Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1977.

WHEREAS it is enacted, inter alia, by Section 13 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1977 that it shall be obligatory for every employer to obtain from an incorporated insurance office, approved by the Minister, a policy of insurance for the full amount of the liability to pay compensation under the said Act to all workers employed by him, but that if an employer proves to the satisfaction of the Minister that such employer has established a fund for insurance against such liability and has deposited at the Treasury securities charged with all payments to become due under such liability, the Governor may, by Order in Council exempt such employer from the operation of that Section; and whereas the Bank of New South Wales of 109 St. George's Terrace, Perth, being an employer within the meaning of the Section has duly, in accordance with the Act and the regulations made thereunder, made application for exemption from the operation of the Section, and has satisfied the Minister that it has established a fund for insurance against the said liability, and has deposited at the Treasury a security, to wit, a bond of Twenty five Thousand Dollars (\$25 000.00) given by the Bank charged with all payments to become due under the said liability: Now therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Act, doth hereby exempt the Bank of New South Wales of 109 St. George's Terrace, Perth, from the operation of section 13 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1977, for a period expiring on the 31st day of March, 1980.
