PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, } By His Excellency The Honourable Sir Francis
To Wit: } Theodore Page Burt, Knight Commander of the
F. T. P. BURT, } Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and
Lieutenant Governor. } Saint George, Lieutenant Governor in and over
[L.S.] } the State of Western Australia and its Depen-
dencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by the Election of Senators Act, 1903, it is provided that the Governor may by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette* not less than seven days before the issue of the writ for any election of Senators for the State of Western Australia, fix the places at which such election shall be held, and the dates for the nomination, the polling, and the declaration of the poll and return of the writ; and whereas Thursday, the 10th day of November, 1977, has been fixed as the date for the issue of a writ for the election of Senators aforesaid: Now, therefore, I, the Lieutenant Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby fix Friday, the 18th day of November, 1977, at 12 o'clock noon,

as the day and time before which nominations for the said election are to be made, and Saturday, the 10th day of December, 1977, as the date for the polling at the said election, and on or before Wednesday, the 8th day of February, 1978 as the date for the declaration of the poll and return of the writ; and do hereby fix the Office of the Australian Electoral Officer at Fifth Floor, Wapet House, 12 St. George's Terrace, Perth, as the place of nomination for the said election, and the polling places within the said State appointed under the law of the Commonwealth for the time being in force for the regulation of Parliamentary elections as the places at which such election shall be held.

Given under my hand and the Public Seal of the said State, at Perth, this 2nd day of November, Nineteen hundred and seventy-seven.
