AGRICULTURE AND RELATED RESOURCES PROTECTION ACT, 1976-1979.

Agriculture Protection Board, South Perth, 28th February, 1980.

THE Agriculture Protection Board, having declared Agile Wallabies (*Macropus agilis*) to be declared animals under section 35 of the Agriculture and Related Resources Protection Act, 1976-1979, and assigned them to category A7 under section 36 of that Act, has now, in accordance with section 66 of the said Act approved the programme set out herebelow for the management and regulation of those animals.

Programme.

1. The aim of the programme is to regulate the numbers of Agile Wallabies to a point where they no longer constitute a problem to the management of the rangelands in the area of the State specified, whilst ensuring that the continued existence of those animals in the area is not endangered.

- 2. The Protection Board encourages the commercial exploitation of Agile Wallabies as a primary means of population reduction. Commercial exploitation should be integrated with but not supersede other forms of control.
- 3. Agile Wallabies may be taken without licence only by landholders and leaseholders on their own properties, or by their approved agents.
- 4. Landholders operating on their own properties may use whatever methods of regulating the population of Agile Wallabies they think most suitable. Methods used should be as target specific as possible under the circumstances existing at the time.
- 5. The management programme shall be applicable to the municipal districts of Broome, West Kimberley, Wyndham-East Kimberley and Hall's Creek and shall take effect from 1st March, 1980.
