Lot 106 as shown on Land Titles Office Plan 2620 Sheet 2; thence southerly to and along that boundary and the western boundaries of Lots 41 to 33 inclusive to the southwestern corner of the last-mentioned lot; thence easterly along the southern boundary of that lot to the western side of Teesdale Street; thence southerly along that side and onwards to the northern boundary of Harvey A.A. Lot 13; thence westerly and southerly along boundaries of that lot and onwards to the southern boundary of the eastern severance of Lot 187; thence easterly along that boundary and onwards to a southeastern side of the Brunswick to Pinjarra Railway Reserve; thence southwesterly along that side and onwards to the southern side of Clifton Road; thence easterly along that side to the prolongation southerly of the eastern boundary of Land Titles Office Lot 23 of Harvey A.A. Lot 163 as shown on Land Titles Office Diagram 19520; thence northerly to and along that boundary to its northernmost corner; thence westerly to and along the northernmost northern boundary of Lot 19 as shown on Land Titles Office Diagram 18402 to the northeastern corner of Lot 1 as shown on Land Titles Office Diagram 10287; thence northerly along the prolongation northerly of the eastern boundary of that lot to the southern boundary of the southern severance of Location 897; thence easterly and northerly along boundaries of that severance and onwards to and along the eastern boundaries of the central and northern severance of that location to the southern boundary of the southeastern severance of Location 826 and thence easterly along that boundary to the starting point, as bordered green on Plan P.W.D., W.A. 50264-1-1 and 1-2.

Minister administering the Bush Fires Act, under the authority contained in Section 17 and 25B of the said Act hereby suspends the operation of all declarations prohibiting the setting fire to the Bush, and suspends the operation of the provisions of paragraphs (d) (1) (d) (ii) and (e) of subsection (1) of Section 25 of the said Act during the periods stated herein and to the extent necessary to allow the burning set out herein, on land within the Kalgoorlie/Boulder Urban Fire District as defined in *Government Gazette* No. 56 of the 22nd August, 1975, subject to the condition that all burning carried out under the provision of these suspensions shall be carried out in accordance with the conditions specified hereunder.

## Specified Conditions.

Period 1st October, 1977, to 31st October, 1978, Inclusive:

1. Bush (including standing grass); Garden Refuse, and Rubbish: May be burnt on land of any area at any time of the day or night subject only to the condition that reasonable precautions are taken to prevent the fire escaping.

Period 1st November, 1977, to 14th December, 1977, Inclusive:

## 2. Garden Refuse and Rubbish:

(a) In an incinerator (any time—day or night). You may burn garden refuse or rubbish at any time of the day or night provided it is burnt in a properly constructed incinerator designed to prevent the escape of sparks or burning material. The incinerator must be situated not less than 2 metres (approx. six feet) from any building or fence. All flammable material must be cleared, and kept clear for a distance of at least 1 metre (approx. three feet) from the incinerator. (The local Council may, upon being satisfied that no fire hazard is likely to occur, give permission in writing for the incinerator to be situated at a lesser distance than 2 metres (approx. six feet) from any building or fence).

(b) on the Ground (any time—day or night). You may burn garden refuse or rubbish, at any time of the day or night, upon ground from which all bush or other flammable material is thoroughly cleared within 1 metre (approx. three feet) of all points of the site of the fire provided that at least two able bodied persons, 15 years of age or over, are present during the whole of the time the fire is burning. A hose must also be provided which has water flowing through it continuously and which is long enough to reach all parts of the area to be burnt. If reticulated water is not available, alternative fire-fighting equipment must be provided such as shovels, rakes, beaters, water in buckets or similar equipment sufficient to control the escape of the fire.

## 3. Bush (including standing grass):

(A) On land of 2 000 square metres (approx. one-half of an acre—normal household block) or under—

Where the area of the land on which the proposed burning is to take place does not exceed 2 000 square metres (approx. one-half of an acre).

(a) Clearing Fires—Permit Required: Fires to clear land of stumps, fallen trees, limbs of trees, branches, logs, cleared scrub and other debris resulting from clearing operations may only be lit provided that a permit to burn is first obtained from a Bush Fire Control Officer of the Local Authority. The conditions set out in the permit must be carried out.

(b) Standing Bush (see definition of "bush"); Except as in A (a) above, standing bush may be burnt without a permit provided that—

(i) a firebreak at least 1 metre (approx. three feet) wide, has first been cleared immediately inside all external boundaries of the land and also immediately surrounding all buildings situated on the land; and

(ii) at least two able bodied persons, 15 years of age or over are in attendance during the whole of the time in which the fire is burning; and

(iii) a hose long enough to reach all parts of the area to be burnt is provided and has water flowing continuously during the whole of the time in which fire is burning; or as an alternative to (iii)

(iv) where reticulated water is not available, alternative firefighting equipment is provided such as shovels, rakes, beaters, water in buckets or similar equipment sufficient to control the escape of the fire.

(B) On land over 2 000 square metres (approx. one-half of an acre) Where the area of the land on which the burning is to take place is over 2 000 square metres (approx. one-half of one acre), bush of all kinds, including standing grass (see definition of "bush"), may only be burnt provided that a firebreak at least three metres (approx. ten feet) wide (or of such greater width as specified in the permit) is first cleared, immediately inside all external boundaries of the land and also immediately surrounding all buildings situated on the land and a permit to burn is first obtained from a Bush Fire Control Officer of the Local Authority. The conditions set out in the permit must also be carried out.

Definition—"Bush": For your information "bush" is defined in section 7 of the Bush Fires Act. The definition is very wide and bush includes trees, bushes, plants, stubble i.e. hay, straw, grass, herbage and all other similar vegetation, scrub and undergrowth of all kinds, whether alive or dead, standing or not standing and any part of the above-named whether severed from the main plant or not.

Period 15th December, 1977, to the 14th April, 1978, inclusive: All burning of bush (including standing grass) is prohibited during this period.

4. Garden Refuse and Rubbish may be burnt as follows:—

(a) In an incinerator (any time—day or night). You may burn garden refuse or rubbish at any time of the day or night provided it is burnt in a properly constructed incinerator designed to prevent the escape of sparks or burning material. The incinerator must be situated not less than 2 metres (approx. six feet) from any building or fence. All flammable material must be cleared and kept clear for a distance of at least 2 metres (approx. 6 feet) from the incinerator. (The local Council may, upon being satisfied that no fire hazard is likely to occur, give permission in writing for the incinerator to be situated at a lesser distance than 2 metres (approx. six feet) from any building or fence).

(b) On the ground (evenings only). You may burn garden refuse or rubbish upon ground from which all bush or other flammable material is thoroughly cleared within three metres (approx. ten feet) of all points of the site of the fire. The fire may only be lit between the hours of 6 o'clock of the same day and must be completely extinguished not later than midnight of that day. The person who lights the fire must completely extinguish the fire before he leaves it.

Period 15th April, 1978 to the 30th April, 1978 inclusive:

5. Bush (including standing grass), Garden Refuse and Rubbish may be burnt subject to the conditions in sections 2 and 3 (1st November to 14th December),

Period 1st May, 1978, to the 31st May, 1978, inclusive:

6. Bush (including standing grass) Garden Refuse and Rubbish may be burnt on the same conditions as in section 1 above (1st October to 31st October).

Notice to Owners and Occupiers of Land in the Beverley Municipality.

PURSUANT to the powers contained in Section 33 of the above Act, you are hereby required on or before the 15th October, 1977 east of the Great Southern Railway or October 30th west of the Great Southern Railway to plough, cultivate, scarify, or otherwise clear, and thereafter maintain free of all inflammable material, until the 15th day of April, 1978, firebreaks not less than 2.2 metres (7 feet) wide in the following positions on the land owned or occupied by you:—

Note: No extensions of time will be granted.

- (1) Inside and within 60.3 metres (3 chain) of the boundary of all cleared land. Uncleared land on boundaries shall be isolated by the provision of an internal break.
- (2) Where the above lands are divided by or abut trafficable public roads or railway reserves a firebreak shall be provided within 60.3 metres (3 chain) of the boundary of the road or railway reserve.
- (3) Within 60.3 metres (3 chain) of the perimeter of all buildings and haystacks on the land, to completely surround the building or group of buildings or haystacks.
- (4) Land, the bush on which has been bulldozed, chained or prepared in any similar manner for clearing or burning shall be completely surrounded by a firebreak 3 metres (10 feet) wide (Note:—firebreaks may be provided on adjoining land).
- (5) Existing gullies, Salt Lakes, rivers or drains shall not form portion of a firebreak required by this order unless approved by the Shire Council.
- (6) Rivers:—On all river banks a firebreak shall be provided on cleared land as close as is practicable but not further than 60.3 metres (3 chain) from high water mark.
- (7) Beverley Townsite:—On or before November 30th 1977, a firebreak 2.2 metres (7 feet) wide completely free of all inflammable material shall be provided inside and along all external boundaries. Additionally all lots of .10 ha ( $\frac{1}{4}$  acre) or less shall be cleared of all inflammable material
- (8) Fuel Drums:—All grass or other inflammable materials must be cleared from areas where fuel drums, either empty or containing fuel are stored or intended to be stored. The cleared area is extended for a distance of 3 metres (10 feet) completely surrounding the fuel drums.

If it is impracticable for any reason to clear firebreaks in the positions required by this notice, the approval of the Council must be obtained to provide them in an alternative situation.

Firebreaks in the situation hereunder will be accepted as complying with the requirements of the notice so far as it applies to the common

boundary between the land of any owner or occupier and the abutting land referred to hereunder:—

Where the land of an owner or occupier abuts, on Crown Land or a Reserve and the owner or occupier has cleared a firebreak not less than 2.2 metres (7 feet) wide on the Crown Land or Reserve along the Common Boundary.

Firebreak Requirements 1977/78.

Notice to all Owners and/or Occupiers of land within the Shire of Northam.

PURSUANT to the powers contained in Section 33 of the above Act, you are hereby required on or before the dates referred to below to clear firebreaks on land owned or occupied by you in

accordance with the following and thereafter to maintain the firebreaks clear of all inflammable material up to and including the 15th day of April, 1978:—

- (1) You shall on or before the 15th day of October, 1977, clear of all inflammable material firebreaks of a least two metres in width immediately inside and along all external boundaries of the land; and
- (2) You shall on or before the 15th day of October, 1977, clear of all inflammable material firebreaks of at least two metres in width in such positions as to divide properties of more than 200 hectares into separate sections of no more than 200 hectares completely surrounded by a firebreak of at least two metres in width; and
- (3) You shall on or before the 15th day of October, 1977, clear of all inflammable material firebreaks of at least two metres in width within 100 metres of the perimeter of all buildings and/or haystacks or groups of buildings and/or haystacks in such a manner as to completely encircle the buildings and/or haystacks; and
- (4) You shall on or before the 29th day of November, 1977, in the Western Section of the Shire of Northam (i.e. all land west of the dividing line described hereunder) and on or before the 15th day of November, 1977, in the Eastern Section of the Shire of Northam (i.e. all land east and south of the dividing line described hereunder), clear of all inflammable material firebreaks of at least two metres in width immediately surrounding all areas of standing crop or standing crop and pasture combined in such positions so as areas of standing crop or standing crop and pasture combined or more than 100 hectares are divided into separate areas of no more than 100 hectares.
- (5) You shall on or before the 15th day of October, 1977, clear of all inflammable material firebreaks of at least three metres in width inside and along all property boundaries which abut a Railway Reserve on which railway traffic operates.
- (6) You shall on or before the 15th day of October, 1977, clear of all inflammable material (including standing and fallen trees, branches and undergrowth) firebreaks of at least three metres in width along and as close as possible to all external boundaries of each separate area of undeveloped land and in such extra positions so as areas of more than 200 hectares are divided into areas of no more than 200 hectares completely surrounded by a firebreak.
- (7) You shall on or before the 15th day of October, 1977, completely clear of all inflammable material all separate townsite lots where the lot is 4 000 square metres or less in area.

**Alternative Firebreaks:** If it is considered to be impracticable for any reason to clear firebreaks or to remove inflammable material from land as required by this notice, you may apply to the Council or its duly authorised officer, not later than the 7th October, 1977, for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions or to take alternative action to abate fire hazards on the land. If permission is not granted by the Council or its duly authorised officer, you shall comply with the requirements of this notice.

**Penalty:** The penalty for failing to comply with this order is a fine of not less than \$10, nor more than \$200, and a person in default is also liable, whether prosecuted or not, to pay the cost of performing the work directed in this order if it is not carried out by the owner or occupier by the date required by this notice.

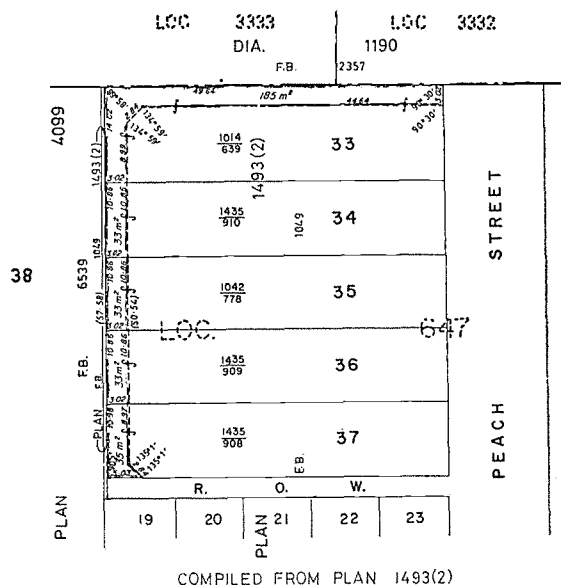

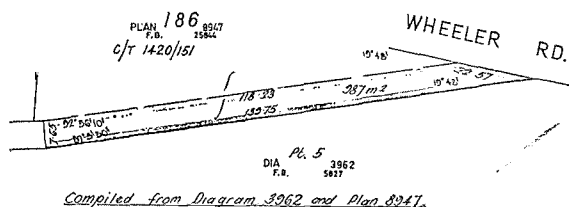

2. By-law 5 (c) is deleted and the following inserted in its place:—

(c) (i) along such of the sides of the land as shall abut a road or roads erect a solid screen fence of opaque materials to a height of not less than 1.8 metres above the crown of the road or roads adjacent to such fence to the satisfaction of the Council but not so as to restrict visibility at an intersection.

(ii) along the remaining sides of the land erect a solid screen fence of opaque materials to a height of not less than 1.8 metres to the satisfaction of the Council".

3. By-law 6 (a) (ii) is amended by deleting the words "200 per 4 000 square metres" in line 3 thereof and substituting the words "100 per 4 000 square metres".

4. By-law 7 is deleted and the following inserted in its place:—

7. Every person contravening the provisions of these by-laws is liable to a maximum penalty of \$200 and in addition a maximum daily penalty of \$20 for each day during which the offence continues; minimum penalty of \$20 and in addition a minimum daily penalty of \$2 for each day during which the offence continues.

FACTORIES AND SHOPS ACT, 1963-1976.

REGULATIONS.

Citation. 1. These regulations may be cited as the Fibreglass Industry Regulations, 1977.

SCHEDULE—*continued*

- Application. 2. (1) Subject to this regulation, these regulations apply to and in relation to—
- (a) any factory in which a fibreglass manufacturing process is carried on; and
  - (b) any premises to which the operation of the Factories and Shops Act, 1963 has been extended in accordance with section 6 of the Act and in which a fibreglass manufacturing process is carried on.
- (2) Regulation 4 does not apply to a factory being used for the purpose of a fibreglass manufacturing process immediately before the date that these regulations take effect until twelve months after that date.
- (3) Notwithstanding anything in subregulation (2) of these regulations, paragraph (b) of subregulation (1) of regulation 4 does not apply to a factory that is—
- (a) being used for a fibreglass manufacturing process at the time that these regulations take effect; and
  - (b) situate in a building that consists of more than one storey until the person who is the occupier of the factory at the time that these regulations take effect ceases to use the factory for a fibreglass manufacturing process.
- (4) Notwithstanding anything in subregulation (2) of this regulation, regulation 4 applies to any factory in which a fibreglass manufacturing process is carried on to which structural alterations are made at any time after these regulations take effect.
- Interpretation. 3. In these regulations, unless the contrary intention appears—
- “approved” means approved in writing by the Chief Inspector;
- “authorized person” means a person authorized by the occupier pursuant to regulation 13;
- “catalyst” means the chemical methyl ethyl ketone peroxide or any chemical that is added to resin for the purpose of initiating polymerisation of a resin;
- “fibreglass manufacturing process” means any manufacturing process involving the reaction of a resin with a catalyst whether or not the product made by the process is reinforced by glass fibres or any other material;
- “flammable liquid” means any liquid that has a flash point below 23°C;
- “hazard area” in relation to a factory to which these regulations apply means any part of the factory in which a catalyst, promoter or resin is used for laminating or spraying and any part of the factory in which a solvent is used for cleaning equipment;
- “low level” means below an imaginary line drawn horizontally 1.3 metres above the level of the floor;
- “lower explosive limit” means the minimum concentration of vapour, gas or dust in the atmosphere of a factory that will propagate a flame;
- “promoter” means the chemical cobalt naphthenate or any other chemical that assists a catalyst in a fibreglass manufacturing process;
- “regulation” means one of these regulations;
- “resin” means a solid, semi-solid or liquid organic material which normally has an indefinite and high molecular weight and which is used as a base in a fibreglass manufacturing process;
- “solvent” means the chemicals acetone, ethyl acetate, ethyl alcohol or any chemical used for dissolving other chemicals used in a fibreglass manufacturing process;
- “threshold limit value” means the maximum permissible concentration of gas, vapour, dust or fumes that may be present in the air of a factory to which these regulations apply as determined from time to time as the maximum permissible concentration for such a factory by the Commissioner of Public Health, appointed under the Health Act, 1911.
- General provisions relating to factory. 4. (1) An occupier shall not, in a factory, carry on a fibreglass manufacturing process unless—
- (a) the factory is separated from other premises by walls that have a fire rating equal to or better than a 2 hour fire rating wall as defined by the Uniform Building By-laws, 1974 (as amended);
  - (b) the factory is situate in a single storey building;
  - (c) the farthest point of the factory from a fire hydrant required by the Fire Brigades Board or local authority, as the case may be, does not exceed 90 metres or such other distance as is approved;
  - (d) the factory has electrical installations which conform to the Electricity Act, 1945 and the regulations made thereunder;

SCHEDULE—*continued.*

- (e) every portion of the factory that is a hazard area has not less than two emergency exits at least one of which is situate not more than 20 metres from any portion of the floor area of the hazard area;
- (f) every emergency exit in the factory has vertically hinged doors that open readily in the direction of egress and without the use of a key or other device;
- (g) the extent of any undivided floor area of the factory, other than office and showroom areas, does not exceed—
- (i) in the case of a building of type 1, 2 or 3 as defined by the Uniform Building By-laws, 1974, an area of 3 500 m<sup>2</sup> where a fire sprinkler system is not provided, or, an area of 5 500 m<sup>2</sup> where a fire sprinkler system is provided;
  - (ii) in the case of a building of type 4 as defined by the Uniform Building By-laws, 1974, an area of 3 000 m<sup>2</sup>, where a fire sprinkler system is not provided, or, an area of 4 500 m<sup>2</sup> where a fire sprinkler system is provided;
  - (iii) in the case of a building of type 5 as defined in the Uniform Building By-laws, 1974, an area of 2 000 m<sup>2</sup> where a fire sprinkler system is not provided, or, an area of 2 800 m<sup>2</sup> where a fire sprinkler system is provided.
- (2) Paragraph (a) of subregulation (1) of this regulation does not apply to a factory that is separated from other buildings by a clear space of not less than 6 metres.
- Ventilation. 5. (1) An occupier of a factory to which these regulations apply shall ensure that there is sufficient natural or mechanical ventilation in the factory so as to prevent—
- (a) the threshold limit value; or
  - (b) the lower explosive limit,
- from being reached.
- (2) Mechanical means of ventilation prescribed by subregulation (1) shall not be regarded as providing adequate ventilation unless it provides at least six air changes in the factory per hour.
- (3) Mechanical or natural ventilation in a factory to which these regulations apply shall be by means of floor level inlet and outlet ducting in opposite walls of the factory and high level ridge ventilation so as to ensure cross flow of ventilating air over the complete working area.
- (4) Where any work relating to a fibreglass manufacturing process is carried on in a confined space the occupier shall ensure that the space is provided with mechanical ventilation sufficient to prevent the threshold limit value and the lower explosive limit from being reached.
- (5) Where a mechanical means of ventilation is used in a factory to which these regulations apply the ventilation shall be so arranged as to—
- (a) exhaust the air into the external atmosphere; and
  - (b) prevent re-circulation of the exhaust air into the work place.
- Hazard areas. 6. (1) The following provisions apply to a hazard area—
- (a) the hazard area shall be ventilated so as to conform with regulation 5;
  - (b) where mechanical means of ventilation are used, the ventilation system shall be maintained in operation for not less than 15 minutes after cessation of operations in the hazard area;
  - (c) no person shall work in a hazard area unless he is accompanied by at least one other person;
  - (d) no person shall smoke in a hazard area;
  - (e) welding or cutting by use of naked flames shall be carried out only after the written approval has been obtained from an authorized person and in accordance with his instructions which shall specify the type of equipment to be used and the duration of its use.
- (2) The occupier of a factory shall not install or use in a hazard area any heater unless the heater—
- (a) is of a type that uses hot air, hot water, steam or other approved medium; and
  - (b) is approved by the Chief Inspector in relation to its type and installation.
- Duties of person authorizing welding or cutting work in hazard area. 7. Whenever an authorized person permits any operation that involves the use of a naked flame he shall ensure that—
- (a) welding and cutting operations are carried out in accordance with Australian Standard A.S. 1674-1974;
  - (b) the person carrying out the operation observes the fire precautions specified in the authorization;

SCHEDULE—*continued*

- (c) all flammable materials have been removed away to a distance of not less than 9 metres from the source of the flame but where this is not practicable he shall ensure that any flammable materials are protected by an asbestos or other type of fireproof screen;
- (d) not less than one 9 kilogram dry chemical fire extinguisher of a type approved of by the Fire Brigades Board is available for immediate use;
- (e) any plant, equipment or process in that hazard area is shut down, removed and made safe for the duration of the welding or cutting operations;
- (f) the hazard area has been inspected, tested and found to be free of any flammable liquids, vapours, gases or dust;
- (g) the duration of the work does not exceed the time specified in the authorization unless further inspection tests for flammable liquids, vapours or gases are carried out;
- (h) the complete welding or cutting operation is carried out under the personal supervision of a competent person;
- (i) a watch is maintained in the hazard area for not less than one hour after the welding or cutting operation has ceased.

Provisions relating to glass depositor guns.

8. (1) An occupier of a factory to which these regulations apply shall not use any portion of the factory for the purpose of laminating or spraying unless the Chief Inspector has approved of the use of that portion for that purpose.

(2) An occupier of a factory to which these regulations apply shall ensure that—

- (a) no glass depositor gun is used in the factory unless the gun is of an approved type of gun;
- (b) a glass depositor gun is properly cleaned but so that in doing so there is no indiscriminate spraying of solvents;
- (c) where a leakage of a catalyst, solvent or resin occurs in a glass depositor gun or its fittings, the gun or fittings, as the case requires, is dismantled immediately in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions and repaired by an authorised person;
- (d) no unauthorized person operates or services a glass depositor gun;
- (e) all hoses are inspected at intervals not exceeding 28 days and any defective hose or component is immediately repaired or replaced;
- (f) a wet bin is provided for the gun hand during gun preparation and cleaning.

(3) A gun hand is responsible for the proper operation and use of his glass depositor gun and shall carry out all adjustments thereto and prepare and clean or supervise all preparation and cleaning of the gun.

Cleanliness.

9. An occupier of a factory to which these regulations apply shall ensure that—

- (a) the floors of the factory are kept clean of waste material;
- (b) waste of any kind is deposited in non-combustible bins that are marked to indicate the kind of waste to be stored therein;
- (c) not less than one dry waste bin is provided for each 50 square metres of the floor area of the factory;
- (d) not less than two wet waste bins are provided for each 50 square metres of the floor area of the factory—one for disposal of catalyst contaminated material and the other for the disposal of resin and promoter contaminated material;
- (e) every bin provided pursuant to this regulation—
  - (i) has a sufficient capacity to receive waste of that kind collected in the factory;
  - (ii) is marked to indicate the kind of waste to be stored therein; and
  - (iii) is kept at a safe distance from any other bin provided pursuant to this regulation;
- (f) all wet waste material collected in bins is kept covered by water;
- (g) any spillage of a catalyst, promoter or resin or any other chemical is cleaned up immediately and deposited in the bin kept for the purpose and not mixed in a bin kept for another purpose;
- (h) all materials used for cleaning spillages of a catalyst are clean before being used for that purpose; and
- (i) all walkways, exits and escape paths are kept clear of obstructions.

SCHEDULE—*continued*

- Fire extinguishers 10. (1) All equipment used for the purpose of extinguishing fire shall be placed so as to be easily accessible for use in an emergency.
- (2) An occupier of a factory to which these regulations apply shall ensure that the fire extinguishing equipment at the factory is sufficient for the factory having regard to the size of the factory and the quantity of the material contained therein.
- Storage of flammable liquids. 11. (1) Generally, the provisions of the Flammable Liquids Regulations, 1967 apply to the storage of flammable liquids in a factory to which these regulations apply.
- (2) Where the total quantity of liquid stored is less than the minimum quantity prescribed under the Flammable Liquids Regulations, 1967, storage of the liquid shall comply with the directions of the Chief Inspector.
- (3) Notwithstanding anything in subregulation (1) and subregulation (2) of this regulation all catalysts not required for immediate use shall be stored—
- separately from promoters, resins and other chemicals;
  - in the same container in which it was received by the occupier;
  - within the temperature ranges that conform to the recommendations of the manufacturer of the catalyst; and
  - in a part of the factory that is separate from the production area of the factory.
- (4) The amount of catalyst brought into and stored in the production area of the factory shall not exceed the amount necessary for one day's production and any amount so brought in and stored shall be held in a container—
- that is sealed at all times except when material is being drawn from it; and
  - that is held in an area not less than 2 metres distant from any containers holding promoters, resins or other chemicals.
- (5) The occupier of a factory shall ensure that separate measuring burettes that are appropriately and clearly marked shall be provided for each chemical being handled at the factory.
- Protective clothing and equipment. 12. (1) An occupier of a factory to which these regulations apply shall provide the following protective equipment for the persons engaged in a fibreglass manufacturing process—
- eye goggles, dust masks, or face masks for grinding and trimming operations;
  - full face visors for repairs to pressure lines carrying chemicals; and
  - polyvinyl chloride gloves and aprons for handling chemicals.
- (2) A person who is engaged in a fibreglass manufacturing process who fails to use the protective equipment necessary for carrying out any work in a factory to which these regulations apply commits an offence.
- (3) A person shall not without the prior permission of the occupier remove from a factory any protective equipment referred to in this regulation.
- (4) An occupier of a factory to which these regulations apply shall maintain all protective equipment to which these regulations apply in a clean and efficient condition.
- Authorized person. 13. (1) The occupier of a factory to which these regulations apply shall appoint a person to give any authorization or permission required to be given under these regulations by such a person.
- (2) An appointment pursuant to subregulation (1) of this regulation shall be in writing and shall be produced by the occupier upon demand by an inspector.
- Safety of personnel and property. 14. (1) An occupier of a factory to which these regulations apply shall ensure that every person employed in the factory—
- is fully instructed as to the dangers of the materials stored in the factory and that can arise in a fibreglass manufacturing process;
  - receives sufficient training in the work he is to perform and the safety procedures to be adopted in the event of a mishap; and
  - works under the supervision of a person who has a thorough knowledge of the equipment, materials and apparatus in the factory.
- (2) The occupier of a factory to which these regulations apply shall ensure—
- that sufficient supervisory and other personnel are available at the factory to take such steps as are necessary in the event of a fire or other emergency;
  - all such persons are familiar with the procedures to be carried out in the event of fire or other emergency.
- (3) The occupier of a factory to which these regulations apply shall ensure that no person smokes or consumes any food or beverage in a production area of the factory.

SCHEDULE—*continued.*

- Dust. 15. (1) An occupier of a factory to which these regulations apply shall not cause or permit any dust producing process to be carried on in any area of the factory unless there is installed in that portion of the factory an efficient dust collection system.
- (2) The dust collection system prescribed by subregulation (1) of this regulation shall not be regarded as efficient for the purposes of that subregulation unless the mass of the dust suspended in the atmosphere of the factory is less than the threshold limit value and the lower explosive limit.
- (3) An occupier of a factory to which these regulations apply shall ensure that all overhead structures, ledges and sills in the factory are cleaned of dust deposits in such a manner as to prevent the dispersion of dust in the factory.
- Egress. 16. (1) Every emergency exit in a factory to which these regulations apply shall be marked above the exit and at low level with the word "EXIT" by means of a sign that conforms to the provisions of subregulation (4) of this regulation.
- (2) The following signs shall be displayed in those portions of the factory in which they are relevant—
- DANGER—NO SMOKING—NO NAKED FLAMES.
  - DANGER—MIXING BAY.
  - DANGEROUS FACTORY—NO ADMITTANCE TO UNAUTHORISED PERSONS.
  - NO MATCHES OR LIGHTERS ALLOWED.
  - HAZARD AREA—NO PORTABLE ELECTRICAL EQUIPMENT TO BE USED WITHOUT APPROVAL.
  - FIRE EQUIPMENT.
- (3) The Chief Inspector may direct such other signs to be displayed in any portion of the factory where he is of the opinion that such a sign is necessary.
- (4) Every sign prescribed by these regulations shall be—
- in red capital letters not less than 100 millimetres in height and 12 millimetres in thickness;
  - displayed on a white background; and
  - maintained in good condition to the satisfaction of the Chief Inspector.
- Portable electrical equipment. 17. (1) All portable electrical equipment used in a factory to which these regulations apply shall be suitable for the circumstances in which it is used.
- (2) All portable electrical equipment in a factory to which these regulations apply shall be inspected at least once every six months by a person authorized to do so under the Electricity Act, 1945.
- (3) The occupier of a factory to which these regulations apply shall cause a book to be provided for the purpose of recording the portable equipment in use at the factory.
- (4) The occupier of a factory to which these regulations apply shall cause to be entered in the record book referred to in subregulation (2) of this regulation details of—
- all equipment in use at the factory;
  - equipment not suitable for use in hazard areas; and
  - inspections pursuant to subregulation (2) of this regulation.
- (5) The record book referred to in this regulation shall be available for inspection by an inspector and by an inspector appointed under the Electricity Act, 1945.
