WHEREAS it is provided by subsection (4) of section 548 of the Local Government Act, 1960-1978, that the Governor may at the request of a council of a municipality by order declare portion of its district to be an area within which the council may impose, in respect of the rateable property therein, a greater rate than that which it imposes elsewhere in the district; and whereas such an order was made and published in the *Government Gazette* of 31st January, 1975, in respect of the municipality of the Town of Kalgoorlie; and whereas that municipality has requested that the portion of its district described in the Schedule hereto be declared an area within which the council may impose, in respect of the rateable property therein, a greater rate than that which it imposes elsewhere, in lieu of the existing declared area; and whereas it is provided by subsection (2) of section 691 of the Local Government Act, 1960-1978, that a power given to make Orders includes power from time to time to revoke those Orders; Now therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council does hereby:

- (i) cancel the Order in Council published in the *Government Gazette* of 31st December, 1975;
- (ii) declare that portion of the district of the municipality of the Town of Kalgoorlie, described in the schedule hereto, as an area within which the Kalgoorlie Town Council may impose, in respect of the rateable property therein, a greater rate than that which it imposes elsewhere in the district.

CITY OF STIRLING TOWN PLANNING SCHEME
NO. 30—OSBORNE PARK INDUSTRIAL
AREA EXTENSION.

THE City of Stirling under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon it in that behalf by the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended) hereby makes the following Town Planning Scheme.

Scheme Text.

PART I.—PRELIMINARY.

1.1 This Town Planning Scheme may be cited as the City of Stirling Town Planning Scheme No. 30—Osborne Park Industrial Area Extension (hereinafter called "the Scheme").

1.2 The Scheme shall come into operation when approved by the Minister for Urban Development and Town Planning and published in the *Government Gazette* (which date is hereinafter referred to as "the commencement date").

1.3 The authority responsible for enforcing the observance of the Scheme is the City of Stirling (hereinafter referred to as "the Council").

1.4 The following Scheme Maps are attached to this text and form part of the Scheme:—

- (a) Land Use Map.
- (b) Scheme Map.

1.5 The Scheme shall apply to the area of land contained within the inner edge of a broken black line on the Scheme Map and the land within that line is hereinafter referred to as "the Scheme Area".

General Objects.

1.6 The general objects of the Scheme are:—

- (a) to facilitate and co-ordinate progressive subdivision and development of land within the Scheme Area;
- (b) to make provision for a new subdivision of the Scheme Area;
- (c) to ensure proper drainage within the Scheme area and to provide adequate drainage areas and compensating basins as required to the satisfaction, specifications and requirements of the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Board;
- (d) to make provision for reticulated water and sewerage disposal services throughout the Scheme area to the satisfaction, specifications and requirements of the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Board;
- (e) to provide adequate electrical power within the Scheme area;
- (f) to assist in the development of the Scheme area for industrial purposes in accordance with the provisions of the Scheme and the City of Stirling District Planning Scheme.

Method of Carrying Out Objects.

1.7 As and when owners of land within the Scheme Area subdivide their land such subdivision shall be according to a plan which will be capable of forming part of an overall plan of subdivision for the Scheme Area.

1.8 The Scheme Map forms the basis for subdivision and development of the Scheme Area but the Council may recommend to the Town Planning Board after the submission of an individual application for subdivision alterations or variations within the Scheme Area where circumstances justify such action provided that no such alterations or variations shall be permitted if it would impede the subdivision and development of the Scheme Area as a whole.

Subdivision.

1.9 An owner of land within the Scheme Area who desires to subdivide his land either alone or in conjunction with other owners shall submit to the Town Planning Board a plan of the proposed subdivision of the land in conformity with the Scheme Map with such modifications as shall be permitted by the Council as aforesaid.

Survey.

1.10 Each owner shall upon the approval of the plan of subdivision of his land arrange for the survey of his land in conformity with the approved plan of subdivision and shall pay the costs of such survey. If prior to the approval of a plan of subdivision the Council shall consider it to be necessary or desirable that an owner's land or any part thereof be surveyed according to the Scheme Map it may arrange for the survey to be carried out. An owner shall pay to the Council the cost of such survey of his land or part thereof upon the subdivision of the land or at the expiration of three months' notice given to him by the Council calling upon him to make such payment whichever shall first happen.

New Roads and Pedestrian Accessways.

1.11 Subject to the following clauses new roads and pedestrian accessways within the Scheme Area shall be constructed and drained at the expense of the respective owners of the land in which the roads are situated and each owner shall when subdividing his land or any part thereof make the land available for the roads and pedestrian accessways and pay the costs of the construction and drainage of the roads and pedestrian accessways within the land owned by him.

1.12 In cases where the situation of the new road or pedestrian accessway within the Scheme Area is such that in the opinion of the Council it would be fair and equitable that the owners of land served or capable of being served by the road or pedestrian accessway should each contribute to or receive a contribution in respect of the cost of the construction or drainage of a road or pedestrian accessway and apportion the value of the land made available for the purpose and such owners are unable to agree upon the proportion of the costs payable by or to each of them the amount (if any) payable by each such owner shall be determined by arbitration in manner hereinafter provided.

If the Council shall do so prior to the subdivision of the land abutting such road or pedestrian accessway all compensation and other costs consequent upon the acquisition of the land shall be paid to the Council by each respective owner of the land in accordance with the foregoing provisions upon the final approval of the Town Planning Board to the subdivision of his land or at such earlier time as the Council in its discretion and for the benefit of the Scheme shall direct. An owner shall be given not less than three months' notice before he shall become liable for payment.

1.14 If after receiving Town Planning Board approval to subdivision an owner shall subdivide his land and if he or his predecessor in title shall

have claimed or shall have been paid compensation by reason of the resumption by the Council of the land for a new road, road widening or pedestrian accessway within the Scheme Area he shall before the clearance of his plan of subdivision by the Local Authority release the Council from the payment of compensation or re-pay to the Council the compensation paid by it to him or his predecessor in title as the case may be.

1.15 The Council will not be responsible for any costs incurred by the fulfilment of any conditions of subdivision imposed by the Town Planning Board as a result of an application for subdivision by any owner within the Scheme Area.

PART II.—LAND ACQUISITION.

2.1 Land within the Scheme area or so much thereof as is necessary to give effect to any of the Scheme proposals may be resumed or otherwise acquired by the Council in cases where the owner thereof will not agree to make the land available. The Council shall be under no obligation to exercise its powers under this clause.

PART III.—SCHEME COSTS— ADMINISTRATION.

3.1 The costs or estimated costs of the following items shall comprise the Scheme Costs:—

- (a) The administration costs of the Scheme including an amount to reimburse the Council for all preliminary costs incurred by it in relation to the Scheme prior to the commencement date and for such overhead and supervision costs as may be incurred by the Council in the administration of the Scheme.
- (b) All compensation payable and the costs of determining and settling compensation.
- (c) All other costs and expenses which shall be payable by the Council in order to complete the Scheme.

Herdsmen Nominees Pty. Ltd. of 463 Scarborough Beach Road, Osborne Park, has entered into an agreement with the Council that it will pay to the Council such of the Scheme Costs as shall from time to time be incurred by the Council.

3.2 Under the powers contained in Clause 5.1 (b) the City of Stirling has entered into an agreement with Herdsmen Nominees Pty. Ltd. of 463 Scarborough Beach Road, Osborne Park, which agreement will require the Company to pay to the Council such of the Scheme Costs as shall from time to time be incurred by the Council in the implementation of the Scheme. These costs are to include any moneys which are paid by the Council for resumption or compensation. The Scheme Report refers also to those items which will comprise the Scheme Costs.

PART IV.—RESUBDIVISION.

4.1 Where in order to give effect to any of the Scheme proposals the allocation or transfer of any land owned by one person to another is required the same may be achieved by agreement provided that if the parties cannot agree the Council may without prejudice to the powers contained in Part II hereof resume or otherwise acquire such land as is necessary for the purpose and shall dispose of the same in such manner as will give effect to such proposal. If the Council receives any moneys from any person as or by way of consideration for the disposal of such land and Herdsmen Nominees Pty. Ltd. has paid the Scheme Costs incurred in the acquisition thereof the Company shall be entitled to be reimbursed the amount so paid by it with respect to such costs to the extent to which the Council has received any such moneys less any incidental expenses incurred by the Council. The Council shall be under no obligation to exercise its powers under this clause.

PART V.—POWERS AND AUTHORITIES of COUNCIL.

5.1 In carrying out the provisions of the Scheme the Council shall have the following powers and authorities:—

- (a) To enter and inspect any land within the Scheme Area.

- (b) to make agreements with the owners, occupiers, developers or prospective purchasers or prospective occupiers of any land within the Scheme Area.
- (c) To enter into agreements to make arrangements with the Metropolitan Region Planning Authority, the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Board, the State Energy Commission, or any other Government instrumentality concerning any matters relating to the Scheme.
- (d) To purchase land in the Scheme Area.
- (e) The Council may resume any land within the Scheme Area for roads and pedestrian accessways, public open space or drainage, sewerage or water reticulation purposes.
- (f) If any owner of land within the Scheme Area does not proceed with the subdivision or development of his land in accordance with the terms of the Scheme or by reason of the situation or nature of his land he is unable to subdivide or develop it and his failure to do so will in the opinion of the Council unduly delay the completion of the Scheme or the development of other land the Council may resume the land of such owner or any part or parts thereof and proceed with the subdivision and development of the land in accordance with the provisions of the Scheme.
- (g) In the event of the Council exercising its powers under paragraph (f) it shall have the powers of an owner in the subdivision, development and disposal of the said land. If the owner has not been paid compensation for the resumption of his land the Council shall before selling the land so subdivided and developed offer the new lots to the owner upon his paying to the Council all costs and expenses consequent upon the resumption, subdivision and development of the said land and payable pursuant to the Scheme and upon his releasing the Council from all claims for compensation in respect of such resumption. The said offer shall be made in writing and if not accepted within one month of the service thereof the Council may proceed with the sale of the subdivided lots. All moneys received by the Council from such sale shall be applied firstly in payment of all costs and expenses paid or payable pursuant to the Scheme and consequent upon such subdivision and development, and secondly in payment of all compensation in respect of the resumption of the said land and payments pursuant to Clause 4.1. The balance (if any) of such moneys shall be finally reconciled in the Scheme accounts under Council's agreement with Herdsmen Nominees Pty. Ltd.
- (h) If the offer mentioned in paragraph (g) hereof be not accepted the Council may retain all or any part of the said land but if it does so it shall be responsible to pay such costs of subdivision of the said land and payable pursuant to the Scheme and of compensation for its resumption as are then unpaid.
- (i) To dispose of any lots to which it becomes entitled whether under paragraphs (f) or (g) hereof or otherwise upon such terms and conditions as it may think fit and without limiting the generality of the foregoing the Council may sell the lots singly or in groups and on the condition that buildings of a specified character with specified parking or other facilities shall within a limited period be constructed thereon or that the land and buildings be used for a specified purpose.
- (j) To exchange any land in the Scheme Area for the time being owned by the Council.
- (k) To extend the time within which payments have to be made to the Council and agree to the securing of such payments.

5.2 Twenty eight (28) days written notice is hereby prescribed as the notice to be given pursuant to section 10 of the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended). Any expenses incurred by the Council under the said section may be recovered from the person in default as a simple contract debt in such Court of Civil Jurisdiction as is competent to deal with the amount of the claim.

PART VI.—CLAIMS FOR COMPENSATION.

6.1 The time limit for the making of claims for compensation pursuant to section 11 of the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended) is six months after the date when notice of the approval of the Scheme is published in the manner prescribed by the Regulations made under the Act.

PART VII.—ARBITRATION.

7.1 Any dispute or difference between the owners as to any matter which by the terms of this Scheme may be determined by arbitration may be referred to arbitration in manner provided by the Arbitration Act, 1895, or any statutory modification thereof for the time being in force.

PART VIII.—SCHEME REPORT.

8.1 The Scheme Report must be read in conjunction with this Text.
