- 3.30 Special Rural Zone.—The following provisions shall apply specifically to all land included in the Special Rural Zone in addition to any provisions which are more generally applicable to such land under this Scheme—

- (a) The objective of the Special Rural Zone is to select areas within the rural areas wherein closer subdivision will be permitted to provide for such uses as hobby farms, horse breeding, rural-residential retreats, intensive agriculture including market gardens and viticulture, and also to make provision for retention of the rural landscape and amenity in a manner consistent with the orderly and proper planning of such areas.
- (b) The provisions for controlling subdivision, land uses and development relating to specific Special Rural Zones will be as laid down in the Schedule (4) to the Scheme and future subdivision will accord with the Plan of Subdivision for the specified area referred to in the Schedule and such plan of Subdivision shall form part of the Scheme.

Before making provision for a Special Rural Zone, Council will prepare, or require the owner(s) of the land to prepare, a submission supporting the creation of the Special Rural Zone, and such submission shall include:

- (i) A statement as to the purpose or intent for which the zone is being created.
 - (ii) The reasons for selecting the particular area the subject of the proposed zone with particular reference as to how this relates to the Council's Rural Planning Strategy.
 - (iii) A plan or plans showing contours at such intervals as to adequately depict the land form of the area and physical features such as existing buildings, rock outcrops, trees or groups of trees, lakes, rivers, creeks swamps, orchards, wells and significant improvements.
 - (iv) Information regarding the method whereby it is proposed to provide a potable water supply to each lot.
 - (v) The proposed staging of the subdivision and development and the criteria to be met before successive stages are implemented.
- (c) The Scheme provisions for a Specific Special Rural Zone shall include a Plan of Subdivision showing:

- (i) The proposed ultimate subdivision including lot sizes and dimensions.
- (ii) Areas to be set aside for Public Open Space, pedestrian accessways, horse trails, community facilities, etc., as may be considered appropriate.
- (iii) Those physical features it is intended to conserve.
- (iv) The proposed staging of the subdivision where relevant.

(d) In addition to the Plan of Subdivision the Scheme provisions for a specific Special Rural Zone shall specify:

- (i) The facilities which the purchasers of the lots will be required to provide (e.g., their own potable water supply, liquid and solid waste disposal system, etc.)
 - (ii) Proposals for the control of land uses and development which will ensure that the purpose of intent of the zone and the rural environment and amenities are not impaired.
 - (iii) Any special provisions appropriate to secure the objectives of the zone.
- (e) In addition to a Building Licence, the Council's prior approval to commence development is required for all development except for a private dwelling house and such application shall be made in the form of the Third Schedule to this Scheme and be subject to the provisions of Part (3) of the Scheme.

Before modifying any requirement or standard the Council may require that the owner or developer enter into an agreement to use or develop the building or land in a particular manner, and in case of a breach of the agreement the Council shall enforce the requirements of the Scheme.

Where a use is proposed that is not listed in the Special Provisions of this part, that use is not permitted unless Council gives its approval in writing after giving consideration to the possible effect that such a use would have on the amenity, public

health, convenience and economy of the existing or planned uses nearby; Council shall before considering each application:—

- (i) Place in a conspicuous position on the site proposed for such a use and in the office of the Council, a notice explaining the proposed uses.
 - (ii) Advertise the proposed use, once a week for three consecutive weeks in a daily newspaper having a circulation in the District; the cost of the advertisements shall be borne by the applicant.
 - (iii) Give notice of the proposed use to the owners and occupiers of all land nearby that in the opinion of the Council may be affected by the proposed use. All costs resulting from this action shall be borne by the applicant.

- (iv) Consider any objection to and support for the proposed use, which are delivered to the Council in writing within 35 days of the date shown on the notice.

- Principal regulations. 1. In these regulations the Education Act Regulations, 1960, as reprinted pursuant to the Reprinting of Regulations Act, 1954, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 19th March, 1971, and thereafter amended from time to time by notices so published are referred to as the principal regulations.
- Reg. 57E substituted. 2. Regulation 57E of the principal regulations is revoked and the following regulation is substituted—
57E. (1) This regulation applies, pursuant to section 27C of the Act, to the payment of grants to pre-school centres in relation to the number of children enrolled therein.
(2) When a pre-school centre wishes to apply for grants under this regulation, the teacher in charge of the pre-school centre shall apply therefor to the Minister at such time and in such form as the Minister from time to time determines.
(3) The Minister shall, subject to subregulation (4) and as soon as practicable after—
(a) 1st January in each year, ascertain the value of the total grant paid during the preceding calendar year in respect of each child enrolled in pre-school centres;
(b) he has ascertained the value of the total grant referred to in paragraph (a) of this subregulation, pay in respect of each child enrolled in each applicant pre-school centre on the last Friday in February of the current calendar year fifty *per centum* of that value (in this subregulation called "the first instalment");
(c) 1st August in each year, assess the average cost in a Government school of a pre-primary pupil by dividing the expenditure incurred in respect of pre-primary instruction in Government schools during the preceding financial year by the number of pre-primary pupils enrolled in Government schools on 1st August in the current calendar year;
(d) he has assessed the average cost referred to in paragraph (c) of this subregulation, pay in respect of each child enrolled in each applicant pre-school centre on 1st August of the current calendar year the difference between twenty-five *per centum* of that average cost and the amount of the first instalment paid during that year. .
(4) The Minister—
(a) may pay grants under this regulation in the form of—
(i) money;
(ii) goods and services supplied by the Minister to the pre-school concerned;
(iii) goods and services supplied by a person other than the Minister to the pre-school concerned but paid for by the Minister; or

- (iv) any combination of two or three of the forms referred to in subparagraphs (i) to (iii) of this paragraph;
- (b) shall not pay a grant under this regulation in respect of a child—
- (i) who is not a pupil at the pre-school centre which applied for the grant;
 - (ii) who does not attain the age of five years during the calendar year in which the grant is applied for;
 - (iii) none of whose parents is a permanent resident of Western Australia.
- (5) In subregulation (3) of this regulation—
 “applicant pre-school centre” means pre-school centre which applied under subregulation (2) of this regulation during the current calendar year for grants.

(8) In paragraph (b) of subregulation (6) of this regulation—

“the South-West Division” means the South-West Division of the State as defined by section 28 of the Land Act, 1933-1977.
