The construction of extensions to the existing wastewater treatment works together with all things necessary for the undertaking. The extensions will upgrade the plant to give improved treatment facilities for an equivalent population of 16 600 persons and will comprise a screen, flow equalisation basin and additional sludge treatment facilities consisting of a dissolved air flotation thickener and two centrifuges. The extensions will be wholly located within the Canning Vale Wastewater Treatment Plant site on Lot 71 Magnet Road, as shown on plan M.W.B. 16945.

Employment Agents' Act, 1976.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS, pursuant to section 8 of the Employment Agents' Act, 1976, the Governor may by Order in Council grant to any person an exemption from any provision of that Act on such terms and conditions as the Governor thinks fit: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Administrator, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby grants to Universal Aunts of 200 Nicholson Road, Subiaco, and Baby Sitter Bureau & Anytime Babysitting Service of 129 Elliott Road, Karrinyup, an exemption from those provisions of subsection (2) of section 42 of the Employment Agents' Act, 1976, which require an employment agent who refers persons seeking employment to other persons with a view to engagement to give or forward to the prospective employee a form of "Notice of Employment Offered", upon the condition—

- (a) that the information as to any prospective employment which might be offered to a person seeking employment and which would, but for the exemption, have had to be given in writing to that person shall be given verbally;
- (b) that upon an engagement being made as to a prospective employment in relation to the person seeking that employment, the "Notice of Employment Offered", duly signed, shall be given or forwarded to the prospective employee as required by that section; and
- (c) that an accurate office record be maintained of all information furnished to a person seeking employment, whether verbally or by a Notice, specifying the details required under the Act.

HOSPITALS (AMENDMENT) REGULATIONS 1980.

MADE by His Excellency the Administrator in Executive Council.

- Citation. 1. These regulations may be cited as the Hospitals (Amendment) Regulations 1980.
- Commencement. 2. These regulations shall come into operation on 11 September 1980.
- Principal regulations. 3. In these regulations the regulations made under the Hospitals Act 1927 as reprinted pursuant to the Reprinting of Regulations Act 1954 and published as reprinted in the *Government Gazette* on 2 February 1960 and amended by notices published from time to time in the *Government Gazette*, are referred to as the principal regulations.
- Regulations 1 and 2 repealed and subs. 4. Regulations 1 and 2 of the principal regulations are repealed and the following regulations are substituted—
- “ 1. These regulations may be cited as the Hospitals Regulations 1940.
2. (1) Subject to the approval and directions of the Governor, persons to be appointed by the Governor as members of boards of management of hospitals may first be nominated for such appointment in the manner hereinafter mentioned.
- (2) The Governor may, on the recommendation of the Minister, determine from time to time the hospitals to which sub-regulation (1) shall apply, and direct the particular method of nomination which shall be adopted by those hospitals, respectively. ”
- Regulation 10 amended. 5. Regulation 10 of the principal regulations is amended in model by-law 16 by deleting paragraphs (a) and (b) of the rates applying to Nursing Home Type Patients and substituting the following—
- “ (a) A Nursing Home Type Patient who is a hospital insured person or a person other than a hospital insured person who elects to be treated as a private patient—
- (i) Where receiving extensive care—\$24.83 per day.
- (ii) Where not receiving extensive care—\$18.83 per day.
- (b) Any other Nursing Home Type Patient—\$7.08 per day. ”

1. Foreign Currency Hedge Contracts Arranged Through The Official Forward Exchange Market
being contracts which, subject to the approval of the Reserve Bank, permit foreign currency to be purchased at some future date at a predetermined price through an Australian Trading Bank (notwithstanding any movements in exchange rates).
2. Foreign Currency Hedge Contracts Arranged Through The Unofficial Hedge Market
being contracts which bring together importers and exporters with opposite exchange risks. The parties set an exchange rate for a future date with the intention that at settlement the amount of the differential from the rate so set arising from the fluctuations in the exchange rate between the date of setting and the date of settlement is paid or received.
3. Foreign Currency Hedge Contracts Arranged Through The Bank Hedge Market
being contracts which attempt to cater for importers and exporters with opposite exchange risks. A party will trade directly with a bank acting as a principal and the bank sets the exchange rate determined in the same manner as the Unofficial Hedge Market by matching rates acceptable to buyers and sellers.
4. Foreign Currency Hedge Contracts Arranged Through The Sydney Futures Exchange
being contracts which provide a market for buying and selling standard sized parcels of the Australian equivalent of a foreign currency at a predetermined price for delivery at a specified future date.
5. Interest Rate Future Contracts
being contracts entered into through the Sydney Futures Exchange providing for the buying and selling of parcels of bank accepted bills of exchange at a predetermined price for delivery at a specified future date.

GOVERNMENT SCHOOL TEACHERS ARBITRATION AND APPEAL REGULATIONS 1980.

“ (1a) An appeal by a teacher against a decision pursuant to regulation 86A of the Education Regulations—

(b) dismissing the teacher,

is prescribed pursuant to section 29 (1) (g) as a matter for the purposes of Part IV of the Act. ”

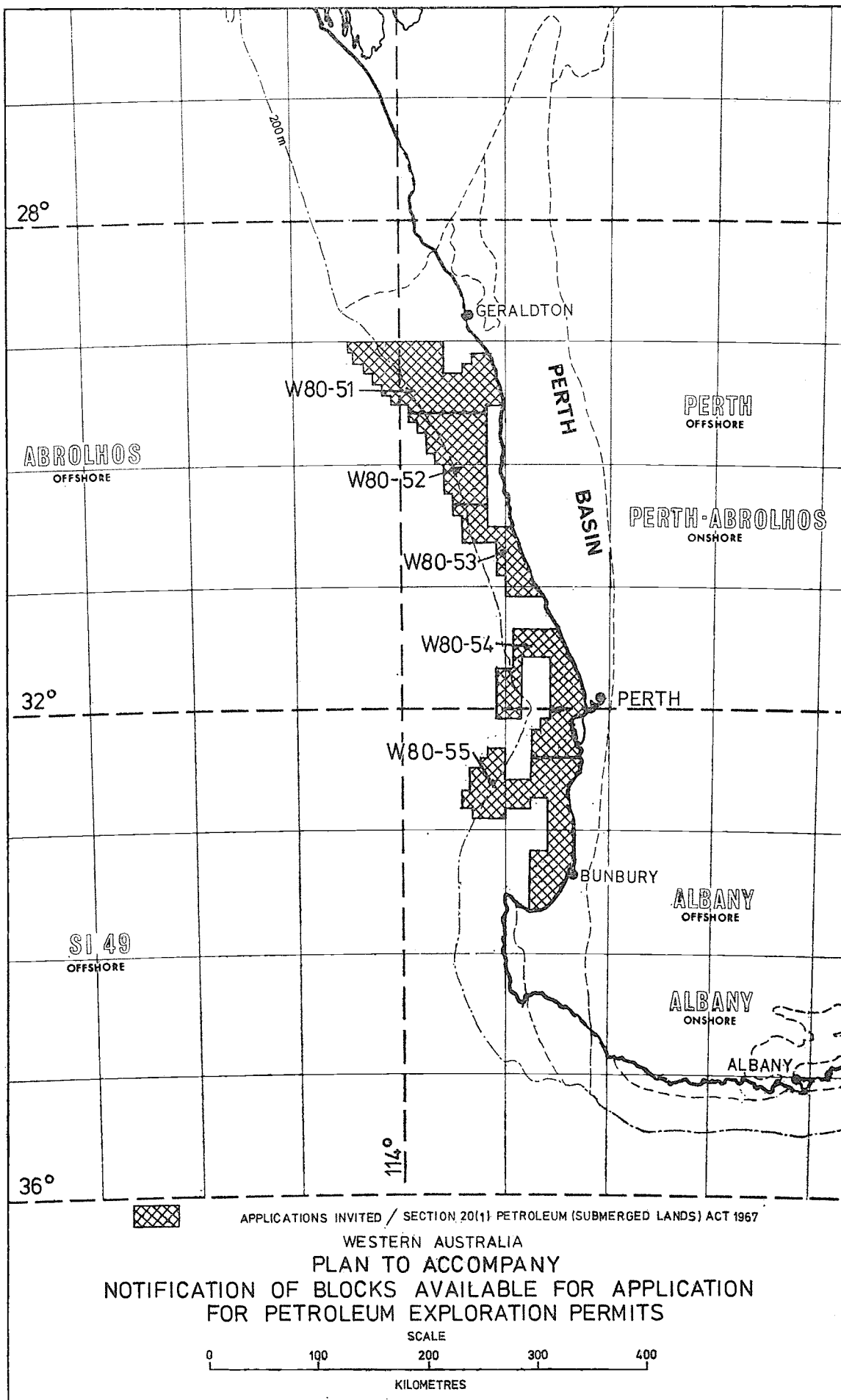
