WHEREAS by the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909-1978, it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Board shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct provide and extend Water Works, Sewerage Works and Metropolitan Main Drainage Works; and whereas the preliminary requirements of the said Act have been complied with and the plan in respect of the works hereinafter mentioned has been submitted to and approved by the Governor in Council: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby empower the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Board to undertake the construction of the following works under the said Act, namely:—

City of Stirling and Shire of Swan.

Widgee Road Branch Drain—Sections 6, 7 and 8.

- (a) Provision comprises the takeover by constitution as a Metropolitan Main Drain, that portion of the Widgee Road Branch Drain located within the Shire of Swan Town Planning Scheme No. 7, in the district of Malaga, and generally between Alexander Drive and McGilvray Avenue, Widgee Road and the Northern Perimeter Controlled Access Highway Reserve, as shown on plan M.W.B. 15219. The drain was constructed by contractors under instructions from consulting engineers and to the overall satisfaction of the Metropolitan Water Board.

The drain generally consists of approximately 1 870 metres of reinforced concrete piped gravity drain of varying diameter from 375 mm to 750 mm, approximately 92 metres of twin 375 mm diameter mild steel pressure main, two open earth compensating basins and a pump station; all complete with necessary brick and concrete structures, manholes and other apparatus connected therewith.

- (b) The construction of approximately 1 380 metres of temporary shallow open earth drain to function as an outlet for that section of the Widgee Road Branch Drain described above.

The drain is to be located in the district of Malaga; in the eastern extremity of the Shire of Swan Town Planning Scheme No. 7; Controlled Access Road Reserve; Malaga

Road, and in the Metropolitan Regional Planning Authority land, lots 10, 11 and 1 to 5 Widgee Road, Majority of drain length being sited parallel to Widgee Road and approximately 60 metres North of Widgee Road, as shown on plan M.W.B. 15219.

1. (1) Subject to this item the following fees shall be charged in respect of the duties and services of the Public Trustee, acting alone or jointly, with respect to the estate of a deceased person (in addition to all moneys properly expended in respect of the estate)—

(a) as to the gross capital of an estate—

(i) where the gross capital value of the estate does not exceed \$300—\$30;

(ii) where the gross capital value of the estate exceeds \$300 but does not exceed \$2 000—10% of the value;

(iii) where the gross capital value of the estate exceeds \$2 000 the fee to be charged shall be ascertained according to the following scale—
\$200 or

3½% on the first \$100 000 of that value;

3% on the next \$100 000 of that value;

2½% on the next \$200 000 of that value;

2% on amounts in excess of \$400 000 of that value, whichever is the greater but where the fee is payable by the spouse of the deceased person the fee on the first \$100 000 of the gross capital value shall be \$200 or 3 per centum of that value whichever is the greater,

but where—

(iv) any property in an estate is an asset in another estate administered by the Public Trustee and in respect of which the appropriate fee in this schedule has already been paid the fee shall be 1½ per centum of the gross capital value; or

(v) the property in an estate consists of the proceeds of an asset which the Public Trustee receives as principal administrator from outside the State of Western Australia the fee shall be 1½ per centum of those proceeds;

(b) as to the income of any estate—

(i) in relation to income derived from rent—

(I) where the rent is collected by the Public Trustee without an agent, such amount as expressed as a percentage or otherwise under the scale adopted by the body known as the Real Estate Institute of Western Australia;

(II) where the rent is collected through an agent who is employed and paid a commission by the Public Trustee, such amount as equals 2½ per centum of that income;

(ii) in relation to income derived from sources other than rent—

(I) where the income is collected by the Public Trustee without an agent, 6 per centum of that income;

(II) where the income is collected through an agent who is employed and paid a commission by the Public Trustee, such amount as equals 2½ per centum of that income.

(2) In time of war no fees shall be charged under this item on the estate of any deceased seaman or any member of the Defence Forces as constituted under the Defence Act 1903 of the Parliament of the Commonwealth and any Act amending or in substitution for

that Act where the gross value of the assets of the estate does not exceed five thousand dollars, but where the gross value of the estate exceeds five thousand dollars—

- (a) there shall be charged on so much of the gross value of the estate as exceeds five thousand dollars but does not exceed ten thousand dollars, one-half of the fee chargeable under paragraph (1) of this item; and
- (b) there shall be charged on so much of the gross value of the estate as exceeds ten thousand dollars, the fees chargeable under paragraph (1) of this item.

2. (1) Subject to this item on the gross proceeds of assets realised or moneys collected by the Public Trustee in estates of incapable patients or persons, or infirm persons, $3\frac{1}{2}$ per centum, except that—

- (a) no commission shall be charged on moneys withdrawn from a current account or fixed deposit in a Savings Bank or Trading Bank; and
- (b) on moneys received from an officer in any State (other than this State) or a territory of the Commonwealth or of New Zealand pursuant to subsection (1) of section 30 of the Act, the fee shall be $1\frac{1}{2}$ per centum with no distinction between capital and income.

(2) Where the estate is that of an incapacitated member of the Defence Forces as constituted under the Defence Act 1903 of the Parliament of the Commonwealth and any Act amending or in substitution for that Act and the incapacity has been accepted by the prescribed authority under the Repatriation Act 1920, of the Parliament of the Commonwealth and any Act amending or in substitution for that Act as the result of war service, the fees payable under this item shall be reduced by half.

BY-LAWS.

1. These by-laws may be cited as the Sunset Hospital (Traffic and Grounds) By-laws.
2. In these by-laws unless the contrary intention appears—
"hospital" means the public hospital known by the name of the Sunset Hospital;

"vehicle" has the same meaning as that term has in and for the purpose of the Road Traffic Act, 1974, or any Act for the regulation and control of traffic enacted in substitution for that Act, for the time being in force.

3. A person shall not, without lawful excuse, be in or upon the hospital premises or the grounds attached or belonging thereto, whether enclosed or fenced or not.

4. A person shall not park, or cause or permit to be parked, a vehicle within the grounds attached to the hospital or belonging thereto except in an area set apart by the Board of the hospital for the purpose and so designated by suitable notices or signs.

5. A person shall not drive a vehicle within the grounds attached to the hospital or belonging thereto—

- (a) at a speed in excess of 8 kilometres per hour;
- (b) other than along a road or parking area except with the prior approval of the Administrator of the hospital; or
- (c) in contravention of any sign erected for the purpose of controlling traffic.

6. A person shall not, except with the prior approval of the Administrator of the hospital, drive within the grounds of the hospital, a vehicle the unladen weight of which exceeds two tonnes.

7. A person who contravenes any provision of these by-laws commits an offence and is liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding ten dollars.

Notice to all Owners and/or Occupiers of Land in the Shire of Goomalling.

PURSUANT to the powers contained in section 33 of the above Act, you are hereby required on or before the 31st day of October, 1978, to remove from the land owned or occupied by you all inflammable materials or to clear firebreaks in accordance with the following, and thereafter to maintain the land or the firebreaks clear of inflammable material up to and including the 31st day of March, 1979.

- (1) In respect of the land owned or occupied by you within the townsite of Goomalling, you shall remove all inflammable materials on the land from the whole of the land, except land zoned as Rural under the Town Planning Scheme currently in force, on which you shall clear of all inflammable material, firebreaks of not less than (3) metres wide immediately inside the external boundaries of the land.

If it is considered to be impractical for any reason to clear firebreaks or to remove inflammable material from the land as required by this Notice you may apply to the Council or its duly authorised officer not later than the 15th day of October, 1978 for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions or to take alternative action to abate fire hazards on the land. If permission is not granted by the Council or its duly authorised officer, you shall comply with the requirements of this Notice.

"Inflammable material" is defined for the purpose of this Notice to include bush, timber, boxes, cartons, paper and like inflammable materials, rubbish and also any combustible matter, but does not include green standing trees or growing bushes and plants in gardens and lawns.

The Penalty for failing to comply with this Notice is a fine of not less than \$10.00 nor more than \$200.00 and a person in default is also liable, whether prosecuted or not, to pay the cost of performing the work directed in this Notice if it is not carried out by the owner or occupier by the date required by this Notice.

Notice to Owners and Occupiers of Land within the Shire of Mingenew.

UNDER the provisions of the above Act you are hereby required to:—

Agriculture Land: On or before the first day of October, 1978, plough, scarify, cultivate or otherwise clear, and thereafter maintain free of all inflammable material until the 15th day of April, 1979, firebreaks of not less than 2.1 metres (approximately 7 feet) in width in the following positions of the land owned or occupied by you:—

- (a) Inside and along the whole of the external boundaries of the property or properties owned or occupied by you;
- (b) Around all crops;

- (a) Vacant Blocks: Provide and thereafter maintain until April 15th, 1979, an effective firebreak around the perimeter of all vacant blocks cleared of all inflammable material to a width of at least 1.8 metres (approximately 6 feet) or completely remove all inflammable material from vacant blocks and thereafter maintain clean until April 15th, 1979;
- (b) Blocks and Buildings: Provide and thereafter maintain until April 15th, 1979, an effective firebreak around the perimeter of all buildings or groups of buildings and inside and along the whole of the boundary of the land, cleared of all inflammable material to a width of at least 1 metre (approximately 3 feet) or where the boundary is closer than 1 metre for that lesser distance.

3. Fuel Depots: Provide and clear of all inflammable material firebreaks at least 3 metres (approximately 10 feet) wide so as to completely surround the perimeter of the land occupied by drums used for the storage of inflammable liquids, whether the drums contain inflammable liquids or not, including any land on which ramps for holding drums are constructed. Also clear of all inflammable material all the land within the firebreak required by this paragraph.

PURSUANT to the powers contained in section 33 of the above Act, you are hereby required on or before the 1st day of November, 1978, (or by such other date as is necessary to comply with paragraph 1 (d) herein) to plough, scarify, cultivate or otherwise clear and thereafter maintain free of all inflammable material until the 31st day of March,

1979, firebreaks of the following dimensions and in the following positions on the land owned or occupied by you:—

1. Rural Lands:

- (a) North Ward: Along the whole of the inside of the external boundaries of the property and within 20 metres of the perimeter of any buildings, group of buildings or haystacks a firebreak of not less than 3 metres in width.
- (b) Central, East and West Wards: Along the whole of the inside of the external boundaries of the property except where those boundaries are in bush and adjoin cleared land, a firebreak of not less than 3 metres in width. Inside and along the whole of any portion of the external boundaries of the property where that portion is in bush and adjoins cleared land, a firebreak of not less than 20 metres in width. Within twenty metres of the perimeter of any buildings, group of buildings or haystacks, a firebreak of not less than 3 metres in width.
- (c) All Properties exceeding 2 025 hectares: Where the total area of a property exceeds 2 025 hectares additional firebreaks of not less than 3 metres in width must be provided in such positions as to divide the property into areas not exceeding 2 025 hectares, each area being completely surrounded by a firebreak.
- (d) Where the bush on land owned or occupied by you has been bulldozed, chained or prepared in any similar manner for clearing by burning (whether you intend to burn the bush or not) you shall forthwith clear a firebreak not less than 20 metres wide immediately inside the external boundaries of land on which bulldozed, chained or otherwise prepared bush is situated.

2. Townsite Land: Clear of all inflammable materials, firebreaks at least 2 metres wide immediately inside all external boundaries of the land and also immediately surrounding all buildings and/or haystacks or groups of buildings and/or haystacks situated on the land.

3. Bulk or Drum Fuel Storage Sites: All bulk or drum Fuel Storage sites to be totally cleared of inflammable materials for a minimum distance of 6 metres around the storage site.

4. No firebreaks will be permitted on any Road or other Reserves.

Notice to Owners and Occupiers of land within the Shire of Moora.

Firebreaks.

1. Pursuant to the powers contained in section 33 of the above Act, you are hereby required, on or before the 1st day of November, 1978, to plough,

scarify, cultivate or otherwise clear, and thereafter maintain free of all inflammable material until the 10th day of April, 1979, in the following positions and of the following dimensions on the land owned or occupied by you:

Rural Lands.

2. Firebreaks not less than two metres in width inside and along the whole of the external boundaries of the properties owned or occupied by you; but where this is not practicable the firebreaks must be provided as near as possible to, and within, such boundaries.

Farm Building and Haystacks.

3. Firebreaks at least three metres in width completely surrounding and not more than twenty metres from the perimeter of any building, group of buildings, or haystack. All inflammable material must be removed from an area two metres in width immediately surrounding the building.

Townsites.

4. On or before the 1st day of November, 1978, all town Lots within the townsites of Moora, Miling, Watheroo and Bindi Bindi are required as follows:

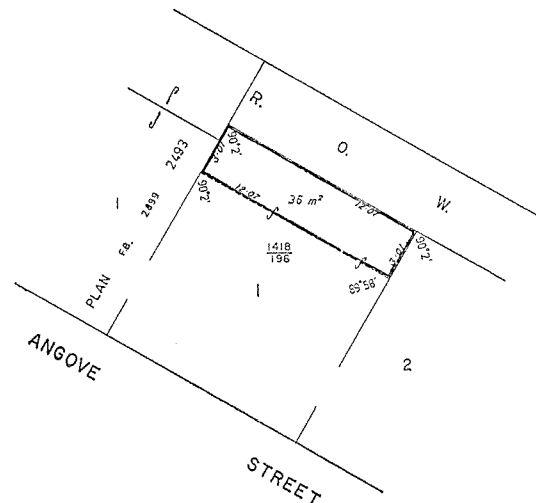

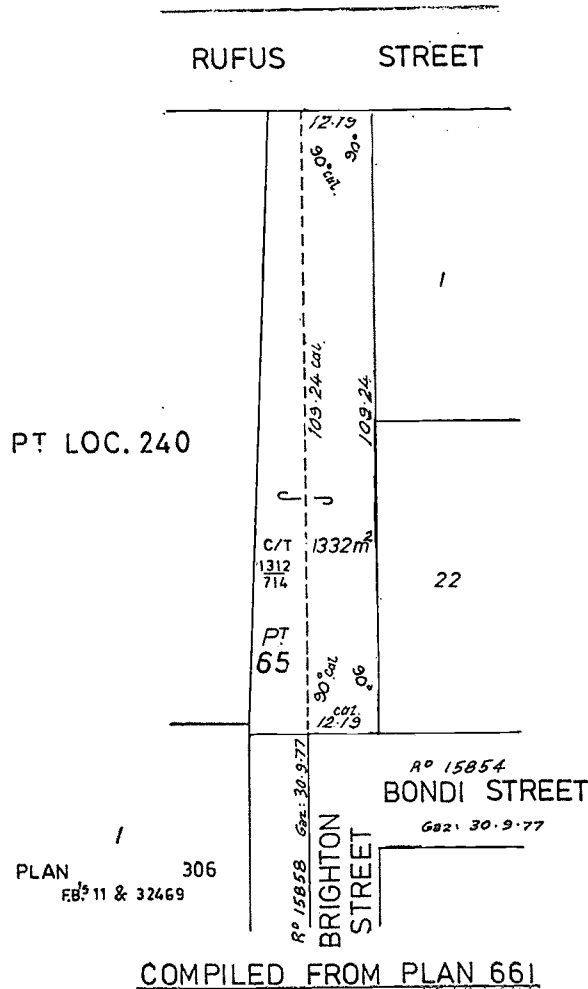

REGULATIONS.

Preliminary.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Public Service Arbitration Act Regulations, 1978.
2. In these regulations, unless the contrary intention appears—
“the Act” means the Public Service Arbitration Act, 1966-1977.
Public Service Arbitration.
3. Every claim, appeal, application or copy thereof under section 14, 15, 16, 17 or 24 of the Act submitted by the Association or an employer shall be entitled in the form of Form 1 in the Schedule to these regulations.
4. An appeal in relation to a matter referred to in paragraph (g) of subsection (1) of section 11 of the Act shall be in the form of Form 2 in the Schedule to these regulations.

5. Every claim, application or appeal submitted to the Arbitrator shall be accompanied by such number of copies thereof as will enable a copy to be forwarded to each party to the claim, application, or appeal.

6. Subject to the Act, the following provisions apply to and in relation to any proceedings before the Arbitrator—

- (a) except with the agreement of all the parties in a matter, notice of not less than seven days shall be given of the time and date of any conference held pursuant to subsection (4) of section 15 of the Act or subsection (4) of section 18 of the Act;
- (b) where the Arbitrator thinks it is necessary to hear evidence in relation to any matter not less than fourteen days notice shall be given of the time and date of the hearing unless all the parties concerned agree to a shorter notice;
- (c) every party to the proceedings shall, within such time as is fixed by the Arbitrator in the notice given pursuant to paragraph (b) of this regulation, serve on the Arbitrator and on every other party to the proceedings a notice listing the names of the witnesses to be called by that party;
- (d) any party may apply to the Arbitrator for permission to call as a witness a person whose name is not listed on a notice referred to in paragraph (c) of this regulation and the Arbitrator may grant or refuse the application;
- (e) where a person whose name is listed as a witness in a notice served by a party pursuant to paragraph (c) of this regulation is not called as a witness by that party any other party may call that person as a witness.

7. (1) Four copies of every agreement entered into between an employer and the Association pursuant to paragraph (a) of subsection (3) of section 14 of the Act, shall be filed with the Arbitrator by the employer within seven days of the date on which the agreement is executed.

(2) The Arbitrator shall register the agreement and shall return a stamped copy to each party to the agreement.

8. The Arbitrator shall cause every order and award and every agreement filed pursuant to regulation 7 of these regulations to be published in the *Western Australian Industrial Gazette*.

Provisions Relating to Appeals to the Western Australian Industrial Appeal Court.

9. The Industrial Arbitration Act (Western Australian Industrial Appeal Court) Regulations, 1964, with such modifications as are necessary for that purpose apply to and in relation to an appeal to the Western Australian Industrial Appeal Court under section 26 of the Act.

The Public Service Appeal Board.

10. Every appeal to the Board under Part III of the Act shall be in writing, signed by the appellant and lodged with the Clerk to the Board within one month after the date of the notice advising of the decision in respect of which the appeal is made and shall clearly and concisely set forth the grounds on which the appeal is made.

11. Upon receipt of a notice of appeal referred to in regulation 10 of these regulations the Clerk to the Board shall forward a copy thereof to the employer concerned, and, where the employer is not the Public Service Board, one copy to the Public Service Board.

12. The Clerk to the Board shall give notice to the parties to the appeal of the date fixed for the hearing of the appeal, which notice shall not, except with the agreement of all parties, be less than fourteen days before the day fixed for the hearing.

13. The Clerk to the Board shall request the Association and the employer to appoint a representative to serve on the Board and the Association and the employer shall forthwith advise the Clerk to the Board in writing of the names of the persons so appointed.

14. (1) An appellant shall, not less than seven days before the date fixed for the hearing, file with the Clerk to the Board—

- (a) a written statement setting out the facts upon which he intends to rely in the appeal; and
- (b) a notice listing the names of the persons he intends to call as witnesses in the appeal.

(2) The employer concerned in any appeal shall, not less than seven days before the hearing of the appeal, file at the office of the Arbitrator a notice listing the names of the persons he intends to call as witnesses in the appeal.

(3) The Clerk of the Board shall forthwith upon receipt of a statement or notice referred to in this regulation cause a copy thereof to be forwarded to the other parties to the appeal.
