# Special Residential.

5.10 Within the Special Residential zone it is the intention, subject to approval by the Town Planning Board, to provide for the subdivision of the land into lots having a minimum area of not less than .8 ha (2 acres).

No development of land within this zone shall be effected without the prior written permission of the Council. An application for permission to develop land within this zone shall be in writing and shall contain a detailed statement of the proposed development and unless the Council considers it unnecessary shall be accompanied by plans and specifications of the proposed development. No fencing shall be erected or permitted on land within this zone without the prior written permission of the Council. The Council shall endeavour to achieve uniformity in the appearance of and materials to be used in the provision of fencing in the interests of visual amenity. An application for permission to erect fencing shall be in writing and shall contain details of proposed fencing. The Council shall not be liable to contribute to the cost of any fence on boundaries of roads, footways, bridle paths or public open space.

No excavations shall be effected and no dams shall be constructed on land within this zone without the prior written permission of the Council. The Council shall not permit such proposed excavations or works to be carried out where, in its opinion, they would adversely affect the appearance and amenity of the area in the vicinity of such proposed excavations or works in particular and the land within the Scheme Area in general. An application for permission to effect excavations or construct dams on land within this zone shall be in writing and shall contain a statement of such proposed excavations or dam construction.

All structures erected on land within this zone shall accord with the provisions of the Uniform Building By-Laws 1974 as from time to time amended. The frontage of houses constructed on land within this zone shall be set back at least ten (10) metres from the boundary of the lots on which such houses are constructed.

No stables shall be constructed within ten (10) metres of the boundaries of lots within this zone and no stables shall be constructed or permitted on a lot within this zone between a house erected on such lot and that boundary of the lot on which such house is erected which boundary is adjacent to a road, footway or bridle path.

- (f) Where in the opinion of Council portions of lots containing steeply sloping land the natural vegetation on which requires preservation, the Council may require that such areas be fenced or treated in such other fashion as may ensure that such land is not degraded by grazing, browsing or the movement of stock or by any other cause.
- (g) Each dwelling to be erected on lots within the land shall be provided with a supply of potable water from one or a combination of the following:
  - (i) a reticulated system;
  - (ii) a rainwater storage system having a capacity of not less than 90 000 litres; and
  - (iii) an underground supply.
- (h) The undermentioned details of proposed uses and development shall be to the satisfaction and approval of the Council:—
  - (i) The use, siting, design and external appearance of any buildings erected on the land.
  - (ii) The floor area of any new dwelling which in no case shall be less than 60 square metres (excluding a carport or garage) as ascertained by external measurements.
  - (iii) The setbacks of development from all lot boundaries and street alignments and in the latter instances, a minimum setback of 20 metres shall apply.





- (2) Sick leave not taken by a member of the Council's outside staff during the year in which he is entitled to take it, according to his conditions of employment, may be accumulated and taken in subsequent years if the employee is incapacitated due to sickness or injury; provided that the maximum period of accumulated sick leave days shall not exceed one hundred and thirty.
- (3) For the purpose of these By-laws, a member of the outside staff is one whose wages and conditions are governed by the current awards of the Municipal Outside Workers (Metropolitan) Award, Building Trades Award, Electrical Contracting Industry Award, Metal Trades (General) Award and the Cleaners and Caretakers Award.

By-laws Relating to Parks and Public Reserves.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on the 25th day of March, 1980, to submit for confirmation by the Governor the following by-laws:—

#### Definitions.

- 1. In these By-laws:—
  - "Building" means and includes any building construction, stall, fence, barrier, hoarding, outbuilding and includes any tent or caravan.
  - "Council" means the executive body of the municipality of the City of Gosnells
  - "Person" includes a body corporate or group of persons.
  - "Public Reserve" means park lands, squares, reserves, beaches, and other lands, included in or adjoining a district, and set apart for the use and enjoyment of the inhabitants of the district and includes parks and other lands acquired for public purposes, and vested in or under the care, control or management of the muncipality, except streets.
  - "Town Clerk" shall mean the Town Clerk of the City of Gosnells.
  - "Vehicle" includes any conveyance and every object capable of being propelled or drawn, on wheels or track by any means, not being a train, vessel or aircraft.
- 2. These by-laws shall apply to all reserves within the Municipality of the City of Gosnells.

#### Damage to Property.

- 3. No person shall destroy, damage, take away or interfere with any tree, tree guard, shrub, flower, plant, fence, building, seat, waterpipe, hose, hose fitting, soil, grass surface or other property owned by or vested in the Municipality of the Council in or on any reserve.
- 4. No person shall climb or be upon any tree, shrub, tree guard, wall or fence or upon the roof of any building in any reserve.

#### Rubbish.

5. No person shall deposit or leave in any reserve any rubbish, refuse, clothing, paper, glass, china, timber, stone, bricks, sand, gravel, scrap metal or other material, whether of the same kind or not, other than in a receptacle provided for the purpose.

#### Animals and Vehicles on Reserves.

- 6. No person shall tether any animal to any tree, shrub, tree guard, wall or fence in any park or public reserve without the authority of the Council.
- 7. No person shall cause, allow or suffer any horse or cattle to be or to depasture upon any park or public reserve without first having obtained a licence from the Council so to do.
- 8. No person shall, unless authorised in that behalf by the Council, lead, ride or drive any horse, cattle, bicycle, tricycle, motorcycle or motor vehicle upon or over any portion of any park or public reserve, except upon a carriageway or an area set aside for the purpose of parking.
- 9. No person shall, unless authorised in that behalf by the Council, leave any vehicle, whether in charge of any person or not, stationary upon any park or public reserve, except upon a carriageway or part of such park or reserve set aside for the purpose.
- 10. No person shall leave any vehicle, whether in charge of any person or not, stationary upon a carriageway within any park or public reserve, except on a duly appointed stand, and not in any event for a longer period than is specified by a notice exhibited in such park or reserve.
- 11. The driver of any vehicle standing on any carriageway in any park or public reserve shall place and keep the same and any horse or other animal attached thereto close to and parallel with the kerb or footpath on the left of such vehicle, except where marked parking bays channels or other obstructions prevent this from being done or indicate otherwise.

#### Misdemeanours.

- 12. Any person found in a state of intoxication or behaving in a disorderly manner or using indecent, profane or insulting language or creating or taking part in any disturbance or making an harangue whereby a crowd is collected or committing any act of indecency in any park or public reserve shall be liable to be removed therefrom forthwith by any officer of the Council or by any member of the Police Force and shall be guilty of an offence against this by-law.
- 13. No person shall in any park or public reserve wilfully obstruct, disturb, interrupt or annoy any other person in the lawful use thereof or wilfully obstruct in the execution of his duty or insult or neglect to obey the lawful directions of any caretaker, ranger or other officer of the Council.
- 14. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or seats or any structure or erection within any park or public reserve.
- 15. It shall be lawful for any officer of the Council or any member of the Police Force to remove from any park or public reserve any child under the age of seven (7) years who is not under the care or control of his parent or other person over the age of sixteen (16) years.
- 16. No person shall commit a nuisance in any park or public reserve, or on or in any part of any pavilion, dressing room or other building erected on any part of any park or public reserve.

#### Hawking.

- 17. No person shall hawk or offer for sale in any park or public reserve any goods or articles of any description without having previously obtained the written permission of the Town Clerk.
- 18. No person shall in any park or public reserve, without the written permission of the Town Clerk, take the photographic portrait of any person for reward or for the purpose of sale.
- 19. No person shall erect or place within any park or public reserve any tent, stall, platform or table for public amusement or for any performance, whether for gain or otherwise, without the written consent of the Town Clerk.

#### Amplifiers.

- 20. No person shall take upon or erect or operate upon any park or public reserve any loudspeaker or other device for the amplification of sound without having previously obtained the written permission of the Town Clerk.
- 21. No person shall in any park or public reserve, speak or make any noise so as knowingly to cause such speech or noise to be amplified by any loud-speaker or other device without having previously obtained the written permission of the Town Clerk.

#### Liquor, Gambling.

22. No person shall unless authorised in that behalf by the Council, bring, carry or take into or have in his possession or under his control in any park or public reserve any fermented or spirituous liquors nor consume or drink the same therein. Provided that this clause shall not apply to any person lawfully exercising or taking advantage of the privileges of a registered club for which is held a current licence granted under the provisions of the Liquor Act, 1970, as amended, with the approval of the Council.

#### Fires, Camping.

23. No person shall light any fire within any park or public reserve except in an area set aside for the purpose, without the written permission of the Town Clerk.

24. No person shall camp, lodge or tarry overnight in any park or public reserve or frequent the same for the purpose of camping, lodging or tarrying overnight therein, without having previously obtained the written permission of the Council.

#### Playing on Reserves.

- 25. No person shall, except in the course of a game being lawfully played on a park or public reserve, throw or discharge anything in or to or over a park or public reserve.
  - 26. No person shall:-
    - (a) play at or practice golf in any park or public reserve except in a park or public reserve set aside for the purpose;
    - (b) play in or at any game between opposing teams or practice at any game in a park or public reserve without having first obtained the written permission of the Town Clerk; or
    - (c) play at any game in a park or public reserve to the annoyance or disturbance of any other person lawfully using the park or reserve or in such circumstances that such play might reasonably be anticipated to cause damage to any tree, tree guard, shrub, flower, plant, fence, seat, building, waterpipe, hose-fitting, soil, grass surface or other property of whatsoever nature or kind owned by or vested in the Municipality of the City of Gosnells.
- 27. A person or organised Club having obtained permission as aforesaid shall not practise or play at any such game, except at such times and upon such portions of the parks or public reserves as shall be specified in such permission.

#### Billposting.

28. No person shall deface or write upon or post, stick, stamp, stencil, paint or otherwise affix or cause to be posted, stuck, stamped, stencilled, painted or otherwise affixed, any placard, handbill, notice, advertisement, writing or picture whatsoever upon any tree, building, fence, post, gate, wall, flagging or path in or around any park or public reserve, without the written consent of the Town Clerk being first obtained.

#### Flying Objects.

29. No person shall fly any balloon or motorised model aircraft from or on any park or public reserve without the written permission of the Town Clerk, except on such parks or public reserves or parts thereof as shall from time to time be set aside by the Council for the purpose.

#### Bathing.

30. No person shall bathe in any park or public reserve except in such areas as are set aside for that purpose.

#### Erection of Buildings on Reserve.

- 31. No person shall erect or permit or authorise the erection of a building on a reserve without the consent of the Council. Any person desirous of erecting a building on a reserve shall make application to Council under the provisions of the Uniform Building By-laws.
- 32. Any person who shall erect or use or permit or authorise the erection or use of any building on a reserve without the written consent of the Council or otherwise than in accordance with the terms of the written consent of the Council shall be guilty of an offence.
- 33. The Council may by notice in writing to the owner or occupier or to the person whom it believes to be the owner or occupier of a building on a reserve, direct that a building erected or used on a reserve without the consent of the Council, or erected or used otherwise than in accordance with the terms of the consent of the Council, or any building in respect of which the consent to erect the same has been withdrawn, be removed within a period of fourteen (14) days after the date of the service of the said notice.
- 34. No person shall cause any damage to or interfere with any building on a reserve.
- 35. No person, other than the owner, or a person duly authorised in that behalf by the owner of the building shall use a building on a reserve.
- 36. Any person to whom the Council has granted permission to use a building on a reserve and/or the grounds adjacent to such building at such a time when the building and/or grounds would normally be occupied by another person shall have the sole right to use such building and/or grounds to the exclusion of the person normally so authorised and the person normally so authorised shall not during the time for which the permission is granted use, suffer, permit or allow such building to be used by any person other than the person to whom Council has expressly granted permission at that time.
- 37. In the event of the non-compliance with a notice given in pursuance of By-law 33 hereof the Council may sell the building in respect of which the notice has been given or may by its officers, servants and workmen take down and remove the said building and may sell the materials of which it is constructed and shall hold the balance of the purchase money received by it, after deducting all costs and expenses consequent upon such failure to comply with the notice and such taking down and removal and sale, upon trust for the person entitled thereto.

#### Children's Playgrounds.

- 38. The Council may set aside a reserve or any portion of a reserve as a children's playground.
- 39. The Council may limit the ages of persons who shall be permitted to use a children's playground and may erect a notice to that effect on the playground.
- 40. A person over the age specified in a notice erected on a playground other than a person having the charge of a child or children in the playground shall not use a playground or interfere with the use by children of the playground.

#### Penalty.

41. Any person offending against any of the provisions of these by-laws shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding one hundred dollars (\$100).

By-laws Relating to Street Lawns and Gardens.

By-law No. 4.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on the 16th day of June, 1980, to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following by-law to be known as By-law No. 4.

- 1. In this by-law unless the context otherwise requires:
  - "garden" means an area of a street which is planted, developed or treated otherwise than as a lawn but does not include any development or treatment which involves the construction of works in a street within the meaning of section 509 of the Local Government Act, 1960;
  - "carriage way" means a portion of a road that is improved, designed or ordinarily used for vehicular traffic, and includes the shoulders, and areas, including embayments, at the side of centre of the road, used for the standing or parking of vehicles, but does not include a lane, right-of-way or driveway;
  - "Council" means the Council of the City of Perth;
  - "footpath" means that part of a road set apart or constructed for the use of pedestrians and every established footway, pavement, lane, thoroughfare or any other part of a road set apart for the use of pedestrians;
  - "intersection" means the area comprised within imaginary straight lines joining in succession the points of transection of the property lines of two or more roads that meet each other. Where the property lines are curved at any corner, the point of transection of the property lines shall be regarded as the point on the curve nearest to the point at which those property lines, if extended in straight lines from each end of the curve, would meet;

- "junction" means that part of a road lying between imaginary straight lines at right angles to the road commencing from the points of transection formed by its own property lines with the property lines of a road which abuts thereon. Where the property lines are curved at any corner, the point of transection formed by the property lines shall be determined in the same manner as is provided in the definition of "intersection";
- "lawn" means an area of a street which is planted solely with grass and which comprises no other landscaping feature other than a tree or shrub planted by the Council;
- "property line" means the boundary between the land comprising a street and the land that abuts thereon.
- 2. Where before the coming into operation of this by-law a garden has been planted in a street the owner or occupier of the land that abuts on that portion of the street in which that garden is planted shall ensure that the garden complies with the provisions of this by-law but is not required to obtain a permit pursuant to this by-law.
- 3. (1) A person shall not plant a garden in a street, except pursuant to a permit issued by the Council and then only in conformity with this by-law.
- (2) The Council shall not issue a permit for the planting of a garden in any portion of a street, except on the application of the owner or occupier of the land that abuts on that portion of the street.
- (3) A person requiring a permit to plant a garden in a street shall submit to the Council a sketch plan setting out details of the proposed garden and the positions of the proposed garden beds and any trees or shrubs proposed to be planted in relation to the frontage of the carriageway.
- (4) The owner or occupier of land that abuts on portion of a street may plant a lawn in that portion of the street without obtaining a permit to do so unless the lawn is part of a garden in that portion of the street.
  - 4. A person shall not plant a garden in a street:-
    - (a) so that it extends beyond the frontage in respect of which the permit is issued;
    - (b) so that it encroaches on the pavement of a carriageway or a made footpath;
    - (c) that is not graded from the frontage of the land abutting on that portion of the street to the kerb of the carriageway and in accordance with the general ground levels obtaining in that street.
- 5. (1) The owner or occupier of land abutting on portion of a street in which a lawn or garden is planted shall ensure that any water pipe laid to that lawn or garden:—
  - (a) is laid and kept beneath the surface of the street, at a depth of not more than 30 cm nor less than 15 cm and so that any fitting connected to a pipe does not project above the surface of the lawn or garden;
  - (b) if connected to a public water supply, is laid to comply with the requirements of the body constituted for, and having control of that supply under the Act;
  - (c) if connected to a private water supply, where passing under road, pavement, made footpaths or crossings, is of galvanised, wrought iron, P.V.C. or of copper; and
  - (d) has approved valves, located within the property where they are connected to the water supply and is fitted so as to give complete control of the flow of water from that supply.
- (2) Where a person, in the course of laying pipes pursuant to this by-law, causes damage to any road, pavement, footpath, or crossing, or to any water, gas or sewerage pipes, to any power or telephone cables or to a fire hydrant, that damage may be made good, by the authority having the control of the thing damaged, at the expense of that person or of the person on whose behalf the pipes were laid, and the amount of that expense may be recovered in any court of competent jurisdiction.
- 6. A person shall not water a street lawn or garden in such a manner as will, or may, occasion inconvenience to persons using the adjoining carriageway or footpath.
- 7. (1) A person shall not plant or keep any tree or shrub in a garden in a street if that tree or shrub is of a height exceeding 0.75 metres, or is of a variety likely to grow to a height exceeding 0.75 metres, if that tree or shrub is within 6 metres of a junction or intersection.
- (2) Nothing in this by-law authorises a person to place or erect any fence, enclosure or other obstruction on, or about, a lawn or garden in a street.
- 8. (1) The Council may at any time by notice in writing to the owner or occupier of land that abuts on portion of a street in which a lawn or garden is planted require that owner or occupier to remove any tree, shrub, water piping or fitting from that lawn or garden and the owner or occupier shall comply with that notice within the time stipulated for compliance therewith in the notice.
- (2) If an owner or occupier upon whom a notice has been served pursuant to subclause (1) of this clause fails to comply with that notice within the stipulated time the Council may remove the tree, shrub, water piping or fitting from that lawn or garden referred to in the notice at the expense of the owner or occupier and any expense incurred by the Council in so doing may be recovered from that owner or occupier in a court of competent jurisdiction.

- 9. (1) The Council may, without being liable to compensate any person therefor, dig up all or any part of a lawn or garden in a street, for the purpose of carrying out any authorised works.
- (2) A person employed by the Council acting pursuant to this clause shall not disturb a lawn or garden or damage any pipes laid under that lawn or garden to any greater extent than is reasonably necessary for the purpose of carrying out any authorised works and shall, upon the completion of the works, reinstate the lawn or garden, as far as is reasonably practicable.
- 10. (1) Where the Council for the purpose of carrying out authorised works is of the opinion that the carrying out of those works may be impeded by the existence of piping, under a lawn or garden in a street, it may give notice to the owner or occupier of the land abutting on the lawn or garden to remove the piping, until the completion of the works. Where the owner or occupier does not comply with the notice within the time stipulated in the notice for compliance therewith the Council may remove the piping at the expense of the owner or occupier, and any expense incurred by the Council pursuant to this clause may be recovered in any court of competent jurisdiction.
- (2) The Council shall not be liable for damage to piping under a lawn or garden in a street, occasioned either in the course of the removal of the piping under the provisions of subclause (1) of this clause or in the course of carrying out authorised works.
- 11. (1) Except as provided by this by-law, a person shall not wilfully damage a lawn or garden in a street.
- (2) Except as provided in this by-law, a person other than the owner or occupier of land that abuts upon portion of a street in which a garden is planted or a person authorised by that owner or occupier shall not remove any flower, plant, or shrub from that garden.
- 12. The Council shall not be liable for any damage sustained by a person by reason of, or arising out of, the planting, or existence, of a lawn or garden in a street.
- 13. A person who commits an offence against this by-law is liable to a penalty of two hundred dollars.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Education Amendment Regulations 1980.
