SHIRE OF GOOMALLING
TOWN PLANNING SCHEME No. 2.

THE Goomalling Shire Council, under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon it in that behalf by the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended) hereby makes the following Town Planning Scheme for the purpose of—

- (a) setting aside land for future public use as reserves;
- (b) controlling land development;
- (c) other matters authorised by the enabling Act.

PART I.—PRELIMINARY.

1.1 Citation: This Town Planning Scheme may be cited as the Shire of Goomalling Town Planning Scheme No. 2 hereinafter called "the Scheme" and shall come into operation on the publication of notice of the Minister's final approval thereof in the *Government Gazette*.

1.2 Scheme Area: The Scheme shall apply to the whole of the land within the broken black border shown on the maps appended hereto.

1.3 Revocation of Town Planning Scheme: The Shire of Goomalling Town Planning Scheme No. 1 which was published in the *Government Gazette* on the twenty third day of August 1968 and subsequently from time to time amended is hereby revoked.

1.4 Responsible Authority: The Responsible Authority for carrying out the Scheme is the Council of the Shire of Goomalling hereinafter referred to as "the Council".

1.5 Arrangement of Scheme:

The Scheme Text is divided into the following parts:—

- Part I.—Preliminary.
- Part II.—Reserved Land.
- Part III.—Zones.
- Part IV.—Non-Conforming Uses.
- Part V.—General Provisions.
- Part VI.—Finance and Administration.

The remaining documents of the Scheme are as follows:—

- (1) Land Use Map.
- (2) Scheme Map.

1.6 Interpretation: In this Scheme the terms used will have the respective interpretations set out in Appendix "D" of the Town Planning Regulations, 1967 unless otherwise specified by this Scheme.

"generating works" means land and buildings used for the production of electric power.

"truck and machinery sales premises" means land and buildings used for the display and sale of trucks and machinery, including agricultural machinery, whether new or second hand, but does not include a workshop.

PART II.—RESERVED LAND.

2.1 (a) Land set aside under this Scheme for the purposes of a reservation is deemed to be reserved for the purposes indicated on the Scheme Map.

(b) Except as otherwise provided in this Part a person shall not carry out any development on land reserved under this Scheme, other than the erection of a boundary fence, without first applying for and obtaining the written approval of the Council.

(c) In giving its approval the Council shall have regard to the ultimate purpose intended for the reserve and shall in the case of land reserved for the purposes of a public authority confer with that authority before giving its approval.

(d) No provision of this Part shall prevent the continued use of land for the use for which it was being lawfully used immediately prior to the Scheme having the force of law, or the repair and maintenance, for which the prior consent in writing of the Council has been obtained, of buildings or works lawfully existing on the land.

2.2 (a) Where a Council refuses approval for the development of land reserved under the Scheme on the ground that the land is reserved for public purposes, or grants approval subject to conditions that are unacceptable to the applicant, the owner of the land may, if the land is injuriously affected thereby, claim compensation for such injurious affection.

(b) Claims for such compensation shall be lodged at the office of the Council not later than six months after the date of the decision of the Council refusing approval or granting it subject to conditions that are unacceptable to the applicant.

(c) In lieu of paying compensation the Council may purchase the land affected by such decision of the Council at a price not exceeding the value of the land at the time of refusal of approval or of the grant of approval subject to conditions that are unacceptable to the applicant.

PART III.—ZONES.

3.1 The Scheme Area is divided into fourteen types of zones set out hereunder:

- Residential.
- Business.
- Hotel.
- Motel.
- Light Industry.
- General Industry.
- Fuel Depot.
- Service Station.
- Civic and Cultural.
- Church and Institutional.
- Place of Public Assembly.
- Caravan Park and Camping.
- Rural.
- Special Sites.

3.2 Table No. 1 appended to Clause 3.5 of this Part indicates the several uses permitted by this Scheme in the various zones, such uses being determined by cross-reference between the list of "Use Classes" on the left hand side of the Table and the list of "Zones" on the top of that Table.

3.3 Where a zone is restricted to one use only it has been excluded from the Table and its permitted use may be determined from the Scheme Map.

3.4 The symbols used in the cross-reference in Table No. 1 appended to Clause 3.5 have the following meanings:

- "P"—A use that is permitted under this Scheme.
- "AA"—A use that is not permitted unless approval is granted by the Council.
- "IP"—A use that is not permitted unless such use is incidental to the predominant use as decided and approved by the Council.
- "X"—A use that is not permitted.

3.5 (a) The Council shall advertise its intention to consider granting approval for uses marked "AA" in Table No. 1 at least once in a newspaper circulating in the Shire of Goomalling.

(b) The notice shall state that objections and comments may be lodged with the Council before a specified date, being not less than fourteen days from the publication of the notice.

(c) After the date stated in the notice, the Council shall consider the application, together with any objections and comments received and shall resolve to refuse the application or grant approval with or without conditions.

PART IV.—NON-CONFORMING USE
OF LAND.

4.1 No provision of this Scheme shall prevent—

- (a) the continued use of any land or building for the purpose for which it was being lawfully used at the time of the coming into force of the Scheme; or
- (b) the carrying out of any development thereon for which, immediately prior to that time, a permit or permits required under the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended), and any other law authorising the development to be carried out have been duly obtained and was current.

4.2 (a) Where in respect of land reserved under Part II of the Scheme a non-conforming use exists or was authorised as mentioned in Clause 4.1 of this Part on that land all or any erections, alterations or extensions of the buildings thereon or use thereof shall not be carried out unless the approval of the Council has been obtained in writing.

(b) Where in respect of land zoned under Part III of the Scheme a non-conforming use exists or was authorised as mentioned in Clause 4.1 of this Part on the land such land may continue to be used for that purpose so long as any buildings or works comprised thereon at such approval date is not, except with the consent of the Council, enlarged, rebuilt or extended. Such consent may be refused if in the opinion of the Council the use thereon as enlarged, rebuilt or extended is likely to cause injury or to prejudicially affect the amenity of the neighbourhood or to increase any existing injury to or prejudicial affection of the neighbourhood.

4.3 Change of Non-conforming Use: The Council may permit the use of any land to be changed from one non-conforming use to another non-conforming use, provided the proposed use is, in the opinion of the Council, less detrimental to the amenity of the neighbourhood than the existing use, or is, in the opinion of the Council closer to the intended uses of the zone.

4.4 Discontinuance of Non-conforming Use:

- (a) Notwithstanding the preceding provisions of this Part, except where a change of non-conforming use has been permitted by the Council under Clause 4.3, when a non-conforming use of any land or building has been discontinued, such land or building shall not thereafter be used other than in conformity with the provisions of the Scheme.
- (b) The Council may effect the discontinuance of a non-conforming use by the purchase of the affected property, or by the payment of compensation to the owner or the occupier or to both the owner and the occupier of that property, and may enter into an agreement with the owner for that purpose.

PART V.—GENERAL PROVISIONS.

5.1 Building Line:

5.1.1 General: No building shall be constructed closer to the road or street alignment or alignments of the lot on which it stands than the distances prescribed hereunder:—

Church and Institutional	9.0

5.1.2 Special Sites: In the Special Sites Zone, the Council may, at its discretion, reduce the distance prescribed in Clause 5.1.1 below fifteen (15) metres.

5.1.3 Corner Lots: Where a lot is situated at the corner of two or more roads then the distances prescribed in Clause 5.1.1 may, at the discretion of the Council be reduced below the distance hereinbefore set out.

5.2 Light Industrial and General Industrial Zones:

- (a) No person shall stock or place any fuel or raw materials or products or by-products of manufacture in a Light Industrial Zone or a General Industrial Zone, nearer to a road or street alignment than the building line.
- (b) No person shall in a Light Industry Zone or a General Industry Zone, use the land between the building line and the road or street for any purpose other than as a means of access, for parking of vehicles, for loading or unloading of vehicles, or for lawns, gardens or trade display.

5.3 Keeping of Livestock:

- (a) Within the Scheme Area, livestock stocking rates on land zoned "Rural" shall not be above the normally accepted district stocking rates, and in no circumstances shall be above 37 sheep to the hectare (15 sheep to the acre) and 10 cattle to the hectare (4 cattle to the acre).
- (b) No person shall keep any entire horses, mares, geldings, fillies, colts, foals, bulls, oxen, steers, heifers, calves, asses, mules or camels in any area of the townsite other than an area zoned for that purpose or as "Rural".

PART VI.—FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION.

6.1 Disposal of Land: The Council may deal with or dispose of any land which it owns or which it has acquired pursuant to the provisions of the Scheme, in accordance with the Act and in conformity with the provisions of the Scheme, and for such purpose may make such agreements with other owners as it deems fit.

6.2 Compensation: Claims for compensation by reason of the Scheme other than for the purpose of Part II shall be made not later than six months from the date on which notice of approval of the Scheme is published in the *Government Gazette*, except in the case of reserved land where the provisions of Part II shall apply.

6.3 Entry to Premises: The Council may by an authorised officer enter at all reasonable times any building or land for the purpose of ascertaining whether the provisions of the Scheme are being observed.

6.4 Penalties: Any person who fails to comply with any of the provisions of the Scheme is guilty of an offence and without prejudice to any other remedy given herein is liable to such penalties as are prescribed by the Act.

6.5 Appeal Rights: Any person grieved by a decision of the Council given under the terms of this Scheme may appeal to the Minister for Town Planning or to a Town Planning Court in accordance with Part V of the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended) and the Appeals Regulations made under that Act.

6.6 Enforcement of Provisions:

- (a) If any person contravenes or fails or neglects to comply with the condition of any approval granted by the Council pursuant to this Scheme or with any other of the provisions of this Scheme the Council may, by notice in the manner set out in Clause 6.7 hereof, order such person to discontinue forthwith any such contravention and within thirty (30) clear days after the service of such notice to remove, pull down, take up, alter or otherwise make good any work which contravenes the Scheme, or carry into effect any provisions of the Scheme which are not being complied with

and at the same time it may pursuant to subsection 1 of section 10 of the Act advise such person that in the event of him failing to comply with the provisions thereof in the time limited for compliance then the Council by its agents will enter such person's property and cause to be done such works and things as shall be specified in such notice.

- (b) Any expense incurred by the Council in doing any works pursuant to any default under paragraph (a) hereof may be recovered from the person in default by action for a civil debt recoverable summarily in any court having jurisdiction in respect of the amount involved.

6.7 Notices: Any notice under Clause 6.6 hereof—

- (a) shall be addressed to the owner, occupier or lessee of the land in question;
- (b) shall describe in general terms the manner in which the Scheme has been contravened; and
- (c) shall require the owner, occupier or lessee as the case may be, within 30 clear days after the service of such notice, to discontinue such contravention of the Scheme and take such action as the Council may direct to cause a compliance with the provisions of the Scheme; and
- (d) shall where necessary advise the person to whom it is addressed that in default of his compliance with such notice the Council will enter such land and carry out the requirements of such notice itself at the expense of such person;
- (e) Any notice required to be given hereunder may be served personally or by prepaid letter addressed to the person to be served at his address as shown in the rate book of the Council if he shall be a ratepayer or at last known address (whether a ratepayer or not) and such notice shall be deemed to be served in due course of post.

"AS 1989-1976" means the Australian Standard for Classification and Labelling of Children's Night Clothes for Fire Hazard approved on behalf of the Council of the S.A.A. on August 25, 1976 and published on December 1, 1976;

"AS 1249-1976" means the Australian Standard Specifications for Children's Night Clothes having Reduced Fire Hazard approved on behalf of the Council of the S.A.A. on August 25, 1976 and published on January 1, 1977, and subsequent amendment published on August 1, 1977;

"AS K185-1968" means the Australian Standard Colours for Specific Purposes approved on behalf of the Council of the S.A.A. on November 25, 1968;

"garment" means—

(a) an article of nightwear, including pyjamas, over-garments of pyjama style nightdresses and dressing-gowns, but not including any article of headwear, footwear or handwear; and

(b) of any of the sizes 0 to 14 inclusive as defined by AS 1182-1972.

5. (1) For the purposes of these regulations garments are classified as follows—

Category 1—garments with a low fire hazard complying with AS 1249-1976 Part 1;

SCHEDULE—*continued.*

Category 2—garments designed to reduce fire hazard and complying with AS 1249-1976 Part 2;

Category 3—garments which do not comply with AS 1249-1976 Part 1 or Part 2.

(2) The minimum outside surface burning time prescribed for the purposes of subsection (3) and subsection (4) of section 5 of the Act with respect to garments of Category 3 is ten seconds when tested by the method described in AS 1176-1976, Part 3.

5. Regulation 6 of the principal regulations is revoked and the following regulation substituted—

6. (1) Garments shall be marked in compliance with AS 1989-1976 as follows—

- (a) where the garment is in Category 1—with the words "LOW FIRE DANGER";
- (b) where the garment is in Category 2—with the words "DESIGNED TO REDUCE FIRE DANGER. FLAMMABLE FABRIC"; and
- (c) where the garment is in Category 3—with the words "WARNING—HIGH FIRE DANGER—KEEP AWAY FROM FIRE" and the symbol



(2) Where a garment is made of or contains any thermoplastic fabric that when tested by any of the methods described in AS 1176 shows any tendency to melt or to allow drops of molten material to fall, it shall be marked with the words "WARNING—DO NOT WEAR UNDER ANY FLAMMABLE GARMENT".

6. Regulation 8 of the principal regulations is revoked and the following regulation substituted—

8. (1) Every marking required by these regulations shall be upon the face side of a label sewn into the garment in compliance with AS 1989-1976.

(2) The letters of a marking shall be clearly legible in upper case and of medium width and—

- (a) where the garment is of Category 1 or Category 2—shall be printed in Signal Red 537, as specified in AS K185-1968, on a white background;
- (b) where the garment is of Category 3, shall be printed in black on Signal Red 537 as specified in AS K185-1968.

(3) The label for a garment of Category 3 shall include the symbol specified in paragraph (c) of subregulation (1) of regulation 6 printed on in black on Signal Red 537, as specified in AS K185-1968.

(4) Where more than one marking is, pursuant to these regulations, required to be marked the marking so prescribed shall be in close proximity to each other.

(5) A marking shall not be combined with or accompanied by any other matter if that other matter would, by illustration, by wording or by size of lettering, tend to contradict or obscure the marking.

(6) All marking shall be in the English language.

(7) A label prescribed with respect to a garment by these regulations shall be marked and sewn into the garment in such a manner as to be legible and intact with the garment after a test described in Appendix A of AS 1989-1976 has been carried out on the garment.

INDUSTRIAL TRAINING ACT, 1975.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council acting under the provisions of the Industrial Training Act, 1975 and section 11 of the Interpretation Act, 1918-1975 has been pleased to make the regulations set forth in the Schedule below to take effect on and from the 6th February, 1978.

Schedule.

REGULATIONS.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Industrial Training (General Apprenticeship) Regulations, 1978.
2. These regulations apply to and in relation to apprenticeships in the trades and groups of trades specified in the First Schedule.
3. In these regulations unless the contrary intention appears—
 - “advisory board” means the industrial training advisory board appointed under the Act in relation to the trade or group of trades in question;
 - “employer” means the person employing the apprentice or employee in question;
 - “examiner” means a person appointed by the Minister pursuant to section 17 of the Act to carry out duties relating to the examination of apprentices in relation to the trade in question;
 - “regulation” means one of these regulations;
 - “the Act” means the Industrial Training Act, 1975;
 - “training” includes theoretical and practical tuition and instruction and the type of employment required to be given to an apprentice pursuant to any regulation made under the Act in relation to the trade in which he is apprenticed;
 - “union” means a union of workers or employers registered under any law relating to the registration of trade unions or the prevention and settlement of industrial disputes.
4. (1) The trades specified in the First Schedule are prescribed as apprenticeship trades.
 (2) The term “building trade” means the following trades, namely—
 - Bricklaying;
 - Stonemasonry;
 - Plastering;
 - Tilelaying.
5. A person is eligible to commence an apprenticeship if he—
 - (a) has fulfilled the conditions of eligibility prescribed by the regulations relating to that apprenticeship; and
 - (b) produces such evidence as satisfies the Director that he has fulfilled those conditions.
6. (1) An employer who employs a person in the first instance on probation pursuant to section 29 of the Act shall notify the Registrar of that fact within 14 days after the commencement of the employment.
 (2) A notice given pursuant to subregulation (1) of this regulation shall be in the form of a form approved of by the Council.

- Notification of objection to unions.
7. (1) Where the Registrar receives a notification pursuant to regulation 6 he shall cause the relevant unions to be notified of that fact.
- (2) A union that desires to object to a person being employed as an apprentice shall lodge notice of its objection with the Registrar within 14 days of the date of the notice given pursuant to subregulation (1) of this regulation.
- (3) The Registrar shall notify the employer, the employee and the parent or guardian of the employee of any objection lodged pursuant to subregulation (2) of this regulation.
- (4) Any objection to the employment of a person as an apprentice shall be referred by the Registrar to the Commission for hearing and determination and effect shall be given to that determination.
- Employer to notify person as to apprenticeship.
8. (1) Before the end of the period of three months' probation or such other period (not exceeding three months) by which that period is extended by the Director the employer shall notify the person employed on probation as to whether he intends to have that person apprenticed at the end of the period of probation.
- (2) Where the employment of a person who was employed on probation in the first instance is terminated the employer shall notify the Registrar of that fact.
- Agreement.
9. (1) As soon as practicable after the period of probation referred to in regulation 8 has expired the employer shall enter into an apprenticeship agreement with the person who has served the period of probation.
- (2) An apprenticeship agreement other than an apprenticeship agreement with a special trade shall be in the form of the form in the Second Schedule.
- (3) An apprenticeship agreement in relation to a special trade shall be in the form of the form in the Third Schedule.
- (4) The employer shall cause the apprenticeship agreement to be lodged for registration at the office of the Registrar within 14 days of the date of the execution of the agreement.
- (5) The Registrar shall not register an apprenticeship agreement unless he is satisfied that no objection in relation to that apprenticeship has been lodged, or, where an objection has been so lodged, the Commission has approved of the registration of the agreement.
- Credit.
10. Notwithstanding anything in the regulations prescribing the period of apprenticeship to be served in a particular trade, where the Director is satisfied that a person has, before becoming indentured as an apprentice, acquired some experience or skill in that trade by reason of former service or otherwise the Director may direct that the period to be served by that person as an apprentice in that trade shall be such period as he specifies in his direction.
- Record book.
11. (1) An employer shall maintain a separate record of training in respect of each apprentice in his employ.
- (2) The record of training prescribed by subregulation (1) of this regulation shall be in the form of a form approved of by the Council.
- (3) An employer shall cause to be entered in the record of training referred to in subregulation (1) of this regulation such particulars as are required by the form of the record.
- (4) Where an apprentice is transferred by the employer to another employer the record of training maintained in relation to the apprentice shall be forwarded to that other employer who shall be responsible for maintaining the record during the period that the apprentice is employed by him.
- (5) An employer shall give to the apprentice his record of training upon the completion of the apprenticeship.
- (6) The record of training referred to in this regulation shall be open for inspection by any examiner, officer of the Division, the advisory board, the Council, the union in question and the parent or guardian of the apprentice.

Extension
(lost time)

12. Where the Director is satisfied that by reason of sickness of the apprentice or any other reason that an apprentice has not served a continuous period of service as provided for in his apprenticeship agreement he may by written direction—

(a) require the apprentice to serve such additional period as he specifies in his direction; and

(b) specify the manner in which the apprenticeship is to be extended,

and the period to be served by that apprentice is extended accordingly.

Transfer.

13. (1) Where an employer employs an apprentice by way of the transfer of the employment of the apprentice pursuant to section 34 of the Act the employer shall notify the Registrar within 14 days of the date that the apprentice commences employment with him.

(2) Where the Registrar receives notification pursuant to subregulation (1) of this regulation he shall cause the relevant unions to be notified of that fact.

(3) A union that desires to object to the transfer of the employment of an apprentice shall lodge notice of its objection with the Registrar within 14 days of the date of the notice given pursuant to subregulation (2) of this regulation.

(4) Where pursuant to subregulation (3) of this regulation an objection is made to the transfer of the employment of an apprentice the Registrar shall refer the objection to the Commission for hearing and determination and notify the employer of the apprentice, the employer to whom the employment is to be transferred, the apprentice and the parent or guardian of the apprentice of the objection.

(5) The employer to whom the employment of an apprentice is transferred shall, within 60 days after the commencement of the employment of the apprentice, lodge the completed transfer of employment for registration with the Registrar in accordance with subsection (5) of section 34 of the Act.

(6) The Registrar shall not register the transfer of employment agreement unless he is satisfied that no objection in relation to the transfer has been lodged, or where an objection has been lodged, the Commission has authorised the transfer.

(7) A transfer of employment of an apprentice shall be in the form of the form approved by the Council.

(8) Where the Registrar registers a transfer of employment he shall forward a copy thereof to each of the parties referred to therein.

Cancellation.

14. (1) The Commission may on the application of the apprentice or guardian cancel the apprenticeship agreement and thereupon the apprentice ceases to be bound as an apprentice to his employer.

(2) Where—

(a) an apprentice abandons his apprenticeship; or

(b) an employer is satisfied on reasonable grounds that an apprentice has abandoned his apprenticeship,

the employer shall, within 14 days of the apprentice abandoning his apprenticeship or being so satisfied, as the case may be, notify the Registrar of that fact.

(3) Upon receipt of a notice pursuant to subregulation (2) of this regulation the Director may notify the apprentice and his parent or guardian that if the apprentice does not comply with the terms of his apprenticeship agreement the agreement may be cancelled and if after the notice has been forwarded to the apprentice he does not so comply the Director may cancel the apprenticeship agreement.

(4) An apprenticeship agreement may be cancelled by the mutual consent of the employer, the apprentice and parent or guardian of the apprentice by entering into an agreement for the cancellation of the apprenticeship agreement in the form of the form of agreement approved of by the Council.

(5) An agreement for the cancellation of an apprenticeship agreement shall be lodged with the Registrar within 14 days of the date of its execution and on receipt thereof the Registrar shall cancel the apprenticeship agreement.

(6) Where an apprenticeship agreement is cancelled pursuant to this regulation the apprentice ceases to be bound as an apprentice to his employer.

Misconduct. 15. (1) An application pursuant to section 37 of the Act shall be lodged with the Registrar.

(2) An application lodged pursuant to subregulation (1) of this regulation shall be forwarded by the Registrar to the Commission.

(3) The Commission shall notify the parties to the apprenticeship agreement and the relevant union or unions of the date of the hearing of the application.

Reduction. 16. Where the Director is satisfied that because of the special circumstances of the particular case it is not necessary for an apprentice to serve his apprenticeship for the whole of the period prescribed in relation to the trade in which he is apprenticed he may on application by the apprentice, his parent or guardian or the employer, reduce the period of apprenticeship to be served by the apprentice.

Satisfactory progress. 17. (1) The Director may require any person training an apprentice to furnish him with a report on the conduct, diligence and application of the apprentice.

(2) Where, in the opinion of the Director, an apprentice is not making satisfactory progress in his training the Director may do any one or more of the following—

(a) direct that the period of apprenticeship specified in the apprenticeship agreement of that apprentice be extended in the year being served or require that the apprentice serve an additional period after his last normal year of service;

(b) require the apprentice to undertake such additional training as the Director deems necessary;

(c) cancel the apprenticeship agreement of that apprentice, but the Director shall not take any action pursuant to this subregulation unless he gives the parties to the apprenticeship agreement an opportunity to make representations to him.

(3) Where pursuant to subregulation (2) of this regulation he has extended an apprenticeship agreement or required an apprentice to undertake additional training and he is satisfied with the progress the apprentice is making with his training the Director may cancel or vary the direction or requirement, as the case may be.

Technical training. 18. (1) An apprentice shall regularly and punctually attend all technical training classes in the subjects prescribed by the regulations in relation to the trade in which he is being trained.

(2) Notwithstanding subregulation (1) of this regulation the Director may exempt an apprentice from attendance at classes and may make the exemption subject to such conditions (including the undertaking of correspondence instruction) as he thinks fit.

(3) An exemption granted pursuant to subregulation (2) of this regulation may be given in relation to a particular apprentice or in relation to any grouping of apprentices.

(4) Subject to any exemption granted under subregulation (2) of this regulation where any regulation relating to training in a particular trade prescribes that the course of training for the trade be undertaken at a particular rate or in particular stages an apprentice undertaking the course shall complete the course at the rate prescribed or in the particular stages prescribed, as the case may be, in relation to that trade.

(5) Where an apprentice is required to undertake instruction by correspondence the employer shall forward all correspondence lessons completed by the apprentice to the body that conducts the course.

(6) Where an apprentice fails to attend a class or carry out a correspondence lesson he shall within seven days of such failure provide the person conducting the course with a written explanation for his absence signed by his parent or guardian stating the reason for his failure to so attend or carry out a lesson.

(7) Where an apprentice fails to attend a class or carry out any requirement of his training by reason of his illness the Director may require him to provide a medical certificate signed by a legally qualified medical practitioner.

(8) The employer shall not obstruct or hinder an apprentice from attending any class or from undertaking any correspondence instruction that he is required to attend or undertake under the Act.

(9) An apprentice shall submit himself to be examined at such examinations and final examinations as are prescribed in relation to the trade in which he is being trained.

(10) The Director may direct that the employer of a particular apprentice shall ensure that the apprentice completes his correspondence lessons for correction within the times specified in relation to those lessons.

Examina-
tions.

19. (1) The results of every examination of an apprentice, including examinations conducted by the Technical Education Division of the Education Department, shall be forwarded by the examiner, or that Division, as the case requires, to the Director.

(2) Where an apprentice does not sit for, or attend, an examination, or fails an examination, the examiner, or the Technical Education Division, as the case requires, may recommend to the Director that action be taken under regulation 17 of these regulations.

Final

tion.

20. (1) Every apprentice shall submit himself to a final examination at the time and place specified by the examiner.

(2) The final examination shall be conducted on the employer's premises unless the Director is of the opinion that in the circumstances of a particular case the examination should be conducted elsewhere and nominates the place at which the examination shall be so conducted.

(3) An apprentice shall be regarded as having completed his apprenticeship if—

(a) he has passed the final examination prescribed under the regulations in relation to the trade in which he is being trained; and

(b) subject to these regulations, he has completed the term of apprenticeship specified in his apprenticeship agreement.

(4) The Director shall issue to an apprentice who has completed his apprenticeship, a Final Certificate in the form of the form approved by the Council.

Machinery

21. The employer shall place at the disposal of the examiner any of the employer's material and machinery that is required by the examiner for the purpose of conducting an examination on the employer's premises.

Examiners'
fees.

22. (1) The fees to be paid to an examiner of apprentices, other than an Apprenticeship Officer appointed under the Act, are five dollars for every hour or part thereof incurred in time expended in travel and examination of apprentices, but the minimum payment shall be not less than twenty dollars unless the Registrar otherwise directs and the maximum payment for any one day shall not in any event exceed forty dollars.

(2) Subject to the approval of the Director, an examiner who in the course of his duties under the Act necessarily incurs any travelling expenses is entitled to be paid in accordance with the Public Service Miscellaneous Allowances Award, 1976 as amended from time to time or any award or agreement in substitution thereof.

That the apprentice shall and will truly and faithfully serve the employer as his apprentice in the said trade at such place (or places) as the employer may reasonably direct and that the apprentice will diligently attend to his work at the said trade, and will at all times willingly obey the reasonable directions of the employer, his managers, foremen, and overseers, and will not during the apprenticeship, without the consent in writing of the employer sell any goods which the employer makes or employ himself in the service of any other person or company in any work, or do any work for hire or reward which the employer undertakes, other than for the employer, and will not absent himself from the employer's service without leave, and will comply with the provisions of the Industrial Training Act, 1975.
2. That the apprentice will not do any damage or knowingly suffer any damage to be done to the property of the employer.
3. That the apprentice shall not be responsible for any faulty work or for any damage or injury done to materials, work, or machinery, tools, or plant other than wilful damage or injury during the course of his work.
4. That the apprentice, if under the age of eighteen years, shall not be required to work overtime without his consent.
5. The guardian shall be bound by this Agreement until the apprentice attains the age of twenty-one years or until the expiration of the said term whichever first occurs.
6. That the employer will accept the apprentice as his apprentice during the said term, and will during the said term, by the best means in his power, cause him to be instructed in the said trade and will provide facilities for the practical training of the apprentice in the said trade.
7. That the technical instruction of the apprentice prescribed by or under the Industrial Training Act, 1975 when available shall be in the employer's time, except in places where such instruction is given after the ordinary hours of work.
8. That in the event of the apprentice, in the opinion of his examiner or examiners, not progressing satisfactorily, increased time for technical instruction shall be allowed at the employer's expense to enable the apprentice to reach the necessary standard, but if and only if the failure of the apprentice to make satisfactory progress is due to the fault of the employer or is due to the inability of the apprentice to attend to his duties at any time during the period of his apprenticeship, whether on account of illness or other lawful reason.
9. That the employer will observe and perform all the conditions and stipulations of the Industrial Training Act, 1975.
10. This Agreement may be cancelled by mutual consent by the employer, the apprentice and the guardian giving notice in writing to the Registrar of Industrial Training appointed under the Industrial Training Act, 1975 and thereupon the apprenticeship shall be terminated without prejudice to the rights of any of the parties hereto in respect of any antecedent breach of the provisions of this Agreement.
11. That, subject to Section 37 of the Industrial Training Act, 1975, the employer shall have the right to suspend the apprentice and must then apply to suspend or cancel this agreement if the apprentice is at any time guilty of misconduct. The term "misconduct" without limiting its general sense, shall include refusal to obey lawful orders, wilful neglect or dereliction of duty, absence from duty without leave, the taking part in or being concerned in or anything in the nature of a strike or doing anything contrary to the provisions of the Industrial Training Act, 1975 or to the provisions of any Award or Industrial Agreement in force so far as the same shall relate to the apprenticeship or any of these things.
12. This Agreement is subject to the provisions of the Industrial Training Act, 1975.
13. In this Agreement reference to an Act includes the amendments to that Act for the time being in force and also any Act passed in substitution therefor or in lieu thereof and the regulations for the time being in force thereunder.

1. That the apprentice shall and will truly and faithfully serve the employer as an apprentice of the Board in the said trade at such place (or places) as the employer may reasonably direct and that the apprentice will diligently attend to his work at the said trade, and will at all times willingly obey the reasonable direction of the employer, his managers, foremen, and overseers, and will not during the apprenticeship, without the consent in writing of the employer sell any goods which the employer makes or employ himself in the service of any other person or company in any work, or do any work for hire or reward which the employer undertakes, other than for the employer, and will not absent himself from the employer's service without leave, and will comply with the provisions of the Industrial Training Act, 1975.
2. That the apprentice will not damage or knowingly suffer any damage to be done to the property of the employer.
3. That the apprentice shall not be responsible for any faulty work or for any damage or injury done to materials, work, or machinery, tools, or plant other than wilful damage or injury during the course of his work.
4. That the apprentice, if under the age of eighteen years, shall not be required to work overtime without his consent.
5. The guardian shall be bound by this Agreement until the apprentice attains the age of twenty-one years or until the expiration of the said term whichever first occurs.
6. That the employer will accept the apprentice as his apprentice during the said term, and will during the said term, by the best means in his power, cause him to be instructed in the said trade and will provide facilities for the practical training of the apprentice in the said trade.
7. That the technical instruction of the apprentice prescribed by or under the Industrial Training Act, 1975 when available shall be in the employer's time, except in places where such instruction is given after the ordinary hours of work.
8. That in the event of the apprentice, in the opinion of his examiner or examiners, not progressing satisfactorily, increased time for technical instruction shall be allowed at the employer's expense to enable the apprentice to reach the necessary standard, but if and only if the failure of the apprentice to make satisfactory progress is due to the fault of the employer or is due to the inability of the apprentice to attend to his duties at any time during the period of his apprenticeship, whether on account of illness or other lawful reason.
9. That the employer will observe and perform all the conditions and stipulations of the Industrial Training Act, 1975.
10. This Agreement may be cancelled by mutual consent by the employer, the apprentice and the guardian giving notice in writing to the Registrar of Industrial Training appointed under the Industrial Training Act, 1975 and thereupon the apprenticeship shall be terminated without prejudice to the rights of any of the parties hereto in respect of any antecedent breach of the provisions of this Agreement.
11. That, subject to Section 37 of the Industrial Training Act, 1975, the employer shall have the right to suspend the apprentice and must then apply to suspend or cancel this agreement if the apprentice is at any time guilty of misconduct. The term "misconduct" without limiting its general sense, shall include refusal to obey lawful orders, wilful neglect or dereliction of duty, absence from duty without leave, the taking part in or being concerned in or anything in the nature of a strike or doing anything contrary to the provisions of the Industrial Training Act, 1975 or to the provisions of any Award or Industrial Agreement in force so far as the same shall relate to the apprenticeship or any of these things.
12. This Agreement is subject to the provisions of the Industrial Training Act, 1975.
13. In this Agreement reference to an Act includes the amendments to that Act for the time being in force and also any Act passed in substitution therefor or in lieu thereof and the regulations for the time being in force thereunder.

REGULATIONS.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Industrial Training (Apprenticeship Training) Regulations, 1978.
2. These regulations shall be construed in conjunction with the Industrial Training (General Apprenticeship) Regulations, 1978 as if these regulations were incorporated and formed part of those regulations.
3. In these regulations unless the contrary intention appears—
“directed” means under a direction of the Director of Technical Education;
“Schedule” means a Schedule to these regulations;
“trade” means a trade prescribed as an apprenticeship trade under the Act.
4. (1) The Council may by notice published in the Western Australian Industrial Gazette declare the course of training applicable in relation to any trade.
(2) A notice referred to in subregulation (1) of this regulation may by subsequent notice be varied or cancelled by the Council.
(3) Until the Council pursuant to subregulation (1) of this regulation declares the course of training applicable in relation to a trade the course of training approved by the Commission in relation to that trade under the provisions of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912 and in force immediately before the coming into operation of the Industrial Training Act, 1975 is the prescribed course of training in relation to that trade.
5. (1) For the purposes of this regulation “column” means a column of the First Schedule.
(2) The term of an apprenticeship in a trade specified in column one is the term specified opposite and corresponding to that trade in column two but—
 - (a) where a lesser period is specified in column three opposite and corresponding to a trade specified in column one and the requirements specified in that column have been complied with the lesser period so specified is the full term of the apprenticeship;
 - (b) where in column three, column four or column five requirements are specified setting out other terms of apprenticeship opposite and corresponding to a trade specified in column one the term of an apprenticeship in that trade is, if the parties to the apprenticeship agreement so agree, the term specified in the column the requirements of which have been complied with.
(3) Notwithstanding anything in paragraph (b) of subregulation (2) of this regulation but subject to subregulation (4) of this regulation, where the requirement in column four or column five, as the case may be, have been complied with the full term of an apprenticeship shall not exceed four years.
(4) Where an apprentice to the trade of plumbing has completed the tenth year of schooling and has obtained the achievement certificate in such subjects and at such levels as the advisory board determines the term of his apprenticeship shall, if the parties to the apprenticeship agreement so agree, be four years.
6. (1) In this regulation unless the contrary intention appears “column” means a column of the Second Schedule.

(2) Subject to subregulation (3) of this regulation, an apprentice in a trade specified in column one whose term of apprenticeship is for a term specified in column two of the First Schedule shall attend classes conducted by the Technical Education Division of the Education Department at the centre applicable to his case during the first, second, third and fourth year of his apprenticeship for the periods respectively specified opposite and corresponding to his trade in column two, three, four and five respectively according to the year of his apprenticeship but where the term to be served by the apprentice is a term specified in column three, four or five of the First Schedule the apprentice shall attend classes for such periods as are directed by the Director.

(3) Notwithstanding anything in subregulation (2) of this regulation, the Director may direct an apprentice whose term of apprenticeship is for a term specified in column two of the First Schedule to attend classes at such times and for such periods specified in his direction in lieu of the times and periods prescribed by subregulation (2) of this regulation and effect shall be given to such a direction.

7. Where a particular standard of education or certificate is prescribed as a requirement under these regulations the advisory board may accept in lieu of the standard of education or certificate so prescribed any standard or certificate which in its opinion is equivalent to that standard or certificate.
