Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and .
Drainage Act, 1909-1978.

Metropolitan Water Supply.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.B. 569071/78.

WHEREAS by the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909-1978, it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Board shall, with the approval of the Governor have power to construct provide and extend Water Works, Sewerage Works and Metropolitan Main Drainage Works; and whereas the preliminary requirements of the said Act have been complied with and the plan in respect of the works hereinafter mentioned has been submitted to and approved by the Governor in Council: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby empower the Metropolitan Water Supply,

Sewerage and Drainage Board to undertake the construction of the following works under the said Act, namely:

Shire of Wanneroo and City of Stirling. Land Around Beach Road and Edlaston Road near Kersey Way.

Hamersley Pumping Station No. 15, Rising Main and Connecting Gravity Sewer.

Generally, the works comprise of-

- (a) A pumping station located on a proposed pump site adjacent to the western side of the Recreation Reserve ↑ 32896-9044 north of Beach Road.
- (b) A 100 mm rising main commencing at the pumping station in (a) above and proceeding southerly to Beach Road, thence easterly along the southern side of the Recreation Reserve ↑ 32896-9044 in (a) above next to Beach Road for about forty metres and southerly across Beach Road, thence easterly along the northern side of land adjacent to Beach Road for about one hundred and fifty metres and southeasterly to Edlaston Road to terminate at the proposed Manhole Q 0143 in Edlaston Road, a distance of about three hundred and forty metres.
- (c) A 230 mm gravity sewer commencing at the proposed manhole Q 0143 in (b) above and proceeding southeasterly to the south side of Edlaston Road to terminate at the existing manhole N 278, a distance of about fifteen metres.

The above works and localities are shown on Plan MWB 15559.

This Order in Council shall take effect from the 15th day of December, 1978.
