ABORIGINAL AFFAIRS PLANNING AUTHORITY ACT, 1972.

Aboriginal Affairs Planning Authority,

THE Lieutenant Governor and Deputy of the Governor in Executive Council, acting pursuant to the powers conferred on him by the Aboriginal Affairs Planning Authority Act, 1972, has been pleased to make the regulations set out in the Schedule hereunder.

Schedule.

REGULATIONS.

1. In these regulations the Aboriginal Affairs Planning Authority Act Regulations, 1972, published in the *Government Gazette* on 30th June, 1972, are referred to as the principal regulations.

2. Regulation 8 of the principal regulations is amended—

(a) as to subregulation (1)—

(i) by deleting the word "Commissioner", where it appears in two places in line four, and substituting in each case the word "Minister"; and

(ii) by deleting the words "recommend to the Minister to" in line five;

(b) as to subregulation (2), by deleting the word "The", at the commencement, and substituting the passage "Subject to the provisions of subregulation (3) of this regulation the"; and

(c) by adding a new subregulation as follows—

(3) Before granting any permission to a person to enter or remain within the boundaries of a reserve pursuant to this regulation, the Minister shall consult the Aboriginal Lands Trust in the matter, but if the decision of the Minister differs in any material way from the views in the matter expressed to the Minister by the Aboriginal Lands Trust the Minister shall cause a report on the matter and the reason for his decision to be notified to the Aboriginal Lands Trust and laid before each House of Parliament as soon as may be practicable thereafter.
