ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corres. No. 3173/66.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1972, it is, *inter alia*, made lawful for the Governor to direct that any land reserved pursuant to the provisions of the Act shall be leased for the purpose for which the land is reserved as aforesaid, by Instrument of Lease in accordance with the form in the Fourth Schedule of the Act, to any person (as defined in the said Section): and whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve No. 29404 shall be leased for a term of one year to The Busselton Golf Club Incorporated to be held in trust for the purpose of "Public Recreation" subject to the following conditions:—

- (1) The land shall not be used for any purpose other than "Public Recreation" without the prior approval in writing of the Minister for Lands.
- (2) The lease shall be renewable at the will of the Minister for Lands and subject to determination at three months' notice by either party after the initial term of one (1) year. Should the lease be so renewed, the rental fixed may be re-appraised at such amount as the Minister for Lands may at any time and from time to time determine.

(3) Compensation shall not be payable to the lessee in respect of any improvements effected by him on the demised land and remaining thereon at the expiration or earlier determination of the lease.

(4) On determination of the lease, the lessee shall fill in, consolidate and level off any unevenness, excavation or hole caused by him during the term of the lease or by removal of his improvements and shall leave the demised land in a clean, neat and tidy condition to the satisfaction of the Minister for Lands and shall remove any or all waste matter as required by the Minister.

(5) Improvements on the area will be restricted to non-structural development associated with the laying out and maintenance of golf course extensions.

(6) The right of the public to free access on and over the reserve should be guaranteed at all times.

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council doth hereby direct that the abovementioned Reserve shall be leased for a term of one year to The Busselton Golf Club Incorporated to be held in trust for the purpose of "Public Recreation", subject to the conditions as aforesaid.

Local Government Act, 1960-1977.

ORDERS IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 288 of the Local Government Act, 1960-1977, it shall be lawful for the Governor, on request by a Council of a Municipal District, by Order published in the *Government Gazette* to declare any lands reserved or acquired for use by the public or used by the public as a street, way, public place, bridge or thoroughfare, under the care, control, and management of the Council, or lands comprised in a private street, constructed and maintained to the satisfaction of the Council, or lands comprised in a private street of which the public has had uninterrupted use for a period of not less than ten years, as a public street and if the Council thinks fit, that the Governor shall declare the width of carriageway and footpaths of the public street; and whereas the Councils mentioned in the schedule hereto have requested that certain lands named and described in the said schedule, which have been reserved for

streets within the said Councils, be declared public streets: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby declare the said lands to be public streets and such land shall, from the date of this Order, be absolutely dedicated to the public as streets within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force.

WHEREAS under the provisions of the Health Act, 1911-1976 a local authority may make, adopt, alter, amend or repeal any By-laws so made or adopted: Now, therefore the City of Fremantle being a local authority within the meaning of the Act, and having adopted the Model By-laws described as Series "A" as reprinted in *Government Gazette* on July 17, 1963 doth hereby resolve and determine that the said adopted By-laws shall be amended as follows:—

PART I.—BY-LAW 26—STABLES.

The whole of this by-law is repealed and replaced by the following:—  
The occupier of any premises whereon a horse is kept shall provide a stable which shall comply with the following conditions:—

- (a) It shall not be at any less distance than 16 metres from any dwelling-house, nor less than 15 metres from the milking-shed or milk-room of any dairy.
- (b) It shall have walls to a number and height and thickness approved and such walls shall be constructed of concrete, brick, stone, wood or galvanised iron.
- (c) It shall have a roof to be constructed of some impervious material
- (d) There shall be on all sides of the building between the wall and the roof a continuous clear space of at least 150 mm in height.
- (e) The upper surface of the floor shall be raised at least 75 mm above the surface of the surrounding ground, and shall be constructed of granolithic cement, concrete or some other approved impervious material; it shall have a fall of one in a hundred to a drain.
- (f) There shall be provided outside each stable a receptacle for manure; such receptacle shall be constructed of brick, faced with cement or with other approved impervious material; it shall be provided with a tight-fitting cover and shall be emptied at least once weekly.
- (g) All manure produced on the premises shall be collected daily and placed in the receptacle for manure.
- (h) The stable shall be maintained in a clean condition, and shall be cleansed and disinfected when so ordered by a surveyor.

- (i) All stables shall be licensed annually and the fee shall be five dollars (\$5.00) per stall. The local authority may withdraw the license at any time if the structural condition deteriorates, is unsightly or considered by a Health Surveyor to be detrimental or dangerous to health. License shall operate from January 1 to December 31.
- (j) The owner of every stable shall live on the property.
- (k) Any person operating an unlicensed stable shall be liable to a penalty of forty dollars (\$40.00) and four dollars (\$4.00) a day for every day of non compliance.
- (l) All existing stables shall conform to these By-laws by the first day of January, 1979.

## ROAD TRAFFIC ACT, 1974.

## Vehicle Standards Regulations, 1977.

## Movement of Towed Agricultural Implements.

RTA File—75/392.

I, REGINALD JAMES COURT, Chairman of the Road Traffic Authority acting pursuant to Regulation 1106 of the Vehicle Standards Regulations 1977 do hereby rescind the order published in the *Government Gazette* of 16th July, 1976, and all previous orders published under this Regulation, and direct that the movement of agricultural implements exceeding 2.5 metres in width or 16.8 metres in length, including the towing vehicle, may be made during the hours between sunrise and sunset subject to the following conditions:—

1.0 Highways and Main Roads shown in schedules 1 and 2 hereto—

- 1.1 The movement of towed agricultural implements not exceeding 4.9 metres in width or 18.3 metres in length, including the towing vehicle, is authorised by virtue of this direction alone.
- 1.2 The movement of towed agricultural implements exceeding 4.9 metres but not 8.5 metres in width is authorised by a permit issued under Regulation 1106 of the Vehicle Standards Regulations 1977 by an officer of the Authority, Traffic Inspector or Police Officer.
- 1.3 All movements to be made in accordance with the General Conditions specified hereunder.

2.0 On roads other than those shown in the schedules hereto movements may be made by virtue of this direction alone subject to the General Conditions listed hereunder.

## 3.0 General Conditions

## 3.1 Overwidth—

- 3.1.1 Where the width of the towed agricultural implement exceeds 2.5 metres but not 3.0 metres, the weight of the implement is not to exceed the weight of the towing vehicle and warning flags are to be affixed to each lateral extremity of the implement.
- 3.1.2 Where the width of the towed agricultural implement exceeds 3 metres but not 4.9 metres, the towing vehicle is to be a tractor or wagon with a tare exceeding 2 032 kg., and warning flags are to be affixed to each lateral extremity of the implement. Warning signs indicating that the implement is overwidth are to be affixed to the front of the towing vehicle and the rear of the implement.
- 3.1.3 Where the width of the towed agricultural implement exceeds 4.9 metres but not 8.5 metres, the towing vehicle is to be a tractor or wagon with a tare exceeding 2 032 kg., warning flags are to be affixed to each lateral extremity of the implement. Warning signs indicating that the implement is overwidth are to be affixed to the

front of the towing vehicle and the rear of the implement. The towing vehicle is to be preceded by a pilot vehicle bearing a sign that an overwidth tow follows.

- 3.1.4 Agricultural implements exceeding 8.5 metres in width are not permitted to be moved on roads without the special approval of the Chief Executive Officer.

## 3.2 Overlength—

- 3.2.1 The movement of towed agricultural implements where the combined length of the implement and towing vehicle exceeds 18.3 metres is authorised by the issue of a permit issued under Regulation 1106 of the Vehicle Standards Regulations 1977 by an officer of the Authority, Traffic Inspector or a Police Officer.

- 3.2.2 Warning signs indicating that the combined implement and towing vehicle is overlength are to be affixed to the front of the towing vehicle and the rear of the implement.

- 3.3 "Warning flag" means a red flag of not less than 450 millimetres square.

- 3.4 "Warning sign" means a sign bearing the words "overwidth" or "overlength" or a combination of these words as may be required in black lettering 200 millimetres in height on a yellow background.

- 3.5 Warning signs are to be covered or removed on completion of the movement.

- 3.6 The implement or towing vehicle is not to be parked on the main portion of a road.

- 3.7 The movement is to be made at a speed not exceeding 35km/h.

- 3.8 A movement of an implement exceeding 3 metres in width or of a combined implement and towing vehicle exceeding 16.8 metres in length is not to be made within 32 kilometres of the General Post Office Perth without the approval in writing of the Chief Executive Officer of the Authority.

- 3.9 Permits, for which no fee is payable, may be issued for a single movement or a number of movements or for a period not exceeding twelve months.


- 3.10 Additional limitations relating to time, place and circumstance may be imposed by an officer of the Authority, Traffic Inspector or a Police Officer.

- 3.11 The weight of an agricultural implement which is not overwidth or overlength may not exceed the weight of the towing vehicle.



IT is hereby notified that the Hon. Minister administering the Bush Fires Act, 1954, has approved of the following for the districts of the municipalities set out in the Schedule hereunder for the periods stated therein:—

- (a) Acting under the powers conferred by section 17 subsection (3) (i) of the Bush Fires Act, 1954, approved of the suspension of all declarations of prohibited burning times under section 17 of the Act, so far as such declarations extend to any land used for Railway purposes.
- (b) Acting under the powers conferred by section 17 subsection (3) (iv) of the Act, approved of the suspension of all declarations for prohibited burning times under section 17 of the Act so far as such declarations extend to all land on those parts of roads having a common boundary with land used for Railway purposes, as is situated between the road formation and the said common boundary.

Any burning undertaken under the provisions of this suspension shall be subject to the following conditions:—

- (1) The Local Authority is to be advised on each day that burning is proposed and no burning shall be undertaken on any day which the Local Authority or an officer nominated by it prohibits burning on the land affected by these suspensions.

- (2) No burning shall be undertaken on days when the fire hazard forecast issued by the Bureau of Meteorology for the area concerned is "dangerous" except in accordance with the provisions of the Bush Fires Act.
- (3) At least three men shall be constantly in attendance at every fire until it has been completely extinguished including all smouldering logs, timber, disused sleepers and other inflammable material.
- (4) Each man shall be provided with a heavy fire rake and each three men with at least one knapsack spray with sufficient water for its operation.
- (5) Any burning carried out under the provisions of this suspension shall comply with section 18 and all other relevant provisions of the Bush Fires Act, 1954.

Citation.

1. This Town Planning Scheme may be cited as Town of Canning Town Planning Scheme No. 30—Riley Road Development Scheme (hereinafter called "the Scheme").

Responsible Authority.

2. The Authority responsible for enforcing the observance of this Scheme is the Town of Canning (hereinafter called "the Council").

Maps.

3. The following maps are attached to and form part of the Scheme:

Land Use Map.

Scheme Map.

Supplementary Map showing road deviations and road closures.

Scheme Area.

4. The Scheme shall apply to the whole of the land contained within the inner edge of a broken black line on the Land Use Map and the Scheme Map. The said land is hereinafter referred to as "the Scheme Area". The areas shown shaded grey on the Scheme Map are hereinafter referred to as the "Private Development Area". The area shown on the Scheme Map as Special Business—Plant Nursery is hereinafter referred to as the "Special Business Area". The areas shown on the Scheme Map as "Service Station" and "Hotel-Motel" are hereinafter referred to as such respectively. The remainder of the Scheme area is hereinafter referred to as the "Council Development Area". Portion of the Scheme Area is within the area of Town of

Canning Town Planning Scheme No. 23 Lynwood-Ferndale Guided Development Scheme published in the *Government Gazette* of 19th November, 1971, and Amendment No. 1 published in the *Government Gazette* of 5th September, 1975 (hereinafter referred to as "Scheme 23") and the remaining portion is within the area of Town Planning Scheme No. 24 Willetton Guided Development Scheme published in the *Government Gazette* of 27th June, 1975 (hereinafter referred to as "Scheme 24").

#### General Objects.

5. The general objects of the Scheme are:

- (a) To resurvey and subdivide the Council Development Area.
- (b) To make suitable provision for the use of land within the Council Development Area for building purposes and for the other purposes shown on the Scheme Map.
- (c) To make suitable provisions for roads and traffic within the Council Development Area.
- (d) To ensure proper drainage of those parts of the Council Development Area that require drainage.
- (e) To provide a reticulated water supply throughout the Council Development Area.
- (f) To provide sewage disposal services within the Council Development Area.
- (g) To provide for the apportionment of certain costs of the Scheme among owners of land within the Scheme Area.

#### Management of Scheme.

6. The Council shall carry out and manage the Scheme in respect of the Council Development Area in accordance with the following provisions.

#### Schemes 23 and 24.

7. The Scheme Map of this Scheme differs from the maps which form part of Schemes 23 and 24. The purpose of this Scheme is to carry out the development proposals contained in Scheme 23 and 24 so far as such proposals relate to the Council Development Area. The Scheme Maps of Scheme 23 and of Scheme 24 and all other maps which form part of Scheme 23 and Scheme 24 shall be deemed to be amended to conform to the Scheme Map and to the provisions of this present Scheme.

8. The Council shall when subdividing and developing land in the Council Development Area comply with and observe the provisions of Scheme 23 and Scheme 24 except insofar as those Schemes have been modified by this Scheme and for the purpose of those Schemes be treated as an owner subdividing land.

9. Owners of land in the Private Development Area shall except insofar as Scheme 23 has been modified by this Scheme comply with and observe the provisions of Scheme 23.

#### Acquisition of Land.

10. The land within the Council Development Area or so much thereof as is necessary to implement the Scheme but excluding the nominated lots under Clause 16 and excluding the Special Business Area shall be resumed or otherwise acquired by the Council.

#### Scheme Works.

11. Subject to the provisions of Clause 12, the following works shall be carried out within the Council Development Area:—

- (a) The Council Development Area shall be resurveyed in conformity with the design shown on the Scheme Map with such variations as may with the approval such the Town Planning Board be determined by the Council.

- (b) The lands shown as roads on the Scheme Map within the Council Development Area not already constructed shall be constructed and drained and all necessary earthworks undertaken but in the cases of Vahland Avenue, Willeri Drive and Apsley Road only one carriageway will be constructed. The carriageways shown on the Scheme Map are diagrammatic only and the location or dimensions of any carriageway may be altered by the Council from the design shown on the Scheme Map where it considers it necessary or desirable to do so.

- (c) The lands shown as pedestrian accessways on the Scheme Map within the Council Development Area shall be set aside for that purpose and shall be paved.

- (d) Levelling filling and drainage works including the relocation and piping of existing open drains shall be carried out within the Council Development Area where considered necessary or desirable by the Council.

- (e) The lands shown as compensating basins on the Scheme Map shall be set aside for drainage purposes and drainage reserves.

- (f) Sewage disposal facilities shall be provided throughout the Council Development Area and all necessary pipes mains pumping stations and other apparatus and equipment shall be installed. Where necessary mains and pumping stations may be installed outside the Council Development Area.

- (g) Water shall be reticulated throughout the Council Development Area and all necessary pipes mains pumping stations and other apparatus and equipment shall be installed. Where necessary mains and pumping stations may be installed outside the Council Development Area.

- (h) The lands shown as Public Open Space on the Scheme Map within the Council Development Area shall be set aside for that purpose.

- (i) If in the opinion of the Council it is necessary or desirable the clearing and the grading for drainage purposes of the land shown as Public Open Space shall be carried out.

- (j) Tree planting and landscape treatment for the purposes of screening or maintaining a reasonable level of amenity in the area shall be carried out where considered desirable by the Council.

- (k) If in the opinion of the Council it is considered economically feasible to lay electric power lines underground such works will be undertaken, but the said works shall not be undertaken if the Council is of the opinion that the owners' interest in the Scheme would be decreased as a result.

- (l) Where in the opinion of the Council it would be desirable to erect fences on the new boundaries of existing developed lots or on adjacent lots such works shall be undertaken.

#### Unsuitable Land.

12. If in the opinion of the Council any lot or part thereof within the Council Development Area is considered unsuitable for such form of subdivision or development as is shown on the Scheme Map the Council may exclude the said lot or part thereof from the Council Development Area.

#### Closure of Roads and Rights-of-Way.

13. It is the intention of the Scheme that certain roads and rights of way shall be closed and replaced by other roads in order to improve the safety of vehicular and pedestrian traffic in

the Scheme Area. Those roads and rights of way within or abutting the Council Development Area which are shown on the Scheme Map as closed roads or closed rights of way shall be closed and the land used for the purpose shown on the Scheme Map. The Supplementary Map shows road deviations to accommodate traffic from the roads to be closed by the Scheme.

#### Scheme Costs.

14. (1) The costs or estimated costs of the following items comprise the Scheme Costs:—

- (a) The administration costs of the Scheme including an amount to reimburse the Council for such overhead and management costs as may be incurred in the implementation of the Scheme. The term "administration costs" shall in addition include all legal costs, planning costs, payment to planning consultants and other professional consultants and valuation costs.
  - (b) Except for the proportion of the costs of servicing the Private School site as shall be determined by the Council the costs of the Scheme works to be carried out within the Council Development Area provided that pursuant to a Deed made upon the fourteenth day of November 1972 Development Underwriting (Willetton) Pty. Ltd. agreed to reimburse the Council compensation and costs relative to the relocation of Apsley Road such sums not to exceed \$25 000.
  - (c) The cost of those drainage works including repairing and upgrading drainage facilities which are outside the Council Development Area to the extent of which such works are of benefit to the Council Development Area.
  - (d) All compensation payable and all costs and expenses of determining and settling compensation.
  - (e) The estimated compensation and costs payable under Clause 15 hereof.
  - (f) The cost of acquisition of any land within the Council Development Area in the event of such land being acquired other than by resumption.
  - (g) The costs of sewerage facilities and water reticulation in the Council Development Area.
  - (h) The cost of altering existing electricity water sewerage drainage or telephone services or of providing exceptional services rendered necessary by the Scheme to the extent to which and in cases where the Council considers the cost justified.
  - (i) All rates and taxes which would have been payable in respect of the land in the Council Development Area if that land had remained in private ownership for the period during which the land is vested in the Council.
  - (j) All Scheme Costs payable to the Council as the responsible authority for Scheme 23 and for Scheme 24.
  - (k) All other costs and expenses which the Council shall be required to meet in order to complete the Scheme.
- (1) The costs mentioned in subclauses (2) and (3) of this clause.
- (2) The costs of the following works shall form part of the Scheme Costs but in ascertaining the net value of new lots under Clause 19 such costs shall be deducted only from the values of the new lots situated west of Willeri Drive:

So much of the cost of the construction and drainage of Vahland Avenue, of Willeri Drive and of Apsley Road, as would have been payable if such roads had been of a single carriageway only.

(3) So much of the cost of the sewerage headworks serving the Scheme Area as is not payable by the Metropolitan Water Supply Sewerage and Drainage Board and by owners of land outside the Scheme Area shall be paid in the following manner:

- (a) The total area of land within the Scheme Area capable of being used after subdivision for the following purposes, namely—
  - Residential,
  - Homestore,
  - Place of Public Worship,
  - Hotel/Motel,
  - High School/Primary School,
  - Private School,

but excluding the nominated lots under Clause 16 shall be ascertained. The area so ascertained is herein referred to as "the contributing area."

- (b) Each owner of land within the Private Development Area shall pay to the Council that proportion of the costs of the sewerage headworks as the total area of his land in the Private Development Area capable of being subdivided and used for any of the purposes listed in subclause (3) (a) of this Clause bears to the contributing area.
- (c) Each Department or person or persons who acquires the High School/Primary School site and who acquires the Private School site shall pay to the Council that proportion of the costs of the sewerage headworks as the area of the High School/Primary School site or the Private School site as the case may be bears to the contributing area.
- (d) The Owner of the Hotel/Motel shall pay to the Council that proportion of the costs of sewerage headworks as one hectare of his land bears to the contributing area.
- (e) Except as provided in paragraph (f) hereunder the payments to be made to the Council shall be made in the cases of land within the Private Development Area and the Hotel/Motel by each owner immediately prior to the final approval of the plan or diagram of survey of the subdivision of his land or at the expiration of three months notice from the Council requiring such payment whichever shall first happen.
- (f) Payment to be made to the Council in respect of the portions of those lots listed hereunder which are included in the Private Development Area, namely—
  - Location 118 (C/T Vol. 534 Fol. 5A) Riley Road),
  - Location 118 (C/T Vol. 1081 Fol. 3) (Riley Road),
  - Lot 3 on Diagram 12289 (Riley Road),
  - Lot 2 on Diagram 12289 (Riley Road),
  - Lot 1 on Diagram 12289 (Riley Road),
  - Lot 12 on Diagram 21514 (Riley Road),
 shall be paid either immediately prior to the final approval of the plan or diagram of survey of the subdivision of the said lot or part thereof or upon the commencement of works on the last stage of the Council Development Area, whichever shall first happen.
- (g) The payment in respect of the School Sites shall be made upon the land having been acquired by the Department or person or persons for the purpose of a School Site.

(4) In ascertaining the net value of new lots under Clause 19 the amounts payable shall be deducted from the cost of the sewerage headworks.

(5) The remainder of the cost of the sewerage headworks shall be paid as part of the Scheme Costs.

#### Estimation of Compensation.

15. In the event of any claims for compensation not having been settled at the time when the Council desires to ascertain the Scheme Costs the Council may estimate the amount of compensation payable and the costs relating thereto and debit the Scheme with the amount so estimated. Any estimate so made may be revised from time to time. In the event of the Council having distributed the net surplus of the Scheme, the difference between the estimated and the actual compensation payable shall be received or paid by the Council as the case may be.

#### Nominated Lots.

16. The following lots shall be "Nominated Lots"—

- Lot 14 on Diagram 42447 (Herald Avenue).
- Lot 15 on Diagram 46375 (Cnr. Acanthus Road and Vahland Avenue).
- Lot 4 on Diagram 21115 (Mansard Road).
- Lot 10 on Diagram 45086 (Mansard Road).
- Lot 10 on Diagram 39783 (Mansard Road).

The owners of nominated lots shall not have any interest in the Scheme.

#### Owners' Value Ratio.

17. The lots shown on the Land Use Map but excluding the following lots or portions of lots, namely—

- Nominated lots under Clause 16.
- Land shown on the Scheme Map as Special Business Area and as Private School.
- That portion of Lot 1230 on Plan 4391 shown on the Scheme Map as Vahland Avenue road reserve.
- That portion of Lot 1121 on Plan 4391 situated north of a line being the eastward extension of the south boundary of Lot 14 on Diagram 42447.

within the Council Development Area (hereinafter called "old lots") shall be valued as at the 9th day of August, 1976, on which date the Council passed a resolution deciding to prepare the Scheme to ascertain the values thereof assuming that there are no buildings structures or fences thereon. The Council shall as soon as the valuation has been made notify each owner of the value so placed on his old lot or portion of his old lot as the case may be.

18. The lots (excluding the nominated lots under Clause 16, the Special Business Area, and the Private School) created by the resurvey of the Council Development Area in accordance with the Scheme Map (hereinafter called "new lots") shall be valued as at the 9th day of August, 1976, on the basis that all works to be undertaken as part of the Scheme have been carried out.

19. From the sum of the values of the new lots there shall be deducted subject to subclauses 14(2) and 14(4) the costs or estimated costs of the Scheme and the figure so ascertained is the net value of the new lots. The "owners' value ratio" is the relationship between the net value of the new lots and the sum of the values of the old lots.

#### Owners' Interest in Scheme.

20. Each owner of an old lot or portion of an old lot in the Council Development Area shall be deemed to be entitled to an interest in the Scheme of a value equal to the value of his old lot or the portion thereof within the Council Development Area increased in the ratio of the owners' value ratio determined in accordance with Clause 19 hereof if the net value of the new lots exceeds the sum of the value of the old lots and decreased in the said ratio if the net value of the new lots is less than the sum of the values of the old lots.

#### Allocation and Disposal of New Lots.

21. The new lots created by the resurvey of the Scheme Area (excluding the nominated lots under Clause 16, the Special Business Area, and the Private School) will be dealt with as follows—

- (a) The Council shall set aside certain lots to be nominated by it (hereinafter called "saleable lots") in order that the proceeds of sale of such lots may be applied in payment or part payment of the Scheme costs.
- (b) Subject to paragraph (c) hereunder the lots referred to in Clauses 39 to 41 and 43 shall be dealt with according to the provisions of those Clauses.
- (c) The remaining new lots and any group housing lots that the Council decides be so dealt with under Clause 39(a)(i) shall be apportioned among the owners of the old lots as equitably as possible and offered to such owners. So far as possible each owner of an old lot within the Council Development Area will be offered a new lot or lots as nearly as may be in the same position as his old lot and where possible having the same amenities of view corner position and the like.

#### Nature of Offers.

22. An offer made pursuant to the preceding clause will be made either with an offer of payment of money or subject to the owner making a payment of money in order that the total value of the new lot or lots offered and the new value of any land within the Council Development Area not acquired by the Council and retained by the owner together with or subject to a payment in money is equal to the owners' interest in the Scheme as ascertained in accordance with Clause 20 hereof. The offer may be made in the alternative giving the owner the right to accept either a lot or lots subject to a payment by him or to accept no lots or a lesser number of lots with a payment by the Council to him.

23. The owners from whom the land has been resumed but to whom no offer of land is made shall be offered a cash payment equal to that owner's interest in the Scheme.

24. If an owner shall in the opinion of the Council suffer any additional damage or inconvenience by reason of the reduction in the size of the lot on which a dwelling-house is erected or by reason of the proximity of a road to such dwelling-house or otherwise by reason of the Scheme, the Council shall offer to such owner such sum (if any) as it (acting on the advice of the Chief Valuer of the State Taxation Department or other valuer approved by it) considers equitable. The said offer shall be made with the offer mentioned in Clause 21 hereof to the intent that the owner may not accept the offer mentioned in Clause 21 either wholly or in part without accepting the offer in this clause mentioned.

25. The offers mentioned in the above clauses shall be made in writing to each of the said owners and served on him by certified post at his address as appearing in the Rate Book of the Council and shall specify the new lot or lots (if any) the subject of the offer and the old lot in respect of which the offer is made. It shall also specify the owner's interest in the Scheme, the valuations placed on the said lots and the payment to be made or received as the case may be and how the amount is calculated.

26. If a pipe drain has been or is to be laid across land within a new lot such new lot may be offered or sold expressly subject to the condition that the transferee shall grant to the Council or to the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Board as decided by the Council a drainage easement over so much of the lots as is required for the drain. If the Council shall itself have granted an easement to the said Board the lot shall be transferred subject to such easement.

27. The offer shall specify a date not being less than twenty-eight days after the posting of the said offer within which the offer may be accepted.

28. The offer may be accepted by notice in writing to the Council at any time before the date specified in the said offer and if not accepted within such time shall unless the time shall have been extended by the Council be deemed to have been rejected.

29. If an offer be made in the alternative and an owner does not accept all the lots offered to him the lots accepted by him shall be treated as being payment on account of the owner's interest in the Scheme. The remainder of his interest in the Scheme shall be adjusted in cash.

30. An owner who accepts the offer shall be liable to pay to the Council all rates which would have been payable on the land acquired from him if such land had remained in the name of the owner until the transfer of the new lots to him.

31. If an offer be accepted wholly or in part it shall be accepted by the owner on the basis that such acceptance is a complete bar to all claims for compensation which the owner may have had in respect of the resumption from him of the old lot or lots in respect of which the offer was made and otherwise in respect of the operation of the Scheme but shall not debar him from participating in the profits of the Scheme.

32. If an owner does not accept an offer wholly or in part he shall not be entitled to any interest under this Scheme or to participate in the Scheme profits.

#### Registration of Transfers.

33. The Council shall cause to be prepared and sent by either registered or certified mail to those owners entitled transfers in respect of each lot offered and which has been accepted by the owner in accordance with the Scheme. If an owner shall fail to complete the transfer in accordance with the Transfer of Land Act, 1893 (as amended), and return it to the Council for registration or if the owner shall fail to make payment of any money which may be due by him to the Council within twenty-eight days after having been called upon to do so by notice served by registered post on the owner at his address last known to the Council (which notice may be served with the Transfer) the Council may rescind any agreement whereby such owner is entitled to have the land the subject of the transfer transferred to him and thereupon such owner shall have a claim against the Council only for a cash payment equal to his interest in the Scheme and the land the subject of the transfer shall be treated as a rejected lot.

#### Saleable Lots and Rejected Lots.

34. Any lot offered to but not accepted by an owner in accordance with the Scheme or the subject of a transfer not completed as aforesaid may be dealt with by the Council as hereinafter appears.

35. The Council may sell the saleable lots and the rejected lots either by public auction, tender or private contract as a whole or in separate lots upon such terms and conditions as the Council may think fit. In the event of any such sale the price shall not be less than the price recommended by the Chief Valuer of the State Taxation Department or such other valuer as shall be appointed by the Council unless after submitting the land for sale by public auction or tender that price has not been obtained.

36. If in the opinion of the Council it shall not prove necessary to sell all the saleable lots in order to pay the costs of the Scheme the Council may subject to the provision of Clause 37,—

- (a) re-allocate some or all of the lots unsold to owners where it considers it just and equitable so to do in which case the cash payment to be made or received under Clause 22 shall be adjusted accordingly;

- (b) set aside lots for public open space;
- (c) otherwise deal with the lots in such manner as it considers to be in the best interest of the Scheme Area.

37. The Council may instead of selling all or any of the saleable lots or rejected lots ascertain the value of them or those unsold as at the date or respective dates of final approval by the Town Planning Board of the plan or plans of survey of the said lots, and credit the Scheme with the value so ascertained and in that event the lots shall be the property of the Council and may be retained sold or otherwise dealt with in such manner as the Council thinks fit.

#### Zoning.

38. It is intended that the Scheme Area be classified into the zones shown on the Scheme Map. The Council will do all things reasonably within its power so that the necessary amendments may be made to its Zoning Scheme (Town Planning Scheme No. 16 published in the *Government Gazette* of 16th October, 1973) to permit the lands to be used in accordance with the provisions of this Scheme.

#### Group Housing.

39. (1) The lands shown as "Possible Group Housing" on the Scheme Map may be—

- (a) offered to owners under Clause 21(c), or
- (b) sold by the Council for group housing development, or
- (c) subdivided and sold as residential lots, or
- (d) treated as saleable lots and dealt with pursuant to Clauses 34 to 37 (inclusive) hereof, or
- (e) dealt with partly by one method and partly by another or others as the Council shall from time to time determine.

(2) Any lands dealt with under paragraph (a) of subclause (1) hereof shall be valued as group housing sites in accordance with Clause 18.

#### Places of Public Worship.

40. Those lands shown as "Place of Public Worship" on the Scheme Map which are vacant shall be retained by the Council and the Council shall credit the Scheme with the valuations thereof. The said lands shall be valued as lands used for the purpose shown on the Scheme Map as at the date or respective dates of final approval by the Town Planning Board of the plan or plans of survey of the lot or lots. The Council shall submit the said lands for sale at such times and in such manner as it thinks fit to a purchaser or purchasers who will agree to erect a place of worship of a design and within a time agreed by the Council. If after two years from the date on which the Scheme is published in the *Government Gazette* or if after an alternative date which the Council may from time to time nominate any of the said lands remain vested in or have been re-vested in the Council such lands may be used for residential purposes and may be sold by the Council accordingly. Any profit arising from the sale of the said lands shall be expended by the Council on community facilities within the Scheme Area.

#### Homestores.

41. The lands shown as "Homestores" on the Scheme Map shall be retained by the Council and the Council shall credit the Scheme with the valuations thereof. The said lands shall be valued as lands used for the purpose shown on the Scheme Map as at the date or respective dates of final approval by the Town Planning Board of the plan or plans of survey of the lot or lots. The Council shall submit the said lands for sale at such times and in such manner as it thinks fit to a purchaser or purchasers who will agree to erect a building capable of being used for a Homestore of a design and within a time agreed by the Council. If after two years from the date on which the Scheme is

published in the *Government Gazette* or if after an alternative date which the Council may from time to time nominate any of the said lands remain vested in or have been re-vested in the Council such lands may be used for residential or group housing purposes and may be sold by the Council accordingly. Any profits arising from the sale of the said lands shall be expended by the Council on community facilities within the Scheme Area.

#### Special Business Area.

42. (1) The land within the Special Business Area shall not be resumed or otherwise acquired by the Council for the purposes of the Scheme.

(2) The costs or estimated costs of the items mentioned in Clause 14(1)(a) and (j) and (2) shall for the purpose of this clause be added to an amount calculated under Clause 14(3)(b) as though the Special Business Area was included in the Private Development Area. The total amount so ascertained shall be divided by the number of new lots zoned or intended to be zoned for Single Residential Class 3, group housing, place of public worship and for homestores in the Council Development Area but excluding the nominated lots under Clause 16. The amount as ascertained shall for the purpose of this clause be referred to as the "cost per lot".

(3) The Council shall determine the maximum number of Single Residential Class 3 lots into which the Special Business Area is capable of being subdivided. The number so determined shall be multiplied by the cost per lot. The amount so calculated shall for the purpose of this clause be referred to as the "special business area contribution".

(4) At such time as land abutting the Special Business Area is subdivided under this Scheme the owner of the Special Business Area shall pay to the Council the special business area contribution.

#### Lot 1122 Owned by Council.

43. The Council is the owner of Lot 1122 situated at the corner of High Road and Herald Avenue. The Council shall in respect of Lot 1122 have the same rights as other owners of land in the Council Development Area. The Council shall sell the replacement lots offered to it in respect of that portion of Lot 1122 situated south of a line being the eastward extension of the south boundary of Lot 14 on Diagram 42447 and apply the proceeds of sale and any moneys paid to it as owner in the purchase of that portion of Lot 1121 situated north of the further extension of the aforementioned line.

#### Lot 1230 on Plan 4391.

44. Lot 1230 on Plan 4391 has been acquired by the Metropolitan Region Planning Authority for the purpose of an Important Regional Road (Vahland Avenue) as shown on the Metropolitan Region Scheme. The Council has agreed with that Authority that arrangements shall be made whereby that portion of Lot 1230 required for Vahland Avenue road reserve shall be dedicated as such and that the Council shall become the proprietors of the remaining portions.

#### Drive-in Cinema.

45. (1) The owner of the land shown on the Scheme Map as "Drive-in Cinema" shall vest free of cost in the Crown as road widening an area of land 10 metres in depth along the entire frontage of the said land. Such vesting shall be made upon the final approval of the Scheme.

(2) The owner of the land shown as "Drive-in Cinema" shall grant free of cost to the Council right of access over and entry upon the said land for the purposes of carrying out Scheme works.

(3) At such time as the land shown as "Drive-in Cinema" is rezoned or redeveloped for a purpose which in the opinion of the Council would impose a greater demand upon the sewer system in the

area than that which is imposed by the existing drive-in cinema the owner shall pay to the Council an amount of money to be determined as follows:—

(a) the Council shall obtain an estimate of the cost of that proportion of the sewerage headworks which would be contributed under Clause 14 (3) as though the Scheme and the said headworks were being developed at the time of the said rezoning or redevelopment.

(b) the proportion which the area of the drive-in cinema bears to the contributing area shall be multiplied by the amount determined in the immediately preceding sub-clause. The amount so calculated shall be the contribution required to be paid to the Council by the owner of the drive-in cinema.

(4) Any amount so paid to the Council shall be utilised in the purchase of or in the improvement to land within the Scheme Area for public recreation or for other community facilities as determined by the Council.

#### Surplus Income.

46. If on the completion of the Scheme there shall be a surplus such surplus shall be dealt with as follows:—

The surplus shall be distributed among each of those owners of land within the Council Development Area who have accepted wholly, or in part, if such is permitted the offers mentioned in Clauses 21 to 24 in the proportion which the value of the owner's old lot or portion thereof within the Council Development Area bears to the total value of the old lots within the Council Development Area whose owners have accepted wholly or in part the offers made to them pursuant to Clauses 21 to 24. For the purpose of this Clause the values shall be those finally made pursuant to Clauses 17 and 51. The right to participate in the surplus of the Scheme shall not in the absence of agreement devolve to any person not the owner of the land who accepted the offer made by the Council pursuant to the Scheme. The surplus distributable to owners under this Clause may be made in land or cash or partly in one mode and partly in the other.

47. If an owner or other person entitled to portion of the surplus of the Scheme cannot be found the Council may after the expiration of six years from the date on which the owner's share in the surplus was ascertained expend the amount of this portion of the surplus in the development of public open space and the provision of amenities in the Council Development Area and thereafter such person shall have no claim in respect of such money.

#### Encumbrances on Title.

48. In the event of any land in the Scheme Area being subject to a registered mortgage charge or lease or to a caveat to protect the interest of the purchaser mortgagee chargee or lessee the Council shall not make any payments to nor transfer a new lot to the owner without the consent of all persons entitled to the benefit of the encumbrance or unless subject to similar encumbrances.

#### Moneys Owning to Council and for Rates and Taxes.

49. The Council shall deduct from any moneys payable to an owner the amount of any unpaid rates or taxes and any other moneys owing by the owner to the Council. Except in the case of pensioners who wish to postpone the payment of rates and taxes no new lot shall be transferred to an owner until all moneys owing by him for rates and taxes have been paid.

## Powers of Council.

50. The Council in the conduct and management of this Scheme shall in addition to the powers and authorities hereinbefore mentioned have the following powers:

- (a) To enter and inspect the land within the Scheme Area.
- (b) To enter into agreements or arrangements with the owners or occupiers of any land within the Scheme Area.
- (c) To extend the time within which any offer of replacement lots may be accepted.
- (d) To acquire by purchase or otherwise any land or buildings within the Scheme Area.
- (e) To dispose of any lots to which it becomes entitled either as the owner of land within the Scheme Area at the date of the coming into operation of this Scheme or to which it becomes entitled pursuant to the Scheme upon such terms and conditions as it may think fit. Without limiting the generality of the foregoing the Council may sell the lots singly or in groups and on the condition that buildings of a specified character with specific parking or other facilities shall within a limited period be constructed thereon or that the land and buildings be used for a specified purpose.
- (f) To transfer any land acquired by it in pursuance of the Scheme as compensation or part compensation and to enter into agreements relative to the determination and settling of compensation.
- (g) To enter into such agreements and arrangements with the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Board as seems proper to the Council for the purpose of draining the Scheme Area and providing reticulated water and sewage disposal services within the Scheme Area.
- (h) To remove, alter or demolish any building which obstructs the observance or carrying out of this Scheme and if it thinks fit to recover the cost of the removal, alteration or demolition of any such building from the owner of the original lot upon which the building is situated.
- (i) With the consent of the Town Planning Board to make variations to the survey design where necessary or desirable.
- (j) To let or lease on such terms and conditions as it thinks fit any land or buildings acquired by it pursuant to this Scheme.
- (k) With the consent of all owners affected thereby to alter the allocation of any replacement lots.
- (l) If an owner does not accept an offer the Council may, but is not obliged to do so, pay by way of compensation the interest in the Scheme to which the owner would have been entitled if he had accepted the offer or a part thereof.
- (m) As an owner to comply with the provisions of Scheme 23 or Scheme 24 as the case may be in respect of land resumed by it.
- (n) To postpone the implementation of the Scheme for such period as it thinks fit or to implement the Scheme in stages dealing with portions of the Scheme Area from time to time as the Council considers proper in the circumstances. If

the Council shall implement the Scheme in stages the Scheme Costs shall be apportioned to each portion of the Scheme Area in respect of which the Scheme is implemented and Clauses 17 to 21 shall be read as referring to that area and not to the whole of the Council Development Area.

## Valuations.

51. Where it is necessary to ascertain the value of any land for the purpose of the Scheme the value shall be determined on the assumption that there are no buildings structures or fences thereon and shall be made by the Chief Valuer of the State Taxation Department or by such other valuer being a member of the Australian Institute of Valuers as shall be approved by the Council.

52. If an owner shall object to the value placed on his land he may give notice of such objection to the Council within twenty-eight days after having been notified of the said value or revised value. If the valuer does not agree to change the value to a figure acceptable to the owner and if the objection shall not have been withdrawn the value shall be determined by the arbitration of a single arbitrator in manner hereinafter provided.

53. If a value placed on a lot shall be changed as the result of an objection the valuer may reconsider the value placed on the other lots and make such revaluations as he considers just and equitable. The owners affected shall forthwith be notified of any change in value so made.

## Arbitration.

54. Any dispute or difference between the owners as to the valuation of land made for the purpose of this Scheme and all disputes which may be referred to arbitration shall be referred to the arbitration of a single arbitrator in manner provided by the Arbitration Act, 1895, or any statutory modification thereof for the time being in force. If the parties fail to agree upon any one arbitrator he shall in the case of a dispute or difference as to the valuation of land be nominated by the Chief Valuer of the State Taxation Department and shall be a member of the Australian Institute of Valuers. Prior to such nomination the Chief Valuer shall discuss with both the Council and the President of the West Australian Branch of the Australian Institute of Valuers and have regard to but not be bound by their views as to the person to be appointed as arbitrator. In the case of any other dispute the arbitrator shall if the parties fail to agree be nominated by the President for the time being of the Law Society of Western Australia.

## Time Limit for Claims for Compensation.

55. The time limit for the making of claims for compensation pursuant to Section 11 of the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended) is six months after the date when notice of the approval of the Scheme is published in manner prescribed by the regulations made under the Act.







2. No person shall alter, repair or add to any existing major building as defined in classes I to IX of the Uniform Building By-laws, 1974, in that portion of the district of the Shire of Katanning, which is specified in the Schedule hereto unless such alteration, repair or addition is of brick or brick veneer or other material as approved by the Council.

The Municipality of the Shire of Northampton.  
By-laws Relating to Aerodromes.

LG. NR-7-29.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the above mentioned Act and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on the 17th day of December, 1976, to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following by-laws:—

Application.

1. These By-laws shall apply to and be in force within the whole of the area of the district of the Shire of Northampton.

Interpretation.

2. In these By-laws, unless the context otherwise indicates or requires, the following terms shall have the meanings respectively assigned to them, that is to say: "Act"—The Air Navigation Acts, 1920-1973, of the Commonwealth of Australia or other Act or Acts of the Commonwealth relating to air navigation for the time being in force:—

"Aerodrome"—Any area of land under the control of the Council as an aerodrome whilst and so long as licensed for the purpose of an aerodrome under the Regulation.

"Aerodrome Manager"—The officer appointed by or under the authority of the Council for the time being directing and controlling the traffic or aircraft on any aerodrome or of persons having business with aircraft on any aerodrome.

"Council"—The Council of the Shire of Northampton.

"Groundsman"—Any person appointed by or under the authority of the Council to control and supervise the use generally of any Aerodrome, or for the time being acting in the discharge of such duties.

"Local Government Act"—The Local Government Act, 1960-1977 or any Act for the time being in force amending or in substitution therefore.

"Owner"—Includes lessee, charterer, and person for the time being in control of the aircraft.

"Pilot"—The person actually controlling an aircraft at the relevant time. If there is no such persons, then the person entitled to such control.

"Regulation"—The Air Navigation Regulations made under the Act and for the time being in force by virtue of the Act.

Any term defined in the Act or Regulations shall have the same meanings in these by-laws.

Use of Aircraft.

3. (1) The owner of every aircraft shall be entitled, upon and subject to compliance with these by-laws, to use any aerodrome for the landing, servicing and departure of his aircraft and the embarkment and disembarkment of aerial passengers and freights.

(2) Unless and until so determined by the aerodrome manager, any aerodrome shall not be open to use for flying where the surface of the aerodrome may be or may reasonably be expected to be unsafe for landing or departure of aircraft. Providing that, in the case of emergency, landings may be made, entirely at the owner's risk, upon such aerodrome.

Buildings, Notices, etc.

4. Subject to the Act and Regulations, the Council may:—

(1) Erect, make, or place upon any aerodrome in such positions as it may see fit such buildings, structures, barriers, conveniences, amenities, signposts, notices, markings and other things as it may see fit for the more complete, effective, convenient, and safe use and enjoyment of any aerodrome as a public landing ground for aircraft.

(2) Grant to any person, upon application, permission to erect buildings, refuelling sites, or any other structure or thing consistent with the use of the land as an aerodrome, subject, if the Council considers fit, to the payment of a rental for the use of the land upon which such buildings, refuelling sites, or other structure or thing are or is erected. Such permission may be granted by the Council subject to such terms and conditions as it may deem fit.

(3) The Council may from time to time set apart any building or any part of a building for the use upon such terms and conditions as the Council may stipulate by any person for the conduct of any business considered by the Council to be an amenity or operation of benefit to any aerodrome and may similarly set apart any portion of any aerodrome for the conduct of any such business and permit the erection thereon of any building or structure.

(4) Except in accordance with an authority granted under By-law 4(iii) and the terms and conditions of that authority, a person shall not, within an airport either personally or by his servant or agent, or as the servant or agent of another person—

- (a) sell, for delivery within the airport, or supply, any goods or services;
- (b) carry on, or solicit for any business; or
- (c) erect, display or distribute, or communicate by sound, any advertisement or public notice.

## Right of Entry to Aerodrome.

5. (i) Save as herein provided, a person other than—
- (a) Persons lawfully employed upon duties in or about the supervision and control of any aerodrome or in about the arrival, departure, or servicing of, or other attention upon aircraft lawfully using any aerodrome; or
  - (b) Passengers or intending passengers by aircraft lawfully using any aerodrome; shall not enter or be upon any aerodrome or any part thereof.
- (ii) The Council may from time to time set apart any specified part or parts of any aerodrome—
- (a) To which persons other than those mentioned in subclause (a) of clause (i) of this by-law shall not be admitted;
  - (b) To which the general public, or any limited classes of the general public, may be admitted, either at all times or at specified times, or for limited periods and generally upon such terms and conditions as the Council may determine.
  - (c) To which no vehicle may be admitted, or to which vehicles may be admitted only on such terms and conditions as the Council may determine.
- (iii) Suitable notices shall be placed by the Council indicating the limits of any part of any aerodrome set apart for any special or limited use under this By-law.
- (iv) Notwithstanding the provisions of this By-law and By-law 11 the Council may on special occasions, such for instance, as an aerial pageant or other event of public interest, make such arrangements for the control of any aerodrome and charge such fees for participation and for admission as per attached schedule of charges.
- (v) No person shall bring, or permit to stray, on to any aerodrome any horse, cattle, sheep or goats without authority from the Council. Any such animal so found trespassing without authority may be removed from the aerodrome by any officer or employee of the Council, or by any person authorised so to do. Any person bringing, or permitting any such animal to stray, on to any aerodrome without authority shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding two hundred dollars (\$200).
6. It shall be an offence, punishable by a penalty not exceeding two hundred dollars (\$200) for any person, without permission of the Council, to enter or be upon any part of any aerodrome to which he is not entitled under the provisions of By-law 5 to admission.

## Conduct of Persons on Aerodrome.

7. Every person admitted to or being upon any aerodrome shall whilst thereon behave himself in a proper and becoming manner and so as not to cause any annoyance or inconvenience to any other person lawfully thereon; and shall obey any directions reasonably given to him by the groundsman or any person acting under him, for the purpose of preserving order or promoting or facilitating, the lawful use and enjoyment of any aerodrome. Any person offending against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding two hundred dollars (\$200).
8. All passengers and intending passengers by any aircraft shall, whilst upon any aerodrome, obey the directions of the groundsman or aerodrome manager as to their conduct and movements.
9. Any person whether or not a passenger or intending passenger by an aircraft, who the groundsman or aerodrome manager may consider to be intoxicated or so under the influence of liquor as to make his presence on any aerodrome dangerous to himself or others, or offensive to others, or otherwise undesirable, may be refused admission to any aerodrome, or if upon any aerodrome may be removed by the groundsman or aerodrome manager or any person acting under the direction of the groundsman or aerodrome manager.
10. A person shall not use any building, structure, convenience, or amenity provided upon any aerodrome for any purpose other than that for which it is provided or intended, or destroy, remove, obliterate, deface alter or otherwise interfere with any barrier, notice, sign or marking designed or intended for the direction, guidance, warning or information of persons using any aerodrome.

## Landing Fees, Charges Etc.

11. (i) The Council may require the owner of every private or commercial aircraft using any aerodrome to pay fees as per the attached schedule of charges and approved by the Department of Transport. Provided that, if at any time the scale of fees permitted by the Act and Regulations to be charged for the use of an aerodrome as a landing ground for aircraft be less in any particular than the scale set out by Council, then the fee in any such particular shall be that which is so permitted to be charged.
- (ii) In the case of a regular air service, the Council may allow the payment of an annual charge in respect of such service, of such amount as it may see fit, such charges not to exceed the total fees that would be payable in respect of the service for the year at daily rates.
- (iii) If any aircraft remains on any aerodrome more than twenty-four (24) hours, a fee shall be payable as for one landing for each day after the first day during which it so remains. Provided that this provision shall not apply to aircraft parked within leased hangers or on leased sites.

(iv) The owner of any aircraft not running to a regular schedule, which it is intended shall land upon or depart from any aerodrome, shall give the Council groundsman notice of sufficient length of time (where practicable, at least an hour) before the time of anticipated arrival or departure, to enable the necessary arrangements to be made. Where extra expense is incurred by the Council through failure to give adequate notice, the owner of the aircraft shall on demand pay the Council the extra expense so incurred.

12. (i) The fees payable under clause (i) of By-law II shall be payable at or before the time of landing of the aircraft or at such time as may be specially fixed by the Council; other charges and expenses under that By-law shall be payable upon demand, for the purpose of which demand that pilot may be treated as the agent of the owner.

(ii) Any fee, charge, or expense payable in accordance with these By-laws constitute a debt due by the owner of the aircraft concerned, and may be recovered by the Council from him in any court of competent jurisdiction.

General.

13. A person who in any respect contravenes or fails to comply with any of these by-laws shall be guilty of an offence, and where no other penalty is provided, liable to a penalty not exceeding two hundred dollars (\$200) and in addition such person may, if upon any aerodrome, be summarily removed therefrom by any police officer, groundsman, or aerodrome manager, or any person acting under the direction of the groundsman or aerodrome manager.

14. Provided further that the Council, in its absolute discretion, may, either generally or for specific use, waive all or any of the requirements of these by-laws.

The Municipality of the Shire of Northampton.

By-laws Relating to the Control and Usage of Kalbarri Jetty.

LG. NR-7-30.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on the Sixth day of July, 1977, to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following by-laws:—

1. Interpretation:

In these by-laws subject to the context "Council" means the Council for the Shire of Northampton.

"Motor Boat" means a vessel propelled by any means other than oars or sail and includes a speed boat and a sailing vessel which is equipped with propelling machinery and propelled by mechanical power.

"Officer of the Council" means an officer of the Council for the Shire of Northampton or other person acting for or on behalf of or with the authority of the Council.

- "Owner" in relation to a vessel includes the master or person in charge of the vessel.
- "Jetty" means a public jetty as defined in the Jetties Act, 1926 Section 3.
2. Use of Jetty:
    - (a) No person shall land at, use or enter the jetty except in accordance with these by-laws.
    - (b) No person shall land at, use or enter the jetty when it is under construction or under repair or is closed by order of the Council.
  3. Moored Vessels to Jetty:
    - (a) No vessels shall be moored or made fast to the jetty or any part thereof except to such mooring piles, ring bolts or other fastenings as are provided and no vessel shall remain alongside the jetty unless so moored or fastened.
    - (b) No person shall cause any obstruction on or to any public steps or landing place for passengers on or at the jetty or impede the free passage of other persons on or along such steps or places.
  4. Vessels Not to Remain at Jetty:
    - (a) Any vessel fastened to or alongside the jetty shall be removed forthwith on order for removal being given by an officer of the Council.
    - (b) Subject to by-law (a) of this by-law, vessels fastened to or alongside the jetty remain so fastened or alongside only while embarking or disembarking passengers or cargo.
    - (c) No vessel loading or discharging cargo shall come alongside or be fastened to the jetty until the cargo is ready to be loaded or discharged as the case may be.
    - (d) Except with the written permission of the Council no vessel shall remain alongside the jetty for the purpose of loading or discharging cargo between sunset and the next following sunrise.
  5. Cargo Property on the Jetty:
    - (a) No property intended for shipment onto a vessel shall be placed on the jetty unless and until the vessel is alongside the jetty and such property shall be removed from the jetty as soon as practicable after being placed thereon.
    - (b) Property off loaded from a vessel onto the Jetty shall be removed from the jetty as soon as practicable.
    - (c) Property on the jetty shall be forthwith removed therefrom on demand by an officer of the Council.
    - (d) Property on the jetty left, shall be removed before the next sunrise.
    - (e) A person who leaves property or is in charge of property left on the jetty contrary to this regulation commits an offence.
    - (f) Property which remains on the jetty contrary to this regulation may be removed by an officer of the Council and the cost of removal and of any subsequent storage of the property shall be deemed to be a debt to the Council payable jointly and severally by the owner, consignor and consignee of the property and may be recovered by action in a court of competent jurisdiction.
  6. Explosives on Jetties: Without the permission of the Council no person shall land, place or handle on the jetty any explosives as defined in section 4 of the Explosives and Dangerous Goods Act, 1961.
  7. Vehicles on Jetties:
    - (a) No vehicle shall be driven onto or be or remain on the jetty without permission of an officer of the Council.
    - (b) No person shall ride or have a bicycle on the jetty.
  8. Bulk Cargoes on Jetty:
    - (a) No bulk cargo shall be tipped from a vehicle or deposited from a vessel onto the jetty; provided that this by-law shall not apply to the tipping or depositing of sand, stone, gravel, soil which is tipped or deposited by permission in writing of an officer of the Council.
    - (b) All property tipped or deposited onto the jetty shall be so tipped or deposited gently and carefully.
  9. Damage to Jetty:
    - (a) Without prejudice to the liability of other persons, if any, the owner of a vessel is personally responsible for all damage to the jetty caused by a person employed by him.
    - (b) Where damage to the jetty is caused by an owner or by a person employed by him the Council may repair the damage and the cost of such repair shall be a debt due to the Council and payable by the owner and may be recovered in a court of competent jurisdiction.
  10. Fishing from Jetty:
    - (a) No person fishing from the jetty shall obstruct, delay or interfere with the free movement of vessels approaching or leaving the jetty.
    - (b) No person fishing from or using the jetty shall cause a nuisance on the jetty.
    - (c) No person shall cause a nuisance to persons on or using the jetty or to vessels using the jetty.
  11. Fishing Nets on Jetties: No fishing nets shall be hung on or spread about any part of the jetty.

## 12. Gangways to be Provided:

- (a) Any licensed passenger motor boat using the jetty for the purpose of embarking or disembarking passengers shall provide between the vessel and the jetty at least one safe gangway not less than .75 of a metre in width having a hand rail on both sides.
- (b) Where passengers are embarking or disembarking between sunset and the next following sunrise the gangway referred to in the last preceding sub-by-law shall be sufficiently lighted.

13. Material Not to be Removed: No persons shall remove or cause to be removed from the jetty or from the approaches any gravel, stone, timber, grasses or other material without the written permission of the Council or an officer of the Council.

## 14. Obstruction of Jetty or Officer:

- (a) No person shall place or cause to be placed on the jetty any obstruction without permission in writing of the Council.
- (b) No person shall obstruct, any representative, officer or workman of the Council in constructing, repairing, adding to or working on the jetty.

15. Livestock on Jetty: No person shall drive or allow any cattle, horse, sheep or other animal to stray upon the jetty.

## 16. Departing Vehicles, etc., on the Jetty:

- (a) No person shall ride or drive any horse or bicycle, motor car or any other vehicle upon or along the jetty or premises of any path or other way used in connection with the jetty or premises without the permission of an officer in charge of the jetty or an officer of the Council.
- (b) No person shall drive, park, stand or leave unattended a vehicle on the jetty or the approaches to the jetty unless he is expressly authorised to do so by the officer in charge of the jetty and then only if that person drives, parks, stands or leaves unattended the vehicle for the purpose of loading or unloading stores or cargo on or from the vehicle.
- (c) Where permission has been granted under these by-laws to a person to drive a vehicle onto the jetty the Council will not be responsible to any person for damage caused to the vehicle or to any person by that vehicle while on the jetty or the approaches to the jetty.
- (d) Every driver of a car, cart, dray or other vehicle shall, while in or upon any jetty or upon the jetty follow the reasonable instructions and directions of any authorised employee of the Council.

17. Miscellaneous: No person unless authorised in writing by the Council shall—

- (a) Post, stick, paint or write or cause to be posted, stuck, painted or written any placard, bill advertisement, sign or any other matter within or on any jetty, post, fence, gate, platform, wall or building or other property or premises of the Council.
- (b) Deface any writing or printing on or attached to any board or any notice authorised to be maintained on any jetty or any fence or building upon the jetty, or premises of the Council.
- (c) Write any indecent words, draw any indecent or obscene pictures or representation on any part of the jetty or on any face or building upon the jetty or premises of the Council.

## 18. Disorderly Person:

- (a) No drunk, idle or disorderly person shall enter or remain in or upon the jetty or premises of the Council.
- (b) No person shall behave in a violent or offensive manner to the annoyance of others or write or use any insulting, indecent, blasphemous, obscene or abusive words or wilfully interfere with the comfort of any person in or upon the jetty, shed, vehicle or premises of the Council.
- (c) No person shall commit any nuisance or gamble in or upon the jetty, shed, vehicle or premises of the Council.

19. Fires: No person shall under any pretext whatever, light, place or keep a fire upon or so near to endanger the jetty, shed, car, carriage or other work of a like nature whatsoever of the Council.

20. Interference with Lights: No person shall interfere with, damage or remove any portion of any electric or any other type of light or lamp or the mains or fittings thereof on the jetty or any vehicle or premises of the Council.

21. Lost Property: Any person who finds any lost property upon the jetty or premises or in any vehicle shall immediately hand same over to the officer in charge either of the jetty or the premises or an officer of the Council as the case may be.

22. Obstruction of Officer or Acts of: No person shall do, attempt to do, assist or aid in doing, cause or procure to do any of the following things:—

- (a) Obstruct any officer or servant employed on the jetty or premises of the Council in the due performance of this duty.
- (b) Do any act which obstructs or may obstruct the working of any person or persons travelling thereon.

23. Rubbish, etc: No person shall throw or cause to be thrown at or from any car or other vehicle of the Council or onto the jetty or premises vested in, used by or under the control of the Council, any glass, stone or any other missile or any filth, dirt rubbish or other matter of a similar nature.

24. Berthage Dues: Berthage dues for small vessels shall be:—
- (a) Fishing vessels not exceeding 50 gross tonnes \$3.00 per week.
  - (b) Fishing vessels not exceeding 100 gross tonnes when taking stores only \$2.00 per day of 24 hours or part thereof.
  - (c) Launches for public hire \$25.00 per annum payable half yearly in advance.
  - (d) Tugs and dredges \$40.00 per annum payable half yearly in advance.
  - (e) Barges \$40.00 per annum payable half yearly in advance.
25. Wharfage Dues: Wharfage rates as follows shall be paid in respect of all cargo landed on or shipped from the jetty:—
- (a) General cargo \$1.00 per tonne.
  - (b) Fishing vessels discharging fish or other sea products \$1.00 per tonne.
26. Payment Dues: The Dues payable under by-laws 24 and 25 shall be based at the option of the officer of the Council on the measurement or weight of the goods as declared by the vessel's Master
27. Penalties: A person who by act or admission contravenes the provision of any of these by-laws commits an offence and is liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding \$100.

## UNIFORM GENERAL BY-LAWS.

- Principal by-laws. 1. In these by-laws the Uniform Building By-laws, 1974, as reprinted pursuant to the Reprinting of Regulations Act, 1954, in the *Government Gazette* on the 25th August, 1977, and amended by notices published in the *Government Gazette* on the 24th December, 1976, and the 1st August, 1977, are referred to as the principal by-laws.
- By-law 12.6 added. 2. The principal by-laws are amended by adding after by-law 12.5 a by-law and headings as follows—
- Provision of Fire Services.**
- Fire Mains to be Progressively Installed in Certain Buildings.*
- 12.6 (1) Where a building that will, when constructed, exceed two stories or 9 m in height is required under by-law 27.2 to be provided with a fire main, the fire main shall, so far as is practicable, be installed progressively during the construction of the building so as to be available and ready for use not more than two stories or 9 m below the highest formed floor of the building.
- Provisions Applying to Fire Mains Referred to in Sub-by-law (1).*
- (2) The following provisions apply to a fire main that is required by sub-by-law (1) to be installed progressively during the construction of a building, that is to say—

## EDUCATION DEPARTMENT.

## SALARIES OF TEACHING STAFF.

THE Hon. Minister for Education has determined that the salaries in the schedule below shall be paid to teachers in the Education Department. The new schedule of salaries shall replace that published in the *Government Gazette* of 13th June, 1975.

## PART I.—GENERAL.

1. This determination will operate as from the beginning of the pay period which commences on or after 11th October, 1977.

2. The salary rates prescribed in this schedule shall be varied to the extent necessary to give effect to any decision of the Australian Conciliation and Arbitration Commission in a National Wage Case, made during the currency of this schedule and expressed to be on general economic grounds and which has general application.

## PART II.—DEFINITIONS.

For the purpose of this schedule—

“two-year trained teacher” means a teacher who has successfully completed a minimum of two years’ full-time tertiary education and has gained an approved two-year trained teaching qualification.

“three-year trained teacher” means a teacher who has successfully completed a minimum of three years’ full-time tertiary education and has gained an approved three-year trained teaching qualification or such other qualifications as the Director-General may from time to time deem to be acceptable in lieu thereof.

“four-year trained teacher” means a teacher who has a minimum of four years full-time tertiary education in which the teacher either

(a) has first obtained an approved teaching qualification and, in addition, has obtained an approved degree which is not of itself an initial teaching qualification for which the minimum requirements are three years full-time study or obtained other qualifications approved as of equivalent standard; or

(b) has first obtained an approved degree, which is not of itself an initial teaching qualification, and for which the minimum requirements are three years full-time study or obtained other qualifications approved as of equivalent standard, and in addition has obtained a teaching qualification requiring at least one year of further full-time study; or

(c) has obtained an approved education degree for which the minimum requirements are four years full-time study.

“tertiary education” means undertaking a course at an approved education institution for which the pre-requisite is a successful Year 12 of schooling or its approved equivalent.

“graduate” means a person who has obtained an approved degree of a recognised university, or possesses qualifications deemed by the Director-General to be equivalent to such a degree.

“unqualified teacher” means a teacher who does not hold an approved teacher’s qualification.

For the purposes of these definitions only, a two-year trained teacher has the qualifications to become a three-year

trained teacher when he obtains, subsequent to his initial training period, additional approved qualifications, equivalent to a full year’s tertiary study, as from time to time prescribed.

Also, for the purpose of these definitions, a two-year trained teacher who has completed ten years’ service as a teacher with the Teachers’ Certificate shall be deemed to be a three-year trained teacher, provided that two-year trained teachers appointed to grades higher than Grade 4 shall be required to serve one year less than ten for each grade on which they were appointed above Grade 4, except that lecturers (trade) will be required to serve one year less than ten for each recognised year of post apprentice experience, regardless of their grade of appointment.

For the purpose of this schedule the Teachers’ Higher Certificate gives four-year trained status to a teacher.

“approved” means approved by the Director-General of Education.

## PART III.—SALARY SCALES.

1. The following salary scales shall be paid to teachers according to their qualifications, experience and position.

2. Masters, mistresses, lecturers, counselling assistants or other teachers who do not occupy positions for which additional remuneration is provided in this schedule shall receive a salary according to Column AA (4 year trained teacher) or Column AR (other) of the Salary Scales.

4. The salaries in Table I of the Salary Scales shall apply to all four year trained teachers. The salaries in Table II shall apply to all two and three year trained teachers.

5. Except as provided for specifically in this schedule, progression along the Salary Scales shall be by annual increments and shall be dependent upon satisfactory service.

6. (a) Teachers who obtain an approved qualification at the completion of training at a teacher training institution shall be placed on the Salary Scales as follows:—

Four year trained teacher—Table I, Column AA, Grade 4;

Three year trained teacher—Table II, Column AR, Grade 5;

except that graduate teachers whose approved course exceeded four years and non-graduate teachers whose approved course exceeded three years may be placed on grades higher than those specified above at the discretion of the Director-General.

(b) Teachers who do not obtain their full qualification at the completion of the training at a teacher training institution shall be placed on grades lower than those specified above at the discretion of the Director-General.

7. (a) On first appointment to the Department other than directly from an approved teacher training institution, teachers will be placed on the salary scales as determined by the Director-General, taking into consideration their qualifications and experience.

(b) (i) Lecturers (trades) with five years' post-apprenticeship experience will be placed on Table II, Column AR, Grade 7.

(ii) Lecturers (trades) with special additional experience or with higher technical qualifications may be placed on grades higher than Grade 7 at the discretion of the Director-General.

(iii) Lecturers (trades) with less than five years' post-apprenticeship experience will be placed on grades lower than Grade 7. Such placement will be determined by the number of years by which the experience is less than five years.

8. (a) An unqualified teacher, other than a lecturer (trades), shall not proceed beyond Grade 5 of Table I or Grade 7 of Table II except that an unqualified person appointed to the Technical Education Division in accordance with paragraph 7 of this Part may advance two increments from his grade of appointment to the Department.

(b) A two year trained teacher may not proceed beyond Grade 11 on Table II.

(c) A three year trained teacher may proceed to Grade 12 on Table II.

(d) Notwithstanding subparagraphs (a), (b) and (c) of this paragraph, a teacher holding the position of lecturer (trades) or senior lecturer (trades) on 31st December, 1972, and appointed as such prior to 31st December, 1967, may proceed beyond Grade 12, Table II, and transfer to Table I and proceed by annual progression as shown hereunder provided he has obtained the Teachers' Certificate (Technical) and has obtained a diploma of the Technical Education Division or other equivalent qualification:

Grade 12—Table II.

Grade 9—Table I.

Grade 10—Table I.

Grade 11—Table I.

9. A teacher who has not had a satisfactory report may not advance further than three annual increments from his grade of appointment.

10. (a) A teacher who obtains a promotion or appointment to a position carrying a salary entitling him to move from one column of the Salary Scales to another column shall transfer to the new column on the same grade as he would have occupied had he not received the promotion or appointment.

(b) A teacher who obtains promotion to a position carrying a higher salary range shall be placed on a salary that will give him an increase in salary as a result of his promotion.

11. Teachers who have added to their qualifications in their own time without Departmental concessions after leaving a teacher training institution or after appointment to the teaching service where the appointment is not from such an institution, may be given accelerated progression. Progression under this paragraph is governed by the restrictions imposed in paragraph 8 of this Part and can only be made once in respect of any particular qualification.

Special progression under this paragraph is made in addition to any annual increments to which a teacher is entitled.

The purpose of this special progression is to ensure that teachers who are contemporaries, that is, who have the same length of total service including the period spent in teacher training or the equivalent, shall be on the same grade of salary they have the same qualifications.

Progression through qualifications is awarded as follows:—

(a) A two year trained teacher who obtains the qualifications of a three year trained teacher or is deemed to be a three year trained teacher shall advance one increment, and may proceed to Grade 12, Table II.

(b) Notwithstanding subparagraph (a), a lecturer (trades) covered by paragraph 8 (d) shall advance one increment regardless of which table he is on, and he shall continue to progress to Grade 11, Table I.

(c) A three year trained teacher who obtains the qualifications of a four year trained teacher may transfer to Table I as follows:—

(i) Teachers appointed prior to 11th October, 1974:

(d) Unqualified teachers appointed to the Department from a teacher training institution who obtain approved teaching qualifications within a period of three years after leaving the teacher training institution shall be placed on the same salary grade as their contemporaries who were appointed with completed qualifications.

(e) Unqualified teachers other than those referred to in sub-paragraph (d) on gaining approved teaching qualifications—one increment.

(f) A four-year trained teacher, on obtaining a University Master's degree, Doctoral degree, a second Bachelor's degree, or its equivalent—one increment (except that only one increment can be obtained under this clause).

(g) Lecturers (trades) who have progressed to Table I under paragraph 8 (d) shall advance to Grade 11, Table I, on obtaining the Teachers' Higher Certificate.

11. (a) The fortnightly salary of all teachers, both permanent and temporary, shall be calculated as follows:—
