Transfer of Land Act, 1893. PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, By His Excellency the Honourable John Martin To Wit: JLavan, Administrator in and over the State of J. M. LAVAN, Western Australia and its Dependencies in the Administrator. [L.S.]

WHEREAS by the Transfer of Land Act, 1893, the Governor is empowered by Proclamation in the Government Gazette to revest in Her Majesty as of Her former estate all or any lands, whereof Her Majesty may become the registered proprietor of the lands described in the Schedules hereto: Now therefore, I, the Administrator with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation revest in Her Majesty, Her Heirs and Successors, the land described in the Schedules hereto as of Her former estate.

Given under my hand the Public Seal of the said State, at Perth, this 1st day of October, 1980.

Land Act, 1933-1977. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corres. 1392/97.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1977, it is, *inter alia*, made lawful for the Governor to direct that any land reserved pursuant to the provisions of the Act, shall be leased for the purpose for which the land is reserved as aforesaid, by Instrument of Lease in accordance with the form in the Fourth Schedule of the Act, to any person (as defined in the said section); and whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve No. 36813 (Cossack Lots 106, 107, 124, 126, 168, 422, 423 and 442) shall be leased for a term of twenty one (21) years at a peppercorn rental to the Cossack Project Committee (Inc.) for the purpose of "Preservation and Enjoyment of Historical Buildings and Monuments" subject to the following conditions:—

- (a) The land shall not be used for any purpose other than "Preservation and Enjoyment of Historical Buildings and Monuments" without the prior approval in writing of the Minister for Lands.
- (b) The lessee shall not without the previous consent in writing of the Minister for Lands assign, transfer, sublet or part with the possession of the demised land.
- (c) The lessee shall maintain existing and future improvements to the satisfaction of the Minister for Lands.
- (d) The lessee shall indemnify the Minister against all claims for damage to property or persons arising from the use of the land.
- (e) The Minister or his representative may enter the land for inspection at any reasonable time.
- (f) Compensation shall not be payable to the lessee in respect of any improvements effected by him on the demised land and remaining thereon at the expiration or earlier determination of the lease.
- (g) Consent to mortgage will not at any time be given.

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Administrator by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council doth hereby direct that the abovementioned reserve shall be leased for a term of twenty one (21) years to the Cossack Project Committee (Inc.) for the purpose of "Preservation and Enjoyment of Historical Buildings and Monuments" subject however to the rental and conditions aforesaid.

Land Act, 1933-1977. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Local Government Act, 1960-1979. ORDERS IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 288 of the Local Government Act, 1960-1979, it shall be lawful for the Governor, on request by a Council of a Municipal District, by Order published in the Government Gazette to declare any lands reserved or acquired for use by the public or used by the public as a street, way, public place, bridge or thoroughfare, under the care, control, and management of the Council, or lands comprised in a private street, constructed and maintained to the satisfaction of the Council, or lands comprised in a private street of which the public has had uninterrupted use for a period of not less than ten years, as a public street and if the Council thinks fit, that the Governor shall declare the width of carriageway and footpaths of the public street; and whereas the Councils mentioned in the schedule hereto have requested that certain lands named and described in the said schedule, which have been reserved for streets within the said Councils, be declared public streets: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Administrator, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby declare the said lands to be public streets and such land shall, from the date of this Order, be absolutely dedicated to the public as streets within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force.

7. A person who contravenes any provision of these by-laws commits an offence and is liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding ten dollars.

- (b) a circular green signal unaccompanied by-
 - (i) the words "DONT WALK" in red lettering; or
 - (ii) a symbol similar to the illustration in the diagram following paragraph (c) of this subregulation and coloured red,

is a direction that he may proceed across the carriageway;

 (c) the words "DONT WALK" in red lettering or a symbol similar to the illustration in the following diagram and coloured red, whether flashing or steady, is a direction that he may not enter upon the carriageway, irrespective of other signals displayed and, if the words or symbol appear while he is on the carriageway, that he is to proceed, at once, to the nearest footway;



(d) a red or an amber circular signal, unaccompanied by-(i) the word "WALK" in green or white lettering; or

(ii) a symbol similar to the illustration in the diagram following paragraph (a) of this subregulation and coloured green,

is a direction that he shall not enter upon the carriageis a diffection that he shall he check up on the carriageway, he is to quit it with reasonable despatch. ".

By-law No. 60-Care, Control and Management of Parking

Facilities—Amendment.

The Municipality of the City of Perth. By-law relating to Parking Facilities.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on the 18th day of August, 1980 to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor, the following amendments to By-law No. 60:

Delete Clause 47 and substitute therefor the following:

- 47. (1) In this clause—
 - "eligible person" means a person who
 - (a) (i) is the owner or occupier of and who lives in a single tenement dwelling house adjacent to a part of a road whereon the standing of a vehicle is prohibited for more than a specified time or adjacent to a part of a road which is in a metered zone and
 - (ii) is unable to park a vehicle or more than one vehicle on the land on which that house is erected or
 - (b) (i) is the owner and occupier of a residential unit being part of a building adjacent to part of a road whereon the standing of a vehicle is prohibited for more than a specified time or is adjacent to a part of a road which is in a metered zone and who lives in that unit; and
 - (ii) is unable to park a vehicle or more than one vehicle in a permanent off-street parking facility set aside for that unit
 - "West Perth area" means the area bordered by Kings Park Road, Thomas Street, the railway line, Havelock Street to Hay Street, Hay Street to Harvest Terrace and Harvest Terrace to Malcolm Street.
 - (2) Subject to the payment of the fees prescribed in subclause (3) of this clause and subject to subclause (4) of this clause, the Council may on written application being made to it, issue a residential parking permit for a period not exceeding one year for a vehicle registered in the name of an eligible person.
 - (3) The fees payable for the issue of each residential parking permit pursuant to this clause are:
 - (a) where the applicant is a person eligible for a deferment of rates under the Pensioners (Rates Rebates and Deferments) Act Amendment Act: \$5 per annum
 - (b) where the applicant is an eligible person who is living in a house or unit in the West Perth area on the date on which the introduction of this Clause 47 into this By-law was effected by publication in the Government Gazette: \$5 per annum
 - (c) where the applicant is an eligible person who does not come within the provisions of paragraph (a) or paragraph (b) of this subclause: \$50 per annum or \$13 per quarter or part thereof and expiring on the last day of the months of December, March, June and September.
 - (4) In the West Perth area, the Council issue residential parking permits with respect to vehicles owned by two eligible persons living in the same house or unit if no vehicle can be parked on the land on which the house is erected or there is no permanent off-street parking facility set aside for that unit.

Contingent Liability: The amount of loan interest included in loan debentures issued and payable over the life of the loan but not shown in the Balance Sheet as a liability is about $$2610\ 002$ which included $$952\ 137$ from self supporting loans.

Trust Funds: The amount shown of \$1882339 includes the amount of \$1543592 which are Council funds and shown in current assets under the subheading "Council Items in Trust A/c.". The proceeds from the sale of land at Mt. Scott \$195080, have not been included in Council funds nor treated as a sale as titles were not able to be issued at 30/6/80.

Debtors: Of the amount owing of \$194 894 about \$53 147 is for rates statutory deferred by pensioners.

Deferred Liabilities: The loan liability shown of \$3 322 571 is Council's liability. however, \$979 419 is due to be paid by sporting bodies, etc., who have been granted self supporting loans.

Fixed Assets: Are generally shown at cost less depreciation, except for land which is not depreciated. Some assets including some vacant land have been given imputed values after a recent check of assets held.

Contingent Asset: The State Energy Commission is currently holding about $\$35\ 306$ which is the cost of unrecouped power reticulation charges. This amount will be periodically repaid when subdivisions will be fully developed. This amount previously charged to subdivision costs, when received, will show in the A/c Council Items in Trust A/c—Sale of Assets.

- " 16. (1) In relation to the election of workmen's inspectors—
 - (a) returning officers shall be paid fifty per cent of the fee prescribed for a returning officer for State Parliamentary Elections in the regulations made under the Electoral Act 1907, as in force at the time of the holding of an election;
 - (b) assistant returning officers shall be paid the fee prescribed for a presiding officer plus two dollars (\$2,00) which shall be taken to include any fee for presiding; and
 - (c) presiding officers, assistant presiding officers and poll clerks shall be paid the appropriate fee prescribed for State Parliamentary Elections in the regulations made under the Electoral Act 1907, as in force at the time of the holding of an election.
