Child Welfare Act, 1947-1977.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 19 of the Child Welfare Act, 1947-1977, it is provided, inter alia, that the Governor may, by Order in Council, appoint a Special Magistrate for any Children's Court or Courts: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor in exercise of the power conferred by the aforementioned provision of the said Act and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council doth hereby appoint John Anthony Howard as a Special Magistrate for every Children's Court heretofore established under the said section, with effect from the 1st October, 1979.

Forests Act, 1918-1976. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

F.D. 92/77; L. & S. 2939/76.

WHEREAS by The Forests Act, 1918-1976 it is provided that a dedication under the said Act of Crown Land as a State forest may be revoked in whole or in part in the following manner—

- (a) The Governor shall cause to be laid on the Table of each House of Parliament a proposal for such revocation;
- (b) after such proposal has been laid before Parliament the Governor, on a resolution being passed by both Houses that such proposal be carried out, shall by Order in Council revoke such dedication.

And whereas His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor did cause to be laid on the Table of each of Parliament, his proposal dated the 5th day of October, 1977, for the revocation in part of the dedication of Crown Lands as State forest: And whereas after such proposal had been laid before Parliament a resolution was passed by both Houses that such proposal should be carried out: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor with the advice and consent of the Executive Council doth hereby revoke in part the dedication of Crown Land as State forest No. 4 described in the Schedule hereto.



    - (i) have the qualifications specified in paragraph (a) of this subregulation; and
    - (ii) have satisfactorily completed eight years' service as a teacher in a Government school at either or both of the primary and secondary levels, including—
      - (I) two years' service as principal of a Class III primary school or appointment to the substantive position of principal of a Class III primary school on either 1st January, 1973 or 1st January, 1974;
      - (II) two years' service as a deputy principal or principal mistress of a Class 1A primary school;
      - (III) two years' service as a deputy principal or principal mistress of a district high school;
      - (IV) two years' service as a senior master or senior mistress;
      - (V) two years' service as an education officer, Grade 1; or
      - (VI) an aggregate of two years' service in more than one of the positions referred to in items (I) to (V) of this subparagraph.
