PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS it is enacted by subsection (2) of section 15 and subsections (2) and (3) of section 152 of the Petroleum Act, 1967, that notwithstanding the Land Act, 1933, or any other Act the Governor, by proclamation, may declare that any land of the Crown or part thereof reserved for or dedicated to any public purpose under any Act and howsoever classified that:

- (a) is not Crown land within the meaning of that expression in section 5 of that Act; and
- (b) is specified in the proclamation,

is Crown land for the purposes of the Petroleum Act, 1967, and is land to which that Act applies, so long as the proclamation remains in force: Now, therefore, I the Lieutenant Governor and Administrator, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in the exercise of the powers under subsection (2) of section 15 of the Petroleum Act, 1967, do hereby declare that the land of the Crown comprising Reserve Nos. 26399 and 24923 classified as Class "C" and set apart for the purpose of the use and benefit of Aborigines pursuant to the provisions of the Land Act, 1933, is Crown land for the purposes of the Petroleum Act, 1967, and is land to which the Petroleum Act, 1967, applies so long as this proclamation remains in force, subject to:—

- (i) the unnecessary destruction of timber stands being avoided;
- (ii) the use of a bulldozer being subject to the following:
 - (a) Traverses being cleared through spinifex country.
 - (b) Traverses being cleared through scrub provided dozer blades are kept just clear of the ground to avoid unnecessary destruction of flora.
 - (c) Traverses through timber stands being cut by hand.
- (iii) The clearing of hilltops, steep slopes and the banks of channels and depressions being avoided and all stands of well formed mulga trees being avoided so far as is possible.
- (iv) Such measures being taken as are reasonably practicable to assist in the rehabilitation of the area to its natural state with any topsoil removed being retained and replaced evenly over disturbed areas and all holes, pits, trenches and other disturbances made to the surface of the land during operations being filled in.

Local Government Act, 1960-1979.

ORDERS IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 288 of the Local Government Act, 1960-1979, it shall be lawful for the Governor, on request by a Council of a Municipal District, by Order published in the *Government*

Gazette to declare any lands reserved or acquired for use by the public or used by the public as a street, way, public place, bridge or thoroughfare, under the care, control, and management of the Council, or lands comprised in a private street, constructed and maintained to the satisfaction of the Council, or lands comprised in a private street of which the public has had uninterrupted use for a period of not less than ten years, as a public street and if the Council thinks fit, that the Governor shall declare the width of carriageway and footpaths of the public street; and whereas the Councils mentioned in the schedule hereto have requested that certain lands named and described in the said schedule, which have been reserved for streets within the said Councils, be declared public streets: Now therefore, the Lieutenant Governor and Administrator, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby declare the said lands to be public streets and such land shall, from the date of this Order, be absolutely dedicated to the public as streets within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force.

- (6) By adding a new Table—TABLE IV to the Scheme Text entitled:
"Special Rural Zones—Provisions relating to Specified Areas" in the form of a schedule with two columns (a) and (b) such that the specified area of locality is identified under column (a) and the provisions which refer specifically to that area are set out under column (b).
- (7) By adding a new part—Part VIII—Special Rural Zones, General Provisions—
7.1 Special Rural Zone: The following provisions shall apply specifically to all land included in the Special Rural Zone in addition to any provisions which are more generally applicable to such land under this Scheme—
(a) The objective of the Special Rural Zone is to select areas wherein closer subdivision will be permitted to provide for such uses as hobby farms, horse breeding, rural residential retreats, intensive agriculture including market gardening and viticulture, and also to make provision for the retention of the rural landscape and amenity in a manner consistent with the orderly and proper planning of such areas.
(b) The provisions of controlling subdivision, land uses and development relating to specific Special Rural Zones will be as laid down in Table No. IV of the Scheme, and future subdivisions will accord with the plan of subdivision for the specified area referred to in the Table and such plan of subdivision will form part of the Scheme.

Before making provision for a Special Rural Zone, Council will prepare, or require the owners to prepare a submission supporting the creation of Special Rural Zone and such submission shall include:—

- (i) A statement as to the purpose or intent for which the zone is being created.

- (ii) The reasons for selecting the particular area the subject of the proposed zone with particular reference as to how this relates to Council's Rural Planning Strategy.
 - (iii) A plan or plans showing contours at such intervals as to adequately depict the land form of the area and physical features such as existing buildings, rock outcrops, trees or groups of trees, lakes, rivers, swamps, orchards, wells and significant improvements.
 - (iv) Information regarding the method whereby it is proposed to provide a potable water supply to each lot.
 - (v) The proposed staging of the subdivision and development and the criteria to be met before successive stages are implemented.
- (c) The Scheme provisions for a specific Special Rural Zone shall include a plan of subdivision showing:—
- (i) The proposed ultimate subdivision including lot sizes and dimensions.
 - (ii) Areas to be set aside for Public Open Space, pedestrian accessways, horse trails, community facilities, etc., as may be considered appropriate.
 - (iii) Those physical features it is intended to conserve.
 - (iv) The proposed staging of subdivision where relevant.
- (d) In addition to the plan of subdivision, the Scheme provisions for a specific Special Rural Zone shall specify:—
- (i) The facilities which the purchasers of the lots will be required to provide (e.g. their own potable water supply, liquid disposal system, etc.).
 - (ii) Proposals for the control of land uses and development which will ensure that the purpose and intent of the zone and the rural environment and amenities are not impaired.
 - (iii) Any special provisions appropriate to secure the objectives of the zone.
- (e) (i) No dwelling unit shall be constructed or approved for construction unless a minimum of 90 000 litre roof water storage tank is incorporated in the approved plans, and no dwelling unit shall be considered fit for human habitation unless such a tank has been installed and is operating.
This clause shall not apply where:—
- (a) The lots created within the zone are supplied by normal water supply authority mains.
 - (b) The developer has produced evidence from some competent professional authority which satisfies Council that an adequate potable on-site water supply is available.

- (ii) The siting of any underground source of water supply extraction fixture shall require the approval of Council.
- (iii) The disposal of liquid and solid waste shall be carried out by the installation of a sewerage disposal system, as approved by Council's Senior Health Surveyor.
- (iv) The minimum distance between an effluent disposal point and an underground water supply extraction fixture shall be 30.48 metres.
- (v) Council may, at its discretion, require tree planting to be carried out by the owner of the land. The number of trees (existing and to be planted) shall be calculated by determining the length of the street alignment (in metres) and dividing it by four. The trees shall be planted within the area that is located within 25 metres from the road alignment or where specified by Council.
- (vi) Road carriageways within the Special Rural Zone shall be bituminised to a width of 6.1 metres with shoulders of 1.22 metres. Culverts shall be provided where considered necessary by Council.
- (vii) The Council may, by notice served upon individual landowners or upon a subdivider of land within this Zone require the preservation of groups of trees and thereafter no landowner or subdivider shall cut, remove or otherwise destroy any tree or trees so specified unless the Council rescinds the notice or order.
- (viii) Notwithstanding the provisions of the Scheme and what may be shown on the plan of subdivision specified in Table IV, the Town Planning Board may approve a minor variation to the subdivisional design and the amalgamation of the lots, but further breakdown of the lots so created shall be deemed to be contrary to the provisions of the Scheme.
- (ix) In considering an application to build a dwelling house or other structure on a lot situated within the area mentioned in Column A, Council will have regard to:
- (a) The compatibility of the proposed building with other buildings in the immediate locality, if any; and
 - (b) The compatibility of the proposed building with the immediate general environment.
- (x) The Council may, at its discretion, restrict the clearing of flora within a distance of 25 metres from any road alignment except for the following purposes:—
- (a) Complying with the requirements of the Bush Fires Act, 1954 (as amended); and
 - (b) The construction of a vehicular accessway.

Front Setback: 30 metres.

- (1) The accounts or group accounts and the report shall show all amounts required to be shown to the nearest thousand dollars (hereinafter called "the rounding off"); provided that where an amount as a result of the rounding off be reduced to zero, that amount shall be shown to the nearest dollar by way of a note to the accounts, group accounts or report as the case may require.
- (2) The accounts and group accounts and report shall clearly indicate on each page thereof that rounding off to the nearest thousand dollars has been adopted.
- (3) Where the figures for a current year are rounded off comparative figures shall also be rounded off.
- (4) The report shall state that the company is a company of the kind specified in the Schedule to this Order and that the amounts have been rounded off in accordance with this Order.

Order in respect of disclosure in accounts of companies acting as Trustees.

WHEREAS I, David Arthur Evans, Deputy Commissioner for Corporate Affairs in the State of Western Australia am of the opinion in respect of each of the companies specified in the Schedule hereto that compliance with the requirements of subclauses (2) and (4) of clause 5 of the Ninth Schedule to the Companies Act, 1961-1979 (hereinafter called (3)—95011

"the Act") relating to the form and content of accounts or group accounts would impose an unreasonable burden on the company insofar as those provisions require it to disclose in its accounts—

- (a) liabilities incurred by the company whilst acting as trustee or in any representative capacity to the extent to which the company has a valid and subsisting right of indemnity out of any assets in respect of such liabilities and such assets are sufficient to satisfy such right of indemnity; and
- (b) assets, consisting of the value, if any, of any such right of indemnity arising from the incurring of such liabilities.

Now therefore pursuant to the powers conferred upon me by section 162C (2) of the Act I hereby order subject to the condition appearing below that the directors of each of the companies specified in the schedule hereto, are relieved until 30th June, 1981, from the requirements of subclauses (2) and (4) of clause 5 of the Ninth Schedule to the Act in relation to the disclosure in the accounts of each company of
