WHEREAS under the provisions of section 5 of the Plant Diseases Act, 1914-1974 it is enacted, *inter alia*, that the Governor may by proclamation prohibit either absolutely or except in accordance with regulations the bringing or sending into the State either generally or from any specified State, country, or place of any specified kind of plant, fruit or other thing which would in his opinion be likely to introduce any disease within the meaning of the Act into the State; and whereas I the Governor, am of the opinion that the bringing or sending into this State from any other State or Territory of the Commonwealth of any plant or part of a plant of the Lucerne species, except for the part specified in the Schedule to this Proclamation would be likely to introduce the disease known as spotted alfalfa aphid (*Therioaphis maculata*)

into this State: Now, therefore, I, the Governor acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by section 5 of the Plant Diseases Act, 1914-1974 do hereby prohibit the bringing or sending into the State from any other State or Territory of the Commonwealth of—

- (a) any part of a plant of the Lucerne species except for the part specified in the Schedule to this Proclamation; and
- (b) the part specified in the Schedule to this Proclamation except in accordance with the regulations specified in that Schedule.

Dianella Branch Drain Sections 6 and 7—Dianella and Morley.

Works comprise a three hundred and seventy-five millimetre to one thousand and fifty millimetre diameter piped drain approximately one thousand four hundred metres long, and two open earth compensating basins all as shown on plan M.W.B. 14550. Works to be complete with all apparatus and things connected therewith.

(The said drain was constructed, by Contractors working under instructions from Consulting Engineers and to the overall satisfaction of this Board, as part of the works required for Bayswater Shire Council Town Planning Scheme No. 17. To complete takeover formalities the Board will, in due course, constitute the said works as a Metropolitan Main Drain.)

Transfer of Territory from the City of Gosnells to the town of Canning.

REGULATIONS.

1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Security Agents Act Regulations.
(2) In these regulations the Security Agents Act, 1976, is referred to as "the Act".

2. (1) The forms prescribed for the purposes of the Act are set out in the schedule to these regulations, and are referred to in these regulations by their respective designations.

(2) A notice of objection to the grant, renewal or transfer of a licence, or to the operation of a temporary licence, is not required to be in a prescribed form.

3. (1) The application form referred to in the first column of the table hereunder shall be used for the purpose specified in relation thereto in the second column.

Application Forms.

B	on behalf of a firm or corporation.

(2) The application form required may be obtained without charge from, and should be sent, together with the application fee payable, to the Commissioner of Police, Police Headquarters, 2 Adelaide Terrace, Perth, 6000.

(3) The fee payable on making an application for the grant or transfer of a general or restricted licence for a purpose set out in the first column of the table hereunder shall be the amount shown in relation thereto in the second column of that table.

(4) No fee is payable in respect of the making of an application for the renewal of a licence, but a licence is not renewable as of right.

(5) The fee payable on the issue of any licence granted, transferred or renewed for a purpose set out in the first column of the table hereunder shall be the amount shown in relation thereto in the second column of that table, but in relation to any period of less than one year the fee that would otherwise be payable in respect of a year shall be apportioned rateably as to one-twelfth part for each month or part of a month for which the licence is to have effect.

Guard	\$6.00

(6) Where a licence is surrendered voluntarily, a refund of the licence fee shall be payable, apportioned rateably as to one-twelfth part for each whole month of the unexpired period for which that licence would otherwise have taken effect.

(7) Where an application is submitted for a licence to be used on behalf of a firm or corporation four copies should be lodged, and in any other case three copies.

(8) An applicant may be required to present himself at a time and place determined by the licensing officer for the purpose of being photographed.

(9) Where a photograph of the applicant is required to be submitted by the applicant himself four copies shall be lodged each 25 mm wide by 35 mm high, in colour, on unglazed paper (not being a print from an automatic self-portrait machine) showing the applicant's head and shoulders taken full face, without hat, and with a light background.

(10) The application for a transfer of a licence shall be made as though it were an application for the grant of a licence, but shall be endorsed with the consent of the transferor and on behalf of the firm or corporation (if any) named in the original licence as that for the benefit of which the licence is to be used.

(11) The fee payable in an application to vary the conditions relating to a licence, which may be made personally or in writing, shall be \$10.00 but no fee is payable in respect of the making of the variation.

(12) The fee payable on the issue of a duplicate licence shall be \$2.00.

4. For the purposes of subsection (4) of section 13 of the Act the notice to be published in a newspaper shall be in the form of the Notice of Application set out in the Schedule to these regulations, subject to any modification approved by the licensing officer for the purposes of subsection (5) of that section.

5. The forms of licence referred to by the numbers in the first column of the table hereunder shall be used for the purposes specified in relation thereto in the second column.

6. The categories of business that may be licensed for the purposes of the Act shall be—

- (a) General—comprising all classes of business;
- (b) Restricted—either specifically by the conditions, limitations or restrictions specified in the licence, or by reference to one or more of the following classes of business—
 - (i) Patrol Guard: general type guards involved in mobile or static duties (e.g. store security and surveillance);
 - (ii) Armed Guards: guards engaged in escorting and guarding cash and valuables;
 - (iii) Electronic Surveillance: guards engaged as control operators for surveillance of electronic alarm systems;
 - (iv) Consultant and Investigator: guards engaged in investigating and advising persons on matters of security;
- (c) Specially restricted—by reference to specific regulations having effect in relation to specified classes of business or the performing of authorized functions under specified circumstances; and
- (d) Temporary—pursuant to subsection (4) of section 8 of the Act and these regulations.

7. (1) With the consent of the Commissioner an application for the grant of a temporary licence may be made otherwise than on the prescribed form.

(2) A temporary licence shall be deemed to be subject to the condition that it shall cease to have effect if the licensing officer, on his own initiative or by reason of objections received, serves on the holder a notice terminating the licence.

(3) No temporary licence shall be granted to a person on the application of a firm or corporation to enable him to carry out functions in the employ of, or acting for or by arrangement with, that firm or corporation unless the licensing officer is satisfied by that firm or corporation, by way of statutory declaration or otherwise, that all reasonable enquiries have been made regarding the prospective licensee and that no objection to the application is likely to be sustained on any of the grounds specified in subsection (2) of section 15 of the Act.

(4) The fees payable on the application for and the issue of a temporary licence shall be the same as would be payable in respect of a licence of that kind other than a temporary licence.

(5) Where the holder of a temporary licence is during the currency of that licence granted a general or restricted licence in respect of the same class of business, the fee paid in respect of the issue of the temporary licence shall, as to any whole month remaining unexpired, be rateably credited against the fee payable on the issue of the general or restricted licence.

8. Every licence issued on behalf of a firm or corporation shall be subject to the condition that the Commissioner shall be notified in writing forthwith of any change in—

- (a) the position held by, or the duties of, the holder;
- (b) the persons who together constitute the firm or corporation; or
- (c) the persons responsible in the State for the management of that firm or corporation,

and that it shall cease to have effect on the date specified in that notice if the licensing officer serves on the holder a notice in writing terminating the licence.

9. Where during the currency of a licence issued on behalf of a firm or corporation named therein—

- (a) the holder of a security agent's licence ceases to carry out his functions as such for or on behalf of that firm or corporation; or
- (b) any change is made in the persons who together constitute that firm, or in relation to the persons responsible in the State for the management of the firm or corporation, and a notice is served to terminate the licence pursuant to regulation 8 of these regulations,

and the licensing officer is satisfied as to the circumstances he may, subject to the Act and these regulations, make provision by way of a temporary licence for the business to be carried on pending an application for the transfer of that licence.

10. A transfer of a licence or any variation in the conditions applicable shall be endorsed on the original licence to which it relates.

11. For the purposes of section 21 of the Act the Clerk of a Court of Petty Sessions shall, not later than the seventh day in each month, forward to the licensing officer through the Commissioner a return specifying the particulars of any licences granted, suspended or cancelled or persons refused or disqualified in the preceding month in the form of the Petty Sessional Return set out in the Schedule to these regulations.

12. (1) The Register to be kept for the purposes of section 23 of the Act shall record all applications, fees paid, and licences issued under the Act, and shall contain photographs of all licence holders and such other matters as the Commissioner may direct but shall not contain information furnished as to the character of any applicant or documents relating to the conduct of any business.

(2) The Register shall be maintained at Police Headquarters, 2 Adelaide Terrace, Perth, and shall be available for inspection Monday to Friday between the hours of 8.00 a.m. to 4.00 p.m. upon payment of a fee of \$1.00 for each licence the entries relating to which are inspected.

(3) A certificate under the hand of the licensing officer as to any matter contained in the Register shall be furnished upon payment of a fee of \$3.00 for each licence relating to which a certificate is required.

13. The holder of a guard's licence, and a security agent who is performing the function of a guard, shall carry when performing functions subject to the Act and produce on demand an identification card containing his photograph issued by and stamped on behalf of the Commissioner, setting out his name, business address and licence number.

Penalty: Two hundred dollars.

14. For the purposes of section 34 of the Act every security agent shall prepare and maintain a record showing—

- (a) the full names and current residential address of every guard supplied by him;
- (b) full particulars of the name and address of every person provided with security services, including full particulars of the type of security required, and the fee charged for the service;
- (c) a grid map showing the circuit of every patrol and the address of premises to be checked;
- (d) a guard instruction manual;
- (e) a daily operations roster for guards; and
- (f) a time card or log book indicating hourly movement of staff,

in a manner approved by the licensing officer, and shall produce the same on demand to the licensing officer.

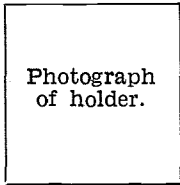

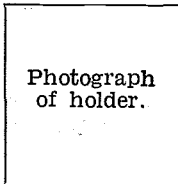

(ii) No person shall erect along any side boundary of any allotment of land for a distance of 7.5 metres from the frontage or the distance that a dwelling is sited forward of the building line any fence exceeding 1.1 metres in height without the prior written approval of the Council which approval shall in any event only be given if the side fence is the same height as the fence along the frontage of the said land, or that particular side boundary abuts a public recreation reserve or other area set aside for public recreation.

- (2) Where a lot abuts a road reserve on two or more sides a fence in excess of 1.1 metres in height may only be erected with the prior written approval of the Council—
- (a) along any property line which is common to two lots, and
 - (b) along two-thirds of the length of one property line abutting a road reserve.
