ROAD TRAFFIC ACT, 1974.

Vehicle Standards Regulations, 1977.

Road Traffic (Licensing) Regulations, 1975.

I, DESMOND HENRY O'NEIL, Minister for Traffic, in exercise of the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Act, 1974, and above cited regulations do hereby direct:—

1. The directions relating to the licensing of certain vehicles as of Class B and C appearing on pages 2546 and 2547 of the *Government Gazette* of the 5th August, 1977, are hereby rescinded.

2. The Road Traffic Authority may issue licences of Classes B and C, in accordance with the following directions, subject to the conditions of movements, purpose of use of the vehicle, requisite signs and warning devices being endorsed on the licence documents as specified in the direction.

2.1 In this Direction—

“Warning flag” means a red flag of not less than 450 millimetres square;

“Warning sign” means a sign bearing the words “OVERWIDTH” “OVERLENGTH” or both as the case may require, in black lettering, 200 millimetres in height on a yellow background.

3. Fire Fighting vehicles:—Licences of Class B may be issued for any vehicle that is owned by a person engaged in the business of farming or grazing and that is fitted and used solely for the purpose of fire fighting or fire prevention, or its movement to the nearest practicable place for repair, without the payment of a licence fee but subject to such other charges as are prescribed by law.

4. Class “B” vehicle:—Licences of Class “B” may be issued where a vehicle—

4.1 is not equipped with lights in conformity with the Vehicle Standards Regulations, 1977, provided its use is restricted to the hours between sunrise and sunset;

4.2 is a tractor or self-propelled agriculture implement not exceeding 8.5 metres in width which is used only for agricultural or pastoral pursuits within such areas as the Road Traffic Authority may direct and subject to the following conditions—

4.2.1 where the width of the vehicle exceeds 2.5 metres a warning flag is to be affixed at each lateral extremity;

- 4.2.2 where the width of the vehicle exceeds 3 metres but not 4.9 metres a warning flag is to be affixed to each lateral extremity and a warning sign indicating the vehicle is overwidth is to be affixed to the front and rear of the vehicle;
- 4.2.3 where the width of the vehicle exceeds 4.9 metres but not 8.5 metres, a warning flag is to be affixed at each lateral extremity, a warning sign that the vehicle is overwidth is to be affixed to the front and to the rear of a vehicle, the vehicle is to be preceded by a pilot vehicle bearing a warning sign indicating that an overwidth vehicle follows it and the vehicle is to be followed by a pilot vehicle bearing a warning sign that an overwidth vehicle is ahead of it;
- 4.2.4 where the width of the vehicle exceeds 3 metres and is driven within 32 kilometres of the General Post Office, Perth, the following conditions apply—
- 4.2.4.1 Pilot vehicle to be used preceding the vehicle at a distance of 45 metres-140 metres bearing a sign in front "OVERWIDTH/OVERHEIGHT/OVERLENGTH VEHICLE FOLLOWING" in black letters 200 mm high on a yellow background.
- 4.2.4.2 For vehicles exceeding 3.05 m in width and/or 22 m overall length headlights on vehicle and pilot vehicle to be kept burning in dipped position.
- 4.2.4.3 Vehicle to carry front and rear signs "OVERWIDTH/OVERHEIGHT/OVERLENGTH" in black letters 200 mm high on a yellow background.
- 4.2.4.4 Vehicles(s) not to travel during hours of darkness except that overlength vehicles are permitted to travel during hours of darkness in approved Road Train areas only. Reflectorised signs to be fitted. Warning lights and reflectors to be fitted in accordance with Vehicle Standards Regulation 1104 (4).
- 4.2.4.5 Speed Limit 40 km/h.
- 4.2.4.6 Movement is not permitted between the hours of 7.30 a.m. to 9.00 a.m. and 4.30 p.m. to 6.00 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays inclusive. Nor between 9.00 a.m. to 12.30 p.m. on Saturdays.
- 4.3 Is a tractor or tractor plant other than a tracked vehicle and not exceeding 3 metres in width or 12.2 metres in length subject to the following conditions:—
- 4.3.1 where the length of the vehicle exceeds 11 metres but not 12.2 metres, or its width exceeds 2.5 metres but not 3 metres, a warning sign indicating that the vehicle is overlength, overwidth, or both, as the case may be, is to be affixed to the front and rear of the vehicle;
- 4.3.2 where the vehicle is a mobile crane a warning flag is to be attached to the hook which is to be secured and if the length exceeds 11 metres or width exceeds 2.5 metres its use is confined to the hours between sunrise and sunset;
- 4.3.3 irrespective of the number of tyres per axle, the tyre-axle loadings and tyre inflation pressures do not exceed the following—

- 4.3.5 the longitudinal distance between the centres of any two axles is not less than 1.2 metres;
- 4.3.6 where the longitudinal distance between the centre of extreme axles of a group of two or more consecutive axles is less than 2.4 metres, the total load carried by those axles does not exceed 13 208 kilograms;

4.3.7 the vehicle travels unladen at all times except when operating within the confines of a road construction activity and is directed by the Road Construction Authority.

5. Class "C" vehicles:—Motor vehicles of a dimension, weight or axle loading exceeding those set out in Clause 4 of this Direction may be licensed as of Class "C" only with my special approval.

DAIRY INDUSTRY ACT, 1973.

Direction by the Minister for Agriculture.

I, RICHARD CHARLES OLD, Minister for Agriculture, being the Minister for the time being administering the Dairy Industry Act, 1973, pursuant to the powers conferred by section 27 of the said Act, hereby direct the Dairy Industry Authority to determine applications for market milk and special products milk delivery quotas

made to it under section 26 of the Act in respect of the quota year commencing on January 1, 1978, on the following bases or principles:—

- (a) market milk quotas and special products milk quotas shall be granted to dairymen holding market milk quotas at the end of the quota year commencing January 1, 1977 for not less than the quantity held by them in that quota year, (disregarding the whole or any part thereof surrendered on or immediately before January 1, 1978) subject to the following conditions:—

(1) dairymen who short supplied in any month during the period July 1, 1976 to June 30, 1977 will have their quotas for the year 1978 calculated on the basis of the month of lowest supply during the period July 1, 1976 to June 30, 1977 unless, within 14 days of receiving from the Authority written advice of the decision of the Authority with respect to their application for quota, such dairymen, due to extenuating circumstances, are able to present reasons in writing acceptable to the Authority for the short supply of quota. Notwithstanding this condition no dairyman is to be allocated a market milk quota less than the equivalent of 245 litres daily; and

(2) dairymen whose quotas for the 1977 quota year were reduced because of previous shortfall during the period July 1, 1975, to June 30, 1976 will have that reduction restored for the 1978 quota year except that where they have short supplied the reduced quota during the period July 1, 1976 to June 30, 1977, the 1978 quota shall be reduced by the amount of that shortfall.

- (b) new quotas equal to 245 litres of market milk each per day shall be issued to nine dairymen, selected in accordance with the principles previously laid down in paragraph (c) of the direction published in the *Government Gazette* on December 24, 1976, with approval to commence supplying on or after January 1, 1978.

ALLOWANCES PAYABLE TO
TEACHING STAFF.

Travelling, Transfer, Relieving, Removal
and District.

1.—Arrangement.

- (1) Arrangement.
- (2) Allowances Payable on Transfer or Appointment.
- (3) Allowances for Teachers Relieving Away from their usual Locality.
- (4) Allowances for Removal of Household Furniture, Appliances and Effects.
- (5) Travel Concessions for Teachers Travelling in the summer vacation.
- (6) Allowances Payable to Teachers involved with Excessive Daily Travelling to School.
- (7) Allowances Payable to Teachers Required to use their own Motor Vehicle or to Travel by Public Transport on School Business.
- (8) District Allowances.
- (9) Property Allowances on Transfer or Promotion.
- (10) Camping Allowances.

2.—Allowances Payable on Transfer
or Appointment.

(a) A teacher who travels to take up a new appointment shall be reimbursed reasonable accommodation and meal expenses during the course of travelling from one locality to another in accordance with the provisions of clause 5 of the

Public Service Miscellaneous Allowances Award No. 17 of 1976, such clause to apply *Mutatis Mutandis*: provided that where the locality of the new appointment is situated at a radius of fifty kilometres or less from the locality where the teacher was previously stationed, reimbursement of the above mentioned expenses, if any, shall be at the discretion of the Director-General.

(b) A teacher who is transferred to another locality where Government or private residential accommodation is unavailable and hotel or motel accommodation is utilised, shall be paid a transfer allowance at the rates prescribed by clause 6 of the Public Service Miscellaneous Allowances Award No. 17 of 1976, *Mutatis Mutandis*; up to a maximum period of fourteen days after arrival at the new locality; provided that a District Superintendent of Education shall certify that there is no suitable accommodation other than hotel or motel available in the locality.

(c) When Government residential accommodation is unavailable in a locality and a teacher is unable to obtain suitable alternative accommodation within the period of fourteen days mentioned in sub-clause (b), and the Director-General is satisfied that the teacher has taken all possible steps to secure suitable accommodation, the Director-General shall determine an appropriate rate of reimbursement having regard for the cost of the hotel or motel accommodation and normal reasonable living expenses for the teacher and any of his dependants.

(d) A teacher transferred to a locality where Government residential accommodation is available shall not be entitled to reimbursement under sub-clauses (b) and (c) except where entry into such Government residential accommodation is delayed through circumstances beyond the teacher's control. In the event of such a delay the teacher may, subject to the production of receipts, be reimbursed actual reasonable accommodation for himself and his wife and dependant children under 16 years of age or other children wholly dependant on him, less a deduction for normal living expenses prescribed in Column A, Items 14 and 15 of Schedule A of the Public Service Miscellaneous Allowances Award, No. 17 of 1976.

(e) Where it can be shown by the production of receipts or other evidence that allowances payable under sub-clauses (a) and (b) would be insufficient to meet reasonable additional costs incurred by a teacher on transfer, an appropriate rate of reimbursement shall be determined by the Director-General.

(f) The provisions of this clause do not apply to a teacher transferred from one school to another solely at his own request or on account of misconduct or unsatisfactory service, unless otherwise approved by the Director-General.

3.—Allowances for Teachers Relieving Away
from Their Usual Locality.

A teacher who is required to take up duty away from his usual locality to relieve another teacher or to perform special duty, and necessarily resides temporarily away from his usual place of residence shall be reimbursed reasonable accommodation, meal and incidental expenses in accordance with the provisions of clause 8 of the Public Service Miscellaneous Allowances Award No. 17 of 1976, and such clause shall apply *Mutatis Mutandis*.

4.—Allowances for Removal of Household
Furniture, Appliances and Effects.

(a) A teacher who is transferred in the public interest or in the ordinary course of promotion or transfer, or on account of illness due to causes over which the teacher has no control, shall be reimbursed—

- (i) the actual reasonable cost of conveyance of himself and his wife and children under 16 years of age or other children wholly dependant upon him;
- (ii) subject to sub-clause (c) the actual reasonable cost of conveyance of the teacher's furniture, including insurance of such furniture whilst in transit; and

(iii) an allowance of \$150 for accelerated depreciation and extra wear and tear on furniture, appliances and effects; provided that—

(a) the Director-General is satisfied that the value of necessary household furniture moved by the teacher is at least \$900; and

(b) payment of the allowance to transferred teachers will be made on every transfer.

(b) A teacher transferred from one school to another solely at his own request or on account of misconduct or unsatisfactory service must bear the whole cost of his removal unless otherwise approved by the Director-General.

(c) The maximum reimbursement for cost of conveyance of furniture, including insurance whilst in transit, shall be subject to the approval of the Director-General; provided that only necessary household furniture, appliances and effects shall be taken into consideration.

(d) A teacher shall be reimbursed the full freight charges necessarily incurred in respect of the removal of his motor vehicle.

If authorised by the Director-General to travel to the new locality in his own motor vehicle, reimbursement for the distance necessarily travelled shall be on the basis of one-half of the appropriate rate of hire as prescribed by clause 5 of the Public Service Motor Vehicle Allowances Award, No. 13 of 1976 *Mutatis Mutandis*, except that teachers who travel in their own motor vehicle to localities north of 26 degrees south latitude will receive the full rates provided in that award, subject to the following conditions:—

(i) The journey is by the shortest practical route.

(ii) The reimbursement does not exceed the cost of the air fare for the teacher, his wife and dependent children.

(iii) The reimbursement does not exceed the cost of the teacher's air fare when his family does not accompany him by car.

(e) Where practicable furniture, effects and appliances shall be removed by State-owned transport unless some other mode of transport is approved by the Director-General. Applications for the use of road transport will only be approved by the Director-General in special circumstances. Such applications shall be accompanied by quotes from at least two carriers where practicable.

(f) Vouchers must be produced for all sums paid.

(g) The Director-General may, in lieu of cost of conveyance, authorise payment of an amount not exceeding the maximum prescribed by subclause (c) to compensate for loss in any case where an officer with prior approval of the Director-General, disposes of his furniture, appliances and effects instead of removing them to his new headquarters; provided that such payment shall not exceed the sum which would have been paid if such furniture, appliances and effects had been removed by the cheapest form of transport available.

(h) When a teacher is transferred to accommodation where furniture is provided and as a consequence is obliged to store his own furniture, he shall be reimbursed the actual cost of such storage as approved and authorised by the Director-General.

5. Travel Concessions for Teachers Travelling in the Summer Vacation.

(a) Teachers employed in District Allowance Areas 3, 5 and 6 and in that portion of Area 4 situated north of the 30° south latitude shall be entitled to the following concessions when proceeding to either Perth or Geraldton in the summer vacation:—

Mode of Travel to be Allowed; Concessions.

(i) Air—teacher and family travelling together; Free passes for the teacher, his wife and dependent children,

(ii) Sea—teacher and family travelling together; Free passes for the teacher, his wife and dependent children.

(iii) Road—teacher and family travelling together; Full rates in accordance with subclause (e).

(iv) Air and Road—teacher travelling by car and the remainder of family by air; Full rates for car trip by the teacher in accordance with subclause (e). Free passes for his wife and dependent children.

(v) Sea and Road—teacher travelling by car and the remainder of family by sea; Full rates for car trip by the teacher in accordance with subclause (e). Free passes for his wife and dependent children.

(vi) Sea and Air—teacher travelling by air and remainder of the family by sea; Free passes in each case for the teacher, his wife and dependent children.

(b) Teachers employed in isolated localities (towns of Cundeelee, Coonana, Zanthus, Rawlina, Reid) in District Allowance Area 4 south of 30° south latitude shall be entitled to the following concessions when proceeding to Perth or Esperance during the summer vacation:

(i) Road—teacher and family travelling together; Full rates in accordance with subclause (e).

(ii) Rail and Road—Teacher travelling by car and the remainder of the family by rail; Full rates for car trip by the teacher in accordance with subclause (e). Free first class rail fares for his wife and dependent children.

(c) Teachers employed in District Allowance Area 2 shall be entitled to reimbursement of fares to Perth for the teacher and his dependents once in every two years. If the teacher elects to travel by road in his own motor vehicle, he shall be reimbursed at the rate of 10 cents per kilometre for the return journey.

(d) The mode of travel used by teachers in accordance with subclauses (a) and (b) shall be subject to the approval of the Director-General.

(e) A teacher who is eligible for a travel concession in accordance with subclauses (a) or (b) of this clause and who elects to travel by motor vehicle instead of by air, rail or sea shall be reimbursed the full rates in accordance with the Public Service Motor Vehicle Allowances Award No. 13 of 1976 provided that the amount of reimbursement shall not exceed the cost—

(i) in respect of subclause (a), of a return air fare by public air services of a teacher when travelling alone or the return air fares of the teacher and his family when travelling together; and

(ii) in respect of subclause (b), of a return first class rail fare of a teacher when travelling alone or the return first class rail fares of the teacher and his family when travelling together.

The amount of reimbursement under this subclause shall be approved by the Director-General.

(f) When the teacher and family travel together by rail, first class rail fares shall be allowed for the teacher, his wife and dependent children.

(g) No concession in this clause shall apply to a child dependent upon a teacher if that child is aged seventeen years or over, unless that child is totally dependent upon the teacher and then with the special approval of the Director-General.

6.—Allowance Payable to Teachers Involved with Excessive Daily Travelling to School.

(a) A teacher employed at a country school who is unable to obtain suitable residential accommodation within a distance of 16 kilometres of the school, if authorised by the Director-General to travel to and from the school in his own motor vehicle, shall be reimbursed for the distance necessarily travelled in excess of 16 kilometres each way between the residence and the school on the basis

(b) Single Teachers: Half the appropriate rate as prescribed in (a) above for married male teachers.

(c) For the purpose of this clause, the boundaries of the various districts shall be as described hereunder:—

BOUNDARIES.

District:—

- (1) The areas within a line commencing on coast; then east along latitude 28 to a point north of Tallering Peak; thence due south to Tallering Peak; thence southeast to Mount Gibson and Burracoppin; thence to a point southeast at the junction of latitude 32 and longitude 119; thence south along longitude 119 to the coast.
- (2) The area within a line commencing on the south coast at longitude 119; thence east along the coast to longitude 123; thence north along longitude 123 to a point on latitude 30; thence west along latitude 30 to the boundary of No. 1 District.
- (3) The area within a line commencing on the coast at latitude 26; thence east along latitude 26 to longitude 123; thence south along longitude 123 to the boundary of No. 2 District.
- (4) The area within a line commencing on the coast at latitude 24; thence east to the South Australian border; thence south to the coast; thence along the coast to longitude 123; thence north to the intersection of latitude 26; thence west along latitude 26 to the coast.
- (5) That area of the State situated between latitude 24 and a line running east from Carnot Bay to the Northern Territory border.
- (6) That area of the State north of a line running east from Carnot Bay to the Northern Territory border.

9.—Property Allowances.

(a) When a teacher is transferred from one locality to another in the public interest or in the ordinary course of promotion or transfer, or on account of illness due to causes over which he has no control, he shall be entitled to be paid a property allowance for reimbursement of prescribed expenses incurred by him—

- (i) in the sale of a residence in his former locality, which, at the date on which he received notice of his transfer to his new locality—
 - (a) he owned and occupied; or
 - (b) he was purchasing under a contract of sale providing for vacant possession; or
 - (c) he was constructing for his own permanent occupation, on completion of construction; and
- (ii) in the purchase of a residence or land for the purpose of erecting a residence thereon for his own permanent occupation in his new locality.

(b) A teacher is not entitled to be paid a property allowance under subclause (a) (i) unless he is entitled to be paid a property allowance under subclause (a) (i); provided that the Director-General may approve the payment of a property

allowance under subclause (a) (ii) to a teacher who is not entitled to be paid property allowance under subclause (a) (i) if the Director-General is satisfied that it was necessary for the teacher to purchase a residence or land for the purpose of erecting a residence thereon in this new locality because of his transfer from his former locality.

(c) For the purpose of this clause it is immaterial that the ownership, sale or purchase is—

- (i) in the case of a married teacher, solely or jointly or in common with—
 - (a) his spouse;
 - (b) a dependent relative; or
 - (c) his spouse and a dependent relative.
- (ii) in the case of any other teacher, solely or jointly or in common with a dependent relative living with him.

(d) Where the teacher sells or purchases a residence jointly or in common with another person—not being a person referred to in subclause (c)—he shall be paid only the proportion of the prescribed expenses for which he is responsible.

(e) An application by a teacher for a property allowance shall be accompanied by evidence of the payment by the teacher of the prescribed expenses; being evidence that is satisfactory to the Director-General.

(f) Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions, a teacher is not entitled to the payment of a property allowance—

- (i) in respect of a sale or purchase prescribed in subclause (a) which is effected—
 - (a) more than twelve months after the date on which he took up duty in his new locality; or
 - (b) after the date on which he received notification that he was being transferred back to his former locality; provided that the Director-General may, in exceptional circumstances, grant an extension of time for such period as is deemed reasonable.
- (ii) where the teacher is transferred from one locality to another solely at his own request or on account of misconduct.

(g) “Dependent relative” in relation to a teacher means a relative or chief person who is solely dependent on the teacher for support.

“Locality” in relation to a teacher means—

- (i) within the metropolitan area, that area within a radius of fifty kilometres from the Perth Central Railway Station; and
- (ii) outside the metropolitan area, that area within a radius of fifty kilometres from a teacher’s headquarters when they are situated outside of the metropolitan area.

“Prescribed expenses” means—

- (i) legal fees, not exceeding fifty dollars in respect of each transaction;
- (ii) stamp duty (except stamp duty payable in connection with the registration or discharge of a mortgage);
- (iii) fees paid to the Registrar of Titles or to the teacher performing duties of a like nature and for the same purpose in another State of the Commonwealth (except fees payable in connection with the registration or discharge of a mortgage).

“Residence” includes any accommodation of a kind commonly known as a flat or home unit that is, or is intended to be, a separate tenement.

10.—Camping Allowance.

(a) A teacher who is stationed in a camp of a permanent nature where facilities of a good standard are provided, shall be paid the appropriate allowance prescribed by the Public Service Camping Allowance Agreement, No. 6 of 1976 for each day spent camping; provided that no such allowance shall be paid when a teacher occupies a departmental house within or near the precincts of a camp.

 the period of the vacation shall not form part of the period of long service leave.
