3A. (1) The Minister may from time to time appoint an Advisory Committee for the Carnarvon Irrigation District.

(2) The Advisory Committee shall consist of such number of persons, including representatives of owners and occupiers of land and officers of Government Departments, as the Minister appoints, but—
