Review of Australian Patent System.

THE Industrial Property Advisory Committee is undertaking a comprehensive review of the Australian patent system. The broad thrust of the inquiry is to study, from the viewpoint of the Australian national interest, whether the Australian patent system as presently operating sufficiently advances Australia's technological development and whether there are ways in which it may be made to do so more effectively.

The terms of reference for the review, which was referred to the Committee by the Minister for Productivity in October, 1979, are to examine:

- how the patent system can best contribute to the efficiency and progressiveness of the Australian economy and the adequacy of the system in meeting the needs of Australia with respect to the development and exploitation of new and existing technology;
- any changes required to legislation and administrative procedures to make the patent system less complex and more responsive to needs.
- how patent legislation can be co-ordinated with other industrial and economic policy measures.
- whether there are restrictive practices in the exercise and licencing of patents in Australia, whether it is desirable in the public interest to prohibit by law such practices, and whether the present legislation is adequate for that purpose.
- the conditions necessary for Australia to maximise benefit from participation in the international development of patent systems.
- the ways to maximise access to and utilisation of patent information including an assessment of how information sources can be co-ordinated with other sources of technological and business information.

Interested persons, organisations and associations are invited to make written submissions on any matter within the above terms of reference before 31st December, 1980. It is probable that the Committee will invite comments on particular topics,

COPPLESTONE DEVELOPMENT SCHEME.

THE Shire of Dardanup under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon it in that behalf by the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended) hereby makes the following Town Planning Scheme.

Citation.

1. This Town Planning Scheme may be cited as Shire of Dardanup Town Planning Scheme No. 4—Copplestone Development Scheme.

Responsible Authority.

2. The authority responsible for enforcing the observance of this Scheme is the Shire of Dardanup.

Interpretation.

3. (1) In this Scheme unless the context otherwise requires—

“Act” means the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928;

“Board” means the Town Planning Board of Western Australia;

“building envelope” means an area of a lot shown as such on the Scheme Map and depicted on a plan or diagram of survey in accordance with Clause 11 outside which building development is not permitted;

“clause” means a clause of the Scheme;

“Council” means the Shire of Dardanup;

“District Scheme” means Shire of Dardanup Town Planning Scheme No. 3—District Scheme published in the *Government Gazette* of the 16th March, 1979;

“final approval of the Board” in relation to the subdivision of land means the approval of the Board to a plan or diagram of survey depicting the lots created or to be created by the subdivision of the land after all (if any) conditions imposed by the Board have been carried out;

“Scheme” means this Town Planning Scheme;

“Scheme Area” means the area defined in Clause 5;

“Scheme Costs” means the costs described in Clause 23;

“subclause” means a subclause of the clause in which the term is used;

“tree preservation area” means an area of a lot shown as such on the Scheme Map and depicted on a plan or diagram of survey in accordance with Clause 11 within which, subject to the provisions of the Scheme, no indigenous trees or vegetation may be removed.

(3) A reference to an Act of Parliament or to a section of an Act of Parliament shall be construed as including a reference to any amendment thereto or re-enactment thereof for the time being in force and to all by-laws and regulations made thereunder for the time being in force.

(4) Headings are for reference purposes only and shall not affect the construction of this Scheme Text.

Maps.

4. The following maps are attached to and form part of the Scheme:—

Land Use Map.
Scheme Map.

Scheme Area.

5. The Scheme applies to the whole of the land contained within the inner edge of a broken black line on the Land Use Map and the Scheme Map.

General Objects.

6. The general objects of the Scheme are:—

- (a) to facilitate and encourage the orderly and progressive subdivision and development of the land within the Scheme Area for rural retreats, with particular emphasis on the keeping and stabling of horses;

- (b) to co-ordinate and control development within the Scheme Area so that any new development will have minimal detrimental effect on the visual and rural amenity of the area;

- (c) to plan and make provision for roads, public open space and bridle paths within the Scheme Area;

- (d) to make provision for the apportionment of Scheme Costs amongst owners in an equitable manner.

Zoning.

7. The land within the Scheme Area is situated within a smallholding Development Area as classified by the District Scheme.

Method of Carrying Out Objects.

8. As and when owners of land within the Scheme Area subdivide or develop their land the subdivision or development shall be according to a plan which will be capable of forming part of an overall plan of subdivision and development for the Scheme Area.

9. (1) The Scheme Map indicates an acceptable method of subdivision and development of the Scheme Area.

(2) The Council may with the consent of the Town Planning Board permit departures from the design shown on the Scheme Map if it considers the proposed subdivisional design or proposed development to be of a similar standard to that shown but no departure from the design shown on the Scheme Map shall be permitted if in the opinion of the Council it would impede the subdivision or development of the Scheme Area as a whole or of the sub-area in which the land is situated.

Subdivision and Development.

10. An owner of land within the Scheme Area who desires to subdivide or develop his land either alone or in conjunction with another owner or owners shall submit a plan of the proposed subdivision or development to the Council and if the proposal involves subdivision he shall submit to the Town Planning Board a plan of subdivision in conformity with the Scheme Map with such modifications as are permitted by the Council under Clause 9.

11. Prior to applying for or obtaining the final approval of the Board to the subdivision the owner shall—

- (a) submit to the Council a copy of the plan or diagram of survey relating to the subdivision on which are accurately depicted with all appropriate dimensions—

- (i) all existing drains;

- (ii) the building envelopes shown on and in accordance with the Scheme Map;

- (iii) the tree preservation areas shown on and in accordance with the Scheme Map;

- (b) make arrangements with the State Energy Commission for access to the land for the purpose of maintenance of any electric power lines, pillars, poles, pylons and fittings that are situated on the land.

New Roads.

12. Subject to the provisions hereof all new roads shall be constructed and drained at the expense of the owners of the land in which such roads are situated and each owner shall when subdividing his land make the land available for the roads and pay the costs of the construction and drainage of the roads within the land owned by him.

13. Where because of the situation of a new road within the Scheme Area the Council is of the opinion that it would be fair and equitable that the owners of land adjoining or served by the road, other than the Council, should each contribute to the cost of the construction and drainage of the

road and the value of the land made available therefore and the owners are unable to agree upon the proportion of the costs and the value of the land payable by them respectively the amount (if any) payable by each owner shall be determined by arbitration in manner hereinafter provided and the owners shall make the payments required to be made according to the award of the arbitrator.

14. The Council may construct and drain any new roads and acquire the land necessary for that purpose and if the Council does so prior to the subdivision of the lands adjoining the road the costs of the construction and drainage of the road and all compensation and other costs consequent upon the acquisition of the land shall be paid to the Council by each owner of land in accordance with the foregoing provisions upon the final approval of the Town Planning Board to the subdivision of his land or after having been served with not less than three months' notice from the Council calling upon him to make such payment whichever first happens.

15. If an owner subdivides his land and he or his predecessors in title have claimed or been paid compensation by reason of the resumption by the Council of the land for a new road he shall before the final approval by the Town Planning Board to his plan of subdivision release the Council from the compensation claimed or repay to the Council the amount of compensation paid by it to him or his predecessors in title as the case may be.

Public Open Space.

16. It is intended that the land coloured light green and shown as Recreation and as Bridle Paths on the Scheme Map will be reserved for public open space.

17. When subdividing his land each owner shall upon the final approval of the Board to the subdivision vest in the Crown pursuant to section 20A of the Act so much of his land as is coloured light green on the Scheme Map and thereon shown as Recreation or a Bridle Path.

Development.

18. Except where otherwise expressly provided, Clauses 19 to 21 of this Scheme do not affect the operation of Clauses 3.14.1, 3.14.2, 3.16.5, 3.16.6 and 3.16.8 of the District Scheme.

19. A person who wishes to carry out development on any land within the Scheme Area shall make application to the Council for planning consent to commence development as required by and in accordance with the District Scheme.

20. In considering and making its decision on an application for planning consent to commence development on land within the Scheme Area the Council shall take into consideration the following matters—

- (a) the colour and type of materials to be used;
- (b) the architectural style and the general appearance of the proposed building;
- (c) any other factors which in the opinion of the Council may detract from the rural landscape or amenity of the Scheme Area.

21. Notwithstanding the provisions of Clause 3.14.1 (k) of the District Scheme the Council may grant its approval to the erection of a building outside the building envelope if the Council is satisfied that another location would be less detrimental to the preservation of the landscape or the environment. If the Council gives its approval under this clause a person shall not carry out any development otherwise than on the portion of the lot designated by the Council in granting its approval.

Tree Preservation Areas.

22. A person shall not without the prior approval of the Council damage, fell or remove a tree in a tree preservation area except—

- (a) a tree that is dead or is diseased and likely to die;
- (b) for the purpose of clearing a fire break;

- (c) a tree contained within a building envelope or other approved location for a building which in the opinion of the Council would unreasonably obstruct or interfere with the erection of a dwelling house or an out-building.

Scheme Costs.

23. The costs or estimated costs of the following items are the Scheme Costs:—

- (a) the costs of preparation and administration of the Scheme including an amount to reimburse the Council for all overhead, supervision and management costs it may incur in the preparation and implementation of the Scheme and including all legal costs, planning costs, payments to planning consultants, engineering consultants and other professional consultants, and valuation costs;
- (b) the cost (if any) to the Council of the construction and drainage of roads and the acquisition of land for roads;
- (c) all compensation payable and all costs and expenses of determining and settling compensation;
- (d) all other costs and expenses which the Council is required to meet in order to implement and complete the Scheme.

Payment of Scheme Costs.

24. Each owner's proportion of Scheme Costs is the proportion of the total Scheme Costs calculated in the ratio which the total area of the owner's land within the Scheme Area bears to the total area of land within the Scheme Area.

25. Each owner of land within the Scheme Area shall prior to the final approval of the Town Planning Board to the subdivision of the land pay to the Council the owner's proportion of the Scheme Costs, but the Council shall not demand or seek to enforce payment before the date upon which the owner makes application to the Board for that final approval.

Powers and Authorities of Council.

26. In carrying out the provisions of the Scheme the Council has the following powers and authorities:—

- (a) to enter and inspect any land within the Scheme Area;
- (b) to make agreements with the owners or occupiers of any land within the Scheme area;
- (c) to enter into agreements with purchasers or prospective purchasers or prospective occupiers of land within the Scheme Area;
- (d) to enter into agreements with the Crown and any department of the State with reference to the carrying out of any of the objects or works of the Scheme;
- (e) to extend the time within which payments are to be made to the Council and agree to the securing of such payments.

27. One month's written notice is hereby prescribed as the notice to be given pursuant to section 10 of the Act before the Council exercises the powers conferred by that section—

- (a) to remove, pull down or alter any building or other work in the Scheme Area, which has been commenced or continued after the gazettal date and which is such as to contravene the Scheme, and in the erection or carrying out of which any provision of the Scheme has not been complied with;
- (b) to execute any work which it is the duty of any person to execute under the Scheme, in any case where it appears to the Council that delay in the execution of the work would prejudice the efficient operation of the Scheme

and any expenses incurred by the Council under that section may be recovered from the person in default in a court of competent jurisdiction.

Claims for Compensation.

28. The time within which a person may make a claim for compensation pursuant to section 11 of the Act is six (6) months after the date when notice of the approval of this Scheme is published in the manner prescribed in the regulations made under the Act.

ARBITRATION AND APPEAL ACT, 1979.

Government School Teachers' Tribunal.

Misc. Appeal No. 6/80.

Date of hearing 24th day of June, 1980.

In the matter of the Government Teachers Arbitration and Appeal Act, 1979, and an application by the State School Teachers' Union of Western Australia claiming (i) provision of 1/5 time for duties other than teaching for primary school teachers and (ii) provision for teaching principals, teachers-in-charge of Class IV schools and senior assistants to be free from teaching at least 1/3 time to allow for administrative duties.

Decision of Tribunal.

An application by the State School Teachers' Union of Western Australia claiming (i) provision of 1/5 time for duties other than teaching for primary school teachers and (ii) provision for teaching principals, teachers-in-charge of Class IV schools and senior assistants to be free from teaching at least 1/3 time to allow for administrative duties.

Mr. Lloyd appeared for the applicant.

Mr. M. O'Connor appeared for the Hon Minister for Education.

By his answer, the Minister rejected both claims and as to the second of them he appears to say that the time now allowed for administrative duties is adequate. At the hearing however, Mr. O'Connor raised the issue of jurisdiction. He said that the Minister had taken the stand that the allocation of time in respect to duties was the prerogative of the employer and did not fall within the definition of an industrial matter under section 4 of the Act or otherwise. It is not open to the Tribunal to ban argument as to jurisdiction but in fairness to the applicant, it should have been pleaded by the Minister in his answer.

This is an application under the provisions of Part III of the Act. Section 12 provides that—

"The Tribunal has jurisdiction under this part to determine all matters submitted to it with respect to:

- (a) industrial matters relating to teachers;

By section 4

"Industrial matters" means—

- (a) salaries or ranges of salaries, including the incremental steps therein;
- (b) allowances for additional responsibility or additional duty;
- (c) allowances for disabilities and reimbursement of expenses;
- (d) circumstances in which allowances are to be payable and conditions of service to apply in lieu of payment of an allowance,

but does not include such conditions of employment as are prescribed by or under the Education Act, 1928.

Here, the Tribunal is being asked to make a determination as to the time to be allocated for the discharge of different duties by those teachers in the classifications described. The subject matter of the application does not concern salaries, allowances or conditions of service in lieu of allowances and the Tribunal therefore does not have the power to make the determination sought. The objection to the jurisdiction is upheld.

The applicant did offer evidence on the merits as one would expect in the light of the answer to the claim delivered to it and the Tribunal considers that notwithstanding the above ruling some further comment should be made.

In support of the claims three teachers were called and each gave evidence on oath. The first witness was Mrs. Ann-Marie Heine a permanent teacher serving at the Padbury Primary School. She stressed the desirability of having the opportunity to confer with parents under conditions which did not interfere with classroom supervision

and of having time available to facilitate the organising of camps, excursions, in-service courses and school sport. There were children, she told the Tribunal, who did not cope in the general classroom and needed more individual attention. The development of programmes for school based curriculum required teachers in each particular study area to confer and this, Mrs. Heine said, was inhibited by lack of time available to teachers outside classroom teaching duties. In brief, it was the view of this witness that more hours outside the classroom would enhance professional development, improve administrative efficiency and lessen stress. When asked if she had some non-contact time she replied:

"I do have an hour a week at the moment with the use of the art specialist. However I like to be hovering around the art room. I like to see what the children are doing and how they are coping."

The next witness was Darrell William Ward now a senior assistant at the Claremont Primary School and formerly at the Roebourne Primary School. Mr. Ward expressed concern as to the effect of the recent change in the status of his present school. He said:

"The change from Class I to a Class II school this year and possibly because of the district it is in and socio-economic status of the district and its proximity to tertiary institutions—I do not know what the reasons are—there is a tremendous amount of parental pressure for things to be done. Whereas last year the school had a principal who was completely free from classroom duties and two deputies, we are finding that the expectation has not dropped from the parents but the resources to cater with the requests are much less."

As to his time available for duties other than teaching in the classroom he made an estimate of one tenth. In Roebourne where he had to cope with a large aboriginal group within the school, the period was two fifths of his time. He now felt "a bit frustrated because of lack of time available to him for carrying out non-teaching duties. There were resources in the school which he said were not being utilised. He commented:

"We have a fairly extensive library resource centre. The complaint of our support teacher who is in fact the resource teacher—but because again of parental pressure, because we are forced to use him pretty much in that role because of his background, training and so on—is that there is some there which is not being utilised."

Teachers need the time to go and get the material, not just see what is there, and in fact to see whether it is useful in the case of book material."

As did Mrs. Heine, Mr. Ward emphasised the difficulty experienced in getting teachers together because of lack of time within school hours and family commitments outside those hours.

The third witness called was Neville Frank George Bull the principal of Upper Swan Primary which is a Class II school.

Mr. Bull testified that he had three tenths time for administration. In his view that time was "definitely not" sufficient because of the difficulties flowing from the school progressing from Class III to Class II and because he lived so far away from the school he could not do as much work as he wished outside school hours. He said he did not have time to make any material contribution to the gifted children programme for his region. There was insufficient time for internal evaluation. Staff meetings after 3.30 p.m. were not well accepted because all staff members except one were married women. He said he was met with the objection: "We have other commitments, we have to get home."

Mr. Bull was firmly convinced that the claim from primary school teachers was justified. He again responded affirmatively to the suggestion that there had been increasing stress placed on primary school teachers in the last few years.

The reason for that he put as being due to classroom teachers feeling that they have to show more publicly accountability as to what they are doing.

To outline the view of the respondent, Mr. O'Connor called Norman Frederick Trevithick Tredrea, the Assistant Director of Staffing (Primary). From what he said and from the documentary evidence tendered by the applicant there is no doubt that the respondent agrees that it is desirable that teachers to whom this application relates do have time out of the classroom to attend to administrative and other duties. Mr Tredrea referred to support teachers, the introduction of specialist teachers and the staffing policy statements for 1978 and 1980.

In each of the schools to which a witness for the applicant was attached it is clear that the staff could have enjoyed greater non-contact time than they did within the existing staffing framework. In no case however could the resources of the school have provided the degree of non-contact time claimed. If it were within the jurisdiction of the Tribunal to make the orders sought then upon the evidence adduced such orders should not be made. It is not really in issue between the parties that the teachers concerned should have some non-contact time. The dispute is as to the extent of it. The evidence would have to be far more persuasive to justify a finding that primary school teachers should have one day each week and senior assistants and principals of Class IV schools at least 1 2/3 days each week for duties other than classroom teaching.

Nevertheless and in the light of the practice in all other teaching divisions the Tribunal considers that some time for the duties of the nature described in the evidence should be programmed for primary school teachers.

In the matter of an industrial dispute relating to the conditions of employment of teachers of English as a second language to migrants and refugees. Between The State School Teachers' Union of Western Australia (Incorporated), Applicant, and the Hon. Minister for Education, Respondent.

Mr. Lloyd appeared for the applicant.

Mr. O'Connor appeared for the respondent.

Decision.

The claim of the Union as amended is for the inclusion in the conditions of employment of the teachers to whom the dispute refers provisions expressed in these terms:

- (1) A salary for teachers employed in migrant and refugee education should be contained in the Salary determination. It should reflect the level of qualifications and experience in teaching English as a foreign language. The minimum salary should be \$14.70 per hour.
- (2) Contracts of employment for 12 months should be granted to teachers in migrant and refugee education.
- ...
- (5) Compensation should be provided for teachers in migrant and refugee education for out of pocket expenses including travel and meals.

(6) A stipulation should be contained in the determination for payment for teachers in migrant and refugee education to attend seminars and conferences associated with migrant and refugee education.

(7) Sick leave and holiday entitlements similar to those of other teachers should be contained in the determination.

The respondent by his answer says that the current salary rates and other conditions of service applying are appropriate.

The teachers to whom this application relates are all employed as teachers of English as a second language to migrants and refugees. They are employed under contracts of service by the hour. None is employed to work more than 20 hours in one week. The teachers are paid at an hourly rate computed by dividing the current annual salary for Grade 7 of Scale AR by 920 resulting in a rate of \$14.35 per hour at the date of the hearing. These teachers are not eligible for leave holidays or sick leave. The Tribunal was told that there were 146 teachers employed on hourly contracts. The number of hours worked each week varied from 2 to 20. Apart from the lecturer in charge of the section only one other teacher was employed full-time. Where the demand for the services offered fluctuates and it is a matter of difficulty to anticipate what it might be on a long term basis, obviously, the employer must be able to vary the numbers employed at reasonably short notice to obviate over supply or under supply. Nevertheless, the Tribunal finds it is a matter of concern that there are not more full-time teachers employed and more part-time teachers employed with some degree of security not now available.

The Union contends that the work of the teachers has changed because of the different methodology introduced in 1979 and because of the fact that the migrants and refugees now entering the country are not from the traditional sources of the past.

The teachers are now paid at a rate based on the rate known as Technical Education Group Level 4. That rate is the rate which is applied for the teaching of students at the levels of years 8, 9 and 10 in high schools. It is claimed that the appropriate scale is Technical Education Group Level 3. If that claim were granted then the hourly rate would be increased to \$16.50. It is further argued that teachers should be given greater security and that they should be employed for a term of one year and enjoy entitlements to leave and allowances as do teachers who work full time.

The Tribunal considers that it is desirable to provide the opportunity for teachers to work on an annual contract where practicable.

It is acknowledged that some teachers might prefer to retain the present contractual arrangements. From the evidence led it is not reasonably possible to determine how many teachers should be employed yearly or hourly. The Tribunal includes in the award to issue from this decision—terms to apply to teachers employed under a contract for one year and terms for those employed by the hour.

We understand that as to the rates of salaries the parties appreciate that the teacher who is employed for a year should be paid *pro rata* to the annual salary applicable in the proportion the hours worked each week bear to thirty. The formula for determining hourly rates adopted by the respondent produces a result which in the opinion of the Tribunal provides adequately for work outside the classroom and for lack of security.

The Union argues that salary increases should be granted because of change in the nature and presumably the value of the work being carried out and to resolve inequities. It was demonstrated that teachers in Western Australia are being paid less than their counterparts in some other States. As the programmes are funded by the Commonwealth it is contended that there is no justification for teachers here being so disadvantaged. The Tribunal is not bound by decisions of wage fixing authorities of other States but when they relate to materially the same work funded from the same source, they

must have persuasive weight. The Tribunal was advised that the hourly rates paid outside Western Australia were as follows:

The Tribunal considers that it must have proper regard for the guidelines relative to wage claims laid down by the Australian Conciliation and Arbitration Commission. In particular in the case of an application to remove an inequity the matters referred to by the Commission in Clause 7 (d) of the Principles of Wage Determination (see Exhibit 2) are relevant.

In support of the claim Mr. Lloyd called four teachers. Geraldine Margot Walsh the lecturer in charge of the Adult Migrant Education programme at Graylands outlined the work carried out at that centre. She stated that the refugees now being taught lacked the educational background of those received in 1979 and as a result difficulties now confronted teachers which did not previously exist. This witness said that there was a staff of 35 at Graylands of whom 12 had been teaching there for more than 12 months. Marlene Mary Luiten a teacher at the Adult Migrant Centre at Wapet House testified that teachers had to design courses to meet the needs of a wide range of students. Some were unable to read and write in any language. Others were literate in a language in which the Roman alphabet was not used. Alison Molly Hewitt and Catherine Paula Smith supported the evidence of the preceding witnesses and each described her experience in the service.

The only witness called for the respondent was Lennard Dawson Paul Drake-Brockman, the officer in charge of the Adult Migrant/Refugee programme since 1966. He was clearly sympathetic to the claim of his teachers for higher salaries. Mr. Drake-Brockman also said he could not see any impediment to employing a proportion of his staff on yearly contracts.

The Tribunal considers that a case has been made out for improved conditions of employment within the guidelines referred to. An award will now issue providing for two classifications of teachers.

Firstly, part-time teachers being those regularly employed not less than 15 hours nor more than 20 hours each week under a contract of service for one year. The salary for these teachers shall be based on that from time to time fixed for Level 6 of Scale AA of Table 1 (now \$14 370) where the teacher is four or five-year trained. As to all other part-time teachers the salary shall be based on that fixed from time to time for Level 8 of Scale AR of Table II (now \$13 906). In each case the salary actually paid shall be *pro rata* to the base salary in the proportion the hours worked each week bear to 30. Part-time teachers shall be entitled to leave holidays and sick leave as prescribed by or under the Education Act Regulations. It appears that agreement was reached on that matter in the course of the hearing of Salary Appeal No. 1/1979. Reference is made to page 35 of the decision of the Tribunal in that Appeal. Part-time teachers shall also be eligible for increments in salary as provided in Regulation 109 (3).

Secondly, a teacher not being a part-time teacher who is employed to work not more than 20 hours in any week under a contract of service by the hour. Casual teachers shall be paid fortnightly on an hourly rate based on the salary from time to time fixed for Level 8 of Scale AR of Table II. As at the date of the hearing the hourly rate so calculated is \$15.10. Casual workers shall not be entitled to leave holidays and sick leave as granted to part-time workers.

Some evidence was led relating to teachers attending seminars and conferences. If a teacher is directed by the respondent to attend then that teacher is entitled to be paid without any specific

reference to the award. The Tribunal declines to grant the application under this head. Again the Tribunal does not consider that any specific provision in the award should be made as to the claims expressed in paragraph 5.

The salary rates prescribed in the award shall apply from the beginning of the first pay period commencing on or after this reference was filed *viz.* the 2nd day of April, 1980.

It should be noted that the salary scales referred to have been affected by the decision of the National Wage Case handed down on the 14th day of July under which a general increase of 4.2% to operate from the beginning of the first pay period to commence on or after that date was granted.

BEFORE THE GOVERNMENT SCHOOL
TEACHERS' TRIBUNAL.

Award No. M8 of 1980.

Between The State School Teachers' Union of Western Australia (Incorporated), Applicant, and The Minister for Education, Respondent.

THE Tribunal in exercise of the powers conferred on it under section 22 of the Government School Teachers Arbitration and Appeal Act, 1979 doth hereby make the following award in connection with the industrial dispute between the above-named parties.

Award.

1.—Title.

This award shall be known as the Teachers of English (Migrants and Refugees) Award 1980.

2.—Term.

The term of the award shall be for a period of three years from the date hereof.

3.—Scope.

This award shall apply to all part-time teachers and casual teachers (as hereinafter defined) of English as a second language to migrants and refugees.

4.—Definitions.

- (i) "Regulations" means Education Act Regulations, 1960.
- (ii) "The determination" means the determination of the Minister for Education of the 9th December, 1977 (as amended) and as altered by the Government School Teachers' Tribunal.
- (iii) "Part-time teacher" for the purposes of this award means a teacher regularly employed to work not less than 15 hours nor more than 20 hours in each week under a contract of service for one year.
- (iv) "Casual teacher" for the purposes of this award means a teacher, not being a part-time teacher, who is employed to work not more than 20 hours in any week under a contract of service by the hour.

5.—Leave.

A part-time teacher shall be entitled to leave holidays and sick leave as prescribed by or under the regulations provided that payment shall be based on the salary payable to that teacher at the time the benefit is taken.

6.—Salary.

The teachers covered by this award shall be paid at the rates set out in the schedule hereto. Such rates shall apply from the beginning of the first pay period commencing on or after the 23rd day of April, 1980.

7.—Salary increment.

The provisions relating to the eligibility of teachers, not being full-time teachers, for basic salary increment prescribed by or under the regulations shall apply to part-time teachers.

Schedule.

(a) Part-time teachers.

A part-time teacher shall be paid fortnightly at a rate *pro rata* to the rate, from time to time prescribed, for the basic salary level relevant to that teacher in the proportion which the hours worked each week bear to thirty and calculated in accordance with the formula set out in the determination. The basic salary level relevant means:—

- (i) for four and five-year trained teachers—Grade 6 of Scale AA of Table 1 of the determination; and
- (ii) for all other teachers—Grade 8 of Scale AR of Table II of the determination.

(b) Casual teachers.

A casual teacher shall be paid fortnightly for each hour worked at the rate based on the annual salary from time to time prescribed for Grade 8 of Scale AR as aforesaid divided by 920.

GOVERNMENT SCHOOL TEACHERS
ARBITRATION AND APPEALS ACT, 1979.

Government School Teachers' Tribunal.

Misc. Appeal No. 9/1980.

Date of hearing: 23rd day of June, 1980.

In the matter of the Government School Teachers Arbitration and Appeal Act, 1979, and an application by the State School Teachers' Union of Western Australia (Inc.) in relation to a claim that all periods of service as a teacher be included in the calculation of Long Service Leave entitlements and that the requirement for continuity of service under the Long Service Leave Provisions be removed.

Decision of the Tribunal.

An application by the State School Teachers Union of Western Australia (Inc.) in relation to a claim that all periods of service as a teacher be included in the calculation of Long Service Leave entitlements and that the requirement for continuity of service under the Long Service Leave Provisions be removed.

Mr. T. K. Lloyd appeared for the applicant.

Mr. M. O'Connor appeared for the Hon. Minister for Education.

By his answer, the Hon. Minister pleaded, *inter alia*, that the Tribunal did not have jurisdiction to entertain the application because it did not relate to an industrial matter under the provisions of section 4 of the Act. It was agreed by the parties that the issue of jurisdiction be first determined. Under section 12 of the Act, the Tribunal has jurisdiction to determine all matters submitted to it with respect to—

- (a) Industrial matters relating to teachers,

The expression industrial matters is defined by section 4 (1) as follows:

"Industrial Matters" means—

- (a) salaries or ranges of salaries, including the incremental steps therein;
- (b) allowances for additional responsibility or additional duty;
- (c) allowances for disabilities and reimbursement of expenses;
- (d) circumstances in which allowances are to be payable and conditions of service to apply in lieu of payment of an allowance,

but does not include such conditions of employment as are prescribed by or under the Education Act, 1928;

Mr. O'Connor argues that the subject matter of the application is caught by the exclusion because the conditions applying to Long Service Leave are prescribed by regulations made under the Education Act, 1928. Section 28 of that Act empowers the Minister to make regulations relating to leave of absence. Regulation 130 of the Education Act Regulations prescribes the conditions as to entitlement to Long Service Leave. Entitlement is based on continuous service by a teacher and sub-regulation (7) describes the meaning of continuity of service for that purpose. To grant the relief sought by the applicant would have the effect of amending Regulation 130. The Tribunal lacks the power to do so.

The Tribunal is satisfied that Regulation 130 is valid and that it does not have jurisdiction to make the determination sought. The objection of the Minister is upheld and the application is dismissed.
