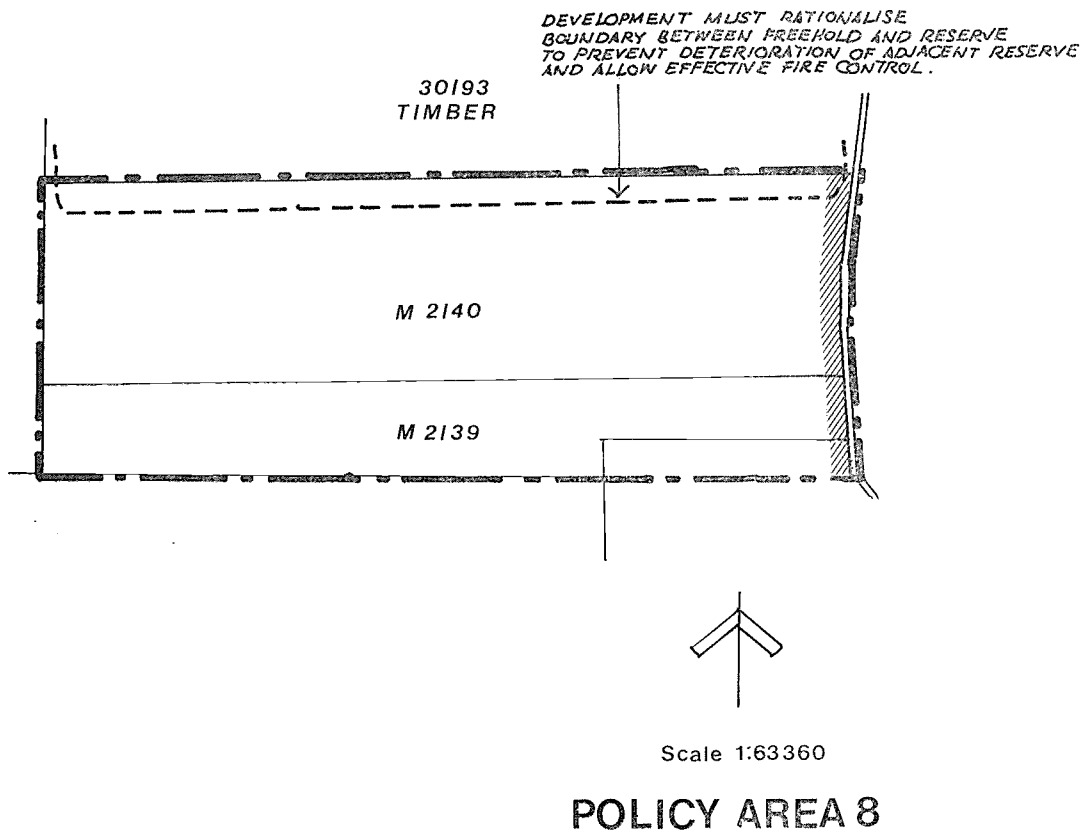

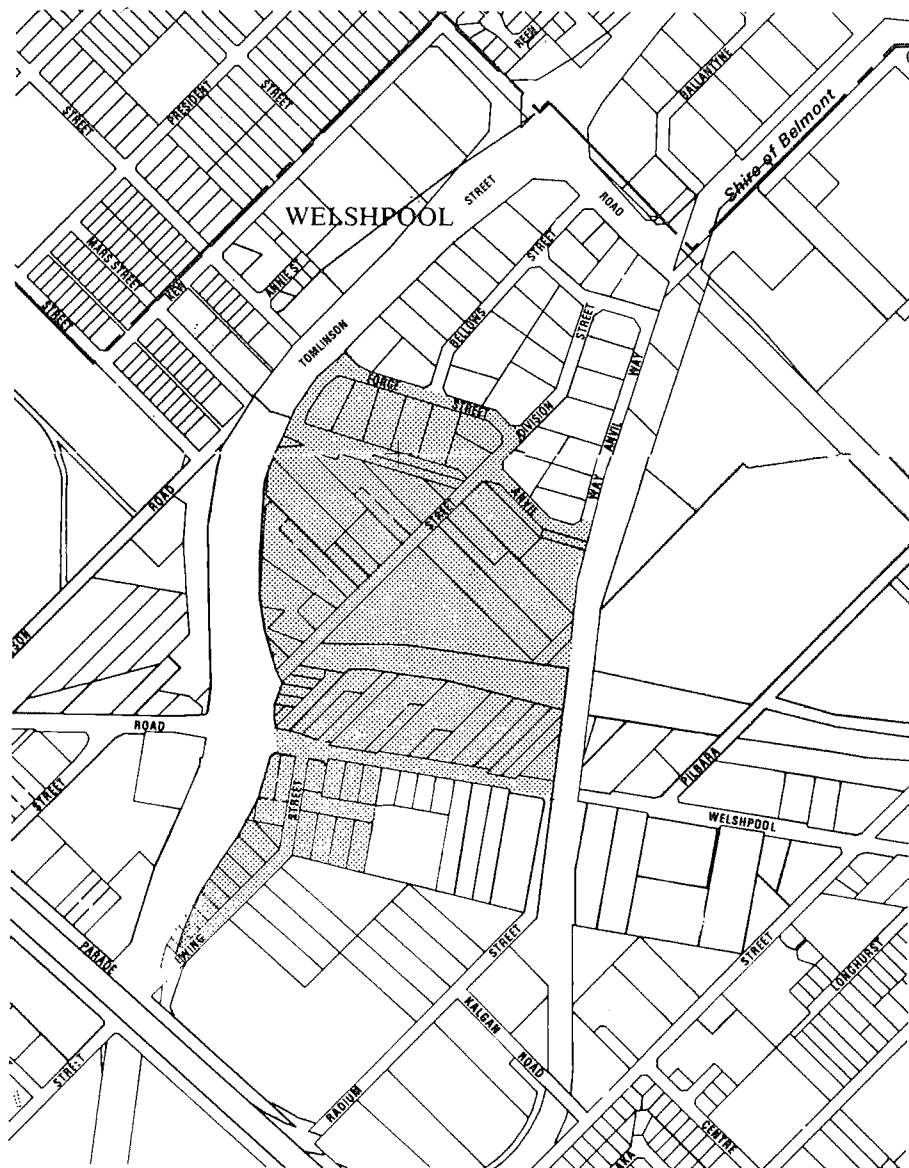

2. Regulation 30 of the principal regulations is amended—
