Constitution Act, 1889-1970

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS section 74 of the Constitution Act, 1889-1970 provides, *inter alia*, that the Governor in Council may vest in heads of departments, or other officers or persons within the State, power to make minor appointments to public offices under the Government of the State: Now therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council hereby vests in John S. Graham, Director, Department for Youth, Sport and Recreation, and in any person temporarily appointed to perform the normal duties of the said John S. Graham during his absence or incapacity, the power to make appointments in respect of the Department specified in Column 1 of the Schedule hereto, of employees in the categories specified respectively in Column 2 of the Schedule hereto in relation to that Department, on such terms and conditions as are contained from time to time in the award and/or agreement specified respectively in Column 3 of the Schedule hereto in relation to those categories of employees.

THE QUEEN'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY IN COUNCIL

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Report from the Judicial Committee of the Privy Council dated the 5th day of October 1978 in the words following viz:—

"WHEREAS by virtue of His late Majesty King Edward the Seventh's Order in Council of the 18th day of October 1909 there was referred unto this Committee the matter of an Appeal from The Full Court of The Supreme

Court of Western Australia between (1) Caratti Holding Co. Pty. Ltd. and (2) Sergio Caratti Appellants and Bernardo Zampatti Respondent (Privy Council Appeal No. 17 of 1977) and likewise the humble Petition of the Appellants setting forth that the Respondent filed a Petition in the Supreme Court of Western Australia praying that the 1st Appellant be wound up and for a declaration that Article 32 of its Articles of Association was void and of no effect and alternatively inter alia that the 2nd Appellant be ordered to purchase from the Respondent the shares held by the Respondent in the capital of the 1st Appellant at such price as to the Court seemed just; that by Order dated the 19th September 1975 the Court ordered that all further proceedings on the Petition be stayed on condition that the orders thereafter set forth be implemented and ordered and directed inter alia (A) that the 2nd Appellant purchase the 1,500 shares held by the Respondent in the 1st Appellant at a sum to be certified by the Master of the Supreme Court such sum being the value of the shares ascertained upon the enquiry by the Master in manner thereafter set forth (B) that the Master enquire into and ascertain in the manner therein directed the value of such shares as at the date of presentation of the Petition (C) that the Master also enquire into and take an account of all rents loans and other moneys due from the Respondent to the 1st Appellant as at the date of such enquiry and account (D) that pending the purchase of such shares by the 2nd Appellant in the 1st Appellant certain particular directions be effective and (E) that the 2nd Appellant pay to the Respondent the purchase price of the Respondent's shares as certified by the Master within certain specified periods: that the Appellants appealed to The Full Court of The Supreme Court of Western Australia and on the 17th November 1976 that Court made an Order dismissing the Appeal and ordering the Appellants to pay the Respondent's costs of the Appeal: that by Order dated the 13th April 1977 the Full Court granted the Appellants leave to appeal to Your Majesty in Council: And humbly praying Your Majesty in Council to take this Appeal into consideration and that the Order of the Full Court of the 17th November 1976 be reversed altered or varied and for further or other relief:

"THE LORDS OF THE COMMITTEE in obedience to His late Majesty's said Order in Council have taken the Appeal and humble Petition into consideration and having heard Counsel on behalf of the Parties on both sides Their Lordships do this day agree humbly to report to Your Majesty as their opinion that this Appeal ought to be dismissed and the

Order of The Full Court of The Supreme Court of Western Australia dated the 17th November 1976 affirmed:

"And in case Your Majesty should be pleased to approve of this Report then Their Lordships do direct that there be paid by the Appellants to the Respondent his costs of this Appeal incurred in the said Full Court and his costs thereof incurred in England the amount of such costs to be hereafter certified."

HER MAJESTY having taken the said Report into consideration was pleased by and with the advice of Her Privy Council to approve thereof and to order as it is hereby ordered that the same be punctually observed obeyed and carried into execution.

Whereof the Governor or Officer administering the Government of the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia for the time being and all other persons whom it may concern are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

Fishing Unit No.

- (4) The fishing units which may be licensed to take fish in the Shark Bay Beach Seine and Mesh Net Fishery are to be restricted to those listed in the attached schedule, excepting as is provided hereunder.

- (5) A fishing unit shall consist of—

- (a) a primary fishing vessel (mother ship);
- (b) not more than three netting dinghies;
- (c) not more than three professional fishermen;

and shall be operated by the owner fisherman or part owner fisherman.

- (6) Licenses for units and fishermen additional to those listed in (4) above may be issued on the written approval of the Director of Fisheries;

(a) where a professional fisherman who has historically fished in the Shark Bay Beach Seine and Mesh Net Fishery has moved away from that fishery and wishes to return to professional fishing in the Shark Bay Beach Seine and Mesh Net Fishery; and

(b) where a professional fisherman has historically fished in the Shark Bay Beach Seine and Mesh Net Fishery and wishes to continue so to do.

- (7) Units and fishermen listed in (4) and (6) above may be reduced by:—

- (a) not replacing owner fishermen or part owner fishermen upon their retirement or other withdrawal from the fishing industry;
- (b) not renewing licenses where the fishing performance of the unit has been such that it can be established that the members of the unit do not spend the major part of their working time fishing and do not earn a substantial part of their income from fishing.

- (8) A professional fisherman who has been authorised to engage in taking fish for sale in the Shark Bay Beach Seine and Mesh Net Fishery and who wishes to engage in professional fishing in another fishery for

a period of time shall first obtain the approval of the Director of Fisheries who may specify conditions relating to his entitlement to return to that fishery as a professional fisherman.

- (9) The holder of an endorsed license who relinquishes his license or endorsement or retires from the Shark Bay Beach Seine and Mesh Net Fishery shall not be replaced by any other person except with the approval of the Director of Fisheries who may grant or refuse such approval after investigating the potential of the fishery.
- (10) The holder of an endorsed license for any of the fisheries listed hereunder shall not hold an endorsed license to fish in the Shark Bay Beach Seine and Mesh Net Fishery—
- (i) Swan/Canning Estuarine Fishery;
 - (ii) Mandurah Estuarine Fishery;
 - (iii) Leschenault Estuarine Fishery;
 - (iv) Hardy Inlet Estuarine Fishery; and
 - (v) South Coast Estuarine Fishery.

For the purpose of these instructions—

“the Shark Bay Beach Seine and Mesh Net Fishery” means the beach seine and mesh net fishery in the waters of Shark Bay lying south of a line drawn from Cape Inscription on Dirk Hartog Island due east to the mainland.

- (4) The fishing units which may be licensed to take fish in the Swan/Canning Estuarine Fishery are to be restricted to those listed in the attached schedule or such replacements as are approved excepting as is provided hereunder.

- (5) A fishing unit shall consist of:

- (a) a primary fishing vessel (mother ship);
- (b) not more than two netting dinghies;
- (c) not more than the number of fishermen listed in the attached schedule;

and shall be operated by the owner fisherman or part owner fisherman.

- (6) Licenses for units and fishermen additional to those listed in (4) above may be issued on the written approval of the Director of Fisheries:

- (a) where a professional fisherman who has historically fished in the Swan/Canning Estuarine Fishery has moved away from that fishery and engaged in professional fishing in another fishery and wishes to return to professional fishing in the Swan/Canning Estuarine Fishery and provided he has not been absent for a period longer than three years; and

- (a) not replacing owner fishermen or part owner fishermen upon their retirement or other withdrawal from the fishing industry;
- (b) not renewing licenses where the fishing performance of the unit has been such that it can be established that the members of the unit do not spend the major part of their working time fishing and do not earn a substantial part of their income from fishing.

- (8) A professional fisherman who has been authorised to engage in taking fish for sale in the Swan/Canning Estuarine Fishery and who wishes to engage in professional fishing in another fishery for a period of time shall first obtain the approval of the Director of Fisheries who may specify conditions relating to his entitlement to return to that fishery as a professional fisherman.

- (iv) Hardy Inlet Estuarine Fishery; and
- (v) South Coast Estuarine Fishery.

For the purpose of these instructions:

"the Swan/Canning Estuarine Fishery" means the commercial professional fishery in the waters of the Swan and Canning Rivers.
