- (a) Acting under the powers conferred by section 17 subsection (3) (i) of the Bush Fires Act, 1954, approved of the suspension of all declarations of prohibited burning times under section 17 of the Act, so far as such declarations extend to any land used for Railway purposes; and

Allowances payable to teaching staff.
Travelling, Transfer, Relieving, Removal and District.

1. Arrangement.

- (1) Arrangement.
- (2) Allowance Payable on Transfer or Appointment.
- (3) Allowances for Teachers Relieving Away from their usual Locality.
- (4) Allowances for Removal of Household Furniture, Appliances and Effects.
- (4) Travel Concessions for Teachers Travelling in the Summer Vacation.
- (6) Allowances Payable to Teachers involved with Excessive Daily Travelling to School.
- (7) Allowances Payable to Teachers Required to use their own Motor Vehicle or to Travel by Public Transport on School Business.
- (8) District Allowances.
- (9) Property Allowance.

2. Allowances Payable on Transfer or Appointment:

- (a) A teacher who travels to take up a new appointment shall be reimbursed reasonable accommodation and meal expenses during the course of travelling from one locality to another in accordance with the provisions of clause 6 of the Public Service Allowances (Miscellaneous) Agreement, 1971, No. 109 of 1971, such clause to apply *mutatis mutandis*; provided that where the locality of the new appointment is situated at a radius of fifty (50) kilometres or less from the locality where the teacher was previously stationed, reimbursement of the above mentioned expenses, if any, shall be at the discretion of the Director-General.

(b) A teacher who is transferred to another locality where Government or private residential accommodation is unavailable and hotel or motel accommodation is utilised, shall be paid a transfer allowance at the rates prescribed by Clause 7 of the Public Service Allowances (Miscellaneous) Agreement, 1971, *mutatis mutandis* up to a maximum period of fourteen days after arrival at the new locality; provided that a District Superintendent of Education shall certify that there is no suitable accommodation other than hotel or motel available in the locality.

(c) When Government residential accommodation is unavailable in a locality and a teacher is unable to obtain suitable alternative accommodation within the period of fourteen days mentioned in sub-clause (b), and the Director-General is satisfied that the teacher has taken all possible steps to secure suitable accommodation, the Director-General shall determine an appropriate rate of reimbursement having regard for the cost of the hotel or motel accommodation and normal reasonable living expenses for the teacher and any of his dependants.

(d) A teacher transferred to a locality where Government residential accommodation is available shall not be entitled to reimbursement under sub-clauses (b) and (c) except where the entry into such Government residential accommodation is delayed through circumstances beyond the teacher's control. In the event of such a delay, the teacher shall be reimbursed in accordance with sub-clause (c).

(e) Where it can be shown by the production of receipts or other evidence that allowances payable under subclauses (a) and (b) would be insufficient to meet reasonable additional costs incurred by a teacher on transfer, an appropriate rate of reimbursement shall be determined by the Director-General.

(f) The provisions of this clause do not apply to a teacher transferred from one school to another solely at his own request or on account of misconduct or unsatisfactory service, unless otherwise approved by the Director-General.

3. Allowances for Teachers relieving away from their Usual Locality:

A teacher who is required to take up duty away from his usual locality to relieve another teacher or to perform special duty, and necessarily resides temporarily away from his usual place of residence shall be reimbursed reasonable accommodation, meal and incidental expenses in accordance with provisions of clause 9 of the Public Service Allowances (Miscellaneous) Agreement, 1971, No. 109 of 1971, and such clause shall apply *mutatis mutandis*.

4. Allowance for Removal of Household Furniture, Appliances and Effects—

(a) A teacher who is transferred in the public interest or in the ordinary course of promotion and transfer or on account of illness due to causes over which the teacher has not control, shall be reimbursed—

- (i) the actual reasonable cost of conveyance of himself and his wife and children under 16 years of age or other children wholly dependent on him; and

- (ii) subject to subclause (c) the actual reasonable cost of conveyance of the teacher's furniture, including insurance of such furniture whilst in transit; or the whole time of storage as approved and authorised by the Director-General; and
- (iii) an allowance of \$150 for accelerated depreciation and extra wear on furniture, appliances and effects; provided that—
- the Director-General is satisfied that the value of necessary household furniture moved by the teacher is at least \$900; and
 - payment of the allowance to transferred teachers will be made on every transfer.
- (b) A teacher transferred from one school to another solely at his own request or on account of misconduct or unsatisfactory service must bear the whole cost of his removal unless otherwise approved by the Director-General.
- (c) The maximum reimbursement for cost of conveyance of furniture, including insurance whilst in transit shall be subject to the approval of the Director-General; provided that only necessary household furniture, appliances and effects shall be taken into consideration.
- (d) A teacher shall be reimbursed the full freight charges necessarily incurred in respect of the removal of his motor vehicle.
- If authorised by the Director-General to travel to the new locality in his own motor vehicle, reimbursement for the distance necessarily travelled shall be on the basis of one-half of the appropriate rate of hire as prescribed by clause 5 of the Public Service Allowances (Motor Car Hire) Agreement, 1971, No. 108 of 1971, *mutatis mutandis*, except that any reimbursement for travel under this clause undertaken by a teacher in that part of the State north of the 26th parallel of latitude shall be at the full rates provided in that agreement.
- (e) Furniture, appliances and effects, where practicable, shall be removed by State-owned transport unless some other mode of transport is approved by the Director-General. Applications for the use of road transport will only be approved by the Director-General in special circumstances. Such applications shall be accompanied by quotes from at least two carriers where practicable.
- (f) Vouchers must be produced for all sums paid.
- (g) The Director-General may, in lieu of cost of conveyance, authorise payment of an amount not exceeding the maximum prescribed by subclause (c) to compensate for loss in any case where a teacher with prior approval of the Director-General disposes of his furniture, appliances and effects instead of removing them to his new headquarters; provided that such payment shall not exceed the sum which would have been paid if such furniture, appliances and effects had been removed by the cheapest form of transport available.
- (h) Where a teacher is transferred to departmental accommodation where furniture is provided and as a consequence is obliged to store his own furniture, he shall be reimbursed the actual cost of such storage.

 - Rail and Road—Teacher travelling by car and the remainder of the family by rail. Full mileage rates for car trip by the teacher in accordance with sub-clause (e). Free first class rail fares for his wife and dependent children.
- (c) Teachers employed in District Allowance Area 2 shall be entitled to reimbursement of fares to Perth for the teacher and his dependants once in every two years. If the teacher elects to travel by road in his own motor vehicle, he shall be reimbursed at the rate of 10 cents per kilometre for the return journey.
- (d) The mode of travel used by teachers in accordance with sub-clauses (a) and (b) shall be subject to the approval of the Director-General.
- (e) A teacher who is eligible for a travel concession in accordance with sub-clauses (a) or (b) of this clause and who elects to travel by motor vehicle instead of by air, rail or sea shall be reimbursed the full mileage rates in accordance with the Public Service Allowances (Motor Car Hire) Agreement, 1971, provided that the amount of reimbursement shall not exceed the cost
- in respect of sub-clause (a), of a return air fare by public air services of a teacher when travelling alone or the return air fares of the teacher and his family when travelling together; and
 - in respect of sub-clause (b), of a return first class rail fare of a teacher when travelling alone or the return first class rail fares of the teacher and his family when travelling together.
- The amount of reimbursement under this sub-clause shall be approved by the Director-General.

- (f) When the teacher and family travel together by rail, first class rail fares shall be allowed for the teacher, his wife and dependent children.
- (g) No concession in this clause shall apply to a child dependent upon a teacher if that child is aged seventeen (17) years or over, unless that child is totally dependent upon the teacher and then with the special approval of the Director-General.
6. Allowances Payable to Teachers Involved with Excessive Daily Travelling to School:
- (a) A teacher employed at a country school who is unable to obtain suitable residential accommodation within a distance of 16 kilometres of the school, if authorised by the Director-General to travel to and from the school in his own motor vehicle, shall be reimbursed for the distance necessarily travelled in excess of 16 kilometres each way between the residence and the school on the basis of one-half of the appropriate rate of hire as prescribed by clause 5 of the Public Service Allowances (Motor Car Hire) Agreement, 1971, *mutatis mutandis*; provided that a District Superintendent of Education shall certify that there is no suitable residential accommodation within a distance of 16 kilometres of the school.
- (b) A teacher who resides within the metropolitan schools boundary as defined and is required to travel daily to a school located outside that boundary, shall be reimbursed for the distance necessarily travelled between that boundary and the school on the basis of one half of the appropriate rate of hire as prescribed by clause 5 of the Public Service Allowances (Motor Car Hire) Agreement 1971, *mutatis mutandis*; provided that the distance necessarily travelled shall not include any distance travelled each way within 16 kilometres of the residence of the teacher.
- (c) Metropolitan Schools Boundary: The area within a line joining and including the following schools and locations constitutes the boundary for metropolitan schools:—
Becher Point, Byford, Carinyah, Sawyers Valley, Mt. Helena, Warbrook and a line due west to the coast.
A map showing the above area is attached in Appendix A of the original Determination.
7. Allowances Payable to Teachers Required to Use their own Motor Vehicles or Travel by Public Transport on School Business:
- (a) A teacher who is required to use his own motor vehicle for travelling on school business including measuring bus routes, travelling between dispersed schools for the purpose of teaching manual training, home economics and business studies, transporting sick school children, collecting official mail and stock and school banking, shall be reimbursed the appropriate rate of hire prescribed by clause 5 of the Public Services Allowances (Motor Car Hire) Agreement, 1971, *mutatis mutandis*; provided that such travelling is authorised by the Director or Deputy Director of the appropriate Division or the Chief Administrative Officer. In the case of transporting sick school children, authority may be given by the school headmaster.
- (b) A teacher who is required to use a private motor vehicle on other approved activities such as school sports meetings, camps and In-Service training courses shall be reimbursed on the basis of the appropriate rate of hire as prescribed by clause 5 of the Public Service Allowances (Motor Car Hire) Agreement, 1971, *mutatis mutandis*;
- provided that reimbursement for such travel shall be limited to activities and amounts authorised by Superintendents of Education.
- (c) A teacher who is required to accompany school groups attending educational and sporting functions when public transport is used, shall be reimbursed the cost of the fare incurred.
8. District Allowances—As determined by the Tribunal in its 1976 District Allowances case.
9. Property Allowances—
- (1) When a teacher is transferred from one locality to another in the public interest or in the ordinary course of promotion or transfer, or on account of illness due to causes over which he has no control, he shall be entitled to be paid a property allowance for reimbursement of prescribed expenses incurred by him—
- (a) in the sale of a residence in his former locality, which, at the date on which he received notice of his transfer to his new locality—
- he owned and occupied; or
 - he was purchasing under a contract of sale providing for vacant possession; or
 - he was constructing for his own permanent occupation, on completion of construction; and
- (b) in the purchase of a residence or land for the purpose of erecting a residence thereon for his own permanent occupation in his new locality.
- (2) A teacher is not entitled to be paid a property allowance under subclause (1)(b) unless he is entitled to be paid a property allowance under subclause (1)(a); provided that the Director-General may approve the payment of a property allowance under subclause (1)(b) to a teacher who is not entitled to be paid a property allowance under subclause (1)(a) if the Director-General is satisfied that it was necessary for the teacher to purchase a residence or land for the purpose of erecting a residence thereon in this new locality because of his transfer from his former locality.
- (3) For the purpose of this clause it is immaterial that the ownership, sale or purchase is—
- in the case of a married teacher, solely or jointly or in common with—
 - his spouse
 - a dependent relative; or
 - his spouse and a dependent relative
 - in the case of any other teacher, solely or jointly or in common with a dependent relative living with him.
- (4) Where the teacher sells or purchase a residence jointly or in common with another person—not being a person referred to in subclause (3)—he shall be paid only the proportion of the prescribed expenses for which he is responsible.
- (5) An application by a teacher for a property allowance shall be accompanied by evidence of the payment by the teacher of the prescribed expenses; being evidence that is satisfactory to the Director-General.
- (6) Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions, a teacher is not entitled to the payment of a property allowance (a) in respect of a sale or purchase prescribed in subclause (1) which is effected—
- more than twelve months after the date on which he took up duty in his new locality; or

- (ii) after the date on which he received notification that he was being transferred back to his former locality;
- provided that the Director-General may, in exceptional circumstances, grant an extension of time for such period as is deemed reasonable.
- (b) where the teacher is transferred from one locality to another solely at his own request or on account of misconduct.
- (7) "Dependent relative" in relation to a teacher means a relative or chief person who is solely dependent on the teacher for support.

"Locality" in relation to a teacher means—

- (a) within the metropolitan area, that area within a radius of fifty (50) kilometres from the Perth Central Railway Station; and
- (b) outside the metropolitan area, that area within a radius of fifty (50) kilometres from a teacher's headquarters when they are situated outside of the metropolitan area.

"Prescribed expenses" means—

- (a) legal fees, not exceeding fifty dollars (\$50) in respect of each transaction;
- (b) stamp duty (except stamp duty payable in connection with the registration or discharge of a mortgage);

- (c) fees paid to the Registrar of Titles or to the teacher performing duties of a like nature and for the same purpose in another State of the Commonwealth (except fees payable in connection with the registration or discharge of a mortgage).

"Residence" includes any accommodation of a kind commonly known as a flat or home unit that is, or is intended to be, a separate tenement.

REGULATIONS.

Principal
regulations.

1. In these regulations the Education Act Regulations, 1960 as reprinted pursuant to the Reprinting of Regulations Act, 1954 and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 19th March, 1971 and thereafter amended from time to time by notices so published are referred to as the principal regulations.

Reg. 4
amended.

2. Regulation 4 of the principal regulations is amended by adding after the interpretation "junior primary school" the following interpretation—

"leave" means permission to be absent from duty;

3. Regulations 115 to 125A of the principal regulations is revoked and the following regulations substituted—

115. (1) A teacher shall not be absent from duty without leave.

(2) A teacher who is absent from duty without leave—

(a) is guilty of misconduct; and

(b) is not entitled to be paid in respect of any period that he has been so absent.

116. (1) Subject to these regulations, a teacher who wishes to be absent on leave shall apply for and obtain leave before being absent from duty.

(2) An application pursuant to subregulation (1) of this regulation shall be made to the Director-General in the form of the form approved of by him.

(3) Where by reason of an emergency it is not possible for a teacher to make application for leave in the manner prescribed by subregulation (1) and subregulation (2) of this regulation the teacher shall prior to being absent from duty apply for and obtain leave from the principal of the school in which he serves.

(4) Where a principal authorises a teacher to take leave the principal shall immediately notify the Director-General of that fact.

SCHEDULE—*continued.*

117. A teacher who, not being on leave, does not resume duty immediately following—

- (a) the summer vacation—shall be regarded as having been absent from duty during the period commencing on the 1st day of January of that year and ending with the day that he resumes duty;
- (b) a term vacation—shall be regarded as having been absent from duty during that period and until he resumes duty,

unless the Minister is satisfied as to the reasons for the inability of the teacher to resume duty immediately following that vacation and directs that the teacher shall be regarded as having been on leave until the day that he in fact resumes duty.

118. (1) The Director-General may at his discretion grant a teacher leave without pay.

(2) Any continuous period of leave without pay exceeding ten working days granted under this regulation—

- (a) does not count as service;
- (b) does not constitute a break in continuous service, under these regulations.

(3) Notwithstanding anything in this regulation the Minister may on the recommendation of the Director-General declare that leave granted to a teacher on and after the 1st January, 1964 for the purpose of undertaking studies directly related to his duties as a teacher constitutes service for the purposes of these regulations.

119. (1) The Director-General may grant a pregnant teacher leave without pay, in these regulations referred to as "accouchement leave", for a period beginning before and ending after her expected date of confinement.

(2) An application for accouchement leave shall be supported by the certificate of a legally qualified medical practitioner stating—

- (a) that the teacher is pregnant; and
- (b) the expected date of her confinement.

(3) The normal period of accouchement leave which may be taken is twelve months but where—

- (a) a teacher on accouchement leave so applies the Director-General may reduce the normal period of accouchement leave to a lesser period so long as this lesser period is not less than eight weeks before the expected date of the teacher's confinement and ending on the expiration of eight weeks from the date of the termination of her pregnancy;
- (b) the Director-General is of the opinion that there is no suitable position available for the teacher to take up at the end of that period, he may extend the accouchement leave for a further period not exceeding six months.

(4) Where a teacher who is on accouchement leave on the last working day before the beginning of a term vacation resumes duty on the first working day following the vacation, the period of accouchement leave shall be deemed to have ended on the last working day before the vacation.

(5) A teacher who applies for accouchement leave less than eight weeks before the expected date of her confinement shall be deemed to have resigned as of the date of her application.

(6) For the purposes of these regulations accouchement leave—

- (a) does not count as service;
- (b) does not constitute a break in continuous service; and
- (c) constitutes service for the purposes of calculating the repayment of allowances paid under an agreement entered into pursuant to regulation 200 of these regulations.

120. (1) The Director-General may grant a teacher leave with pay (in this regulation referred to as "short leave") for absence not exceeding a total of three days in any year to conduct urgent personal business which cannot reasonably be transacted outside hours of duty.

(2) The Director-General shall not grant short leave in respect of any day—

- (a) immediately preceding or immediately following a school vacation or the Easter holiday period; or
- (b) immediately preceding leave granted to attend examinations.

121. Subject to these regulations the Director-General may grant a teacher leave on full pay, leave on half pay or leave without pay because of illness or disability (in these regulations referred to as "sick leave").

SCHEDULE—*continued*

122. (1) An application for sick leave shall be made by a teacher not later than the day on which he resumes duty following his absence because of sickness.

(2) The Director-General shall not grant sick leave unless the application therefor is supported by the certificate of a legally qualified medical practitioner approved of by the Director-General stating—

- (a) the nature of the teacher's illness or disability; and
- (b) the period during which the teacher is unfit for duty, unless he is satisfied that in the circumstances of a particular case it is not possible for the teacher to obtain such a certificate and where the Director-General is so satisfied he may instead require the applicant to produce the certificate of a person specified by him.

(3) The Director-General may grant a teacher non-cumulative sick leave with pay without the production of a medical certificate for absence not exceeding a total of three days in any year except that he shall not grant such leave on any day—

- (a) immediately preceding or immediately following a school vacation or the Easter holiday period; or
- (b) immediately preceding leave granted to attend examinations.

123. (1) Subject to these regulations in respect of service on and after 1st January, 1954, a permanent teacher is entitled to a cumulative credit in working days towards sick leave on full pay and half pay (referred to in these regulations as a "sick leave credit") as follows:—

	Credit towards leave on full pay	Credit towards leave on half pay
On permanent appointment	5	2
On completion of six months' continuous service from permanent appointment	5	3
On completion of 12 months' continuous service from permanent appointment	10	5
On completion of each additional 12 months' continuous service	10	5

(2) In respect of service on and after 1st January, 1954, a temporary teacher is entitled to a cumulative credit of one day towards sick leave on full pay and of one half day towards sick leave on half pay for each completed period of four weeks of continuous service to a maximum in any one calendar year of ten days towards sick leave on full pay and of five days towards sick leave on half pay.

(3) A teacher employed on a fractional-time basis is entitled to that proportion of the entitlement towards sick leave on full or half pay of a teacher employed full-time as the proportion his employment bears to full-time employment.

124. (1) The Director-General shall not grant a teacher sick leave with pay unless the teacher has an appropriate sick leave credit.

(2) Sick leave with pay taken by a teacher shall be deducted from his sick leave credit at the rate of one day for each working day including public holidays that the teacher is on sick leave with pay.

(3) Where a teacher's sick leave credit on full pay becomes exhausted, the Director-General may, on application by the teacher, grant a credit towards sick leave on full pay of one day for each two days that the teacher is entitled to a credit towards sick leave on half pay and the credit towards sick leave on half pay shall be reduced accordingly.

(4) When a teacher's credit towards sick leave with pay becomes exhausted, the Director-General may grant a credit towards sick leave on full pay of one day for each day that the teacher is entitled to long service leave and the entitlement to long service leave shall be reduced accordingly.

125. (1) For the purposes of regulations 115-125^F of these regulations "service" includes—

- (a) any period of leave except—
 - (i) subject to subregulation (3) of regulation 118 of these regulations, leave granted without pay in excess of ten working days; and
 - (ii) any continuous period of sick leave without pay in excess of three months;
- (b) service before the 1st January, 1975 as a monitor or as a student with allowances in a teachers college.

SCHEDULE—*continued*

(2) A teacher is not entitled to sick leave with pay in respect of an illness or disability—

- (a) caused by that teacher's misconduct; or
- (b) caused by circumstances within that teacher's control.

125A. (1) Subject to this regulation, the re-appointment of a teacher following his resignation shall, in relation to his entitlement to a credit towards sick leave with pay, be deemed to be a first appointment.

(2) Where a teacher—

- (a) resigns from the permanent staff;
- (b) is appointed a temporary teacher; and
- (c) his temporary appointment is, exclusive of school vacations, continuous with his service as a permanent teacher,

he shall be credited with any sick leave to which he was entitled on the date of his resignation.

(3) Where a teacher who retires on medical grounds is subsequently re-appointed a teacher he shall be credited with any sick leave credit to which he was entitled as of the date of his retirement.

(4) Where a temporary teacher is appointed to the permanent staff and his permanent appointment is continuous with his service as a temporary teacher he shall retain any sick leave credit to which he was entitled as a temporary teacher immediately before his appointment as a permanent teacher.

(5) Where a temporary teacher ceases service he loses his sick leave credit unless—

- (a) the cessation is due to a term vacation; or
- (b) his services are not required for a period that does not exceed 12 weeks.

125B. (1) Subject to this regulation the Director-General shall not grant sick leave with pay to a teacher who is on leave.

(2) Where the Director-General is satisfied that the sick leave sought by a teacher—

- (a) arises from illness during the teacher's long service leave; and
- (b) results in the teacher being confined to his residence or a hospital for a period of 14 days or more,

he may grant the teacher sick leave in respect of the period during which he was sick while on leave and where he does so the period shall not be reckoned as long service leave for the purposes of these regulations.

125C (1) Where a teacher is on sick leave on the last working day before the beginning of a school vacation or public holiday and resumes duty on the first working day following the vacation or public holiday his period of sick leave shall be deemed to have ended on the last working day before the vacation or public holiday.

(2) Where a teacher is on sick leave on the last working day before the beginning of a school vacation and continues on sick leave on the first working day following the vacation he shall—

- (a) in relation to the summer vacation, receive full pay for the period of the vacation; and
- (b) in relation to a term vacation—
 - (i) receive full pay for the period of the vacation if on sick leave on full pay;
 - (ii) receive half pay for the period of the vacation if on sick leave on half pay;
 - (iii) receive no pay for the period of the vacation if on sick leave without pay,

but the period of the vacation shall not form part of the period of sick leave.

125D. Where a teacher—

- (a) applies for sick leave with pay because of an illness or disability in respect of which he is not required to be confined to his house or a hospital; and

(b) is entitled to a period of long service leave, the Director-General may require the teacher to apply for and take all or part of the period of long service leave to which he is entitled in place of an equivalent period of sick leave.

125E. (1) In this regulation the terms "Commonwealth employee", "Commonwealth instrumentality", "State employee", and "State instrumentality" have the same meaning as in regulation 132.

(2) A Commonwealth or State employee whose appointment as a teacher is continuous with his employment by a Commonwealth or State instrumentality is entitled, on appointment, to be credited with a sick leave credit equal to any entitlement to

SCHEDULE—*continued*

sick leave with pay to which he was entitled, under the sick leave conditions of the Commonwealth or State instrumentality, on the date of his leaving the employment of the instrumentality.

(3) For the purposes of this regulation, the employment of a person with a Commonwealth or State instrumentality shall be regarded as continuous with his service as a teacher if the period commencing with the date he ceases his employment with the instrumentality and ending with the date of his appointment as a teacher does not exceed four weeks, or such longer period as the Minister, in special circumstances, determines.

125F. (1) A teacher who is absent from duty because of a war-caused injury or disability is entitled, in addition to any other sick leave credit under these regulations, to an additional credit in working days towards sick leave on full pay as follows—

(a) in respect of service before the 1st July, 1967—

(i) on the date of appointment—10 days;

(ii) on completion of 12 months' continuous service—10 days;

(iii) for each 12 months' of continuous service after the first 12 months' of continuous service and any further service up to his fifth year of service—10 days for each year but with no accumulation in excess of 60 days and no re-accumulation;

(b) in respect of service on and after the 1st July, 1967—

(i) on the date of appointment—15 days;

(ii) on completion of 12 months' continuous service—15 days;

(iii) for each 12 months' continuous service after the first 12 months' of continuous service—15 days.

(2) A teacher's additional sick leave credit under the provisions of paragraph (a) or paragraph (b) of subregulation (1) of this regulation shall be reduced by one day for each working day including public holidays the teacher is on sick leave with pay because of war-caused injury or disability.

(3) A war-caused injury or disability is an injury or disability which is certified by the Department of Veterans' Affairs of the Commonwealth to be war-caused.

Part XIB
added.

4. The principal regulations are amended by adding after Part XI a new Part as follows—

PART XIB.—SPECIAL EDUCATION.

262H. In this Part, unless the context otherwise requires—

“child” means a child of compulsory school age;

“direction for exclusion” means a direction of the Minister, under the provisions of section 20B of the Act, directing the parent of a child to refrain from causing the child to attend any Government school;

“direction to special education” means a direction of the Minister, under the provisions of section 20A of the Act, requiring the parent of a child to cause the child to attend such school or schools as is or are specified in the direction;

“school” means the Government school in which a child is enrolled;

“special educational facility” means a special class designated by the Director-General to be a special educational facility for the purposes of this Part.

262I. (1) Where the principal of a school or the parent of a child is of the opinion—

(a) that the child suffers from a mental or physical disorder or disability; and

(b) that by reason of the disorder or disability the child is having extreme difficulty in adjusting to the regular educational programme of the school,

the principal shall arrange a conference (in these regulations referred to as an “initial conference”) for the purposes of ascertaining the educational programme best suited to the needs of the child and inform the parent of the child of the date and time of the conference.

(2) An initial conference shall consist of—

(a) the parents of the child;

(b) the principal of the school;

(c) the teacher or teachers of the child; and

(d) where the parents so desire, an interpreter, friend or relative of the parents, brought to the conference by the parents.

SCHEDULE—*continued.*

(3) For the purposes of convening an initial conference the principal shall—

- (a) set a reasonable time for the conference after, if practicable, discussion with the parents of the child;
- (b) invite the parents to attend the conference;
- (c) advise the parents that they may be accompanied by a friend, relative or interpreter;
- (d) require the teacher or teachers of the child to attend the conference; and
- (e) give written notification to the parents of the date and time of the conference and inform them that they may be accompanied by a friend, relative or interpreter.

(4) An initial conference shall take place in the presence of both parents of the child unless one or both parents refuse or neglect to attend the conference or one parent is unable to attend a conference at any reasonable time.

(5) The aims of an initial conference are—

- (a) to ensure the maximum co-operation between the parents of the child and the school regarding the provision of an educational programme that is in the best interests of the child;
- (b) to discuss the educational programmes offered by the school and their adequacy, in the light of the child's disorder or disability, to meet his educational needs;
- (c) to agree, where possible, on an educational programme for the child at the school; and
- (d) to discuss possible alternatives to the educational programmes available at the school.

262J. (1) Where an initial conference has taken place and the principal of the school is of the opinion—

- (a) that it is not possible adequately to determine whether the school is able to provide a suitable educational programme for the child without further advice; or
- (b) that it is not possible for the school to provide a suitable educational programme for the child,

he shall arrange forthwith for a specialist assessment of the educational needs of the child.

(2) The assessment referred to in subregulation (1) of this regulation shall be made by any or all of the following persons—

- (a) an officer or officers of the Guidance Branch or other specialist branches of the Education Department;
- (b) any person or agency generally approved by the Director-General as suitable for the assessment of children;
- (c) at the request of the parents of the child, and if approved by the Director-General, by any person or agency not comprised in paragraphs (a) and (b) of this subregulation.

(3) Where an assessment of a child has been made under the provisions of this regulation, the principal shall forthwith convene an assessment conference to discuss the results of the assessment.

(4) An assessment conference shall consist of—

- (a) the principal of the school;
- (b) the teacher or teachers of the child; and
- (c) where practicable, the person or persons who made the assessment.

(5) An assessment conference shall consider the report or reports of the person or persons making the assessment and shall recommend to the principal that the child—

- (a) remain in the school under that school's regular programme;
- (b) remain in the school under a modified programme;
- (c) be placed in a special educational facility; or
- (d) be excluded from attending any Government school.

262K. (1) Where, after an assessment conference, the principal of the school decides that the child should remain in the school under the regular or a modified programme, he shall forthwith—

- (a) inform the parents of the child in writing of the decision explaining the reasons for the decision and the nature of the programme the child will undertake; and
- (b) attempt to enlist the co-operation of the parents in implementing the programme decided upon.

SCHEDULE—*continued*

(2) Where, after an assessment conference, the principal of the school is of the opinion that it is not practicable, by modification in facilities, staff, or programmes, to provide a suitable educational programme for the child at the school and that the child should be placed in a special educational facility he shall forthwith—

- (a) recommend to the Director-General that the child be made subject to a direction to special education; and
- (b) inform the parents of the child, in writing, that he has made such a recommendation.

(3) Where the Director-General does not approve the recommendation he shall—

- (a) direct that the suspension of the child, if any, be terminated;
- (b) direct that the child continue to be enrolled in the school; and
- (c) inform the parents of the child in writing of his decision.

(4) Where the Director-General approves the recommendation he shall—
