AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chambers, at Perth on 9th January, 1980 the following Order in Council was authorised to be issued.

Forests Act, 1918-1976.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

F.D. 182/79; L. & S. 1396/74.

WHEREAS by the Forests Act, 1918-1976, it is provided that a dedication under the said Act of Crown Land as a State forest may be revoked in whole or in part in the following manner—

- (a) the Governor shall cause to be laid on the Table of each House of Parliament a proposal for such revocation.
- (b) after such proposal has been laid before Parliament the Governor, on a resolution being passed by both Houses that such proposal be carried out, shall by Order in Council revoke such dedication.

And whereas His Excellency the Governor did cause to be laid on the Table of each House of Parliament, his proposal dated the 4th day of October, 1979, for the revocation in part of the dedication of Crown Lands as State forest; And whereas after such proposal had been laid before Parliament a resolution was passed by both Houses that such proposal should be carried out: Now, therefore, the Lieutenant Governor and Deputy of the Governor with the advice and consent of the Executive Council doth hereby revoke in part the dedication of Crown Land as State forest No. 70 described in the Schedule thereto.

REGULATIONS.

Principal regulations.

1. In these regulations the Electoral Act Regulations, 1949, published in the *Government Gazette* on the 10th August, 1949, reprinted pursuant to the Reprinting of Regulations Act, 1954, and published as so reprinted on the 14th February, 1968, and amended from time to time thereafter by notices so published, are referred to as the principal regulations.

Regs. 61, 62, 63 and 64 substituted.

2. Regulations 61, 62, 63 and 64 of the principal regulations are revoked and the following regulations substituted:—

61. (a) Every person who is an officer within the meaning of that expression as used in the Public Service Act, 1978, may be required by the Governor to act, and when so required, shall act in the capacity of Returning Officer, Deputy or Assistant Returning Officer, Presiding Officer, Assistant Presiding Officer, Poll Clerk or Doorkeeper, pursuant to the provisions of the Act.

(b) Those persons when so acting, and all officers appointed pursuant to the provisions of the Act, shall be entitled to receive and retain the appropriate fees or allowances prescribed in these regulations.

(ii) Where, in any district, more than twenty polling places have been appointed for a Council or an Assembly Election, the Returning Officer or Deputy Returning Officer, as the case may be, shall be paid in addition to the fee prescribed in subparagraph (i) of this paragraph a further fee of \$3.90 for every polling place in excess of twenty.

(iii) Except as provided in subparagraph (vii) and (viii) of this paragraph, where an officer simultaneously holds more than one position under the Act in respect of each of which fees by way of remuneration are prescribed, he shall be entitled only to the fee for that position for which the highest fee is prescribed, where the duties of all the positions can be performed simultaneously.

(iv) The fees prescribed in subparagraph (i) of this paragraph for Presiding Officers, Assistant Presiding Officers, Poll Clerks and Doorkeepers shall cover all services performed between the hours of 7.30 a.m. and 8.30 p.m. on polling day.

(v) Except as otherwise provided in these regulations, the fees prescribed in subparagraph (i) of this paragraph for Returning Officers and Deputy Returning Officers shall cover all services required by the Act or by regulation, to be performed by the officer in connection with an election and for an Assistant Returning Officer all services required on polling day.

(vi) Where an officer does not reside in the district for which he has been appointed as Returning Officer, Deputy Returning Officer or Assistant Returning Officer, if he is required to travel to the district to which he has been appointed prior to the day of the election for the purpose of performing his duties, he shall be paid a travelling allowance in accordance with regulation 64 for the whole period of his absence from his residence in connection with those duties.

(vii) When an election for the Legislative Council is held on the same day as an election for the Legislative Assembly and the Returning Officer for the Legislative Assembly District is also Returning Officer or Deputy Returning Officer for the Legislative Council Province for the purposes of those elections, and he carries out duties in relation to both elections, the following provisions apply—

- (a) If both elections are contested or uncontested he is entitled to be paid the appropriate higher fee prescribed in subparagraph (i) of this paragraph for a Returning Officer for the Legislative Assembly or Returning Officer or Deputy Returning Officer for the Legislative Council and 5 per cent of the appropriate fee prescribed for his office in relation to the other election.
- (b) If one of the elections is contested and the other is uncontested, he is entitled to be paid the fee prescribed in subparagraph (i) of this paragraph for his office in relation to the contested election and 5 per cent of the appropriate fee prescribed for his office in relation to the uncontested election.

(viii) Where a Returning Officer or Deputy Returning Officer for a Legislative Council Province carries out duties in relation to two Legislative Council elections in the same day in respect of the same province—

- (a) If both elections are contested or uncontested he is entitled to be paid the appropriate fee prescribed in subparagraph (i) of this paragraph for his office in relation to one of the elections and 5 per cent of that fee in relation to the other election.
- (b) If one of the elections is contested and the other is uncontested, he is entitled to be paid the fee prescribed in subparagraph (i) of this paragraph for his office in relation to the contested election and 5 per cent of the appropriate fee prescribed for his office in relation to the uncontested election.

(ix) Where, in any district, any institution or hospital, or both is declared under the provisions of paragraph (d) of subsection (1) of section 100 to be a special institution or hospital, or both, for the purposes of the Act, the fees and allowance payable to officials shall be as follows—

64. (1) Officers who are required to travel outside the metropolitan area for the purpose of performing their duties as Electoral Officers shall be entitled to such travelling allowance as is prescribed under the industrial agreement for the time being in force or from time to time in force between the Civil Service Association of Western Australia (Incorporated) and the Public Service Board of Western Australia.

Provided that no transport allowance shall be paid to any officer in respect of the day of the election, but if approved by the Chief Electoral Officer, any expense necessarily incurred by an officer for transport on the day of the election may be recouped to the officer.

(2) Officers who are required to perform services throughout the hours of 7.30 a.m. and 8.30 p.m. on polling day shall be entitled to the payment of \$3.00 as reimbursement for the cost of the evening meal.

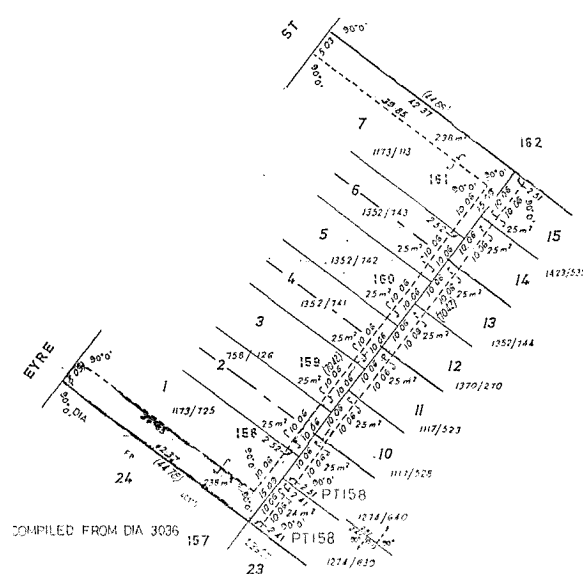

REGULATIONS.

Part I—PRELIMINARY.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Government School Teachers Arbitration and Appeal Regulations, 1980.

2. In these regulations unless the contrary intention appears—

"Form" means a Form in the Schedule to these regulations;

"Minister" means the Minister for the time being charged with the administration of the Education Act, 1928;

"the Act" means the Government School Teachers Arbitration and Appeal Act, 1979.

SCHEDULE—*continued.*

PART II—GOVERNMENT SCHOOL TEACHERS ARBITRATION.

3. (1) Every application making a claim under Part III of the Act shall be entitled in the form of Form 1.

(2) A clear and concise statement of the claim shall be made in the application making the claim.

4. Subject to the Act, the following provisions apply to and in relation to any proceedings before the Tribunal under Part III of the Act—

(a) where the Tribunal decides to call evidence with respect to a claim for the purposes of determining the claim, the Tribunal shall give notice of not less than 7 days of the time and date of the hearing unless the parties agree to a shorter period of notice;

(b) every party to a proceeding under Part III of the Act shall, within such time as is fixed by the Chairman in the notice given under paragraph (b) of this regulation, furnish the other party to the proceedings with a list of the names of every witness being called by that party;

(c) any party may apply to the Tribunal to call as a witness a person whose name does not appear on the list furnished pursuant to paragraph (b) of this regulation and the Tribunal may grant or refuse the application;

(d) where a person whose name is listed as a witness by a party is not called as a witness by that party the other party may call him as a witness.

5. (1) Four copies of every agreement entered into between the Minister and the Union under Part III of the Act shall be filed with the Tribunal within 7 days of the date on which the agreement is executed.

(2) The Tribunal shall register the agreement and shall forward one stamped copy of the agreement to the Minister and one to the Union.

6. The Chairman shall cause every award, order or decision made under Part III of the Act to be published in the *Western Australian Government Gazette*.

PART III—GOVERNMENT SCHOOL TEACHERS APPEALS.

7. (1) Appeals under the following provisions of the Education Regulations, namely—

(a) paragraph (b) of subregulation (1) of regulation 95;

(b) subregulation (2) of regulation 102DA;

(c) paragraph (d) of subregulation (2) of regulation 102DE; and

(d) paragraph (c) of subregulation (2) of regulation 102F,

are prescribed pursuant to paragraph (g) of subsection (1) of section 29 of the Act as matters for the purposes of Part IV of the Act.

(2) In this regulation—

“the Education Regulations” means the Education Act Regulations, 1960 as reprinted in the *Government Gazette* on the 19th March, 1971, as amended.

8. For the purposes of the interpretation of that term in subsection (1) of section 30 of the Act—

“efficiency” means special qualifications, aptitude and experience for the position to be filled together with diligence, good conduct of the teacher and his status at the time of the application but any service gained by him in an acting capacity shall be disregarded.

9. A teacher's service for the purpose of calculating his seniority shall be deemed to have commenced on the 1st January of the year in which the teacher commenced full-time employment with the Department if the teacher's continuous full-time service with the Department commenced on or before the 30th March in that year.

10. The class of office in respect of which an appeal does not lie pursuant to paragraph (c) of subsection (2) of section 29 is the class of office declared as “special positions” under Section F of Division 6 of Part IV of the Education Act Regulations, 1960.

11. (1) All proceedings under subsection (1) of section 29 other than an appeal under paragraph (a), (b), (c), (e) or (f) of that subsection shall be commenced by application to the Tribunal.

(2) An appeal to the Tribunal under paragraph (a), (b), (c), (e) or (f) of subsection (1) of section 29 shall be in the form of Form 2.

12. An application or appeal under Part IV of the Act shall set out clearly and concisely the grounds of the application or appeal and shall be signed by the applicant or appellant, as the case requires.

SCHEDULE—continued.

13. (1) An appeal under paragraph (a) of subregulation (1) of section 29 of the Act and any appeal of the kind referred to in regulation 7 of these regulations shall be made within 14 days of the date of the notice given under the Education Act Regulations, 1960 of the decision with respect to which the appeal is made.

(2) An appeal under paragraph (e) or paragraph (f) of subsection (1) of section 29 of the Act shall be made within thirty days of the date of the decision appealed against.

(3) An appeal or application to the Tribunal in relation to any matter under the jurisdiction of the Tribunal under subsection (1) of section 29 other than the matters referred to in subregulation (1) or (2) of this regulation may be made at any time.

(4) Notwithstanding subregulations (1) and (2) of this regulation, where a teacher is employed in a remote locality or is temporarily absent from his school, he may lodge notice of an appeal by telegram within the time prescribed in subregulation (1) or (2), as the case requires, if an appeal is lodged within 7 days next following the last day under subregulation (1) or subregulation (2), as the case requires, and an appeal so made is deemed to have been made within the time prescribed by subregulation (1) or subregulation (2).

14. (1) The Clerk to the Tribunal shall serve on each party to an appeal or application notice of the hearing of the appeal or application.

(2) Notice of the hearing of an appeal or application shall be in the form of Form 3 and shall be served on each party to the appeal or application not less than 7 days before the date fixed for the hearing of the appeal or application.

15. An appellant or applicant who desires to abandon an appeal or application shall lodge notice of the withdrawal with the Tribunal not less than 3 clear days before the date fixed for the hearing of the appeal or application.

16. (1) Service of any document or notice for the purposes of the Act on a teacher may be effected—

- (a) by personal service on the teacher;
- (b) by posting the notice or document to the teacher at the school at which the teacher is employed; or
- (c) if service is to be effected during summer vacation as defined under the Education Act Regulations, 1960, by posting the notice or document to the teacher by post to the last known postal address of the teacher.

(2) Service of any document or notice for the purposes of the Act on the Minister or the Director-General may be effected by personal delivery to the Department or by post to the address of the Department.
