Town of Narrogin under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon it in that behalf by the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended), hereby makes the following Town Planning Scheme.

Citation.

1. This Town Planning Scheme may be cited as Town of Narrogin Town Planning Scheme No. 6 Lock Street-Narrakine Road Area Scheme (hereinafter referred to as "the Scheme").

Responsible Authority.

2. The Authority responsible for enforcing the observance of the Scheme is the Town of Narrogin (hereinafter referred to as "the Council").

Maps.

3. The following maps are attached to the Text and form part of the Scheme:—

- Land Use Map.
- Scheme Map.

Scheme Area.

4. The Scheme shall apply to the land contained within the inner edge of a broken black line on the Land Use Map and on the Scheme Map. The said land is hereinafter referred to as "the Scheme Area".

General Objects.

5. The general objects of the Scheme are:—
- (a) To facilitate co-ordinate and encourage the progressive subdivision and development of land within the Scheme Area.
  - (b) To plan within the Scheme Area residential lots and suitable roads and footways.
  - (c) To make provision for land to be used for Public Open Space and to facilitate and provide for the acquisition of such land by the Council.
  - (d) To make provision for the drainage of the Scheme Area.
  - (e) To make provision for the land within the Scheme Area to be connected to a sewer.
  - (f) To make provision for the reticulation of water throughout the Scheme Area.
  - (g) To provide for the sharing of the costs of the Scheme among certain owners of land in the Scheme Area.

Method of Carrying Out Objects.

6. As and when owners of land within the Scheme Area subdivide or develop their land such subdivision or development shall be according to a plan which will be capable of forming part of an overall plan of subdivision for the Scheme Area.

7. The Scheme Map forms a basis for subdivision and development of the Scheme Area but the Council may with the consent of the Town Planning Board permit alterations or variations to that design where in the opinion of the Council circumstances justify such action provided that no such alteration or variation shall be permitted if in the opinion of the Council it would impede the subdivision and development of the Scheme Area as a whole.

Subdivision and Development.

8. An owner of land within the Scheme Area who desires to subdivide or develop his land either alone or in conjunction with other owners shall submit a plan of the proposed development to the Council and if the development involves subdivision he shall submit to the Town Planning Board a plan of subdivision in conformity with the Scheme Map with such modifications as shall be permitted by the Council as aforesaid.

Survey.

9. An owner who subdivides his land shall carry out the survey of the land in accordance with the plan of subdivision approved by the Town Planning Board.

New Roads and Footways.

10. Subject to the following clauses all new roads and footways within the Scheme Area shall be surveyed constructed paved and drained at the expense of the owners of the land in which the roads and footways are situated and each owner shall when subdividing his land make the land available for the roads and footways and pay the costs of the survey the construction paving and drainage of the roads and footways within the land owned by him.

11. In cases where the situation of a new road or footway within the Scheme Area is such that in the opinion of the Council it would be fair and equitable that the owners of land, other than the Council, served by or capable of being served by the road or footway should each contribute to the cost of the survey construction paving or drainage of that road or footway and apportion the value of the land made available for the roads and foot-

ways and such owners are unable to agree upon the proportion of the costs payable by each of them the amount (if any) payable by each such owner shall be determined by arbitration in manner hereinafter provided.

12. The Council may survey construct pave and drain any new roads and footways within the Scheme Area and acquire the land necessary for that purpose. If the Council shall do so prior to the subdivision of the lands adjoining such road or footway the costs of the survey construction paving and drainage of the said road or footway and all compensation and other costs consequent upon the acquisition of the land shall be paid to the Council by each respective owner of land in accordance with the foregoing provisions upon the final approval of the Town Planning Board to the subdivision of his land or after having been served with not less than three calendar months' notice from the Council calling upon him to make such payment whichever shall first happen.

13. If an owner shall subdivide his land and if he or his predecessors in title shall have claimed or shall have been paid compensation by reason of the resumption by the Council of the land for a new road or footway within the Scheme Area he shall before the final approval by the Town Planning Board to his plan of subdivision release the Council from the payment of compensation or repay to the Council the compensation paid by it to him or his predecessors in title as the case may be.

#### Public Open Space.

14. It is intended that the land shown as "Public Open Space" on the Scheme Map shall be reserved for Public Open Space and vested in the Crown as a reserve for recreation.

15. The Council may as and when it deems fit acquire the said lands shown as Public Open Space or any parts thereof either by purchase or resumption or partly by one method and partly by the other.

16. Each owner of land within the Scheme Area shall prior to the final approval by the Town Planning Board to the plan of subdivision of his land or any part thereof and subject as herein-after provided transfer to the Council an area of land equal to one-tenth of the total area of land being subdivided.

17. In the Scheme the expression "the total area of land being subdivided" means the whole of the area the subject of the subdivision including any part thereof that is or is to become a road or portion of a road.

18. Land to be transferred to the Council pursuant to Clause 16 shall not include any land which is or is intended to be a road or part of a road created by the subdivision or a drainage reserve.

19. If it is not possible for an owner to transfer an area of land exactly equal to one-tenth of the total area of land being subdivided he shall transfer to the Council land as near as possible an area equal to the said one-tenth of the total area of the land being subdivided and the Council shall pay to or receive from the owner a cash adjustment representing the value of the area of land by which the area transferred exceeds or is less than the said one-tenth or the Council may agree upon a cash payment in lieu of the transfer of any land.

20. If within an owner's land more than one-tenth is required by the Council for Public Open Space the owner shall upon the subdivision of his land or any part thereof transfer to the Council the land required by it for that purpose and the Council shall pay to the owner by way of compensation the value of the land exceeding the said one-tenth. If the Council and the owner so agree the Council may transfer to the said

owner other land in or near the Scheme Area either owned by the Council or acquired by it for that purpose to compensate him for the land in excess of the said one-tenth required by the Council in which case the amount payable by the Council to the Owner shall be reduced accordingly.

21. The Council may sell or otherwise dispose of any land transferred to it under the preceding clauses and not required by it for Public Open Space recreation or drainage purposes; provided that all moneys received by the Council in respect of such sales and under Clause 19 hereof shall after making all necessary payments to owners under the foregoing clauses and after payment to it of the cost of land (if any) acquired for transfer to owners under the preceding clause be expended by the Council in the acquisition or improvement of land for Public Open Space recreation or drainage purposes in or near the Scheme Area.

22. If the Council shall have resumed land for Public Open Space, roads, footways or recreation or drainage purposes it shall be reimbursed all compensation and costs from moneys received from the sale of land under the preceding clauses.

23. If the Council shall have resumed land for Public Open Space roads footways or recreation or drainage purposes the amount and value of the said one-tenth of an owner's land shall be assessed on the basis that such land had not been resumed.

24. For the purposes of the foregoing clauses the valuations shall be made on the basis that the whole of the owner's land is offered for sale taking into account that the subdivision can be approved but not on the basis of the total of the values of the individual lots in the subdivision.

25. If an owner of land shall subdivide his land and if he or his predecessors in title shall have claimed or shall have been paid compensation by reason of the resumption by the Council of land for Public Open Space within the Scheme Area the amount of compensation paid shall be taken into account in assessing the payments to or by an owner in accordance with the foregoing clauses and if no compensation has then been paid the owner shall release the Council from the payment of any such compensation.

#### Drainage.

26. The Council shall at the appropriate time or times carry out such drainage works as in its opinion are necessary for the proper drainage of the Scheme Area and may acquire land for that purpose and may set aside land for drainage sumps and compensating basins.

#### Water Supply and Sewerage.

27. Such water supply works and sewerage works as are in the opinion of the Council necessary for the connection of the lands in the Scheme Area to water mains and to a sewer shall at the appropriate time or times be carried out. The cost of the connection of each lot to water mains and to the sewer shall be paid by the owner of the lot.

#### Connection to the Sewer.

28. Subject to the next succeeding Clause no land shall be subdivided unless there is a sewer to which all new lots in the proposed subdivision may be connected and no building shall be occupied unless the building is connected to the sewer.

29. If the Council is of the opinion that the nature of the soil in any part of the Scheme Area is sufficiently absorptive to permit the efficient operation of an apparatus for the bacteriolytic treatment of sewage it may permit the subdivision or development of that area and the occupation of buildings thereon before the sewer is available. Permission to subdivide or develop pursuant to this clause does not unless otherwise deter-

mined by the Council absolve an owner from his liability to pay for the connection of his land to the sewer and his share of the cost or estimated cost of the sewerage works.

#### Scheme Costs.

30. The costs or estimated costs of the following items are hereinafter referred to as Scheme Costs:—

- (a) The administration costs of the Scheme including an amount to reimburse the Council for such overhead and supervision costs as may be incurred in the implementation of the Scheme. The term "administration costs" shall include all legal costs, planning costs, payments to planning consultants and other professional consultants and valuation costs.
- (b) The cost of surveys (if any) carried out by the Council in the Scheme Area.
- (c) The cost to the Council of any drainage works necessary for the proper drainage of the Scheme Area and the acquisition of lands for that purpose.
- (d) The cost (if any) to the Council of supplying water throughout the Scheme Area.
- (e) The cost (if any) to the Council of the sewerage works necessary for the connection of the land in the Scheme Area to a sewer and the acquisition of lands for that purpose.
- (f) One half of the cost of the survey construction paving and drainage of those new roads which adjoin public open space and one half of the value of the land on which such roads are situated.
- (g) The cost of the construction paving and drainage of so much of Sydney Hall Street as is within the Scheme Area and is shown on the Land Use Map.
- (h) The cost of the survey acquisition and construction of the footway from Dalglish Street to Sydney Hall Street.
- (i) All compensation payable and all costs and expenses of determining and settling compensation.
- (j) All other costs and expenses which the Council shall be required to meet in order to implement and complete the Scheme.

#### Payment of Scheme Costs.

31. The Scheme Costs shall be paid to the Council by the owners of land specified hereunder in the following proportions:—

32. Each owner shall prior to the final approval by the Town Planning Board to the subdivision of his land or after having been served with not less than three calendar months' notice from the Council whichever shall first happen pay to the Council his portion of Scheme Cost.

#### Estimate of Scheme Costs.

33. If any of the items of Scheme Costs have not been paid or ascertained at the time of the subdivision of a parcel of land or at the time of the giving of a notice by the Council as aforesaid the Council may estimate the cost of such items of Scheme Costs. An estimate may be revised from time to time.

#### Service of Notices.

34. Any notice to be served or given to an owner pursuant to the Scheme may be sufficiently served if sent to such owner by registered post in an envelope addressed to him at his address appearing in the Rate Book of the Council and a notice so sent shall be deemed to have been served on the day on which it would in the ordinary course of post reach the address to which it was sent.

#### Valuations.

35. Where it is necessary to ascertain the value of any land for the purpose of the Scheme the value shall be determined by either the Chief Valuer of the State Taxation Department or at the option of the Council by a disinterested and competent valuer appointed by the Council.

36. If an owner shall object to the value so determined he may give notice of such objection to the Council within twenty eight (28) days after having been informed of the said value or the revised value. If the valuer does not agree to change the value to a figure acceptable to the owner the value shall be determined by arbitration in accordance with the provisions hereinafter contained.

37. If a valuation made by the valuer shall be changed as the result of an objection the valuer may reconsider the values placed on other lands and make such revaluations as he considers just and equitable. The owners affected by such revaluation shall forthwith be notified of any change in values.

#### Arbitration.

38. Any dispute or difference in respect of any matter which by the terms of the Scheme may be determined by arbitration may be referred to the arbitration of a single arbitrator in manner provided by the Arbitration Act, 1895, or any statutory modification thereof for the time being in force and if the parties fail to agree upon any one single arbitrator he may be nominated by the President of the Law Society of Western Australia for the time being.

#### Powers and Authorities of Council.

39. In carrying out the provisions of the Scheme the Council shall have the following powers and authorities:

- (a) To enter and inspect any land within the Scheme Area.
- (b) To make agreements with the owners or occupiers of any land within the Scheme Area.

- (c) To enter into agreements with purchasers or prospective purchasers or prospective occupiers of land within the Scheme Area.
- (d) To enter into agreements with the Crown and any department of the State with reference to the carrying out of any of the objects or works of the Scheme.
- (e) If any owner of land within the Scheme Area does not proceed with the subdivision or development of his land in accordance with the Scheme or by reason of the nature of his land he is unable to subdivide or develop it and his failure to do so in the opinion of the Council will unduly delay the subdivision and development of the Scheme Area the Council may resume or purchase the land of such owner or any part or parts thereof and proceed with the subdivision and development of the said land in accordance with the provisions of the Scheme.
- (f) In the event of the Council exercising its powers under clause (e) it shall have the powers of an owner in the subdivision development and disposal of the said land; if land shall have been resumed and if the owner shall not have been paid compensation by reason of the resumption the Council before selling the land so subdivided and developed shall offer the new lots to the original owner upon his paying to the Council all costs and expenses consequent upon the resumption subdivision or development of the said land and upon his releasing the Council from all claims for compensation in respect of such resumption. The said offer shall be made in writing and if not accepted within one calendar month of the service thereof the Council may proceed with the sale of the subdivided lots. All moneys received by it from such sale shall be applied firstly in payment of all costs and expenses consequent upon such subdivision and secondly in payment of all compensation in respect of the resumption of the said land. The balance if any of such moneys may be retained by the Council and the Council shall make good any deficit.
- (g) If the offer mentioned in Clause (f) hereof be not accepted the Council may retain all or any part of the said land but if it does so it shall be responsible to pay such costs of subdivision of the said land and compensation for its resumption as are then unpaid.
- (h) To dispose of any lots to which it becomes entitled whether under Clause (e) hereof or otherwise upon such terms and conditions as it may think fit and without limiting the generality of the foregoing the Council may sell the lots singly or in groups and on the condition that buildings of a specified character with specified parking or other facilities shall within a limited period be constructed thereon or that the land and buildings be used for a specified purpose.
- (i) To extend the time within which payments are to be made to the Council and agree to the securing of such payments.
- (j) To transfer any land owned by it or acquired by it pursuant to the Scheme as compensation or part compensation and to enter into agreements relative to the determination and settling of compensation.
- (k) To acquire land for Public Open Space in the vicinity of the Scheme Area.

40. Twenty eight (28) days written notice is hereby prescribed as the notice to be given pursuant to Section 10 of the Act. Any expenses incurred by the Council under the said Section may be recovered from the person in default as a simple contract debt in such Court of Civil Jurisdiction as is competent to deal with the amount of the claim.

41. The Council may at any time exercise the powers conferred by Section 13 of the Act.

#### Agreements with Owners.

42. If the Council in anticipation of the Scheme or in order to encourage and facilitate development of land within the Scheme Area shall have entered into an agreement with an owner prior to the gazettal of the Scheme the rights and obligations of that owner under the Scheme shall in the case of conflict be deemed to have been modified by the terms of the agreement and the terms of the agreement shall prevail.

#### Claims for Compensation.

43. The time limited for the making of claims for compensation pursuant to Section 11 of the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended) is six months after the date when a notice of the approval of the Scheme is published in the manner prescribed by the Regulations made under the Act.

#### Buildings.

44. No person shall construct a building in the Scheme Area other than a garage or outbuilding unless:—

- (a) the materials used in the construction are brick stone or cement or other materials approved by the Council; and
- (b) the exterior design of the building is in harmony with other buildings in the immediate vicinity.

SHIRE OF NORTHAM—TOWN PLANNING  
SCHEME No. 1—(SPECIAL RURAL ZONES).

THE Northam Shire Council, under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon it in that behalf by the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended), hereby makes the following Town Planning Scheme for the purpose of—

- (a) zoning land for Rural small holdings;
- (b) enabling the development of Rural Small Holdings in a controlled, orderly manner with a minimum of detriment to the existing environment;
- (c) establishing certain criteria for the planning and development of such lands;
- (d) setting aside land for future Public use as Reserves;
- (e) other matters authorised by the enabling Act.

Arrangement of Scheme.

- PART I.—Preliminary.  
PART II.—Objectives of the Scheme.  
PART III.—Reserved Land.  
PART IV.—Policy Areas and Zones.  
PART V.—Non-Conforming Uses.  
PART VI.—General Provisions.

- (ii) Scheme Map.

PART I—PRELIMINARY.

1.1 Citation—This Town Planning Scheme may be cited as the Shire of Northam Town Planning Scheme No. 1 hereinafter called "the Scheme" and shall come into operation on publication of notice of the Minister's final approval thereof in the *Government Gazette*.

1.2 Scheme Area—The Scheme shall apply to the whole of the land within the broken black border shown on the Maps appended hereto. The Scheme shall consist of Policy Areas numbered 1 to 3 inclusive.

1.3 Responsible Authority—The Authority responsible for carrying out the Scheme is the Council of the Shire of Northam hereinafter referred to as "the Council".

1.4 Interpretations—In this Scheme the terms used will have the respective interpretations set out in Appendix "D" of the Town Planning Regulations 1967 unless otherwise specified by the Scheme and with the addition of the following.

Rural Uses means uses normally carried out in connection with agriculture, grazing or farming generally including residential use but not including piggeries, noxious uses or other uses considered by Council to be detrimental to the health or amenity of the area, but may with consent of Council include establishments for the breeding and sale of animals.

Building Envelope is an area of land within a lot defined on a plan of subdivision lodged with the Council, or by other means, related by measurement to the boundaries of the lot, and within which all buildings on the lot are to be contained.

Tree Preservation Area is an area of land within a lot defined either on plan of subdivision lodged with the Council under the provisions of this Scheme or by other description under the Scheme within which no indigenous tree or vegetation may be destroyed or removed except by the conditions laid down in the Scheme.

PART II—OBJECTIVES AND POLICIES.

2.1 Council's primary objective will be to ensure that development which takes place within the Scheme Area as a result of increased residential and recreation uses should occur with the least detrimental effect possible to the Shire's rural landscape, its social structure and its historic heritage.

2.2 Council's Policy in order to achieve its objectives will be to require that applications for development in the Scheme Area must show an adequate concern for the environment and show minimal detrimental intrusion into the landscape, the area's ecology, and the Shire's social structure.

PART III—RESERVED LAND.

3.1 (a) Land set aside under this Scheme for the purposes of a reservation is deemed to be reserved for the purposes indicated on the Scheme Map or for such other purpose as may from time to time be decided by the Authority in whom the Reserve is vested or is controlled.

(b) Except as otherwise provided in this Part a person shall not carry out any development on land reserved under this Scheme, other than the erection of a boundary fence, without first applying for and obtaining the written approval of the Council.

(c) In giving its approval the Council shall have regard to the ultimate purpose intended for the reserve and shall in the case of land reserved for the purposes of a public authority confer with that authority before giving its approval.

(d) No provision of this Part shall prevent the continued use of land for the use for which it was being lawfully used immediately prior to the Scheme having the force of law, or the repair and maintenance, for which the prior consent in writing of the Council has been obtained, of buildings or works lawfully existing on the land.

3.2 (a) Where a Council refuses approval for the development of land reserved under the Scheme on the ground that the land is reserved for public purposes, or grants approval subject to conditions that are unacceptable to the applicant the owner of the land may, if the land is injuriously affected thereby, claim compensation for such injurious affection.

(b) Claims for such compensation shall be lodged at the office of the Council not later than six months after the date of the decision of the Council refusing approval or granting it subject to conditions that are unacceptable to the applicant.

(c) In lieu of paying compensation the Council may purchase the land affected by such decision of the Council at a price not exceeding the value of the land at the time of refusal of approval or of the grant of approval subject to conditions that are unacceptable to the applicant.

## PART IV—POLICY AREAS AND ZONES.

4.1 (a) The Scheme consists of Policy Areas numbered 1 to 3 inclusive.

(b) The Policy Areas contain land within the Shire of Northam considered to be suitable to contain Special Rural Zones subject to the need to consider in detail matters of environmental protection within them.

(c) The Policy Areas contain—

Rural Zones within which no further subdivision will be permitted except under conditions normally applied by the Town Planning Board to rural land.

Reserves of various types as indicated on the Scheme Map.

Special Rural Zones within which applications for subdivision to small holdings will be considered subject to compliance with the requirements of the Scheme.

4.2 Within Land zoned as Special Rural Zone no use will be permitted except—

- (a) Residential—single family detached dwelling unit.
- (b) Rural uses.

4.3 Policy Area 1—Within a Special Rural Zone in Policy Area 1 the conditions of the following Sub Clauses will apply.

4.3.1 Subdivision and development must take into account and give adequate consideration to the planning criteria indicated in Schedule 1.

4.3.2 No building may be erected closer to the road frontage of a lot than—

- (a) from the frontage to roads shown on the Scheme Map as Major Roads—50 metres;
- (b) from the frontage to roads shown on the Scheme Map as Important Roads—30 metres;
- (c) from the frontage to other roads—20 metres.

4.3.3 No lot within the zone may be of lesser area than 2 hectares, except that in the area defined in the map in Schedule 1 hereto, the minimum area of a lot shall be 8 hectares.

4.4 Policy Area 2—Within a Special Rural Zone in Policy Area 2 the conditions of the following Sub Clauses will apply.

4.4.1 Subdivision and development must take into account and give adequate consideration to the planning criteria indicated in Schedule 1.

4.4.2 No building may be erected closer to the road frontage of a lot than—

- (a) from the frontage to roads shown on the Scheme Map as Important Roads—30 metres;
- (b) from other roads—20 metres.

4.4.3 No lot within the zone may be of lesser size than 2 hectares and within any one proposal for subdivision lots must average at least 4 hectares in area.

4.5 Policy Area 3—Within a Special Rural Zone in Policy Area 3 the conditions of the following Sub Clauses will apply.

4.5.1 Subdivision and development must take into account and give adequate consideration to the planning criteria indicated in Schedule 1.

4.5.2 No building may be erected closer to the road frontage of a lot than—

- (a) from the frontage to roads shown on the Scheme Map as Important Road—30 metres;
- (b) from the frontage to other roads—20 metres.

4.5.3 No lot within the zone may be of lesser size than 2 hectares and within any one proposal for subdivision lots must average at least 4 hectares in area.

## PART V—NON-CONFORMING USE OF LAND.

5.1 No provision of the Scheme shall prevent—

- (a) the continued use of any land or buildings for the purpose for which it was being lawfully used at the time of the coming into force of the Scheme; or
- (b) the carrying out of any development thereon for which, immediately prior to that time, a permit or permits required under the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended), and any other law authorising the development to be carried out have been duly obtained and was current.

5.2 (a) Where in respect of land reserved under Part III of the Scheme a non-conforming use exists or was authorised as mentioned in clause 5.1 of this Part on that land all or any erections alterations or extensions of the buildings thereon or use thereof shall not be carried out unless the approval of the Council has been obtained in writing.

(b) Where in respect of land zoned under Part IV of the Scheme a non-conforming use exists or was authorised as mentioned in clause 5 of this Part on that land, and provided the prior consent in writing of the Council has been obtained, buildings may be extended to the limits prescribed by the Uniform Building By-Laws made under the Local Government Act, 1960 (as amended), or by any other by-laws made under that Act for the purpose of limiting the size, location and distance from boundaries and any other matters required by law for that class of use within the boundary of the lot or lots on which the use was carried on immediately prior to the coming into force of the Scheme.

5.3 Change of Non-Conforming Use—The Council may permit the use of any land to be changed from one non-conforming use to another non-conforming use, provided the proposed use is, in the opinion of the Council, less detrimental to the amenity of the neighbourhood than the existing use, or is in the opinion of the Council closer to the intended uses of the zone.

5.4 Discontinuance of non-Conforming Use—(a) notwithstanding the preceding provision of this Part, except where a change of non-conforming use has been permitted by the Council under Clause 5.3 when a non-conforming use of any land or building has been discontinued, such land or building shall not thereafter be used other than in conformity with the provisions of the Scheme.

(b) The Council may effect the discontinuance of a non-conforming use by the purchase of the affected property, or by the payment of compensation to the owner or the occupier or to both the owner and the occupier of that property, and may enter into an agreement with the owner for that purpose.

## PART VI—GENERAL CONDITIONS.

6.1 Approval of Development Applications.

6.1.1 It will be the responsibility of the applicant for subdivision to analyse in detail the area proposed for subdivision and its potential for development taking into account the criteria laid down by this Scheme generally and in particular the requirement of Schedule 1 to this Scheme.

6.1.2 A proposal for subdivision must be prepared so that it will achieve the objectives of the Scheme in protection of the environment and in this regard must conform to the requirements of Schedule 2 of this Scheme. The proposal must also clearly illustrate how these requirements will be met and the objectives achieved.

6.1.3 Not more than one private dwelling house will be permitted to be erected on a lot within an area zoned Special Rural under this Scheme. Except that by specific consent of Council more

than one private dwelling house may be erected on a lot where Council is satisfied that the use proposed for the lot justifies such additional dwelling houses.

6.1.4 An owner of land within the Special Rural Zone who desires to subdivide or develop land shall submit a plan of the proposed development to the Council and if development involves subdivision he shall also submit an application for approval to that subdivision to the Town Planning Board as required by the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended) and in accordance with all the provisions of this Scheme.

6.1.5 Prior to final approval to a plan of subdivision, Council will require the applicant to lodge with the Council a copy of the plan of subdivision on which is shown the building envelopes and tree preservation areas proposed and agreed to by Council.

6.1.6 Upon lodging of the plan referred to in 6.1.5 Council will adopt such plan as part of this Scheme in order to implement controls over the area which is the subject of the plan.

6.1.7 Notwithstanding the provisions of this Scheme and what may be shown on a plan of subdivision submitted in accordance with clause 6.1.5 the Town Planning Board may after consultation with the Council approve a minor variation to a subdivisional design but further breakdown of lots so created shall be deemed to be contrary to the provisions of the Scheme.

6.1.8 Council's Approval Necessary—In addition to a building licence, Council's prior approval to commence development is required for all development including a private dwelling house.

6.1.9 Council's Approval—The Council may grant its approval with or without conditions or may refuse to grant its approval to commence development.

6.1.10 If the Council shall have granted its approval to commence development subject to conditions and any of the conditions shall not be fulfilled or complied with the Council may revoke its approval.

6.1.11 Development approval shall be valid for a period of two years from the time of approval. Failure to reapply to the Council for development approval within the specified time will result in lapse of approval.

6.1.12 If the Council shall not within sixty days of the receipt by it of an application to commence development have conveyed its decision to the applicant the application shall be deemed to have been refused.

6.1.13 If a person shall have applied for approval to commence development and the Council shall have refused or be deemed to have refused such approval or granted it subject to conditions unacceptable to the applicant he may appeal to the Minister for Urban Development and Town Planning.

6.1.14 Conditions to be Complied with—Where conditional approval to the carrying out of development is given under Part VI of this Scheme no person shall commence, carry out, or complete that development otherwise than in accordance with the condition or conditions upon which the approval is given or continue to carry out such development after the expiry of any period limited by such a condition for the completion of the development or fail to remove any structure or building erected pursuant to the approval if so required by such a condition.

6.1.15 Enforcement of Provisions—(a) If any person contravenes or fails or neglects to comply with the condition of any approval granted by the Council pursuant to this Scheme or with any other of the provisions of this Scheme the Council may, by notice in the manner set out in Clause 6.1.16 hereof, order such person to discontinue forthwith any such contravention and within thirty (30)

clear days after the service of such notice to remove, pull down, take up, alter or otherwise make good any work which contravenes the Scheme, or carry into effect any provisions of the Scheme which are not being complied with and at the same time it may pursuant to subsection 1 of section 10 of the Act advise such person that in the event of him failing to comply with the provisions thereof in the time limited for compliance then the Council by its agents will enter such person's property and cause to be done such works and things as shall be specified in such notice.

(b) Any expense incurred by the Council in doing any works pursuant to any default under paragraph (a) hereof may be recovered from the person in default by action for a civil debt recoverable summarily in any court having jurisdiction in respect of the amount involved.

6.1.16 Notices—Any notice under Clause 6.1.15 hereof—

- (a) shall be addressed on the owner, occupier or lessee of the land in question;
- (b) shall describe in general terms the manner in which the Scheme has been contravened; and
- (c) shall require the owner, occupier or lessee as the case may be, within 30 clear days after the service of such notice, to discontinue such contravention of the Scheme and take such action as the Council may direct to cause a compliance with the provisions of the Scheme; and
- (d) shall where necessary advise the persons to whom it is addressed that in default of his compliance with such notice the Council will enter such land and carry out the requirements of such notice itself at the expense of such person; and
- (e) any notice required to be given hereunder may be served personally or by prepaid letter addressed to the person to be served at his address as shown in the rate book of the Council if he shall be a rate payer or at last known address (whether a rate-payer or not) and such notice shall be deemed to be served in due course of post.

## 6.2 Tree Preservation.

6.2.1 Land adjoining roads shown on the Scheme Map as Major Roads and Important Roads is by the Scheme designated, and where applicable will be shown on the Maps lodged with the Council under Clause 6.1.5 as Tree Preservation Area to a depth of—

- (a) Major Roads—50 metres from road boundaries.
- (b) Important Roads—20 metres from road boundaries.

6.2.2 Within land designated as Tree Preservation Area no indigenous tree or scrub or other substantial vegetation may be felled or removed except as hereunder—

- (a) trees which are dead, diseased or are dangerous;
- (b) for the purpose of a firebreak required by a regulation or by-law;
- (c) under the conditions of Clause 6.2.3.

6.2.3 Any person wishing to fell or remove indigenous trees, shrubs or substantial vegetation within a Tree Preservation area except under the exemptions provided in Clause 6.2.2 will be required to obtain the consent of Council and if approval is granted, will be required to establish a tree of a type approved by Council for each tree so felled or removed.

6.2.4 Elsewhere within the Scheme Area no trees or indigenous vegetation shall be removed without consent of Council who in considering approval to clearing of trees or vegetation will consider the purpose to which the land is to be put and the possible effects on the areas amenity and soil stability.

### 6.3 Building Envelopes.

6.3.1 Any building on a lot in a Special Rural Zone must be erected within the Building Envelope defined on plan lodged with the Council under the provisions of this Scheme.

6.3.2 Notwithstanding the provision of Clause 6.3.1 Council may permit the erection of buildings on a lot in areas other than those contained within the Building Envelope if it is shown to the satisfaction of Council at the time of application for a building permit that the proposed location will be less detrimental to the preservation of the landscape or to the environment than if it were sited within the Building Envelope.

### 6.4 Occupation of Buildings.

6.4.1 No building on a lot within a zone may be occupied as a residence unless such building has been approved by Council as a residence in conformity with its by-laws currently in force or any variation there from approved by Council.

6.4.2 Notwithstanding the provision of Clause 6.4.1 the Council may permit temporary occupation of a building which does not conform to its building by-laws under such conditions as it thinks fit provided that the Council has at the same time approved plans for construction of a residence on the lot.

6.4.3 All buildings within the zone intended for residence except those occupied on a temporary basis under the provisions of Clause 6.4.2 must provide for the catchment and storage in suitable tanks of at least 94 000 litres of water unless it can be shown to the satisfaction of Council that the residence can be connected to and supplied with water from an existing piped supply.

### 6.5 Amenity.

6.5.1 Notwithstanding that a building or work may conform in all respects to the provisions of this Section the Council may refuse to issue a building permit or may require alterations to a proposed building if it considers that the proposed building or work would be likely to seriously affect the amenity or the visual appearance of the area. In this respect buildings or works within the areas shown as Important Landscape Element on the Maps in the Schedule hereto will be of special importance.

6.5.2 No person shall display or permit to be displayed a sign hoarding or billboard other than one in compliance with the Shire of Northam By-Laws relating to signs, hoardings, and billposting as amended.

### 6.6 Control of Bush Fires.

6.6.1 Proposals for development or subdivision within the Scheme must contain—

- (a) an analysis of the bush fire vulnerability of the lands within the subdivision arising for either the proposal itself or from areas within the vicinity;
- (b) the measures proposed within the subdivision to control bush fires such measures including but not necessarily limited to the provision and location of strategic fire breaks and the methods of treating open space areas where there may be appropriate treatment form effective fire management control.

## PART VII—FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION.

7.1 Disposal of Land—The Council may deal with or dispose of any land which it owns or which it has acquired pursuant to the provisions of the Scheme, in accordance with the Act and in conformity with the provisions of the Scheme and for such purpose may make such agreements with other owners as it deems fit.

7.2 Compensation—Claims for compensation by reason of the Scheme other than for the purpose of Part II shall be made not later than six months from the date on which notice of approval of the Scheme is published in the *Government Gazette*, except in the case of reserved land where the provisions of Part II shall apply.

7.3 Entry to Premises—The Council may by an authorised officer enter at all reasonable times any building or land for the purpose of ascertaining whether the provisions of the Scheme are being observed.

7.4 Penalties—Any person who fails to comply with any of the provisions of the Scheme is guilty of an offence and without prejudice to any other remedy given herein is liable to such penalties as are prescribed by the Act.

7.5 Appeals—Any person grieved by a decision of the Council under the terms of this Scheme may appeal to the Minister for Town Planning or to a Town Planning Court in accordance with Part V of the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended) and the Appeals Regulations made under that Act.

### 7.6 Development stages.

7.6.1 Within each Policy Area development under the conditions of this Scheme will be permitted only on land zoned Special Rural.

7.6.2 Within each of the Special Rural zones development will be permitted in stages of approximately 25 lots or 100 hectares whichever is the greater, and the first stages of development permitted will be referred to as Stage 1.

7.6.3 In considering permission to develop further stages of development or further zoning to Special Rural within the Policy Areas, Council will take into account the amount and standard of development carried out in preceding zones and if such development is considered to be satisfactory in meeting Council's objectives for Rural Homesites, Council may initiate further zoning.

7.6.4 Notwithstanding any limitations on development imposed by Clauses 7.6.1 and 7.6.3 Council may permit further development if it considers a proposal either—

- (a) introduces by its design, development or management proposals any feature which appears to offer some innovation in administrative procedure or environmental management;
- (b) proposes to protect or conserve some feature of natural historic or scientific value which Council considers may not be so protected or conserved unless the proposed development is permitted.

### 7.7 Provisions for subdivision applications.

7.7.1 Following receipt of an application for subdivision within the Special Rural Zones the Council will—

- (a) consider whether the provisions of Section 7.6 which refers to staging of subdivision should apply;
- (b) consider whether the development factors of Schedule 1 have been satisfactorily dealt with;
- (c) consider whether the requirements of Schedule 2 have been adequately covered in the submission;
- (d) if it considers desirable refer the application or so much of it as is considered necessary to adjoining landowners who may be affected by the proposal;
- (e) if it considers desirable refer the application to any Local Group or Society or Statutory Authority who may in the opinion of Council be competent by reason of specialised knowledge to offer advice or comment;

7.7.2 Upon determination of any of the matters or receipt of any advice or comment referred to in the preceding clauses Council may require the subdivision or submission to be amended or may recommend that conditions of approval be applied.

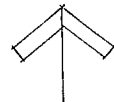

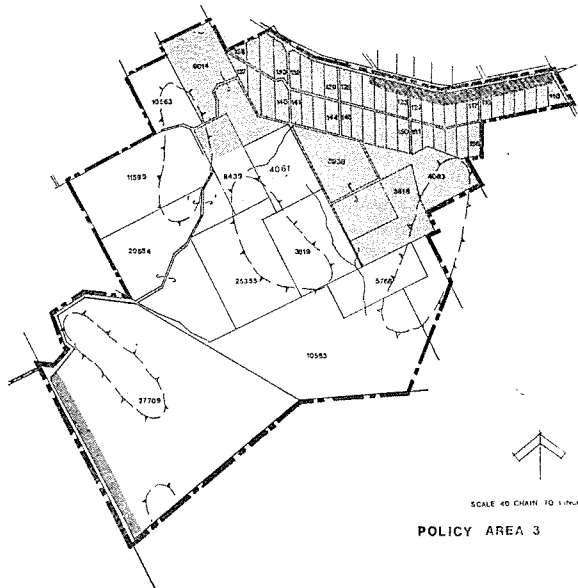

### Schedule 2.

Submission Requirements—Applications for subdivision and development must consist of the following, or any variations therefrom which in the opinion of the Council are reasonably satisfactory.

(i) Base Plan showing—

- (a) contours of the land at intervals not exceeding 5 metres;
- (b) location, type and approximate density of trees and other significant vegetation;
- (c) creeks, watercourses, significant drainage lines and major rock outcrops (if any);
- (d) buildings, fences and other improvements.

(ii) Submissions must identify and show how the following have been dealt with or taken into account in the subdivision—

- (a) present use of the land (e.g. crop, improved pasture);
- (b) skylines and landscape faces which are important in retention of the rural character or the environmental amenity of the area;
- (c) adjoining reserves, special treatment of areas adjacent to them and access thereto;

(d) method of providing access to adjoining lands within the zone.

(iii) Submissions must identify and show on the subdivisional proposal or on supplementary plans or documents—

- (a) areas intended for tree preservation including road frontage areas and other timbered areas of environmental significance;
- (b) the location, nature and existing degree of preservation of any building of historic or architectural significance, any aboriginal site, any area of botanical or scientific interest, and any unique wild life habitats, together with the means by which such features if any are to be treated or disposed of;
- (c) any other unique features or qualities of the subdivisional proposal;
- (d) the means of treating any areas of specific problems (e.g. areas of actual or potential erosion);
- (e) the means by which the scenic quality of the landscape are to be preserved and/or enhanced.

(iv) Submissions must supply the following information—

- (a) The method proposed to ensure that each lot can obtain adequate and satisfactory supply of water, together with proof that the nominated supply is of sufficient volume and quality.
- (b) Demonstrate, if applicable, that the obtaining of water will not affect the supply to nearby agricultural, forest and ecological areas.
- (c) Indicate the proposed means of disposal of liquid wastes from each lot, and demonstrate that such disposal method will not affect other lands either adjoining lots within the subdivision or lands external to the subdivision nor will cause pollution of any natural watercourse.
- (d) Assessment of the natural drainage conditions of the land and the means of overcoming any drainage problems either existing or caused by the proposed development.
- (e) The method of road construction proposed including any specific areas such as watercourse crossing and excessive grades.
- (f) The methods proposed to implement satisfactory bush fire control.

- (3) The Council shall permit a single occupancy dwelling only to be erected on each lot within the zone, together with such outbuildings that would reasonably be associated with a residential or agricultural use.
- (4) No building shall be erected or placed on any lot without the owner making application to and gaining the approval of, Council.
- (5) No dwelling house or outbuilding shall be constructed within fifteen metres of the front boundary except where it can be established to the satisfaction of Council due to the topography, the shape of the lot or the existing vegetation, this requirement is unreasonable or undesirable, Council may at its discretion vary the requirement, provided such variation does not fall below a minimum setback of 7.5 metres.
- (6) No building shall be constructed in such a manner or of such materials that it in the opinion of the Council destroys the local amenity.
- (7) So far as is practicable the rural character of the area shall be maintained and native trees shall be retained.

- (8) The Council may by notice served upon individual lot owners or a subdivider of land within the zone, require the preservation of specified trees or groups of trees and thereafter no lot owner or subdivider shall cut, remove or otherwise destroy any tree or trees so specified unless the Council rescinds the notice of the order.
- (9) No person shall display or permit to be displayed a sign, hoarding or billboard other than one not exceeding 0.2 m<sup>2</sup> in area advertising the activity conducted on the site.
- (10) Where lots below 8 000 m<sup>2</sup> in area to be used for the keeping of a horse or horses then that use shall be limited to the keeping of horses for the personal use and enjoyment of the lot owner.
- (11) Pig farming, commercial poultry farming and feed lot farming shall not be permitted.

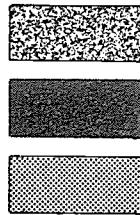
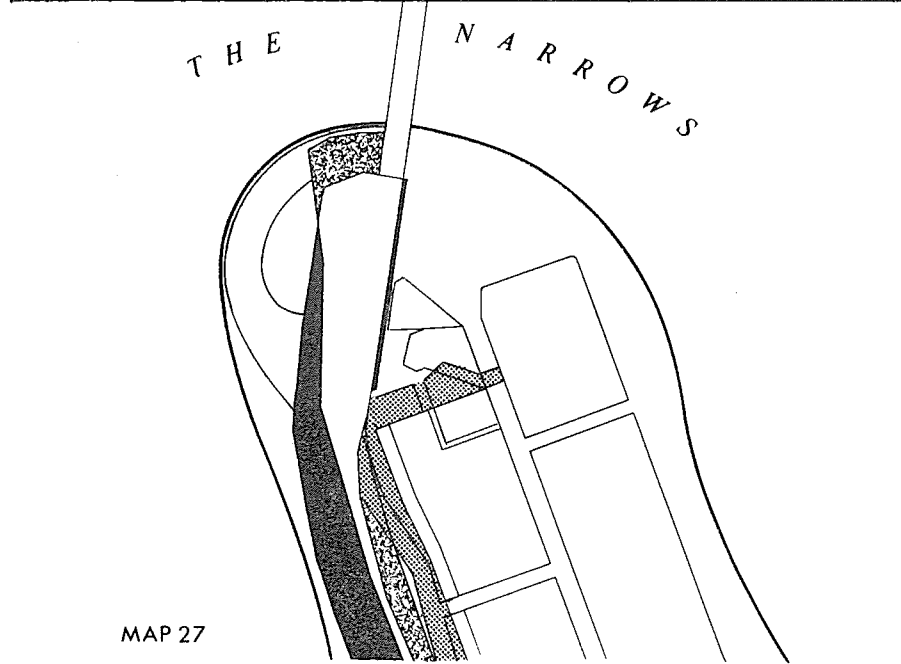
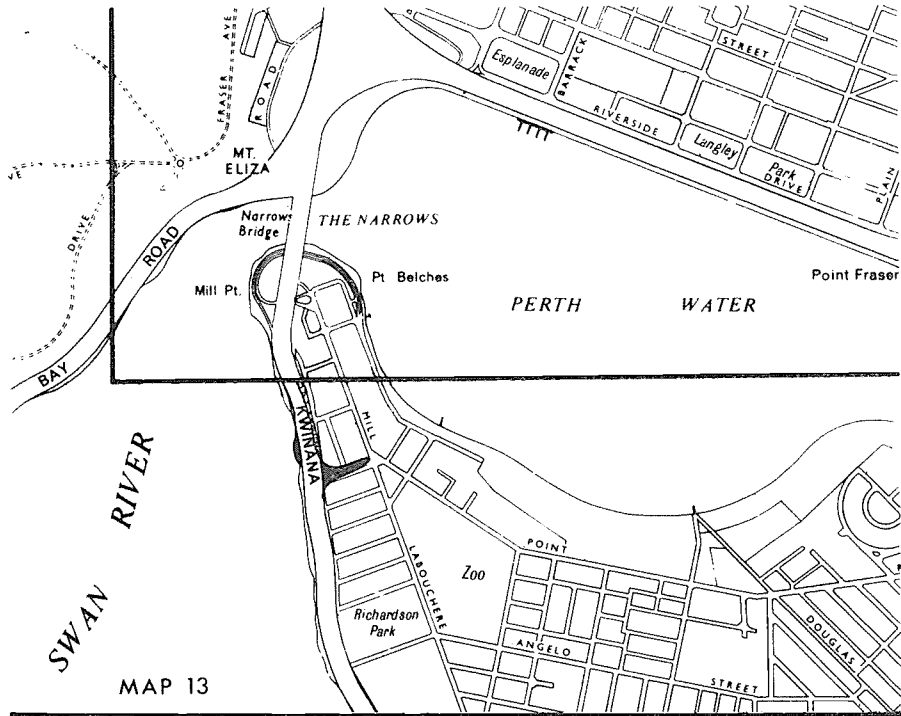

In these regulations the Education Act Regulations, 1960 as reprinted pursuant to the Reprinting of Regulations Act, 1954 and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 19th March, 1971 and thereafter amended from time to time by notices so published are referred to as the principal regulations.
- Reg. 13 amended. 2. Paragraph (c) of subregulation (2) of regulation 13 of the principal regulations is amended by substituting for the passage "2 (two)" in line six, the passage "2.5".
- Reg. 57D amended. 3. Regulation 57D of the principal regulations is amended by substituting for subregulation (2) the following subregulation—  
(2) The prescribed purposes in relation to which an interest subsidy may be paid are—  
(a) the construction of residential accommodation at an efficient school for scholars attending that school;  
(b) the construction of classroom accommodation at an efficient school for scholars attending that school;  
(c) the supplying of accommodation for teachers at efficient schools north of the 26th parallel;  
(d) the purchase of school sites.
- Reg. 57E added. 4. The principal regulations are amended by adding after regulation 57D the following regulation—  
57E. (1) This regulation applies, pursuant to section 27C of the Act, to the paying of grants to pre-school centres in relation to the number of children enrolled.  
(2) Where a pre-school centre wishes to apply for grants under this regulation, the application shall be made by the teacher in charge of the centre at such time and in such form as the Minister, from time to time, determines.  
(3) (a) As soon as practicable after 1st January in each year, the Minister shall assess the average cost in a Government school of a pre-primary pupil by dividing the estimated expenditures for pre-primary courses in Government schools during the current financial year by the actual enrolment in those courses in Government schools on the 1st August of the immediately preceding year.  
(b) As soon as practicable after the average cost has been ascertained in accordance with paragraph (a) of this subregulation, the Minister shall, subject to subregulation (5) of this regulation, pay twelve and one half percentum of that average cost to each pre-school centre which has applied for the grants in accordance with subregulation (2) of this regulation, for each child enrolled at the centre on the last Friday in February of the current year.  
(4) (a) As soon as practicable after 1st August in each year, the Minister shall assess the average cost in a Government school of a pre-primary pupil by dividing the actual expenditures for pre-primary courses in Government schools during the immediately preceding financial year by the actual enrolments in those courses in Government schools on the 1st August of the current year.  
(b) As soon as practicable after the average cost has been ascertained in accordance with paragraph (a) of this subregulation the Minister shall, subject to subregulation (5) of this regulation, pay twelve and one half percentum of that average cost to each pre-school centre which has applied for the grants in accordance with subregulation (2) of this regulation, for each child enrolled at the centre on the 1st August of the current year.  
(5) Grants payable under subregulations (3) and (4) of this regulation may be made by monetary payment or by way of goods and services supplied to, or paid for by the Minister in relation to, a child at the centre.  
(6) Grants are payable under this regulation only in respect of a child—  
(a) who is a pupil at the pre-school centre which applies for the grant;  
(b) who attains the age of five years during the year in which the grant is paid; and

(c) one of whose parents is a permanent resident of Western Australia.

(7) (a) As soon as practicable after the coming into operation of the Education Act Amendment Act, 1977 the Minister shall pay a grant of \$110 to pre-school centres in respect of each child enrolled at a centre on 1st August, 1977.

(b) The provisions of subsections (2), (5) and (6) of this regulation apply to grants made in accordance with paragraph (a) of this subregulation.
