IN the matter of the Public Service Property Allowance Award 1975, No. 16 of 1975 and in the matter of a claim made by the Civil Service Association of Western Australia Incorporated that the Award be amended pursuant to Clause 7 thereof.

The parties having reached agreement on the form of the amendment to the Award, I hereby make the following order pursuant to section 18(4) of the Act:

PUBLIC SERVICE PROPERTY ALLOWANCE
AWARD 1975.

No. 16 of 1975.

Amendment No. 13 of 1978.

The Public Service Property Allowance Award 1975, No. 16 of 1975 be, and the same is amended pursuant to the provisions of Clause 7 thereof in accordance with the following schedule, with effect from 18th January, 1978.

Schedule.

1. Clause 4—Substitute "sixty five dollars (\$65)" in lieu of "fifty dollars (\$50)" in subparagraph (a) of the definition of "Prescribed expenses".

2. Clause 5—delete the existing subclause (2) and insert in lieu thereof the following:—

(2) An officer is not entitled to be paid a property allowance under subclause (1) (b) unless he is entitled to be paid a property allowance under subclause (1) (a); provided that the Public Service Board may approve the payment of a property allowance under subclause (1) (b) to an officer who is not entitled to be paid a property allowance under subclause (1) (a) if the Board is satisfied that it was necessary for the officer to purchase a residence or land for the purpose of erecting a residence thereon in this new locality because of his transfer from his former locality, provided also that where a dispute or disagreement exists concerning the necessity to purchase a residence or land it shall be deemed to be a dispute or disagreement within the meaning of section 11 (1) (f) of the Public Service Arbitration Act, 1966-1977.

6. A person who contravenes any provision of these by-laws commits an offence and is liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding ten dollars.

By-Laws Relating to Fencing.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on the 15th day of June, 1976, to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following by-law:—

1. These by-laws, are made for the general control of fences within the townsites of Three Springs and Arrino.

2. In these by-laws, unless the context requires otherwise—

“Council” means the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Three Springs;

“Dangerous Fence” means any fence or wall certified by the Surveyor to be dangerous by reason of its faulty design, construction, deterioration of constituent materials, damage by termites, change in ground level, or other cause subsequent to construction;

"Dividing Fence" means any fence that separates the lands of different owners whether the fence is on the common boundary of adjoining lands or on a line other than the common boundary;

"Fence" means any fence or wall and includes a retaining wall;

"Surveyor" for the purpose of these by-laws means the Building Surveyor, Shire of Three Springs, or an officer appointed by the Council for the purpose of these By-Laws.

3. A person shall not commence to erect, proceed with the erection, rebuild, reconstruct, or alter any fence, pergola or hood attached to any gateway or fence if it is situated within nine (9) metres of a street alignment and exceeds 1.2 metres in height unless and until he has lodged with the Council two copies of a plan and specification of the proposed fence and such plan and specifications or proposed alterations or reconstruction have been approved by the Council.

4. A person shall not commence to erect, proceed with the erection, rebuild, reconstruct, or alter any fence exceeding 1.8 metres in height on the boundary of an allotment unless and until he has lodged with the Council two copies of a plan and specification of the proposed fence or the proposed rebuilding, reconstruction, or alteration, and the Council has approved a copy of the plan and specifications.

5. A person shall not erect a fence exceeding 750 millimetres in height on any frontage of an allotment which is situated at the intersection of two or more streets within a distance of 9 metres from the point of intersection of the lines obtained by extending the street alignments fronting the allotment provided however, that on an allotment being lawfully used for industrial purposes, the Council may permit a link mesh fence to be erected to a greater height than 750 millimetres if the Council is satisfied that any such fence would not materially affect the visibility of drivers of vehicles approaching the intersection.

6. A person shall not erect or affix or allow to remain on any fence bordering an allotment owned or occupied by him in the townsite of Three Springs, any barbed or other wire with spiked or jagged projections nor shall any person erect or affix or allow to remain on any fence bordering an allotment owned or occupied by him in an industrial area any barbed or other wire with spiked or jagged projections unless the wire is carried on posts bent back into the allotment from the boundary at an angle of 45 degrees, and unless the bottom row of wire is set back 300 millimetres from the face of the fence and is not nearer than 2.15 metres to the ground immediately thereunder.

7. A person shall not affix to or allow to remain upon any fence on an allotment owned or occupied by him in any area, any broken glass.

8. A person shall not construct any fence with second hand galvanised iron or other second hand material unless he shall previously have obtained the written consent of the Council, which consent the Council may in its absolute discretion refuse to grant, or grant upon such terms and conditions as it deems fit.

9. A person shall not construct any fence with any material other than brick, concrete, masonry, wrought iron, tubular steel, link mesh, timber sheathed with pickets, palings, boardings, asbestos or other material approved by the Council.

10. The owner and occupier of each allotment within the Municipality of the Shire of Three Springs shall maintain any fence erected on the boundary of that allotment in good condition so as to prevent it from becoming dilapidated, dangerous, unsightly, or prejudicial to the property in or the inhabitants of the neighbourhood.

11. A fence constructed in accordance with the specifications set out in the schedules hereto is hereby prescribed to be a sufficient fence for the purposes of the Dividing Fences Act, 1961.

12. Any person who does anything in contravention of any of the provisions of these By-laws or who fails to carry out any duty or requirement imposed upon him by these By-Laws commits an offence and shall be liable on conviction to a maximum penalty of \$100 and in addition to a maximum daily penalty of \$10 per day during which time the offence continues.

Schedule "A".

FLATS AND RESIDENTIAL AREA.

Across a frontage and for a distance of 9 metres from the street alignment along a side boundary, except By-laws 3 or 5 hereof a fence shall not exceed 1.2 metres in height and shall be constructed in brick, concrete, masonry, wrought iron, tubular steel, link mesh, timber sheathed with pickets, palings, boarding, asbestos or other materials approved by the Council.

Thereafter, along the side boundary and along the rear boundary, the fence shall be constructed as follows:—

1. Corrugated self supporting sheet fencing shall be erected as follows:—
 - (a) Sheets under 1.8 metres to be trenched 0.5 metres in soil.
 - (b) Sheets exceeding 1.8 metres high, but under 2.4 metres high shall be trenched 0.6 metres in soil.
 - (c) Sheets to be lapped and fixed with three galvanised 6 millimetre gutter bolts, nuts and washers.
 - (d) Sheets to be capped with asbestos moulded cap.

"Dividing Fence" means any fence that separates the lands of different owners whether the fence is on the common boundary of adjoining lands or on a line other than the common boundary;

"Fence" means any fence or wall and includes a retaining wall;

"Surveyor" for the purpose of these by-laws means the Building Surveyor, Shire of Three Springs, or an officer appointed by the Council for the purpose of these By-Laws.

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5. A person shall not erect a fence exceeding 750 millimetres in height on any frontage of an allotment which is situated at the intersection of two or more streets within a distance of 9 metres from the point of intersection of the lines obtained by extending the street alignments fronting the allotment provided however, that on an allotment being lawfully used for industrial purposes, the Council may permit a link mesh fence to be erected to a greater height than 750 millimetres if the Council is satisfied that any such fence would not materially affect the visibility of drivers of vehicles approaching the intersection.

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7. A person shall not affix to or allow to remain upon any fence on an allotment owned or occupied by him in any area, any broken glass.

8. A person shall not construct any fence with second hand galvanised iron or other second hand material unless he shall previously have obtained the written consent of the Council, which consent the Council may in its absolute discretion refuse to grant, or grant upon such terms and conditions as it deems fit.

9. A person shall not construct any fence with any material other than brick, concrete, masonry, wrought iron, tubular steel, link mesh, timber sheathed with pickets, palings, boardings, asbestos or other material approved by the Council.

10. The owner and occupier of each allotment within the Municipality of the Shire of Three Springs shall maintain any fence erected on the boundary of that allotment in good condition so as to prevent it from becoming dilapidated, dangerous, unsightly, or prejudicial to the property in or the inhabitants of the neighbourhood.

11. A fence constructed in accordance with the specifications set out in the schedules hereto is hereby prescribed to be a sufficient fence for the purposes of the Dividing Fences Act, 1961.

12. Any person who does anything in contravention of any of the provisions of these By-laws or who fails to carry out any duty or requirement imposed upon him by these By-Laws commits an offence and shall be liable on conviction to a maximum penalty of \$100 and in addition to a maximum daily penalty of \$10 per day during which time the offence continues.

Schedule "A".

FLATS AND RESIDENTIAL AREA.

Across a frontage and for a distance of 9 metres from the street alignment along a side boundary, except By-laws 3 or 5 hereof a fence shall not exceed 1.2 metres in height and shall be constructed in brick, concrete, masonry, wrought iron, tubular steel, link mesh, timber sheathed with pickets, palings, boarding, asbestos or other materials approved by the Council.

Thereafter, along the side boundary and along the rear boundary, the fence shall be constructed as follows:—

1. Corrugated self supporting sheet fencing shall be erected as follows:—
 - (a) Sheets under 1.8 metres to be trenched 0.5 metres in soil.
 - (b) Sheets exceeding 1.8 metres high, but under 2.4 metres high shall be trenched 0.6 metres in soil.
 - (c) Sheets to be lapped and fixed with three galvanised 6 millimetre gutter bolts, nuts and washers.
 - (d) Sheets to be capped with asbestos moulded cap.

2. Other fences to be erected as follows:—
- (a) First posts and rear corner posts shall not be less than 125 mm x 125 mm x 2.15 metres.
 - (b) Intermediate posts shall not be less than 125 mm x 75 mm x 2.15 metres.
 - (c) All posts shall be spaced at not more than 2.75 metres.
 - (d) All posts shall be sunk at least 0.5 metres into the ground.
 - (e) Corner posts shall be strutted two ways with 100 mm x 50 mm soles and 75 mm x 50 mm struts.
 - (f) Posts must have at least two rows of rails.
 - (g) Rails shall be not less than 75 mm x 50 mm, double nailed to each post and each rail shall span two bays of fencing with joints staggered.
 - (h) The fence shall be covered with a material as specified in By-law 9.
 - (i) All pickets or palings shall be placed not more than 75 mm apart and shall be double nailed to each rail.
 - (j) Steel, first, intermediate and corner posts may be used in lieu of timber, with the written approval of the Council.

Schedule "B".

Fences in "Showroom", "Warehouse Offices", "Office", "Central Commercial", "Mineral Exploration" and "Industrial Areas".

1. Corrugated self supporting sheet fencing shall be erected as follows:—
- (a) Sheets under 1.8 metres high to be trenched 0.5 metre in soil.
 - (b) Sheets exceeding 1.8 metres high, but under 2.4 metres high, shall be trenched 0.6 metres in soil.
 - (c) Sheets to be lapped and fixed with three galvanised 6 millimetre gutter bits, nuts and washers.
 - (d) Sheets to be capped with asbestos moulded cap.

2. Other fences to be erected as follows:—

Corner and gate posts shall be constructed of galvanised iron piping having an internal diameter of not less than 50 mm and shall have caps to tops and set into concrete blocks having a depth of not less than 0.6 metres and sides of a width of not less than 225 mm.

Struts shall be constructed of galvanised iron piping having a nominal bore of 32 mm set into concrete bases. Specification of footing required 225 mm x 500 mm.

Corner posts shall have not less than two struts at right angles to each other, and gate posts not less than one strut.

Intermediate posts shall be constructed of galvanised iron piping having a nominal bore of 40 mm and shall have caps to tops and set into concrete blocks having a depth of not less than 0.5 metre and sides of a width not less than 225 mm spaced at not more than 3.6 metres centre.

Cables shall be affixed to the top, centre and bottom of all posts and shall consist of two or more 3.15 mm diameter wires twisted together or alternatively 4 mm coiled tension wire.

Galvanised link mesh shall not be less than 1.8 metres high and constructed of 50 mm mesh 2.5 mm diameter galvanised iron wire and shall be strained, neatly secured and laced to the posts and affixed to cables.

Gates shall provide an opening of not less than 3.6 metres and shall be constructed of diagonal bracing of an outer frame from 25 mm nominal bore galvanised piping and inner frame from 20 mm nominal bore galvanised piping.

ASBESTOS REGULATIONS, 1978.

PART I.—PRELIMINARY.

- Citation. 1. These regulations may be cited as the Asbestos Regulations, 1978.
- Application. 2. These regulations apply to—
(a) any factory in which an asbestos process is carried out; and
(b) any premises to which the operation of the Factories and Shops Act, 1963 has been extended in accordance with section 6 of the Act and in which an asbestos process is carried out.
- Arrangement. 3. These regulations are divided into Parts as follows—
PART I.—PRELIMINARY. Regs. 1-4.
PART II.—DUTIES of OCCUPIER. Regs. 5-14.
PART III.—CLEANING AND MAINTENANCE ETC. Regs. 15-17.
PART IV.—ASBESTOS MATERIALS. Regs. 18-20.
PART V.—MEDICAL EXAMINATIONS. Regs. 21-27.
PART VI.—MISCELLANEOUS. Regs. 28-29.
- Interpretation. 4. In these regulations, unless the contrary intention appears—
“asbestos” means the minerals crocidolite, amosite, chrysotile, fibrous anthophyllite, tremolite, actinolite and any mixture of them;
“asbestos dust” means air containing a time weighted average fibre concentration, as measured by a method approved by the Commissioner, in excess of the threshold limit value;
“asbestos process” means any manufacturing process involving the use or handling of asbestos, or any substance containing asbestos where asbestos dust is emitted by the process;
“asbestos processing area” means a workroom or part of a factory in which an asbestos process is carried on;
“authorised medical officer” means a legally qualified medical practitioner registered under the Medical Act, 1894 and approved by the Commissioner;
“Commissioner” means the Commissioner of Public Health appointed under the Health Act, 1911;
“exhaust system” means a system whereby asbestos dust and other airborne matter is removed from the air, and includes any collecting hood, ductwork and fan whereby dust containing asbestos is collected, any air cleaning device whereby such dust is removed from the air, any collector, bin or receptacle into which such dust is collected and the means whereby such collector, bin or receptacle is emptied of the dust it contains;
“prescribed medical examination” means a medical examination performed by an authorized medical officer consisting of—
(a) a chest x-ray photograph (posterior and anterior, 350 mm x 430 mm);
(b) pulmonary function tests;
(c) a clinical examination; and
(d) a statement of the occupational history of the person examined;
“regulation” means one of these regulations;
“threshold limit value” means a long term average fibre concentration of two fibres of asbestos per millilitre of air, whether containing any other material or not.

PART II.—DUTIES OF OCCUPIER.

- Persons to be protected from inhaling asbestos dust. 5. (1) Where in any area of a factory there is present asbestos dust which is likely to be inhaled by persons engaged in an asbestos process, the occupier shall provide—
(a) an efficient exhaust system capable of removing asbestos dust from the air; or
(b) where, in the circumstances, it is not possible to comply with paragraph (a) of this subregulation, an approved respiratory protective device and protective clothing for each person, capable of shielding the person from exposure to asbestos dust; and

- (c) screens, partitions or other suitable means to prevent asbestos dust from escaping into any area where an adequate exhaust system has not been provided.
- (2) Where in any area of a factory a person who is employed in any process involving the cleaning, inspection, examination, testing or maintenance of—
- the interior of an asbestos processing area;
 - equipment, furniture or fittings within an asbestos processing area; or
 - dust collecting equipment, including the removal and emptying of such equipment,
- is likely to inhale asbestos dust, the occupier shall provide approved respiratory protective devices, protective clothing, screens and partitions, in accordance with the provisions of paragraphs (b) and (c) of subregulation (1) of this regulation.
- (3) For the purposes of paragraph (d) of subregulation (1) of this regulation, a respiratory protective device is a device which complies with the Australian Standards Specification for Respiratory Protective Devices published by the Standards Association of Australia and numbered AS 1716-1975.
- Exhaust system.** 6. An exhaust system provided pursuant to paragraph (c) of subregulation (1) of regulation 5 shall—
- make provision for the effective collection of asbestos dust from the exhaust draught; and
 - be kept in operation at all times throughout the asbestos process and for such time thereafter as is necessary to remove from the asbestos processing area, all asbestos dust.
- Dust collectors.** 7. (1) Any dust collectors provided pursuant to paragraph (a) of regulation 6 shall—
- be installed in an enclosure or enclosures designed to prevent, as far as is practicable, the escape of asbestos dust into the air of any asbestos processing area;
 - be replaced forthwith whenever a leakage of asbestos dust occurs; and
 - not be emptied, cleaned, agitated or reconditioned except by mechanical or other suitable means.
- Inspection.** 8. (1) The occupier shall make provision for the exhaust system to be—
- inspected at least once in every 7 days; and
 - examined at intervals not exceeding 3 months,
- by a person with suitable qualifications to conduct such inspections and examinations.
- (2) A person making an inspection pursuant to paragraph (a) of subregulation (1) may make recommendations with respect to the maintenance or replacement of any components of the exhaust system to the occupier.
- Report.** 9. (1) A person making an examination pursuant to paragraph (b) of subregulation (1) of regulation 8 shall furnish the occupier with a report which shall—
- list the components of the exhaust system that were inspected or examined;
 - give details of the results of such inspection or examination with respect to each component of the exhaust system listed pursuant to paragraph (a) of this subregulation; and
 - make any recommendations with respect to the maintenance or replacement of any components of the exhaust system.
- (2) The occupier shall keep any report provided pursuant to subregulation (1) of this regulation in the factory for a period of not less than 2 years.
- Maintenance of exhaust system.** 10. The occupier shall ensure that any defective item or component of an exhaust system is immediately repaired or replaced.
- Use of respiratory protective devices and protective clothing.** 11. Where a person has been provided with a respiratory protective device and protective clothing, pursuant to paragraph (d) of subregulation (1) of regulation 5, the occupier shall—
- instruct each person in the function and proper use of the respiratory protective device and protective clothing;
 - ensure that each respiratory protective device is thoroughly cleaned whenever necessary, and that each item of protective clothing is cleaned in accordance with regulation 12; and
 - not permit any respiratory protective device or protective clothing used by a person, to be used by another person unless it has been thoroughly cleaned since last being used.
- Cleaning of protective clothing.** 12. (1) All items of protective clothing shall be cleaned—
- within the factory, if there exist adequate facilities for the process; or
 - at a laundry (which shall not be a domestic laundry).

(2) All items of protective clothing which are to be despatched to a laundry for cleaning shall be thoroughly wetted, sealed in impermeable bags and clearly marked to show that they contain asbestos contaminated apparel, before being sent to the laundry.

Provision of change rooms and lockers.

13. (1) The occupier shall provide for the use of persons issued with respiratory protective devices and protective clothing a conveniently accessible change room, with an adequate vacuum exhaust system to enable such persons to clean any dust from their protective clothing, so as to prevent any person from inhaling asbestos dust as a result of handling respiratory protective devices and protective clothing.

(2) The occupier shall provide, within the change room, for each person—

- (a) a dust-proof locker for the storage of street clothes; and
- (b) a separate dust-proof locker, or a separate dust-proof compartment of the locker referred to in paragraph (a) of this subregulation for the storage of protective clothing and respiratory protective devices.

(3) For the purposes of paragraph (b) of subregulation (1) of this regulation, a compartment of a locker is not separate from the locker unless it is completely shut off from the remainder of the locker when the door of the locker is closed.

Persons to use protective equipment.

14. A person for whose use protective clothing or a respiratory protective device has been provided shall—

- (a) wear and make proper use of the protective clothing and respiratory protective device as instructed by the occupier;
- (b) forthwith report to the occupier any defect he discovers in the protective clothing or respiratory protective device; and
- (c) make proper use of the change room and locker or lockers provided for the storage of street clothes, protective clothing and respiratory protective devices.

PART III.—CLEANING AND MAINTENANCE ETC.

Asbestos processing areas to be cleaned.

15. (1) The occupier shall ensure that every asbestos processing area within the factory is maintained in a clean condition and in particular that—

- (a) all machinery, apparatus, equipment, workbenches, furniture and other fittings used for the purposes of an asbestos process;
- (b) the external surfaces of any exhaust system and vacuum cleaning equipment; and
- (c) the floor, walls, ceiling or inside part of the roof, and other interior surfaces,

are kept free from accumulations of dust containing asbestos and other waste materials.

(2) All items required to be cleaned pursuant to subregulation (1) of this regulation shall be cleaned only by means of vacuum cleaning equipment suitable for that purpose or other suitable means.

(3) The occupier shall ensure that cleaning shall be done in the case of—

- (a) those parts of a floor where dust containing asbestos is reasonably likely to accumulate, at least once in each day during which an asbestos process is carried on;
- (b) walls, ceiling or inside parts of a roof, and other interior surfaces, at intervals of not more than 12 months, commencing from the date on which these regulations take effect;
- (c) work benches and other items referred to in paragraph (a) of subregulation (1) of this regulation which are used during an asbestos process, immediately after the cessation of a period of work in the asbestos processing area; and
- (d) any surface on which dust containing asbestos is deposited as a result of cleaning, immediately.

Inspector may require item to be cleaned.

16. Notwithstanding any of the provisions of subregulation (3) of regulation 15 an inspector may, where it appears to him to be reasonably necessary to do so, require an occupier by notice in writing to clean any of the items referred to in subregulation (3) of regulation 15 at more frequent intervals.

General maintenance.

17. The occupier shall ensure that all exhaust equipment protective clothing, and respiratory protective devices, and every other thing, provided in the factory pursuant to these regulations shall be maintained in good order, condition and repair and in an efficient state and, in the case of mechanical equipment or devices, in good and efficient working order.

PART IV.—ASBESTOS MATERIALS.

Asbestos material.

18. In these regulations "asbestos material" means—

- (a) any loose asbestos fibre or any material containing any loose asbestos fibre for use in an asbestos process; or
- (b) any other waste containing dry, loose asbestos fibre that has been collected within the factory.

- Storage and disposal of asbestos materials.
19. (1) Asbestos material shall not be—
- (a) despatched from or (so far as is practicable) received into an asbestos processing area; or
 - (b) stored in a factory, unless it is contained in a receptacle which prevents the escape of asbestos dust or is being transported within the factory in a completely enclosed system of conveyance.
- (2) Where asbestos material is disposed of as waste, the occupier shall ensure that the disposal is carried out in such a manner so as to prevent any person in the process of disposing of such material, from inhaling asbestos dust.
- Crocidolite.
20. Crocidolite shall not be handled or used in an asbestos process except in accordance with directions of the Chief Inspector.

PART V.—MEDICAL EXAMINATIONS.

- Occupier to arrange medical examinations.
21. Subject to these regulations, an occupier shall not employ any person in an asbestos process whereby that person is likely to be exposed, whether directly or indirectly, to asbestos dust unless that person undergoes the prescribed medical examination—
- (a) within 90 days after the commencement of employment with the occupier of the factory;
 - (b) at intervals of no longer than 3 years after the commencement of employment; and
 - (c) within 30 days preceding or following the termination of employment, unless the person has been employed for less than 5 years or has within the 2 years next preceding the termination of his employment undergone the prescribed medical examination.
- Authorized medical officer may recommend further examinations.
22. Where the authorized medical officer who conducts the prescribed medical examination is of the opinion that for any reason associated with the inhalation of asbestos dust by the person examined, a further medical examination of that person is desirable, and notifies the occupier of that opinion, the occupier shall make such arrangements as are necessary to have the person further examined.
- Occupier not to employ person suffering from disease.
23. (1) Where the authorized medical officer who conducts the prescribed medical examination notifies the occupier that the person examined is suffering from any disease (whether accompanied by a disability or not) that is attributable to the inhalation of asbestos dust, the occupier shall not continue to employ that person in any work which would expose that person to inhaling any asbestos dust, unless a certificate from an authorized medical officer is produced stating that the person is fit to be employed in work which would be liable to expose him to the inhalation of asbestos dust in a concentration not exceeding one quarter of the threshold limit value.
- (2) An occupier of any factory to which these regulations apply who has actual notice of an opinion by an authorized medical officer that a person is suffering from a disease that is attributable to the inhalation of asbestos dust, shall not employ that person in any work which would expose the person to the inhalation of asbestos dust, unless a certificate, pursuant to subregulation (1) of this regulation is produced to him.
- Person to attend medical examination.
24. (1) A person for whom arrangements are made to attend a prescribed medical examination or any further medical examination, shall attend for and undergo the examination, in accordance with those arrangements.
- (2) Where a person is required to attend for and undergo a medical examination and fails, without reasonable excuse to do so, the occupier, on being advised of the failure to attend for the examination, by the authorized medical officer, shall—
- (a) notify the Chief Inspector; and
 - (b) cease to employ that person in any asbestos process or within an asbestos processing area, until that person has attended the required examination.
- Occupier to be furnished with results of examination.
25. (1) The occupier shall make arrangements with the authorized medical officer to—
- (a) inform the person examined of the results of the examination;
 - (b) inform the occupier of the results of the examination of each person who has been examined; and
 - (c) furnish the occupier with the report and x-ray photographs of any person found to be suffering from any disease, whether accompanied by any disability or not, which in the opinion of the authorized medical officer is attributable to the inhalation of asbestos dust.
- (2) Where the occupier receives a report and x-ray photographs, pursuant to paragraph (c) of subregulation (1) of this regulation, he shall—
- (a) notify the Commissioner of the results of the report, forthwith;
 - (b) furnish the Commissioner with any report and x-ray photographs, on request; and
- Occupier to notify Commissioner of positive results.

(c) make suitable arrangements to keep all reports and x-ray photographs in the factory for the period of employment of the person to whom the reports and x-ray photographs relate, and thereafter, for 40 years.

Occupier
to pay
for costs
of examina-
tion.

26. The occupier shall be responsible for arranging for an employee to attend a prescribed medical examination pursuant to regulation 21, all costs incurred in attending for and carrying out such medical examination and any other medical examination made pursuant to regulation 22, and shall not involve a person who is to undergo a prescribed medical examination in any expense or unreasonable inconvenience.

Occupier
to keep
Health
Register.

27. The occupier shall keep in the factory a Health Register, containing details with respect to persons required to undergo a prescribed medical examination pursuant to the regulations under this Part of—

- (a) the name, home address and duties of the person;
- (b) the date of each prescribed medical examination and any subsequent medical examination of the person, which may be required pursuant to regulation 22; and
- (c) particulars of every report furnished to the occupier in respect of such examination by the authorized medical officer who carried out the examination.

PART VI.—MISCELLANEOUS.

Inspection
of reports.

28. (1) The occupier shall, on request of an inspector, produce for examination—

- (a) any report kept pursuant to regulation 25;
- (b) any report and x-ray photographs kept pursuant to paragraph (c) of subregulation (2) of regulation 25, for the purpose of determining that such reports and x-ray photographs are being kept in accordance with that regulation; and
- (c) the Health Register, kept pursuant to regulation 27.

(2) The inspector may require any report referred to in paragraph (a) of subregulation (1) of this regulation or the Health Register referred to in paragraph (c) of subregulation (1) of this regulation to be photocopied, in whole or in part.

Penalty.

29. A person who contravenes by act or omission any of the provisions of these regulations shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a penalty not exceeding \$200.
