WHEREAS by section 28A of the Main Roads Act, 1930-1977, it is provided that the Governor may, on the recommendation of the Commissioner, by proclamation declare that any section or part of a road is subject to control of access, and the places only at which it may be entered or departed from; and whereas the Commissioner has recommended that the road section HIGHWAY 16 (Mitchell Freeway-Woolwich Street to Hutton Street) and delineated on MRD plans 7621-173-1, 7825-30 and 7825-31 shall be subject to Control of

Therefore, I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred by section 28A of the AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chambers at Perth the 21st day of March, 1979, the following Order in Council was authorised to be issued:-

# VALUATION OF LAND ACT, 1978.

Office of the Valuer General, Perth, 26th March, 1979.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council, acting under the provisions of the Valuation of Land Act, 1978 and section 11 of the Interpretation Act, 1918-1975 has been pleased to make the regulations set forth in the schedule hereunder to take effect on and from the day that the Valuation of Land Act, 1978 comes into operation.

### Schedule.

### REGULATIONS.

- 1. These regulations may be cited as the Valuation of Land Regulations, 1979.
  - In these regulations unless the contrary intention appears—
     "the Act" means the Valuation of Land Act, 1978; "Valuer-General" means
     the person holding or acting in the office of Valuer-General established
     under section 6 of the Act.
- 3. The percentage of the capital value of land prescribed for the purposes of the term "assessed value" in section 4 of the Act is five per cent.
- 4. An agency or instrumentality of the Crown, or a municipality or any other public authority shall upon request made by the Valuer-General furnish to the Valuer-General details of any land owned by or vested in it which any other person is entitled to use under an agreement or arrangement with it.
- 5. (1) Subject to this regulation, the charges to be paid by a rating or taxing authority in respect of valuations that the Valuer-General is authorised to supply under the Act shall be determined on the basis of \$22.50 per hour of valuer time but in any event shall not exceed the cost of the service.
- (2) Where air travel and other expenses are necessarily incurred for the purposes of carrying out a valuation the rating or taxing authority with respect to which the service is performed shall pay the costs of such expenses in addition to the other charges to be paid under this regulation.
- (3) Where a valuation is carried out at the same time for more than one rating or taxing authority the charges to be paid by the authorities in respect of the valuation shall be borne by the authorities in the proportions determined by the Valuer-General but where a proportion is so determined the amount to be paid by an authority shall not exceed the cost of supplying the service to the authority.
- 6. The following fees are payable in respect of the several matters set out below—
  - (a) For an extract of a valuation roll .... \$2.00 for each entry
  - (b) For a certified extract of a valuation roll .... ....

\$3.00 for each certified entry

7. A person who contravenes or fails to comply with any of the provisions of these regulations commits an offence.

Penalty: Two hundred dollars.
