THE FINANCE BROKERS SUPERVISORY BOARD has fixed the following schedule to be the maximum amounts of remuneration for services rendered by persons carrying on the business of a Finance Broker. The schedule shall apply in the case of contracts made on or after the 1st September, 1978, and replaces the schedule published in *Government Gazette* No. 22/77 on the 15th April, 1977.

1. Application Fee:

\$35 non refundable fee for all loans. The Application Fee is a deposit against Broker's own inspection fee and eventual Brokerage charge.

If an independent qualified valuation is required this is chargeable separately at cost. In the event of a loan not being arranged no extra fees are chargeable.

2. Inspection Fees:

(a) Initial Inspections:

Up to 30 kilometres radius—\$35.00.
Over 30 kilometres radius—\$35.00 plus \$30.00 per hour spent outside the 30 kilometre radius with a maximum of \$80.00 per half day or part thereof or \$150.00 per day.

(b) Subsequent Inspections:

For progress advances for residential properties \$20.00 with a maximum of \$60.00 per property.

For progress advances for commercial properties in course of erection and where not under architectural supervision—by negotiation with the client.

3. Brokerage Fees:

(a) Local Money Loans:

On the first \$20 000—\$100 + 1%.
On the next \$10 000—1½%.
On the next \$20 000—2%.
On the next \$50 000—2½%.
Over \$100 000—as is mutually agreed between the parties in writing.

(b) Bridging Loans:

On loans of 6 months or less ¾%.
Over 6 months—normal rates.

(c) Interstate and Overseas Money Loans:

Rates subject to prior written agreement between broker and client. If interim Bridging Finance also arranged, additional brokerage of ¾% to be charged.

(d) Conditions of Brokerage Charges:

- (1) Brokerage should NOT be charged by a selling agent where a Contract of Sale or Mortgage to Vendor is arranged. The Agent Broker may, however, charge on a time basis for consultations and work done (see miscellaneous charges).
- (2) Where the selling Agent is also the broker a separate written Loan Application is also required before brokerage can be charged.
- (3) Where a broker arranges a loan from a Bank, Insurance Company or other Financial Institution, and where the applicant would not otherwise been able to obtain that loan from that source, brokerage at one half normal rates may be charged. This applies whether the broker is also the selling Agent or not, and is subject to clause 3(d)2 hereof.

4. Transfer of Mortgage Between Investor Clients: Standard scale of fees plus out of pockets, payable by the Transferor.

5. Extension of Mortgages: One quarter standard brokerage inclusive of any re-inspection, but solicitors costs, stamp duty, and registration should be in addition.

6. Finalisation Fee (discharges): Flat fee of \$27.50 to include all services required of a broker, in addition to legal costs, out of pockets, and settlement fees.

7. Commission on Interest Collections:

(a) Interest Collections only—6% of interest collections inclusive of postages, cheque duty and bank charges.

(b) Total Mortgage Management—including interest collection and supervision of mortgagors' compliance with all mortgage clauses—

8% of interest collections, inclusive of postages, cheque duty and bank charges except where the broker is acting as an agent for an insurance company in which case a fee of 6% applies.

8. Miscellaneous Charges:

(a) Production of Title—\$15.

(b) Titles Office Searches \$3 plus Titles Office fees.

(c) Additional Interest Statements as provided in the Finance Brokers Code of Conduct \$3 for each statement issued.

(d) Bank Cheques—\$2 including costs.

(e) Where no brokerage fees are payable consultations, advice, investigations and negotiations on finance—standard charge of \$25 per hour based on the actual time spent.

(f) Disbursements directly and reasonably incurred by the broker in the negotiations relating to a loan or a proposed loan and without limiting the generality of the foregoing would include—search fees, production fees, telephone trunk calls, telex, telegrams, accommodation expenses, postages and courier service. The Broker shall at the request of the client produce to the client such evidence of disbursement that the client should reasonably require.

 2½% on the next \$200 000 of that value
 2% on amounts in excess of \$400 000 of that value,
 whichever is the greater but where the fee is payable by the spouse of the deceased person the fee on the first \$100 000 of the gross capital value shall be \$200 or 3 per centum of that value whichever is the greater,

but where—

(iv) any property in an estate is an asset in another estate administered by the Public Trustee and in respect of which the appropriate fee in this schedule has already been paid the fee shall be 1½ per centum of the gross capital value; or

(v) the property in an estate consists of the proceeds of an asset which the Public Trustee receives as principal administrator from outside the State of Western Australia the fee shall be 1½ per centum of those proceeds;

(b) as to the income of any estate—

(i) in relation to income derived from rent—

(I) where the rent is collected by the Public Trustee without an agent, such amount as expressed as a percentage or otherwise under the scale adopted by the body known as the Real Estate Institute of Western Australia;

(II) where the rent is collected through an agent who is employed and paid a commission by the Public Trustee, such amount as equals 2½ per centum of that income;

(ii) in relation to income derived from sources other than rent—

(I) where the income is collected by the Public Trustee without an agent, 6 per centum of that income;

(II) where the income is collected through an agent who is employed and paid a commission by the Public Trustee, such amount as equals 2½ per centum of that income.

(2) Where the estate is that of an incapacitated member of the Defence Forces as constituted under the Defence Act, 1903, of the Parliament of the Commonwealth and any Act amending or in substitution for that Act and the incapacity has been accepted by the prescribed authority under the Repatriation Act, 1920, as the result of war service, the fees payable under this item shall be reduced by half.

(3) In time of war no fees shall be charged under this item on the estate of any deceased seaman or any member of the Defence Forces as constituted under the Defence Act, 1903, of the Parliament of the Commonwealth and any Act amending or in substitution for that Act where the gross value of the assets of the estate does not exceed five thousand dollars, but where the gross value of the estate exceeds five thousand dollars—

(a) there shall be charged on so much of the gross value of the estate as exceeds five thousand dollars but does not exceed ten thousand dollars, one-half of the fee chargeable under paragraph (1) of this item; and

(b) there shall be charged on so much of the gross value of the estate as exceeds ten thousand dollars, the fees chargeable under paragraph (1) of this item.

2. On the gross proceeds of assets realised or moneys collected by the Public Trustee in estates of incapable patients or persons, or infirm persons, 3½ per centum, except that—

(a) no commission shall be charged on moneys withdrawn from a current account or fixed deposit in a Savings Bank or Trading Bank; and

(b) on moneys received from an officer in any State (other than this State) or a territory of the Commonwealth or of New Zealand pursuant to subsection (1) of section 30 of the Act, the fee shall be 1½ per centum with no distinction between capital and income.

3. On moneys received for investment under the provisions of subsection (1) of section 37 of the Act or subsection (6) of section 16E of the Motor Vehicle (Third Party Insurance) Act, 1943-1976, 1 per centum.

4. Upon income, other than income consisting of the receipts of age, invalid, unemployment or sickness benefits paid by the Department of Social Security, war and service pensions and sickness payments made by co-operative or Friendly Societies, received by the Public Trustee in respect of any fund or property held by the Public Trustee alone or jointly including income earned from investment in the Common Fund the fees payable shall be the fees referred to in subparagraph (b) of paragraph (1) of item 1 of this Schedule.

Special provisions Relating to Bets known as Favourite Numbers Bets and Totalisator Pools Conducted in respect thereof.

34D. (1) The Board shall determine the events to which the available participating numbers on a favourite numbers bet ticket relate by random selection from events on which the Board intends to operate in respect of the favourite numbers totalisator pool concerned and which are to be run after the time advertised by the Board as being the closing time for the receipt of bets for that totalisator pool.

(2) When determining the events referred to in subregulation (1) of this regulation, the Board shall also determine which events are to be substituted therefor should all or any of the first-mentioned events be abandoned or postponed from one day to another.

(3) The Board shall by notices displayed in totalisator agencies, or by announcements made, at the time of determining the events referred to in subregulations (1) and (2) of this regulation specify the number of winning events which must be successfully nominated in order to comprise a winning bet.

(4) For the purposes of this regulation, a winning event is one which is won by the horse or greyhound which is deemed to be the off course favourite in accordance with this regulation.

(5) The horse or greyhound starting in a race on which there has been invested by way of win bets recorded by the Board a greater amount than that invested on any other horse or greyhound starting in that race is deemed for the purpose of favourite numbers bets to be the off course favourite for that race.

(6) If in a race there have been invested on two or more horses or greyhounds equal amounts, each of which is greater than any amount invested on any other horse or greyhound starting in the race, the off course favourite is deemed to be the horse or greyhound among the first-mentioned horses or greyhounds which has assigned to it the lowest numerical code number in the official list displayed by the Board for the race.

(7) If one of the horses or greyhounds participating in a dead heat is the off course favourite in the race concerned and that race is one to which a favourite numbers bet relates, that race is deemed for the purpose of this regulation to have been won by that off course favourite.

(8) Subject to the provisions of subregulation (9) of this regulation and before any dividend is calculated or declared in respect of a favourite numbers bet, the Board shall deduct a totalisator commission of twenty per centum of the gross takings of the totalisator pool concerned and shall pay the amount of the resulting balance to the holder of the winning ticket by way of dividend or, if there is more than one winning ticket, divide that amount by the number of winning tickets and pay to the holder of each winning ticket his share of that amount as so divided.

(9) On a unit favourite numbers bet of fifty cents (50c), the Board shall not pay a fraction of ten cents (10c) by way of dividend unless that fraction is equal to or exceeds five cents (5c), in which case five cents (5c) shall be paid.

(10) If no favourite numbers bet placed in the totalisator pool concerned is a winning bet in accordance with subregulation (3) of this regulation, the Board shall carry forward fifty per centum of the resulting balance of the gross takings referred to in subregulation (8) of this regulation and shall add the amount of that percentage to the amount invested in a subsequent totalisator pool conducted for the same kind of favourite numbers bet as that in respect of which no bet on the winning combination was made.

(11) The Board shall, after carrying forward fifty per centum of the resulting balance of the gross takings in accordance with subregulation (10) of this regulation, divide the remaining fifty per centum of the resulting balance of the gross takings by the number of tickets nominating the number of successful numbers which is one less than the appropriate number specified in terms of subregulation (3) of this regulation for the purpose of declaring and paying a dividend in terms of subregulation (6) of this regulation.

(12) If there are no tickets nominating the number of successful numbers referred to in subregulation (11) of this regulation, the Board shall progressively reduce by one the number required for the purpose of determining which bets are winning bets until the Board is able to calculate and declare a dividend.

THE Shire of Dowerin proposes to construct a sewerage scheme within the Townsite of Dowerin as delineated on K. de Courtenay and Associates, Civil and Structural Consulting Chartered Engineers plan, for the purposes of draining sewerage from dwellings and business premises and to treat that sewerage in a sewerage treatment works to be constructed and advises the public generally that an application has been made to the Commissioner of Public Health to approve the scheme under Part IV Division 1, Sanitary Provisions of the Health Act, 1911-1976.

WHEREAS under the provisions of the Health Act, 1911-1976, as amended a local authority may make or adopt by-laws and may alter, amend or repeal any by-laws so made or adopted: Now therefore, the Town of Narrogin being a local authority within the meaning of the Act and having adopted the Model By-laws described as Series "A" as reprinted, pursuant to the Reprinting of Regulations Act, 1954, in the *Government Gazette* of 17th July, 1963, doth hereby resolve and determine that the said adopted by-laws shall be amended as follows:—

PART 1.—GENERAL SANITARY PROVISIONS.

Repeal By-law 26 and substitute a new by-law therein as follows:—

STABLES.

1. These by-laws may be cited as the "Town of Narrogin Stable by-laws" and shall apply and have operation throughout the Health District of Narrogin
2. In these by-laws, unless inconsistent with the text or subject matters—
 - "Act" means the Health Act, 1911 and amendments thereto;
 - "Health Surveyor" means any surveyor appointed under the Act;
 - "Horse" means any stallion, mare, gelding, pony, colt or foal and includes any ass, mule, donkey and any beast of whatever description used for burden or draught or for carrying purposes;
 - "Paddock" means an area of land in excess of 0.2 ha;
 - "Person" and words applying to any person, or individual includes a Corporation;

"Stable" means any building capable of being enclosed in which a horse is accommodated or kept, and includes any shed, loose box, stall or shelter used for keeping, stabling, feeding, watering, grooming, sheltering or veterinary treatment of a horse.

"Premises" means area of land of 1 500 sq. m in area or greater up to 2 000 sq. m and includes messuages, buildings, lands and hereditaments.

3. From the 30th July, 1978:

- (i) The occupier of any premises within the Health District of the Town of Narrogin shall not permit a horse to be kept on those premises unless those premises are registered with the Council.
- (ii) No person shall allow a greater number of horses on the premises than the number for which the premises are registered.
- (iii) No person shall permit a horse to be kept on an area of land under 1 500 sq. metres in area.

4. The occupier required by these by-laws to register premises for the keeping of horses shall make application to the Council in the form prescribed for that purpose in the schedule hereto, and with every application for original registration shall lodge plans, drawings and particulars in duplicate of those premises for which registration is required.

5. Upon receipt of such application the Council shall cause the premises to be inspected by the Health Surveyor and reported upon in respect to their proposed compliance with these by-laws.

6. If upon such application and report being submitted to Council it shall appear to the Council that such application for registration should be granted, it shall upon being paid the registration fee hereinafter prescribed, register such premises, subject to such by-laws, orders, regulations and rules as shall be or become of force, during the continuance of such registration, and to issue the applicant a certificate of registration in the form set out in the Schedule hereto.

7. Every certificate of registration shall remain in force from the date of issue until the 30th June next issuing and thereafter during the period of every annual renewal and no longer, but may be sooner suspended or cancelled by the Council for breach of any by-laws, orders, regulations or rules which relate to the premises or the occupier.

8. Application for the renewal of any registration shall be made annually during the month of May and the registration certificate then in force shall be presented with the said application.

9. For every initial registration, there shall be paid to the Council by each applicant a sum of \$5.00 for each premises.

For every renewal of registration there shall be paid to the Council by each applicant a sum of \$3.00 for each premises.

10. To be registered, every premises must conform to the following requirements:—

- (1) The construction of every building and fence shall be in accordance with the Uniform Building By-laws.
- (2) Notwithstanding the provisions of sub-by-law (1):—
 - (a) Every loose-box, stable or stall shall have an area of not less than 11 sq. metres and walls of not less than 3 metres measured horizontally and vertically. The floor shall be at least 100 mm above the natural ground surface and constructed of concrete graded to an open "spoon drain" situated outside of the building. There shall be on all sides of the building between the wall and the roof, a clear space of at least 150 mm.
 - (b) A shelter provided in a yard for the protection of horses from inclement weather shall have an area of not less than 9.3 sq. metres and a height of at least 2.4 m. It shall not be capable of being closed and shall have at least one side completely open to the outside air.
 - (c) Grain, chaff, bran and other horse feed shall be stored so that it is inaccessible to rodents.
 - (d) A sufficient number of impervious, fly proof bins shall be provided for retaining manure.
 - (e) A stable shall not be situated at any less distance than 9 metres from any house, street, right of way or public place.
 - (f) A paddock used for the keeping of any horse or horses, shall be suitably fenced and shall be kept in such a state as to prevent any nuisance arising.
 - (g) A stable, yard or paddock shall not be situated at any less distance than 18 metres from any food handling premises.

11. The occupier of premises whereon a horse is kept shall:—

- (a) Cause all manure and offensive litter to be collected each day and placed in an approved receptacle.
- (b) Cause all manure and offensive litter to be suitably disposed of at least once each week, and more often if so directed.
- (c) Cause the manure receptacle to be treated internally with a suitable insecticide so as to prevent fly breeding.
- (d) Cause to be sprayed with a residual insecticide and surface of any building when so directed.
- (e) Employ all means and adopt such precautions as may be necessary to keep the premises in a clean and sanitary condition, and free from offensive odours.

12. Any person who makes a false statement in connection with any application under these by-laws shall be guilty of an offence.

13. Any person doing any act forbidden to be done, or failing to do any act directed to be done by these by-laws shall be liable to a penalty of not more than one hundred dollars and in the case of a continuing offence, a further daily penalty of not more than ten dollars per day.

Notice to all Owners and/or Occupiers of Land within the Shire of Boddington.

PURSUANT to the powers contained in section 33 of the above Act, you are hereby required on or before the 30th day of November, 1978, to remove from the land owned or occupied by you all inflammable material or to clear firebreaks in accordance with the following and thereafter to maintain the land or the firebreaks clear of inflammable material up to and including the 15th day of April, 1979:—

1. In respect of the land owned or occupied by you within any Townsite you shall:
 - (a) Where the area of land is 2 000 m² or less, remove all inflammable material creating a fire hazard on the land from the whole of the land, and
 - (b) Where the area of land exceeds 2 000 m² clear of all inflammable material firebreaks at least 2.44 metres wide immediately inside all external boundaries of the land and also immediately surrounding all buildings situated on the land, and
 - (c) Where a liquid or gas fuel depot or ramp is situated on any land within a townsite, you shall clear of all inflammable material an area immediately surrounding the depot or ramp and the radius of that area being not less than 6.10 metres.
2. In respect of the land owned or occupied by you which is not situated in a townsite, you shall:
 - (a) Clear firebreaks at least 2.44 metres wide along boundaries of your property which adjoin any trafficable road. (Burning of road side at least 2.44 metres wide will be accepted in lieu of ploughing breaks on the adjoining land. Owners/Occupiers opting for this method and who are unable to burn prior to November 30, 1978 must, before that date, obtain a permit from the Chief Fire Control Officer, or his Deputy, to carry out burning operations between November 30 and December 15. A condition of permits issued under this clause will be that all fires are extinguished and burnt trees rendered safe at the conclusion of the exercise.)
 - (b) Clear firebreaks at least 2.44 metres wide immediately around all land which is carrying established pasture or crop.
 - (c) Clear of all inflammable material an area immediately surrounding all buildings and/or haystacks and the radius of that area being not less than 7 metres and
 - (d) Either spring burn or provide a 20 metres firebreak around all bush country at least once every three years.

If it is considered to be impractical for any reason to clear firebreaks or to remove inflammable material from the land as required by this notice you may appeal to the Council or its duly authorised officer not later than the 15th day of November, 1978 for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions or to take alternative action to abate fire hazards on the land.

If permission is not granted by the Council or its duly authorised officer, you shall comply with the requirements of this notice.

If the requirements of this notice are carried out by burning, such burning must be in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Bush Fires Act.

The penalty for failure to comply with this notice is a fine of not less than \$40 and not more than \$200 and a person in default is also liable, whether prosecuted or not, to pay the costs of performing the work directed in this notice, if it is not carried out by the owner or occupier by the date required by this notice.

- (iii) by inserting the words "For Permitted Uses See Appendix B" opposite the use classes, such that by reference to Appendix B the uses that are permitted by the scheme subject to any conditions imposed by Council in determining the application for planning consent "P"; are not permitted unless approval is granted by Council "AA"; are not permitted unless such uses are incidental to the predominant use as described and approved by the Council "I.P."; or are not permitted "X" may be ascertained.
3. By adding a new clause under Part 5 after clause 5.8, and being clause 5.9, as follows:

Special Rural Zone: The following provisions shall apply specifically to all land included in the Special Rural Zone in addition to any provisions which are more generally applicable to such land under this Scheme—

- (a) The objective of the Special Rural Zone is to select areas within the rural areas wherein closer subdivision will be permitted to provide for such uses as hobby farms, horse breeding, rural-residential retreats, intensive agriculture including market gardens and viticulture, and also to make provision for retention of the rural landscape and amenity in a manner consistent with the orderly and proper planning of such areas.
- (b) The provisions for controlling subdivisions, land uses and development relating to specific Special Rural Zones will be as laid down in Appendix B to the Scheme and future subdivision will accord with the Plan of Subdivision for the specified area referred to in the Schedule and such Plan of Subdivision shall form part of the Scheme.

Before making provision for a Special Rural Zone, Council will prepare, or require the owner(s) of the land to prepare, a submission supporting the creation of the Special Rural Zone and such submission shall include:

- (i) A statement as to the purpose or intent for which the zone is being created.
- (ii) The reasons for selecting the particular area the subject of the proposed zone with particular reference as to how this relates to the Council's Rural Planning Strategy.

- (iii) A plan or plans showing contours at such intervals as to adequately depict the land form of the area and physical features such as existing buildings, rock outcrops, trees or groups of trees, lakes, rivers, creeks, swamps, orchards, wells and significant improvements.
 - (iv) Information regarding the method whereby it is proposed to provide a potable water supply to each lot.
 - (v) The proposed staging of the subdivision and development and the criteria to be met before successive stages are implemented.
- (c) The Scheme provisions for a specific Special Rural Zone shall include a Plan of Subdivision showing:
- (i) The proposed ultimate subdivision including lot sizes and dimensions.
 - (ii) Areas to be set aside for Public Open Space, pedestrian accessways, horse trails, community facilities, etc, as may be considered appropriate.
 - (iii) Those physical features it is intended to conserve.
 - (iv) The proposed staging of the subdivision where relevant.
- (d) In addition to the Plan of Subdivision, the Scheme provisions for a specific Special Rural Zone shall specify:
- (i) The facilities which the purchasers of the lots will be required to provide (e.g. their own potable water supply, liquid and solid waste disposal system, etc.).
 - (ii) Proposals for the control of land uses and development which will ensure that the purpose of intent of the zone and the rural environment and amenities are not impaired.
 - (iii) Any special provisions appropriate to secure the objectives of the zone.

The Municipality of the Town of Bunbury By-laws Relating to Hawkers and Stallholders.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on 12th June, 1978 to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following by-laws.

Definitions.

1. "Act" means the Local Government Act, 1960.
"Clerk" means the Town Clerk or the person acting for the time being in that capacity.
"Council" means Town of Bunbury.
"District" means the District of the Town of Bunbury.
"Hawker" "Stall" and "Stallholder" have the meanings assigned to them by Sections 217 and 242 of the Act.
"Licensee" means a person to whom a licence is granted under these by-laws.
"Licence" means a licence issued pursuant to these by-laws.
"Member of the Police Force" means a member of the Police Force of Western Australia.
2. Any person who desires to hawk any goods, wares or merchandise or to be a stallholder within the district, shall make application in writing to the Council for a licence so to do.
3. Subject to these by-laws, the Council may issue licences, and may, at its discretion, issue a licence for a period less than one year but for not less than one month.
4. (1) A licence shall be in the form set out in the First Schedule to these by-laws; and the licence fees shall be the fees set out in the Second Schedule to these by-laws and those fees shall be paid by the licensee to the Council, forthwith upon the issue to him of the licence.
(2) A licence is not transferable.
(3) The licence granted to a hawker is valid for the hawking of the goods, wares or merchandise therein described, only; and in the case of a licence limited to a part of the district is valid for that part of the district only.
5. (1) Every person wishing to obtain a licence shall make application in writing therefore to the Council.
(2) An application for a hawker's licence shall specify—
 - (a) the kind of goods, wares or merchandise which the applicant requires to hawk;
 - (b) the type of vehicle, conveyance or means of carriage to be employed in hawking;
 - (c) the period for which the licence is required; and
 - (d) where the licence is required to be limited to a part of a district, the part of the district to which it is so to be limited.
- (3) An application for a stallholders licence shall specify—
 - (a) the kind of goods, wares or merchandise which the applicant desires to sell;
 - (b) the location of the stall;
 - (c) the period for which the licence is required.
6. (1) The Council shall not issue a Hawker's or Stallholders licence (other than a renewal of a licence) to an applicant, unless he produces to the Council a Certificate signed by two Justices of the Peace certifying that he is of good character and reputation, and is a fit person to exercise the trade of a Hawker.
(2) The Council may refuse to issue a licence or may cancel a licence in the event that the applicant or licensee (as the case may be)—
 - (a) is an undischarged bankrupt or becomes bankrupt;
 - (b) has been convicted or is convicted of an indictable offence;
 - (c) has been twice convicted during the preceding five years or is twice convicted in the space of five years of an offence against the by-laws of any Local Authority relating to hawkers;
 - (d) does not conform with the requirements of the Health Act, 1911, or the Model By-laws made under that Act.
- (3) Council may refuse to issue a licence if in its opinion the needs of the District or the portion thereof for which the licence is sought are adequately catered for by established shops or by persons to whom licences have been issued.
7. The Council may revoke any licence issued by it on any of the grounds set out in By-law 6 hereof, or on the grounds—
 - (a) that the licensee has committed a breach of the terms or conditions of the licence;
 - (b) that the licensee is not conducting his business in a respectable or sober manner;
 - (c) that he has assigned his licence or does not himself carry on the business or
 - (d) that he is not regularly carrying on the business for which the licence was granted.

8. Upon the cancellation of a licence the holder thereof shall forthwith return the licence to the Clerk and shall forfeit all fees paid in respect of the licence.
9. (1) The Council shall issue to every licensee a badge in the form set out in the Third Schedule of these by-laws and the licensee shall pay for such badge a fee of fifty cents.
 (2) A licensee shall display his badge while hawking or conducting a stall.
 (3) A person shall not display a hawkers or stallholders badge unless he is the holder of a current licence.
 (4) Upon cancellation of a licence the holder shall forthwith return his badge to the Clerk and shall forfeit the fee paid in respect thereof.
10. A hawker while hawking or stallholder while conducting a stall shall—
 (a) carry with him his licence and shall produce the same to any officer of the Council or to a Police Officer on demand;
 (b) have his name legibly and conspicuously displayed on his vehicle, barrow, bag or tray; and
 (c) when selling goods, wares or merchandise by weight, carry and use for that purpose, scales, tested and certified in accordance with the provisions of the Weights and Measures Act, 1915.
11. A hawker or stallkeeper shall not—
 (a) hawk or conduct a stall between the hours of sunset and the next sunrise, or on any Sunday, or on Christmas Day or Good Friday, without the consent of the Council;
 (b) loiter within a distance of two hundred metres of any shop or permanent place of business that has for sale any goods, wares or merchandise of the kind being hawked or offered for sale by the stallholder;
 (c) call his wares or make or cause to be made any outcry, noise or disturbance likely to be a nuisance or annoyance to any person in that vicinity;
 (d) deposit or store any box or basket under his vehicle or on the roadway or footpath;
 (e) obstruct the free passage of pedestrians or vehicles on any footpath or roadway; or
 (f) act in an offensive manner.
12. The person to whom a stall holders licence is issued shall maintain the stall in good order and condition.
13. No person shall conduct a stall on private property unless there is adequate provision on the private property adjacent to the stall for parking of customers' vehicles.
14. Notwithstanding any of the provisions of these by-laws, the Council may grant without fee, licences to conduct stalls in any street or way or on any land for any period specified in such a licence if such stalls are conducted solely for the purpose of raising money for religious or charitable purposes.
15. The person to whom a hawkers licence is issued shall not remain stationary in any street or public place for any period longer than shall be necessary for the purpose of serving or treating with any customer or intending customer then offering to buy or to treat.
16. Any person committing a breach of these by-laws or who is guilty of an offence against these by-laws shall be liable to—
 (a) a maximum penalty of \$200; and
 (b) a maximum daily penalty during the breach of \$20 per day; and
 (c) a minimum penalty of one-tenth of the maximum penalty and of one-tenth of the maximum daily penalty for the breach.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council acting under the provisions of the Public Service Arbitration Act, 1967-1977, and the Interpretation Act, 1918-1975, has been pleased to—

- (a) revoke the Public Service Arbitration Regulations published in the *Government Gazette* on the 12th April, 1967, and the Public Service Appeal Board Regulations published in the *Government Gazette* on the 3rd October, 1967; and
- (b) make the regulations set forth in the Schedule below, so that the revocation and the regulations referred to in paragraph (b) take effect on and from the 1st day of September, 1978.

REGULATIONS.

PART I.—PRELIMINARY.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Public Service Arbitration Act Regulations, 1978.
2. These regulations are divided into Parts as follows—
 - Part I.—Preliminary.
 - Part II.—Provisions Relating to Proceedings Before the Public Service Arbitrator.
 - Part III.—Provisions Relating to Appeals to the Western Australian Industrial Appeal Court.
 - Part IV.—Provisions Relating to Proceedings Before the Public Service Appeal Board.
3. In these regulations, unless the contrary intention appears—
“the Act” means the Public Service Arbitration Act, 1966-1977.

PART II.—PROVISIONS RELATING TO PROCEEDINGS BEFORE THE PUBLIC SERVICE ARBITRATOR.

4. Every document, other than a document in relation to an appeal under section 26 of the Act, prepared for use under Part II of the Act—
 - (a) shall have a heading in the form of Form 1 in the Schedule to these regulations;
 - (b) shall state in the heading the nature of the document; and
 - (c) shall contain a concise statement of the matter to which it relates.
5. An appeal in relation to a matter referred to in paragraph (g) of subsection (1) of section 11 of the Act shall be in the form of Form 2 in the Schedule to these regulations.
6. An application or appeal to the Arbitrator made under Part II of the Act shall state briefly, but specifically—
 - (a) the grounds relied on in support of the application or appeal; and
 - (b) the decision or determination sought by the applicant or appellant, as the case may be.
7. Every claim, application or appeal submitted to the Arbitrator shall be accompanied by such number of copies thereof as will enable a copy to be forwarded to each party to the claim, application, or appeal.
8. Subject to the Act, the following provisions apply to and in relation to any proceedings before the Arbitrator—
 - (a) notice of not less than seven days shall be given of the time and date of any conference held pursuant to subsection (4) of section 15 of the Act or subsection (4) of section 18 of the Act;
 - (b) where the Arbitrator thinks it is necessary to hear evidence in relation to any matter not less than fourteen days notice shall be given of the time and date of the hearing unless all the parties concerned agree to a shorter notice;
 - (c) every party to the proceedings shall, within such time as is fixed by the Arbitrator in the notice given pursuant to paragraph (b) of this regulation, serve on the Arbitrator and on every other party to the proceedings a notice listing the names of the witnesses to be called by that party;
 - (d) any party may apply to the Arbitrator for permission to call as a witness a person whose name is not listed on a notice referred to in paragraph (c) of this regulation and the Arbitrator may grant or refuse the application;
 - (e) where a person whose name is listed as a witness in a notice served by a party pursuant to paragraph (c) of this regulation is not called as a witness by that party any other party may call that person as a witness.
9. (1) Four copies of every agreement entered into between an employer and the Association pursuant to paragraph (a) of subsection (3) of section 14 of the Act shall be filed with the Arbitrator by the employer within seven days of the date of which the agreement is executed by all the parties thereto.

(2) The Arbitrator shall register the agreement and shall return a stamped copy to each party to the agreement.

10. The Arbitrator shall cause every order and award and every agreement filed pursuant to regulation 9 of these regulations to be published in the *Western Australian Industrial Gazette*.

PART III.—PROVISIONS RELATING TO APPEALS TO THE WESTERN AUSTRALIAN INDUSTRIAL APPEAL COURT.

11. The Industrial Arbitration Act (Western Australian Industrial Appeal Court) Regulations, 1964, with such modifications as are necessary for that purpose apply to and in relation to an appeal to the Western Australian Industrial Appeal Court under section 26 of the Act.

PART IV.—PROVISIONS RELATING TO PROCEEDINGS BEFORE THE PUBLIC SERVICE APPEAL BOARD.

12. (1) An appeal to the Board under Part III of the Act shall be by notice in writing signed by the appellant and filed at the office of the Arbitrator within thirty days after the date of the decision or determination in respect of which the appeal is made.

(2) A notice of appeal referred to in subregulation (1) of this regulation shall state briefly, but specifically—

- (a) the grounds relied on in support of the appeal; and
(b) the decision sought by the appellant in lieu of the decision or determination appealed from.

13. Upon receipt of a notice of appeal referred to in regulation 12 of these regulations the Clerk to the Board shall forward a copy thereof to the employer concerned, and, where the employer is not the Public Service Board, one copy to the Public Service Board.

14. The Clerk to the Board shall give written notice of not less than fourteen days to each party to an appeal of the time and place appointed by the chairman of the Board of the sitting of the Board for the hearing of the appeal.

15. (1) An appointment of a person as member of the Board as an employer's representative pursuant to paragraph (b) of subsection (3) of section 33 of the Act shall be in writing signed by the employer concerned.

(2) An appointment of a person as member of the Board as an employee's representative pursuant to paragraph (c) of subsection (3) of section 33 of the Act shall be in writing signed by the President of the Association or a Vice-President thereof.

16. (1) An appellant shall, not less than seven days before the date fixed for the hearing, file at the office of the Arbitrator—

- (a) a written statement setting out the facts upon which he intends to rely in the appeal; and
(b) a notice listing the names of the persons he intends to call as witnesses in the appeal.

(2) The employer concerned in any appeal shall not less than seven days before the hearing of the appeal file at the office of the Arbitrator a notice listing the names of the persons he intends to call as witnesses in the appeal.

(3) The Clerk of the Board shall forthwith upon receipt of a statement or notice referred to in this regulation cause a copy thereof to be forwarded to the other parties to the appeal

17. The Clerk to the Board shall cause a copy of the decision of the Board on an appeal to be supplied to every party to the appeal.
