Petroleum Act, 1967.

WHEREAS it is enacted by subsection (2) of section 15 and subsections (2) and (3) of section 152 of the Petroleum Act, 1967 that notwithstanding the Land Act, 1933 or any other Act the Governor, by proclamation, may declare that any land of the Crown or part thereof reserved for or dedicated to any public purpose under any Act and howsoever classified that:

(a) is not Crown land within the meaning of that expression in section 5 of that Act; and

(b) is specified in the proclamation, is Crown land for the purposes of the Petroleum Act, 1967, and is land to which that Act applies, so long as the proclamation remains in force; and may impose conditions for the purpose of ensuring as far as is practicable that any operations carried out on the land under the authority of a permit or licence issued or granted under the Petroleum Act, 1967 are carried out in such a manner as to minimise the risk of damage to any native fauna and flora on the land: Now, therefore, I the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in the exercise of the powers under the Petroleum Act, 1967 do hereby declare that the land of the Crown comprising Reserve No. 29073 classified Class "C" and set apart for the purpose of Protection of Flora and Fauna is Crown land for the purposes of the Petroleum Act, 1967, and is land to which the Petroleum Act, 1967 applies so long as this proclamation remains in force. And I do hereby impose the following conditions on the carrying out of operations on that

land under the authority of a permit or licence issued or granted under the Petroleum Act, 1967:

- (i) Prior to the granting of a production licence within the Reserve the applicant supplying the Minister for Mines with an Environmental Review and Management Programme (ERMP) for study by the Environmental Protection Authority whose recommendations will be considered by the Minister.
- (ii) Survey lines within the Reserve to be delineated with minimum interference to and disturbance of timber and vegetation. Any clearing and construction of tracks to be limited to the cutting off of the vegetation above ground level to minimise future soil erosion problems.
- (iii) Movement of vehicles within the Reserve to be restricted to survey lines and constructed tracks to minimise random vehicle movement with consequent disturbance to vegetation.
- (iv) All vehicles to be washed down according to Forests Department Vehicles Hygiene prescription before entering the Reserve, except where the movement of vehicles is within the permit area, to prevent the spread of "Phytophthora cinnamomi".
- (v) No open fires to be lit within the Reserve.
- (vi) No dumping of rubbish, spillage of fuels, oils, etc., or discharge of other pollutants within the Reserve.
- (vii) No discharge of firearms or other disturbance of fauna within the Reserve.
- (viii) No camping within the Reserve.

## SUPREME COURT ACT, 1935-1979.

PURSUANT to the powers conferred by the Supreme Court Act, 1935-1979, and all other powers hereunto enabling, a majority of the Judges of the Supreme Court of Western Australia hereby make the following rules.

**AMENDMENT OF THE RULES OF THE  
SUPREME COURT, 1971.**

**Principal rules.** 1. In these rules, the Rules of the Supreme Court, 1971, reprinted in the *Government Gazette* on 9th August, 1976, pursuant to the Reprinting of Regulations Act, 1954, and as amended from time to time, \* are referred to as the principal rules.

**Citation and commencement.** 2. These rules may be cited as the Supreme Court (Costs) Rules, 1980 and shall come into operation on the day on which they are published in the *Government Gazette*.  
Cf. Act No. 30 of 1918, s. 36.

**Revocation.** 3. Rule 5 of the Supreme Court (Costs) Rules, 1978 published in the *Government Gazette* on 13th January, 1978, is revoked; but the revocation of that rule does not affect any work done or services performed between that day and the day on which these rules come into operation.

**Fourth Schedule amended.** 4. (1) Subject to subrule (2) of this rule, the Fourth Schedule to the principal rules is amended by increasing by one-half—  
(a) the allowances prescribed by each item in the scale of costs, other than items 16, 28, 29 and 30; and  
(b) the allowance \$100 prescribed by item 16.  
(2) Subrule (1) of this rule does not apply to any percentage or fraction appearing in any item contained in the scale of costs.

**O. 38 R. 16 amended.** 5. Order 38 of the principal rules is amended by substituting for Rule 16 the following rule:—

**Examiners' fees.** 16. (1) An examiner is entitled to charge the fees set forth in the following table:—

(2) The party prosecuting the order or his solicitor shall also pay all reasonable travelling and other expenses including charges for the room (other than the examiner's office) where the examination is taken and an allowance of \$12 an hour for the time occupied by the examiner in travelling.

(3) The fee on appointment may be retained by the examiner whether the examination is taken or not.

(4) The other fees and the travelling or other expenses shall be paid as soon as the examination has been concluded.

(5) A Judge or the Master may authorize the charging of fees at a higher hourly rate than the hourly rate specified in the foregoing table.

(6) If any dispute arises as to the amount of fees or expenses payable under this Rule it shall be referred to the Master for his decision which shall be final.

(3) In addition to the foregoing allowances, a witness residing at a distance from the place of trial or hearing may be allowed reasonable travelling expenses actually paid, and a reasonable amount for maintenance or sustenance.

(4) The Taxing Officer may also allow such amount as has been reasonably and properly incurred and paid to a witness for qualifying to give skilled evidence.

(5) Except by special order of the trial judge, an allowance shall not be made to an expert witness for his attendance at Court in assisting or advising counsel or the solicitor for a party during a trial or hearing.

(6) In the case of a person giving evidence as an expert, the foregoing allowances may be increased in the discretion of the Taxing Officer.

Application. 7. The principal rules, as amended by these rules, apply to and in relation to work done and services performed on or after the day on which these rules come into operation.

WHEREAS, by an Order dated 14th November, 1978, published in the *Government Gazette* on 17th November, 1978, I, Norman Richard Fletcher, Commissioner for Consumer Affairs, permitted the supply of certain goods to wit portable fire extinguishers but only subject to certain conditions specified therein; and whereas a notice by a Consumer Affairs Authority, the Honourable Wallace Clyde Fife, the Minister for Business and Consumer Affairs, permitting the supply of particular goods to wit portable fire extinguishers subject to certain conditions dated 24th October, 1978 and published on 31st October, 1978, in the *Commonwealth Gazette*, has been revoked by an Order of the Honourable Ransley Victor Garland, the Minister for Business and Consumer Affairs dated the 26th February, 1980, published on 4th March, 1980, in the *Commonwealth Gazette*; and whereas the Order of Norman Richard Fletcher dated 14th November, 1978 and published on 17th November, 1978 in the *Government Gazette*, by virtue of section 23R (4) of the Consumer Affairs Act now ceases to have effect; and whereas a Consumer Affairs Authority, the Honourable Ransley Victor Garland, the Minister for Business and Consumer Affairs in and for the Commonwealth of Australia has by an order dated 26th February, 1980, published in the *Commonwealth Gazette* on 4th March, 1980, permitted the supply of particular goods to wit portable fire extinguishers subject to certain

conditions specified therein. Now therefore, I, Norman Richard Fletcher, Commissioner for Consumer Affairs being satisfied that a Consumer Affairs Authority has made the Order aforesaid and in pursuance of section 23R (4) of the Consumer Affairs Act, 1971-1978 permit the supply of a particular class of goods specified in Schedule One subject to the conditions set out in Schedule Two and Schedule Three.

## Interpretation.

A "portable fire extinguisher" means a first aid firefighting appliance that can be carried by hand.
