 - (b) a bin of not less than 0.20 cubic metres in capacity in which case such bin shall have an effectively operating
 - (ii) The builder shall keep such site free of rubbish and offensive matter whether temporary or otherwise.
 - (iii) The builder shall maintain the Street verge immediately adjacent to such site free of rubbish or offensive matter, whether temporary or otherwise.
 - (iv) The builder shall on completion of construction immediately clear the site and the Street verge immediately adjacent thereto of all rubbish and offensive matter and shall remove therefrom all or any rubbish, disposal bins placed thereon by the builder.

- (b) In this By-aw the word "rubbish" shal be deemed to include stones, bricks, lime, timber, iron, tiles, bags, plastics and any broken, used or discarded matter whatsoever whether of the same kind or type or otherwise.
- (c) In this By-law the word "builder" shall include the person or persons or firm or corporation who shall be the holder of any building licence issued in respect of such building works by the Town of Bunbury and shall also, include any person or persons or firm or corporation who shall be in effective control of such building site whether or not such person or persons or firm or corporation shall be the holder of any such licence.



PART OF METROPOLITAN REGION SCHEME MAP 16



 - "Dwelling" means a Class I building as defined in the Uniform Building By-laws;
 - "External wall" means an outer wall or vertical enclosure of a building;
 - "Scheme" means Shire of Peppermint Grove Town Planning Scheme No. 2 published in the Government Gazette of the 2nd April, 1976, and amended from time to time;
 - "Shire" means the Shire of Peppermint Grove;
 - "Uniform Building By-laws" means the Uniform Building By-laws 1974 published in the Government Gazette of the 19th December, 1974 and amended from time to time.
- (1) Subject to the provisions of these by-laws the external walls of a dwelling whether of one or two storeys erected after the publication of these by-laws in the Government Gazette shall be of brick cavity or masonry block construction complying with the provisions of the Uniform Building By-laws.
- (2) The Council may in any particular case if it thinks fit permit an external wall or walls of a dwelling to be constructed partly in brick cavity or masonry block construction and partly in another material or materials approved by the Council but so that not less than eighty percentum (80%) of each wall shall be constructed in brick cavity or masonry block construction.
- (1) Subject to Section 399 (4) of the Act the Council may grant approval in accordance with Section 374 of the Act to the addition of a timber frame upper storey to a single storey existing dwelling if the following conditions are complied with-
 - (a) The application for such approval is accompanied by a written certificate by a duly qualified structural engineer that he has personally inspected the existing dwelling and that in his opinion the existing foundations are capable of carrying the loads expected in compliance with the relevant Australian standards;

- (b) the provisions of the Scheme and of the Uniform Building By-laws generally and in particular as to set-back, plot ratio and other site requirements are complied with;
- (c) the proposed addition is in the opinion of the Council harmonious with the existing dwelling and in conformity with the general standard of design of buildings in the locality in which it is proposed to be erected;
- (d) sheets of asbestos or other materials if used will be of the type known as profiled unless in any particular case the Council approves the use of flatsheets.
- (2) All exposed timber used in a timber frame upper storey shall from time to time be treated with preservatives to ensure that it remains in good condition and does not deteriorate through exposure to the weather or damage by white ants.
- 4. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in these by-laws but subject to compliance with the Act, the Uniform Building By-laws, the Scheme and any other relevant statute regulation, by-law or order the Council may permit the alteration, extension or enlargement of an existing dwelling by the construction of an addition thereto consisting of one storey in a material or materials that are the same as or substantially similar to those of which the existing dwelling or the portion thereof abutting the proposed addition as the case may be is constructed.
- 5. A person who erects a dwelling or makes an alteration extension or enlargement to an existing dwelling otherwise than in compliance with these by-laws or who fails to do anything which he is required to do by these by-laws commits an offence.

ACCEPTANCE AND DISPOSAL OF MILK BY THE AUTHORITY

It is further determined that, where milk delivered by a dairyman-

- is found to contain less than 11.75 per cent total milk solids, as determined by the aforementioned Standard Method during any testing period, milk supplied by that dairyman for the duration of that testing period will not be accepted by the Authority as market milk.
- is found to contain less than $3 \cdot 2$ per cent milk fat, as determined by one of the aforementioned methods during any testing period on a second or succeeding occasion after January 1 1977 or on a second or succeeding occasion in any subsequent quota year, milk supplied by that dairyman for the duration of that testing period will not be accepted by the Authority as market milk.
- is found by the Department of Agriculture of Western Australia on a certain day to contain anti-biotic on a second occasion after January 1 1977 or on a second occasion in any subsequent quota year, milk supplied by that dairyman for that one day will not be accepted by the Authority as market milk.
- is found by the Department of Agriculture of Western Australia on a certain day to contain anti-biotic on a third or succeeding occasion after January 1 1977 or on a third or succeeding occasion in any subsequent quota year, milk supplied by that dairyman for the duration of the testing period in which that day occurs will not be accepted by the Authority as market milk.
- is found by the Department of Agriculture of Western Australia on a certain day to contain added water on a second or succeeding occasion after January 1 1977 or on a second or succeeding occasion in any subsequent quota year, milk supplied by that dairyman for the duration of the testing period in which that day occurs will not be accepted by the Authority as market milk.

Where milk delivered by a dairyman is acceptable as market milk and the abovementioned prices for market milk and rates for transport of market milk apply—

market milk delivered by a dairyman to the Authority IN CANS is accepted by the Authority at the dairy produce factory of the Authority's authorised agent.

market milk delivered by a dairyman to the Authority INTO A BULK TANKER is accepted by the Authority at the dairyman's registered dairy produce premises.

market milk delivered by a dairyman and accepted by the Authority is disposed of by the Authority to the dairy produce factory at the point of acceptance by the Authority.

PROVIDED THAT nothing in the Dairy Industry Act, 1973, requires the Authority to accept all or any market milk delivered to it by any person; and market milk delivered to and accepted by the Authority may be disposed of by the Authority to milk vendors or other persons.

- is found by the Department of Agriculture of Western Australia on a certain day to contain added water on a second or succeeding occasion after July 1 1977 or on a second or succeeding occasion in any subsequent quota year, milk supplied by that dairyman for the duration of the testing period in which that day occurs will not be accepted by the Authority as special products milk.
