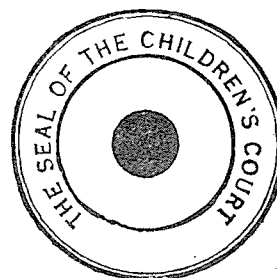

Vehicle Standards Regulations, 1977.

I, DONALD HECTOR AITKEN, Commissioner of Main Roads, acting pursuant to regulation 1107 of the Vehicle Standards Regulations 1977 do hereby rescind the direction issued under the Traffic Act 1974 and published in the *Government Gazette* of February 20, 1976, and give the following direction:—

1. In this Direction—

"Warning flag" means a red flag of not less than 450 millimetres square;

"warning sign" means a sign bearing the words "OVERWIDTH", "OVERLENGTH", "OVERHEIGHT" or any combination of those words, as the case may require, in black lettering, 200 millimetres in height, on a yellow background.

2. A limitation imposed by this direction does not affect the power of a Patrolman to impose additional limitations relating to time, place or circumstance.

3. A patrolman, or other officer of the Road Traffic Authority approved by me may, subject to the Vehicle Standards Regulations 1977, issue permits for the carrying of indivisible loads that will occasion any or all of the dimensions of a vehicle or combination of vehicles, to exceed those, or that project for a greater distance than that, prescribed by the Vehicle Standards Regulations, 1977 where—

- (a) the overall length of vehicle or combination of vehicles and load does not exceed 22 metres or the overall width does not exceed 3.1 metres, subject to the following conditions, namely—
 - (i) the transporting vehicle is to have a warning sign indicating that the vehicle is overwidth, overlength, overheight or any combination of those things, as the case may require, affixed to the front and rear;
 - (ii) warning flags are to be placed at the points of greatest extension of the load or of the vehicle and load;
 - (iii) the vehicle is not to travel during the hours of darkness;
 - (iv) the warning signs provided by this paragraph are to be removed or covered when the movement of the load has been completed;
 - (v) the permit is to be carried on the transporting vehicle; and
 - (vi) the permit is liable to immediate cancellation on the infringement of any condition to which its issue is subject;
- (b) the width exceeds 3.1 metres but not 4.3 metres, subject to the conditions set out in paragraph (a) of this clause and, further, subject to the following conditions, namely—
 - (i) the transporting vehicle is to be preceded by a pilot vehicle bearing a warning sign indicating that an overwidth vehicle follows it; and
 - (ii) the headlights of the transporting vehicle and pilot vehicle are to be kept burning in the dipped position, until the movement of the load is completed;
- (c) the height exceeds 4.3 metres but not 4.9 metres, subject to the conditions set out in paragraph (a) of this clause and, further, subject to the following conditions, namely—
 - (i) the movement is to be made in conformity with the requirements of the State Energy Commission;
 - (ii) approval for the movement of the load is to be obtained from the Australian Telecommunications Commission; and
 - (iii) when required by the State Energy Commission or the Australian Telecommunications Commission under conditions (i) and (ii) the transporting vehicle is to be escorted by a Patrolman.

4. Permits shall not be issued for the carrying of loads that exceed the maximum dimensions, or that project for a greater distance than that mentioned in clause 3 of this direction, without the specific approval of the Commissioner of Main Roads, in each case.

Where several adjoining lots are held or used by the owner and/or occupier the firebreaks may be provided inside and along the external boundaries of the group or lot.

3. Rural and Townsite Lands:

- (i) Firebreaks of not less than three (3) metres wide must be provided immediately surrounding all buildings, haystacks, fuel depots, drum ramps and drums both full and empty.

If for any reason, it is considered impracticable to comply with any provision of this notice, a written application for a variation may be made to the the Shire Council and must reach the Shire Clerk before the 5th day of January, 1978.

Any such application must bear the signature of the Fire Control Officer of the area signifying his agreement to the variation. If permission for variation is not granted the terms of the notice must be complied with.

The penalty for failure to comply with this notice is a fine of not less than \$10.00 nor more than \$200 in addition to which the Council may have the works carried out and may recover the costs of such works from the owner and/or occupier. Where for an item in the scale set out in subregulation (1) of this regulation, the normal fee charged by a chiropractor to a patient other than one entitled to workers' compensation is less than the fee in that scale for that item, for the purposes of paragraph (c) of subsection (1) of Section 35 of the Act the fee to be paid to that chiropractor for that item shall be that normal fee.

AGRICULTURAL PRODUCTS ACT, 1929-1975

Children who live within the areas and boundaries stated shall attend the schools to which such boundaries apply unless directed otherwise or unless an option is provided. Children who live outside the areas and boundaries shall not attend the schools to which such boundaries apply unless written approval for such admission is obtained from the undersigned.

SCHOOL BOUNDARIES.

1. Craigie-Kallaroo-Mullaloo area:

With the opening of the Mullaloo Heights Primary School in 1978, the re-definition of boundaries of some of the schools in the area has become necessary, as follows:—

(a) Mullaloo Heights Primary School:

The boundary for the abovementioned school is as follows:—

From the Indian Ocean south of the east-west alignment of Merrifield Place, due east to West Coast Highway, north along West Coast Highway to Mullaloo Drive, east along Mullaloo Drive to its intersection with the proposed Mitchell

Freeway, and thence in a generally northerly direction along the alignment of the proposed Mitchell Freeway.

The boundary parts of Merrifield Place (both sides), West Coast Highway (both sides), Mullaloo Drive (north side), and the proposed Mitchell Freeway (west side), are included within the area for the Mullaloo Heights Primary School.

Children attending Government schools and in Years 1 to 7 inclusive in 1978, and living within the boundary for the Mullaloo Heights Primary School, as provided above, shall attend the Mullaloo Heights Primary School, except that children who reside in the localities of Beldon and Heathridge and who currently (1977) attend the Camberwarra Primary School, may remain at the Camberwarra Primary School or may transfer to the Mullaloo Heights Primary School. This option is also extended to the younger siblings of such children. In addition, Year 7 pupils in 1978 who currently (1977) attend the Springfield Primary School shall have the option of completing their primary education at their present (1977) school or of transferring to the new Mullaloo Heights Primary School.

(b) Camberwarra Primary School:

The boundary for the above-mentioned school is as follows:—

From the intersection of Mullaloo Drive and the proposed Mitchell Freeway, west along Mullaloo Drive to Marmion Avenue, south along Marmion Avenue to Albion Street, east along Albion Street, across Camberra Drive and east along Arawa Place and its easterly extension to Camberwarra Drive, north along Camberwarra Drive to Corima Place, and east along Corima Place and its easterly extension to the proposed alignment of the Mitchell Freeway.

The boundary parts of Mullaloo Drive (south side) and Marmion Avenue (east side) and included in the area for the Camberwarra Primary School. The boundary part of Camberwarra Drive (east side) and the boundary streets of Albion Street (both sides), Arawa Place (both sides), and Corima Place (both sides), are excluded from the area for the Camberwarra Primary School.

Children attending Government schools and in Years 1 to 7 inclusive in 1978, and living within the boundary for the Camberwarra Primary School, as provided above, shall attend the Camberwarra Primary School.

Children who reside in the localities of Beldon and Heathridge and who currently (1977) attend the Camberwarra Primary School, may remain at the Camberwarra Primary School or may transfer to the Mullaloo Heights Primary School. This option is extended to the younger siblings of such children.

(c) Springfield Primary School:

The boundary for the above-mentioned school is as follows:—

From the Indian Ocean south of the east-west alignment at Merrifield Place, due east to West Coast Highway, north along West Coast Highway to Mullaloo Drive, east along Mullaloo Drive to Marmion Avenue, south along Marmion Avenue to Whitfords Avenue, and west along Whitfords Avenue and its westerly extension to the Indian Ocean.

The boundary parts of Mullaloo Drive (south side), Marmion Avenue (west side), and Whitfords Avenue (north side) are included in the area for the Springfield Primary School. The boundary parts of Merrifield Place (both sides) and West Coast Highway (both sides) are excluded from the area for the Springfield Primary School.

Children attending Government schools and in Years 1 to 7 inclusive in 1978, and living within the boundary for the Springfield Primary School, as provided above, shall attend the Springfield Primary School. In addition, Year 7 pupils in 1978, who currently (1977) attend the Springfield Primary School and who live within the boundary for the new Mullaloo Heights Primary School, shall have the option of completing their primary education at their present

(1977) school or of transferring to the Mullaloo Heights Primary School.

2. Gwynne Park Primary School:

The boundary for the above-mentioned school is as follows:—

Wungong Road from its southern-most point, northwest and north along Wungong Road to Seventh Road, northwest along Seventh Road to Forrest Road, thence in a generally southwesterly direction along Forrest Road.

The boundary parts of Wungong Road (both sides), Seventh Road (south side) and Forrest Road (south side) are included within the area for the Gwynne Park Primary School.

Children attending Government schools and in Years 1 to 7 inclusive in 1978, and living within the boundary for the Gwynne Park Primary School, as provided above, shall attend the Gwynne Park Primary School, except that children in Year 7 in 1978 who are currently (1977) attending the Neerigen Brook Primary School, shall have the option of completing their primary education at their present (1977) school or of transferring to the new Gwynne Park Primary School.

3. Warwick Primary School:

The boundary for the above-mentioned school is as follows:—

From the junction of Warwick Road and Wanneroo Road, west and southwest along Warwick Road to the alignment with the proposed Mitchell Freeway, southeast along the alignment of the proposed Mitchell Freeway to Beach Road, east and northeast along Beach Road to Wanneroo Road, and north along Wanneroo Road to Warwick Road.

The boundary parts of Warwick Road (south side), Mitchell Freeway (east side), Beach Road (north side) and Wanneroo Road (west side), are included within the area for the Warwick Primary School.

Children attending Government schools and in Years 1 to 7 inclusive in 1978, and living within the boundary for the Warwick Primary School, as provided above, shall attend the Warwick Primary School.

4. Brookman, Yale and Langford Primary Schools:

(a) Brookman and Yale Primary Schools:—

The following has been declared as an optional area between the Brookman Primary School and the Yale Primary School:—

The area bounded on the Northwest by the alignment of the proposed Roe Freeway, on the southwest by Spencer Road, on the southeast by the Standard Gauge Railway, and on the northeast by the Canning River.

The boundary parts of the Roe Freeway (southeast side) and Spencer Road (northeast side) are included within the optional area, as provided above.

(b) Langford Primary School:—

The boundary for the above-mentioned school is as follows:—

From where the Standard Gauge Railway crosses Garden Street, northeast along the Standard Gauge Railway to Cameron Street, northwest along Cameron Street to the alignment of the proposed Roe Freeway, northeast along the alignment of the proposed Roe Freeway to a point opposite Langford Park and on the south side

of Cortis Way, in a generally northwesterly direction crossing Langford Park to Langford Avenue, in the same direction southwest of Towton Way to Brookman Avenue, in the same direction between Foxwood Way, Foxwood Court and Letson Way on the northeast and Rouse Court and Turley Way on the southwest to Nicholson Road, southwest along Nicholson Road to Garden Street, and southeast along Garden Street to the Standard Gauge Railway.

The boundary parts of Cameron Street (south side), the proposed Roe Freeway (northwest side), Nicholson Road (east side) and Garden Street (north side), are included in the area for the Langford Primary School.

The area bounded on the northeast by Spencer Road, on the southeast by the Standard Gauge Railway, on the southwest by Cameron Street, and on the northwest by the alignment of the proposed Roe Freeway is an optional area between Langford Primary School and Yale Primary School, with the boundary parts of Spencer Road (southwest side) Roe Freeway (southeast side), and Cameron Street (northeast side) being included in the optional area. Children from this optional area shall be excluded from attending the Brookman Primary School.

Children attending Government schools and in Years 1 to 7 inclusive in 1978, and living within the boundary for the Langford Primary School, as provided above, shall attend the Langford Primary School, but children living in the optional area designated above may attend either Langford Primary School or Yale Primary School.

5. Forrestdale Primary School:

The boundary for the above-mentioned school is as follows:—

Where Forrest Road crosses the Wungong River.

Children living to the west of this point shall attend the Forrestdale Primary School whilst children living to the east thereof, but being to the south of Forrest Road, shall attend the Gwynne Park Primary School.

The above boundary is to apply except where the routing of any school bus service to the Armadale Primary School passes through any part of the above-mentioned areas.

Children attending Government schools in Years 1 to 7 inclusive in 1978 and living within the boundary for the Forrestdale Primary School, as provided above, shall attend the Forrestdale Primary School, except that children in Year 7 in 1978 who are currently (1977) attending other primary schools may remain at their present (1977) school or may transfer to the new Forrestdale Primary School.

6. East Victoria Park Primary School:

The eastern boundary for the above-mentioned school is as follows:—

The Perth-Bunbury Railway Line.

Children living in the area to the east of the Railway Line shall be excluded from attendance at the East Victoria Park Primary School.

7. Carnarvon and East Carnarvon Primary Schools:

The boundary between the above-mentioned schools is as follows:—

From the Gascoyne River south between Hearn Place and Pratt Court on the west and Morrell Court and Wheelock Way on the east to Babbage Island Road, southeast along Babbage Island Road and across Robinson Street, and thence in a generally southeasterly direction.

Children attending Government schools and living to the west of the boundary, as provided above, shall attend the Carnarvon Primary School, and those living to the east of the said boundary shall attend the East Carnarvon Primary School. This direction shall apply to children in Year 1 in 1978, in Years 1 and 2 in 1979, in Years 1, 2 and 3 in 1980, and so on.

8. Flinders Park Primary School:

The boundary for the above-mentioned school is as follows:—

From Oyster Harbour, southwest along Collingwood Street to Battle Road, north along Battle Road to Buffalo Road, west along Buffalo Road to Brewster Road, north along Brewster Road to Lower King Road, north and northeast along Lower King Road to Norwood Road, northwest along Norwood Road to Chester Pass Road, northeast along Chester Pass Road to Upper King Bridge, and in a generally westerly direction along the King River.

The boundary parts of Collingwood Street (both sides), Brewster Road (both sides), Lower King Road (both sides), and Chester Pass Road (both sides), and the boundary street of Norwood Road (both sides), are included within the area for Flinders Park Primary School. The Boundary streets of Battle Road (both sides) and Buffalo Road (both sides) are excluded from the area for the Flinders Park Primary School.

Children attending Government schools and in Years 1 to 7 inclusive in 1978, and living within the boundary for the Flinders Park Primary School, as provided above, shall attend the Flinders Park Primary School, except that children in Year 7 in 1978 who are currently (1977) attending the Spencer Park Primary School may remain at their present (1977) school or may transfer to the Flinders Park Primary School.

9. Pegs Creek Primary School:

The boundary for the above-mentioned school is as follows:—

From the eastern extremity of Millstream Road, west along Millstream Road to Balmoral Road, then north and west along Balmoral Road.

The boundary street of Balmoral Road (both sides) is included within the area for the Pegs Creek Primary School and the boundary part of Millstream Road (both sides) is excluded from the area for the Pegs Creek Primary School.

Children attending Government schools and in Years 1 to 7 inclusive in 1978, are living within the boundary and for the Pegs Creek Primary School, as provided above, shall attend the Pegs Creek Primary School, except that children in Year 7 in 1978 who are currently (1977) attending the Karratha Primary School may remain at their present (1977) school or may transfer to the Pegs Creek Primary School.

10. North Tom Price Primary School:

The boundary for the above-mentioned school is as follows:—

From the eastern extremity of Milpera Street, west along Milpera Street to Central Road, south along Central Road to North Road,

southwest along North Road to a point where it turns south, thence due west to the Tom Price-Dampier Railway, and southwest along the alignment of the Tom Price-Dampier Railway.

The boundary street of Milpera Street (both sides) and the boundary parts of Central Road (both sides) and North Road (both sides) are included within the area for the North Tom Price Primary School.

Children attending Government schools and in Years 1 to 5 inclusive, and living to the north of the abovementioned boundary, shall attend the North Tom Price Primary School.

11. Carine Primary School:

The boundary for the above-mentioned school is as follows:—

North Beach Road from its intersection with Marmion Avenue, east along North Beach Road to Okely Road, north along Okely Road to Beach Road, west along Beach Road to Marmion Avenue, and southeast along Marmion Avenue to North Beach Road.

The boundary parts of North Beach Road (north side), Okely Road (both sides), Beach Road (south side), and Marmion Avenue (east side), are included in the area for the Carine Primary School.

The area bounded on the west by Okely Road, on the south by North Beach Road, on the east by Duffy Road, and on the north by the proposed alignment of the North Perimeter Highway, is to be an optional area. The boundary parts of Okely Road (both sides), North Beach Road (south side) and Duffy Road (east side) shall be excluded from the optional area. Children living in the optional area so defined, and in Years 1 to 6 inclusive in 1978, may attend either the Carine Primary School or the Lake Gwelup Primary School.

Children attending Government schools and in Years 1 to 6 inclusive in 1978, and living within the boundary for the Carine Primary School, as provided above, shall attend the Carine Primary School, except that children living in the optional area, as designated above, may attend either the Carine Primary School or the Lake Gwelup Primary School.

12. North Morley Primary School and Camboon Primary School:

The boundary between the above-mentioned schools is as follows:—

From the junction of Camboon Road and Lincoln Road, north along Camboon Road to Wolseley Road, west along Wolseley Road to Hookwood Street, north along Hookwood Street to Wotzko Road, west along Wotzko Road to a point due south of a line between Hayden Close on the west and Sunderland Place on the east, north and northwest along this line between Hayden Close, Farmer Court, Monk Place, and Callaghan Way on the west and Sunderland Place, Hepworth Way and Newell Way on the east, to Bramwell Road, east along Bramwell Road to the eastern boundary of the Morley Senior High School site, north along the eastern boundary of the Morley Senior High School site to Widgee Road, west along Widgee Road to the northwestern corner of Morley Senior High School site, and then due north along a line between Bohemia Place on the west and Luderman Road and Ing Place on the east, to the proposed alignment of the North Perimeter Highway.

The boundary parts of Camboon Road (both sides), Wolseley Road (both sides), Bramwell Road (south side) and Widgee Road (north side) and the boundary street of

Hookwood Street (both sides) and included in the area for the Camboon Primary School. The boundary part of Wotzko Road (both sides) is included in the area for the North Morley Primary School.

Children attending Government schools and living in the area to the west of the abovementioned boundary shall attend the North Morley Primary School, whilst those living to the east of the above-mentioned boundary shall attend the Camboon Primary School.

13. Cooloongup-Hillman-Rockingham-Safety Bay-Waikiki-Warnbro area:

With the opening of the Cooloongup Primary School in 1978 the re-definition of boundaries of schools in the above-mentioned area has become necessary, as follows:—

(a) Cooloongup Primary School:

The boundary for the abovementioned school is as follows:—

From the junction of Ennis Avenue with Grange Drive and Elanora Drive, northwest along Ennis Avenue to Rae Road, southwest and west along Rae Road to Waikiki Road, south along Waikiki Road to Malibu Road, southwest along Malibu Road to Safety Bay Road, southeast along Safety Bay Road to Warnbro Beach Road, southwest and southeast along Warnbro Beach Road to View Road, northeast along View Road to Safety Bay Road, northwest along Safety Bay Road to Seahaven Street, northeast along Seahaven Street to Charthouse Road, northwest along Charthouse Road to Seabreeze Street, northeast along Seabreeze Street to Jamaican Road, southeast along Jamaican Road to Kingston Way, northeast along the southwest/northeast alignment of Kingston Way and its extension across Forty Road to the proposed extension of Ennis Avenue, and thence northwest along the proposed extension of Ennis Avenue to the junction with Grange Drive and Elanora Drive.

The boundary parts of Ennis Avenue (west side), Rae Road (south side), Malibu Road (south side), Safety Bay Road (both sides), Warnbro Beach Road (both sides), Charthouse Road (both sides), Jamaican Road (both sides), and Kingston Way (both sides), and the boundary streets of Waikiki Road (east side), View Road (both sides), Seahaven Street (both sides), and Seabreeze Street (both sides), are included in the area for the Cooloongup Primary School.

The area bounded on the west by Read Street, on the south by Rae Road, on the east by Ennis Avenue, and on the north by Dixon Road and the proposed alignment of Leghorn Street, is to be an optional area between the Bungaree, Cooloongup and Hillman Primary Schools. The boundary parts of Read Street (east side), Rae Road (north side), Ennis Avenue (west side), and Dixon Road (both sides), and the boundary street of the proposed Leghorn Street (both sides), are included in the optional area.

Children attending Government schools and in Years 1 to 7 inclusive in 1978, and living within the boundary for the Cooloongup Primary School, as provided above, shall attend the Cooloongup Primary School, except as follows:—

(i) children living in the optional area, as designated above, may attend either the Bungaree Primary School, Cooloongup Primary School or Hillman Primary School;

(ii) children in Year 7 in 1978 and currently (1977) attending either the Bungaree Primary School or the Hillman Primary School may remain at their present (1977) school or may transfer to the Cooloongup Primary School at the beginning of the 1978 school year;

(iii) children living within the area bounded by Safety Bay Road (both sides), Warnbro Beach Road (both sides), View Road (both sides), Safety Bay Road (both sides), Seahaven Street (both sides), Charthouse Road (both sides), Seabreeze Street (both sides), Jamaican Road (both sides), Kingston Way (both sides), Forty Road (west side), Malibu Road (both sides), the western boundary of the Safety Bay High School site, Seagate Road (both sides), Waikiki Road (east side), and Malibu Road (south side), and currently (1977) attending other schools, shall have the option of continuing their primary education at their present (1977) school or of transferring to the Cooloongup Primary School at the beginning of the 1978 school year; this option is to be extended to the younger siblings of such children.

(b) Bungaree Primary School:

The boundary for the abovementioned school is as follows:—

Rae Road from its junction with the eastern portion of Farmers Road, east along Rae Road to Read Street, north along Read Street to Swinstone Street, in a generally westerly direction along Swinstone Street to Casserley Road, south along the north/south alignment of Casserley Road to the proposed Garden Island Expressway, across the proposed Expressway to the eastern portion of Farmers Road, and south along Farmers Road to Rae Road.

The boundary parts of Rae Road (north side), Read Street (west side), Swinstone Street (both sides), Casserley Road (east side), and Farmers Road (east side), are included in the area for the Bungaree Primary School.

The area bounded on the west by Read Street, on the south by Rae Road, on the east by Ennis

Avenue, and on the north by Dixon Road and the proposed alignment of Leghorn Street, is to be an optional area between the Bungaree, Cooloongup and Hillman Primary Schools. The boundary parts of Read Street (east side), Rae Road (north side), Ennis Avenue (west side), and Dixon Road (both sides), and the boundary street of the proposed Leghorn Street (both sides), are included in the optional area.

Children attending Government schools and in Years 1 to 7 inclusive in 1978, and living within the boundary for the Bungaree Primary School, as provided above, shall attend the Bungaree Primary School, except that children living in the optional area, as designated above, may attend either the Bungaree Primary School, Cooloongup Primary School or Hillman Primary School.

(c) Hillman Primary School:

The western boundary for the abovementioned school is as follows:—

Ennis Avenue.

The boundary street of Ennis Avenue (east side) is included in the area for the Hillman Primary School.

The area bounded on the west by Read Street, on the south by Rae Road, on the east by Ennis Avenue, and on the north by Dixon Road and the proposed alignment of Leghorn Street, is to be an optional area between the Bungaree, Cooloongup and Hillman Primary Schools. The boundary parts of Read Street (east side), Rae Road (north side), Ennis Avenue (west side), and Dixon Road (both sides), and the boundary street of the proposed Leghorn Street (both sides), are included in the optional area.

Children attending Government schools and in Years 1 to 7 inclusive in 1978, and living in the area to the east of the boundary shall attend the Hillman Primary School, except that children living in the optional area, as designated above, may attend either the Bungaree Primary School, Cooloongup Primary School, or Hillman Primary School.

(d) Warnbro Primary School:

The boundary for the abovementioned school is as follows:—

From the Indian Ocean at a point opposite the junction of Warnbro Beach Road and View Road, northeast to and along View Road to Safety Bay Road, northwest along Safety Bay Road to Seahaven Street, northeast along Seahaven Street to Charthouse Road, northwest along Charthouse Road to Seabreeze Street, northeast along Seabreeze Street to Jamaican Road, southeast along Jamaican Road to Kingston Way, northeast along the southwest/northeast alignment of Kingston Way to Forty Road, and southeast along Forty Road to Safety Bay Road.

The boundary parts of Safety Bay Road (both sides), Charthouse Road (both sides), Jamaican

Road (both sides), Kingston Way (both sides), and Forty Road (east side), and the boundary streets of View Road (both sides), Seahaven Street (both sides), and Seabreeze Street (both sides), are excluded from the area for the Warnbro Primary School.

Children attending Government schools and in Years 1 to 7 inclusive in 1978, and living within the boundary for the Warnbro Primary School, as provided above, shall attend the Warnbro Primary School, except as follows:—

Children living within the area bounded by Safety Bay Road (both sides), Warnbro Beach Road (both sides), View Road (both sides), Safety Bay Road (both sides), Seahaven Street (both sides), Chart-house Road (both sides), Seabreeze Street (both sides), Jamaican Road (both sides), Kingston Way (both sides), Forty Road (west side), Malibu Road (both sides), the western boundary of the Safety Bay High School site, Seagate Road (both sides), Waikiki Road (east side), and Malibu Road (south side), and currently (1977) attending other schools shall have the option of continuing their primary education at their present (1977) school or of transferring to the Coolesongup Primary School at the beginning of the 1978 school year; this option is to be extended to the younger siblings of such children.

(e) Rockingham Beach and Safety Bay Primary Schools:

The boundary between the abovementioned schools is as follows:—

Boundary Road.

The boundary street of Boundary Road (both sides) is included in the area for the Safety Bay Primary School.

14. Wattleup Primary School:

The boundary for the abovementioned school is as follows:—

From Banganup Lake at a point due east of Mortimer Street, west across Pearse Road to and along Mortimer Street to Power Avenue, north along Power Avenue to McLeod Road, west along McLeod Road and its westerly extension across Rockingham Road to a point due north of the junction of Hope Valley Road and Rockingham Road, due south to the junction of Hope Valley Road and Rockingham Road, southeast along Hope Valley Road to McLaughlan Road.

The boundary part of Power Avenue (both sides) and the boundary streets of Mortimer Street (both sides) and McLeod Road (both sides) are excluded from the area for the Wattleup Primary School. The boundary part of Hope Valley Road (north side) is included in the area for the Wattleup Primary School.

The area bounded by Banganup Lake, Russell Road, Hurst Road, Rockingham Road, a line due east from Rockingham Road to McLeod Road, McLeod Road, Power

Avenue, Mortimer Street and its easterly extension to Banganup Lake is to be an optional area between Wattleup Primary School and South Coogee Primary School. The boundary parts of Russell Road (south side), Rockingham Road (both sides) and Power Avenue (both sides), and the boundary streets of Hurst Road (both sides), McLeod Road (both sides) and Mortimer Street (both sides) are included in the optional area.

In addition, children living in Harris Road and Hill Road (both sides in each case) being cul-de-sac streets on the north side of Hope Valley Road, shall have the option of attending either Wattleup Primary School or Naval Base Primary School.

Children attending Government schools and in Years 1 to 7 inclusive in 1978, and living within the boundary for the Wattleup Primary School, as provided above, shall attend the Wattleup Primary School, except as follows:—

(a) Children in Year 7 in 1978 who currently (1977) attend the South Coogee Primary School, may remain at their present (1977) school or may transfer to the Wattleup Primary School.

(b) Children living in the optional area between the Wattleup and South Coogee Primary Schools, as designated above, may attend either the Wattleup Primary School or the South Coogee Primary School.

(c) Children living in the optional area between the Wattleup and Naval Base Primary Schools, as designated above, may attend either the Wattleup Primary School or the Naval Base Primary School.

15. Bambara Primary School:

The boundary for the abovementioned school is as follows:—

Whitfords Avenue from the western boundary of the Pinnaroo Cemetery, in a generally westerly direction along Whitfords Avenue to Marmion Avenue, south along Marmion Avenue to Forrest Avenue, northeast along Forrest Avenue to Mason Way, south along Mason Way and thence in a generally easterly direction between Mason Way, Rowlands Court and Wells Place on the north and Durack Way and Carnegie Way on the south to Forrest Avenue, southeast along Forrest Avenue to the junction of Forrest Avenue and the westerly extension of the northern portion of Simpson Drive, northeast from this point to and along the northern portion of Simpson Drive to a point midway between the eastern portion of Simpson Drive and the western portion of Warner Drive, in a southeasterly direction to Giles Avenue, and northeast along Giles Avenue and its extension across Gibson Avenue to the western boundary of the Pinnaroo Cemetery.

The boundary parts of Whitfords Avenue (south side), Marmion Avenue (east side), Forrest Avenue (both sides), and Mason Way (both sides) are included in the area for the Bambara Primary School, whilst the boundary parts of Simpson Drive (both sides) and Giles Avenue (both sides) are excluded from the area for the Bambara Primary School.

Children attending Government schools and in Years 1 to 5 inclusive in 1978, and living within the boundary for the Bambara Primary School, as provided above, shall attend the Bambara Primary School.

16. Kalgoorlie-Boulder area:

A re-definition of boundaries has been necessary for the Kalgoorlie-Boulder area, and the boundaries which are to apply in the future are as follows:—

(a) North Kalgoorlie Primary School:

The boundary for the abovementioned school is as follows:—

Bourke Street from its southernmost point, northeast along Bourke Street to Varden Street, east along Varden Street across St. Alban's Road to the railway line, north along the railway line to a point mid-way between Gordon Street and Hare Street, and thence in a northeasterly direction between Gordon Street and Hare Street.

The boundary part of Varden Street (both sides) and the boundary street of Bourke Street (both sides) are included in the area for the North Kalgoorlie Primary School.

Children attending Government schools and in Years 1 to 7 inclusive in 1978, and thereafter until further notice, and living in the area to the north of the above-defined boundary, shall attend the North Kalgoorlie Primary School except that children who attended another school in Kalgoorlie-Boulder during 1977 whilst residing in the area now gazetted for the North Kalgoorlie Primary School, shall have the option of either completing their primary education at their present (1977) school or of transferring to the North Kalgoorlie Primary School at the beginning of the 1978 school year.

(b) East Kalgoorlie Primary School:

The boundary for the abovementioned school is as follows:—

From where Hannan Street Crosses the Kalgoorlie-Boulder railway line, southeast along the railway line to Boorara Road, east along Boorara Road to the junction with Barton Street and Black Street, due east from this point to the Trans-Australia Railway, northwest along the Trans-Australia Railway to Kanowna Road, in a generally southwesterly direction along Kanowna Road to Austral Street and southwest along Austral Street to Hannan Street.

The boundary part of Hannan Street (both sides) is excluded from the area for the East Kalgoorlie Primary School, whilst the boundary parts of Boorara Road (both sides), Kanowna Road (both sides) and Austral Street (both sides) are included in the area for the East Kalgoorlie Primary School.

Children attending Government schools and in Years 1 to 7 inclusive in 1978 and thereafter until further notice, and living within the area for the East Kalgoorlie Primary School, as provided above, shall attend the East Kalgoorlie Primary School, except that children who attended another school in Kalgoorlie-Boulder during 1977 whilst residing in the area now gazetted for the East Kalgoorlie Primary School, shall have the option of either completing their primary education at

their present (1977) school or of transferring to the East Kalgoorlie Primary School at the beginning of the 1978 school year.

(c) Kalgoorlie Junior Primary and Kalgoorlie Primary Schools:

The boundary for the abovementioned schools is as follows:—

(i) To the west and north:

Bourke Street from its southernmost point, northeast along Bourke Street to Varden Street, east along Varden Street, across St. Alban's Road to the railway line, north along the railway line to a point mid-way between Gordon Street and Hare Street, and thence in a northeasterly direction between Gordon Street and Hare Street.

The boundary part of Varden Street (both sides) and the boundary street of Bourke Street (both sides) are excluded from the area for the Kalgoorlie Junior Primary/Kalgoorlie Primary Schools.

(ii) To the south and east:

From the northern perimeter of the Kalgoorlie Airport north along the un-named road to the un-named road which runs along the southern boundary of the Race Course, west along this road to Meldrum Avenue, northeast along Meldrum Avenue to Charles Street, southeast along Charles Street to Cheetham Street, northeast along Cheetham Street to Wilson Street, southeast along Wilson Street to Roberts Street, northeast along Roberts Street across Shea Street to the Kalgoorlie-Boulder Railway, northwest along the railway line to Hannan Street, northeast along Hannan Street to Austral Street, northeast along Austral Street to Kanowna Road, and north and northeast along Kanowna Road.

The boundary parts of Wilson Street, Roberts Street and Hannan Street (both sides in each case) and the boundary streets of Meldrum Avenue (both sides) and Cheetham Street (both sides) are included within the area for the Kalgoorlie Junior Primary and Kalgoorlie Primary Schools. The boundary parts of the un-named streets between the Kalgoorlie Airport and the Race Course (both sides in each case) and of Charles Street (both sides) and Austral Street (both sides) and the boundary street of Kanowna Road (both sides) are excluded from the area for the Kalgoorlie Junior Primary/Kalgoorlie Primary Schools.

Children attending Government schools and in Years 1 to 7 inclusive in 1978, and thereafter until further notice,

and living within the area for the Kalgoorlie Junior Primary and Kalgoorlie Primary Schools, as provided in (i) and (ii) above, shall attend the Kalgoorlie Junior Primary/Kalgoorlie Primary Schools, except that children who attended another school in Kalgoorlie/Boulder during 1977 whilst residing in the area now gazetted for the Kalgoorlie Junior Primary/Kalgoorlie Primary Schools shall have the option of either completing their primary education at their present (1977) school or of transferring to the Kalgoorlie Junior Primary School or Kalgoorlie Primary School, as relevant at the beginning of the 1978 school year.

(d) South Kalgoorlie Primary School:

The Boundary for the abovementioned school is as follows:

From a point on the Kalgoorlie-Boulder Railway Line due east of Holmes Street, west to the junction of Holmes Street and Lane Street, west along Holmes Street to Wilson Street, north along Wilson Street to Lionel Street, northwest along Lionel Street to Davidson Street, southwest along Davidson Street to Dixon Street, southwest along Dixon Street to Maxwell Street, northeast along Maxwell Street to the unnamed road running along the south side of the Race Course, northwest along this unnamed road to Meldrum Avenue, northeast along Meldrum Avenue to Charles Street, southeast along Charles Street to Cheetham Street, northeast along Cheetham Street to Wilson Street, southeast along Wilson Street to Roberts Street, northeast along Roberts Street across Shea Street to the Kalgoorlie-Boulder railway line, and southeast along the railway line to a point due east of Holmes Street.

The boundary parts of Wilson Street (Boulder), Lionel Street, Maxwell Street, Charles Street and Wilson Street (Kalgoorlie) (both sides in each case) and the boundary Street of Holmes Street (both sides) are included within the area for the South Kalgoorlie Primary School. The boundary parts of Davidson Street, Dixon Street and Roberts Street (both sides in each case) are the boundary streets of Meldrum Avenue, Cheetham Street, and the unnamed road running along the south side of the Race Course (both sides in each case) are excluded from the area for the South Kalgoorlie Primary School.

The following has been declared as an optional area between the South Kalgoorlie Primary School and the Boulder Junior Primary/Boulder Primary Schools:—

From the junction of Dixon Street and Maxwell Street, northeast along Maxwell Street to the unnamed road which runs along the south side of the Race Course, northwest along the unnamed road to the junction with the unnamed road

which leads southwest to the northern perimeter of the Airport, southwest along this unnamed road to the northern perimeter of the Airport, east, northeast and southeast along the Airport boundary to the junction of Auburn Street and Gregory Street, northeast along Auburn Street to the junction with McLaren Street and Johnston Street, east along Johnston Street to Wilson Street, north along Wilson Street to Lionel Street, northwest along Lionel Street to Davidson Street, southwest along Davidson Street to Dixon Street and southwest along Dixon Street to the junction with Maxwell Street.

The boundary parts of Johnston Street, Davidson Street and Dixon Street (both sides in each case) and the boundary streets of Auburn Street (both sides), and the two unnamed roads (both sides) are included within the optional area, as designated above, whilst the boundary parts of Wilson Street (Boulder), Lionel Street and Maxwell Street (both sides in each case), are excluded from the optional area.

Children attending Government schools and in Years 1 to 7 inclusive in 1978 and thereafter until further notice, and living within the area for the South Kalgoorlie Primary School, as provided above, shall attend the South Kalgoorlie Primary School, except as follows:—

- (i) Children who attended another school in Kalgoorlie/Boulder during 1977 whilst residing in the area now gazetted for the South Kalgoorlie Primary School, shall have the option of either completing their primary education at their present (1977) school or of transferring to the South Kalgoorlie Primary School at the beginning of the 1978 school year;
- (ii) Children resident within the optional area, as designated above, may attend either the South Kalgoorlie Primary School or the Boulder Junior Primary or Boulder Primary School, or, if they attended another school in Kalgoorlie/Boulder during 1977, may complete their primary education at their present (1977) school, or may transfer to the South Kalgoorlie Primary School or the Boulder Junior Primary School

or Boulder Primary School at the beginning of the 1978 school year.

(e) Boulder Junior Primary and Boulder Primary Schools:

The Boundary for the above-mentioned schools is as follows:—

From a point on the Kalgoorlie-Boulder railway line due east of Holmes Street, due west to the junction of Holmes Street and Lane Street, west along Holmes Street to Wilson Street, south along Wilson Street to Johnston Street, west along Johnston Street to the junction with Auburn Street and McLaren Street, southwest along Auburn Street to Gregory Street, south along Gregory Street to Davis Street, West along Davis Street to Hanson Street, south along Hanson Street to the junction with Gatacre Street and Burt Street, southwest, west and northwest along Gatacre Street to the un-named road which goes off in a southwesterly direction south of the Airport, and southwest along this un-named road.

The boundary parts of Wilson Street, Gregory Street, Davis Street, Gatacre Street, and the un-named road south of Gatacre Street (both sides in each case) and the boundary street of Hanson Street (both sides) are included within the area for the Boulder Junior Primary School and Boulder Primary School, whilst the boundary parts of Johnston Street (both sides), and the boundary streets of Holmes Street (both sides) and Auburn Street (both sides) are excluded from the area for the Boulder Junior Primary School and Boulder Primary School.

The following has been declared as an optional area between the South Kalgoorlie Primary School and the Boulder Junior Primary/Boulder Primary Schools:—

From the junction of Dixon Street and Maxwell Street, northeast along Maxwell Street to the un-named road which runs along the south side of the Race Course, northwest along this un-named road to the junction with the un-named road which leads southwest to the northern perimeter of the Airport, southwest along this un-named road to the northern perimeter of the Airport, east, northeast and southeast along the Airport boundary to the junction of Auburn Street and Gregory Street, northeast along Auburn Street to the junction with McLaren Street and Johnston Street, east along Johnston Street to Wilson Street, north along Wilson Street to Lionel Street, northwest along Lionel Street to Davidson Street, southwest along Davidson Street to Dixon Street, and southwest along Dixon Street to the junction with Maxwell Street.

The boundary parts of Johnston Street, Davidson Street and Dixon Street (both sides in each case), and the boundary streets of Auburn Street (both sides) and the two un-named roads (both sides) are included within the optional area, as designated above,

whilst the boundary parts of Wilson Street (Boulder), Lionel Street and Maxwell Street (both sides in each case) are excluded from the optional area.

Children attending Government schools and in Years 1 to 7 inclusive in 1978, and thereafter until further notice, and living within the area for the Boulder Junior Primary and Boulder Primary Schools, as provided above, shall attend the Boulder Junior Primary School or Boulder Primary School, except as follows:—

- (i) Children who attended another school in Kalgoorlie/Boulder during 1977 whilst residing in the area now gazetted for the Boulder Junior Primary/Boulder Primary Schools, shall have the option of either completing their primary education at their present (1977) school or of transferring to the Boulder Junior Primary School or Boulder Primary School, as relevant, at the beginning of the 1978 school year;
- (ii) Children resident within the optional area, as designated above, may attend either the Boulder Junior Primary School/Boulder Primary School or the South Kalgoorlie Primary School, or, if they attended another school in Kalgoorlie/Boulder during 1977, may complete their primary education at their present (1977) school, or may transfer to the Boulder Junior Primary School or Boulder Primary School, as relevant, or to the South Kalgoorlie Primary School at the beginning of the 1978 school year.

In addition, the following is to apply to all primary schools in the Kalgoorlie-Boulder area:—

Children who attended a primary school in Kalgoorlie/Boulder during 1977, whilst residing outside the area now gazetted for that primary school, shall have the option of completing their primary education at the school attended during 1977 or of transferring at the beginning of the 1978 school year to the school at which they should correctly be enrolled as a consequence of the re-definition of boundaries now made.

17. Geraldton Area:

With the opening of the Mount Tarcoola Primary School in 1978, the re-definition of boundaries of the schools in Geraldton has become necessary, as follows:—

(a) Bluff Point Primary School:

The boundary for the above-mentioned school is as follows:—

From the Chapman River at a point due east of Boyd Street, due west to and along Boyd Street to Anderson Street, northwest and north along Anderson Street to Box Street, west and southwest along Box Street to Flores Road, northwest along Flores Road to Ord Street, southwest along Ord Street to the railway line, in a

generally westerly direction along the railway line to where it crosses Chapman Road, and thence due west to the Indian Ocean.

The boundary parts of Boyd Street (both sides), Anderson Street (both sides), and Flores Road (both sides), and the boundary street of Box Street (both sides) are included within the area for the Bluff Point Primary School, whilst the boundary part of Ord Street (both sides) is excluded from the area for the Bluff Point Primary School.

Children attending Government schools and in Years 1 to 7 inclusive in 1978 and living within the area for the Bluff Point Primary School, as provided above, shall attend the Bluff Point Primary School, except as follows:—

(i) Children who attended another school in Geraldton during 1977 whilst residing in the area now gazetted for the Bluff Point Primary School, shall have the option of either completing their primary education at their present (1977) school or of transferring to the Bluff Point Primary School at the beginning of the 1978 school year.

(ii) Children who attended the Bluff Point Primary School during 1977 whilst residing outside the area now gazetted for the Bluff Point Primary School, shall have the option of completing their primary education at the Bluff Point Primary School or of transferring at the beginning of the 1978 school year to the school at which they should correctly be enrolled.

All children who will be in Year 1 in 1978 and living within the area for the Bluff Point Primary School, as provided above, and all children of new families moving into the area for the Bluff Point Primary School, as provided above, as from 1st January, 1978, and in Years 1 to 7 inclusive in 1978, shall attend the Bluff Point Primary School.

(b) Allendale Primary School:

The boundary for the abovementioned school is as follows:—
