Whereas it is enacted by section 8 of the Country Areas Water Supply Act, 1947-1979 that the Governor may by Order in Council alter or extend the boundaries of a Country Water Area: Now therefore the Lieutenant Governor and Deputy of the Governor by and with the consent of the Executive Council does hereby extend the boundaries of the Mandurah Regional Country Water Area as presently constituted so as to include in that Water Area the portions of the State defined in Schedules "B" and "C" herewith.

Park Ridge Country Water Area.

Park Ridge Country Water Area as originally constituted and defined by Order in Council published in the *Government Gazette* dated 23rd December, 1977.

Schedule "B".

Extension to Mandurah Regional Country
Water Area.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the northwestern corner of the northwestern severance of Cockburn Sound Location 5, a point on a present southern boundary of Mandurah Regional Country Water Area, and extending generally southwesterly along the High Water Mark of the Indian Ocean to the prolongation westerly of the westernmost northern boundary of the northwestern severance of Class A Reserve 12189; thence easterly to and easterly, northerly, again easterly, and southerly along boundaries of that severance to the northern side of White Hill Road; thence easterly along that side and onwards to the northwestern corner of the central severance of Murray Location 113; thence easterly along the northern boundary of that severance and onwards to the northwestern corner of the northeastern severance of Location 113; thence easterly along the northern boundary of that severance and onwards to the High Water Mark of Harvey Estuary; thence generally northerly along that water mark and generally northeasterly along the High Water Mark of Peel Inlet to a point situate west of the southern corner of Lot 290 of Cockburn Sound Location 16, as shown on Land Titles Office Plan 7144; thence east to the southern corner of that lot, a point on a present southwestern boundary of Mandurah Regional Country Water Area and thence generally northwesterly and westerly along boundaries of that Country Water Area to the starting point, as bordered green and marked "B" on Plan P.W.D., W.A. 51862-1-1.

with valve pits and all other necessary apparatus commencing in Soldiers Road at a point opposite the northwestern corner of the proposed Soldiers Road Pump Station Site and thence proceeding in a general northerly direction along Soldiers Road to and across the Canning River; thence within a proposed Metropolitan Water Board pipe reserve to and across reserve ↑28353; to and across an existing Right of Way, thence continuing in a general northerly direction within a proposed Metropolitan Water Board pipe reserve through and along the western boundary of Lot eighteen Brookton Highway to Brookton Highway and terminating thereat. REGULATIONS.

- Principal regulations. 1. In these regulations the Family Court of Western Australia Regulations, 1976 published in the *Government Gazette* on the 21st May, 1976 and amended from time to time thereafter by notices so published are referred to as the principal regulations.
- Reg. 2 amended. 2. Regulation 2 of the principal regulations is amended—
(a) by deleting the definition "application" in line three;
(b) by adding after the word "Maintenance" in line two of the definition of "Collector" the words "and includes an Assistant Collector of Maintenance";
(c) by deleting the definition "court of summary jurisdiction" and substituting the following definition—
"court of summary jurisdiction" means a court of summary jurisdiction constituted by a magistrate and includes such a court when constituted by a stipendiary magistrate who is the Registrar; ; and
(d) by deleting the passage "section 36" in line two of the definition of "pending proceedings" and substituting the passage "section 91".
- Reg. 7 amended. 3. Regulation 7 of the principal regulations is amended by adding after subregulation (3) the following subregulation—
(4) An affidavit required for use in or before the Court or any officer of the Court, or in or before a court of summary jurisdiction—
(a) is not sufficient if sworn before the solicitor acting for the party on whose behalf the affidavit is to be used, or before an agent or correspondent of that solicitor, or before the party himself; and
(b) in the case where it would be insufficient if sworn before the solicitor, agent, correspondent or party himself, is insufficient if sworn before his clerk or partner.

- Reg. 9 amended. 4. Regulation 9 of the principal regulations is amended by deleting the word "secretary" in line one of subregulation (1) and substituting the word "Associate".
- Reg. 14 revoked. 5. Regulation 14 of the principal regulations is revoked.

(1) Any officer, fireman, operations room attendant, direct brigade alarm technician or hose and extinguisher serviceman who has established a claim under the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912, by reason of personal injury by accident arising out of or in the course of his employment shall be entitled to leave of absence from duty, and shall receive during the period of incapacity such sum weekly as shall, together with any weekly amount received as compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912, be equal to the amount of his weekly wages.

(2) For the purposes of this regulation "weekly wages" means—

- (a) the total wages, salary or other remuneration payable at the time of the incapacity for a week's work in such employment under any industrial award or industrial agreement to which the work performed by the incapacitated worker is subject;
- (b) prescribed overtime, being any payment for the number of hours constituting the difference between forty-two hours per week and the number of hours stated in the industrial award or industrial agreement as ordinary hours which constitute a week's work for a worker of the class of the incapacitated worker; and
- (c) any shift allowance, week-end or public holiday penalty allowance, district allowance or industry allowance payable to the worker immediately prior to the accident.

(3) The weekly payments shall be continued as long as the incapacitated worker is in receipt of weekly payments under the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912 or until the services of the incapacitated worker have been terminated by the Board whichever is the earlier.

(4) Payments made under this regulation shall not be deducted from any payments made to the incapacitated worker under the Second Schedule of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912.

(5) Leave granted under this regulation shall not be counted against sick leave.

SHIRE OF MUNDARING.

TOWN PLANNING SCHEME NO. 1—
AMENDMENT No. 65.

THE Mundaring Shire Council under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon it in that behalf by the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended) and the Metropolitan Region Town Planning Scheme Act, 1959 (as amended), hereby amends the above Town Planning Scheme by:—

- (a) Deleting from Part I of the Scheme Text in Clause 1.8 in the definition and interpretation of "Rural Pursuit" the words "and poultry farming" and adding the word "and" between the words "forestry, pasture".
- (b) Inserting in Part I of the Scheme Text in the definitions and interpretations listed in Clause 1.8:—
 1. After the definition of "Art Gallery" the following new definition:—
"Building Envelope: is an area of land within a lot defined on a plan of subdivision lodged with the Council or by other means related by measurement to the boundaries of the lot and within which all buildings on the lot are to be contained."
 2. After the definition of "Objects of Natural Beauty" the following new definition:—
"Poultry Farming: means the use of land for hatching, rearing or keeping of poultry for the purpose of the sale of live poultry, meat or eggs for commercial gain."
 3. After the definition of "Studio" the following new definition:—
"Tree Preservation Area: is an area of land within a lot defined on a plan of subdivision lodged with the Council and related by measurement to the boundaries of the lot or elsewhere by the Scheme within which no indigenous trees or vegetation may be removed except under the conditions laid down in the Scheme."
- (c) Deleting from Clause 3.1 in Part III of the Scheme Text the following:—
"12. Special Rural"
- (d) Amending Part III of the Scheme Text by adding to the list of zones in Clause 3.1 after "11. Residential Development" the following new zones:
 - "12. Special Rural Zone—Landscape Interest
 13. Special Rural Zone—Rural Residential
 14. Special Rural Zone—Intensive Rural"
- (e) Deleting from Part III within the Scheme Text Clause 3.9A.
- (f) Inserting into Part III within the Scheme Text following Clause 3.9 the following:—
"3.9A. Special Rural Zones"

- 1.0 The Scheme contains the following Special Rural Zones:—
- (i) Special Rural Zone—Landscape Interest
 - (ii) Special Rural Zone—Rural Residential
 - (iii) Special Rural Zone—Intensive Rural
- 1.1 The following statements of Council's objectives, policies and provisions shall apply specifically to all land included in Special Rural Zones and are in addition to any provisions which are more generally applicable to such land under this Scheme.
- 2.0 Objectives and Policies:
- 2.1 Council's primary objective is to ensure that development which takes place within the Scheme Area, as a result of increased residential and recreational use, should occur with the least detrimental effect possible to the existing rural character, amenity, landscape and social structure.
- 2.2 The general objectives of Special Rural Zones are:
- (a) To permit further subdivision and development within the rural area in accordance with planning policies adopted from time to time by Council. A basis of these policies will be "Perth's Eastern Corridor" Report (M.R.P.A.—February, 1978).
 - (b) To provide for a variety of life styles (subject to appropriate controls) consistent with the retention of rural landscape, environment and amenity qualities and consistent with the orderly and proper planning of the locality.
- 2.3 In order to achieve its objectives Council's policy will require that every application for rezoning to Special Rural Zone must show an adequate concern for the physical and social environment.
- 2.4 Specific Policies for Zones:
- 2.4.1 Special Rural Zone—Landscape Interest: Council's Policy for this zone includes the requirement that all proposed development will be assessed in terms of its probable pollution of water courses within the zone in addition to the consideration of any effect the development may have upon the landscape quality.
 - 2.4.2 Special Rural Zone—Rural Residential: Council's Policy for this zone is to allow residential living in a rural setting with a variety of ancillary land uses dependent upon landform and scenic elements.
 - 2.4.3 Special Rural Zone—Intensive Rural: Council Policy for this zone is to protect areas of landscape which lie within the direct influence of Corridor development in which some further development of the Rural setting will be recognized to provide rural living with part time farming.
- 3.0 General Conditions Relating to Special Rural Zones: Prior to Council initiating the rezoning of lands to be included within any Special Rural Zone it will prepare, or require the owner(s) of the land to prepare, a submission which complies with the following provisions of the Scheme:—
- Following receipt of an application for rezoning to Special Rural Zone, the Council will:—
- (a) Consider whether the requirements of Council have been adequately covered in the submission and
 - (b) May require that the proposed subdivision design or submission be amended to Council's satisfaction.
- 3.1 Rezoning Applications and Associated Sub-division and Development Proposals:
- 3.1.1 Rezoning applications and associated subdivision and development proposals submitted to Council shall embody the basic premise that development and associated services are secondary to the natural features of the site. To fully illustrate the total building and development programme for each lot, such plans, sketches and specifications shall aim to minimise the visual effect of the resultant development on the Rural landscape.
 - 3.1.2 It will be the responsibility of the applicant seeking rezoning to analyse in detail the area proposed for subdivision and its potential for development, taking into account the criteria laid down by this Scheme.
 - 3.1.3 The application for rezoning must be prepared so that it will meet the objectives and policies of the zone in the protection of the environment, and in this regard must conform to the minimum requirements of the Council of this Scheme. The proposal must also clearly illustrate how these requirements will be met and the objectives achieved.
NOTE: For lots comprising 4 ha. or less which are proposed for subdivision, Council may approve a relaxation of the requirements as outlined by Council if in its opinion the criteria (or part thereof) are not required for the assessment of the application.
 - 3.1.4 An owner of land within a Special Rural Zone who desires to develop land shall lodge three copies of a submission of the proposed development with the Council. If he wishes to subdivide he shall submit for separate approval an application for approval for that subdivision to the Town Planning Board in accordance with Section 20 of the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended) and in accordance with all the provisions of this Scheme.
 - 3.1.5 Prior to Council initiating the rezoning of land to Special Rural Zone the applicant shall lodge with Council three copies of the plan of proposed subdivision upon which are shown the building envelopes and tree preservation areas proposed and agreed to by Council.
 - 3.1.6 Upon lodgement of the plan referred to in item 3.1.5 Council shall adopt such plan as part of the Scheme in order to implement controls over the area which is the subject of the plan.
 - 3.1.7 Notwithstanding the provisions of the Scheme and what may be shown in the plan of subdivision submitted in accordance with Clause 3.1.5 the Town Planning Board may, after consultation with Council, approve a minor variation to a subdivisional design, but further breakdown of lots so created shall be deemed to be contrary to the provisions of the Scheme.
 - 3.1.8 No more than one private dwelling house per lot shall be erected.
 - 3.1.9 In addition to a Building Licence, the Council's prior approval to commence development is required for all development including a private dwelling house and outbuildings except where such an outbuilding is the first outbuilding on the lot and does not exceed 6 m² in area, and such application will be made in the form of Form 1 of Appendix A of this Scheme, and be subject to the provisions of Part VIII of this Scheme.

- 3.1.10 No dwelling unit of a lesser ground floor area than 110 m² under the main roof shall be constructed without specific approval of Council.
- 3.1.11 No building shall be constructed within the zone of materials or colour which in the opinion of the Council are undesirable for the locality.
- 3.1.12 No dwelling unit shall be constructed or approved for construction unless a minimum of 90 000 litre roof water storage tank is incorporated in the approved plans, and no dwelling unit shall be considered fit for human habitation unless such a tank has been installed and is operating.
- This clause shall not apply where:
- (i) The lots created within the zone are supplied by normal Water Supply Authority mains.
 - (ii) The developer has produced evidence from some competent professional authority which satisfies Council that an adequate potable on-site water supply is available.
- 3.1.13 The coverage of each individual lot by buildings shall not exceed 3% of the area of that lot.
- 3.1.14 No dwelling house or outbuilding shall be constructed within 20 metres of a lot boundary provided that the Council may approve a lesser distance where Council is of the opinion that the topography or shape of the lot or natural flora upon it makes it desirable to alter this provision.
- 3.1.15 All buildings upon lots which abut public open space shall present an appearance to the public open space which in Council's opinion is aesthetically satisfactory.
- 3.1.16 No sand pad to any new house or outbuilding shall exceed one metre at its maximum depth and have an average depth over the building area of 0.6m and Council will not permit cut or fill of the site to take place which, in its opinion, excessive.
- Such sandpad to be retained by a wall of material to be elected by Council. All retaining walls or rock based batters are to be designed by a qualified structural engineer. If required, Council may request a Certificate from such an engineer to accompany any application for a building permit.
- 3.1.17 Septic tanks, leach drains, or other such installations for on site disposal of effluent or wastes shall be constructed at least 30 metres distant from any bore, well or other surface water supply whether on the same lot or any other lot and no such installation or similar potential source of water pollution shall be established or maintained within 30 metres of any river, stream, creek, spring or watercourse in which water flows in a natural channel, whether permanently or intermittently.
- Any effluent disposal system shall not be installed within 20 metres of any lot boundary.
- 3.1.18. In areas which Council considers to be deficient in tree cover, it may require as a condition of development for any Building Permit issued in the Zone that the owner plant and maintain up to a maximum of 20 native trees of species specified by Council.
- 3.1.19 All roads within the zone shall be constructed to the specification of the Council with bitumen sealed pavement and gravel shoulders and kerbing where necessary.

Collector roads are roads which serve 20 or more lots and these shall not be less than 5.5 metres sealed width with two shoulders of gravel each not less than 1.5 metres wide.

In respect to this clause, Council may modify its specifications as outlined if it is of the opinion that such a modification will contribute to the achievement of the objectives for the zone and will be in accordance with sound engineering practice.

- 3.1.20 With the intention of preventing overstocking or other practices detrimental to the amenity within the zone, intensive agricultural pursuits and the breeding or keeping of animals for commercial gain shall not be permitted without approval in writing of Council. In giving approval under this clause the Council may impose limits of stocking or such other conditions as it sees fit and may vary such conditions in the light of prevailing seasonal conditions.

3.2 Tree Preservation: The following clauses relating to tree preservation are for the purpose of conserving the natural beauty, convenience and amenity of the zones as defined on the Scheme Map, or the conservation of the natural beauty of the area including inland waters, banks, rivers, hill slopes, summits and valleys.

- 3.2.1 Tree Preservation on Land Adjoining Roads: In considering any rezoning or development Council may require the preservation of trees on land adjoining the roads to be retained to a depth of:—

- (a) Great Eastern Highway—50 metres from the road frontage.
- (b) Seaborne Street, Roland Road, Stoneville Road, Sawyers Road, Alice Road, Bunning Road, Old Northam Road—20 metres from the road frontage.
- (c) Future Arterial Roads—20 metres from the road frontage.

- 3.2.2 Areas Proposed for Tree Preservation: Areas for Tree Preservation must be shown on the submissions lodged with Council under the provisions of Clause 3.1.5 of this Scheme and in addition to those areas referred to in the preceding clauses and in specific areas (if any) which may be included within this Scheme, include:—

- (a) Areas contiguous to creeks and water courses.
- (b) Critical landscape elements (e.g. view corridors) and skylines.

Within the land designed as 'Tree Preservation Area' on a submission lodged with Council under the provisions of Clause 3.1.5 of this Scheme, no indigenous tree may be felled except as hereunder:—

- (a) Trees which are dead, diseased or dangerous.
- (b) For the purpose of a firebreak required by a regulation or by law except that in order to preserve the amenity of the area Council may at its discretion vary the position of any required firebreak to avoid destruction of vegetation or due to the physical features of the subject land.

- 3.2.3 The Council may, by notice served upon individual land owners or upon a subdivider of land within a Special Rural Zone, require the preservation of groups of trees, and thereafter no landowner shall cut, remove or otherwise destroy any tree unless the Council rescinds the notice or order.

3.2.4 The Council may require the developer or land owner to advise future land holders of the restrictions in relation to the clearing of the land.

3.3 Building Envelopes:

3.3.1 Any building on a lot in a Special Rural Zone must be erected within the building envelope defined on a plan lodged with the Council under the provisions of this Scheme.

3.3.2 Notwithstanding the provisions of Clause 3.3.1 Council may permit the erection of buildings on a lot in areas other than those contained within the Building Envelope if it is shown to the satisfaction of Council at the time of application for a building permit that the proposed location will be less detrimental to the preservation of the landscape or to the environment than if it were sited within the Building Envelope.

3.4 Amenity: Notwithstanding that a building or work may conform in all respects to the provisions of this section the Council may require alterations to a proposed building if it considers that the proposed building or work would be likely to seriously affect the amenity or the visual appearance of the area.

3.5 Control of Bush Fires: Proposals for the subdivision which accompany an application for rezoning must contain an analysis of the bushfire vulnerability of the land within the subdivision area, arising from the proposal itself or areas within the locality.

Upon the basis of such analysis the developer shall present to Council the measures proposed within the subdivision to control bushfires which shall include, but not necessarily be limited to, the provision and allocation of strategic firebreaks and methods of fire management control.

3.6 Other provisions: In addition to such other provisions of the Scheme as may affect it, land which is included in a "Special Rural Zone" shall be subject to those provisions as may be specifically set out against it in the Schedule entitled "Special Rural Zones—Provisions Relating to Specified Areas."

4.0 Specific Conditions for Special Rural Zones:

(a) Special Rural Zone—Landscape Interest:

- (1) Clearing of indigenous vegetation is to be limited to the area of land contained within the Building Envelope indicated on the submission required by Clause 3.1.5.
- (2) Any clearing of indigenous vegetation outside the Building Envelope will require approval of the Council in writing and any application shall be considered in regard to Council's Policy for the zone.
- (3) In the designation of building envelopes consideration should be given to the location of creek lines, ridge lines (summits) and view corridors.
- (4) Road boundaries and their location shall be in such a manner to preserve natural bushland wherever possible.
- (5) The co-ordination of services and their location will be required where possible, and the development and road reservation should be integrated where possible with Public Open Space location.
- (6) Bridle paths may be required to be established where clearing will take place within road reserves due to the provision of services.
- (7) The use of any land within this zone for the grazing or holding of horses and cattle will require the approval

of Council if it is of the opinion that the controlling of numbers and location of animals is required in order to avoid unnecessary erosion, pollution or depletion of indigenous vegetation.

(b) Special Rural Zone—Rural/Residential:

- (1) The siting and extent of Building Envelopes will be permitted to be of an extent to enable flexibility in the siting of buildings on the land within the lot subject to the location of the building envelope being in such a location that recognises the obligations and policy of the zone, but will not be permitted on ridge lines or water courses.
- (2) The preservation of indigenous vegetation on all road frontages will be required where possible to ensure privacy between owners.
- (3) Within the zone, the clearing of indigenous vegetation will be permitted subject to the provisions of the Scheme, except where Council is of the opinion that clearing will have an adverse effect on the amenity of the locality. Such approval for the clearing of indigenous vegetation will also have regard to the land use proposed and/or being undertaken on the land.
- (4) The Council may impose stocking requirements in relation to an area of land after consideration of the landform, landscape and the lot sizes for the locality.

(c) Special Rural Zone—Intensive Rural:

- (1) The siting and extent of the building envelopes will allow for the development of holdings for farming purposes with the exception of indigenous vegetation on or adjacent to lot boundaries. The Council reserves the right to apply the provisions of Clause 3.2.3 in such cases as it deems necessary in order to preserve the amenity of the locality or where potential erosion problems may be evident.
- (2) The Council may impose stocking requirements in relation to an area of land after consideration of the landform landscape and the lot sizes for the locality.

(d) Minimum Lot Sizes and Density Control: The minimum lot sizes and the average density will be as follows and is based on the compatibility for development in terms of land form and vegetation.

The minimum lot size may be varied by the Town Planning Board after consultation with the Council and where such action is in conformity with the objectives and policy of the zone concerned.

Minimum Lot Size.

Special Rural Zone—Landscape Interest—2 ha.
Special Rural Zone—Rural/Residential—2 ha.
Special Rural Zone—Intensive Rural—15 ha.

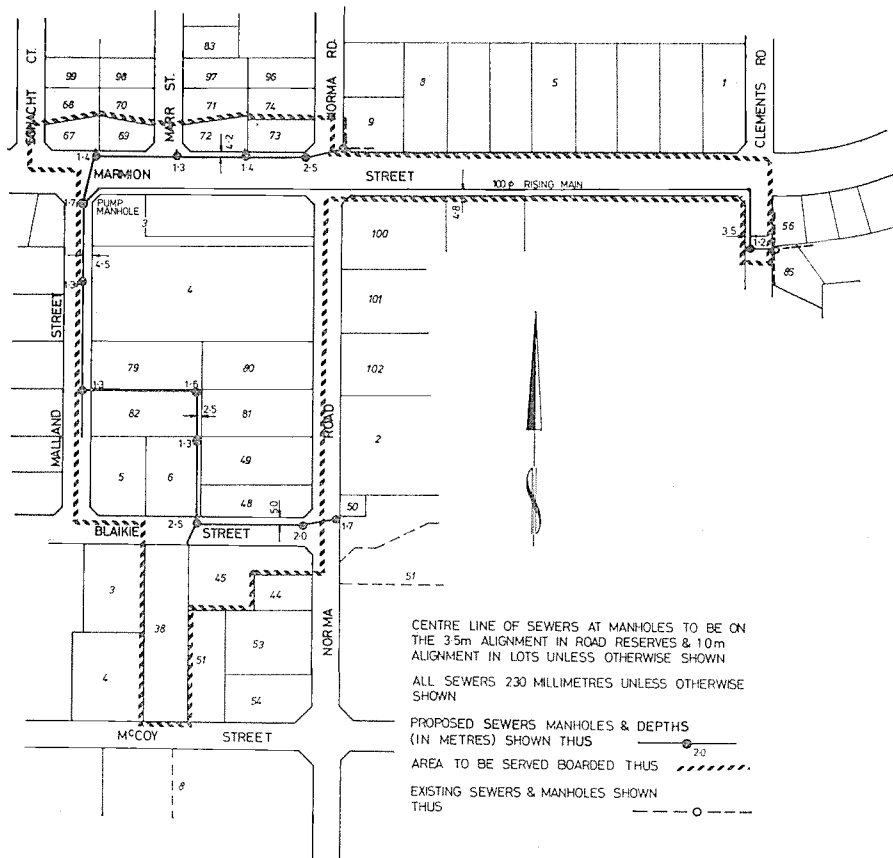

By-law Relating to Street Lawns and Gardens.

By-law No. 31.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on the twenty-seventh day of February, 1979, to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following By-law:—

1. In this By-law, unless the context otherwise requires:—

“carriageway” means a portion of a road that is improved, designed or ordinarily used for vehicular traffic, and includes the shoulders, and areas, including embayments, at the side or centre of the road, used for standing or parking of vehicles, but does not include a lane, right of way or driveway;

“Council” means the Council of the City of Cockburn;

“footpath” means that part of a road set apart or constructed for the use of pedestrians and every established footway, pavement, lane, thoroughfare or any other part of a road set apart for the use of pedestrians;

“Garden” means an area of street which is planted, developed or treated otherwise than as a lawn using only such materials that will not cause an obstruction to persons or vehicles, but does not include any development or treatment which involves the construction of works in the street within the meaning of section 509 of the Local Government Act, 1960 (as amended);

“intersection” means the area comprised within imaginary straight lines joining in succession the points of transection of the property lines of two or more roads that meet each other. Where the property lines are curved at any corner, the point of transection of the property lines shall be regarded as the point on the curve nearest to the point at which those property lines, would meet;

“junction” means that part of a road lying between imaginary straight lines at right angles to the road commencing from the points of transection formed by its own property lines with the property lines of a road which abuts thereon. Where the property lines are curved at any corner, the point of transection formed by the property lines shall be determined in the same manner as is provided in the definition of “intersection”;

“lawn” means an area of a street which is planted solely with grass and which comprises one or more trees or shrubs planted by the Council or the adjacent landowner with approval by Council;

“property line” means the boundary between the land comprising a street and the land that abuts thereon.

2. Where before the coming into operation of this By-law a garden has been planted in a street, the owner or occupier of the land that abuts on that portion of the street in which that garden is planted shall ensure that the garden complies with the provisions of this By-law but is not required to obtain a permit pursuant to this By-law.

3. (1) A person shall not plant a garden in a street, except pursuant to a permit, in the form of the Schedule to this By-law or as otherwise issued by the Council and then only in conformity with this By-law.

(2) The Council shall not issue a permit for the planting of a garden in any portion of a street, except on the application of the owner or occupier of the land that abuts on that portion of the street.

(3) A person requiring a permit to plant a garden in a street shall submit to the Council a sketch plan setting out details of the proposed garden and the positions of the proposed garden beds and any trees or shrubs proposed to be planted in relation to the frontage of the carriageway.

(4) The owner or occupier of land that abuts on portion of a street may plant a lawn in that portion of the street without obtaining a permit to do so unless the lawn is part of a garden in that portion of the street.

4. A person shall not plant a garden in a street:—

(a) so that it extends beyond the frontage in respect of which the permit is issued;

(b) so that it encroaches on the pavement of a carriageway or a made footpath;

(c) that is not graded evenly to a smooth slope from the frontage of the land abutting on that portion of the street to the kerb of the carriageway.

5. (1) The owner or occupier of land abutting on portion of a street in which a lawn or garden is planted shall ensure that any water pipe laid to that lawn or garden:—

(a) is laid and kept beneath the surface of the verge, at a depth of not more than 300 mm nor less than 150 mm and so that any fitting connected to a pipe does not project above the surface of the lawn or garden;

(b) if connected to a public water supply, is laid to comply with the requirements of the body constituted for, and having control of that supply under an Act;

(c) if connected to a private water supply, where passing under a road or pavement, is of galvanised, wrought iron, copper, or of P.V.C., or other approved material; and

(d) has approved valves, located within the property where they are connected to the water supply and is fitted so as to give complete control of the flow of water from that supply.

(2) Where a person, in the course of laying pipes pursuant to this By-law, causes damage to any road, pavement, footpath or crossing, or to any water, gas or sewerage pipes, to any power or telephone cables or to a fire hydrant, that damage may be made good, by the authority having the control of the thing damaged, at the expense of that person or the person on whose behalf the pipes were laid, and the amount of that expense may be recovered in any court of competent jurisdiction.

6. A person shall not water a street, lawn or garden in such a manner as will, or may, occasion inconvenience to persons using the adjoining carriageway or footpath.

7. (1) A person shall not plant or keep any tree or shrub in a garden in a street if that tree or shrub is of a height exceeding 0.75 metres, or is of a variety likely to grow to a height exceeding 0.75 metres, if that tree or shrub is within 6 metres of a junction or intersection.

(2) Nothing in this By-law authorises a person to place or erect any fence, enclosure or other obstruction on, or about, a lawn or garden in a street.

8. (1) The Council may at any time by notice in writing to the owner or occupier of land that abuts on portion of a street in which a lawn or garden is planted require that owner or occupier to remove any tree, shrub, water piping or fitting from that lawn or garden and the owner or occupier shall comply with that notice within the time stipulated for compliance therewith in the notice.

(2) If an owner or occupier upon whom a notice has been served pursuant to subclause (1) of this clause fails to comply with that notice within the stipulated time, the Council may remove the tree, shrub, water piping from the lawn or garden or fitting referred to in the notice at the expense of the owner or occupier and any expense incurred by the Council in so doing may be recovered from that owner or occupier in a court of competent jurisdiction.

9. (1) The Council may, without being liable to compensate any person therefor, dig up all or any part of a lawn or garden in a street, for the purpose of carrying out any authorised works.

(2) A person employed by the Council acting pursuant to this clause shall not disturb a lawn or garden or damage any pipes laid under that lawn or garden to any greater extent than is reasonably necessary for the purpose of carrying out any authorised works.

10. (1) Where the Council, for the purpose of carrying out authorised works, is of the opinion that the carrying out of those works may be impeded by the existence of piping, under a lawn or garden in a street, it may give notice to the owner or occupier of the land abutting on the lawn or garden to remove the piping, until the completion of the works. Where the owner or occupier does not comply with the notice within the time stipulated in the notice for completion therewith the Council may remove the piping at the expense of the owner or occupier, and any expense incurred by the Council pursuant to this clause, may be recovered in a court of competent jurisdiction.

(2) The Council shall not be liable for damage to piping under a lawn or garden in a street, occasioned either in the course of the removal of the piping under the provisions of subclause (1) of this clause or in the course of carrying out authorised works.

11. (1) Except as provided by the By-law, a person shall not wilfully damage a lawn or garden in a street.

(2) Except as provided in this By-law, a person other than the owner or occupier of land that abuts upon portion of a street in which a garden is planted or a person authorised by that owner or occupier shall not remove any flower, plant, or shrub from that garden.

12. The Council shall not be liable for any damage sustained by a person by reason of, or arising out of, the planting, or existence, of a lawn or garden in a street.

13. A person who commits an offence against this By-law is liable to a penalty of Two Hundred Dollars (\$200).

3. In clause 47, delete the passage commencing "The result of voting" and ending with the passage "call for a division", and substitute the following in lieu thereof:—
47 "The result of voting openly is determined on the count of raised hands, but may be determined on the voices unless a member of the Council calls for a show of hands, and upon a vote on the voices or on a show of hands being taken a Councillor may call for a division."
4. By adding a new sub clause (6) to Clause 91.
91(6) "That the membership and functions of each Occasional Committee shall be reviewed at the first meeting of Council held after the annual elections next ensuing after the election of the Committee."
5. Delete Clause 104 and substitute a new Clause as follows.
104 "Whenever it becomes necessary to appoint a Member to represent the Council on a public body or a state instrumentality three clear days notice in writing of the necessity to make the appointment shall be given to the Members."
6. That Clause 110(1) be amended by deleting in lines 2 and 3 the passage commencing ", but where there is" and ending with the words "the latter prevails."

1. These by-laws may be cited as the Shire of Quairading Pest Plant By-laws, 1979.

2. In these by-laws, unless the contrary intention appears—
“council” means council of the municipality of the Shire of Quairading;
“district” means the district of the council;
“pest plant” means a plant described as a pest plant by by-law 4 of these by-laws.

3. These by-laws apply in respect of the district.

4. Every plant described in the First Schedule to these by-laws is a pest plant.

5. (1) The Council may serve on the owner or occupier of private land within the district a duly completed notice in the form of the Second Schedule to these by-laws requiring him to destroy, eradicate or otherwise control any pest plant on that land.

(2) A person with a notice under sub-by-law (1) of these by-laws shall comply with that notice within the time and in the manner specified therein.

6. Where a person fails to comply with a notice under by-law 5 of these by-laws served upon him, the council may—

(a) without payment of any compensation in respect thereof, destroy, eradicate or control, as the case may be any pest plant the destruction, eradication or control of which was required by the notice; and

(b) recover in a court of competent jurisdiction from the person to whom the notice is directed, the amount of the expense of such destruction, eradication or control.
