SCHEME.

THE Albany Town Council under and by virtue of the powers conferred on it in that behalf by the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 as amended hereby makes the following Town Planning Scheme.

SCHEME TEXT.

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Citation.

1. This Town Planning Scheme may be cited as Town of Albany Town Planning Scheme No. 7—Beresford Street Scheme (hereinafter referred to as "the Scheme").

Responsible Authority.

2. The Authority responsible for enforcing the observance of this Scheme is the Town of Albany (hereinafter referred to as "the Council").

Maps.

3. The following maps are attached to and form part of the Scheme.

Land Use Map
Scheme Map

Scheme Area.

4. The Scheme shall apply to the whole of the land contained within the inner edge of a broken black line on the Land Use Map and on the Scheme Map. The said land is hereinafter referred to as "the Scheme Area".

General Objects.

5. The general objects of the Scheme are—
- (a) To improve and develop the Scheme Area to the best possible advantage.
 - (b) To make provision for the better use of the land within the Scheme Area for building purposes.
 - (c) To make better provision for roads and traffic within the Scheme Area.
 - (d) To fill drain and level such parts of the Scheme Area as the Council considers require such treatment.
 - (e) To make provision for the land within the Scheme Area to be connected to a sewer.
 - (f) To make provision for the reticulation of water throughout the Scheme Area.
 - (g) To make provision for the apportionment of Scheme Costs amongst owners in an equitable manner.

Scheme Works.

6. The following works shall be carried out within the Scheme Area and are herein referred to as "the Scheme Works"—

- (a) The Scheme Area shall be re-surveyed in conformity with the design shown on the Scheme Map.

- (b) The lands shown as roads on the Scheme Map of which the proposed carriageway is coloured yellow shall be constructed and drained and any necessary earth works undertaken.

- (c) The land shown as a pedestrian accessway on the Scheme Map shall be paved.

- (d) The Scheme Area shall be drained and all necessary drainage works shall be carried out.

- (e) Water mains shall be extended so as to permit all lots in the Scheme Area to be connected to the town water supply.

- (f) Such sewerage works as are in the opinion of the Council necessary for the connection of the lands in the Scheme Area to a sewer shall be carried out. Cost estimates and apportionment shall take into account an adjustment for lots already served by a sewer, so that such lots are exempt from sewerage costs.

- (g) Those fences which are not on the boundary of the new lots in the re-survey of the Scheme Area may if the Council so determines be demolished and removed.

- (h) Filling and levelling of land shall where the Council so determines be carried out.

7. The filling and levelling of lots shall be the responsibility of the owner but the Council may in any case where it considers it desirable fill and level any land. The cost of filling and levelling new lots carried out by the Council shall be apportioned among the new lots on the basis of the cubic metres of filling required for each lot.

Closure of Roads.

8. The roads hatched diagonally on the Scheme Map will be closed and the land used for the purposes shown thereon.

Public Open Space.

9. The land coloured green on the Scheme Map shall be set aside for public open space.

Acquisition of Land.

10. The land within the Scheme Area or so much thereof as is necessary to implement the Scheme shall be resumed or otherwise acquired by the Council.

Valuations.

11. All the lands within the Scheme Area shown on the Land Use Map shall be valued as at the 13th day of July, 1977. The Valuation shall be the capital amount that an unencumbered estate in fee simple in each of the lands might reasonably be expected to realise upon sale assuming that all improvements thereon (except site improvements) the benefit of which is unexhausted at the time of valuation had not been made. The said values are hereinafter referred to as "the value of the old lots". In this clause the term "site improvements" means the reclamation of land by draining or filling, the construction of a retaining wall or other structures or works appertaining thereto, the excavation, grading and levelling of land, the removal of rocks, stones, sand or soil and the clearing of timber, scrub and other vegetation.

12. The lots created by the re-survey of the Scheme Area in accordance with the Scheme Map (hereinafter called "the new lots") shall be valued on the basis that all works to be undertaken as part of this Scheme have been carried out and taking into account any proposed change of zoning or permitted use for multi-residential purposes. The valuation shall be made as at the date or anticipated date of approval by the Town Planning Board of the subdivision created by the resurvey of the Scheme Area. On a similar basis the public open space shall be valued but in that case the valuation shall assume that those lands were not set aside as public open space but were available for residential development.

13. Valuations shall be made by the Chief Valuer of the State Taxation Department or by some person appointed by him or at the option of the Council by an independent Valuer appointed by the Council.

Costs of Scheme.

14. The following costs are hereinafter referred to as Scheme Costs:—

- (a) The administration costs of the Scheme including an amount to reimburse the Council for such overhead and supervision costs as may be incurred in the implementation of the Scheme. The term "administration costs" shall include all legal costs, planning costs, payments to planning consultants, engineers and other professional consultants, management costs and valuation costs.
- (b) The cost of the Scheme Works other than the levelling and filling (if any) of land to be comprised in the new lots created by the re-survey of the Scheme Area.
- (c) All compensation payable and all costs and expenses of determining and settling compensation.
- (d) The estimated compensation and costs payable under clause 15.
- (e) The costs of acquisition of any land within the Scheme Area in the event of such land being acquired other than by resumption.
- (f) Interest paid by the Council on moneys borrowed for the purpose of the Scheme.
- (g) All other costs and expenses which the Council shall be required to meet in order to implement and complete the Scheme.

Estimate of Compensation.

15. In the event of any claim for compensation not having been settled at the time when the Council is ready to transfer lots in pursuance to the Scheme the Council may estimate the amount of compensation payable and the costs relating thereto and debit the Scheme with the net amount so estimated. In the event of the Council so doing the difference between the estimated and the actual compensation payable shall be received or paid by the Council as the case may be.

Works carried out by the Council.

16. If the Council shall itself carry out any of the Scheme Works it shall prepare detailed costings based on current costs in the Albany region and submit these for verification by an independent engineer nominated by the president for the time being of the W.A. Branch of the Association of Consulting Engineers of Australia. The costs so approved shall form part of the Scheme Costs.

Owners' Value Ratio.

17. From the sum of the values of the new lots shall be deducted the costs or estimated costs of the Scheme and the figure so ascertained is the net value of the new lots. The owners' value ratio is the relationship between the sum of the values of the old lots and the net value of the new lots.

Owners' Interest in Scheme.

18. Each owner of an old lot is entitled to an interest in the Scheme equal to the value of his old lot increased or decreased (as the case may be) in the ratio of the owners' value ratio determined in accordance with clause 17.

Offer of New Lots.

19. Each of the owners of an old lot on the Land Use Map shall be offered a new lot or new lots created by the resurvey of the Scheme Area of a value as near as practicable to the owners' interest in the Scheme calculated in accordance with clause 18. The new lots shall be allocated among the said owners as equitably as possible and shall be as nearly as possible in the same location as the owner's old lot.

20. The offer of a new lot or lots shall be made on the basis that the owner shall in respect of each new lot so offered pay to or be paid by the Council a sum of money ascertained as hereinafter appears.

21. In ascertaining the amount payable by or to be paid to an owner who is offered a new lot in accordance with the terms of the Scheme an owner shall be—

- (a) Credited with the value of his interest in the Scheme as ascertained by Clause 18;
- (b) Debited with the value of the new lot or lots offered to him as provided in Clause 19;
- (c) Debited with the cost of levelling and filling carried out by the Council on the new lot or new lots the subject of the offer.

Nature of Offer.

22. The offers mentioned in the preceding clauses shall be made in writing to each of the said owners and served by certified post on him at his address as appearing in the Rate Book of the Council and shall specify the new lot or lots on the Scheme Map the subject of the offer and the old lot in respect of which the offer is made. The offer shall also specify how the offer is calculated, and the valuations placed on the said lots and the payment to be made or received as the case may be.

23. If the new lot is one on which a drainage line is situated and shown on the Scheme Map the new lot shall be offered subject to the condition that the owner shall grant to the Council a drainage easement over so much of the said lot as is shown as a drainage line on the Scheme Map.

24. The offer shall specify a date not being less than twenty eight days after the posting of the said offer within which the offer may be accepted.

25. An owner who accepts an offer shall pay to the Council the amount of rates which would have been payable if the land which entitled him to receive the offer had remained in the name of the owner until the transfer of the new lot.

26. The offer may be accepted by notice in writing to the Council at any time before the date specified in the said offer and if not accepted within such time shall subject to the Council's right to extend the time to be deemed a valid acceptance unless all rates and taxes owed by the owner in respect of land within the Scheme Area have been paid except in the case of an owner who is a pensioner and payment of rates has been postponed.

27. If the offer be accepted it shall be accepted by the owner in full settlement and satisfaction of all claims for compensation in respect of the resumption from him of the old lot in respect of which the offer was made and otherwise in respect of the operation of this Scheme and on the condition that the owner will indemnify the Council against any claims which may be made by any other person who has or claims to have any estate or interest in the lot in respect of which the offer is made.

Registration of Transfers.

28. The Council shall cause to be prepared and sent to those owners entitled transfers in respect of each offer of a replacement lot which has been accepted by the owner in accordance with this Scheme. If an owner shall fail to complete the transfer in accordance with the Transfer of Land Act, 1893, as amended or shall fail to make the payment of the amount payable by him or shall fail to return the Transfer to the Council for registration within twenty eight days after having been called upon to do so by notice served by registered post on the owner at his address last known to the Council (which notice may be served with the Transfer) the Council may rescind any agreement whereby such owner is entitled to have the land the subject of the Transfer transferred to him and thereupon such owner shall have a claim

against the Council only for compensation for the resumption of the land in respect of which the offer of the replacement lot or lots was made and the land the subject of the transfer shall be treated as a rejected lot.

Rejected Lots.

29. If an owner does not accept an offer made to him by the Council in accordance with the Scheme or fails to complete a transfer of the said lot and make the payment (if any) payable by him in manner aforesaid the Council may deal with the lots so affected as hereinafter appears.

Sale of Surplus Lots and Rejected Lots.

30. The Council may sell the surplus lots and rejected lots either by public auction or private contract as a whole or in separate lots upon such terms and conditions as the Council may think fit. In the event of a sale by private contract the price shall not be less than the price recommended by the Chief Valuer of the State Taxation Department or some person appointed by him or at the option of the Council by an independent valuer appointed by the Council unless after submitting the land for sale by public auction or tender that price has not been obtained.

Valuation of Surplus Lots and Rejected Lots.

31. The Council may instead of selling all or any of the surplus or rejected lots ascertain the value of them or those unsold from the Chief Valuer of the State Taxation Department and credit the Scheme with the value so ascertained and in that event the lots shall be the property of the Council and may be retained sold or otherwise dealt with in such manner as the Council thinks fit.

Profits or Loss of Scheme.

32. In the event of the Scheme showing a profit the amount of the profit (if any) shall be divided amongst each owner of the land in the Scheme Area to whom a new lot has been transferred pursuant to the acceptance of the offer hereinbefore mentioned in the proportion which the value of his land as ascertained in accordance with Clause 11 hereof bears to the total value of the old lots in the Scheme Area.

Native Trees.

36. So far as is practicable and consistent with the economic development of land, existing trees and shrubs shall be retained. The Council may by notice or by marking of trees indicate specific trees or groups of trees which are to be retained.

Powers of Council.

37. The Council in the conduct and management of this Scheme shall have the following powers:—

- (a) To enter and inspect the land within the Scheme Area.

- (b) To enter into agreements or arrangements with owners of any land within the Scheme Area.
- (c) To give notice to owners of proposed allocations of new lots and in the event of dispute as to the allocation to settle the disputes as equitably as possible including power to settle the dispute by drawing of lots.
- (d) To make interim allocations of new lots to be offered to owners and to make interim offers of replacement lots subject to such conditions as the Council shall determine.
- (e) With the consent in writing of all persons interested to vary the allocation of new lots.
- (f) To implement the Scheme in such stages as the Council shall determine. If the Council shall exercise its power the Scheme Costs shall be divided between those costs applying to the whole of the Scheme Area and those applying to the lands within each stage. The Scheme Costs applying to the whole of the Scheme Area shall be apportioned between each stage and the relevant clauses of this text shall be read as applying to each stage of implementation as if it were a separate scheme.
- (g) To extend the time within which any offer of replacement lots may be accepted.
- (h) To extend the time within which payments are to be made to the Council and to agree to the securing of such payments.
- (i) To dispose of any lots to which it becomes entitled by reason of being the owner of land within the Scheme Area as at the date of the coming into operation of this Scheme upon such terms and conditions as it may think fit.
- (j) In disposing of any land or rejected or surplus lots the Council may sell the lots singly or in groups or on the condition that buildings of a specified character shall within a limited period be constructed thereon or that the land and buildings shall be used for a specified purpose.
- (k) To transfer any land acquired by it in pursuance of this Scheme as compensation or part compensation and to enter into agreements relative to the determination and settling of compensation.
- (l) If an owner is offered more than one replacement lot and does not desire to accept all lots offered to enter into such agreements with the owner as seem to the Council to be equitable.
- (m) To demolish the buildings in the Scheme Area which interfere with the proper development of the Scheme Area.
- (n) To make interim payments on account of Scheme Profits.

38. Twenty eight days written notice is hereby prescribed as the notice to be given pursuant to section 10 of the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928. Any expenses incurred by the Council under this Section may be recovered from the person in default as a simple contract debt in such Court of civil jurisdiction as is competent to deal with the amount of the claim.

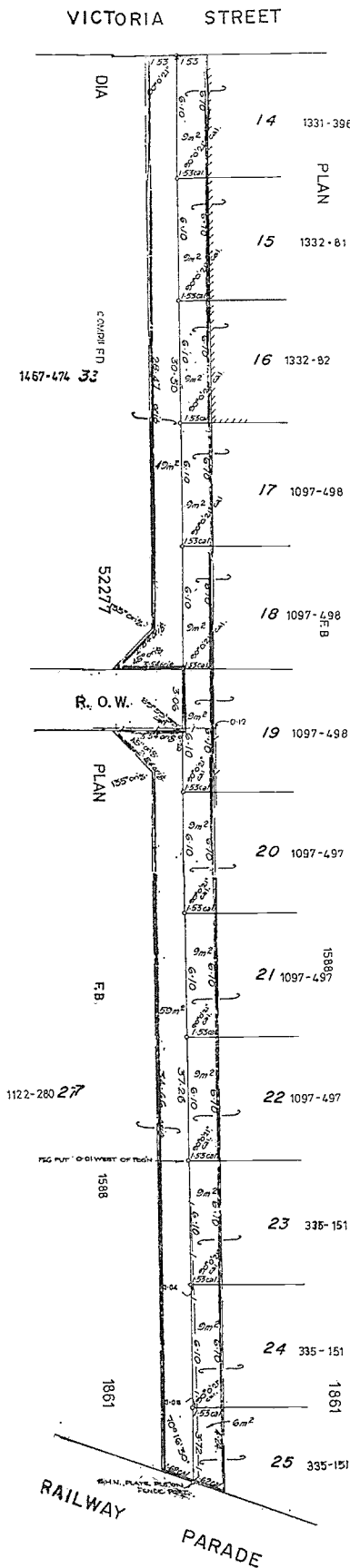
