ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1977, it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any Reserve shall vest in and be held by any person or persons to be named in the Order, in trust for any of the purposes set forth in section 29 of the said Act, or for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such Order and with power of leasing: And whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve No. 36540 should vest in and be held by the Shire of Port Hedland in trust for the purpose of "Recreation".

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby direct that the before-mentioned Reserve shall vest in and be held by Shire of Port Hedland in trust for "Recreation" with power to the said Shire of Port Hedland subject to the approval in writing of the Minister for Lands to each and every lease or assignment of

Shire of Broome.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS the Council of the Shire of Broome is desirous, under the By-law making power conferred by sections 214 and 193 of the Local Government Act, 1960-1979, of making by-laws for regulating and controlling the use of vehicles, bathing appliances and costume of bathers on beaches and the foreshore outside its district for a distance of two hundred (200) metres from the low water mark at ordinary spring tides; and whereas such by-laws may be extended only pursuant to an order under subsection (8) of section 190 of the Act; and whereas it is enacted by the subsection last mentioned that where, in the opinion of the Governor, a by-law making power conferred by the Act on a Council should be extended to any area which is outside the district, the Governor may by order declare that for the purpose of the exercise of a power such area is to be regarded as being within the district and that the Council may exercise a power in respect of the area as if in fact it were within the district; and whereas the Governor is of the opinion that the said by-law making power should be extended to the said area outside the district of the said Council: Now therefore, His Excellency the Governor, pursuant to the powers conferred by subsection (8) of section 190 of the Local Government Act, 1960-1979, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby declare for the purpose of the exercise of the said by-law making power, such area which is outside the district of the Shire of Broome, namely that which adjoins the district and extends for a distance of Two hundred metres (200) seaward from low water mark at ordinary spring tides is to be regarded as being within the district of the Shire of Broome and that the Council of the Shire of Broome may make by-laws for controlling and regulating the use of motor vehicles, bathing appliances and the costume of bathers on the beaches and the foreshore in respect of that area as if in fact it were within the Municipal District of the Shire of Broome.

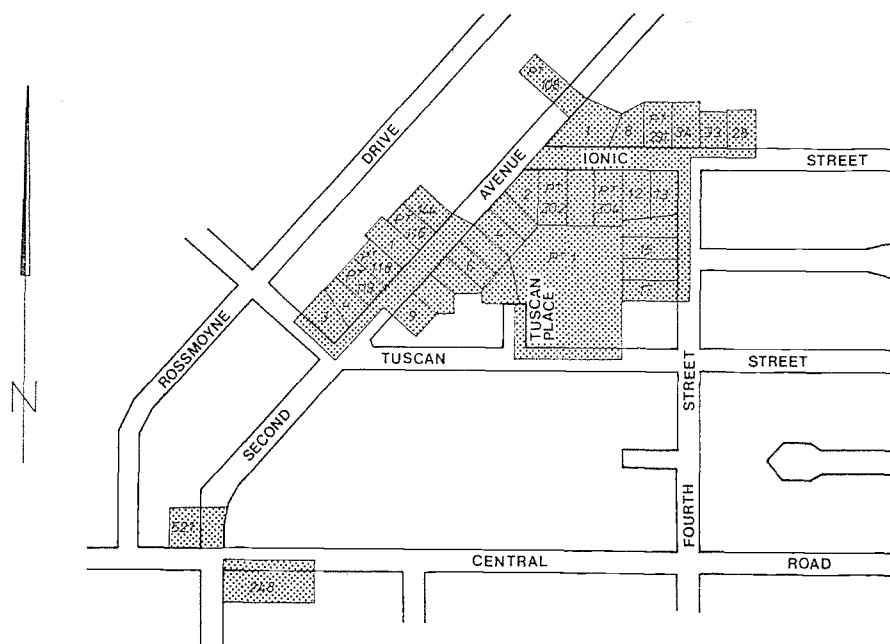
Metropolitan Main Drainage District No. 1.

By-law Relating to Fire Control Order.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act, the Council of the Morawa Municipality hereby records having resolved on the 18th day of October, 1979 to make and submit to the Governor for approval the following by-laws:—

By-laws for the Provision of Firebreaks.

1. Definitions:

“rural land” means all land within the Morawa District not defined as townsite land.

“townsite land” means all land within the boundaries of the Morawa, Gutha and Canna townsites.

“fuel depots” means any piece of land used for the storage of fuel.

“firebreak period rural land” means the time between the first day of October in any year until the first day of April in the year following.

“firebreak period townsites” means the time between the 1st day of November in any year until the 15th day of April in the year following.

“firebreak” means ground from which inflammable material has been removed and on which no inflammable material is permitted during the firebreak period.

2. All owners or occupiers of land within the Morawa District shall have firebreaks during the firebreak period of the dimensions prescribed within this Order.

(a) Rural Land:

Firebreaks 2.1 metres wide as follows:

Immediately adjacent to and surrounding all cleared land.

Surrounding all crops, each building, haystack and around the immediate perimeter of stationary engines or pumps, in such a manner as to completely encircle the buildings, haystacks or stationary engines or pumps.

(b) Townsite Land:

(i) Vacant Blocks: Provide and maintain an effective firebreak around the perimeter of all vacant blocks cleared of all inflammable material to a width of at least 1.8 metres or completely remove all inflammable material from vacant blocks and thereafter maintain clean until the prescribed time.

- (ii) Block and Buildings: Provide and thereafter maintain until the prescribed time an effective firebreak around the perimeter of all buildings or groups of buildings and inside and along the whole of the boundary of the land, cleared of all inflammable material to a width of at least 1 metre or where the boundary is closer than 1 metre for that lesser distance.
- (c) Fuel Depots: Provide and have clear of all inflammable material, firebreaks at least 3 metres wide so as to completely surround the perimeter of the land occupied by drums used for the storage of inflammable liquids, whether the drums contain inflammable liquids or not, including any land on which ramps for holding drums are constructed. Also have clear of all inflammable material on all land within the firebreak required by this paragraph.

3. If it is considered to be impracticable for any reason to clear firebreaks or remove inflammable material from land as required by this notice you may apply to the Council or its duly authorised officer for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions. If permission is not granted by Council or its duly authorised officer you shall comply with the requirements of this notice.

4. Failure to comply with these by-laws shall subject the offender to the penalties prescribed in the Bush Fires Act, 1954-1977.

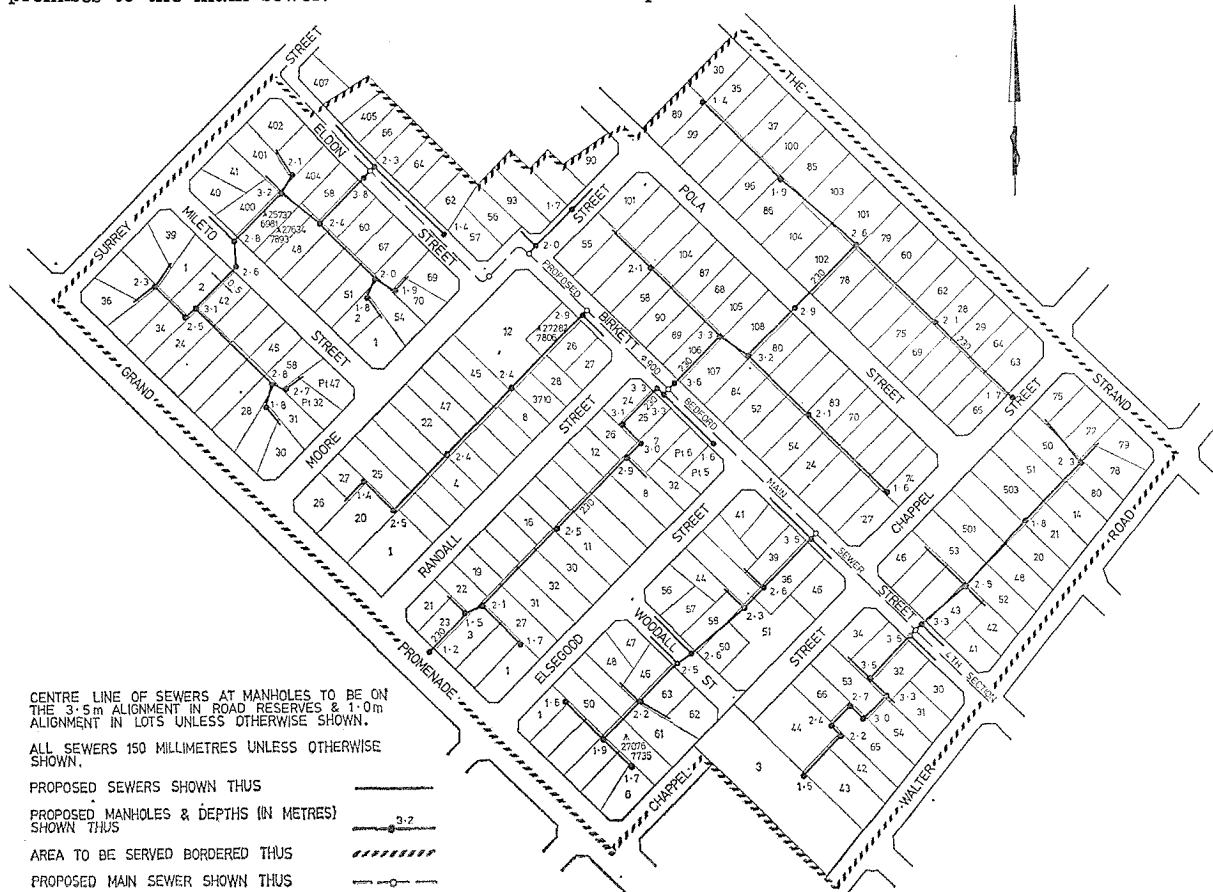

CEMETERIES ACT, 1897-1978.

Southern Cross General Cemetery By-laws.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and all other powers enabling it, Council of the Shire of Yilgarn, as Trustee of the Southern Cross General Cemetery, hereby records having resolved on the 18th day of August, 1978, to adopt and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following By-laws:—

1. These By-laws shall apply to the land described as Reserve 2950 to be known as the Southern Cross General Cemetery and hereinafter referred to as the "Cemetery".

2. "The Secretary" as referred to in these By-laws, means the person for the time being employed by the Trustee as the Secretary of the Cemetery, and such persons shall, subject to the Trustee, exercise a general supervision and control over all matters pertaining to the Cemetery, and to carrying out and enforcement of these By-laws, and the direction of such person shall in all cases and for all purposes be presumed to be and have been the direction of the Trustee.

3. The Trustee may engage other officers and servants where their employment is necessary or expedient for carrying out the provisions of the Cemeteries Act, or those By-laws.

4. No person employed by or under the Trustee shall be permitted to accept any gratuity whatever, nor shall he be pecuniarily interested in any work in the Cemetery other than the remuneration he received from the Trustee and any person proved guilty of accepting any gratuity or being pecuniarily interested in any such work shall be liable to summary dismissal.

5. A Plan of the Cemetery showing sections, situation and number of every grave, and a register of all certificates of Rights of Burials shall be kept at the Office of the Trustee.

6. Unless otherwise ordered the entrance to the Cemetery shall remain open daily between the hours of 8.00 a.m. and 5.00 p.m.

7. The hours of burial shall be:—

9.30 a.m. to 4.00 p.m. (Monday to Friday).

9.30 a.m. to 11 a.m. (Saturday).

No burial shall be allowed to take place nor any coffin allowed to enter the Cemetery at any hour except by written permission of the Trustee. No burial shall take place on Christmas Day or Good Friday.

8. (i) Any person who wishes to inter a dead body or cremated ashes in the Cemetery shall make application as contained in Schedule "B" and shall pay to the Trustee in advance the appropriate fees set forth in Schedule "A".

(ii) Upon such application being approved by the Trustee, they shall cause to be issued to the person so applying an "Order for Burial" in the form contained in the Schedule "C".

(iii) The application referred to in paragraph (i) of this By-law shall be lodged at the Office of the Trustee in sufficient time to allow at least eight working hours notice being given to the Secretary at the Office prior to the time fixed for burial, otherwise an extra charge shall be payable in accordance with Schedule "A".

9. No catacomb, vault or brick graves shall be allowed.

10. The Trustee shall cause all graves to be dug and graves to be re-opened as and when lawfully required.

11. Every grave for a deceased person over the age of 7 years shall be at least 1.8 metres deep at the interment and no interment shall be permitted in any grave with a depth of less than 1 metre from the top of the coffin to the natural surface of the surrounding ground. And in the case of a deceased child under the age of 7 years in a grave of no less than 1 metre deep.

12. (i) Prior to conducting any interment within the Cemetery or making use of the Cemetery for any purpose connected with interments, every undertaker shall pay to the Trustee an annual fee of \$10.00 and shall at the time of making such payment give his assent in writing to such conditions as the Trustee deem fit to impose. Upon such consent being given and the payment of the fee made, he shall receive a "Permit" to hold good during good behaviour and until the first day of July following and unless in the possession of such permit no undertaker shall be allowed to engage in or carry out any duty or work within the Cemetery.

(ii) In special circumstances approval may be given by the Trustee for a person, other than a person being the holder of any undertaker's licence, to undertake a funeral in the Cemetery.

13. The undertaker responsible for a burial shall cause the hearse and mourning coaches to enter the Cemetery through the principal entrance and no other entrance.

14. (i) A person shall not:—

(a) Cause a vehicle other than a hearse or a mourning coach to enter the Cemetery or stand outside the entrance gates in a position obstructing the entrance;

(b) drive a mechanically propelled vehicle within the Cemetery at a speed in excess of fifteen kilometres per hour;

(c) drive a mechanically propelled vehicle within the Cemetery along any road than a road approved for the time being for such traffic by the Secretary;

(d) ride any bicycle within the Cemetery.

(ii) A person failing to comply with the provisions of this By-law may be expelled from the Cemetery.

15. (i) Subject to paragraph (ii) of this section, a person shall not bring a dead person into the Cemetery unless he or his representative has first handed to the Secretary a certificate from a medical practitioner or a Coroner's Order for burial or disposal of the body.

(ii) Where an undertaker or his representative for a valid reason is unable to produce a Certificate or Coroner's Order as required by paragraph (i) of this By-law and he has given to the Secretary a written guarantee to produce the Certificate or Order within three days he may bring the dead body into the Cemetery.

(iii) A burial shall not be permitted in the Cemetery unless the provisions of one of the foregoing paragraphs of this By-law have been complied with.

(iv) Where an undertaker or his representative has given a written guarantee as required in paragraph (ii) of the By-law and has failed to produce the Certificate or Order within three days, the undertaker's licence may be suspended until the Certificate or Order is produced.

The Certificate may be retained but the Coroner's Order shall be returned to the persons delivering same.

16. A person who interrs a body in the Cemetery shall affix to the lid of the Coffin an approved metal plate bearing the name of the deceased stamped or otherwise indelibly inscribed thereon in legible characters. A Coffin not complying with this By-law shall not be admitted to or be interred in the Cemetery.

17. Before any interment is allowed, the "Order of Burial" shall be handed to and retained by the Secretary.

18. (i) A person wishing to secure a Grant of Right of Burial in the Cemetery shall make application to the Trustee and shall pay the appropriate fees set forth in Schedule "A".

(ii) Upon such application being approved by the Trustee, the Secretary shall cause to be issued to the person so applying, a grant of Right of Burial in the form contained in Schedule "D".

19. A person making application for interment of a body in a private grave to which the deceased has no claim during life shall submit to the Trustee the written and verified consent of the grantee of the grave.

20. Where a grant of Right of Burial has been lost, or for any other reason cannot be produced, a person who wishes to make interment in the grave shall lodge together with the application referred to in By-law No. 8 a sworn declaration to that effect and shall pay the fee prescribed in Schedule "A" for a copy of the grant.

21. A person who applies for the exhumation of a body shall produce to the Trustee the necessary warrant or order by law required, authorising the Trustee to permit the exhumation.

22. If for the purpose of re-opening a grave the Trustee finds it necessary to remove any monument, etc., from the grave the person requesting the re-opening shall pay to the Trustee the appropriate charges set forth in Schedule "A".

23. A person shall not place or erect or alter or add to a monument in any part of the Cemetery unless he has first submitted plans to the Trustee and secured approval and consent and otherwise complied with section 23 of the Cemeteries Act, 1897-1978.

24. A person erecting a monument shall leave the locality of the work in a clean and tidy state.

25. A person carrying out work in the Cemetery shall so far as possible prepare the material required in the erection and completion of the work before it is taken to the Cemetery.

26. A person shall not take materials into the Cemetery except through such entrances as the Secretary directs and shall not convey any materials on a vehicle having wheels of less than 100 mm in width.

27. Any person taking part in erecting any monument or attending to any grave shall comply with the following rules:—

(i) No rubbish, soil, sand or other materials removed in attending to a grave shall be placed on any other grave, and if placed on any adjoining ground shall be removed immediately the work is completed.

(ii) No sand, soil, loam or other materials shall be taken from any portion of the Cemetery for use in the erection of any monument or other work except with the permission of the Secretary.

(iii) The erection of any monument or other work and the wheeling and carting of any material shall be subject to the supervision of the Secretary.

28. A monumental mason or other person shall not carry out any work within the Cemetery between noon on Saturday and the opening of the gates on Monday morning without the written permission of the Trustee.

29. A monumental mason or other person working in the Cemetery who at noon on a Saturday is leaving any piece of work uncompleted, shall leave the work in a neat and safe condition to the satisfaction of the Secretary.

30. All workmen, whether employed by the Trustee or by any other person, shall at all times whilst within the boundaries of the Cemetery be subject to the supervision of the Secretary and shall obey such lawful directions as that Officer may find it necessary to give. Any workmen permitting any breach of the regulations and By-laws, or refusing or neglecting to comply with any directions of the said Secretary shall be removed from the Cemetery.

31. A child under the age of ten years shall not enter the Cemetery unless he is in the care of some adult person.

32. Discharging of fireworks within the Cemetery shall not be allowed.

33. (i) A person shall not bring a dog into the Cemetery or permit or suffer a dog under his control to be brought into the Cemetery.

(ii) Any dog found in the Cemetery may be seized and removed therefrom.

34. No person shall remove any plant, tree, shrub, flower (other than withered flowers) or any articles from any grave without first obtaining a permit from the Trustee. A person removing withered flowers from graves shall place these in the receptacles provided for this purpose by the Trustee.

35. No person shall pluck any tree, plant, shrub or flower growing in any portion of the Cemetery.

36. No person shall remove or carry away or attempt to carry out of the Cemetery any tree, plant, shrub, flower, earth or other material without the written authority of the Trustee.

37. Any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum or committing any nuisance or trespass, behaving in an offensive or unruly manner, or injuring these trees, shrub, flower border, grave or any erection, or in any way infringing these By-laws shall be expelled from the Cemetery.

38. No person shall promote or advertise or carry on within the Cemetery any trade business or calling, either by solicitation, distribution of circulars, or cards, or otherwise, or by any system of advertising whatsoever without the written consent of the Trustee. Any person infringing this By-law may be expelled from the Cemetery.

39. A person shall not plant any trees, shrubs, grass or flowers within the Cemetery except with the consent of the Trustee.

40. A person may with the permission of the grantee of the Right of Burial of a plot, decorate the grave with natural flowers set in orthodox vases.

41. The Trustee may grant to the Defence Department of the Commonwealth without fee, a permit to erect monuments on the graves of deceased Members of the Armed Forces.

42. The Trustee may grant plots in the Cemetery free of charge if it is proved to the satisfaction of the Trustee:—

- (i) that the deceased was a returned Serviceman or Servicewoman who died as a result of injuries at war; or
- (ii) that the relatives of the deceased are in necessitous circumstances.

43. Any person infringing the provisions of any of these By-laws and Regulations or of any other Rules, Regulations or By-laws lawfully made under the authority of any Act relating to Cemeteries, shall for every offence be liable to a penalty of not exceeding \$20.00 and in the case of a continuing breach, further sum not exceeding \$2.00 for every day during which the breach continues. A person committing the breach of any By-law shall be forthwith removed from the Cemetery by the Trustee, the Secretary or other Officer of the Trustee or by a Member of the Police Force and if he resists removal or returns to the Cemetery within twenty-four hours without consent of the Secretary, he shall be treated as a trespasser and may be proceeded against accordingly.

44. All previous By-laws relating to the Southern Cross Cemetery are hereby repealed.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, 1960-1979.

The Municipality of the Shire of Waroona.

By-laws Relating to Control and Management of Halls.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on the 20th day of December, 1979, to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following amendments to By-laws:—

1. The existing By-laws relating to the management, use and letting of the Waroona Memorial Hall and associated buildings which were published in the *Government Gazette* on the 1st April, 1977, are hereby revoked.
2. In these By-laws:
 - “Hall or Hall buildings” means any hall which is on land vested in or under the care, control or management of the Council.
 - “Council” means the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Waroona.
 - “Hall Committee” means a committee of management appointed by the Council to manage a hall.
3. The Waroona Shire Council may approve the formation of committees to manage and control halls within the Shire.
4. Application for the hire of halls, or any portion of hall buildings, or equipment or property, under the control of the Council shall be made to the respective Hall Committee not less than twenty-four hours before the hour at which hiring is desired. Where there is no such Management Committee formed, application shall be made to the Council.
5. The hours for which hiring may be effected at day-time rates shall be between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. Night-time rates shall be between the hours of 6 p.m. and 3 a.m.
6. The Council reserves the right to refuse to let any hall or any portion thereof to an applicant for hiring without assigning any reason for such refusal.
7. The Council may at any time demand that the hirer shall, prior to term of engagement, deposit with the Shire Clerk an amount estimated to cover hall hire, and any damage that may occur during the term of engagement. The Council may also demand that the hirer shall, prior to term of engagement, deposit with the Shire Clerk an amount estimated to cover excessive cleaning expenses. Such a deposit to be refunded after the hiring provided the hall or building is left in a clean and tidy condition. If the hall or building is not left in a satisfactory condition, portion or all of the deposit may be retained by the Council. Cleaning of the hall or building shall be completed not later than 10.00 a.m. on the day following the hiring; however, the Council retains the right to require the cleaning to be completed earlier than 10.00 a.m. if the building is required by other hirers. Should the cleaning not be completed by 10.00 a.m. or by the earlier time stated by the Council a portion or all of the deposit may be retained by the Council.
8. The Council may at any time cancel any agreement for hiring of any portion of any hall property.

9. In the event of two or more applications being received for the hire of any hall property at one and the same time and date, the Council or Hall Committees may, without considering priority of application, determine to which applicant the hall hiring shall be granted.

10. The hirer of any portion of any hall property shall comply with the provisions of the Health Act, Licensing Act and any other Act in force for the time being applicable to such hiring or building. If, in the opinion of the Council or the Hall Committees, all necessary actions have not been taken to comply with the requirements of above, and all other relevant Acts, the Council or the Hall Committee may, prior to, or during the term of engagement, forbid and prevent the use of such building.

11. No spirituous liquors, wine, ale or spirits shall be brought into or consumed upon any portion of any hall property, except when permitted in writing by the Council. If it is intended to sell liquor, a permit to do so must be obtained from the Clerk of Courts.

12. No smoking of tobacco, cigarettes, cigars or other matter shall be permitted within any hall building, except by permission of the hirer.

13. No hall plant, furniture, fittings or effect, crockery, glassware or other utensils or materials of any kind shall be hired, loaned or removed from any hall property without the written permission of the Council.

14. No person shall erect any internal or external decorations, place any nails or screws in the woodwork, walls or any part of the hall buildings or property without the permission of the Council or Hall Committee and the hirer shall remove any decorations if requested.

15. No person while intoxicated shall be permitted to enter or remain upon any portion of any hall property nor be guilty of any misbehaviour whatsoever, nor be permitted to use any profane or any improper language nor damage, mark or deface any wall or other part of any hall building or property. Any person who does, permits or suffers any such damage shall be liable to costs of such damage in addition to any penalties imposed under these by-laws.

16. No offensive impersonations or representations of living persons, or anything deemed likely to produce disturbances, riot or breaches of the peace, shall be permitted within any hall building or property.

17. The hirer of any part or parts of any hall building or property shall maintain and keep good order and decent behaviour within the property, and shall be solely and entirely responsible for carrying out and compliance with the requirements of these by-laws and for any damage done to the buildings, fixtures, fittings, crockeryware, etc., and shall pay any such damages as may be assessed by the Council or the Hall Committees.

18. No person shall serve or consume food in any hall without the permission of the Council or the Hall Committees.

19. Any officer representing the Waroona Shire Council or any person duly authorized by the Council or Hall Committees shall at any time be permitted free ingress to the hall buildings or part thereof, and shall be given every facility for enforcing these by-laws.

20. No person shall take photographs without the permission of the hirer and no person shall show films of above 16 millimetres in size without the written permission of the Council.

21. Persons hiring a hall or building who propose to use copyright music in any form must enter into an agreement with the Australian Performing Rights Association Ltd., to permit of the use of copyright music. The hirer must indemnify the Council against any claims which may be made upon it in respect of any breach of copyright.

22. No booking shall be accepted in advance for a longer period than twelve months.

23. Any person who does, permits or suffers an act or matter or thing contrary to any of the by-laws or commits or permits any breach or neglects compliance therewith shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these by-laws and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding \$200 for every such offence.

By-laws Relating to the Use of Vehicles and Bathing Appliances on Cable Beach.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on the nineteenth day of February, 1979, to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor of the following By-laws:—

Definitions.

1. These By-laws apply to the sea adjoining Cable Beach for a distance of 200 metres seawards from the low-water mark at any relevant time.
2. In these By-laws unless the context otherwise indicates, the following terms shall have the meanings set against them hereunder respectively.
 - “Access Road” means the Access Road which leads to Cable Beach from the West of Lot 981 in the Municipality;
 - “Authorised Person” means officer of the Council appointed for the purposes herein or any member of the Western Australian Police Force or any person authorised by Council or the Western Australian Police Force;
 - “Bathing Appliance” means a float of any material, surf-ski, surfboard, kick-board, malibu-board, boat or any other device used or for use in bathing or surf riding, but shall not include foam kick-boards used by children;
 - “Cable Beach” means all that portion of beach between Gantheaume Point and the northern town site boundary of the municipality;
 - “Council” means the Council of the Municipality;
 - “Defined Area” means the area set out in By-law 1 of these By-laws;
 - “Person” includes a body corporate or group of persons.

Vehicles.

3. No person other than an authorised person shall drive or ride a vehicle on that portion of Cable Beach to the south of the access road.
4. No person other than an authorised person shall ride, drive or cause to be ridden or driven a motor bike or beach buggy on any part of Cable Beach.
5. Vehicles other than those described in By-law 4 herein may be driven on Cable Beach to the North of the access road.

Bathing Appliances.

6. No person shall use a bathing appliance within the defined area from a point south of the concrete steps in a southerly direction and such area shall be designated by erecting appropriate signs in the beach sand which can be relocated by resolution of Council as the need arises.
7. An authorised person may either verbally or by the use of clearly marked signs inserted in the beach sand order the discontinuance of use within the defined area of bathing appliances (either generally or of a particular class) which, in his opinion, could cause any inconvenience or danger to bathers.
8. No person shall within the defined area use a bathing appliance (either generally or of a particular class) where the use of that appliance has been prohibited either by notice or by the verbal order of an authorised person.
9. No person shall within the defined area except to put on or remove a garment or garments worn over a bathing costume dress or undress or remove or disarrange any part of his bathing costume in any place open to public view or in any building other than such as is specifically set aside by the Council for the purpose.
10. No person shall within the defined area use a bathing appliance in such a way to cause or be likely to cause danger injury or annoyance to any other person.

General.

11. The Council may appoint any of its members or employees as an authorised person under these By-laws.
12. Every person appointed as an authorised person as provided by these By-laws shall be given a certificate of his appointment and production of the Certificate of Appointment by a person exercising authority under these By-laws is *prima facie* evidence of the appointment and authority.
13. Every member of the Western Australian Police Force has the power of an authorised person under these By-laws.
14. An authorised person finding any person committing or attempting to commit a breach of any of these By-laws may demand of that person his name and current and usual place of abode and shall thereafter report the name and place or places of abode of the offending person to the Council as soon as practicable.

15. Any person who refused or fails to state his name and place or places of abode to an authorised person when that information is requested by the authorised person commits an offence under the Act.

16. Any person who fails to do anything required under these By-laws to be done or who does or attempts to do anything prohibited by these By-laws is guilty of an offence under the Act and is liable to a penalty of \$200.00.
