(AND AMENDMENTS).

By-law No. 60—Care, Control and Management of Parking Facilities.

The Municipality of the City of Perth.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on the 21st day of July, 1980, to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following amendments to By-law No. 60:

1. That paragraphs (iv), (v), (vi) and (vii) of Clause 60 be deleted and the following substituted therefor:
 - (iv) In the case of an offence under Clause 39B where the specified time referred to in that clause is one half hour or less;
 - (a) where the vehicle stands on that part of the road or parking station referred to in that clause for a period of one half hour or less in excess of the specified time—Five dollars (\$5.00);
 - (b) where the vehicle stands on that part of the road or parking station referred to in that clause for a period of more than one half hour in excess of the specified time—Five dollars (\$5.00), with respect to the first one half hour in excess and Five dollars (\$5.00) with respect to any time thereafter:
 - (v) In the case of an offence under Clause 39B where the specified time referred to in that clause is one hour or more:
 - (a) where the vehicle stands on that part of the road or parking station referred to in that clause for a period of one hour or less in excess of the specified time—Five dollars (\$5.00);
 - (b) where the vehicle stands on that part of the road or parking station referred to in that clause for a period of more than one hour in excess of the specified time:—Five dollars (\$5.00), with respect to the first hour in excess and five dollars (\$5.00) with respect to any time thereafter:
 - (vi) In the case of an offence under Clause 7A:—
 - (a) where the vehicle stands in that parking stall for a period of one half hour or less:—Five dollars (\$5.00);
 - (b) where the vehicle stands in that parking stall for more than one half hour—Five dollars (\$5.00), with respect to the first one half hour and five dollars (\$5.00) with respect to any time thereafter;
 - (vii) In any other case—Five dollars (\$5.00).

Part IIIB—Processing Licenses.

THE Public is hereby notified that I have issued a permit to Robin Ray Green, 18 Ashwell Street, Albany, to establish a processing establishment to process fish in pursuance of the provisions of section 35C of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1975, on board licensed fishing boat Helen M, registered number LFB A235, subject to the following conditions:—

That the processing establishment:—

- (1) Shall comply with the requirements of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1975, and all Regulations, Orders in Council, and Notices and Ministerial Directions issued thereunder.
- (2) Shall not be used for the processing of rock lobsters or prawns.
- (3) Shall comply with the requirements of the Health Act, 1911 (amended).
- (4) Shall be registered as an export establishment pursuant to the provisions

of the Export (Fish) Regulations made under the provisions of the Customs Act 1901 (amended) and the Commercial (Trade Descriptions) Act 1905 (amended) of the Parliament of the Commonwealth should it be used to process fish for export.

- (5) Shall not be used for the processing of marron (*Cherax tenuimanus*) unless a license is held under section 39C of the Fisheries Act, 1905.
- (6) Shall not be used for the processing of fish or crustacea caught by any other vessel.

In accordance with the provisions of section 35K, any person aggrieved by this decision may, within fourteen days after publication of this notice, appeal against the decision or order by serving on the Minister for Fisheries and Wildlife, a statement in writing of the grounds of their appeal.

APPLICATIONS are invited under section 117 of the Land Act, 1933-1977 for the leasing of the Boulder Lots listed in the Schedule for the purpose of "Light Industry" for a term of 21 years at the annual rentals shown in the said Schedule.

Intending applicants shall submit with their application an outline plan drawn to scale, showing development proposed within two years from the date of approval of the application.

The Minister for Lands reserves the right to refuse any application on the grounds that no development plans were submitted with such application or that the proposed development is inadequate or unsuitable.

On completion of substantial development to the satisfaction of the Minister for Lands the lessee may surrender this lease in order that the land may be made available in freehold. In this regard it is advised that the lessee should not anticipate freehold title before providing full details of completed development for departmental examination and approval. The price for the land shall be as shown in the Schedule and shall remain valid for a period of 3 years from the date of this notice.

The land is made available for leasing subject to the following conditions:—

- (1) The land shall not be used for any purpose other than "Light Industry" without the prior approval in writing of the Minister for Lands.
- (2) The rent shall be subject to reappraisal at the end of the third year and each successive three year period thereafter.
- (3) The lessee shall not without the previous consent in writing of the Minister for Lands assign, transfer, mortgage, sublet or part with the possession of the demised land.
- (4) The land shall be occupied and used by the lessee for the purpose specified within nine (9) months of the commencement of the lease and thereafter will be continuously so used to the satisfaction of the Minister.
- (5) The lessee shall commence construction within nine (9) months and thereafter continue construction and complete and operate the works within two (2) years from the date of the commencement of the lease.
- (6) All buildings, erections, paving, drainage and other works shall be to the approval of the Local Authority and the lessee shall perform, discharge and execute all requisitions and works unto the demised land as are or may be required by any local or public authority operating under any statute by-law or regulation.
- (7) The lessee shall, within twelve months from commencement of the lease, fence the external boundaries to the satisfaction of the Minister.
- (8) The lessee shall maintain existing and future improvements to the satisfaction of the Minister for Lands.

- (9) All frontages shall be treated and maintained to give an appearance aesthetically pleasing consistent with the purpose of the lease according to a plan submitted to the Minister for Lands.
- (10) The lessee shall indemnify the Minister against all claims for damage to property or persons arising from the use of the land.
- (11) The Minister or his representative may enter the land for inspection at any reasonable time.

Requirements in Respect of Fuel Storage on Rural and Urban Land.

Not less than 6 metres in width in such positions that no part or compartment of a pine plantation shall exceed 28 ha in area.

(6) Townsite Land:

All inflammable material to be removed from townsite lots unless exemption is applied for specific reason such as grazing. Where an exemption is granted, firebreaks be constructed 2 metres wide immediately inside all external boundaries and 3 metres wide immediately surrounding or within 20 metres of the perimeter of all buildings and haystacks on the land.

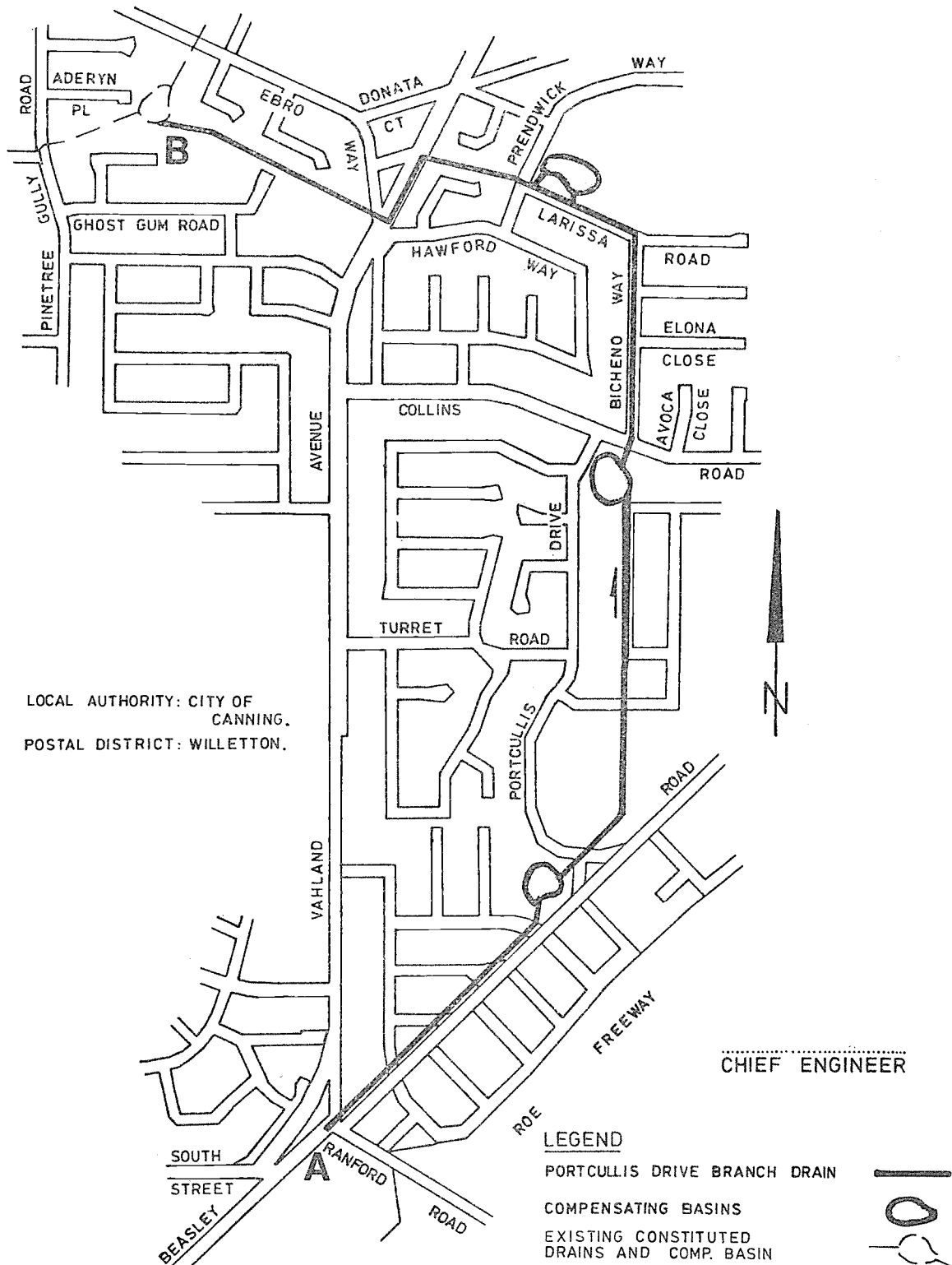

Decision of Tribunal.

An application to amend the Minister's Determination of the 9th December, 1977 (as amended) and as altered by the finding of the Government School Teachers' Tribunal on 14th December, 1979, (as amended) by the addition of the following clause under Part IV—Promotional Positions, Secondary Schools (7)

"Principals:

- (7) (e) Principal Narrogin Agricultural College \$29 653"

By notice published in the issue of the *Education Circular* of the 4th May, 1980 it was announced that:

"From 1981, subject to the appointment of a suitable principal to the agricultural wing, Narrogin Agricultural Senior High School will be divided into two institutions, and with its own principal and staff.

The town school will remain a normal senior high school. It will retain its Group "B" classification and will be staffed accordingly. The Agricultural wing will become Narrogin Agricultural College and in addition to the current vocational courses which are offered at Year 11, 12 levels the college will become a centre for agricultural in-service activities for primary and post secondary students.

The principal (of the college) will be appointed under the provisions of Regulation 141. The salary will be equivalent to the salary of the principal of a high or senior high school having an enrolment of less than 600."

Applications for the position of the principal of the Narrogin Agricultural College were invited by advertisement in *The West Australian* Newspaper of the 24th May. The advertisement contained the following statement:

"Salary and Conditions:

Salary within the range \$23 588 to \$26 065 and four weeks annual leave."

The Union claims that the salary of the principal should be \$29 563. By his reply the Minister says the teachers salaries determination should include under Part IV—Promotional Positions the following subparagraph:

- "7 (e) Narrogin Agricultural College
\$26 065 \$23 242

The position has not been filled and as a consequence no oral evidence was adduced to support the claim. Mr Lloyd for the applicant argues that the salary of the appointee to the advertised position should be that of the principal of a high or senior high school of less than 600 with a loading

to compensate for holidays being limited to four weeks only pursuant to Regulation 141. The applicant contends that:

"It is the employment of this principal, the Narrogin Agricultural College principal, under regulation 141 conditions which makes the salary rate determined by the minister inappropriate. The Union submits that the principal should receive seven weeks' additional pay to compensate for the seven weeks' less annual leave and therefore seven weeks' more work required of the principal of the Narrogin Agricultural College as compared to other principals, both at the agricultural schools and high schools. The Union is therefore claiming a loading of seven weeks' additional pay for the seven weeks' additional work and the longer formal daily hours of work."

From what is before the Tribunal the argument so raised cannot be sustained. The invitation to apply for the position does not express the status of the position, but provides a very brief description of the college, the intention as to its future use, the salary range and conditions of employment of the principal. The notice in *The Education Circular* does not assist the applicant's case. The new position is not said to be equivalent to that of the principal of a high or senior high school but that the salary will be equivalent to the salary payable to a principal of such a school. In

fact a clear distinction is drawn by reference to the application of regulation 141 and of applicants satisfying regulation 185 (1) (a).

There is no evidence which would justify a finding that the salary determined by the Minister is inadequate. After the college has functioned as a separate entity for some time circumstances might arise which would warrant a critical look at the salary range fixed for the principal.

Although not material to this decision the Tribunal considers that the application fore-shadows a problem likely to arise in the future. We refer to the status of the college and of the position of Principal. As to the latter, it appears from the amending regulations published on the 8th August, 1980 (Exhibit 2) that the holder of the position of principal. As to the latter, it appears list, but is that enough? If the holder retires by effluxion of time what promotional benefit has accrued to him?

The application fails for the reasons expressed.
