WHEREAS by the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909-1976, it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Board shall, with the approval of the Governor have power to construct provide and extend Water Works, Sewerage Works and Metropolitan Main Drainage Works; and whereas the preliminary requirements of the said Act have been complied with and plans sections and estimates in respect of the works hereinafter mentioned have been submitted to and approved by the Governor in Council: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby empower the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Board to undertake the construction of the following works under the said Act, namely:—

Dianella Branch Drain—Improvements, 1977.

(1) Deepening a section of an existing open drain approximately 180 metres long and the construction of a new 450 mm diameter Culvert, approximately 40 metres long.

(2) General modifications and installation of new pumping machinery at the Surrey Street pumping station.

Works to be complete with all necessary apparatus and things connected therein.

This Order in Council shall take effect from the 16th day of August, 1977.

## ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.H.D. 637/71; Ex. Co. 5459.

WHEREAS it is enacted by subsection (2) of section 6 of the Clean Air Act, 1964-1971, that the Governor may by Order in Council from time to time amend the Schedule to the Act by adding thereto or removing therefrom any premises or class of premises and the Schedule as so amended shall be the Schedule to the Act: Now therefore, I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by subsection (2) of section 6 of the Clean Air Act, 1964-1971 hereby amend the Schedule to that Act by adding to paragraph (a) thereof the following premises or class of premises:—

construction sites, being premises in which any construction work namely—

- (a) the construction, erection, installation, addition to, alteration, repair, maintenance, cleaning, painting, renewal, removal, dismantling or demolition of any building or structure which when done in relation to a building or structure, is done at or adjacent to the site thereof and which when done in relation to a structure that is a ship or other floating structure, includes the construction of the ship or other floating structure and all

work that is done on or adjacent to a ship or other floating structure in a dock or on a ship or at a wharf or other place;

- (b) driving or extracting piles, sheet piles or trench sheet;
- (c) laying or lining any pipe having an internal diameter exceeding 175 millimetres; or
- (d) excavating, trenching, cutting or any work in connection with—
  - (i) excavating for or preparing foundations for any building or structure; or
  - (ii) excavating for water, sewerage, drainage, gas or electricity supply,

is carried out but does not include any premises on which such work is carried out if—

- (e) the work is done in relation to a single storey dwelling, or, a two storey dwelling, as defined by the Uniform Building By-laws, 1974, that is not part of any other building or structure; or
- (f) the value of the work does not exceed \$75 000.

- (b) the name and address of the purchaser, date of supply,

name of the disease for which the animals are to be  
treated, are entered in a register of poisons;
- (c) the quantity of drugs supplied is not greater than is  
required to provide seventy-two hours of therapeutic

with the drug, or in the case of a pre-packed proprietary  
brand the smallest size manufactured for sale of the

#### HEALTH ACT, 1911-1976.

Shire of Armadale-Kelmscott.

P.H.D.: 1783/56: Ex. Co. 5460.

WHEREAS by the provisions of the Health Act 1911 and its amendments and of the Local Government Act 1960 and its amendments a Local Authority may make or adopt by-laws, and may alter, amend or repeal any by-laws so made or adopted; now, therefore, the Shire of Armadale-Kelmscott, being a Local Authority within the meaning of such Acts and having adopted the Model By-Laws described as Series "A" as reprinted pursuant to the Reprinting of Regulations Act, 1954, in the *Government Gazette* on 17th July, 1963 and having amended the adopted By-laws as reprinted pursuant to the Reprinting of Regulations Act of 1954 in the *Government Gazette* on 20th July 1973 hereby resolve and determine that the said adopted By-Laws shall be amended as follows:—

##### Part 1—General Sanitary Provisions.

##### Method of Disposal of Rubbish.

By-Law 19 (3) as reprinted in the *Government Gazette* on 20th July 1973 is repealed and replaced by the following:—

"By-Law 19 (3):—

- (A) During all periods of construction on any building site:—
- (i) The builder shall provide and maintain on such site a rubbish disposal bin approved by the Local Authority being either:—
    - (a) a bin of not less than 4 cubic metres in capacity; or
    - (b) a bin of not less than 0.20 cubic metres in capacity in which case such bin shall have an effectively operating lid.
  - (ii) The builder shall keep such site free of rubbish and offensive matter, whether temporary or otherwise.
  - (iii) The builder shall maintain the street verge immediately adjacent to such site free of rubbish or offensive matter, whether temporary or otherwise.
  - (iv) The builder shall on completion of construction immediately clear the site and the street verge immediately adjacent thereto of all rubbish and offensive matter and shall remove therefrom all or any rubbish disposal bins placed thereon by the builder.
- (B) In this By-Law the word "rubbish" shall be deemed to include stones, bricks, lime, timber, iron, tiles, bags, plastics and any broken, used or discarded matter whatsoever whether of the same kind or type or otherwise.

- (C) In this By-Law the word "builder" shall include the person or persons or firm or corporation who shall be the holder of any building licence issued in respect of such building works by the Shire of Armadale-Kelmscott and shall also include any person or persons or firm or corporation who shall be in effective control of such building site whether or not such person or persons or firm or corporation shall be the holder of any such licence."

Eating House By-laws.

P.H.D. 1785/56: Ex. Co. 5462.

WHEREAS under the provisions of the Health Act 1911, as amended, a Local Authority may make by-laws with respect to the matters specified in Section 172 of the said Act: Now therefore, the Shire of Carnarvon, being the Local Authority for the Carnarvon Shire Health District doth hereby make the following by-laws.

#### Eating House By-Laws.

1. These by-laws will have effect from 31st December, 1977.
2. The Eating House By-laws as published in the *Government Gazette* on the 15th October, 1957 are hereby repealed.
3. On and after the 1st January, 1978 no person shall establish or carry on the business of an eating house within the Shire of Carnarvon unless:
  - (a) the eating house is registered with the Local Authority, and,
  - (b) the proprietor holds a license from the Local Authority, authorising him to conduct the business of an eating house.
4. All registrations and licenses shall expire on the 31st December next ensuing after the date of issue.
5. The fees to be paid under these by-laws shall be as follows:

6. The proprietor of every eating house shall apply for renewal of registration of the premises, and of his license, within one month of the expiry of that registration and license.
7. (a) Before any eating house is registered the proprietor shall make application to the Local Authority in the form prescribed in the First Schedule.  
(b) If the application is approved, the Local Authority shall, on payment by the applicant of the prescribed fee, issue to the applicant a certificate of registration in the form prescribed in the Second Schedule.
8. (a) Before any license to conduct the business of an eating house is issued, the proprietor shall make application to the Local Authority in the form prescribed in the Third Schedule.  
(b) If the application is approved, the Local Authority shall, on payment of the prescribed fee, issue to the applicant a license in the form prescribed in the Fourth Schedule.
9. If there are two or more joint proprietors:
  - (a) each proprietor shall lodge a separate application form;
  - (b) the issue of a license or registration shall be in the joint names of the applicants, but no license shall be issued unless the local Authority approves of all of the applicants;
  - (c) each proprietor named in the license or registration shall be severally responsible for compliance with all the obligations of a proprietor.
10. Every person failing to do any act directed to be done, or doing any act forbidden to be done by these by-laws shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable to a penalty of \$100 plus a daily penalty of \$4 for every day or part of a day during which the breach is continued after complaint of such breach has been made.

WHEREAS under the provisions of the Health Act, 1911-1976, a local authority may make or adopt by-laws and may alter, amend or repeal any by-laws so made or adopted. Now therefore, the Shire of Roebourne, being a local authority within the meaning of that Act and having adopted the Model By-law described as Series "A" as reprinted pursuant to the Reprinting of Regulations Act 1954 and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 17th day of July, 1954, and having amended the said Model By-laws by the insertion of a further By-law 14A therein passed at a meeting of the Roebourne Shire Council held on the 15th day of May, 1973, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 31st day of August, 1973, doth hereby resolve and determine that the said adopted by-laws as amended shall be further amended as follows:—

By deleting by-law 14A and by inserting the following by-law in its place as follows:—

##### Prescribed Areas and Charges for Rubbish Removal.

14A. (1) The Townsites of Roebourne, Point Samson, Wickham and Karratha as constituted under the Land Act, 1933-1972, as amended; the Townsite of Dampier as constituted under the Local Government Act, 1960-1976 as amended; the Townsite of Wickham situate on Townsite Lease 3116/4629 De Wit Location 69, the Cape Lambert Industrial Area as situate on Industrial Area Lease 3116/4623; De Wit Location 65 and the Dampier Parker Point and East Intercourse Island Industrial Area as situate on Industrial Area Leases 3116/3469, 3116/3807, De Wit Locations 24, 29, 30, 31 and 43 respectively shall be prescribed parts of the Shire of Roebourne within which the provision of section 112A of the Act shall apply.

(2) The following charges are prescribed for the removal of house and trade refuse and other rubbish from premises situate within the aforesaid parts of the said districts of the Shire of Roebourne, namely:—

(a) House premises—

Sixty five dollars (\$65.00) per annum for twice weekly emptying by the Shire of Roebourne of a receptacle provided by an occupier in accordance with by-law 12 hereof.

(b) Trade premises—

(i) Fifty cents (50c) for each daily emptying by the Shire of Roebourne of a receptacle provided by an occupier in accordance with by-law 12 hereof; and

(ii) Three dollars fifty cents (\$3.50) per cubic metre for the removal by the Shire of Roebourne of other trade refuse.

(c) Caravan park premises and land upon which caravans and camps are used for habitation—

Fifty cents (50c) per receptacle for each weekly emptying of a receptacle provided in accordance with the provisions of the Caravan Parks and Camping Ground Regulations 1974 or such other emptying as may be necessary to prevent the creation of a nuisance.

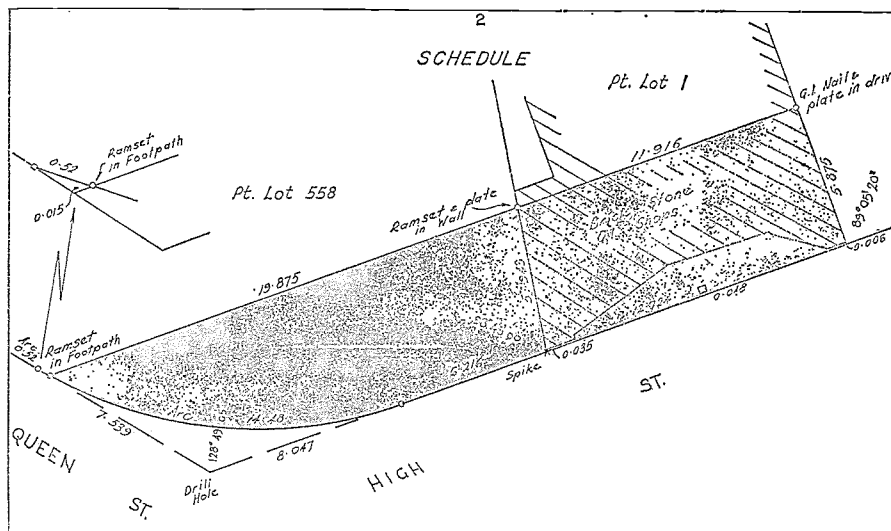

- (1) Delete by-laws No. 1 to and including No. 19 and the Schedule Fees.
- (2) Insert the following as by-law No. 1 to and including No. 6 and the Schedule Fees—
  1. In these by-laws the term "Council" shall mean the Belmont Shire Council.
  2. The Council may establish and maintain a pound or pounds for the impounding of dogs seized pursuant to the provisions of the Dog Act, 1976.
  3. The pound keeper shall be in attendance at the pound for the release of dogs at such times and on such days of the week as shall from time to time be determined by the Council.
  4. If the Council shall destroy a dog at the request of its owner whether such dog shall have been seized or impounded or not the owner shall pay to the Council the fee specified in the schedule hereto.
  5. The occupier of premises whereon any dog is kept shall—
    - (a) enclose the premises or the portion thereof in which the dog is kept with a fence and/or gate of sufficient height and of such nature to prevent the dog escaping therefrom;
    - (b) maintain the said fence in good order and condition;
    - (c) prevent the dog from wandering at large.
  6. Any person who shall commit a breach of these by-laws shall upon conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding one hundred dollars \$100.00.

## The Schedule Fees.

For the seizure or impounding of a dog—\$8.00.

For the sustenance and maintenance of a dog in the pound—\$2.00 per day or part thereof.

For the destruction of a dog—\$2.00.

## Municipality of the Shire of Greenough.

By-laws relating to the Clearing and Removal of Trees, Scrub, Undergrowth, Refuse, Rubbish and Vehicle Bodies from Land:

L.G. GR-7-19.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on the 19th April, 1977 to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor, the following By-laws:—

- (1) If there is;
  - (a) on any vacant land within the district any trees, scrub or undergrowth; or,
  - (b) on any land within the district any refuse or other material of any kind whatsoever which, in the opinion of the Council, is likely to affect adversely the value of the adjoining property or the health, comfort and convenience of the inhabitants thereof; the Council may cause a Notice under the hand of the Shire Clerk to be served on the owner or occupier of such land, requiring him within the time specified in such Notice, to clear and remove such trees, scrub, undergrowth, refuse, rubbish or material from such land.
- (2) If there is on any land whether vacant or occupied within the district any derelict motor vehicle or vehicle body or old machinery which, in the opinion of Council, is likely to adversely affect the value of adjoining property or the health, comfort and convenience of the inhabitants thereof, the Council may cause such Notice under the hand of the Shire Clerk to be served on the owner or occupier of such land requiring him in the time specified in such Notice, to remove such vehicles, vehicle bodies or machinery from such land.
- (3) Every owner or occupier of land upon whom a Notice has been served under By-law 1 or 2 of these By-laws, shall comply with such Notice within the time specified therein. Any person who fails to comply with any Notice served under these By-laws commits an offence and on conviction shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Fifty Dollars (\$50) and a Daily Penalty not exceeding Five Dollars (\$5) for each day on which the offence occurs after the expiry of the Notice.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, 1960-1976.  
The Municipality of the Shire of Mundaring.  
By-Laws relating to Standing Orders.

L.G. MG-7-2.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on the 17th day of March, 1977 to submit for confirmation by the Governor the following By-laws.

The Mundaring Shire Council's By-laws relating to Standing Orders as published in the *Government Gazette* on the 1st December, 1970 are hereby repealed.

Interpretation.

1. In these By-laws every word of the masculine gender shall be construed as including the feminine gender.

Standing Orders.

2. The proceedings and business of the Council shall be conducted according to these By-laws, which shall be referred to as "the Standing Orders".

President.

3. In the construction of these Standing Orders unless the context otherwise requires the word "President" shall in the absence of the President include the Deputy President and the member chosen to preside at any meeting of the Council.

President to Preside.

4. The President or in his absence the Deputy President or in his absence a Councillor chosen by the Councillors present shall preside.

Notice of Meeting.

5. The Shire Clerk shall give to all members of the Council notice in writing of each meeting together with the agenda for such meeting at least one clear day before the meeting. Notice shall also be given of every meeting adjourned for a period exceeding five days.

Quorum.

6. Except in cases where section 173(4) of the Act applies, the number of members necessary to form a quorum—

- (a) where the total number of members of the Council is an even number, is one half of that total
- (b) where the total number of members of the Council is an odd number, is the integer nearest to but greater than one half of that.

7. The Council shall not transact business at a meeting unless a quorum is present.

Absence of Quorum.

8. If at the expiration of half an hour from the time fixed for the commencement of a meeting of the Council, a quorum is not present the President or in his absence the Deputy President or in his absence the majority of Councillors present or any Councillor present alone or in the absence of the President and all Councillors the Shire Clerk may adjourn the meeting and business which could have been transacted had there been a quorum at the meeting may be transacted at the resumption of the adjourned meeting.

Meeting Counted Out.

9. If at any time during any meeting of the Council a quorum is not present, the President shall thereupon suspend the proceedings of the meeting for a period of two minutes and if a quorum be not present at the expiration of that period, the meeting shall be deemed to have been counted out and the President shall adjourn it to some future time or date.

Record of Members Present.

10. At all meetings at which there is not a quorum present, or at which the Council is counted out for want of a quorum, the names of the members then present shall be recorded in the Minute Book.

Open Doors.

11. The business of the Council shall be conducted with open doors except upon such occasions as the Council may by resolution otherwise decide.

Closed Doors.

12. Upon the carrying of such a resolution as is mentioned in By-law 11, the President shall direct all persons other than Councillors and those employees required to assist Council in the conduct of its business to leave the Council Chamber and every such person shall forthwith comply with such direction.

13. Any person who fails to comply with a direction made pursuant to By-law 12 may by order of the President be removed from the Council Chamber.

14. After the carrying of a resolution made under By-law 11 or By-law 116 the business at that meeting of the Council shall proceed behind closed doors until the Council by resolution decides to proceed with open doors.

Distinguished Visitors.

15. If a distinguished visitor shall be present at a meeting of the Council the President may invite him to sit beside the President, or at the Council table.

## Reporters.

16. At all meetings newspaper reporters shall be permitted to attend in such part of the Council Chamber as may be appropriated for their accommodation but they shall withdraw during any period when the Council is sitting behind closed doors.

## Visitors Not to Take Part in Discussions.

17. The admission of members of the public to the Council Chamber shall be under and subject to the condition that no expression of dissent or approval, conversation or interruption to the proceedings of the Council shall take place, and in the event of any breach of this condition, the President may at his discretion and without a vote of the Council require the person or persons so offending to withdraw and thereupon such person or persons shall immediately withdraw from the Council Chamber.

## Removal of Disturbers.

18. Any person who, being ordered to leave the Council Chamber, fails to do so may, by order of the President, be removed from the Council Chamber.

## Two Kinds of Meetings.

19. Meetings of the Council shall be of two kinds, "ordinary" and "special". Ordinary meetings are those called at such places and such times as the Council from time to time appoints for the transaction of the ordinary business of the Council. Special meetings are those called to consider special business the nature of which shall be notified on the notice summoning the meeting. No business shall be transacted at a special meeting other than that for which the special meeting was called.

## Calling of Meetings.

20. The President may convene a meeting of the Council as often as he thinks fit by notice in writing signed by him or the Shire Clerk, sent to each Councillor before the meeting.

21. If the President refuses or neglects to call a meeting of the Council after receiving a request for that purpose, signed by at least three Councillors, those Councillors may call a meeting of the Council by serving a notice in writing signed by them, stating the business to be transacted, on each of the other members of the Council at least seven days before the time of the commencement of the meeting.

## BUSINESS AT COUNCIL MEETINGS.

## Order of Business.

22. The order of business of an ordinary meeting shall be as follows, or as near thereto as shall be practicable, but for the greater convenience of the Council at any particular meeting thereof it may be altered by resolution to that effect.

- (1) Confirmation of Minutes.
- (2) Announcements by the President without discussion.
- (3) Questions of which due notice has been given without discussion.
- (4) Orders of the day, including considering and ordering upon any business left over from the previous meeting and any business the President may think desirable to bring under the notice of the Council and may have directed to be entered as an order of the day.
- (5) Correspondence, reports of committees, and officers.

These matters are to be presented to Council under Departmental classifications as determined from time to time by resolution of Council.

At the conclusion of each Departmental section, the following, dealing with matters relating to that Department, shall be the order of business.

- (a) Motions of which previous notice has been given.
- (b) Notices of motions for consideration at the following meeting if given during the meeting.
- (c) Motions without notice.

## Agenda Closing Time.

23. Correspondence or other matters submitted for Council's ordinary meeting agenda shall only be included if lodged at the office of the Council at least six clear days prior to the date of the Council meeting, except as provided for in By-law 30 or unless the Shire Clerk is of the opinion that the matter is urgent and should be included.

## Order of Special Meeting.

24. The order of business at any special meeting of the Council shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

## Minutes.

25. The pasting or otherwise permanently affixing the minutes to the leaves of a book shall be sufficient recording of the minutes in the Minute Book.

26. The reading at the next ordinary meeting of the Council of the minutes of the previous meeting may be dispensed with when members have been supplied with copies of the minutes at least three clear days before the holding of the next ordinary meeting of the Council.

27. The minutes of any preceding meeting, whether ordinary or special not previously confirmed, shall be submitted as the first business, at all ordinary meetings of the Council: and no discussion shall be permitted thereon, except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings, and the said minutes shall then if found correct be signed by the President and he shall sign and date each page.

## Question on Notice.

28. Any Councillor desiring to ask a question at any meeting of the Council shall direct the question to the President and shall give notice thereof in writing to the Shire Clerk at least six clear days before the hour fixed for the meeting.

29. All questions and answers shall be submitted as briefly and concisely as possible and no discussion shall be allowed thereon.

## Notices of Motion.

30. A Councillor may bring forward at a meeting such business as he considers advisable in the form of a motion of which notice has been given in writing to the Shire Clerk either at the previous meeting or at any time thereafter being not later than 12 noon two clear days before the meeting at which it is brought forward.

31. Every notice of motion shall relate to some question affecting the constitution, administration, or condition of the Municipality or the Council.

32. The President shall rule out of order any motion which does not comply with By-law 31.

33. Every such motion shall lapse unless the Councillor who gave the notice thereof, or some other Councillor authorised by him in writing, be present to move the same when such motion shall be called on.

## Resumption of Debate After Count Out.

34. If a debate on any motion moved and seconded be interrupted by the Council being counted out, such debate may be resumed at the next meeting at the point where it was so interrupted, on motion with notice.

## Deputations.

35. Any person or persons wishing to be received as a deputation by the Council shall, in the first instance, send to the Shire Clerk a memorial, setting out in concise terms the subject matter to be raised by the deputation.

36. Where the Shire Clerk receives a memorial in terms of By-law 35 he shall lay the memorial—

(a) before the Committee concerned; or

(b) where there is no Committee concerned, before the President.

37. A Committee or the president receiving a memorial may either receive the deputation or lay the memorial before the Council.

38. Where a memorial is laid before the Council pursuant to the provisions of By-law 37, the Council may, if it so resolves, receive the deputation.

39. A deputation shall not exceed five in number and only two members thereof shall be at liberty to address the Council or a Committee of the Council, except in reply to questions from members of the Council and the matter shall not be further considered by the Council or the Committee, until the deputation has withdrawn.

## CONDUCT OF DEBATE.

## Motions or Amendments.

40. A Councillor desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment shall state its substance before he addresses the Council thereon and, if so required by the President, shall put the motion or amendment in writing.

## Motions and Amendments to be Seconded.

41. Except as provided by By-law 140, no motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the Council or passed unless it be seconded.

## Unopposed Business.

42. Upon a motion being moved and seconded the President may ask the meeting if any Councillor opposes it. If no one signifies his opposition to the motion, the President may declare the motion carried without debate and without taking a vote thereon. Any motion declared carried under this By-law shall for all purposes be deemed a resolution of the Council.

43. If a Councillor signifies his opposition to a motion the motion shall be dealt with according to the following By-laws.

## Councillors to Address the President.

44. A Councillor moving a motion or amendment, or taking part in the discussion thereon, shall rise and address the President.

## Point of Order.

45. A Councillor who is addressing the President shall not be interrupted except upon a point of order, in which event he shall resume his seat until the Councillor raising the point of order has been heard thereon and the question or order has been disposed of, whereupon the Councillor so interrupted may, if permitted, proceed.

46. A Councillor rising to express a difference of opinion with, or to contradict, a speaker shall not be recognised as raising a point of order.

## Titles to be Used.

47. At meetings of the Council, speakers in referring to others present thereat shall designate them by their separate titles of President, or Councillor, as the case may be.

## Priority to Speakers.

48. If two or more Councillors rise to speak at the same time the President shall decide which is entitled to priority.



President to be Heard.

49. Whenever the President rises during a debate, any Councillor then speaking or offering to speak is to sit down, and the Council is to be silent, so that the President may be heard without interruption.

Councillor Not to Speak Twice.

50. No Councillor shall speak twice on the same question, except by way of explanation, or in reply, upon an original motion of which he was the mover or an amendment last debated of which he was the mover; and no Councillor shall speak to any question after the mover shall have been permitted to reply provided that the Council may be resolution suspend the operation of this By-law during the debate of any motion.

Mover or Seconder to be Held to Have Spoken.

51. A Councillor moving or seconding a motion or amendment shall be held to have spoken thereon.

Calling to Order for Speaking Twice.

52. The President shall, without waiting for the intervention of the Council, call to order any Councillor proceeding to speak a second time on the same question, except where the Councillor is otherwise authorised to so do.

Limit of Speeches.

53. A Councillor shall not speak upon any motion or amendment or in reply for a longer period than 10 minutes without the consent of the Council which shall be signified without debate.

54. An extension shall not be permitted under By-law 53 beyond a further 5 minutes.

Personal Explanation.

55. A Councillor making a personal explanation shall confine it to a succinct explanation of a material part of his former speech which may have been misunderstood, and to the explanation itself, and shall not advert to matters not strictly necessary for that purpose, nor seek to strengthen his former argument by new matter or by replying to other Councillors.

No Speech After Certain Events.

56. No Councillors shall speak on any motion or amendment.

(a) after the mover has replied; or

(b) after the question has been put.

Speaking in Reply.

57. A Councillor speaking in reply shall not introduce any new matter, but shall strictly confine himself to answering previous speakers.

Division of Complicated Resolutions.

58. The President, at his discretion, may, or the Council may, by motion without debate, order a complicated motion to be divided and put in the form of two or more motions.

Withdrawal of Motion.

59. A motion or amendment may be withdrawn by the mover, with the consent of the Council, which shall be signified without debate, and it shall not be competent for any Councillor to speak upon it after the mover has asked permission for its withdrawal, unless permission to withdraw shall have been refused.

Rescission of Resolution.

60. The Council may, at the same meeting at which it is passed, rescind or alter a resolution if all the Members of the Council who were present in the Council Chamber at the time the resolution was passed are also present in the Council Chamber at the time the rescission or alteration is proposed.

61. The Council may, at a meeting after that at which it was passed, rescind or alter a resolution—

61. The Council may, at a meeting after that at which it was passed, rescind or alter a resolution—

(1) where notice of the motion to rescind or alter is not given, if a motion to that effect is carried by an absolute majority of the members of the Council; or

(2) where the Member intending to propose the rescission or alteration has, through the Shire Clerk, given written notice of his intention to each of the other Members of the Council at least seven days before the meeting, if a motion to that effect is carried by a majority of the Members voting on the proposal at the meeting;

but not otherwise.

Suspension of Standing Orders.

62. (1) Any Councillor moving the suspension of a Standing Order shall state the object of the motion, but discussion shall not otherwise take place thereon.

(2) In cases of urgent necessity or whilst the Council is sitting behind closed doors, any of these Standing Orders may be suspended on motion duly made and seconded, but that motion shall not be declared carried, unless an absolute majority of the members of the Council, or a two-thirds majority of those present and voting on the question, whichever is the lesser number, have voted in favour of the motion.

Production of Documents.

63. The President or any Councillor may of right require the production of any of the documents of the Council relating to the question or matter under discussion.

No Digression.

64. A Councillor shall not speak otherwise than upon, or digress from, the question then before the Council, except to make a personal explanation.

No Adverse Reflection on Council.

65. A member of the Council shall not reflect adversely upon a resolution of the Council, except on a motion that the resolution be rescinded.

No Adverse Reflection on Councillor.

66. A Member of the Council shall not reflect adversely upon the character or actions of another Member no impute any motive to a Member unless the Council resolves, without debate, that the question then before the Council cannot otherwise be adequately considered.

67. Any Member of the Council may require the Shire Clerk to take down any particular words used by a Member immediately after such words have been used.

Withdrawal of Offensive Expression.

68. A Councillor who shall use any expression which in the opinion of the President reflects offensively on any Member of the Council or officer of the Shire, shall when required by the President, unreservedly withdraw such expression and make a satisfactory apology to the Chair, and if he declines, or neglects to do so, the President may refuse to hear such Councillor further upon the matter then under discussion and call upon the next speaker.

Disturbance by Councillors.

69. A Councillor shall not make any noise or disturbance in the Council Chamber nor shall he, except to raise a point of order, converse aloud, while any other person is addressing the Council.

Continued Irrelevance.

70. The President may call the attention of the Council to continued irrelevance, tedious repetition, unbecoming language, or any breach of order, on the part of a Councillor, and may direct such councillor, if speaking, to discontinue his speech, and thereupon such Councillor shall cease speaking and resume his seat.

Continued Breach of Order.

71. Where a Councillor persists in any conduct which the President decides is out of order, or refuses to make any explanation, retraction or apology required by the President under By-law 77, the President may direct that Councillor to refrain from taking any further part in the then meeting of the Council other than by recording his vote and the Councillor shall comply with such direction.

Crossing Council Chamber.

72. When the President is putting any question, no Councillor shall walk out of or across the Council Chamber, nor shall any Councillor, whilst any other Councillor is speaking, pass between the speaker and the Chair.

President May Call to Order.

73. The President shall preserve order, and may on his own motion call any Councillor to order whenever in his opinion there shall be cause for so doing.

Definition of Order.

74. Any Member of the Council who shall do anything, or behave in any manner which is forbidden by any By-law of these Standing Orders shall be deemed to be out of order.

Infraction of Standing Orders.

75. A Councillor shall be entitled to direct the attention of the President to any infraction of the Standing Orders by any Member of the Council.

Rulings by President.

76. The President shall decide all questions of order or practice and his decision shall be final and be accepted by the Council without argument or comment unless in any particular case the Council shall thereupon resolve that a different ruling shall be substituted for the ruling given by the President.

Decision of President on Point of Order—Councillor to Apologise When Called Upon.

77. Whenever it shall have been decided that any motion, amendment or other matter before the Council is out of order, it shall be rejected, and whenever anything said or done in the Council by any Councillor shall be similarly decided to be out of order, such Councillor shall, if called upon by the President, make such explanation, retraction or apology, as the case may require.

Serious Disorder.

78. If at a meeting of the Council the President is of opinion that by reason of disorder or otherwise the business of the Council cannot effectually be continued, he may adjourn the meeting for a period of fifteen minutes, whereafter the Council shall reassemble and decide whether business is to be proceeded with; and that question shall be decided forthwith and without debate.

79. Where after any proceeding under By-law 78, the President is again of the opinion that the business of the Council cannot effectually be continued, he may close or adjourn the meeting.

#### Votes of Members of the Council.

80. At meetings of the Council except where he is prohibited from voting by the Act a Councillor present in the Council Chambers when a question is put, shall vote on the question and except where the Act provides otherwise shall vote openly and not by secret ballot.

#### Method of Taking Votes.

81. Except as provided in By-law 42 the President shall, in taking the vote on any motion or amendment, put the question, first in the affirmative, and then in the negative, and he may do so as often as is necessary to enable him to form and declare his opinion as to whether the affirmative or the negative has the majority on the voices or by a show of hands.

82. The result of voting openly is determined on the count of raised hands, but may be determined on the voices unless a member of the Council calls for a show of hands and upon a vote on the voices or on a show of hands being taken, a Councillor may call for a division.

83. The division shall thereupon be taken by those voting in the affirmative passing to the right of the chair and those voting in the negative to the left of the chair.

84. Upon a division being called for, the President may, if he thinks fit, order that the division bell be rung, and after the lapse of one half minute from the bell ceasing to ring a Councillor shall not be permitted to enter or leave the Chamber, until after the division has been taken.

85. The names of the Members of the Council who voted on the question on which there is the division shall be recorded by the Shire Clerk in respect of every division, together with details of whether they voted in the affirmative or negative, together with the names of any Member who abstained from voting.

#### Confidential Business.

86. Every matter dealt with by, or brought before the Council sitting otherwise than with open doors, or before any Committee of the Council, shall be treated as strictly confidential, and shall not without the authority of the Council or of the Committee (as the case may be) be disclosed to any person other than the President, Councillors or the officers or employees of the Council (and in the case of employees only so far as may be necessary for the performance of their duties) prior to the discussion of that matter at a meeting of the Council held with open doors.

#### ORDER OF DEBATE.

##### Motions and Amendments.

87. When a motion is under debate at a meeting of the Council another motion shall not be received unless it be a motion authorised by the Act or these By-laws or one of a nature necessary for the proper observance of the Act and these By-laws.

##### Permissible Motions During Debate.

88. In addition to the other motions authorised by the Act and these By-laws, the following motions may be received when a motion is under debate.

- (1) That the motion be amended.
- (2) That the Council adjourn.
- (3) That the debate be adjourned.
- (4) That the question be now put.
- (5) That the Council do proceed with the next business.
- (6) That the question lie on the table.
- (7) That the Council do sit behind closed doors.
- (8) That the meeting be now closed.

The mover of any of the abovementioned motions must not have moved, seconded or spoken on the matter then before the meeting.

- (1) That the Motion be Amended.

##### Relevancy of Amendment.

89. Every amendment shall be relevant to the motion on which it is moved.

##### To be Read or Stated.

90. Every amendment shall be read or stated before being moved.

##### One Amendment at a Time.

91. Only one amendment shall be discussed at a time. As often as an amendment is lost, another amendment may be moved before the original motion is put to the vote. Where an amendment is carried, one further amendment to the original motion, as amended, and no more, may be moved.

92. In speaking to an amendment a Councillor may give notice of his intention to move a further amendment.

93. Where an amendment is carried, the original motion as amended, shall for all purposes of subsequent debate and subject only to By-law 91 be treated as an original motion.

- (2) That the Council Adjourn.

94. A Councillor may, at the conclusion of the speech of any other Councillor or on the conclusion of any business, move without notice that the Council adjourn and that motion shall state the time and date to which the adjournment is to be made.

## Limit on Speaking.

95. On a motion to adjourn, the mover may speak for not more than five minutes, the seconder shall not speak other than formally to second and the mover of the motion (if any) which was then under debate may speak for not more than five minutes but no other debate shall be allowed.

## No Discussion—Procedure Before Further Motion.

96. If any motion for adjournment of the Council is negatived, the subject then under consideration or the next on the notice paper, or any other that may be allowed precedence, shall be discussed before any subsequent motion for adjournment shall be entertained.

## Question Adjourned to Next Meeting.

97. On a resolution for adjournment, the question (if any) under debate when the motion for adjournment was made shall stand adjourned to the next meeting.

## One Motion Only.

98. At the same sitting no Councillor may move or second more than one motion for the adjournment of the Council.

## Record of Members Who Have Spoken.

99. On a motion for the adjournment of the Council being carried, a record shall be taken of all those who have spoken on the subject under consideration at the time of the adjournment and they shall not be permitted to speak on any subsequent consideration of the same subject, but this By-law does not deprive a mover of the right of reply.

## (3) That the Debate be Adjourned.

100. A Councillor may, at the conclusion of the speech of another Councillor, move without previous notice that the debate be adjourned to a later hour of the same day or to any other day.

## Limit on Speaking.

101. On a motion that the debate be adjourned, the mover may speak for not more than five minutes, the seconder shall not speak other than formally to second, and no other debate shall be allowed, but if the question then before the Council is a recommendation from a Committee, the Chairman of the Committee concerned, or in his absence a member thereof, may speak for not more than five minutes.

## Mover to Speak First.

102. On resuming an adjourned debate, the Councillor who moved its adjournment shall be entitled to speak first.

## One Motion Only.

103. At the same meeting of the Council no Councillor shall move or second more than one motion for adjournment of the same debate.

## Record of Members Who Have Spoken.

104. On a motion for the adjournment of a debate being carried, a record shall be taken of all those who have spoken on the subject under debate and they shall not be permitted to speak on any resumption of the debate on that subject, but this By-law does not deprive a mover of the right of reply.

## (4) That the Question Be Now Put.

105. A Councillor may, at the conclusion of the speech of any other Councillor, move without comment, that the question under consideration be now put, and upon that motion being seconded, the same shall immediately be put, without debate.

## Two-Thirds Majority.

106. A motion that the consideration of the question be now put shall not be decided in the affirmative or take effect without the consent of a two-thirds majority of the Members present.

## Speaking in Reply.

107. Whenever it is decided by the Council that the question under consideration shall be put, the mover of the question under consideration shall, if debate has ensued, and if otherwise entitled to do so, be permitted to speak in reply before the question is put.

## Motion to be Put at Once.

108. Should the motion be carried, the motion or amendment under debate shall be put at once.

## Question Includes Amendment.

109. Whenever it is decided by the Council that the question under consideration shall be put, the question to be so put from the Chair shall be construed and taken to mean and include the main question as well as any amendment thereto.

## (5) That the Council Do Proceed to the Next Business.

110. It shall be competent for any Councillor at the close of the speech of any other Councillor to move without notice that the Council do proceed to the next business, and if the motion be seconded, it shall be put forthwith, without debate.

## Question to be Dropped.

111. When a motion be carried that the Council do proceed to the next business, the question under discussion shall be considered as dropped.

## Further Motion.

112. During the same debate, a second motion that the Council do proceed with the next business shall not be made within one hour.

## (6) That the Question Lie On the Table.

113. A Councillor may at the conclusion of the speech of any other Councillor, move without comment that the motion or amendment under consideration lie on the table and upon that motion being seconded, the same shall immediately be put without debate.

## Question Includes Amendment.

114. Whenever it is decided by Council that the Question under consideration shall lie on the table, if it is passed in respect of an amendment, both the amendment and the substantive motion to which it relates must lie on the table.

## Resumption of Discussion.

115. The Council may at any time resolve to take the question from the table.

## (7) That the Council do Sit Behind Closed Doors.

116. A Councillor may at the conclusion of the speech of any other Councillor move without comment that the Council do sit behind closed doors and upon that motion being seconded, the same shall immediately be put without debate.

## Closed Doors.

117. Whenever it is decided by the Council that the Council sit behind closed doors the provision of By-law 12 shall apply.

## (8) That the Meeting be Now Closed.

118. A Councillor may, at the conclusion of the speech of any other Councillor or on the conclusion of any business, move, without notice, that the meeting of the Council be now closed.

## Limit on Speaking.

119. On a motion that the Council meeting be closed, the mover may speak for not more than five minutes, the seconder shall not speak other than formally to second and the mover of the motion (if any) then under debate may speak for not more than five minutes; but no other debate shall be allowed.

## Motion Negatived.

120. If a motion that the meeting of the Council be closed is negatived, a similar motion shall not be moved until after the question then under discussion or the next on the notice paper or any other which may be allowed precedence has been disposed of.

## Resumption of Debate.

121. On a motion that the meeting be closed being carried, the debate on the question (if any) under debate when that motion was moved shall stand adjourned to its place on the notice paper for the next meeting of the Council.

## Record of Members Who Have Spoken.

122. On a motion that the meeting be closed being carried, a record shall be taken of all those who have spoken on the subject under consideration up to the closing of the meeting and they shall not be permitted to speak on any subsequent consideration of the same subject; but this clause does not deprive a mover of the right of reply.

## COMMITTEES.

## Standing Committees.

123. In addition to such Occasional Committees as may from time to time be appointed, there shall be the following Standing Committees appointed from among the Councillors.

- (1) Town Planning Committee.
- (2) Works and Recreation Committee.
- (3) Health and Building Committee.

## Membership—Standing Committees.

124. The members of each Standing Committee shall be appointed at the first ordinary meeting of the Council held after the annual election and shall, subject to By-law 128, hold office until the commencement of the first ordinary meeting of the Council held after the next annual election.

## Occasional Committees.

125. The Council may appoint Occasional Committees to perform any duty which may be lawfully entrusted by it to a Committee.

## Election of Committees.

126. The members of the said Committee shall, in default of agreement, be elected by ballot.

## Maximum Number of Members of a Committee.

127. The number of the members of a Committee (inclusive of an ex officio member) shall be less than one-half of the total number of the members of the Council.

## Changes and Vacancies in Committees.

128. The Council may, by resolution carried pursuant to a notice of motion, by a majority, or on a motion moved without notice, by an absolute majority, change, subtract from, or add to the membership of any Committee or appoint substitutes for Councillors absent pursuant to leave granted by the Council, and fill any vacancies.

## Division of Functions.

129. A Standing Committee shall not interfere in any matter which, for the time being has been entrusted to an Occasional Committee.

## Membership.

130. The members of a Committee shall be members of the Council except in cases where the Act otherwise permits.

## Convening Committee Meetings.

131. The Shire Clerk shall call a meeting of any Committee when requested so to do by the President or the Chairman or any two members of such Committee.

## Quorum.

132. At a meeting of a Committee unless otherwise determined by the Council a quorum shall consist of not less than three members. Every meeting shall proceed to business so soon after the time stated as there shall be a sufficient number of members in attendance to constitute a quorum.

## Voting.

133. The decision of a Committee on a question is that decided by a majority of the votes of the members present, including the Chairman who has a deliberative vote, and who in the case of an equal division of votes, has a casting vote.

## Minutes.

134. Each Committee shall keep minutes of all its proceedings and transactions. The minutes of each meeting shall be kept in a Minute Book and shall be confirmed at the following meeting and signed by the Chairman thereof.

## Standing Orders.

135. These Standing Orders shall apply in committees and shall be observed, except the order limiting the number of times of speaking.

## Open Doors.

136. The business of the committee shall be conducted with open doors unless the committee by resolution otherwise resolves.

## Public Participation.

137. Committees are empowered to invite members of the public whom they feel can assist them in their deliberation, to attend Committee meetings and to enter into discussions with the committee.

## Reports.

138. Every Committee shall report to the Council.

## Committee Recommendations.

139. Where the question before Council is a recommendation from a Standing Committee of the Council, a Councillor may at the conclusion of the speech of any other Councillor, move without notice that the question be referred back to the Committee, and on any such motion the mover may speak for not more than five minutes, the seconder shall not speak other than formally to second, and the Chairman of the Standing Committee concerned, or in his absence a member thereof may speak for not more than five minutes, but no other debate shall be allowed.

## MISCELLANEOUS.

## Election of President or Deputy President.

140. A nomination to the position of President or Deputy President is not required to be seconded.

141. For election of a President or Deputy President, the Shire Clerk shall—

- (1) Count the voting papers prior to counting votes to ensure that all voting papers are in his possession.
- (2) Count the votes behind a screen in order to maintain complete secrecy of the ballot.

## Representation on Public Bodies.

142. Whenever it becomes necessary to appoint a Member of the Council to represent the Council on a public body or a State Instrumentality, notice of the necessity to make that appointment shall if time permits be given at the meeting of the Council immediately preceding the meeting at which it is intended to make the appointment.

## Protection of Officers and Servants.

143. If a Councillor has any complaint concerning the ability, character or integrity of any officer or employee of the Council or of any act or omission of such officer or employee and desires to bring such complaint to the notice of the Council he shall (unless the matter requires an immediate decision of the Council) notify the President of such complaint, giving such details as are available in order that the complaint may be investigated by Council.

144. If a complaint or criticism be made concerning an officer or employee of the Shire, whether by a Member of the Council or by any other person, that officer or employee shall be given the right, if he so wishes, to reply to the complaint or criticism either personally or in writing to the Council itself.

Meetings of Electors and Ratepayers.

145. (1) A person who is not an elector is not entitled to vote at a meeting of electors, and he may not take any part in any discussion at that meeting, unless the meeting, by a Motion, requests him to do so.

(2) A person who is not a ratepayer is not entitled to vote at a meeting of ratepayers and he may not take any part in any discussion at that meeting unless the meeting, by a Motion, requests him to do so.

146. Subject to the Act, the President shall be Chairman of the meeting.

147. All questions, if answered at the meeting, shall be answered by the President unless he feels that the Shire Clerk or another Councillor may wish to answer the question.

148. If any question cannot readily be answered at the meeting by the President or his nominee, the answer shall be given in writing, by Council, to the person who asked the question.

149. The President may close a meeting when, in his discretion, he decides to do so.

150. The Standing Orders relating to Council meetings shall so far as practicable, apply to meetings of ratepayers or electors.

Enforcement of Standing Orders.

151. The President shall be responsible for the enforcement of these Standing Orders and may prosecute for any breach thereof.

Penalty.

152. Any person committing a breach of these Standing Orders is liable to a penalty not exceeding one hundred dollars.

Affixing of Common Seal.

153. The form of the Sealing Clause of the Council of the Shire of Mundaring is—

154. The Shire Clerk is responsible for the care of the Common Seal and shall keep it in safe custody.

155. The Common Seal shall not be affixed to any document unless—  
(1) The Council has, at any meeting of the Council, directed that the Common Seal be affixed to that document, and  
(2) It is affixed by the President in the presence of the Shire Clerk or the persons acting in these capacities who shall both attest to the affixing of the Common Seal in the manner prescribed in By-law 153.

156. The Shire Clerk shall cause to be kept a register of all documents to which the Common Seal of the Council has been affixed.

## Schedule.

## REGULATIONS.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Abrasive Blasting Regulations, 1977.
2. The Abrasive Blasting Regulations, published in the *Government Gazette* on the 11th October, 1967, as amended by a notice published in the *Government Gazette* on the 16th January, 1976, are hereby revoked.
3. In these regulations unless the contrary intention appears—
  - “abrasive blasting” means the cleaning, smoothing, roughening or removing part of the surface of any article by the use, as an abrasive, of sand, metal, shot or grit or other material, propelled by a blast of compressed air or steam or by a wheel;
  - “blasting chamber” means a blasting enclosure into which persons enter for the purposes of carrying out therein abrasive blasting operations;
  - “blasting enclosure” means a chamber, barrel, cabinet or similar enclosure designed for the carrying out of abrasive blasting therein;
  - “the Act” means the Factories and Shops Act, 1963, as amended from time to time.
4. (1) These regulations apply to any factory where abrasive blasting is done, other than a factory to which the Foundry Regulations, 1963, continued in force by the Act, apply.  
(2) These regulations shall apply to premises to which the operation of the Factories and Shops Act, 1963 has been extended in accordance with section 6 of the Act and in which abrasive blasting is done.
5. (1) The occupier shall provide positive pressure helmets, for the use of all persons—
  - (a) employed in a blasting chamber or blasting enclosure; and
  - (b) engaged in or directly assisting in abrasive blasting done in any area outside of a blasting chamber or blasting enclosure.(2) A person for whose use a positive pressure helmet is provided pursuant to subregulation (1) of this regulation, shall wear it while he is employed in abrasive blasting.  
(3) A person who is employed in abrasive blasting in a blasting chamber shall not remove his positive pressure helmet until he is outside of the blasting chamber.
6. (1) The occupier shall cause each positive pressure helmet to bear a distinguishing mark indicating the person by whom it is intended to be used.  
(2) No person shall wear or be required to wear a positive pressure helmet which does not bear his distinguishing mark, or a positive pressure helmet which has been worn by another person and which has not since been thoroughly cleaned.
7. The occupier shall cause each positive pressure helmet to be maintained in good working order at all times.
8. (1) Where any person employed in assisting at abrasive blasting has to work in an area contaminated by fine silica dust, the occupier shall provide or cause the person to be provided with an efficient means of preventing that person from inhaling any fine silica dust.  
(2) For the purposes of subregulation (1) of this regulation, the occupier may provide masks or suitable air supplied hoods.
9. In addition to the requirements of regulations 5 and 8 of these regulations, the occupier shall provide effective protective equipment and clothing for the use of all persons employed at or assisting in abrasive blasting.
10. All persons who have been provided with protective equipment or clothing shall use or wear the equipment or clothing while employed at or assisting in abrasive blasting.

SCHEDULE—*continued*

11. Air which is to be fed into any air supplied hood or breathing apparatus shall be drawn into the compressor from an area removed from the site of abrasive blasting where there is no possibility of the compressed air being contaminated with fine silica dust and exhaust fumes from the internal combustion engine driving the compressor.

12. Air shall be supplied to any air supplied hood or breathing apparatus at the rate of not less than 0.17 cubic metre per minute and prior to entering protective helmets shall be passed through—

- (a) an efficient filter to remove dust, oil, gas and other potentially harmful contaminants;
- (b) an efficient conditioner which will deliver air at a comfortable temperature, not lower than 15° Celsius and not higher than 27° Celsius;
- (c) an efficient condensate trap fitted with a drain cock to remove any condensed liquid;
- (d) an efficient pressure reducing or limiting device; and
- (e) a valve provided for each operator with an efficient control whereby the wearer can regulate the flow of air to suit his needs.

13. The occupier shall cause any filtering system referred to in paragraph (a) of regulation 12 of these regulations to be cleaned daily.

14. Where possible, all abrasive blasting is to be carried out in a suitable blasting enclosure or blasting chamber which shall conform to the requirements of regulation 15 of the Foundry Regulations continued in force by the Act.

15. Where abrasive blasting is carried out in a blasting chamber, shot or other material containing not more than five per cent (5%) silica shall be used as the blasting agent.

16. When abrasive blasting is carried out outside a blasting chamber or blasting enclosure, the occupier shall cause the abrasive blasting to be carried out so that no blasting unit in operation is located upwind from another unit or operator, in such a position as to expose workers to the dust generated in the process or to contaminate the air supplied to operators' helmets, and the minimum distance from the air inlet to the compressor, to the blasting nozzle shall be eighteen metres.

17. When abrasive blasting is carried out in the open the best practicable means shall be adopted to trap overspray, minimise the dust flurries and prevent general pollution of the air with dust.

18. The occupier shall not cause or permit any employee not engaged in abrasive blasting to enter into any area where abrasive blasting is being carried out in the open and shall cause notices to that effect to be erected in and about that area.

19. The occupier shall not cause or permit—

- (a) any male person under the age of eighteen years or any female employee to be employed in, or employed in assisting in, any abrasive blasting;
- (b) any other person who has not previously been employed in, or employed in assisting in, abrasive blasting to be so employed for more than fourteen days unless that person has submitted to a medical examination, including an X-ray, and the result of that examination has indicated that the health of that person will not be endangered by his being so employed;
- (c) any person previously employed in, or employed in assisting in abrasive blasting to continue to be so employed unless that person at such intervals as are directed by the Chief Inspector, having regard to the results of previous medical examinations of that person and all other relevant circumstances, submits to an examination of the kind referred to in paragraph (b) of this regulation and the results thereof are of the kind referred to in that paragraph.

20. Any person who—

- (a) does any act or thing which by these regulations he is forbidden to do;
  - (b) fails or omits to do any act or thing which by these regulations he is required to do,
- commits an offence.

Penalty: One hundred dollars.

REGULATIONS.

- Principal regulations. 1. In these regulations the Factories (Health and Safety) Regulations, published in the *Government Gazette* on the 11th October, 1967, and amended by notices so published on the 16th January, 1976 and the 30th January, 1976, are referred to as the principal regulations.
- Reg. 14 substituted. 2. Regulation 14 of the principal regulations is revoked and remade as follows—
14. (1) For the purposes of this Part, "confined space" means any compartment or space in which because of the dimensions of the compartment or space, a worker is required to work in a cramped or otherwise restricted position, or without proper ventilation, or adequate egress.
- (2) Whenever any work within a factory is to be performed in a confined space in which there is present or is likely to be present any dangerous gases, flammable liquids or vapours, or any other harmful matter, the occupier shall notify the Chief Inspector before the commencement of such work.
- Reg. 14A added. 3. The principal regulations are amended by adding after regulation 14, the following regulation—
- 14A. (1) Whenever any work is being carried on in a confined space, in a factory, the occupier shall—
- (a) ensure that the confined space is emptied, flushed or otherwise purged of hazardous substances, excessive heat reduced and kept adequately ventilated;
  - (b) cause any openings used for the purpose of ingress or egress to or from the confined space to be maintained free from any encumbrance;
  - (c) if the nature of the work or the conditions existing at the time render difficult the rescue of a worker from the confined space, provide a life-line suitable for the purpose and cause the worker to be kept under observation for the duration of the work;
  - (d) if the nature of the work or conditions existing at the time require any person or persons with such special qualifications as are necessary, having regard to the circumstances existing at the time or that may arise from any situation connected with the work, to render any assistance, cause such a person or persons to be in attendance for the duration of the work;
  - (e) where dust or impurities are produced by the process being carried on in the confined space, cause a supply of fresh air to be provided into the space; and
  - (f) if the process carried on in the confined space renders the use of a respiratory protective device desirable for the safety of the worker therein, provide a suitable device.
- (2) For the purpose of paragraph (f) of subregulation (1) of this regulation, a respiratory protective device is a device which complies with the Australian Standard Specification for Respiratory Protective Devices published by the Standards Association of Australia and numbered AS1716-1975.
