WHEREAS it is enacted by subitem (1) of item 3 of the Second Schedule to the Stamp Act, 1921-1979, that the duty payable on any statement written out or caused to be written out by the owner or his agent, pursuant to the Cattle Industry Compensation Act, 1965, in respect of the sale of any cattle or carcasses of cattle, whether payment of the purchase money therefor is or is not made in full at the time of the sale or is to be made by instalments or is otherwise deferred, shall be, for every \$1 and also for any fractional part of \$1—

- (a) of the amount of the purchase money in respect of one animal or one carcass sold singly; or
- (b) of the total amount of the purchase money in respect of any number of cattle or carcasses, as the case may be, sold in one lot,

5/12 of a cent or such amount, being not more than 5/12 of a cent, as the Governor may, from time to time by proclamation declare; and whereas it is further enacted by subitem (2) of that item that, notwithstanding the provisions of subitem (1) of that item, the duty in respect of the amount of the purchase money of any one animal, or any one carcass, whether sold singly or as a part of a lot, shall not exceed the sum of fifty cents or such lesser sum as the Governor may, from time to time, by proclamation declare; and whereas it appears to me, the Governor, desirable that amounts should be so declared: Now, therefore, I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that, on and from the date on which this proclamation is published in the *Government Gazette*—

- (c) the duty payable for every \$1 and also for any fractional part of \$1—
  - (i) of the amount of the purchase money in respect of one animal or one carcass sold singly; or

- (ii) of the total amount of the purchase money in respect of any number of cattle or carcasses, as the case may be, sold in one lot,

shall be 3/10 of a cent; and

- (d) notwithstanding paragraph (c) of this proclamation, the duty in respect of the amount of the purchase money of any one animal, or any one carcass, whether sold singly or as part of a lot, shall not exceed the sum of fifty cents.

## BUSH FIRES ACT, 1954-1979.

## By-law Relating to Firebreaks.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act, the Council of the abovementioned municipality hereby records having resolved on the 11th day of July, 1979 to make and submit to the Governor for approval the following by-law.

1. In this by-law:—

“Council” means the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Mingenew.

“firebreak period” means:

- (a) where used in relation to townsite land, the period from and including the 1st November in any year until the 15th April in the following year; and
- (b) where used in relation to rural land, the period from and including the 1st October in any year until the 15th April in the following year.

“rural land” means any land within the municipal district of the Shire of Mingenew which is not townsite land.

“townsite land” means any land within the boundaries of the townsites of Mingenew and Yandanooka declared as townsites pursuant to the provisions of the Land Act.

2. Subject to Clause 5 of this by-law, every owner and occupier of rural land or townsite land shall—

- (a) prior to the commencement of the firebreak period plough, cultivate, scarify, burn or otherwise clear upon the land firebreaks at such places, of such dimensions and to such number as required by this by-law;
- (b) at all times during the firebreak period maintain the firebreaks on that land clear of all inflammable matter.

4. On any rural land a firebreak shall be created to a width of not less than 2.1 metres:

- (a) along every boundary of the land;
- (b) along every boundary of any crop on the land;
- (c) within 100 metres of and so as to completely surround any building or haystack on the land;
- (d) immediately adjacent to and so as to completely surround any stationary engine or pump on the land.

5. On any townsite land firebreaks shall be created:

- (a) subject to paragraph (c) of this clause to a width of not less than 2.1 metres along every boundary of vacant land;
- (b) subject to paragraph (c) of this clause to a width of not less than 1 metre along every boundary of land that is built upon;
- (c) to a width of not less than 3 metres along every boundary of land on which inflammable liquids are stored.

6. If the Council is of the opinion that for any reason it is impracticable to create firebreaks in accordance with the requirements of this by-law the Council may give approval to an owner or occupier of land to create a firebreak otherwise than in accordance with those requirements.

7. An owner or occupier of land who fails or neglects in any respect to comply with this by-law is guilty of an offence.

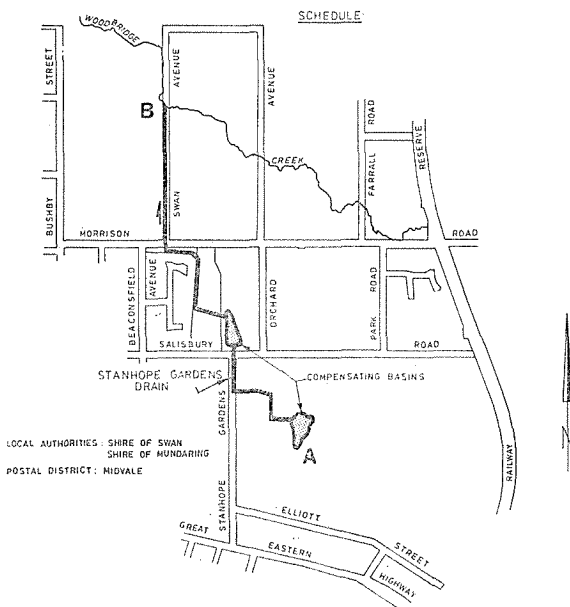

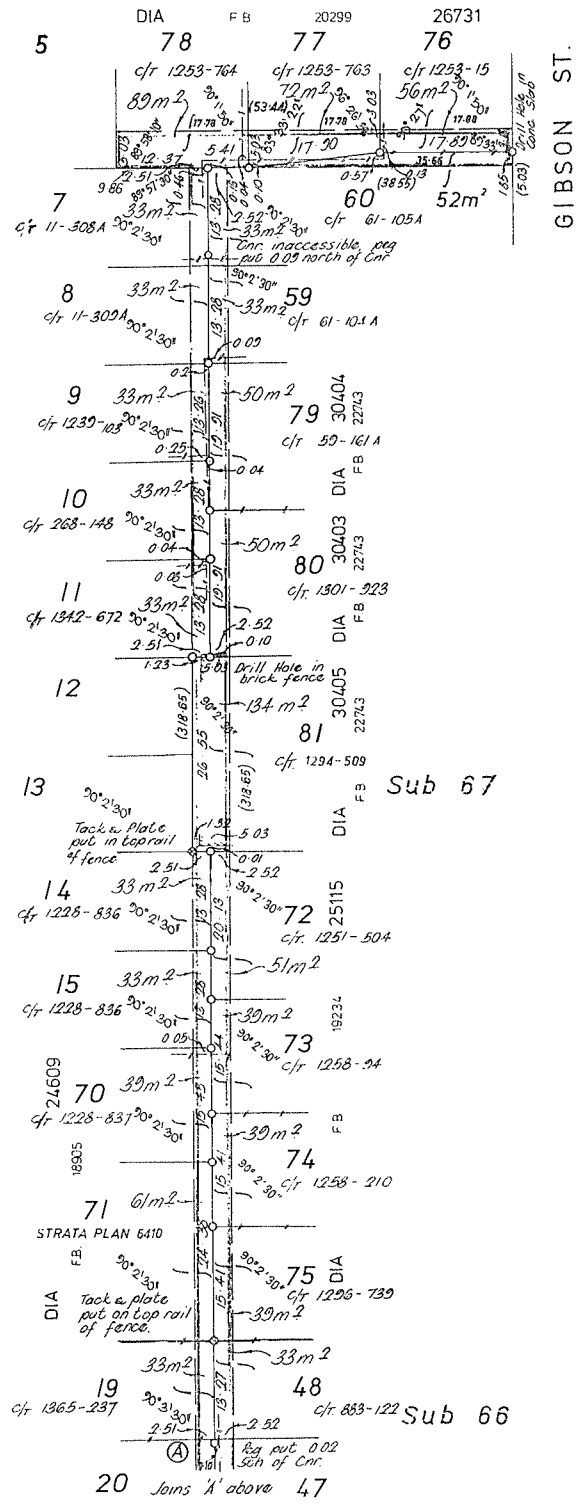
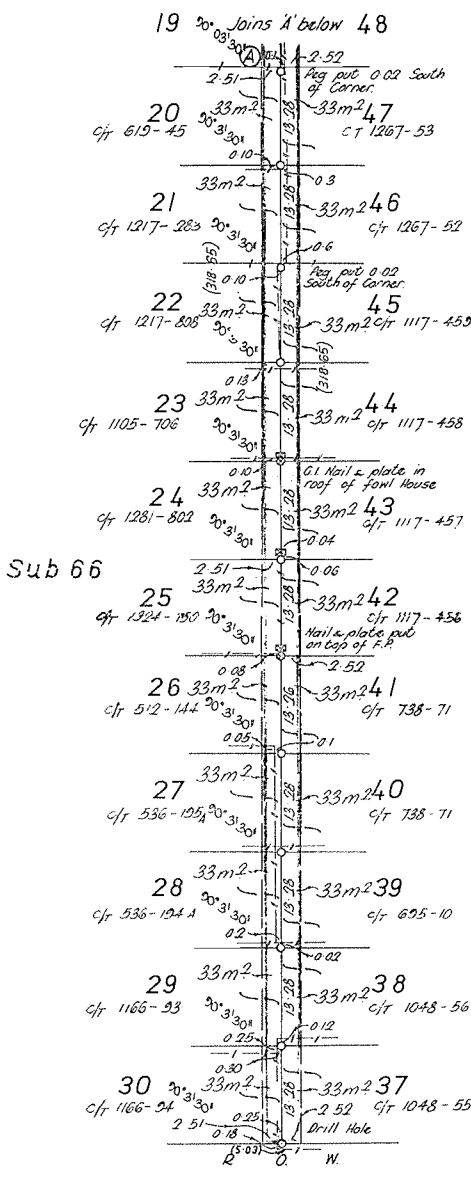

1. These by-laws may be cited as the Shire of Mullewa Pest Plant By-laws, 1979.
2. In these by-laws, unless the contrary intention appears:—  
 "council" means council of the municipality of the Shire of Mullewa;  
 "district" means the district of the council;  
 "pest plant" means a plant described as a pest plant by by-law 4 of these by-laws.
3. These by-laws apply in respect of the district.
4. Every plant described in the First Schedule to these by-laws is a pest plant.
5. (1) The council may serve on the owner or occupier of private land within the district a duly completed notice in the form of the Second Schedule to these by-laws requiring him to destroy, eradicate or otherwise control any pest plant on that land.  
 (2) A person served with a notice under sub-by-law (1) of this by-law shall comply with that notice within the time and in the manner specified therein.
6. Where a person fails to comply with a notice under by-law 5 of these by-laws served upon him, the council may:—  
 (a) without payment of any compensation in respect thereof, destroy, eradicate or control, as the case may be any pest plant the destruction, eradication or control of which was required by the notice; and  
 (b) recover in a court of competent jurisdiction from the person to whom the notice is directed, the amount of the expense of such destruction, eradication or control.

## CEMETERIES ACT, 1897-1978.

The Municipality of the Shire of Carnamah.

By-laws relating to the Winchester Public Cemetery—Reserve No. 19618.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act, and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality, as Trustee of the Winchester Public Cemetery, hereby records having resolved on the 17th October, 1979, to repeal Cemetery by-laws as published in the *Government Gazette* on the 20th day of July, 1928, and to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following by-laws in lieu thereof:—

1. All fees and charges payable to the Trustee, as set forth in Schedule "A" shall be paid at the times and manner therein mentioned unless otherwise ordered.

2. The "Secretary" as referred to in these by-laws means the person for the time being employed by the Council as the Shire Clerk of the Council and such person shall, subject to the Trustee, exercise a general supervision and control over all matters pertaining to the Cemetery, and to the carrying out and enforcement of these by-laws, and the direction of such person shall in all cases and for all purposes be presumed to be and have been the direction of the Trustee.

3. A plan of the Cemetery showing the distribution of the land compartments, sections, situation and number of graves, and a register of all certificates of Rights of Burial shall be kept at the office of the Trustee.

4. Any person desiring to inter any dead body or ashes thereof in the Cemetery shall make an application in the form contained in Schedule "B" and upon payment of the appropriate fees, the Trustee may issue a form of Order of Burial, in accordance with Schedule "C".

5. All applications for interment shall be made at the office of the Trustee in such time as to allow at least eight working hours' notice being given to the Secretary at the office prior to the time fixed for burial.

6. The Trustee shall cause all graves to be dug and vaults and brick graves to be re-opened as and when required.

7. Every coffin or urn shall have upon the lid an approved metal plate bearing the name of the deceased, stamped or otherwise indelibly inscribed in legible characters thereon. A coffin or urn which does not comply with this by-law shall not be admitted to or be interred in the Cemetery.

8. Every grave shall be at least 1.8 m deep at the first interment and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than 1.4 m from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the surrounding ground.

9. In the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault to which the deceased had no claim during life, the written and verified consent of the grantee shall be handed in with the application in the form of Assignment of Right of Burial, Schedule "E".

10. Prior to conducting any interments within the Cemetery, or making use of the Cemetery for any purposes connected with interments, every undertaker shall pay to the Trustee an annual fee as prescribed in Schedule "A", and shall, at the time of making such payment, give, if required, his consent in writing to such conditions as the Trustee may deem fit to impose. Upon such assent being given and the payment of the fee being made, he shall receive a permit, tenable during good behaviour and until the thirtieth day of June next, following, and unless in possession of such permit no undertaker shall be allowed to engage in or carry out any duty or work within the Cemetery.

11. (i) Subject to paragraph (ii) of this by-law, a person shall not bring a dead body into the Cemetery unless he, or his representative has first handed to the Secretary for inspection and return a medical certificate of death or a Coroner's order for burial in respect of the body.

(ii) Where an undertaker or his representative for a valid reason, is unable to produce a medical certificate or coroner's order for burial, as required by paragraph (i) of this by-law and he has given to the Secretary a written guarantee to produce the certificate or order within three days, he may bring the body into the Cemetery.

(iii) A burial shall not be permitted in the Cemetery unless the provisions of one of the foregoing paragraphs of this by-law have been complied with.

(iv) Where a representative or the undertaker himself has given written guarantee as required by paragraph (ii) of this by-law and he has failed to produce the certificate or order within three days the undertaker's licence may be suspended until the certificate or order is produced.

12. No interment shall be allowed on a Sunday except when it is certified in writing by a medical officer of health that for sanitary or special religious reasons it is necessary or advisable that the burial take place on that day.

13. The hours for burial shall be as follows: Monday to Friday, 9.00 a.m. to 4.30 p.m., Saturdays, 9.00 a.m. to 11.00 a.m., Sunday (subject to by-law 12) from 2.00 p.m. to 4.00 p.m. and no burial shall be allowed to take place nor any coffin allowed to enter the Cemetery at any other hour except by written permission of the Trustee. No burial shall take place on Christmas Day or Good Friday.

14. The time fixed for any burial shall be at which time the funeral is to arrive at the Cemetery gates and if not punctually observed, the undertaker responsible shall pay the charge specified in Schedule A.

15. No hearse, mourning coach, or other vehicle shall enter the cemetery, or proceed except at and by such roads as directed by the officer of the Trustee from time to time. Any driver or other person failing or neglecting to observe such directions commits an offence against these by-laws.

16. If application to the Trustee be made to exhume any corpse for the purpose of examination or identification or for the purpose of its being buried elsewhere in accordance with the wishes of a Coroner or a Justice of the Peace issued in accordance with the law authorizing the Trustee to permit the exhumation must be attached to the application form.

17. Children under the age of 10 years entering the Cemetery must be in the charge of some responsible person.

18. Smoking shall not be allowed within the Cemetery nor may any fireworks be discharged therein.

19. No dogs shall be permitted within the Cemetery, and any person taking or allowing a dog into the Cemetery commits an offence against these by-laws.

20. Any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any tree, shrub, flower, border, grave or any erection commits an offence against these by-laws.

21. No person shall remove any plant, tree, shrub, flower or part thereof (other than withered flowers, grass or weeds) from within any portion of the Cemetery or remove any article from any grave without first obtaining a permit from the Trustee or its representative.

22. No person shall promote or advertise or carry on within the Cemetery any trade, business or calling, either by solicitation, distribution of circulars, by cards or otherwise or by any system of advertising whatsoever without the written consent of the Trustee and any person infringing this by-law shall be expelled from the Cemetery.

23. No person employed by the Trustee shall be permitted to accept any gratuity whatsoever nor shall he be pecuniarily interested in any work in the Cemetery other than the remuneration he receives from the Trustee, and any such person proved guilty of accepting any gratuity or being pecuniarily interested in such work shall be liable to summary dismissal.

24. Any person requiring a Grant of Right of Burial in any part of the Cemetery shall apply to the Trustee specifying the location of the grave. If it is proposed to inter therein the remains of any already deceased person the name of such person must be shown in the application. If the application is approved by the Trustee a Grant of Right of Burial shall be issued in the form of Schedule "D".

25. Every Grant of Right of Burial shall be subject to the by-laws for the time being in force, and no interment in any grave or vault shall be allowed unless upon production of the Order for Burial, nor shall any grave or vault be opened unless with the consent of the Trustee.

26. Every coffin placed in any brick grave or vault shall be bricked in, cemented and any space surrounding such coffin to be filled with charcoal, dry earth or other suitable material and covered with a slab of stone, slate or iron, unless written exemption be obtained from the Trustee.

27. In the event of such exemption being obtained from the Trustee each coffin placed in any brick grave or vault shall be properly lead-lined and hermetically sealed.

28. If application be made for an interment in any grave or vault of the remains of any person other than the person to whom the grant was issued, or his registered assign, the written and verified consent of such grantee or assignee shall be produced together with the Grant of Right of Burial.

29. Should the grantee be unable to produce the Grant of Right of Burial through having lost same, on making application for a grave to be re-opened for the purpose of interment, the said grantee shall make a declaration to this effect and shall pay the fee for a copy of such Grant of Right of Burial as prescribed in Schedule "A" before the interment takes place.

30. Any person desiring to place or erect, or to alter or add to any monument, tombstone, or any enclosure in any part of the Cemetery must first obtain the consent and approval of the Trustee and otherwise comply with Section 23 of the Cemeteries Act, 1897.

31. Every tombstone, monument, or enclosure shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations, which if required by the Trustee or its Officer, shall extend to the bottom of the grave.

32. The materials used in every such erection shall be subject to the approval of the Secretary and any material rejected shall be immediately removed from the Cemetery by the Contractor for the erection. All refuse and other rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be immediately removed from the Cemetery by the person causing same.

33. Should any work by masons or other be not completed before a Sunday, they shall be required to leave the work in a neat and safe condition to the satisfaction of the Secretary.

34. All materials required in the erection and completion of any work shall, as far as possible, be prepared before being taken to the Cemetery, and all materials required by tradesmen shall be admitted only at the entrance provided for this purpose.

35. Monumental masons shall not be permitted to carry on work within the Cemetery during other than the hours specified for the opening and closing of the gates on week days, Saturdays and Sundays excepted, when no work is to be done from noon on Saturday to the opening of the gates on the Monday morning, without written consent of the Trustee.

36. No catacomb shall be allowed.

37. No wooden fence, railing, cross or other wooden erection shall be allowed on or around any grave or vault without written approval of the Trustee.

38. No trees or shrubs shall be planted on any grave other than in that section, as indicated on the plan, which is set aside for the interment of ashes, except such as shall be approved by the Secretary.

39. All workmen whether employed by the Trustee or by any other person shall at all times whilst within the boundaries of the Cemetery be subject to the supervision of the Secretary and shall obey such directions as that officer may find it necessary to give and any workman committing any breach of these regulations and by-laws, or refusing or neglecting to comply with any directions of the said Secretary, commits an offence against these by-laws.

40. Any person taking part in dressing or attending to any grave shall comply with the following rules:—

(a) No rubbish, soil, sand or other material removed in dressing a grave shall be placed on any other grave and if placed on any adjoining ground shall be removed immediately the work is completed.

(b) No sand, soil or loam shall be taken from any portion of the Cemetery for the purpose of dressing any grave except with the permission of the Secretary.

(c) The dressing of all graves, and wheeling and carting of any material shall be subject to the supervision of the Secretary.

(d) Work in all cases to be carried on with due dispatch and only during regulation hours specified within by-law 13 hereof.

41. The Trustee may decorate graves from time to time, when desired by the grantee so to do. If the grantees do not desire the Trustee to carry out this work, the grantees may either do it themselves or employ any person as approved by the Trustee for that purpose.

42. If for the purpose of re-opening a grave the Trustee find it necessary to remove edging tiles, plants, grass, shrubs, etc., from the grave, the person so ordering the re-opening shall pay to the Trustee the charges laid down in Schedule "A".

Notwithstanding this clause, the Trustee accept no liability for any damage to edging tiles, headstones, plants, etc., arising from the re-opening of any grave.

43. Free ground may be granted if it is proved to the satisfaction of the Trustee—

(a) That the deceased was a returned soldier, and that he died as a result of injuries received on active service.

(b) That the relatives of the deceased are in necessitous circumstances.

Provided that such grant shall be made subject to the condition that only the remains of the deceased person as approved by the Trustee shall be interred in the grave.

44. A person who commits a breach of any of these by-laws commits an offence and shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty dollars in addition to any costs incurred as a result of making good any damage.

45. Any person committing a breach of any by-law shall, in addition to being liable to a penalty, under any by-law be liable to be forthwith removed from the Cemetery by the Trustee or the Secretary or other employees of the Trustee or by any police constable. If such person resists removal from the Cemetery or, if and as often as such person so removed shall, unless with the consent of the Secretary, again enter the Cemetery within 24 hours of his removal therefrom, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty dollars.

46. Winchester Cemetery By-laws published in the *Government Gazette* on the 20th day of July, 1928, are hereby revoked.

## DAIRY INDUSTRY ACT, 1973

IT is hereby notified for general information that, in accordance with the provisions of the Dairy Industry Act, 1973, the Dairy Industry Authority of Western Australia has fixed the undermentioned prices and rates—

for market milk and the treatment and transport of market milk;

for special products milk produced in dairy areas within the State of Western Australia for the manufacture of the following classes of dairy produce which are sold within the State of Western Australia and which are prescribed in the Dairy Industry Regulations, 1977:—

Yoghurt,

Flavoured Milk;

and for special products milk produced in dairy areas within the State of Western Australia which is sold for human consumption within the State of Western Australia in areas not constituted as dairy areas within the meaning of the Dairy Industry Act, 1973;

## MINIMUM PRICES TO DAIRYMEN:

Minimum price to be paid to dairymen by the Authority at the dairy for market milk containing not less than 11·75 per cent total milk solids as determined by Australian Standard Method 1084-1974, Section 3, in relation to a representative composite sample taken over a testing period; and containing not less than 3·2 per cent milk fat as determined by the Babcock or Milko-Tester methods in relation to the same representative composite sample at the rate of 21·63 cents per litre.

Minimum price to be paid to dairymen by the Authority at the dairy for special products milk containing not less than 11·75 per cent total milk solids as determined by Australian Standard Method 1084-1974, Section 3, in relation to a representative composite sample taken over a testing period; and containing not less than 3·2 per cent milk fat as determined by the Babcock or Milko-Tester methods in relation to the same representative composite sample at the rate of 10·73 cents per litre.

Maximum price to be paid to the Authority by dairy produce factories for special products milk at the rate of 21·62 cents per litre.

## MAXIMUM TRANSPORT CHARGES (Market Milk only):

Maximum charge for transport of market milk purchased by the Authority from dairy produce factories outside the metropolitan area to dairy produce factories in the metropolitan area at the rate of 1·24 cents per litre.

## OTHER CHARGES (Market Milk only):

Maximum charge for treatment, excluding pasteurisation and packing, of market milk at dairy produce factories outside the metropolitan area at the rate of 1·44 cents per litre.

Maximum price to be charged at dairy produce factories in the metropolitan area for market milk received for treatment from dairy produce factories outside the metropolitan area at the rate of 27·70 cents per litre.

## ACCEPTANCE AND DISPOSAL OF MILK BY THE AUTHORITY

It is further determined that, where milk delivered by a dairyman—

is found to contain less than 11·75 per cent total milk solids, as determined by the aforementioned Standard Method during any testing period on a second or succeeding occasion after January 1, 1980 or a second or succeeding occasion in any subsequent quota year, milk supplied by that dairyman for the duration of that testing period will not be accepted by the Authority as market milk or special products milk.

is found to contain less than 3·2 per cent milk fat, as determined by one of the aforementioned methods during any testing period on a second or succeeding occasion after January 1, 1980 or a second or succeeding occasion in any subsequent quota year, milk supplied by that dairyman for the duration of that testing period will not be accepted by the Authority as market milk or special products milk.

is found by the Department of Agriculture of Western Australia on a certain day to contain anti-biotic on a second occasion after January 1, 1980 or a second occasion in any subsequent quota year, milk supplied by that dairyman for that one day will not be accepted by the Authority as market milk or special products milk.

is found by the Department of Agriculture of Western Australia on a certain day to contain anti-biotic on a third or succeeding occasion after January 1, 1980 or on a third or succeeding occasion in any subsequent quota year, milk supplied by that dairyman for the duration of the testing period in which that day occurs will not be accepted by the Authority as market milk or special products milk.

is found by the Department of Agriculture of Western Australia on a certain day to contain added water on the first occasion after January 1, 1980 or on the first occasion in any subsequent quota year, milk supplied by that dairyman for that one day will not be accepted by the Authority as market milk or special products milk.

is found by the Department of Agriculture of Western Australia on a certain day to contain added water on a second or succeeding occasion after January 1, 1980 or on a second or succeeding occasion in any subsequent quota year, milk supplied by that dairyman for the duration of the testing period in which that day occurs will not be accepted by the Authority as market milk or special products milk.

is found by the Department of Agriculture of Western Australia on a certain day to contain added solids on the first occasion after January 1, 1980 or on the first occasion in any subsequent quota year, milk supplied by that dairyman will not be accepted by the Authority as market milk or special products milk for a minimum of two testing periods.

is found by the Department of Agriculture of Western Australia on a certain day to contain added solids on a second or succeeding occasion after January 1, 1980 or a second or succeeding occasion in any subsequent quota year, milk supplied by that dairyman will not be accepted by the Authority as market milk or special products milk for a minimum of four testing periods.

is found by the Department of Agriculture of Western Australia on a certain day to have a freezing point determination above Minus 0.522°C, milk supplied by that dairyman will not be accepted by the Authority as market milk or special products milk in accordance with the aforementioned conditions applying to added water.

is found by the Department of Agriculture of Western Australia on a certain day to have a bacterial content of over 100 000 bacteria per millilitre 10 to 25 days after an initial examination indicating over 100 000 bacteria per millilitre, milk supplied by that dairyman for that one day will not be accepted by the Authority as market milk or special products milk.

Where milk delivered by a dairyman is acceptable as market milk or special products milk and the abovementioned prices for market milk or special products milk apply—

## HONEY POOL ACT, 1978-1979.

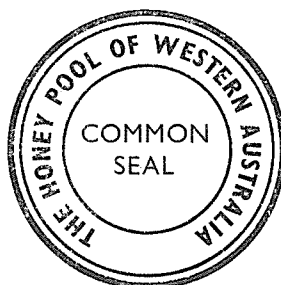
HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council, acting under the Honey Pool Act, 1978-1979, and section 11 of the Interpretation Act, 1918-1975, has been pleased to make the regulations set out in the schedule hereunder to take effect on and from the day on which the Honey Pool Act, 1978, comes into operation.

## Schedule.

## REGULATIONS.

- Citation. 1. These regulations may be cited as the Honey Pool Regulations.
- Interpretation. 2. In these regulations unless the contrary intention appears—  
 “the Act” means the Honey Pool Act, 1978, as amended;  
 “Board” means the Board of Directors of the Honey Pool;  
 “Chairman” means the Chairman of the Board;  
 “Director” means a Director of the Board;  
 “election” means an election for nomination for appointment as an elective Director;  
 “electoral roll” means the roll of prescribed participants referred to in regulation 14;  
 “Form” means a form in the Schedule to these regulations;  
 “Honey Pool” means the Honey Pool of Western Australia established under the Act;  
 “honey” means honey that conforms to the prescribed quality;  
 “pool” means a honey pool formed by the Board to facilitate the marketing of honey;  
 “regulation” means one of these regulations;  
 “Secretary” means the Secretary of the Honey Pool;  
 “subregulation” means a subregulation of the regulation wherein the term is used.
- Prescribed quality. 3. For the purposes of the interpretation “honey” in section 4 of the Act, honey conforms to the prescribed quality if—  
 (a) it is a nectar and saccharine exudation of plants that has been gathered, modified, stored and ripened by the honey bee; and  
 (b) it—  
 (i) does not contain more than 18.5 parts per centum of water;  
 (ii) contains not less than 60 parts per centum of reducing sugars;  
 (iii) does not contain more than 0.5 parts per centum of ash;  
 (iv) does not contain any added pollen, added sugar or glucose, artificial sweetening substance, added colouring matter, or other foreign substance;  
 (v) does not contain more wax or foreign matter than it would if it had been strained through a wire gauze having not more than 1.130 mm between strands when that honey was at a temperature not more than 43°C.  
 (iv) is free from damage, including damage caused by over-heating, metallic staining, fermentation, or foreign flavour or aroma.
- Forms. 4. (1) An appraisalment certificate issued under section 21 of the Act shall be in the form of Form 7.  
 (2) A claim for compensation referred to in section 23 of the Act shall be in the form of Form 8.
- Common seal. 5. (1) The common seal of the Honey Pool shall be in the form set out hereunder:



## Schedule—continued.

- (2) The common seal shall be kept at such place as the Board directs, under lock, the key to which is held by the Secretary, and shall not be affixed to any document except—
- (a) pursuant to a resolution of the Board; and
  - (b) in the presence of at least two Directors and the Secretary, each of whom shall sign the document.
- Time limit for making nominations. 6. The prescribed time for the purposes of subsection (5) of section 8 of the Act is—
- (a) where the request is made under paragraph (a) of subsection (3) of that section—forty-two days;
  - (b) where the request is made under paragraph (b) of subsection (3) of that section—four calendar months.
- “Prescribed period” for purpose of casual vacancies. 7. For the purposes of subsection (11) of section 8 of the Act the prescribed period is five calendar months.
- Application of Electoral Act. 8. The provisions of the Electoral Act, 1907 as amended, and the regulations made thereunder shall apply in so far as they can, with any necessary adaptations, be made applicable to all matters, relating to the election of an elective Director of the Honey Pool, that are not provided for in these regulations.
- General. 9. (1) The returning officer for an election shall be a person appointed in that behalf by the Board.  
(2) The returning officer may appoint other officers to assist him in the conduct of an election.  
(3) The Board shall pay the expenses incurred in connection with an election.
- Notice of elections. 10. (1) Where a request under paragraph (b) of subsection (3) of section 8 of the Act has been made by the Minister, the Chairman shall direct the returning officer to fix a day to be the nomination day and the returning officer shall thereupon fix a nomination day and cause a notice of the day in the form of Form 1, to be published in the *Government Gazette* and in at least one issue of the newspaper known as *The West Australian*.  
(2) The day fixed as the nomination day under this regulation shall be not less than twenty-one days, nor more than forty-five days after the latest of the publications of the notice.
- Date of election. 11. Every election day shall be not less than twenty-one days, nor more than forty-five days, after the nomination day and shall be fixed by the returning officer.
- Close of poll. 12. When fixing an election day the returning officer shall fix an hour for the closing of the poll at that election.
- Lists of prescribed producers. 13. (1) The Board shall, not less than seven days before the nomination day for the election, furnish the returning officer with a list that is certified by the Secretary and contains the full names and addresses of persons who are prescribed participants together with the number of votes to which each of those persons is entitled and, where the prescribed participant is a corporate body, the person authorized to represent the corporate body as a voter.  
(2) Where a person who is a prescribed participant and whose name and address is not included, or whose voting entitlement is incorrectly shown, in the list furnished in accordance with subregulation (1) makes an application in the form of Form 2 to the Board not less than seven days before the day fixed for the election in respect of which the list was so furnished, the Board may, forthwith, furnish the returning officer with a further list that is certified in accordance with subregulation (1) and contains that name and address together with the correct number of votes to which that person is entitled.
- Electoral roll. 14. A list furnished in accordance with regulation 13 shall be the roll of prescribed participants for the election in respect of which that list is so furnished and shall be signed on each page by the returning officer.
- Prescribed participants and voting entitlements. 15. (1) At each election a participant who, in the twelve months ending on the thirtieth day of June immediately preceding that election, has delivered to the Honey Pool, whether constituted under the Honey Pool Act, 1955-1970 or under the Honey Pool Act, 1978 as amended, not less than one hundred kilograms of honey is a prescribed participant, and is entitled to exercise at the election—
- (a) one vote if the amount of honey so delivered was one hundred kilograms;
  - (b) if the amount of honey so delivered exceeds one hundred kilograms—one vote in respect of each hundred kilograms, or part thereof, of honey so delivered.

## Schedule—continued.

(2) Where honey was delivered on behalf of a partnership agreement, the parties to the agreement shall each be entitled to such number of votes as from time to time they may mutually agree and specify by notice in writing signed by each party and sent or delivered to the Board not later than fourteen days before the day fixed as the nomination day under subregulation (1) of regulation 10, but so that the aggregate number of votes to which the parties are entitled shall be the number of votes to which a person delivering the honey solely would have been entitled in respect thereof.

(3) Where any prescribed participant on the electoral roll is a corporate body, the board of directors or other management authority thereof may authorize any director, trustee, or other member of the board or management authority or its manager, secretary, or other officer (being a natural person not already enrolled or entitled to be enrolled on the electoral roll) to represent the corporate body as a voter and, upon receipt of an application in the form of Form 3 from such a representative, not later than fourteen days before the day fixed as the nomination day under subregulation (1) of regulation 10, together with a certificate in writing evidencing the representative's authority in that behalf under the hand of the managing director, or the president or chairman of the management authority, of the corporate body, as the case may be, the Board shall, subject to all other requirements of these regulations being satisfied, endorse the name and address of that representative on the electoral roll for the election beside the name of the corporate body.

(4) No person shall be entitled to be enrolled on the electoral roll more than once, and no person enrolled on the electoral roll shall be endorsed on the electoral roll as the representative of a corporate body.

(5) Every authority given under subregulation (3) shall remain effective for all subsequent elections and electoral rolls until written notice of revocation is sent or delivered to the Board or until the person thereby authorized to represent a corporate body is enrolled on the electoral roll as a prescribed participant in his own right.

(6) Any authority given under subregulation (3) may be revoked by notice in writing, under the hand of the person or persons who gave the authority, sent or delivered to the Board, but such a revocation shall not invalidate any vote by the representative person endorsed on the roll and voting by virtue of such authority at an election held previously to the revocation.

(7) Upon receipt of a revocation of authority as mentioned in subregulation (6), the Board shall forthwith remove from the electoral roll the name of the representative whose authority has been so revoked.

**Nomination.** 16. A nomination may be in the form of Form No. 4, but a nomination is not valid unless it—

- (a) sets out the full name and address of the candidate and, except in the case referred to in regulation 23, the term for which he is nominated;
- (b) is signed by two or more prescribed participants for the election for which the nomination is made;
- (c) contains a statement, signed by the candidate, that—
  - (i) he consents to his nomination; and
  - (ii) he is a prescribed participant for the election for which the nomination is made; and
- (d) is addressed to the returning officer and is delivered to him, or forwarded so as to reach him, before the hour of twelve noon on the day fixed for the close of nominations.

**Withdrawal of nomination.** 17. A candidate may, by notice, signed by him, witnessed by a prescribed participant and addressed to, and lodged with, the returning officer before the hour of twelve noon on the nomination day, withdraw his consent to his nomination; and that candidate shall, thereupon, be deemed not to have been nominated.

**Unopposed candidates.** 18. Where only one candidate has been duly nominated for an election that candidate shall be duly elected.

**Voting papers.** 19. (1) Where more than one candidate has been duly nominated for an election, the returning officer shall, as soon as practicable after the close of nominations—

- (a) cause the full names of the candidates and the day and hour fixed for the close of the poll to be published in the *Government Gazette* and in at least one issue of the newspaper known as *The West Australian*;
- (b) cause voting papers and counterfoils to be printed, in accordance, respectively, with Forms 5 and 6, setting out in the voting papers the full names of the candidates in alphabetical order of their surnames; and

(c) send by post, or otherwise, to each prescribed participant—

(i) one voting paper, initialled by the returning officer or a person authorized by him in that behalf and endorsed on the reverse side with the number of votes to which the prescribed participant is entitled pursuant to these regulations;

(ii) one counterfoil; and

(iii) one envelope addressed to the returning officer.

(2) The voting paper, counterfoil, and addressed envelope, shall be enclosed by the returning officer in a covering envelope which shall be fastened, addressed and forwarded to the person for whom it is intended.

20. If a prescribed participant makes, and sends, to the returning officer a statement in writing setting out his full name, correct address and former address (if any)—

(a) stating that he has not received a voting paper or that any voting paper received by him has been lost or destroyed, and that he has not already voted; or

(b) stating that the voting entitlement endorsed on the voting paper is incorrect and returns to the returning officer the incorrectly endorsed voting paper,

the returning officer may issue to the prescribed participant a voting paper, counterfoil and envelope, or a further voting paper, counterfoil and envelope, as the case may require.

Voting.

21. (1) A person, having received a voting paper and wishing to vote, shall record his votes on the voting paper in the manner following—

(a) The voter shall record the number of votes he wishes to allocate to a candidate opposite the name of the candidate, but so that the total number of votes allocated does not exceed his voting entitlement.

(b) Where a voter wishes to allocate to one candidate all of the votes he is entitled to exercise, he may record his votes in accordance with paragraph (a) of this subregulation or he may simply indicate the name of the candidate by a cross, tick, or other means, whereupon all of his votes will be taken to be allocated to that candidate.

(2) A voter having marked his voting paper in the manner prescribed by subregulation (1) shall, thereupon—

(a) fold the voting paper so that the reverse side, on which the voting entitlement is marked, faces outwards;

(b) complete and sign the counterfoil in the presence of a witness who shall also sign it; and

(c) return the voting paper together with the completed counterfoil to the returning officer, by post or otherwise, in the envelope addressed to the returning officer, so as to be received by him not later than the day and hour fixed by the notice of election for the closing of the poll at that election.

Scrutiny  
and count.

22. (1) The returning officer shall place, and keep, in a locked and sealed box, all voting papers received by him, until the close of the poll.

(2) A voting paper received after the close of the poll shall not be admitted to the scrutiny.

(3) As soon as practicable after the hour fixed for the close of the poll, the returning officer shall, in the presence of any scrutineer appointed under subregulation (4) who is present, proceed with the scrutiny, count the votes received and ascertain and declare the result of the poll.

(4) Each candidate at an election is entitled to appoint, in writing, one scrutineer who may be present when voting papers relating to the election are being opened at the commencement of the scrutiny and who may remain during the scrutiny.

First  
elections.

23. In the case of the first elections held for the purposes of paragraph (b) of subsection (2) of section 8 of the Act voting shall be as if for the purpose of filling only one vacancy, but in declaring the result of the election candidates shall be declared to be elected in accordance with subsection (6) of section 8 of the Act.

Informal  
votes.

24. (1) Where the right of a person to vote, or to the number of votes cast, is not established, or the counterfoil is not signed by the voter and by a witness, the returning officer shall replace the counterfoil and the voting paper in the envelope in which they were received, endorse the envelope "rejected", and set it aside for safe keeping together with any others that may have been rejected.

Schedule—*continued.*

- (2) A voting paper is informal, if—
  - (a) it does not bear the initials of the returning officer or a person authorized by him to initial voting papers;
  - (b) the voter has not marked it as prescribed by these regulations;
  - (c) the names of more than one candidate are indicated without indicating the number of votes allocated to each candidate; or
  - (d) the number of votes allocated exceeds the number of votes the voter is entitled to exercise.
  
- Recount. 25. (1) At any time before the publication of the result of an election, as prescribed by these regulations, the returning officer may, on the written request of a candidate setting out the reasons for the request, or of his own motion, make a recount of the votes cast.
  - (2) Where the returning officer refuses the request of a candidate to make a recount of votes cast, the candidate may, prior to the publication of the result of the election, appeal in writing to the Minister to direct a recount and the Minister may allow or dismiss the appeal.
  - (3) Where the Minister allows an appeal under this regulation, he shall direct the returning officer to make a recount and the returning officer shall comply with that direction.
  
- Equal votes. 26. Where on any count two or more candidates receive an equal number of votes, the returning officer shall decide, by lot, which of them is defeated.
  
- Disputes. 27. Any dispute arising out of the conduct of an election shall be referred by the returning officer to the Minister and the decision of the Minister in that regard shall be final and conclusive.
  
- Security of ballot papers. 28. (1) On completion of the scrutiny and count of votes, the returning officer shall enclose in one packet all voting papers that were admitted to the count, in another packet all counterfoils relating to those voting papers and in a third packet all rejected votes; and thereupon seal the several packets and endorse on each of them the date of the election and the description and number of the contents and sign the endorsement.
  - (2) The returning officer shall hold the sealed packets referred to in subregulation (1) in his custody together with all other documents used at, or in connection with, an election, for a period of three months after the day of the election when the packets and documents shall be destroyed.
  
- Result of election. 29. The returning officer shall declare the candidate to whom the greatest number of votes have been allocated to be elected and shall prepare and forward to the Minister and the Board a statement showing the result of each election and the name of the candidate elected, and shall cause the result of the election to be notified in the *Government Gazette* and in at least one issue of the newspaper known as *The West Australian*.
  
- False statements prohibited. 30. A person shall not make a false statement in any application to have his name entered on an electoral roll as a prescribed participant or as a representative of a corporate body that is a prescribed participant, or in any nomination or voting paper, in respect of any election that is held, or that is to be held, under these regulations.
  - Penalty: One hundred dollars.

In these regulations the Education Act Regulations, 1960 as reprinted and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 19th March, 1971 pursuant to the Reprinting of Regulations Act, 1954, and amended from time to time thereafter by notices so published are referred to as the principal regulations.
- Reg. 3 amended. 2. Regulation 3 of the principal regulations is amended under the heading PART IV.—TEACHERS.—
- (a) by adding after “Division 5.—Resignation and Retirement—Regulations 85-86.” the following—  
“Division 5A.—Dismissal for Inefficiency—Regulation 86A.” ; and
- (b) in Division 6 by deleting “Section A.—General Regulations 86A-90” and substituting the following—  
“Section A.—General Regulations 87-90”.
- Reg. 86A amended. 3. Regulation 86A of the principal regulations is amended by repealing subregulation (2) and substituting the following—
- (2) Where the Director-General receives no less than two reports that a teacher is inefficient the Director-General shall forward a copy of the reports to the teacher and request that the teacher submit a written explanation on the reports within the time specified in the request.
- (2a) Each of the reports referred to in subregulation (2) of this regulation shall come from—
- (a) the principal of the school at which the teacher is employed; or
- (b) a person holding or acting in a position of Superintendent or a higher position,
- and may be given by the same person or by different persons.
- Reg. 185 amended. 4. Regulation 185 of the principal regulations is amended by repealing subregulations (3), (4) and (5) and substituting the following—
- (3) An applicant for the position of senior master or senior mistress in a secondary school shall hold a degree approved by the Director-General or associateship approved by the Director-General, or its equivalent, and where the appointment is made—
- (a) on or before the 31st December, 1981, hold the Teachers’ Certificate and have completed two years’ satisfactory teaching service; or
- (b) on or after the 1st January, 1982, hold the Teachers’ Higher Certificate.
- (4) Notwithstanding anything in subregulation (3) of this regulation, a teacher of art, home economics, manual arts or music is eligible to be appointed a senior master or senior mistress, if the applicant—
- (a) holds a Diploma of the Technical Education Division in his teaching field or its equivalent; and
- (b) where the appointment is made—
- (i) on or before the 31st December, 1981, holds a Teachers’ Certificate and has completed two years’ satisfactory teaching service; or
- (ii) on or after the 1st January, 1982, holds the Teachers’ Higher Certificate.
- (5) For the purposes of paragraph (a) of subregulation (4) of this regulation, the following qualifications shall be accepted as equivalents—
- (a) L. Mus. A; or
- (b) A. Mus. A with the university unit of Musical Education I.

## REGULATIONS.

Principal regulations.

1. In these regulations the regulations made under the provisions of the Coal Mines Regulation Act, 1946-1976, published in the *Government Gazette* on the 19th September, 1947, reprinted pursuant to the Reprinting of Regulations Act, 1954, in the *Government Gazette* on the 3rd May, 1962, and amended from time to time thereafter by notices so published, are referred to as the principal regulations.

## 2. Regulation 215 of the principal regulations is amended—

## (a) by deleting subregulation (1) and substituting the following subregulation—

(1) Any employee who meets with an accident arising out of or in the course of his employment shall immediately give notice of the nature and cause of the accident to the person nearest him, and as soon as practicable to an official of the mine and shall within fourteen days of ceasing work as a result of such accident send or cause to be sent a notice, in writing, to the secretary of the accident committee giving full particulars as to the time and date of the accident, and the circumstances attending such accident, together with the certificates referred to in subregulations (1) and (2) of regulation 216, or the claim shall not be entertained and the secretary of the accident committee shall forthwith notify the Inspector of Mines for the district of such accident and of the nature thereof as reported to him. ; and

## (b) by deleting subregulation (3) and substituting the following subregulation—

(3) The maximum allowances which may be paid from the fund shall be fixed from time to time by the Minister and shall relate to the following circumstances—

## (a) where disablement results from a personal injury by accident, or from a disease, for which workers compensation is received under the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912 as amended, a fortnightly sum, or a daily rate for every working day from the date of the accident, shall be paid. Such payment shall only be made and continued on the certificate of a qualified medical practitioner that the employee is unable to work.

Where the employee attains the age of retirement during the continuance of the disablement, his right to be paid the allowance under this regulation shall thereupon determine and payment of the allowance shall cease. In the event of an employee being permanently disabled he shall, on the certificate of a qualified medical practitioner, be granted a sum not exceeding the amount fixed by the Minister for such a claim at the date of payment, in satisfaction of all claims. A person shall be deemed to be disabled when he is wholly incapacitated from attending to his ordinary occupation;

## (b) where death results from an accident or from a disease for which compensation is received under the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912 as amended and if the deceased was married—

(i) such fortnightly sum as is fixed from time to time by the Minister shall be payable to the widow, if any, until she remarries; and

(ii) such fortnightly sum as is fixed from time to time by the Minister shall be payable to each child, if any, of the deceased until such child attains the age of sixteen years or dies, which sum is, subject to subregulation (ba), to be paid to the widow, if any, during her life, or if there is no widow, or the widow dies while any such sum is payable, to the guardian or person having the care of such child;

## (ba) if the committee considers that any allowance payable to a widow or such other person as is specified in subparagraph (ii) of paragraph (b) for or in respect of a child would not be or is not being properly expended or used for the benefit of the child, it may recommend to the trustees the payment of such allowance to such other person as it may think fit for the sole benefit of the child and the trustees may make such payment to such other person.
