AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chambers at Perth this 20th day of December, 1978, the following Orders in Council were authorised to be issued:—

Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and  
Drainage Act, 1909-1978.

Metropolitan Main Drainage.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.B. 488342/74.

WHEREAS by the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909-1978, it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Board shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct, provide and extend Water Works, Sewerage Works and Metropolitan Main Drainage Works; and whereas the preliminary requirements of the said Act have been complied with and the plan in respect of the works hereinafter mentioned has been submitted to and approved by the Governor in Council: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby empower the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Board to undertake the construction of the following works under the said Act, namely:—

Shire of Armadale/Kelmscott.

Denny Avenue Main Drain—Takeover and Improvements—Woburn Way to Railway Avenue.

1. The takeover of that portion of the Denny Avenue Drain which commences at an existing inlet structure approximately eight metres southwest of the rear boundary of Lot 715 Woburn Way, Kelmscott, and continues downstream to join the presently constituted Denny Avenue Main Drain at the western boundary of Railway Avenue between Third Avenue and Fifth Avenue Kelmscott. The total length of drain to be taken over is approximately 1 350 metres and is comprised of both open channel and reinforced concrete pipe (diametres ranging from 450 mm to 750 mm.

In due course the portion of drain described above will be constituted as a Metropolitan Main Drain and improved as deemed necessary.

2. An initial improvement will be the construction of a drainage compensating basin to be situated alongside a section of the existing pipe drain in Public Recreation Reserve  $\uparrow$ 35233 (lot 3017) Third Avenue, Kelmscott.

Further improvements will comprise deepening, widening, piping, relocating and bank forming.

3. The takeover and improvements to be complete with all necessary structures, apparatus and things connected therewith and will include any land actions arising therefrom.

The drain and compensating basin described above are shown on plan M.W.B. 15735.

This Order in Council shall take effect from the 5th day of January, 1979.

with and the plan in respect of the works hereinafter mentioned has been submitted to and approved by the Governor in Council: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby empower the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Board to undertake the construction of the following works under the said Act, namely:—

Shire of Armadale/Kelmscott.

460 mm Water Main—Roleystone, Peet Road to Westborne Road.

The construction of a four hundred and sixty millimetre nominal diameter steel water main below ground and approximately two thousand one hundred and fifty metres in length complete with valve pits and all other necessary apparatus. Commencing at a point within Lot 10 Peet Road and thence proceeding in a general northerly direction to and across Peet Road to Mackie Road; thence in a general easterly direction along Mackie Road to Notting Hill Drive; thence along Notting Hill Drive in general northerly and then easterly directions to Michael Road; thence continuing in a general easterly direction along Michael Road to Norman Road; thence in a general northerly direction along Norman Road to Slab Gully Road; thence in a general easterly direction along Slab Gully Road to Alice Road; thence in a general northerly direction along Alice Road to Hall Road; thence in a general easterly direction along Hall Road to Dreyer Road; thence in a general northerly direction along Dreyer Road to Wygonda Road; thence in a general easterly direction along Wygonda Road to Holden Road; thence in a general northerly direction along Holden Road to Westborne Road and terminating thereat.

The above works and localities are shown on plan M.W.B. 15807.

This Order in Council shall take effect from the 5th day of January, 1979.

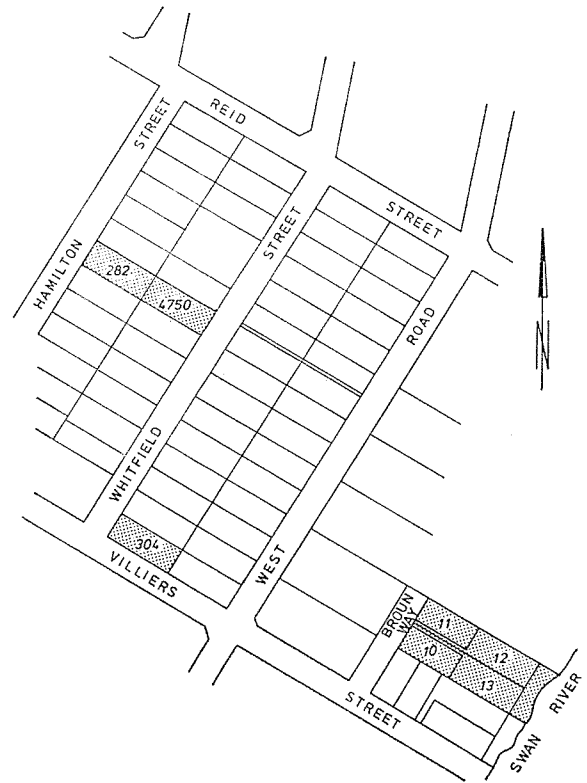

1. These by-laws may be cited as the Carnarvon Regional Hospital (Traffic and Grounds) By-laws.
2. In these by-laws unless the contrary intention appears—  
“hospital” means the public hospital known by the name of the Carnarvon Regional Hospital;  
“vehicle” has the same meaning as that term has in and for the purpose of the Road Traffic Act, 1974, or any Act for the regulation and control of traffic enacted in substitution for that Act, for the time being in force.
3. A person shall not, without lawful excuse be in or upon the hospital premises or the grounds attached or belonging thereto whether enclosed or fenced or not.
4. A person shall not park a vehicle or cause or permit a vehicle to be parked within the grounds attached to the hospital or belonging thereto except in an area set apart by the Board of the hospital for the purpose and so designated by suitable notices or signs.
5. (1) A person shall not drive a vehicle within the grounds attached to the hospital or belonging thereto—  
(a) at a speed in excess of 8 kilometres per hour;  
(b) other than along a road or parking area except with the prior approval of the administrator of the hospital; or  
(c) in contravention of any sign erected for the purpose of controlling traffic.  
(2) A person shall not drive a vehicle the unladen weight of which exceeds two tonnes within the grounds attached to the hospital or belonging thereto.
6. A person who contravenes any provision of these by-laws commits an offence and is liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding ten dollars.

3. That clause 7A be amended by inserting at the commencement of the clause the words "Subject to clause 8 and clause 46 of this By-law".
4. That clauses 46 and 47 be deleted and the following substituted therefor:
  46. Where the standing of a vehicle on any part of a road whether such part be marked as a parking stall or not is prohibited for more than a specified time or where any part of a road is in a metered zone the holder of a residential parking permit is exempted from such prohibition or from the requirements of clauses 6, 7 and 7A of this By-law as the case may be provided that such exemption shall apply only:
    - (i) to the road specified in the permit or where appropriate to that portion of the road specified in the permit or to the metered space or spaces specified in the permit;
    - (ii) if such permit is affixed to the windscreen or a window of the vehicle in a prominent position;
    - (iii) if the period in respect of which the permit was issued has not expired;
    - (iv) if the holder of the permit at the time of standing such vehicle still lives in the premises in respect of which the permit was granted.
  47. The Council may on written application being made to it and upon payment of the following fees,
    - for a person eligible under the Pensioners (Rates Rebates and Deferments) Act Amendment Act, 1978 Five dollars (\$5.00) per annum; for other persons Fifty dollars (\$50.00) per annum or Thirteen dollars (\$13.00) per quarter or part thereof expiring on the last day of the months of December, March, June and September;issue a residential parking permit for a period not exceeding one year for a vehicle registered in the name of a person who
    - (a) (i) is the owner or occupier of a single tenement dwelling house adjacent to a part of a road whereon the standing of a vehicle is prohibited for more than a specified time or adjacent to a part of a road which is in a metered zone and who lives in that house; and
    - (ii) is unable to obtain vehicular access to the land on which that house is erected from either the street or a right of way, or
    - (b) (i) is the owner and occupier of a residential unit being part of a building adjacent to part of a road whereon the standing of a vehicle is prohibited for more than a specified time or is adjacent to a part of a road which is in a metered zone and who lives in that unit; and
    - (ii) has no access to permanent off street parking facilities set aside for that unit.
5. That clause 48 be amended by inserting after the words "the same house" the words "or residential unit".
6. That clause 50(ii) be amended by inserting after the words "the house" the words "or residential unit".

7. That clause 50 (iv) be deleted and the following substituted therefor:  
 (iv) The name of the road to which the exemption granted by clause 46 applies or where appropriate a description of that part of the road to which that exemption applies or the metered space or spaces to which that exemption applies;
