ORDER IN COUNCIL.

City of Perth.

305 mm Feeder Main in Turriff Road and Peebles Road, Floreat Park.

The construction of a three hundred and five millimetre diameter water main, approximately seven hundred metres in length, complete with valves and all necessary apparatus. Commencing

at the junction of Pearson Street and Turriff Road and proceeding thence in a southwesterly direction along Turriff Road to the junction of Turriff Road and Peebles Road and proceeding thence in a westerly direction along Peebles Road to the intersection of Peebles Road and Brookdale Street and terminating thereat, as shown on plan M.W.B. 16307.

A section of a single and duplicate 914 mm outside diameter steel rising main commencing about 10 metres south from Edgewater Road opposite Lot 91 Edgewater Road, and proceeding in a general southerly direction across Lot 1 Kwinana Freeway extension reserve under the control of the Main Roads Department and thence across Lot 2 on the eastern shore of the Canning River being under control of the Metropolitan Regional Planning Authority to the northern end of the proposed Mt. Henry Bridge; thence southwesterly along the proposed Mt. Henry Bridge across Canning River to its southwestern shore; thence westerly and in a general southerly direction along the Kwinana Freeway extension reserve across The Esplanade, Beamish Avenue, Brian Avenue, and Cranford Avenue to terminate on the south side of Cranford Avenue opposite Selway Road, as shown on Plan M.W.B. 15823.

Notice to Owners and Occupiers of land within the Shire of Wandering.

PURSUANT to the powers contained in section 33 of the above Act, you are hereby required on or before the 31st day of October, 1979, or before such later date as the Council may, according to local conditions, decide to, plough, cultivate, scarify or otherwise clear of all inflammable materials and thereafter maintain the firebreaks clear of all inflammable material up to and including the day of 15th day of April, 1980.

If it is impracticable for any reason to clear firebreaks in the position required by this notice, the approval of the Council must be obtained to provide them in alternative places.

Firebreaks in the places described hereunder will be accepted as complying with this Order so far as they apply to the common boundary between the land of any owner and abutting lands referred to here:—

- (a) Where land of an Owner/Occupier abuts on a declared road and the Owner/Occupier has burned or cleared the bush and has maintained it in this condition between the road formation and, the common boundary subject to compliance with the provisions of the Main Roads Act where applicable.

Note: Ploughing of roadsides in the Shire of Wandering is prohibited.

- (b) Where the land of an Owner or Occupier abuts Crown Land or Reserve and, the Owner/Occupier has cleared a firebreak in accordance with the previous specifications in this notice on the Crown Land or Reserve along the common boundary.

PURSUANT to the powers contained in section 33 of the Bush Fires Act 1954, you are hereby required on or before the 15th day of November, 1979, to provide and maintain Firebreaks during the Firebreak period on land owned or occupied by you in positions as near as is practicable to each internal boundary of such land and not less than:—

- (a) 3 metres wide to lots or parcels of land in excess of 4.4 hectares in area or,
- (b) 2 metres wide to lots or parcels of land 4.5 hectares in area or less and,
- (c) 10 metres wide immediately surrounding all buildings and materials of an inflammable nature, haystacks, fuel dumps and ramps.
- (d) 3 metres or more than 6 metres wide to lots or parcels of land in excess of 20 hectares in area but in any event to be to the satisfaction of the Bush Fire Control Officer.

If the requirements of this order are to be carried out by burning, such burning must be in accordance with the Bush Fires Act 1954, section 18 and Regulation 15B. If it is considered to be impracticable for any reason to clear Firebreaks as required by this order on any particular lot or parcel of land the owner thereof may apply in writing to the Council not later than 31st October each year for permission to provide a Firebreak in alternative positions on such land. If Council is not satisfied with the owner's proposal and permission is not granted and conveyed to the owner in writing by the Council the owner of the land shall comply with the requirements of this order.

Interpretation:

- (a) "Council" means the Council of the municipality of the Town of Kwinana.
- (b) "Firebreak Period" means the period between the 15th November in any year and the 15th April in the following year.
- (c) "Firebreak" means ground from which all inflammable material has been removed and on which no inflammable material is permitted during the Firebreak period.

It is the responsibility of the Owner of the Land to ensure that Firebreaks, in accordance with this Order, have been constructed and maintained. The penalty for failing to comply with this notice is a fine of not less than \$40 nor more than \$400 and a person in default is also liable, whether prosecuted or not, to pay the cost of performing the work directed in this notice if it is not carried out by the Owner or Occupier by the date required by this notice.

2:2 Where the area of land exceeds 2 000 square metres, firebreaks at least three metres in width shall be cleared of all flammable material immediately inside and along the boundaries of the land. Where there are buildings on the land, additional firebreaks three metres in width shall be cleared immediately surrounding each building.

If it is considered for any reason to be impractical to clear firebreaks or remove flammable material as required by this notice, you may apply to the Council or its duly authorised officer not later than the 15th day of October, 1979, for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions or take alternative action to remove or abate fire hazards. If permission is not granted by the Council or its duly authorised officer, you shall comply with the requirements of this notice.

"Flammable material" does not include green growing trees or green growing plants in gardens.

If the requirements of this notice are carried out by burning, such burning shall comply with the relevant provisions of the Bush Fires Act, 1954-1977.

- (a) where the area of land is 2 000 square metres or less the land shall be cleared of all inflammable materials; and
- (b) where the area of land exceeds 2 000 square metres a fire break of not less than three metres wide shall be cleared of all inflammable materials inside the external boundaries of the land and immediately surrounding any buildings, fuel deposits and haystacks contained on the land.

If the requirements of this notice are carried out by burning, such burning must be in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Bush Fires Act, 1954-1977.

If it is considered impracticable for any reason to clear firebreaks or remove inflammable materials as required by this notice, an owner and/or occupier of any land may apply to the Council or its duly authorised officer not later than the 15th day of October, 1979, for permission to provide firebreaks in an alternative position on the land.

If permission is not granted the requirements of this notice shall be complied with.

The penalty for failing to comply with this notice is a minimum infringement fine of \$40.40 and/or a maximum court fine of \$400.00.

 - (iv) Stables.
 - (v) Studio.
 - (c) All other uses not mentioned under (a) and (b) are not permitted (X).
 - (3) No dwelling unit of a lesser area than 110 m under the main roof shall be constructed.
 - (4) No building shall be constructed within the zone of material which in the opinion of the Council is undesirable for the locality.
 - (5) No dwelling unit shall be constructed or approved for construction unless a minimum of 90 000 litre storage tank is incorporated in the approved plans and no dwelling unit shall be considered fit for human habitation unless such a tank has been installed and is operating.
This clause shall not apply where:
 - (i) The lots created within the zone are supplied by normal water supply authority mains.
 - (ii) The developer has produced evidence from some competent professional authority which satisfies Council that an adequate potable on-site water supply is available.
 - (6) No dwelling house or outbuilding shall be constructed within 20 metres of a Lot boundary provided the Council may approve a lesser distance where Council is of the opinion that the topography or shape of the Lot or natural flora upon it makes it desirable to alter this provision.

By-laws Relating to Swimming Pools.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records, having resolved on the Fourteenth day of February, 1978 to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following by-laws:—

1. In these by-laws, unless the context otherwise requires, the following terms shall have the meaning set against them hereunder respectively:—

“Council” means the Council of the Municipality of the City of Melville.

“Attendant” means an officer or employee of the Council duly authorised to perform duties in connection with a pool premises.

“Pool Manager” means the person for the time being employed by the Council to control and to manage a pool premises and includes his assistant or deputy.

“Pool Premises” means and includes each of the swimming pools for the time under the control and management of the Council, and all buildings, structures, fittings, fixtures, machinery, chattels, furniture and equipment forming part of such swimming pools or used in connection therewith.

“Town Clerk” means the Town Clerk of the City of Melville.

2. (a) The pool premises shall be open for admission of the public during such hours and periods as the Council may from time to time determine.

(b) The pool premises, or any part thereof may, at any time at the discretion of the Manager, subject to the written approval of the Town Clerk endorsed by Council, be set aside for the use of certain persons to the exclusion of others.

3. The Council may refuse any person admission to the pool premises at any time and children under the age of six (6) years shall be refused admission unless accompanied by a responsible person over the age of fourteen (14) years.

4. Every person using the pool premises shall obey all reasonable directions of the Pool Manager or attendant with regard to such use.

5. The Pool Manager or attendant may temporarily suspend admission to, or remove from the pool premises or any part thereof, all or any persons or person if, in his opinion, such action is necessary or desirable.

6. If a person shall appear in public and in the opinion of the Pool Manager or attendant, be indecently or insufficiently clad, the Pool Manager or attendant shall direct that person forthwith to resume his or her ordinary clothing and such person shall forthwith comply with that direction.

7. (a) It shall be the duty of the Pool Manager or attendant, who is hereby so empowered and directed, to refuse admission to or remove, or cause to be removed from the pool premises any person who, in the opinion of the Pool Manager or attendant:—

(i) is a child under the age of six (6) years and is unaccompanied by a responsible person over the age of fourteen (14) years; or

(ii) is guilty of a breach of any of the provisions of these by-laws; or

(iii) is by his past, or present conduct within or about the pool premises undesirable; or

(iv) is under, or apparently under the influence of alcoholic liquor or drugs; or

(v) is apparently suffering from any contagious infectious offensive disease or skin complaint;

(b) Any such person shall, upon the request of the Pool Manager or attendant to withdraw from the pool premises, quietly and peaceably, do so immediately.

8. Any person who has been refused admission to the pool premises or has been requested to leave the pool premises and who feels aggrieved by the action of the Pool Manager or an attendant, may appeal to the Council, by letter addressed to the Town Clerk, against such action. The Council shall consider the objection and give such direction in the matter as it thinks fit. The right of appeal given by this by-law shall not imply any right of action for damages or other remedy against the Council or Pool Manager or an attendant arising out of such refusal of admission or direction to leave the pool premises.

9. A person shall not for profit, teach, coach or train any person in the pool premises unless with the prior written consent of the Council, subject to such conditions as it thinks fit and may at any time withdraw such consent.

10. (a) A person, club organiser or association shall not conduct controlled swimming or diving events, carnivals or competitions without the prior written approval of the Council.

(b) The Council may grant such approval subject to such conditions as it thinks fit and may, at any time, withdraw such consent.

(c) A person, club, association or organisation conducting any carnival at the pool premises shall be responsible for the conduct of the competitors and spectators during the carnival and shall prevent overcrowding and ensure that no damage is done to the buildings or fencing or any other portion of the pool premises and that these by-laws are observed by all competitors, officials and spectators attending the carnival.

11. Every person finding, within the pool premises, any article which may have been left or lost therein, shall immediately deliver it to the Pool Manager or attendant who shall thereupon register a description of such article and all particulars relating thereto in a book which shall be kept for that purpose, and any person claiming the article, who satisfies the Pool Manager or attendant that he is the lawful owner of the article, shall upon payment of a charge of ten cents (10c) and upon signing a receipt for it, have the article returned to him.

12. All articles left in the pool premises and not claimed within a period of three (3) calendar months, shall be disposed of by the Council in any manner acceptable at common law.

13. (a) No person shall enter any portion of the pool premises set apart exclusively for the opposite sex. Nor shall any person, without the consent of the occupier, enter or attempt to enter any bathroom or dressing box or other compartment which is already occupied.

(b) No person upon the pool premises shall, in any way, interfere with any other person therein or with any other person's use thereof nor throw or push, or attempt to throw or push any person into the swimming pool or throw any stones, sticks or any other matter or thing to the annoyance of any person using the pool premises.

(c) No person or group of persons shall play any ball games or take any action whatsoever which shall in any way limit the enjoyment of the users of the pool premises, provided that nothing therein contained shall apply to the playing of any games or aquatic sports organised and conducted on the pool premises by any Club, association or organisation or other person at such time and in such manner as shall be approved by the Council.

(d) No person liable for the control of a dog or other animal shall cause or permit such dog or animal to enter or remain in or about the pool premises.

14. No person shall:—

- (a) enter the pool premises without having first paid, to the Pool Manager or attendant, the proper charge for admission unless that person is an officer or employee of the Council in the course of his duties
- (b) obstruct the Pool Manager or attendant in carrying out their duties
- (c) enter or depart from any part of the pool premises except by means of the respective entrances or exits set apart for that purpose
- (d) dress or undress or remove any part of his or her bathing costume except in a dressing room enclosure provided for that purpose
- (e) appear in public unless properly attired in a costume of such nature as to preserve public decency and to cover the body so as to prevent indecent exposure of the person;
- (f) enter or be in the pool premises while in an intoxicated condition induced by liquor or drugs
- (g) take into the pool premises, or have in his possession therein, any intoxicating liquor or drugs
- (h) use any soap in any part of the pool premises other than in the dressing rooms or shower recess
- (i) climb up or upon any roof, fence, wall or partition on the pool premises
- (j) in any part of the pool premises behave in an unseemly, improper, disorderly, riotous or indecent manner; swear or use any indecent obscene, offensive or abusive language or gamble or misconduct himself or herself
- (k) deposit any filth or rubbish in any part of the pool premises except in places set aside for that purpose
- (l) smoke, consume foodstuffs or drinks in any specific area in which smoking or consumption is prohibited by notice
- (m) wastefully use the water or leave any taps dripping in the dressing rooms or elsewhere in the pool premises
- (n) spit or expectorate in the swimming pool or on any part of the pool premises or in any way commit any nuisance on or in any part of such premises
- (o) use any substance or preparation whereby the water of swimming pool may become discoloured or rendered turbid or otherwise unfit for the proper use of bathers
- (p) foul or pollute water in any shower, bath or in the swimming pool; or soil, damage, injure, destroy, use improperly, disfigure or write in or upon any dressing room, closet or compartment, or other part of the pool premises or any furniture or other article of equipment therein
- (q) damage, improperly use or interfere with any tap, valve, locker or other fitting or appliance in or about the pool premises or bring or deposit any filth or rubbish onto or in the pool premises
- (r) smoke, unless permitted by the Pool Manager, in any buildings, dressing room or other compartment in the pool premises
- (s) whilst suffering from any contagious, infectious or cutaneous disease, or whilst in an unclean condition, enter or use or attempt to enter or use the swimming pool or the pool premises or any part thereof
- (t) soil or defile or damage any towel or bathing costume
- (u) break, injure, damage or destroy any life saving or other equipment or any locker key or any property of the Council.

15. No person shall pay nor shall any Pool Manager or attendant, or officer or servant of the Council, receive any fee for admission to or for the use of any facility in the pool premises except upon such person being permitted to pass through a turnstile which automatically registers such admission or except in exchange for a printed ticket bearing the name of the Council or in exchange for a ticket issued from a cash register of the Council.

16. Every person shall, when leaving the pool premises, if requested to do so, produce his or her bathing costume or towel for inspection by the Pool Manager or attendant.

17. No ticket, token, licence or receipt issued, as provided by these by-laws, shall be transferable and a person other than the person to whom it was originally issued shall not enjoy and benefit therefrom or any privileges thereunder.

18. Neither the Council nor the Pool Manager or attendant or officers or employee of the Council shall in any way be responsible for any articles or money lost by or stolen from any person whilst in the pool premises or for any articles damaged or destroyed whilst in or about the pool premises.

19. A person who infringes any of the provisions of these by-laws or shall attempt any breach thereof, may be summarily removed from the pool premises or any part thereof by the Pool Manager or an attendant, and if committing a breach of the Act or these by-laws, may be arrested by the Pool Manager or an attendant and given into the custody of a police officer and no person shall have any right of action against the Pool Manager or attendant or Council who in good faith effects or causes to be effected such arrest.

20. (a) The Pool Manager or an attendant may refuse to admit to the pool premises any person who shall have been convicted of a breach of any of the provisions of these by-laws until such time as the Council may decide that such person shall be admitted.

(b) The Council may issue a written direction to the Pool Manager that any person named in such direction shall not be admitted to the pool premises and whilst such direction remains in force, the Pool Manager or an attendant shall not admit such person to the pool premises or permit him to be therein and such person shall not, with the knowledge that such direction is in force, enter or attempt to enter the pool premises.

21. Any person who shall commit a breach of these by-laws shall be liable to:—

(a) a maximum penalty of \$100.

(b) a maximum daily penalty during the breach of \$10 per day.

Where under the provisions of this By-law a notice is served on the owner of a vehicle within the time limited then unless within 21 days after the date of the service of the notice the owner of the vehicle either informs the Clerk of the Council or an authorised officer as to the identity and address of the person who was the driver or person in charge of the vehicle at the time of the offence is alleged to have been committed or satisfies the Clerk of the Council that the vehicle had been stolen or unlawfully taken or was being unlawfully used at the time the offence is alleged to have been committed then the owner is deemed to have committed the offence.

By-law 30 (3). Amended by adding after the word "may" in line 3 the words "within 30 days of the date upon which the offence is alleged to have been committed".

Where under the provisions of this By-law a notice is served on the owner of a vehicle within the time limited then unless within 21 days after the date of the service of the notice the owner of the vehicle either informs the Clerk of the Council or an authorised officer as to the identity and address of the person who was the driver or person in charge of the vehicle at the time the offence is alleged to have been committed or satisfies the Clerk of the Council that the vehicle had been stolen or unlawfully taken, or was being unlawfully used, at the time the offence is alleged to have been committed then the owner is deemed to have committed the offence.

By-laws Relating to the Control and Usage of Pedestrian Bridges over the Avon River within the District of the Municipality of the Town of Northam.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on the twenty-seventh day of June, 1978 to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following by-laws:—

1. Interpretation:

In these by-laws subject to the context "Council" means the Council for the Town of Northam.

"Officer of the Council" means an officer of the Council for the Town of Northam or other person acting for or on behalf of or with the authority of the Council.

"Owner" in relation to any vehicle, bicycle or animal includes any person in charge or control of the vehicle, bicycle or animal.

"Pedestrian Bridge" means any bridge intended for use by pedestrians only and which is subject to the care, control or management of Council as defined in sections 199 and 300 of the abovementioned Act.

"Motor Vehicle" means a self-propelled vehicle that is not operated on rails; and the expression includes a trailer, semi-trailer or caravan while attached to a motor vehicle.

2. Use of Pedestrian Bridges:

(a) No person shall use or enter upon any pedestrian bridge except in accordance with these by-laws.

(b) No person shall use or enter upon any pedestrian bridge when it is under construction or under repair or when it is closed by order of the Council.

3. Motor Vehicles on Pedestrian Bridges:
- (a) No motor vehicle shall be driven, ridden or taken onto or be allowed to remain on any pedestrian bridge without express permission of the Council or an Officer of the Council.
 - (b) No person shall ride a bicycle on any pedestrian bridge.
4. Livestock on Pedestrian Bridges: No person shall herd, drive, ride, lead or allow any cattle, horse, sheep, dog or other animal to stray or to be at large upon any pedestrian bridge.
5. Damage to Pedestrian Bridges: Where damage is caused to any pedestrian bridge the Council may repair the damage and the cost of such repair shall be a debt due to the Council and payable by the person or persons responsible for the damage and may be recovered in a court of competent jurisdiction.
6. Obstruction of Pedestrian Bridges or Officer:
- (a) No person shall place or cause to be placed on any pedestrian bridge any obstruction without permission in writing of the Council.
 - (b) No person shall obstruct any representative, Officer or workman of the Council in constructing, repairing, adding to or working on or in relation to any pedestrian bridge.
7. Disorderly Person:
- (a) No drunk, idle or disorderly person shall enter upon or remain upon any pedestrian bridge, other than in crossing a pedestrian bridge in a lawful manner.
 - (b) No person shall behave in a violent or offensive manner to the annoyance, discomfort or inconvenience of others or write or use any insulting, abusive, indecent, blasphemous or obscene words or interfere with the comfort of any person upon or entering upon any pedestrian bridge.
 - (c) No person shall commit any nuisance or gamble upon any pedestrian bridge.
8. Rubbish, etc.: No person shall throw or place or cause to be thrown or placed at or onto any pedestrian bridge any glass, stone, missile, filth, dirt, rubbish or other matter of similar nature.
9. Fires: No person shall under any pretext whatsoever light, place or keep a fire upon or against any pedestrian bridge.
10. Miscellaneous: No person shall—
- (a) Post, stick, paint or write or cause to be posted, stuck, painted or written any placard, bill, advertisement, sign or other matter on or upon any pedestrian bridge or on or upon any related post, fence, gate, wall or other structure.
 - (b) Write any indecent words, draw any indecent or obscene pictures or representations on or upon any pedestrian bridge or on or upon any related post, fence, gate, wall, or other structure.
 - (c) Deface or damage any writing, printing, paint or improvement to any board or notice authorised to be maintained on or upon any pedestrian bridge or related post, fence, gate, wall or other structure.
 - (d) Interfere or in any way tamper with a pedestrian bridge, its fittings or anything related thereto.
11. Penalties: A person who by act or admission contravenes the provisions of any of these by-laws commits an offence and is liable on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding \$100.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act, and all other powers enabling it, the Council of the Shire of Kalamunda hereby records having resolved on the 11th day of October 1978 to submit for confirmation by the Governor an amendment to the By-law Regulating the Construction, Establishment, Operation, and Maintenance of Motels published in the *Government Gazette* of the 5th day of January 1961, and amended as published in the *Government Gazette* of the 20th day of December, 1974, and the 14th day of March 1975, with such alterations as are here set out.

- (a) Darling Range Road Board becomes "The Municipality of the Shire of Kalamunda" in all the by-laws.
- (b) "Board" becomes "Council" in all the by-laws.
- (c) By-law 3 (1)—Delete By-law 3 (1) and substitute a new By-law 3 (1) "A motel shall not be established or operated other than upon a site set apart under any Town Planning Scheme as a site for motels, in accordance with the provisions of the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928".

By-laws Relating to the Management and Control of the Kalamunda Swimming Centre.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on the 13th day of November, 1978, to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following by-laws.

- 1. In these by-laws subject to the context—
 - "Council" means Council of the Shire of Kalamunda.
 - "Manager" means the person appointed by the Council to control and manage the Pool;
 - "Pool" means the Kalamunda Swimming Centre and shall include any fencing, turnstiles, dressing rooms, shower recesses, spectators stands, seating, lavatories and any other structure erected for the use and convenience of persons using the Pool;
 - "Adult" means any person over the age of fifteen (15) years who is not a full time student;
 - "Child" means any person under the age of fifteen (15) years or a full time student,

2. Hours of Admission: The pool shall be open daily during the summer months from October to April at such times as are determined by the Council and posted on a notice board at the entrance to the pool. The Council may at its discretion restrict or prohibit public access to the pool on any day by posting a notice to this effect on the notice board at the entrance of the pool.

3. Costumes: Every person using the pool shall be dressed in a clean, decent and suitable manner and any person who appears in public in such a condition, which, in the opinion of the Manager or other person for the time being in charge of the Pool, is offensive, then the Manager shall direct that he or she resume his or her ordinary clothes forthwith.

4. Admission: No person shall, without the express permission of the Council or the Manager, enter the Pool save through the turnstile erected at the entrance for that purpose and upon payment of any prescribed admission charge.

5. Control of Premises:

- (a) Every person using the Pool premises shall obey all reasonable directions of the Manager or other person for the time being in charge of the Pool with regard to such use.
- (b) No person shall obstruct, interfere with or hinder the Pool Manager in the performance of any duty in the Pool premises.

6. Offences: No person shall,

- (a) enter or remain in the Pool premises whilst in an intoxicated condition;
- (b) bring into the Pool premises any spirits or other intoxicating liquors;
- (c) use soap in any part of the Pool premises other than in the cleansing shower baths;
- (d) in any part of the Pool premises use any indecent, obscene or offensive language or behave in an indecent or offensive manner;
- (e) smoke in any part of the Pool premises where a notice is exhibited prohibiting smoking;
- (f) climb up to or on any partition or roof or any other portion of the Pool premises;
- (g) in the dressing rooms or elsewhere in the Pool premises wastefully use the water or leave any taps running;
- (h) spit or expectorate in the Pool or on any platform or dressing rooms or commit any nuisance on or in any part of the Pool premises;
- (i) whilst in the Pool use any substance or preparation whereby the water in the Pool may be discoloured or rendered turbid or otherwise unfit for the proper use of bathers;
- (j) wilfully foul or pollute water in any shower bath or in the Pool, or wilfully soil, defile, damage, injure or destroy any dressing room, closet box or compartment or other part of the Pool premises, or any furniture or other article therein;
- (k) at any time carelessly or negligently injure or improperly use or interfere with any taps, locks, valves, or other fittings or appliances in or about the Pool premises or write upon or deface the walls or partitions or any part of the Pool premises or discharge litter of any description on or about the Pool premises.
- (l) cause or allow any dog or other animal belonging to such person under his or her control to enter or remain in or upon the Pool premises;
- (m) in any way interfere with any other person or throw or push or attempt to throw or push any person into the Pool, or throw any stones or sticks or any other matter or thing to the annoyance of any other person using the Pool premises.
- (n) whilst suffering from any cutaneous, infectious or contagious disease, or whilst in an unclean condition, enter or use, or attempt to enter or use the Pool premises or any part thereof;
- (o) leave a child under school age at the Pool, unless the child is in the custody and control of a responsible person.

7. No male person shall enter any portion of the Pool premises set apart for females, and no female person shall enter upon any portion of the Pool premises set apart for males.

8. Lost Property:

- (a) Every person finding in the pool premises any article which may have been left or lost therein shall immediately deliver the same to the Manager or other person for the time being in charge of the Pool, who shall thereupon register a description of such article, and all particulars relating thereto in a book which shall be kept for that purpose, and any person claiming the said article and who satisfies the Manager or other person that he or she is the lawful owner of same, shall have such article returned upon signing for such article in the book before-mentioned.
- (b) The Manager or other person for the time being in charge of the Pool shall at least once in every week report to the Shire Clerk regarding lost property and produce the said book for inspection by the Shire Clerk.

- (c) The Council will not under any circumstances incur any liability in respect of articles lost or stolen from any persons whilst on the Pool premises.

9. Carnivals:

- (a) The person, club, association or organisation conducting any carnival held at the Pool premises shall be responsible for the conduct of the competitors and spectators during such carnival, and shall be bound to see that there is no over-crowding and that no damage is done to the buildings or fencing or any portions of the Pool premises.
- (b) At all swimming carnivals held at the Pool premises, the competitors shall wear proper and approved bathing costumes.
- (c) Every person, club, association, or organisation to whom permission to use the Pool premises is granted for the purpose of holding a swimming carnival shall at least one week before the date of such carnival forward to the Shire Clerk a copy of the programme of events to be competed for thereat; any item on such programme that the President or Shire Clerk does not approve of shall be struck out or so altered as directed.

10. Enforcement of By-Law:

- (a) Any person offending against any of the provisions of these by-laws shall on conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding \$200.
- (b) Every person who shall infringe any of the provisions of these by-laws may be summarily removed from the Pool premises and from every part thereof, by the Manager or other person for the time being in charge of the Pool, or may be arrested by such Manager or other person and given into the custody of a police constable.
- (c) The Manager or other person for the time being in charge of the pool may refuse to admit to the Pool premises any person who shall have been convicted of wilfully disobeying or infringing any of the provisions.

11. The By-Laws Relating to the Management and Control of the Kalamunda Swimming Centre published in the *Government Gazette* of the 18th February 1965 and amended from time to time are hereby revoked.

By-laws Relating to the Control of Hawkers.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and all other powers enabling it the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on the 5th day of October, 1978, to make and submit for confirmation by His Excellency the Governor, the following By-laws:—

1. In these By-laws unless the context otherwise requires the following expressions shall have the meanings set out against them hereunder respectively—

“Council” means the Council of the Shire of Mundaring.

“District” means the municipal district of the Shire of Mundaring.

“Hawker” means a person as defined in section 217 of the Local Government Act 1960 (as amended).

“Licensee” means a person to whom a license is granted under these By-laws.

“License” means a hawker’s license issued pursuant to these By-laws.

“Clerk” means the Shire Clerk or the person acting for the time being in that capacity.

2. A person shall not hawk any goods wares or merchandise within the district unless he holds a current license issued to him by the Council in accordance with these By-laws.

3. A person who desires to obtain a license to hawk any goods wares or merchandise, shall make application in writing to Council in the form of Form I in the First Schedule to these By-laws.

- 4. A license shall—
 - (a) state the type of goods wares or merchandise which are authorised to be hawked;
 - (b) specify what part of the district in which the goods wares or merchandise are permitted to be hawked;
 - (c) specify the conditions (if any) on which the license is issued;
 - (d) be in the form of Form II in the First Schedule of these By-laws.
- 5. Unless otherwise specified a license granted by the Council shall remain valid until the 31st day of December next after the issue thereof unless previously revoked.
- 6. A license shall not be transferable.
- 7. A hawker's license fee shall be as prescribed in the Second Schedule to these By-laws and shall be paid by the licensee prior to the issue to him of a license.
- 8. (i) The Council shall not issue a license (other than a renewal of a license) to an applicant unless he produces to the Council a certificate signed by two Justices of the Peace certifying that he is of good character and reputation and is a fit person to exercise the trade of a hawker.
 - (ii) The Council may refuse to issue a license or may cancel a license in the event that an applicant or licensee (as the case may be);
 - (a) is an undischarged bankrupt or becomes bankrupt;
 - (b) has been convicted or is convicted of an indictable offence;
 - (c) has been twice convicted during the preceeding five years or is twice convicted within the space of five years of an offence against the By-laws of any local authority relating to hawkers;
 - (d) does not conform with the requirements of the Health Act, 1911 or the Model By-laws made under that Act.
 - (iii) Upon the cancellation of a license, the holder thereof shall forthwith return the license to the Clerk and shall forfeit all fees paid in respect of the license.
- 9. A hawker shall not—
 - (i) hawk in the following streets roads or areas as follows:
 - (a) Great Eastern Highway;
 - (ii) hawk between the hours of sunset and the next sunrise or on any Sunday or on Christmas Day or Good Friday without the consent of Council;
 - (iii) trade within the distance of 200 metres of any shop or permanent place of business that has for sale any goods wares or merchandise of the kind being hawked by the hawker;
 - (iv) call his wares or make or cause to be made any outcry or disturbance likely to be a nuisance or annoyance to any person in that vicinity; or
 - (v) remain stationary in any street or public place for any period exceeding thirty minutes or such lesser time as shall be necessary for serving or treating with any customer or intending customer when offering to buy or to treat.
- 10. A hawker while hawking shall when selling goods wares or merchandise by weight, carry and use for that purpose scales tested and certified in accordance with the provisions of the Weights and Measures Act, 1915 (as amended).
- 11. A hawker while hawking shall carry with him his license and shall produce the license to any Officer of the Council or to a Police Officer on demand.
- 12. A hawker while hawking shall have his name and the words "Licensed hawker" legibly and conspicuously displayed on his vehicle barrow bag or tray.
- 13. A person who shall be guilty of an offence against these By-laws shall be liable to a maximum penalty of \$200 and to a maximum daily penalty during the breach of \$20 per day.

The Shire of Mundaring's By-laws relating to Hawkers and Stalls as

repealed.

1. In these By-laws unless the context otherwise requires the following
expressions shall have the meanings set out against them hereunder respec-
tively—

"Council" means the Council of the Shire of Mundaring.

"District" means the municipal district of the Shire of Mundaring.

"Clerk" means the Shire Clerk or the person acting for the time being
in that position.

"License" means a stall-holder's license issued pursuant to these By-laws.

"Licensee" means a person to whom a License is granted under these
By-laws."Stall" means a movable or temporarily fixed stall for the sale of goods,
wares, merchandise or services including motor vehicles fitted out for
such purpose.

"Stall holder" means a person in charge of a stall.

"Voluntary Organisation" means a charitable benevolent religious literary

tion club society or body whether incorporated or not whose members
are not entitled nor permitted to receive any pecuniary or profit from
the transactions thereof.

2. A person shall not set up or conduct a stall in on or near any street or way within the District unless he is the holder of a current License issued to him by the Council in accordance with these By-laws.

3. A person who desires to obtain a license to set up and conduct business at a stall shall make application in writing to Council in the form of Form I as set out in the First Schedule to these By-laws.

4. A License shall

- (a) state the type of goods or services which are authorised to be sold at the stall
- (b) specify the size of the stall
- (c) specify the date and times the stall may be set up
- (d) specify the place in which the stall may be set up
- (e) specify the conditions (if any) on which the license is issued.
- (f) be in the form of Form II as set out in the First Schedule to these By-laws.

5. Unless otherwise specified, a license granted by the Council shall remain valid until the 31st day of December next after the issue thereof unless previously revoked.

6. A license shall not be transferable.

7. A stall license fee shall be as prescribed in the second schedule to these By-laws and shall be paid by the Licensee prior to the issue to him of a license.

8. The Council may revoke a license on any of the following grounds:

- (a) that the stall holder has committed a breach of these By-laws
- (b) that the stall holder has committed a breach of any condition on which the license held by him was issued
- (c) that the stall holder has engaged in dishonest practices in or in respect of the sale of goods at the stall
- (d) that the stall holder is not conducting his business in a respectable or sober manner
- (e) that the stall holder has transferred the license issued to him or does not himself carry on the business.

9. No person shall set up or conduct a business at a stall—

- (a) except at the place specified in the license issued to him, or
- (b) in a street way footpath or other public place at a distance nearer than 5 metres to another stall set up in the street way or footpath or other public place.

10. A stall holder shall not—

- (a) conduct business at a stall except between the hours specified in the license
- (b) deposit any box basket or receptacle (except a receptacle for litter) outside his stall
- (c) make any noise or disturbance to the annoyance of neighbouring residents or passers by
- (d) obstruct the free passage of pedestrians or vehicles on any footpath or roadway
- (e) act in an offensive manner.

11. A stall holder shall carry his license with him and produce it upon demand to an Officer or employee of the Council.

12. A stall holder shall have his name legibly displayed on every stall operated by him.

13. A person who shall be guilty of an offence against these By-laws shall be liable to a maximum penalty of \$200 and to a maximum daily penalty during the breach of \$20 per day.

By-Laws Relating to Numbering of Houses and Buildings.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the above-mentioned Act
 and all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality
 hereby records having resolved on the Eighteenth day of December 1978,
 to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following by-laws:—

1. The Council of the Shire of Toodyay may number and from time to time
 renumber all or any houses or buildings within its district, or require any
 owner or occupiers of any houses or buildings in its district to number or
 renumber their houses or buildings.

2. The Council may adopt a plan or system of numbering of houses or
 buildings in any road or part thereof within its district and may either place
 numbers on the said houses, buildings, or the front gates or fences thereof, or
 by notice in writing require the owners or occupiers thereof to affix number
 plates on the houses, buildings, or front gates or fences in accordance with the
 said plan or system of numbering.

3. (i) The Council may, from time to time, alter any plan or system of
 numbering of houses and buildings adopted by it and may either replace with
 new numbers those previously placed by the Council on the said houses, build-
 ings, front gates, or fences, or may, by notice in writing, require the owners

or occupiers of the said houses and buildings, to affix numbers or new numbers on the houses, buildings, front gates, or fences, in accordance with the alterations to the said plan or system of numbering.

(ii) Any person who has affixed a number to his house, building, fence or gate and is required to renumber his house or building may obtain the required numerals free of charge from the Council and if a person has affixed numerals of an ornamental type, numerals of a similar type may, if practicable, be replaced by the Council free of cost to the person concerned.

4. If the owner or occupier fails to affix a number plate within one month after being served with a written notice to do so he shall be guilty of an offence.

5. Any person committing a breach of this by-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding \$25.00.

Swimming Pool By-Laws.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act, and all other powers enabling it the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on the fourteenth day of July, 1978, to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor, the following by-laws:—

1. In these by-laws unless the context otherwise requires the following terms shall have the meaning set against them hereunder respectively:—

“Council” means the Council of the Shire of Wickepin.

“Shire Clerk” means the Shire Clerk or Acting Shire Clerk of the Shire of Wickepin.

“Pool Manager” means the person appointed for the time being by the Council to have control and management of the Pool Premises.

“Attendant” means an employee of the Council performing any duties on or in connection with the Pool Premises.

“Pool Premises” means the Wickepin Swimming Pool and includes all buildings, structures, fittings, fixtures, machinery, chattels, furniture and equipment forming part of such swimming pool or used in connection therewith.

“Season” means the period of consecutive months in which the Pool Premises is open to the public and agreed upon from time to time by Council.

“Spectator” means any person admitted to the Pool Premises for the sole purpose of viewing the swimming or other activities conducted therein.

“Swimming Coach” means any person permitted by the Council to enter the Pool Premises for the purpose of teaching swimming.

2. A copy of these by-laws shall be kept posted upon a notice board at the main entrance to the Pool Premises.

3. (a) Subject to the provision of sub by-law (b) of this by-law, the Pool Premises shall be open for use of the public for such periods, and at such times as the Council may in its absolute discretion, from time to time determine.

(b) The Pool Manager or the Attendant may temporarily suspend admissions or clear the Pool Premises, or any part thereof, of any person or persons, if in his opinion such action is necessary or desirable.

4. Every person entering the Pool Premises does so at his or her own risk.

5. Excluding a Councillor or an employee of the Council in the course of his duties, no person shall enter the Pool Premises without first having paid the proper charge for admission.

6. (a) All persons wishing to obtain a Season Ticket granting admission to the Pool Premises for any one stipulated Season may obtain such Season Ticket on application to the Council.

(b) Such Season Tickets shall be offered for inspection to the Pool Manager or the Attendant when used to obtain admission to the Pool Premises.

(c) Season Tickets are not transferable and such Tickets may be used only by the person in whose name the same is issued.

(d) A list of all Season Ticket holders shall be kept at the Pool Premises and the Pool Manager or the Attendant shall refuse admission to a person seeking the same and using such Ticket if the Pool Manager or the Attendant believes that the person so seeking admission is not the person to whom such Ticket was issued.

7. (a) No male person above the age of four years shall enter any portion of the Pool Premises set apart for the exclusive use of females.

(b) No female person above the age of four years shall enter any portion of the Pool Premises set apart for the exclusive use of males.

8. No person under the age of six years shall be permitted to enter or remain on the Pool Premises unless that person is, and continues to be, under the care and control of a person above the age of fourteen years.

9. No person shall enter or depart from any part of the Pool Premises except by means of the respective entrances or exits provided for that purpose.

10. No person shall enter the Pool Premises whilst in an intoxicated condition whether such condition is induced by liquor, drugs or otherwise nor shall such person bring into the Pool Premises any drugs or intoxicating liquors.

11. The Council reserves to itself the right to refuse admission to any person at any time and may issue a written direction to the Pool Manager that any person or persons named in such direction shall not be admitted to the Pool Premises and whilst such direction remains in force the Pool Manager or the Attendant shall not admit such person or persons to the Pool Premises or suffer such person or persons to be therein and such person or persons shall not with knowledge that such direction is in force enter or attempt to enter the Pool Premises.

12. The Pool Manager or the Attendant is hereby empowered to refuse to admit to the Pool Premises any person who by his or her past conduct is deemed to be undesirable and shall report such action to the Council.

13. The Pool Manager or the Attendant is hereby empowered to summarily remove from the Pool Premises, or any part thereof, any person or persons who shall have wilfully disobeyed, infringed or broken any of the provisions of these by-laws or who shall permit any breach thereof, or who by his or her present conduct is deemed to be undesirable and shall report such action to the Council.

14. Any person who has been refused admission to the Pool Premises or who feels aggrieved by the action of the Pool Manager or the Attendant may appeal to the Council by letter addressed to the Shire Clerk, against such action and the Council shall give such direction as is thought fit, provided that such right of appeal shall not imply any right of action for damages or other remedy against the Council Pool Manager or Attendant.

15. Every person entering and using the Pool Premises shall obey all reasonable directions of the Pool Manager or Attendant.

16. No person shall in any way obstruct the Pool Manager or the Attendant in his control of the Pool Premises and of the persons therein or in any way interfere with or hinder the Pool Manager or the Attendant in the performance of their duties.

17. No person shall climb up, over or upon any portion of the roof, fences, walls or partitions of the Pool Premises.

18. No person shall, whilst within the Pool Premises or any part thereof:—

- (a) dress or undress or remove any part of his or her ordinary clothing or bathing costume except in the dressing sheds or enclosure provided for that purpose;
- (b) appear in public unless properly attired in ordinary clothing or bathing costume of such nature as to preserve decency and to cover the body so as to prevent indecent exposure of the person. Should any person appear in public in such a condition as to be, in the opinion of the Pool Manager or the Attendant, indecently or insufficiently clad, the Pool Manager or the Attendant shall direct that person to resume his or her ordinary clothing and such direction shall be complied with forthwith;
- (c) use soap elsewhere than in the shower baths provided;
- (d) enter or attempt to enter any pool whilst affected by or suffering from any cutaneous, infectious, contagious or offensive disease or skin complaint or whilst in an unclean condition;
- (e) enter or attempt to enter any pool until he or she has thoroughly cleansed and washed himself or herself in the shower baths provided for that purpose;
- (f) waste or wastefully use water or leave any tap or shower running or dripping;
- (g) use or discharge any substance or preparation whereby the water in any pool may become discoloured, fouled, contaminated, rendered turbid or otherwise unfit for the proper use of bathers;
- (h) deposit any litter, filth or rubbish of any description elsewhere than in the receptacles provided for that purpose;

- (i) permit any dog or other animal belonging to or under his or her control to remain therein or thereon;
- (j) smoke any tobacco or other substance elsewhere than in that or those areas which may be set aside for that purpose;
- (k) consume any food, drink or confectionery of any kind whatsoever elsewhere than in that or those areas which may be set aside for that purpose;
- (l) behave in a riotous disorderly, indecent, improper or unseemly manner;
- (m) swear or use any obscene, indecent, offensive or abusive language;
- (n) interfere with, annoy, attack, throw, push or attempt to interfere with, annoy, attack, throw or push any other person therein;
- (o) throw or attempt to throw any stone, stick or other matter or thing;
- (p) run around the concourse or surrounds;
- (q) expectorate, or in any way commit any nuisance;
- (r) wilfully or negligently destroy, break, damage, or deface or interfere with or improperly use any tree, flower, shrub tap, lock, valve, wall, locker, machinery, fitting or appliance of any kind forming part thereof.

19. No person or group of persons shall play any games or take any action whatsoever which shall in any way limit the enjoyment of other users of the Pool Premises at such time or times as the Pool Premises shall be in general public use. Provided that this by-law shall not apply to the playing of any games or aquatic sport specially organised and conducted by any person, Club, Association or Organisation at such time or times as shall be approved by the Council.

20. No person, Club, Association or Organisation shall conduct any swimming carnival or other event in the Pool Premises unless with the prior consent of the Council which may refuse or grant such consent subject to such conditions as it thinks fit and may at any time withdraw such consent without being under any obligation to assign a reason for doing so and without being liable to pay compensation.

21. A person, Club, Association conducting any swimming carnival or other event in the Pool Premises shall:—

- (a) ensure that all the Officials, Competitors and Spectators comply with all the requirements of these by-laws;
- (b) be financially responsible for any damage to the Pool Premises caused by any Official, Competitor or Spectator.

22. No person shall for reward or profit teach, coach or train any other person for swimming in the Pool Premises except with the written consent of the Council. The Council may refuse or grant such permission subject to such conditions as it thinks fit and may at any time withdraw such permission without being under any obligation to assign a reason for doing so and without being liable to pay compensation.

23. Persons entering the pool premises may deposit valuables with the Pool Manager or the Attendant upon payment of such sum as may be determined by Council from time to time, but under no circumstances whatsoever will Council accept liability should such valuables or any of them be lost, stolen or damaged or otherwise interfered with whilst in the custody of the Council.

24. Any person who finds any article or money which has been left in the Pool Premises and not being his or her property shall forthwith deliver it to the Pool Manager or the Attendant who shall thereupon register a description of such article and all particulars relating thereto in a book which shall be kept for that purpose and any person claiming any such article or money and who satisfies the Pool Manager or the Attendant that he or she is the valid owner of the same shall have such article or money returned to them upon signing for the same in the book abovementioned.

25. At least once in every week the Pool Manager shall report to the Shire Clerk regarding lost property and produce the abovementioned book for inspection by the Shire Clerk.

26. Neither the Council, the Pool Manager or the Attendant shall be in any way responsible for any article or money left or lost by or stolen from any person or for any article damaged or destroyed whilst within the Pool Premises.

27. All articles left at the Pool Premises and not claimed within a period of fourteen (14) days may be disposed of in accordance with the law relating to found and abandoned property.

28. The Pool Manager shall:—

- (a) comply with all directions he may receive from the Council from time to time;
- (b) ensure that the provision of these by-laws are complied with;
- (c) on every Monday of each and every week, or at more frequent intervals properly account to the Shire Clerk for all moneys, being the property of the Council, received at the Pool Premises during the preceding week, or such shorter period;
- (d) submit written reports to the Council, in time to be submitted to each Ordinary Meeting of the Council, on matters arising out of the management of the Pool Premises and its parking area and surrounds and of the behaviour of persons using the same.

29. Any person committing a breach of or an offence against any of the provision contained in these by-laws shall upon conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding one hundred dollars (\$100) for every such breach or offence.

CONSUMER AFFAIRS ACT, 1971-1978.

I, NORMAN RICHARD FLETCHER, Commissioner for Consumer Affairs, being in agreement with a recommendation of the Consumer Products Safety Committee, in pursuance of section 23R (1) of the Consumer Affairs Act hereby permit the supply for domestic use of:

(i) glass shower doors, screens and bath enclosures subject to the following conditions:

(a) the glass shall be Type A or Type B safety glass constructed in accordance with A.S. 2208-1978 except in the case of panels and doors with exposed edges, where glass shall be toughened safety glass constructed in accordance with A.S. 2208-1978 and being in accordance with Table 4.5 of A.S. 1288, Part 1, 1979 but this shall not be taken to include paralleled wire safety glass.

(b) shall be marked in accordance with Clause 2.5 of A.S. 2208-1979.

(ii) framed glass doors and framed glass side panels, subject to the following conditions:

(a) glass shall be toughened safety glass or laminated safety glass constructed in accordance with A.S. 2208-1979 and in accordance with Table 4.5 of A.S. 1288-1979, except in any of the following circumstances:

- (1) The clear opening width of the glass is no wider than 500 mm at any part.
- (2) The lowest part of the glass is 500 mm or more above the highest finished floor level abutting it.
- (3) The clear opening height of each of the glass panels is no larger than 1 000 mm at any part.
- (4) The door or side panel is provided with a horizontal rail or bar located with its upper edge not less than 700 mm or its bottom edge not more than 1 000 mm above the highest finished floor level abutting it. The horizontal rail or bar shall have a face width of at least 40 mm and shall take the form of a fixed

glazing bar or rigid push-bar firmly attached to the stiles to protect each face of the glass.

(b) shall be marked in accordance with Clause 2.5 of A.S. 2208-1979.

(iii) unframed glass doors and unframed glass side panels subject to the following conditions:

(a) the glass shall be toughened safety glass constructed in accordance with A.S. 2208-1979 and be of a thickness of not less than 10 mm.

(b) shall be marked in accordance with Clause 2.5 of A.S. 2208-1979.

(iv) framed internal glass partitions other than glass doors or glass side panels, subject to the following conditions:

(a) the glass shall be Grade A safety glass as defined in A.S. 2208-1979 and of a type in accordance with Table 4.5 of A.S. 1288-1978 except where the maximum glass area for a particular enclosure does not exceed the values given in Table 4.7 of A.S. 1288-1978 where ordinary annealed glass partitions may be supplied.

(b) shall be marked in accordance with Clause 2.5 of A.S. 2208-1979.

3. Amendment to Statute No. 17—Discipline.

(a) Clause 21 is added—

21. A person, who is or has been enrolled as a student and who has not paid a fine imposed on him or any fees or other debts due and payable by him to the University, will not, so long as the fine, fee, or other debt remains unpaid, be informed of his result in any examination or granted credit for any unit or course or given any degree, diploma or other award unless the Senate decides otherwise.

4. Amendments to Statute No. 18—Conditions of Awarding Hackett Bursaries and Hackett Studentships and Scholarships.

(a) Clause 3 is amended by the deletion of the existing Clause 3 and the substitution of the following Clause in its place:—

3. Hackett Studentships shall be awarded under the following conditions—

(1) Postgraduate studentships hereinafter described as Studentships are tenable at a university outside Australia and are open to—

- (a) enrolled students of the University of Western Australia who are graduates of that University and hold at least a second class honours degree or its equivalent; and
- (b) graduates of that University of not more than three years standing who hold at least a second class honours degree or its equivalent.

(2) The value of studentships and the value and method of payment of any additional travelling allowances shall be prescribed by regulations.

(3) Where the Vice-Chancellor is satisfied that a person awarded a Hackett Studentship would be unable to take up or continue his course without undue financial hardship, a special additional allowance of up to such amount per annum as is prescribed by regulations payable at such times and by instalments of such amounts as the Vice-Chancellor shall determine, may be granted to the student.

(4) The University of Western Australia will pay up to such maximum amount as may be prescribed by regulations direct to the institution concerned compulsory fees for admission and tuition payable by the student during his tenure of the Studentship including registration, matriculation, lecture, research, supervision and laboratory fees, but not fees for examination of thesis or graduation.

(b) Clause 4 is deleted.

5. Amendments to Statute No. 19—Professorial Board.

- (a) Clause 1 is amended by the deletion of the existing Clause 1 and the substitution of the following Clause in its place:—

1(1) There shall be constituted a Board to be called "Professorial Board", which shall consist of the following members:—

- (a) the Vice-Chancellor;
- (b) the Deputy Vice-Chancellor;
- (c) the professors of the University;
- (d) the dean of each faculty;
- (e) the head of each department and during the absence of the head of any department from his duties at the University the person appointed by the Senate as the acting head of that department;
- (f) (i) six lecturers elected by the lecturers in the University, such members to hold office for three years;
- (ii) such additional lecturers as the Board may co-opt, provided that the number of such co-opted members shall not exceed three or such number as the Senate may prescribe from time to time on the recommendation of the Board; and
- (iii) for the purposes of this paragraph the term lecturer includes senior tutors and the holders of such other positions as the Board may by resolution declare;
- (g) the University Librarian;
- (h) the Director of the Extension Service;
- (i) the President of the Guild of Undergraduates;
- (j) three students enrolled at the University nominated annually by the Guild Council, one of whom shall be a postgraduate student recommended by the Postgraduate Student Association and in default of any such recommendation nominated in accordance with Guild regulations and each of whom shall hold office for one year and be eligible for renomination.

(2) For the purposes of this clause the Vice-Chancellor, the Deputy Vice-Chancellor, the University Librarian, the Director of the Extension Service, and the President of the Guild of Undergraduates includes any person acting in any of these offices.

- (b) Clause 4 is amended by the deletion of the existing Clause 4 and the substitution of the following Clause in its place:—

4 (1) The Board, after receiving reports from the faculty or faculties concerned, shall make all necessary arrangements for giving effect to the statutes and regulations relating to matriculation and the various courses of study.

(2) The Board may delegate to a Committee appointed by it, to be known as the Ph.D. Committee, all or such matters relating to the degree of Doctor of Philosophy as it thinks fit.

- (c) Clause 7 is amended by the deletion of the existing Clause 7 and the substitution of the following Clause in its place:

7 (1) The Board shall report to the Senate on all proposals for the creation or suppression of professorships, lectureships and all other positions to which full academic conditions apply and of faculties and on all proposals for the foundation or abolition of fellowships, studentships, scholarships, exhibitions or prizes.

(2) The Board may at its discretion report to the Senate on proposals for new buildings and on applications from departments for grants for study or research.

- (d) Clause 16 is amended by the deletion of the existing Clause 16 and the substitution of the following Clause in its place:—

16 (1) Statute No. 21 (Academic Board) is hereby repealed.

(2) Where in any statute or regulation reference is made to the Academic Board constituted by Statute No. 21 hereby repealed, such statute or regulation shall be construed and have effect as if the reference made therein were to the Professorial Board hereby constituted.

(3) In every reprint of such statute or regulation, the words "Professorial Board" shall be substituted for the words "Academic Board".

REGULATIONS.

- Principal regulations. 1. In these regulations the Education Act Regulations, 1960, as reprinted and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 19th March, 1971 pursuant to the Reprinting of Regulations Act, 1954, and amended from time to time thereafter by notices so published, are referred to as the principal regulations.
- Reg. 3 amended. 2. Regulation 3 of the principal regulations is amended—
(a) by inserting after the reference to section B of Division 6 of Part IV, the following reference—
Section BA.—Appointment as Deputy Principal of Class I Primary or Class I Junior Primary School—
Regulations 100A-100E. ;
and
(b) by deleting the number “108” in the reference to Division 7 of Part IV, and inserting in lieu thereof the number “106”.
- Reg. 4 amended. 3. Regulation 4 of the principal regulations is amended by inserting immediately after the interpretation “classification”, an interpretation as follows—
“degree”, in relation to the eligibility of a teacher for promotion, includes a certificate to the effect that the teacher has fulfilled the requirements for the conferring on him of the degree, signed by an officer authorized in that behalf by the body empowered to confer such degree;
- Reg. 13 amended. 4. Subregulation (2) of regulation 13 of the principal regulations is amended by deleting the passage “not exceeding 2.5” in line six of paragraph (c) and inserting in lieu thereof the passage “of 3.25”.
- Part IV, Div. 6 Section BA added. 5. The principal regulations are amended by adding immediately after regulation 100, the following section—
Section BA.—Appointment as Deputy Principal of Class I Primary or Class I Junior Primary School.
100A. (1) This section applies in respect of appointments taking effect on or after the 1st January, 1980, as deputy principal of a Class I primary or Class I junior primary school.
(2) In this section a reference to primary school does not include a junior primary school.
100B. (1) Where an appointment to which this section applies is to be made, the Director-General shall, by notice published in “The Education Circular”, invite applications from teachers eligible under regulation 100D of these regulations to apply to be appointed.
(2) A notice under subregulation (1) of this regulation shall specify the form in which, and the time within which, an application may be made.
100C. An application to be appointed under this section shall be made in the form and within the time specified in the notice mentioned in subregulation (2) of regulation 100B of these regulations.
100D. A teacher is eligible to apply to be appointed under this section if that teacher is, respectively, male or female, as the particular appointment may require, and—
(a) in the case of an appointment as deputy principal of a Class I primary school—
(i) that teacher is, and for not less than one year has been, a principal of a Class III primary school;
(ii) that teacher is, and for not less than one year has been, a deputy principal (primary) of a district high school;
(iii) the name of that teacher is on the promotion list for principals of Class III primary and Class III junior primary schools; or

Schedule—*continued*

- (iv) that teacher is on the permanent staff and has a total of not less than four years' experience as a teacher in a Government school;
 - (b) in the case of an appointment as deputy principal of a Class I junior primary school—
 - (i) that teacher is, and for not less than one year has been, a principal of a Class III junior primary school;
 - (ii) the name of that teacher is on the promotion list for principals of Class III primary and Class III junior primary schools; or
 - (iii) that teacher is on the permanent staff and has a total of not less than four years' experience as a teacher in a Government school.
- 100E. (1) The appointment of a teacher applying under subparagraph (i) or (ii) of paragraph (a) or subparagraph (i) of paragraph (b) of regulation 100D of these regulations shall be treated as a transfer but—
- (a) where a teacher applying under subparagraph (i) or (ii) of paragraph (a) of that regulation is appointed, that teacher shall not thereafter be eligible for transfer to a position referred to in subparagraph (i) or (ii) of paragraph (a) or subparagraph (i) of paragraph (b) of that regulation; and
 - (b) where a teacher applying under subparagraph (i) of paragraph (b) of that regulation is appointed, that teacher shall not thereafter be eligible for transfer to another position as principal of a Class III junior primary school.
- (2) The appointment of a teacher applying under subparagraph (iii) of paragraph (a) or subparagraph (ii) of paragraph (b) of regulation 100D of these regulations—
- (a) shall, subject to subregulation (1) of regulation 99 of these regulations, be made according to the order of eligibility on the promotion list of the teachers applying;
 - (b) shall be treated as a promotion;
 - (c) does not affect the name of the teacher remaining on the promotion list.
- (3) The appointment of a teacher eligible by reason only of subparagraph (iv) of paragraph (a) or subparagraph (iii) of paragraph (b) of regulation 100D of these regulations to apply to be appointed—
- (a) shall not be made while a teacher eligible under any other subparagraph of that regulation to apply for that appointment has applied to be, but has not been, so appointed;
 - (b) shall be made in accordance with the recommendation of the Primary School Appointments Board constituted under regulation 91 of these regulations, and in making its recommendation that Board shall give preference to—
 - (i) applicants considered by it to be satisfactory having a degree approved by the Director-General, or its equivalent, and the Teachers' Higher Certificate;
 - (ii) where there are no applicants as referred to in subparagraph (i) of this paragraph, applicants considered by it to be satisfactory having a Teachers' Higher Certificate;
 - (iii) where there are no applicants as referred to in subparagraph (i) or (ii) of this paragraph, applicants considered by it to be satisfactory having a three year degree approved by the Director-General, that is not, of itself, an initial teaching qualification;
 - (iv) where there are no applicants as referred to in subparagraphs (i), (ii) or (iii) of this paragraph, applicants considered by it to be satisfactory,
- who have been in the service of the Department for the greatest number of complete years.
- (4) There shall be no appeal against a recommendation of the Primary School Appointments Board under subregulation (3) of this regulation.
