# Schedule. REGULATIONS.

Principal 1. In these regulations the Food and Drug Regulations, 1961 as published in the regulations. *Government Gazette* on the 4th January, 1962 and thereafter amended from time

- to time by notices so published, are referred to as the principal regulations.
  - Regulation A.01 of the principal regulations is amended—

     (a) by adding after the interpretation "common name" in subregulation A.01.001, the following interpretation—
    - "component" means any substance including a food additive used in the manufacture or preparation of an ingredient and present in the final product in a primary or modified form; ;
  - (b) by adding after the interpretation "grams per kilogram (g/kg)" in subregulation A.01.001, the following interpretation—
    - "ingredient" means any substance including a food additive used in the manufacture or preparation of a food and present in the final product in a primary or modified form; ;
  - (c) by substituting for subparagraph (iii) of paragraph (b) of subregulation A.01.002, the following subparagraph—
    - (iii) any statement of ingredients or components required by this regulation; ; and
  - (d) by adding after subregulation A.01.002 the following subregulations-
    - A.01.002.001. Date Marking of Packaged Foods.
      - For the purposes of subregulations A.01.002.001 to A.01.002.009-
        - "date of minimum durability" in relation to a packaged food, means the date which signifies the end of the minimum durable life of that food;
        - "date of packaging" means the date on which food is placed in the immediate container in which it will be sold;
        - "longer life foods" means foods with a minimum durable life of more than 90 days;
        - "minimum durable life" means that period beginning on the date of packaging, during which a packaged food, when stored under any conditions stated on the label in accordance with the provisions of paragraphs (h) and (j) of subregulation A.01.002.004, will retain any specific qualities for which implicit or explicit claims are made;
        - "packaged food" means any food that is packed or enclosed in a package for sale as a single item and includes food packaged from bulk at the place where food is retailed but does not include food weighed, counted or measured and wrapped in the presence of the purchaser;
        - "short life foods" means those foods with a minimum durable life of less than 90 days;
        - "use by" followed by a date means the date after which food stored under any conditions stated on the label in accordance with the provisions of paragraphs (h) and (j) of subregulation A.01.002.004 shall not be used.
    - A.01.002.002. Date Marking of Short Life Foods.

(a) Subject to the provisions of this subregulation, the label of every package of short life food shall include one or more of the following---

- (i) date of packaging;
- (ii) date of minimum durability;
- (iii) the "use by" date.

(b) The date marking requirements of those short life foods listed in column 1 of Schedule 1 in subregulation A.01.002.005 shall be modified by the insertion of the date statement set out opposite in column 2 using the form of expression of the date set out opposite in column 3.

(c) The date to be included in the label of short life foods in accordance with paragraphs (a) and (b) of this subregulation shall be expressed in the following manner—

- (i) the day of the month shall be first and shall be expressed as two digit figures (the first nine days of the month being preceded by a zero);
- (ii) the month shall be shown in figures after the day; or in the first three letters of the month, either before or after the day;
- (iii) where the year is shown it shall be last and shall be expressed in figures by at least the last two numerals of the year.

(d) Where the date of packaging is the sole date applied to short life food it shall be accompanied by a statement of the minimum durable life of the packaged food in the following form:

"MINIMUM DURABLE LIFE (and here insert the number of days, weeks or months).".

(e) This subregulation does not apply to the short life foods set out in Schedule 2 in subregulation A.01.002.006.

A.01.002.003. Date Marking of Longer Life Foods.

(a) The label of every package of the longer life foods set out in Schedule 3 in subregulation A.01.002.007 shall include one or more of the following-

(i) date of packaging;

(ii) date of minimum durability;

(iii) the "use by" date.

(b) The date to be included in the label of longer life foods in accordance with paragraph (a) of this subregulation shall be expressed in the following manner—

(i) the month shall be shown first either in figures or in the first three letters of the month;

(ii) the year shall be shown after the month and shall be expressed in figures by at least the last two numerals of the year; and

(iii) the day of the month may be shown.

(c) Where the date of packaging is the sole date applied to longer life food it may be accompanied by a statement of the minimum durable life of the packaged food in the following form:

"MINIMUM DURABLE LIFE (and here insert the number of days, weeks or months).".

A.01.002.004. Date Marking-Labelling.

(a) Subject to paragraph (b) of this subregulation date marking statements in the label of a packaged food shall be in distinct colour contrast to the ground and in boldface sans serif capital letters with a face depth of not less than 3 mm.

(b) Where date marking statements are embossed or impressed and are not in colour contrast to the ground the statement shall be in boldface sans serif capital letters with a face depth of not less than 4.5 mm.

(c) The date of packaging in the label of a packaged food shall be in conformity with one of the following statements:

"PACKAGING DATE (with the relevant date added.)" or

"PACKED ON (with the relevant date added).".

(d) The date of minimum durability in the label of a packaged food shall be in conformity with the following statement:

"BEST BEFORE (with the relevant date added).".

(e) The "use by" date in the label of a packaged food shall be in conformity with the following statement:

"USE BY (with the relevant date added).".

(f) A person shall not use date marking statements in the labelling of a packaged food or in advertising a packaged food other than those statements prescribed by this regulation, but those provisions do not preclude the addition of a manufacturer's or packer's code.

(g) The date marking statement in the label of a packaged food prescribed by this regulation shall not be removed, altered, erased or superimposed.

(b) Subject to paragraph (j) of this subregulation and Schedules 1 and 2 in subregulations A.01.002.005 and A.01.002.006 the label of packaged short life food shall clearly and legibly state the conditions of storage required to ensure that the date of minimum durability or the "use by" date of the packaged food is that stated on the label.

(j) A storage statement is not necessary on packaged food when specific storage conditions are not required to achieve the stated minimum durable life of the food.

(k) A person who sells packaged food to which this regulation applies shall store such food in accordance with the storage conditions on the label. **A.01.002.005.**

# A.01.002.008. Ingredient Labelling.

There shall be written in the label on or attached to every package of food in addition to any other prescribed labelling requirements in these regulations, a statement of the ingredients or components, or both, of the packaged food in the following form-

- (a) Subject to paragraph (b) of this subregulation, all the ingredients and where required by this regulation, the components of a packaged food shall be declared in a statement on the label by the use of common names in descending order of their relative proportions.
- (b) The following modified labelling requirements apply to certain packaged foods-
  - (i) where the food contains an ingredient in a dehydrated or concentrated form the position of that ingredient in the in-gredient list shall be determined by its reconstituted mass as present in that food;
  - (ii) where any dehydrated or concentrated food is intended to be reconstituted according to the directions stated in the label, the ingredients and components may be listed in descending order or proportion in the reconstituted food provided that the list is headed by the statement:

# "INGREDIENTS WHEN RECONSTITUTED";

- (iii) where the common name of the food is the same as the statement of ingredients, the common name shall satisfy the requirements for ingredient labelling;
- (iv) the following categories of packaged foods are deemed to be exempted from ingredient labelling requirements-
  - (I) alcoholic beverages;
  - (II) cheese other than processed cheese, cheese spread, club cheese, potted cheese, luncheon cheese, cheese paste or cheese mixture;
  - (III) essences, in so far as flavour components are concerned;
  - (IV) soft drinks in glass bottles where there is no other label required than a crown seal;
  - $(\mathbf{V})$ where the package containing the food has a total surface area of less than 100 square centimetres.

# Schedule-continued.

- (c) Where the common name of an ingredient or component adequately describes that ingredient or component, the common name shall satisfy the requirement for ingredient labelling.
- (d) Where an ingredient of a food has more than one component the statement of ingredients shall include the common names of the components and the names of the components shall appear in the statement of ingredients in the order of the proportions of the components present in the food, but when the ingredient of a food is standardised by regulation, the components of that food need not be stated (except in the case where that food is of the kind made in conformity with regulation A.12. Foods Not Elsewhere Standardised).
- (e) The following names may be used in place of the equivalent common name to identify ingredients or components animal fats (provided that lard and pork fat are declared separ
  - ately); animal oils; broth; fruit; herbs; milk fat; mixed dried fruit; pectin; spices; starches (except modified starches); total milk solids non-fat; vegetables;
  - vegetable fats; vegetable oils,

specify the ingredient or component.

(f) Where an ingredient of a food is a food additive, that ingredient shall be identified in the list of ingredients by the use of the appropriate functional class name listed hereunder—

and these class names may be qualified by placing in brackets after the functional class name the specific name of the food additive.

- (g) Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph (a) of this subregulation where water is added to a food as an ingredient or component it shall be declared in the statement of ingredients in the following form—
  - (i) by the words "water added" at the bottom of the list; and
  - (ii) by the word "broth" where it forms part of the broth as listed in the ingredients.
- (h) Any emphasis or statement in relation to any particular ingredient or ingredients in the packaged food shall not be made unless a clear statement of the proportion of such ingredients is made.
- (i) Notwithstanding that ingredient labelling is not required in relation to a food, where a statement of ingredients is made in a label on that food then the ingredients shall be listed in descending order or proportion and without any qualifying statement other than as prescribed in paragraphs (f) and (h).
- (j) Ingredient labelling statements in the label of a packaged food shall be in distinct colour contrast to the ground in boldface sans serif capital letters with a face depth of not less than 1.5 mm.

### A.01.002.009.

There shall be written, embossed or otherwise permanently marked in the label on or attached to every article of packaged food, in code or in clear such information as to identify the producing factory and the production lot involved.




