 - (ii) declare a court having summary jurisdiction in a reciprocating State or Territory to be a reciprocating court for the purposes of the en-forcement in this State of a fine payable under a conviction or order of that court against a body corporate in this State; and
 - (b) by subsection (2) of that section that for the purposes of subsection (1) of that section a court may be declared singly or in conjunction with another or others by such description or class or by means of such references as the Governor thinks fit.

Now, therefore, I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and under the provisions of section 171B of the Justices Act, 1902-1976, do hereby-

Suspension of the Prohibited Burning Times.

Bush Fires Board, Perth, 24th August, 1977.

IT is hereby notified that the Hon. Minister administering the Bush Fires Act, under the auth-ority contained in section 17 of the Bush Fires Act, 1954, hereby suspends the operation of all declara-tions prohibiting the setting fire to the bush only so far as the declarations extend to the burning of the bush during the periods from the 1st October. 1977, to the 14th December, 1977, inclusive and from the 1st April, 1978, to the 31st May, 1978, inclusive on land in prohibited burning Zone No. 1 (Metropolitan Fire District Zone) as defined in Government Gazette No. 44 of the 22nd July, 1977, subject to the condition that all burning carried out under the provision of these suspensions shall be carried out in accordance with the conditions specified hereunder:----

Specified Conditions.

Periods 1st October, 1977, to the 14th December, 1977, inclusive and the 1st April, 1978, to the 31st May, 1978, inclusive.

- Where the area of the land on which the proposed burning is to take place does not exceed two thousand square metres:
 - (a) Stumps, fallen trees, limbs of trees branches, logs, cleared scrub and other debris resulting from clearing operations may be burnt provided that a permit to may be burnt provided that a permit to burn is first obtained from an officer ap-pointed by the Council of the municipality in which the land, on which the bush it is proposed to burn, is situated or from an officer appointed by the Fire Brigades Board under the provisions of the Fire Brigades Act. 1942, and the amendments and stationed within the Metropolitan Fire District as defined under that Act and the District as defined under that Act and that the conditions prescribed in the permit are complied with. The permit must be obtained from the office of the Council or the nearest manned Fire Station to the land on which the bush is proposed to be burnt
 - (b) Standing bush may be burnt without a permit provided that-
 - (i) a firebreak at least one metre wide cleared of all infiammable material has first been provided inside all external boundaries of the land and also immediately surrounding all buildings situated on the land;
 - (ii) at least two able bodied persons fifteen years of age or over are in attendance during the whole of the time in which the fire is burning;
 - (iii) a hose long enough to reach all parts of the area to be burnt is provided and has water flowing through it continuously during the vided whole of the time in which the fire is burning; or
 - (iv) where reticulated water is not available, alternative firefighting equipment of the nature of shovels, rakes, beaters, water in buckets, or similar equipment, sufficient to control the escape of the fire is provided.
- 2 Where the area of the land on which the proposed burning is to take place exceeds two thousand square metres. Bush may only be burnt provided that a firebreak at least three metres wide (or of such greater width as speci-fied in the permit), is first cleared, immediately inside all external boundaries of the land and also immediately surrounding all buildings situated on the land and a permit to burn is obtained from an officer appointed by the Council of the municipality in which the land,

on which the bush it is proposed to burn, is situated or from an officer appointed by the Fire Brigades Board under the provisions of the Fire Brigades Act, 1942, and amendments and stationed within the Metropolitan Fire District as defined under that Act and that the conditions prescribed in the permit are com-plied with. The permit must be obtained from the office of the Council or the nearest manned Fire Station to the land on which the bush is proposed to be burnt.

Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraphs (1) and (2) herein, an officer appointed by the Council of the municipality in which the land, on which the bush it is proposed to burn, is situated or an officer appointed by the Fire Brigades Board under the provisions of the Fire Brigades Act, 1942, and amendments and stationed within the Metropolitan Fire District as defined under that Act may refuse to issue a permit to set fire to the bush on any land, if in his opinion, it would not be safe for the proposed burning to be carried out.

Specified Conditions.

Periods 1st October 1977, to the 14th December, 1977, inclusive and the 1st April, 1978, to the 31st May, 1978, inclusive.

Garden refuse or rubbish may be burnt:---

(a) In an Incinerator.

Garden refuse or rubbish may be burnt at any time of the day or night provided it is burnt in a properly constructed incinerator designed to prevent the escape of sparks or burning material. The incinerator must be situated not less than two metres from any building or fence. All infiammable material must be cleared and kept clear for a distance of at least one metre from the incinerator. (The local Council may upon being satisfied that no fire hazard is likely to occur, give permission in writing for the incinerator to be situated at a lesser distance than two metres from any building or fence.)

(b) On the ground.

Garden refuse or rubbish may be burnt, at any time of the day or night, upon ground from which all bush or other all bush or other inflammable material is thorougly cleared within one metre of all points of the site of the fire, provided that at least two able bodied persons, 15 years of age or over, are present during the whole of the time the fire is burning. A hose must also be provided which has water flowing through it continuously and which is long enough to reach all parts of the area to be burnt. If reticulated water is not available, alternative firefighting equipment must be provided such as shovels, rakes, beaters, water in buckets or similar equipment sufficient to control the escape of the fire.

Period 15th December, 1977 to the 31st March, 1978, inclusive.

Garden refuse or rubbish may be burnt:---

(a) In an Incinerator.

Garden refuse or rubbish may be burnt at any time of the day or night provided it is burnt in a properly constructed incinerator designed to prevent the escape of sparks or burning material. The incinerator must be situated not less than two metres from any building or fence. All inflammable material must be cleared and kept clear for a distance of at least two metres from the incinerator.

(The local Council may, upon being satisfied that no fire hazard is likely to occur, give permission in writing for the incinerator to be situated at a lesser distance than two metres from any building or fence).

(b) On the ground.

Garden refuse or rubbish may be burnt upon ground from which all bush or other infiammable material is thoroughly cleared within one metre of all points of the site of the fire. The fire may only be lit between the hours of 6 o'clock in the evening and 11 o'clock of the same day and must be completely extinguished not later than midnight and that day. The person who lights the fire must completely extinguish the fire before he leaves it.

Immediately inside land on which bush has been bulldozed, chained, or prepared in any similar manner for clearing by burning, (whether you intend to burn the bush or not), provided that the firebreak required to comply with this paragraph only, shall be not less than 7 metres wide. Where the land is prepared for clearing by burning after the 15th day of October, 1977, you shall provide the firebreak immediately.

If it is considered to be impracticable for any reason to clear firebreaks as required by this notice, you may apply to the Council or its duly authorised officer not later than the 11th day of October, 1977, for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions on the land. If permission is not granted by the Council, or its duly authorised officer, you shall comply with the requirements of this notice.

If it is intended to clear the area around the buildings by burning, a permit must be obtained from the Local Bush Fire Control Officer.

If it is impracticable for any reason to complete the clearing of firebreaks in the positions, or by the date required by this notice, application must be made not later than the 18th October, 1977, to the Quairading Shire Council for permission to place the breaks in an alternative situation or to complete the clearing of breaks by a later date to be determined by the Council.





By-Laws Relating to Fences.

E.F-7-25.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on the 18th day of July, 1977 to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following By-Laws:

1. In these By-Laws unless the context otherwise requires the following terms shall have the meanings set against them hereunder respectively:

"Council" means the Council of the Town of East Fremantle.

"dangerous fence" means a fence that is likely to collapse of fall or part of which is likely to fall by reason of faulty design, location, construction, deterioration of materials, damage by termites, decay, changes in ground level or any other cause.

"dividing fence" has the meaning given to it by the Dividing Fence Act, 1961.

"fence" includes a wall and a retaining wall.

2. No person shall commence to erect or re-build construct or re-construct or alter any fence or any hood or pergla forming part of a fence—

(a) exceeding 1.5 metres in height abutting or within 7.6 metres of a street alignment; or

(b) exceeding 1.8 metres in height on any lot boundary or adjacent thereto, unless he has lodged with the Council two copies of the plan and specification of a proposed fence and the proposed alterations or reconstructions and unless the Council has approved the said plans and specifications.

3. No person shall-

- (a) erect a fence constructed otherwise than of one or more of the following: brick, concrete, masonry, wrought iron, tubular steel, link mesh, timber, asbestos or other materials approved by the Council;
- (b) in the case of an allotment situated at the intersection of two streets, erect a fence situated at the lot boundary facing the less important of the two streets for a distance of at least 7.6 metres along that street of a design and of materials different from those of the fence along the frontage of the allotment. In the case of a dispute as to which is the less important of the two streets, the decision of the Council shall be final;
- (c) use iron spikes or broken glass on a fence gate or other part of premises or on anything erected on property abutting a street, way, footpath or other public place;
- (d) erect a fence of sheet iron or corrugated iron or use barbed wire on a fence or gate unless the barbed wire is not less than 2 metres above the ground level immediately thereunder without the written consent of the Council, which consent the Council may in its discretion grant on such terms and conditions as it deems fit;
- (e) erect a dangerous fence on or within three metres of the boundary of a public place.

4. (1) The owner of land on which a fence is erected shall maintain the fence in good condition and in such manner as to prevent it from becoming dangerous dilapidated unsightly or prejudicial to the property in or the inhabitants of the neighbourhood.

(2) Where the fence is a dividing fence each of the owners of the adjoining lands is liable to maintain it as required by sub-bylaw (1) hereof.

5. The Council may give notice in writing to the owner or to the occupier of any land upon which there exists a fence that has not been maintained in accordance with By-Law 4 requiring such owner or occupier to pull down remove repair paint or maintain such fence within the time stipulated in the notice.

6. If an owner or occupier of land who has been given notice pursuant to By-Law 5 fails to comply therewith the Council may enter upon such land and maintain the fence and recover the amount of the expenses thereof from the owner in a Court of competent jurisdiction and may prosecute the owner for committing a breach of By-Law 4.

7. A person who fails to comply with a notice given to him pursuant to By-Law 5 or who does anything which he is prohibited from by these By-Laws or who fails to do a thing which he is required or directed to do by these By-Laws commits an offence.

A fence constructed in accordance with the specifications set out in the 8. schedule hereto is hereby prescribed to be a sufficient fence for the purposes of the Dividing Fences Act, 1961.

9. A person who is guilty of an offence against these By-Laws is liable to-

(a) a maximum penalty of \$200.00;

(b) a maximum daily penalty during the breach of \$20.00 per day;

(c) a minimum penalty of \$20.00; and

(d) a minimum daily penalty during the breach of \$2.00 per day.

Schedule:

(a) Dividing fence along Front and Side Boundaries:-

Across the frontage and for a distance of 7.6 m from the street alignment along a side boundary, the fence shall comprise either brick, concrete, masonry, wrought iron, tubular steel, link mesh or timber, sheeted with pickets, palings, boardings or asbestos, or other materials approved by the Council, to a height of not more than 1.5 m.

Thereafter along the side boundary the fence shall be as follows:-

Front corner posts shall be 125 mm x 125 mm x 1.8 m and rear corner posts shall be $125 \text{ mm} \times 125 \text{ mm} \times 2.1 \text{m}$ and intermediate posts shall be $125 \text{ mm} \times 2.1 \text{ m}$ and intermediate posts shall be $125 \text{ mm} \times 75 \text{ mm} \times 2.1 \text{ m}$ all spaced at not more than 2.7 m centres.

All posts shall have tops with 38 mm weather and shall be sunk at least 600 mm into the ground.

Corner posts shall be strutted two ways with 100 mm x 50 mm soles and 75 mm x 50 mm strutts.

Intermediate posts shall be double yankee strutted with 150 mm x 25 mm x 450 mm struts.

Posts shall be checked for two rows of rails. Rails shall be 75 mm x 50 mm each rail spanning two bays of fencing with joints staggered.

Fence shall be covered with not less than 75 mm x 19 mm x 1.8 m sawn pickets or palings placed not more than 75 mm apart, double nailed to each rail.

All pickets or palings shall be placed not more than 75 mm apart and shall be double nailed to each rail.

(b) Dividing fence along rear boundary:-

Corner posts shall be not less than $125 \text{ mm} \times 125 \text{ mm} \times 2.1 \text{ m}$ and intermediate posts shall be not less than $125 \text{ mm} \times 75 \text{ mm} \times 2.1 \text{ m}$ spaced at not more than 2.7 m centres.

All posts shall have tops with 38 mm weather and shall be sunk at least 600 mm into the ground.

All corner posts shall be strutted two ways with 100 mm x 50 mm soles and 75 mm struts.

Intermediate posts shall be double yankee strutted with 150 mm x 25 mm x 450 mm struts.

Posts shall be checked for two rows of rails.

Rails shall be not less than 75 mm x 50 mm each rail spanning two bays of fences with joints staggered.

(c) Where all or portion of the side boundary of one lot forms all or portion of the rear boundary of another lot, the provisions relating to rear boundaries shall apply to such side boundary or portion thereof.
