WHEREAS it is enacted by subsection (3) of section 36 of the Local Government Act, 1960-1977, that where the Governor is of the opinion that on account of economic or seasonal conditions it is desirable that the operations of subsections (1) and (2) of Section 36 should be suspended, he may from time to time, by proclamation, suspend their operation in such districts and for such periods as are specified in the proclamation and may by subsequent proclamation revoke or vary the proclamation; and whereas the Governor is of the opinion that it is desirable on account of seasonal and economic conditions so to suspend the operations of subsection (1) and (2) of section 36 in the district of the municipality of the Shire of Upper Gascoyne: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby suspend the operation of subsections (1) and (2) of Section 36 of the Act, in the district of the Municipality of the Shire of Upper Gascoyne for a period commencing on the date on which this proclamation is published in the *Government Gazette* and ending on the 31st December, 1978.

Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1977.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by subsection (6) of section 13 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1977, that when an employer or group of employers exempted from the operation of that section pursuant to the proviso to subsection (1) of that section shall apply to the Minister for a revocation of the exemption referred to in that proviso, and shall apply to the Minister for the return of securities lodged by him or them with the Treasury discharged from the charge referred to in that proviso, and shall prove to the satisfaction of the Minister that he has or they have obtained from an approved insurer within the meaning of that section a policy of insurance for the full amount of liability to pay compensation under the said Act to all workers employed by him or them, the Governor may by Order in Council revoke the exemption and order that the securities be discharged from the charge and returned to the employer or group of employers: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by subsection (6) of Section 13 of the said Act doth hereby revoke the exemption granted to Whittakers Limited from the operation of Section 13 of the said Act and doth hereby order that the securities deposited by that company at the Treasury, to wit, a Bond for the amount of fifty thousand dollars (\$50 000.00) by the Australia and New Zealand Banking Group Limited, be discharged from the charge and returned to them.

SHIRE OF ROEOURNE TOWN PLANNING  
SCHEME, No. 2—KARRATHA.

THE Roebourne Shire Council, under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon it by the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended) hereby makes the following Town Planning Scheme for the purpose of controlling land use and re-development in parts of the townsite of Karratha which are currently well developed.

PART I.—PRELIMINARY.

1.1 This Town Planning Scheme may be cited as the Shire of Roebourne Town Planning Scheme No. 2 (Karratha area) hereinafter called "the Scheme" and shall come into operation on the publication of the Minister's final approval thereof in the *Government Gazette*.

1.2 The Scheme shall apply to the land set out in the maps forming part of the Scheme.

1.3 The responsible authority for carrying out the Scheme is the Council of the Shire of Roebourne (hereinafter referred to as "the Council").

1.4 Arrangement of the Scheme:

The Scheme Text is divided into the following parts:

- Part I.—Preliminary.
- Part II.—Zones.
- Part III.—General Provisions.
- Part IV.—Non Conforming Use of Land.
- Part V.—Finance and Administration.

The remaining documents are:

1. Scheme Report.
2. Land Use Maps.
3. Scheme Maps.

1.5 Interpretation: In this Scheme the terms used will have the respective interpretations set out in Appendix D of the Town Planning Regulations 1967, unless otherwise specified by this Scheme.

1.5.1 "Contractors Camp" means a camp for the accommodation of temporary workers comprising bedrooms, dining rooms, kitchens, ablutions, toilets and appropriate amenity areas constructed in accordance with the Council's bylaws and appropriate Regulations.

"Security Watchroom" means a room or building set aside for security watchmen having an area not exceeding 35 m<sup>2</sup>. A Security Watchroom may include in its permissible area, a shower, toilet and cooking facilities for light meals should the Council consider these necessary. No sleeping accommodation will be permitted.

PART II.—ZONES.

2.1 The Scheme area is divided into six types of zones set out hereunder:—

- Residential.
- Group Residential.
- Recreational.
- Industrial.
- Industrial Accommodation.
- Special Use.

2.2 The Land Use Table:

2.2.1 Table No. 1 indicates the several uses permitted by the Scheme in the various zones, such uses being determined by cross reference between the list of "Use Classes" on the left-hand side of the Table and the list of "zones" on the top of that Table.

2.2.2 The symbols used in the cross reference in Table No. 1 have the following meanings:

- P—A use that is permitted under the Scheme.
- AA—A use that is not permitted unless approval is granted by the Council.
- IP—A use that is not permitted unless such use is incidental to the predominant use as decided and approved by Council.
- X—A use that is not permitted.

2.3 Applications:

2.3.1 Any person wishing to develop, redevelop or change the use of any land in the Scheme area shall apply to the Council, in writing, identifying the lot and the proposed use, and enclosing plans of any development or redevelopment proposed.

2.3.2 Subject to the provisions of clauses 2.2.2, 2.3.3, 2.3.4, 2.3.5 and Part III Council shall advise the applicant in writing within six weeks of its refusal, approval or conditional approval of any application made under Clause 2.3.1.

2.3.3 The Council may require the applicant to submit such further plans and details of his proposal as it deems necessary for the proper determination of the application.

2.3.4 Where an application relates to a use that the Council may permit at its discretion, and where, in the opinion of the Council, that use may be deemed to be a nuisance by other land users, the Council may display the application and related plans at the offices of the Council and give notice of that display in a newspaper circulating in Karratha together with advice that comments on the application may be lodged at the offices of the Council within three weeks of the notice.

2.3.5 Not earlier than three weeks after a notice made in accordance with clause 2.3.4 the Council shall consider all comments received and shall determine the application.

PART III.—GENERAL PROVISIONS.

3.1 Siting of attached houses:

3.1.1 In this part "flat" means a dwelling which has another dwelling directly above or below it.

"Attached House" means a dwelling which is connected to other dwellings, but does not include a flat, a duplex house, or a triplex house.

3.1.2 An attached house shall be sited in accordance with the provisions of the G.R.4 codes of the uniform building bylaw relating to patio houses (table 11.13 part A and related provisions).

3.1.3 In order to facilitate the calculation of relevant factors lots shall be shown in respect of each attached house on all applications for development of such houses, provided that where subdivision into such lots is not intended they shall be described as 'notional lot'.

3.1.4 Every attached house shall be provided with two walled outdoor spaces each of not less than 60 sq. metres in area, one of which shall be designed for living and entertaining and the other for other domestic activities.

3.1.5 The walls surrounding the outdoor spaces described in 3.1.4 shall have a minimum height of 2 metres broken only by access ways and breeze ways approved by the Council.

### 3.2 Parking:

3.2.1 Each contractor's camp site shall be provided with paved parking spaces at a rate of one car space for every two units of accommodation.

3.2.2 Each industrial lot shall be provided with one car space for every two workers employed on the longest shift.

3.2.3 Each special use lot shall be provided with paved parking spaces to the requirements of the Council.

3.3 Compressors, Airconditioning Machinery and other Noise Sources fitted to buildings other than dwellings shall not be sited where, in the opinion of Council, they may disturb residents.

3.4 Security Watchroom. A Security Watchroom shall not be used as a dwelling.

3.5 General Industry. The Council shall not permit a general industrial use within 200 metres of an industrial accommodation zone.

3.6 Where a Residential Dwelling is destroyed by any disaster within the scheme area the Dwelling shall not be reconstructed other than with materials that have been approved by Council but subject to the approval of the Council a temporary structure constructed otherwise than in accordance with the requirements of the scheme may be permitted for a period of 12 months.

### PART IV.—NON-CONFORMING USE OF LAND.

4.1 No provision of the Scheme shall prevent—

(a) the continued use of any land or building for the purpose for which it was being lawfully used at the time of the coming into force of the Scheme; or

(b) the carrying out of any development thereon for which, immediately prior to that time, a permit or permits required under the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended), and any other law authorising the development to be carried out has been duly obtained and was current.

4.2.1 Where in respect of land reserved under Part II of the Scheme a non conforming use exists or was authorised as mentioned in clause 4.1 of this Part on that land all or any erections, alterations or extensions of the buildings thereon or use thereon or use thereof shall not be carried out unless the approval of the Council has been obtained in writing;

4.2.2 Where in respect of land zoned under Part III of the Scheme a non conforming use exists or was authorised as mentioned in clause 4.1 of this Part on that land, and provided the prior consent in writing of the Council has been obtained, buildings may be extended to the limits prescribed by the Uniform Building By-laws made under the Local Government Act, 1960 (as amended), or by any other by-laws made under that Act for the purpose of limiting the size, location and distance from boundaries and any other matter required by law for that class of use within the boundary of the lot or lots on which the use was carried on immediately prior to the coming into force of the Scheme.

### 4.3 Change of Non Conforming Use:

4.3.1 The Council may permit the use of any land to be changed from one non conforming use to another non conforming use, provided the proposed use is, in the opinion of the Council, less detrimental to the amenity of the neighbourhood than the existing use, or is in the opinion of the Council closer to the intended uses of the zone.

### 4.4 Discontinuance of Non Conforming Use:

4.4.1 Notwithstanding the preceding provisions of this Part, except where a change of non conforming use has been permitted by the Council under Clause 4.3.1 when a non conforming use of any land or building has been discontinued, such land or building shall not thereafter be used other than in conformity with the provisions of the Scheme.

4.4.2 The Council may effect the discontinuance of a non conforming use by the purchase of the affected property, or by the payment of compensation to the owner or the occupier or to both the owner and the occupier of that property, and may enter into an agreement with the owner for that purpose.

### PART V.—FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION.

5.1 Entry to Premises: The Council may by an authorised Officer enter at all reasonable times any building or land for the purpose of ascertaining whether the provisions of the Scheme are being observed.

5.2 Appeals: Any person aggrieved by a decision of the Council made under the discretionary powers conferred upon it by this Scheme may lodge an appeal against such decision in accordance with Part V of the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended).

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, 1960-1977.

The Municipality of the Shire of Williams.

Swimming Pool By-laws.

WL. 7-17.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned municipality hereby records having resolved on the 8th day of June, 1977, to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor, the following by-laws:—

1. In these by-laws unless the context otherwise requires the following terms shall have the meaning set against them hereunder respectively:—

“Council” means the Council of the Shire of Williams.

“Shire Clerk” means the Shire Clerk or Acting Shire Clerk of the Shire of Williams.

"Pool Manager" means the Manager or other person appointed for the time being by the Council to have control and management of the Pool Premises and such term shall include the Assistant Manager.

"Attendant" means an employee of the Council or a person authorised by Council performing any duties on or in connection with the Pool Premises.

"Spectator" means any person admitted to the Pool Premises for the sole purpose of viewing the swimming or other activities conducted therein.

"Swimming Coach" means any person licensed by the Council to enter the Pool Premises for the purpose of teaching swimming.

"Pool Premises" means the Williams Swimming Pool and includes all buildings, structures, fittings, fixtures, machinery, chattels, furniture and equipment forming part of such swimming pool or used in connection therewith.

2. The Pool Premises shall be open for use of the public during such hours and periods as the Council may from time to time by resolution appoint; the Council reserving to itself the right to refuse admission to any person at any time. No person under the age of six shall be permitted to enter or remain at the Pool Premises unless that person is and continues to be under the care and control of a person over the age of fourteen years. No person shall leave a person under the age of six years at the the Pool Premises otherwise than under the care and control of a person over the age of fourteen years.

3. The Pool Manager may temporarily suspend admittances or clear the Pool Premises or any part thereof of any person or persons if in his opinion such action is necessary or desirable.

4. Every person using the Pool Premises shall obey all reasonable directions of the Pool Manager with regard to such use.

5. It shall be the duty of the Pool Manager (who is hereby so empowered and directed) to refuse admission to or remove or cause to be removed from the Pool Premises any person who, in the opinion of the Pool Manager, is guilty of a breach of any of the provisions of these by-laws who, by his past or present conduct, is deemed undesirable and any such person shall, upon the request of the Pool Manager to withdraw from the Pool Premises quietly and peaceably do so as soon as possible.

6. Any person who has been refused admission to the Pool Premises or who feels aggrieved by the action of the Pool Manager may appeal to the Council by letter addressed to the Shire Clerk, against such action and the Council may give such direction in the matter as is thought fit provided that such right of appeal shall not imply any right of action for damages or other remedy against the Pool Manager or Council arising out of such refusal of admission.

7. No male above the age of four years shall trespass upon any part of the Pool Premises set apart for the exclusive use of females and no female shall trespass upon any part of the Pool Premises set apart for the exclusive use of males.

8. The Pool Manager may prohibit any person approaching or entering or remaining in a pool who in his opinion is dirty or unfit to use such pool and the Pool Manager may require such person to thoroughly cleanse and wash himself.

9. (a) No person, Club or Association or organisation shall conduct a carnival at the Pool Premises unless with the prior consent of the Council.

(b) The Council may grant such consent subject to such conditions it thinks fit and may at any time withdraw such consent.

(c) A person, Club, Association or organisation conducting any carnival held at the Pool Premises shall be responsible for the conduct of the competitors and spectators during the carnival and shall prevent overcrowding and ensure that no damage is done to buildings or fencing or any other portion of the Pool Premises and that these by-laws are observed by all competitors, officials and spectators attending the carnival.

10. (a) No person shall for profit teach, coach or train any other person in the pool unless with the prior written permission of the Council.

(b) The Council may grant such permission subject to such conditions as it thinks fit and may at any time withdraw such permission without being under any obligation to assign a reason for doing so and without being liable to pay compensation.

11. Any person who finds any article or money which has been left in the Pool Premises and not his property shall forthwith deliver it to the Pool Manager or an Attendant.

12. Neither the Council nor the Pool Manager or Attendant or Officer or Employee of the Council shall be in any way responsible for any article or money lost or stolen from any person whilst in the Pool Premises or for any article damaged or destroyed whilst in or about the Pool Premises.

13. Season tickets shall be offered for inspection to the attendant when used to obtain admission to the pool. Season tickets are not transferrable and such ticket may be used only by the person in whose name the same is issued. The attendant shall refuse admission to a person seeking the same and using such ticket if the attendant reasonably believes that the person so seeking admission is not the person to whom such ticket was issued.

## 14. No person shall—

- (a) not being an officer, attendant or employee of the Council in the course of his duties enter the Pool Premises without having first paid to the Pool Manager or an attendant the proper charge for admission.
- (b) obstruct the Pool Manager or an Attendant in carrying out his duties.
- (c) enter or depart from any part of the Pool Premises except by means of the respective entrances or exits set apart for that purpose.
- (d) enter or attempt to enter any bathroom or dressing enclosure that is already occupied without the consent of the occupier.
- (e) dress or undress or remove any part of his or her costume or bathing costume except in a dressing enclosure provided for the purpose.
- (f) Appear in public unless properly attired in a costume of such nature as to preserve decency and to cover the body so as to prevent indecent exposure of the person.
- (g) enter or be in the Pool Premises whilst in an intoxicated condition.
- (h) take into the Pool Premises or have in his possession therein any intoxicating liquor or drugs.
- (i) enter or remain in the Pool Premises if he or she is affected by or suffering from any infectious or offensive disease or skin complaint.
- (j) deposit any filth or rubbish in any part of the Pool Premises except in places set aside for the purpose.
- (k) eat in or take into any part of the pool premises other than areas set aside for the purpose any food, drinks or confectionery of any kind whatsoever.
- (l) smoke any tobacco or other substances in any portion of the Pool Premises where smoking is prohibited by Notices displayed therein.
- (m) damage or disfigure or write upon any part of the Pool Premises.
- (n) interfere with or improperly use any portion of the Pool Premises.
- (o) break, injure, damage or destroy any life saving equipment or any property of the Council.
- (p) behave in an unseemly, improper, disorderly or riotous manner or push or throw any person into the pool or run around the concourse or surrounds of the pool.
- (q) swear or use any indecent, obscene or abusive language on any part of the pool premises.
- (r) gamble on the Pool Premises.
- (s) climb upon any fence, wall, partition or roof of the Pool Premises.
- (t) waste or wastefully use water or leave any water tap dripping or running.
- (u) expectorate or commit a nuisance in any part of the Pool Premises.
- (v) annoy or interfere with any person in the Pool.
- (w) bring any animal into the pool premises or being the person in control of such animal permit such animal to remain in any part of the Pool Premises.
- (x) approach or enter any swimming pool until he or she has thoroughly cleansed and washed himself or herself.
- (y) use any soap in any part of the Pool Premises other than in the showerbaths or toilet facilities.
- (z) use any oil, detergent or any other substance or preparation whereby the water in the pool may be or become discoloured, contaminated or rendered turbid.
- (za) foul or pollute the water in the pool or shower.
- (zb) throw any sticks or stones or other objects in the pool or anywhere in the Pool Premises.
- (zc) soil or defile or damage any towel or bathing costume.

16. Any person committing a breach of or an offence against any of the provisions of these by-laws shall for every such breach or offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding one hundred dollars (\$100).
