Road Traffic (Vehicle Weights) Regulations, 1975.

- I, DESMOND HENRY O'NEIL, Minister for Traffic, in exercise of the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Act, 1974, and above cited regulations do hereby direct:—
- 1. The directions relating to the licensing of certain vehicles as of Class B and C appearing on pages 463 and 464 of the Government Gazette of the 20th February, 1976, are hereby rescinded.
- 2. The Road Traffic Authority may issue licenses of Classes B and C, in accordance with the following directions, subject to the conditions of movements, purpose of use of the vehicle, requisite signs and warning devices being endorsed on the licence documents as specified in the direction.
 - 2.1 In this Direction-
 - "Warning flag" means a red flag of not less than 450 millimetres square;
 - "Warning sign" means a sign bearing the words "OVERWIDTH" "OVERLENGTH" or both as the case may require, in black lettering, 200 millimetres in height on a yellow background.
- 3. Fire Fighting vehicles:—Licenses of Class B may be issued for any vehicle that is owned by a person engaged in the business of farming or grazing and that is fitted and used solely for the purpose of fire fighting or fire prevention, or its movement to the nearest practicable place for repair, without the payment of a licence fee but subject to such other charges as are prescribed by law.
- 4. Class "B" vehicle:—Licences of Class "B" may be issued where a vehicle— $\,$
 - 4.1 is not equipped with lights in conformity with the Vehicle Standards Regulations, 1975, provided its use is restricted to the hours between sunrise and sunset:
 - 4.2 is a tractor or self-propelled agriculture implement not exceeding 8.5 metres in width which is used only for agricultural or pastoral pursuits within such areas as the Road Traffic Authority may direct and subject to the following conditions—
 - 4.2.1. where the width of the vehicle exceeds 2.5 metres a warning flag is to be affixed at each lateral extremity;
 - 4.2.2. where the width of the vehicle exceeds 3 metres but not 4.9 metres a warning flag is to be affixed to each lateral extremity and a warning sign indicating the vehicle is overwidth is to be affixed to the front and rear of the vehicle;
 - 4.2.3. where the width of the vehicle exceeds 4.9 metres but not 8.5 metres, a warning flag is to be affixed at each lateral extremity, a warning sign that the vehicle is overwidth is to be affixed to the front and to the rear of a vehicle, the vehicle is to be preceded by a pilot vehicle bearing a warning sign indicating that an overwidth vehicle follows it and the vehicle is to be followed by a pilot vehicle bearing a warning sign that an overwidth vehicle is ahead of it;
 - 4.2.4. where the width of the vehicle exceeds 3 metres and is driven within 32 kilometres of the General Post Office, Perth, the following conditions apply—
 - 4.2.4.1. Pilot vehicle to be used preceding the transporting vehicle at a distance of 45 metres-140 metres bearing a sign in front "OVERWIDTH/OVERHEIGHT/OVERLENGTH VEHICLE FOLLOWING" in black letters 200 mm high on a yellow background.
 - 4.2.4.2. For loads exceeding 3.05 m in width and/or 22 m overall length (including vehicle) headlights on transporting vehicle and pilot vehicle to be kept burning in dipped position.
 - 4.2.4.3. Transporting vehicle to carry front and rear signs "OVERWIDTH / OVERHEIGHT / OVERLENGTH" in black letters 200 mm high on a yellow background.

- 4.2.4.4. Vehicle(s) not to travel during hours of darkness except that overlength vehicles are permitted to travel during hours of darkness in approved Road Train areas only. Reflectorised signs to be fitted. Warning lights and reflectors to be fitted in accordance with Vehicle Standards Regulation 1103 (4).
- 4.2.4.5. Speed Limit 40 km/h.
- 4.2.4.6. Movement is not permitted between the hours of 7.30 a.m. to 9.00 a.m. and 4.30 p.m. to 6.00 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays inclusive. Nor between 9.00 a.m. to 12.30 p.m. on Saturdays.
- 4.3 is a tractor or tractor plant other than a tracked vehicle and not exceeding 3 metres in width or 12.2 metres in length subject to the following conditions—
 - 4.3.1. where the length of the vehicle exceeds 11 metres but not 12.2 metres, or its width exceeds 2.5 metres but not 3 metres, a warning sign indicating that the vehicle is overlength, overwidth, or both, as the case may be, is to be affixed to the front and rear of the vehicle;
 - 4.3.2. Where the vehicle is a mobile crane a warning flag is to be attached to the hook which is to be secured and if the length exceeds 11 metres or width exceeds 2.5 metres its use is confined to the hours between sunrise and sunset;
 - 4.3.3. irrespective of the number of tyres per axle, the tyre-axle loadings and tyre inflation pressures do not exceed the following—

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council acting under the provisions of the Metropolitan (Perth) Passenger Transport Trust Act, 1957-1973, has been pleased to—

- (a) revoke the Metropolitan (Perth) Passenger Transport Trust Regulations, 1961, and all amendments thereto; and
- (b) make the regulations set forth in the Schedule below, so that the revocation and the regulations take effect on and from the 26th day of August, 1977.

Schedule.

REGULATIONS.

Citation.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Metropolitan (Perth) Passenger Transport Trust Regulations, 1977.

Arrangement.

These regulations are divided into Parts as follows:-

Part I-Preliminary. (Regulations 1-3).

Part II—General. (Regulations 4-12).

Part III—Tickets. (Regulations 13-18).

Part IV-Conduct on Vehicles and Trust Premises. (Regulations 19-59).

Part V—Miscellaneous. (Regulations 60-61).

Interpretation.

(1) In these regulations unless the context otherwise requires-

"bus" means a motor omnibus;

"cash fare" means a fare payable in cash; "conductor" means a person employed by the Trust or the Commission who has a duty to perform upon or in connection with a vehicle;

"fare" means the amount of money fixed by the Trust under regulation 6 that is payable in respect of a journey undertaken on a vehicle;

"pass" means a pass issued under regulation 10.
"passenger" means a person travelling on a vehicle but does
not include an employee of the Trust or Commission travelling on a vehicle for the purpose of carrying out his duties;

"periodical ticket" means a ticket issued under regulation 9; "permit" means a permit issued under regulation 10;

"regulation" means one of these regulations;

"section" means such portion of a route as is defined as a section pursuant to regulation 5;

"ticket" means a ticket issued in relation to a journey; "train" means a train or railcar operated by the Commission

on behalf of the Trust for the purposes of suburban railway passenger services;

"zone" means a portion of the metropolitan area declared as a zone under regulation 5.

- (2) Subject to subregulation (3) of this regulation, in these regulations "vehicle" means a bus, trailer, ferry boat, train or other conveyance operated by or on behalf of the Trust for the carriage of passengers.
- (3) In Part IV of these regulations "vehicle" does not include a train.

Part II—General.

Liability of Trust.

- (1) Any notice or timetable relating to times or routes of vehicles published by the Trust is only a notice for the purposes of public information and is not intended to be a term, condition or warranty of any contract between the Trust and any passenger or intending passenger.
- (2) The Trust is not liable for any delay, breakdown or stoppage of a vehicle.

Trust may declare zones etc.

- 5. The Trust may from time to time-
 - (a) declare zones for the purpose of fixing the fare to be paid in respect of a journey by a passenger;
 - (b) mark or declare sections on vehicle routes for the purpose of fixing the fare to be paid in respect of a journey by a passenger;
 - (c) fix stopping places for vehicles; and
 - (d) fix the period during which a ticket issued for a cash fare is valid.

Trust may

- 6. Subject to these regulations, the fare to be paid by or in respect of a passenger shall be the amount fixed by the Trust from time to time in relation to a journey undertaken on a vehicle but
 - (a) a passenger is a child who has not attained the age of five years and is accompanied by an adult passenger, no fare is payable unless he occupies a seat to the exclusion of an
 - (b) a passenger is a child who has attained the age of five years but has not attained the age of fifteen years, the fare payable shall be such lesser amount as may be fixed by the Trust from time to time in relation to such a passenger;
 - (c) a passenger is a student who attends a Government school, or efficient school in the Education Act, 1928, or other educational institution approved by the Trust for the purposes of this paragraph, has attained the age of fifteen

SCHEDULE—continued

years and is travelling to or from a school referred to in the paragraph at the times specified for the purposes of this paragraph by the Trust the fare payable shall be such lesser amount as may be fixed by the Trust from time to time in relation to such a passenger.

Cash fares.

7. Subject to these regulations, all fares are cash fares.

Passenger entitled to a ticket. 8. On payment of a cash fare the passenger in respect of whom it is paid is entitled to the issue of a ticket indicating the fare paid and where the ticket is not issued on payment of the fare the passenger shall demand its issue.

Periodical tickets.

- 9. (1) The Trust or the Commission on behalf of the Trust may issue periodical tickets at such rates and on such terms and conditions as the Trust may from time to time determine.
 - (2) A periodical ticket is valid for the period stated therein.
- (3) Presentation of a valid periodical ticket shall be accepted as proof of payment of the cash fare.

Passes and permits.

- 10. (1) The Trust may issue passes and permits entitling the holders thereof to travel on such terms and conditions as may be fixed by the Trust from time to time in relation to such passes and permits.
- (2) A pass or permit is valid only while the holder thereof is travelling in accordance with the terms and conditions fixed by the Trust in relation to the pass or permit.
- (3) The Trust may allow the holder of a certificate issued by another public authority to travel on a vehicle on such terms and conditions as are determined from time to time by the Trust.
 - (4) In subregulation (3) of this regulation—
 - "public authority" means any department, instrumentality or body of the State or the Commonwealth approved by the Trust for the purposes of this regulation.

Special vehicles.

- 11. (1) In this regulation "special vehicle" means a vehicle operated by the Trust pursuant to this regulation either as a private special vehicle or a public special vehicle.
- (2) A private special vehicle is a vehicle hired by or on behalf of a person pursuant to a contract between that person and the Trust, on which is displayed the word "Special" and which is available for travel only to the persons specified in the contract.
- (3) A public special vehicle is available for travel to any person desiring to travel along the route or to the place or event specified on that vehicle on payment of the cash fare specified by the Trust in relation to the journey travelled by that special vehicle.

Minimum fare vehicles.

12. (1) The Trust or the Commission on behalf of the Trust may operate a minimum fare vehicle (on which is displayed the words "Minimum Fare") along any route or to any place and the minimum fare payable in respect of a journey on such a vehicle is such amount as is fixed by the Trust from time to time in relation to a journey on that vehicle.

Part III-Tickets.

Interpretation. 13. In this Part "ticket" includes a pass and a permit.

Tickets not transferable.

14. A ticket is valid only in respect of the person in respect of whom it is issued and not transferable.

Ticket to be a valid ticket.

- 15. (1) A person shall not travel or attempt to travel on a vehicle by producing a ticket that is not valid.
- (2) A person in respect of whom a ticket is issued shall not cause, permit or suffer another person to use that ticket for the purposes of travelling on a vehicle or for the purposes of enabling that other person to travel on a vehicle or to travel on a vehicle at a lower fare than the fare that would otherwise be payable by that other person.
 - (3) A ticket—
 - (a) which is torn or defaced;
 - (b) which is in such a condition that the printing or writing thereon is not readily legible;
 - (c) on which the printing has been altered, added to, erased or obliterated; or
 - (d) the period of duration of which has expired,

is not valid.

- (4) A person shall not travel or attempt to travel on a vehicle by producing a ticket issued in respect of another person.
- (5) A person shall not obtain a ticket or attempt to obtain a ticket by means of a false statement or representation.

Schedule—continued.

Passenger to obtain and produce a valid ticket.

- (6) A person shall not travel or attempt to travel on a vehicle by using a ticket that has been obtained by means of a false statement.

 16. (1) A passenger, other than a passenger who has produced to the conductor a valid ticket shall, at the earliest opportunity, tender an amount in satisfaction of the cash fare.
- (2) A passenger, other than a passenger who has produced to the conductor a valid ticket shall not leave or attempt to leave the vehicle without having paid the correct cash fare.
- (3) Subject to subregulation (2) of this regulation a passenger or intending passenger who fails to produce a valid ticket when requested to do so by a conductor or other person authorised by the Trust or the Commission shall thereupon pay such additional fare fixed by the Trust under this subregulation in addition to the fare fixed by the Trust in respect of the journey being undertaken by him or that has been undertaken by him.
- (4) Where a passenger who is the holder of a valid ticket in respect of a journey being undertaken by him on a vehicle notifies the conductor either before or on arrival at the farthest point of the journey for which his ticket is valid, that he intends to continue to travel on the vehicle the fare payable by the passenger in respect of the continuation of his journey shall be a fare that is equal to the difference between the fare fixed by the Trust under regulation 6 in respect of the journey to be travelled by the passenger on the continuation of his journey and the fare already paid in respect of the ticket held by him.
- 17. A person shall not alter, add to or obliterate any writing on a ticket.
- 18. A passenger who is in charge of a child travelling on a vehicle, and in respect of whom a fare is payable, shall, at the earliest opportunity, tender, or ensure that the child tenders, an amount in satisfaction of the cash fare to the conductor, and neither of them shall leave, or attempt to leave, the vehicle unless the correct cash fare for that child has been paid.

Part IV-Conduct on Vehicles and Trust Premises.

- 19. A passenger who is the holder of a scholar's permit or who travels on a vehicle on payment of the fare referred to in paragraph (b) or (c) of regulation 6 shall not, if he is requested by the conductor to yield up a seat he occupies, continue to occupy that seat to the exclusion of an adult passenger unless he pays the full fare fixed by the Trust under regulation 6 in relation to the journey being travelled by him.
- 20. (1) A person who has any infectious or contagious disease shall not enter any vehicle or Trust premises, or travel or attempt to travel on any vehicle.
- (2) A person in charge of any child who has any infectious or contagious disease shall not bring that child into or upon any vehicle or Trust premises.
- 21. (1) A person shall not travel upon the roof, step, mudguard, bonnet, bumper bar or other external fitting of a vehicle.
- (2) A passenger shall not stand on the step or entrance of any vehicle whilst that vehicle is in motion.
- 22. A person who is not an employee of the Trust shall not operate, move or interfere with the steps, automatic doors, emergency doors, any part of the mechanism, destination signs or any other equipment of a vehicle.
- 23. (1) A person who is not a passenger on a vehicle shall not take and keep hold of any part of the vehicle whilst it is in motion.
- (2) A rider or driver of a bicycle, motor cycle or other vehicle shall not take hold of or attach himself or his bicycle or motor cycle to, any vehicle whilst that vehicle is in motion.
- 24. (1) A person shall not board or quit any vehicle whilst it is in motion or attempt to do so.
- (2) Any person who boards or alights or attempts to board or alight any vehicle whilst it is in motion does so at his own risk and the Trust shall not be put in peril by any happening consequent to that act.
- 25. A person shall not obstruct a passenger from lawfully boarding or quitting any vehicle.

Schedule-continued.

- 26. (1) For the purpose of effecting a proper distribution of the loading of any vehicle, a conductor may require any passenger to move from one part of the vehicle to another.
- (2) A passenger shall not fail to move from one part of a vehicle to another after he has been required so to do by a conductor.
- (3) Except with the permission of a conductor, a person shall not enter a vehicle except by the door nearest the front of the vehicle.
- 27. (1) A person shall not enter a vehicle after having been informed by a conducter that the vehicle is full, or if the vehicle bears a sign indicating that it is full.
- (2) Where any person enters a vehicle which, in the opinion of a conductor, is full, the conductor may require that person to quit the vehicle
- (3) A person shall not fail to quit a vehicle after a conductor has informed him that the vehicle is full and has requested him to quit it.
- 28. (1) A person who is in a state of intoxication shall not enter a vehicle or Trust premises or, having entered, shall not remain in or upon a vehicle or Trust premises.
- (2) Any person in or upon a vehicle, who, in the opinion of a conductor, is in a state of intoxication shall, at the request of the conductor, immediately leave the vehicle and forfeit his fare, if paid.
- 29. A person whose dress or person might soil or damage any part of a vehicle or the dress of any passenger, or whose presence or dress would, in the opinion of a conductor, be offensive to passengers, shall not enter a vehicle or having entered, remain in or upon a vehicle, if requested by the conductor not to enter or (as the case may be) to leave such vehicle.
- 30. Where a conductor being of the opinion that a person, if remaining in his position on a vehicle, is likely to interfere with the operator thereof, in the performance of his duties, requires that person to move to another position, the person so required shall change his position in the manner indicated by the conductor.
- 31. A person not being a passenger, intending passenger or an employee of the Trust shall not enter any vehicle.
- 32. A person shall not project or lean any portion of his body out of a vehicle.
- 33. (1) A person shall not smoke in or upon any portion of a vehicle not set apart for smoking.
- (2) A person shall not smoke in or upon any part of Trust premises in respect of which a notice is displayed that smoking is prohibited.
 - 34. A person shall not spit on, in, or from a vehicle.
- 35. (1) A person shall not place or rest his foot or feet on or against a seat of a vehicle.
- (2) A passenger shall not permit any child under his charge to stand upon or place its feet on any seat of a vehicle.
- 36. (1) Except with the written consent of the Trust, a person shall not sell any article or thing or offer any article or thing for sale in or upon any vehicle.
- (2) An unauthorised person shall not distribute any handbill, advertisement or printed matter of any kind in or upon any vehicle or any premises.
- (3) A person shall not beg in or upon any vehicle or Trust premises.
- 37. A passenger whilst upon a vehicle shall not place or carry an umbrella, walking stick, box, bag, case, basket, parcel or luggage in such a position or manner as to interfere with the ingress, egress or comfort or endanger the safety of another passenger.
- 38. A person whilst in or upon a vehicle or any Trust premises shall not commit any nuisance, gamble, swear, use obscene, profane, indecent, insulting or abusive language, shout, or sing, or in any way interfere with the comfort of any passenger or intending passenger.
- 39. Except where authorised by the Trust, a person shall not blow or play upon any musical instrument or operate any wireless set whilst in or upon any vehicle, or Trust premises.

SCHEDULE—continued.

- 40. A person shall not enter any part of Trust premises set apart for persons of a sex other than his own.
- 41. A person unless authorised in writing by the Trust shall not post, stick, paint or write or cause to be posted, stuck, painted or written, any placard, handbill, or advertisement, or other document or thing within or upon any vehicle or any Trust premises, or upon any post, pole, fence, gate or wall owned by the Trust.
- 42. A person, other than an employee of the Trust who has been authorised to do so, shall not—
 - (a) damage, break, deface, interfere with or remove any fitting or part of a vehicle or notice, advertisement or other thing in or upon a vehicle;
 - (b) extinguish any lamp in or upon any vehicle, Trust premises or on or about any works being carried out by order of the Trust; or
 - (c) damage, or interfere with or remove any recording clock, telephone box, light switch or other property of the Trust whether of the kind mentioned in this paragraph or not.
- 43. A person whilst in or upon any vehicle or Trust premises shall not—
 - (a) consume any liquor, without the consent of the Trust; or
 - (b) consume any food, after being required by a conductor or other competent person not to do so.
- 44. A person whilst in or upon a vehicle shall not throw any article from the vehicle.
- 45. (1) A person shall not drive or ride any vehicle within any Trust premises unless he is authorised to do so by the Trust.
- (2) Notwithstanding anything in subregulation (2) of regulation 3 in this regulation, "vehicle" has the same meaning as is given to that expression by the Road Traffic Act, 1974.
- 46. (1) A pedestrian not being an employee of the Trust shall not enter or leave the Bus Station at any place set apart by the Trust for use by vehicles only and designated as such by road markings, signs, or other means.
- (2) In this regulation "the Bus Station" means the Perth Central Bus Station situated in Wellington Street, Perth.
- 47. A person having the control of a child under the age of five years, shall not cause or permit that child to travel in a vehicle unless under the charge of another passenger of at least 15 years of age.
- 48. Any person finding any lost or forgotten property in or upon any vehicle or Trust premises shall, before leaving that vehicle or those premises, deliver that property to the conductor in charge of the vehicle or to an officer of the Trust.
- 49. (1) A person shall not bring, or cause to be brought, into a vehicle any animal, bird or reptile, or being in charge of an animal, bird or reptile, suffer it to remain in any vehicle.
- (2) A conductor may remove any animal, bird or reptile from a vehicle.
- (3) A guide dog in the company of a blind person is not an animal for the purposes of this regulation.
- 50. A person, having been so required by a conductor shall not fail to remove from any gangway, or passage of a vehicle any parcel, bag or other article brought by him into that vehicle.
- 51. A person, other than an employee of the Trust, shall not enter a private special vehicle as defined by regulation 11 without the consent of the person by or on whose behalf the private special vehicle has been hired.
- 52. (1) Where, at or near any stop or terminus, the Trust exhibits by a sign the word "Queue" or some recognisable abbreviation thereof, such as the letter "Q", any person intending to board a vehicle at that stop or terminus shall take up a position in a queue (if any) formed by intending passengers.
- (2) Where intending passengers are required to form a queue, whether pursuant to this regulation or on the instruction of a conductor, and a queue is formed, a person shall not—
 - (a) join that queue other than at the rear or end thereof;
 - (b) having joined that queue take up or attempt to take up a position therein, in advance of the position originally taken up by him;
 - (c) pass through or attempt to pass through that queue;
 - (d) board or attempt to board any vehicle for which that queue is formed, except in his proper turn, according to his position in the queue; or

SCHEDULE-continued.

- (e) fail to observe a reasonable direction, given by a conductor, for the regulation of that queue.
- 53. (1) A person shall not bring or cause to be brought, into a vehicle any package or luggage which, in the opinion of a conductor—
 - (a) exceeds 16 kg in weight;
 - (b) is of dimensions exceeding 720 millimetres by 460 millimetres by 260 millimetres;
 - (c) cannot readily be accommodated in the vehicle; or
 - (d) is likely to damage the vehicle or interfere with the comfort or convenience of any passenger.
- (2) A person shall not place any package or luggage in such a position as would cause it to interfere with the ingress or egress of passengers and, where a conductor has indicated a position for the placing of that package or luggage, a person shall not place it in any other position.
- 54. (1) A person shall not carry a perambulator or pusher on any vehicle, other than by means of hooks (if any) provided at the rear of the vehicle, and then only on such of those hooks as is not already taken up by a perambulator or pusher.
- (2) A perambulator or pusher will not be carried by the Trust if it contains goods or parcels or unless it is accompanied by an adult passenger.
- (3) Any perambulator or pusher carried by the Trust is carried free of charge but at the risk of the owner.
- 55. On any route where no alternative satisfactory parcels service exists, the Trust may accept parcels for carriage at such times and on such conditions as may, from time to time, be determined by the Trust.
- 56. A person shall not bring, or cause to be brought into any vehicle or consign for carriage by the Trust, any package containing any flammable or explosive substance or any dangerous thing.
- 57. The Trust is not responsible for the loss of or damage to any luggage, package or parcel, carried pursuant to regulations 55 and 56 of these regulations.
- 58. Any person offending against regulations 20 to 22 (both inclusive), 25 to 46 (both inclusive), 49 or 51 may in addition to any penalty prescribed for the offence, be removed, by or under the direction of a conductor or other authorised person, from the vehicle or premises in or upon which the offence was committed.
- 59. (1) Every passenger whilst travelling upon a vehicle or upon quitting a vehicle shall, if so required by a conductor give to that conductor his full name and address.
- (2) A passenger required to give his full name and address, pursuant to this regulation shall not give a false name or false address.
- (3) Where a conductor requires a passenger to identify himself with the name and address given by him, pursuant to this regulation, the passenger shall produce any evidence of his identity then and there available.

Part V.-Miscellaneous,

- 60. (1) Any article or thing found or left unclaimed in any Trust premises or upon any vehicle and subsequently deposited at a lost property office of the Trust shall be delivered to the person only who proves ownership thereof to the satisfaction of the officer in charge of that office and upon payment of such charges, as may from time to time be determined by the Trust.
- (2) The Trust is not required to keep any lost article of a perishable nature longer than twenty-four hours.
- 61. (1) A person who fails to comply with or contravenes any of these regulations commits an offence.
- (2) A person who commits an offence against any of these regulations other than regulation 19, 35, 37, 39, 47 or 54 of these regulations is liable to a minimum penalty of ten dollars and to a maximum penalty of one hundred dollars.
- (3) A person who commits an offence against regulation 19, 35, 37, 39, 47 or 54 of these regulations is liable to a penalty of one hundred dollars.

- 1. Compliance with all requirements of the Town Zoning Scheme: Unless those requirements conflict with those set out below, in which case the following requirements shall apply.
- 2. Minimum Lot Area: 700 square metres.
- 3. Minimum Site Area per Unit*: 350 square metres.
- 4. Types of Units Permitted: Each unit shall be a self-contained single family unit, comprising a minimum of four habitable rooms. Units may be sited singly, or grouped and joined by party walls
- 5. Subdivision of Lots: Lots shall be subdivided on the basis of Strata Titles as laid down under the Strata Titles Act (1966), as amended.
- 6. Setbacks: Minimum setbacks shall be as follows:
 - A. From walls of dwelling** to-
 - (1) a street 7.5 metres.
 - (2) other lot boundary 3.0 metres.
 - B. From garages, carports, patios, outbuildings, stores to—
 - (1) a street 7.5 metres.
 - (2) other lot boundary—
 - (a) NIL, in the case of a brick parapet wall being constructed, (i.e. on lot boundary).
 - (b) 1.0 metre for other than brick parapet.
 - C. Between a dwelling unit and the edge of its defined use area†—
 - (1) where there are no openings in the walls of the dwelling NIL.
 - (2) where there are no major openings‡ to habitable rooms 1.0 metre.
 - (3) where there are major openings to habitable rooms 3.0 metres.

Garages, carports or patios may be sited within the setback distances between dwellings, provided that roof drainage is contained within the defined use area of the unit (see also section 12).

7. Unit Yard Areas:

- A. Each unit shall include an enclosed private yard area, such yard area having direct access to the dwelling.
- B. Yard areas for all units on a lot shall contain an average yard area of 140 square metres (minimum); the absolute minimum area of any unit yard area shall be 100 square metres; each unit yard area shall contain an area of 70 square metres in one "usable" parcel having a minimum dimension of 6.0 metres.
- 8. Parking Requirements:
 - A. Minimum 2 paved car parking spaces per unit, of which one shall be contained in a garage or carport.
 - B. Minimum 1 paved recreation vehicle parking space (minimum 3.0 metres x 6.0 metres) for every three dwelling units or part thereof: such parking space to be sited.
 - (1) Minimum 7.5 metres from a street, and
 - (2) Not within the defined use area of any unit.

Recreation vehicle parking shall be suitably screened so as to maintain an aesthetic quality in keeping with the development on site; and is provided for the storage of boats, caravans and other such vehicles.

- 9. External Storage Facility: Each unit shall include a lock-up storage facility having a minimum area of 4.0 square metres, and constructed of the same materials as the dwelling. The storage facility may form part of the dwelling structure with direct external access; it may be incorporated as part of a garage or carport; or it may be a separate structure.
- 10. Pedestrian Access: A pedestrian access way having a minimum width of 0.8 metres shall be provided to the "usable" yard area of each unit; such may comprise either an external access way or may be provided through a garage or carport.
- 11. Drying Areas: A drying area shall be provided for each unit, such area being suitably screened from view from public roads, public open spaces areas and other dwelling units (both on and off the lot on which the unit is located).
- 12. Patios: Patios are to be constructed so as not to restrict light and ventilation to any buildings or open yard areas.

Provided that an Outline Development Plan shall not be required where the development does not significantly affect the proper planning of the Zone, as determined by the Council or by the Minister.

3.8.4 The Council may itself prepare an Outline Development Plan for all or any part of the Zone.

3.8.5 An Outline Development Plan shall include—

- (i) the topography of the area;
- (ii) existing public utility systems including roads, water, power and sewerage systems:
- (iii) the proposed land use pattern including residential densities, the provision of land for public purposes, the location and width of proposed roads and the relationship of the land to adjacent land;
- (iv) the proposed sewerage and drainage systems.
- (v) landscaping proposals;
- (vi) in the case of buildings other than single and duplex dwellings, building envelopes indicating the siting and scale of buildings, and an indication of building form. colours and materials.

- (i) Upon adoption by the Council of an Outline Development Plan the Council shall advertise that the Plan has been prepared and is available for public inspection during normal business hours at the offices of the Council, and that submissions on the Plan may be lodged with the Town Clerk on or before the twenty first day from the date of the last advertisement.
- (ii) Advertisement shall be by notice at weekly intervals for each of three successive weeks in a newspaper circulating in the district.
- (iii) The Council shall consider all submissions and may amend the Outline Development Plan in consideration of these or other relevant factors.
- (iv) The Council shall submit the Outline Development Plan (as amended), together with a schedule of submissions and the Council's comments on these and other relevant factors, to the Town Planning Board for adoption by the Board as the basis for approval of subdivision and development within the area covered by the Plan.




