(c) in the undesignated paragraph beneath the subheading "Paying Officer, Treasury.", by deleting—

(i) the third such paragraph and substituting the following undesignated paragraph—

Schedules must be stamped with the Treasury "PAID" stamp after being recorded in the expenditure Cash Book. With the exception of wages and salaries, receipts will not be obtained on vouchers. The presentation of cheques to the payee's account, or the endorsement of cheques when deposited to accounts other than the payee's, will constitute the discharge. ;

(ii) the fourth such paragraph and substituting the following undesignated paragraph—

The department schedule, voucher or reference number and particulars requisite for the public creditor's information must be quoted on the payee's advice section of the cheque or attachment. ; and

(iii) the sixth and seventh such paragraphs.

in the Department of Lands and Surveys.

(Regulation 150.)

I, DAVID JOHN WORDSWORTH, Minister for Lands, acting under the provisions of regulation 150 of the Regulations for the Guidance of Surveyors in the Department of Lands and Surveys, hereby fix the remuneration payable to surveyors for surveys carried out under those regulations as the amounts set out in the Schedule below with effect on and from the 15th day of January, 1979.

## Schedule.

The fees payable to surveyors for surveys carried out under the regulations shall be as follows—

## 1. CADASTRAL SURVEYS RURAL:

- (a) For each survey effected under a separate instruction, a basic fee of \$60.00 will be paid.
- (b) Only one basic fee will apply where two or more surveys are effected at the same time and utilise common establishment or re-establishment.
- (c) In addition to the basic fee a linear base rate of \$73.50 per kilometre will be paid for the definition of new boundaries. The cost of placing and provision of survey marks and reading of angles is inclusive in this charge.
- (d) The rate shall be the same for old lines re-established provided they are accurately ranged and chained and that old marks are renewed where necessary.

- (e) Provided the nature and extent of such variations are clearly shown in the field notes lodged, a loading on the base rate in respect to slope and vegetation variation may be applied using the tables hereunder as a guide. These loadings may be averaged where possible.
- (f) For traverses not marked in accordance with Regulations for the Guidance for Surveyors deduct 33½ per cent.

#### Schedule.

##### AMENDING STATUTE NO. 2 OF 1978.

##### 1. Amendments to Statute No. 8—The Faculties.

(a) Clause 2 is amended by the deletion of the existing Clause 2 and the substitution of the following Clause in its place:

2. There shall be Faculties of and degrees shall be granted after examination in Arts, Law, Education, Economics and Commerce, Science, Engineering, Agriculture, Dentistry, Medicine and Architecture and such other Faculties as the Senate may from time to time establish.

(b) Clause 10 is amended by the deletion of the existing Clause 10 and the substitution of the following Clause in its place:

10. The Faculty of Education shall consist of the professors, lecturers and other full-time members of the teaching staff of the Department of Education and the Department of Physical Education and Recreation, the Dean of the Faculty of Arts or his nominee who shall be a full-time member of the teaching staff of a department of the Faculty of Arts, the Dean of the Faculty of Science or his nominee who shall be a full-time member of the teaching staff of a department of the Faculty of Science, the Head of the Department of Psychology or his nominee who shall be a full-time member of the teaching staff of the Department of Psychology, two members of the Faculty of Arts appointed annually by that Faculty, one member of the Faculty of Science appointed annually by that Faculty, the President of the Education Union of the University or his nominee and two other members enrolled in the Faculty of Education (one of whom shall be a graduate student and the other an undergraduate student) elected annually by the members of that Union, and such other persons as may from time to time be appointed by the Senate on the nomination of the foregoing and on the recommendation of the Professional Board.

(c) Clause 11 is amended by the deletion of the existing Clause 11 and the substitution of the following Clause in its place:

11. The Faculty of Economics and Commerce shall consist of the professors, lecturers and the full-time senior tutors and tutors in the Departments of Accounting and Finance, Economics, Management, and in such other departments as may from time to time be established within the

Faculty, the Professor of Geography and one Lecturer in Geography nominated annually by the Professor of Geography, the Dean of the Faculty of Arts and two other members of that Faculty nominated annually by it, the Dean of the Faculty of Agriculture, the Chairman of the Department of Mathematics or his nominee, three members of the Economics and Commerce Students' Society enrolled in the Faculty of Economics and Commerce including the President of the Society or his nominee who must be a student enrolled in the Faculty of Economics and Commerce and two undergraduate members elected annually by the Society, and in addition one postgraduate student enrolled in the Faculty of Economics and Commerce elected annually by the postgraduate students enrolled in the Faculty and such other persons as may from time to time be appointed by the Senate on the nomination of the foregoing and on the recommendation of the Professional Board.

(d) Clause 15 is amended by the deletion of the existing Clause 15 and the substitution of the following Clause in its place:

15. The Faculty of Dentistry shall consist of—

- (a) the professors, lecturers and other full-time members of the academic staff in the School of Dental Science;
- (b) the Dean of the Faculty of Medicine or his nominee who must be a full-time member of the teaching staff of the Faculty of Medicine;
- (c) the Heads of the Departments of Physics and Zoology and the Chairman of the School of Chemistry or their nominees who must be full-time members of the teaching staff of the departments concerned;
- (d) the heads of such other departments as may from time to time be established within or associated with the Faculty or their nominees who must be full-time members of the teaching staff of the departments concerned;
- (e) two members of the part-time teaching staff of the Dental School elected by that staff each of whom shall hold office for two years;
- (f) a nominee of the Western Australian Committee of the Royal Australian College of Dental Surgeons;
- (g) two persons elected annually by the University Dental Students' Society of whom one is to be a member of that Society enrolled as an undergraduate in the Faculty of Dentistry and one to be a person who has completed the requirements for the degree of Bachelor of Dental Science of the University of Western Australia and within the preceding two years;
- (h) the following persons each of whom shall hold office for one year but shall be eligible for re-nomination and re-appointment:
  - (i) the most senior dental officer of the Western Australian Department of Public Health;
  - (ii) two members of the Dental profession nominated, one by the Faculty and the other by the Australian Dental Association (W.A. Branch);
  - (iii) a dental member of the Dental Board nominated by that Board;
  - (iv) a dentally qualified representative of the Perth Dental Hospital Board of Management nominated by that Board;
  - (v) such other persons as may from time to time be appointed by the Senate on the nomination of the Faculty and the recommendation of the Professorial Board.

(e) Clause 16 (1) is amended by the deletion of the existing Clause 16 (1) and the substitution on the following Clause in its place:

16 (1) The Faculty of Medicine shall consist of:

- (a) the Dean of the Faculty;
- (b) the professors, lecturers, and the full-time senior tutors and tutors in the Departments of Anatomy and Human Biology, Biochemistry, Child Health, Medicine, Microbiology, Obstetrics and Gynaecology, Pathology, Pharmacology, Physiology, Psychiatry and Surgery, and of such other departments as may from time to time be established within the Faculty;
- (c) the Dean of the Faculty of Dentistry or his nominee who shall be a full-time member of the teaching staff of the Faculty of Dentistry;
- (d) the Heads of the Departments of Organic Chemistry, Physical and Inorganic Chemistry, Physics, Psychology and Zoology or their nominees who shall be full-time members of the teaching staff of the departments concerned;
- (e) seven members of the part-time clinical teaching staff as under, each elected by the part-time clinical teaching staff of the teaching hospital concerned to serve for a period of three years or for the duration of his appointment to the hospital staff whichever is the shorter:
  - (i) one from the Princess Margaret Hospital for Children;
  - (ii) one from the King Edward Memorial Hospital for Women;
  - (iii) three from the Royal Perth Hospital (of whom at least one shall be a physician and at least one shall be a surgeon);
  - (iv) one from Fremantle Hospital;
  - (v) one from Sir Charles Gairdner Hospital;



- (f) a nominee of the Australian Medical Association (Western Australian Branch) who shall be a general practitioner, such member to serve for a period of three years;
- (g) not more than six other persons appointed from time to time by the Senate on the nomination of the foregoing members of the Faculty and on the recommendation of the Professorial Board to serve for such periods as the Faculty may determine but not exceeding three years;
- (h) the Commissioner of Public Health and Permanent Head Medical Department and the Director of Mental Health Services;
- (i) three persons elected annually by the Western Australian Medical Students' Society of whom two are to be members of that Society enrolled as undergraduates in the Faculty of Medicine and one to be a person who has completed the requirements for the degree of Bachelor of Medicine and Bachelor of Surgery of the University of Western Australia within the preceding three years.

(f) Clause 18 (1) is amended by the deletion of the existing Clause 18 (1) and the substitution of the following Clause in its place:

18 (1) There shall be Advisory Boards in Law, Education, Engineering, Agriculture, Architecture and Physical Education constituted as follows:

- (a) The Advisory Board in Law shall consist of the Dean of the Faculty, a Judge of the Supreme Court nominated by the Senate, the Solicitor-General of his nominee, a member of the Barristers' Board nominated by the Barristers' Board, a member of the Law Society nominated by the Law Society, two other members of the Faculty nominated by the Faculty, and such other persons as may from time to time be appointed by the Senate on the nomination of the foregoing and on the recommendation of the Professorial Board.
- (b) The Advisory Board in Education shall consist of the Dean and members of the Faculty of Education, the Director-General of Education, one officer of the State Education Department nominated by the Director-General of Education, one officer nominated by the Australian Department of Education, the Chairman of the Catholic Education Commission of Western Australia, the President of the Association of Independent Schools of Western Australia or his nominee, two persons from the Western Australian State Schools Teachers' Union nominated by that Union, one person from the independent schools and one person involved in pre-school education both of whom will be nominated by the Faculty, and such other persons as may from time to time be appointed by the Senate on the nomination of the foregoing and on the recommendation of the Professorial Board.
- (c) The Advisory Board in Engineering shall consist of:
  - (i) the Dean and the Sub-Dean of the Faculty of Engineering;
  - (ii) the heads of the departments of the Faculty of Engineering;
  - (iii) two members of each department within the Faculty of Engineering, nominated by the Faculty;
  - (iv) one representative nominated by the Institution of Engineers, Australia, Western Australian Division;
  - (v) one representative nominated by the Perth Division of the Institution of Surveyors, Australia; and
  - (vi) nineteen members, four being members of the Faculty of Engineering, and fifteen not being members of the Faculty of Engineering, appointed by the Senate on the nomination of the Advisory Board.
- (d) The Advisory Board in Agriculture shall consist of the Dean and members of the Faculty of Agriculture, the permanent Head of the Department of Agriculture of Western Australia, the principal of Muresk Agricultural College, one person nominated by the Pastoralists and Graziers Association of Western Australia (Incorporated), one person nominated by the Royal Agricultural Society of W.A. (Inc.), one person nominated by the Farmers' Union of Western Australia, two persons nominated by the Western Australian Branch of the Australian Institute of Agricultural Science, and of such other persons as may from time to time be appointed by the Senate on the nomination of the foregoing and on the recommendation of the Professorial Board.
- (e) The Advisory Board in Architecture shall consist of the Dean and members of the Faculty of Architecture, the Chairman of the Architects' Board of Western Australia, two persons nominated by the Western Australia Chapter of the Royal Australian Institute of Architects, two persons nominated by the Western Australian Institute of Technology, one person nominated by the Perth Division of the Institution of Engineers, Australia, one person nominated by the Master Builders' Association of Western Australia and such other persons as may from time to time be appointed by the Senate on the nomination of the foregoing and on the recommendation of the Professorial Board.
- (f) The Advisory Board in Physical Education and Recreation shall consist of the Dean and members of the Faculty of Education, the Head of the Department of Physical Education at the Secondary Teachers College, the Superintendent of Physical Education of the Education Department of Western Australia, the Director of the

Community Recreation Council of Western Australia, the Head of the Department of Anatomy and Human Biology or his nominee, the Head of the Department of Physiology or his nominee, one person nominated by the Australian Medical Association (Western Australian Branch), one person nominated by the Australian Sports Medicine Federation (Western Australian Branch), one person nominated by the Australian Council for Health, Physical Education and Recreation (Western Australian Branch), one person nominated by the National Heart Foundation of Australia (Western Australian Division), two practising teachers nominated by the Western Australian Physical Education Teachers Association, three students enrolled in the Department of Physical Education and Recreation in the Faculty of Education, nominated by the University of Western Australia Physical Education and Recreation Students Associations, and such other persons as may from time to time be appointed by the Senate on the nomination of the foregoing and on the recommendation of the Professorial Board.

2. Amendments to Statute No. 11—Academic Dress.

(a) Clause 1 is amended by the deletion of the existing Clause 1 and the substitution of the following Clause in its place:

1. The official dress of this University shall be as follows:

- (a) The Chancellor's gown shall be a black silk gown faced with white silk and trimmed with gold braid down each front with a flap collar at the back faced with white silk and trimmed with gold braid and with open sleeves fully lined with white silk, trimmed with gold braid and turned back to form a triangle bisected by two loops of gold cord from the shoulders. The Chancellor's cap shall be a black velvet trencher cap with gold tassel and button and trimmed with three centimetres gold braid.
- (b) The Pro-Chancellor's gown shall be a black silk gown faced with white silk and trimmed with gold cord down each front with a flap collar at the back faced with silk and trimmed with gold cord and with open sleeves fully lined with white silk, trimmed with gold cord and turned back to form a triangle bisected by a loop of gold cord from the shoulders. The Pro-Chancellor's cap shall be a black velvet trencher cap with gold tassel and button and trimmed with one and one half centimetres of gold braid.
- (c) The Vice-Chancellor's gown shall be a black silk gown faced with white silk and trimmed with silver braid down each front with a flap collar at the back faced with white silk and trimmed with silver braid and with open sleeves fully lined with white silk, trimmed with silver braid and turned back to form a triangle bisected by two loops of silver cord from the shoulders. The Vice-Chancellor's cap shall be a black velvet trencher cap with silver tassel and button and trimmed with three centimetres silver braid.
- (d) The gown for members of the Senate shall be the habit of their degrees or a black stuff gown similar to that worn by graduates holding the degree of Master but with a plain black collar and with the sleeves looped up with black braid from the shoulders and a black cloth trencher cap.

(b) Clause 3 is amended by the deletion of the existing Clause 3 and the substitution of the following Clause in its place:

3. The academic dress for undergraduates of this University shall be a plain black stuff gown with a band of silk one and one half centimetres wide of the colour appropriate to their degrees, placed horizontally at the level of the breast on each facing of the gown, and a black cloth trencher cap.

(c) Clause 4 is amended by the deletion of the existing Clause 4 and the substitution of the following Clause in its place:

4 (a) The colours of the silk linings and facings of the dress for degrees shall be as determined by the Senate from time to time and shall be defined by reference to the British Colour Council Dictionary of Colour Standards (2nd Edition 1951).

(b) Until otherwise prescribed the colours shall be as follows:

- (i) Agriculture—Bronze (B.C.C. 116).
- Architecture—White (B.C.C. 1).
- Arts—Royal Blue (B.C.C. 197).
- Building Science—Maize (B.C.C. 5).
