## LOCAL COURT AMENDMENT RULES (No. 2) 1980.

MADE by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

- Citation. 1. These rules may be cited as the Local Court Amendment Rules (No. 2) 1980.
- Commencement. 2. Pursuant to section 158 of the Local Courts Act 1904-1976 these rules shall take effect at the expiration of one month from the publication thereof in the *Government Gazette*.
- Principal rules. 3. In these rules the Local Court Rules 1961,\* as amended, are referred to as the principal rules.
- Appendix amended. 4. Part II of the Appendix to the principal rules is amended by deleting the table of Bailiff's Fees and substituting the following—

THE Minister for Fisheries and Wildlife, pursuant to the powers conferred by section 14 and 17B of the Wildlife Conservation Act, 1950-1979, does hereby declare as follows:—

- (1) That the period from five o'clock in the forenoon of 1st January, 1981, until seven o'clock in the afternoon of 31st December, 1981, shall be an open season in respect of those species of wild duck in the Second Schedule hereto in those parts of the State which lie within the boundaries of the Kimberley, North-West and Eastern Divisions, as defined in section 28 of the Land Act, 1933, with the exception of those areas defined in the First Schedule hereto.
- (2) That the species of wild duck in the Second Schedule hereto are game species in all parts of the State in respect of which an open season on those species is declared by paragraph (1) of this notice.

- (7) That a person shall not take or attempt to take wild ducks from any boat, raft, launch or other type of boat which is powered by any type of motor or engine or which is propelled or towed by any means other than by hand.

If it is considered to be impracticable for any reason to clear firebreaks or to remove inflammable material from land as required by this notice, you may apply to the Council or its duly authorised officer in writing on or before the 24th December, 1980, for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions or to take alternative action to abate fire hazards on the land. 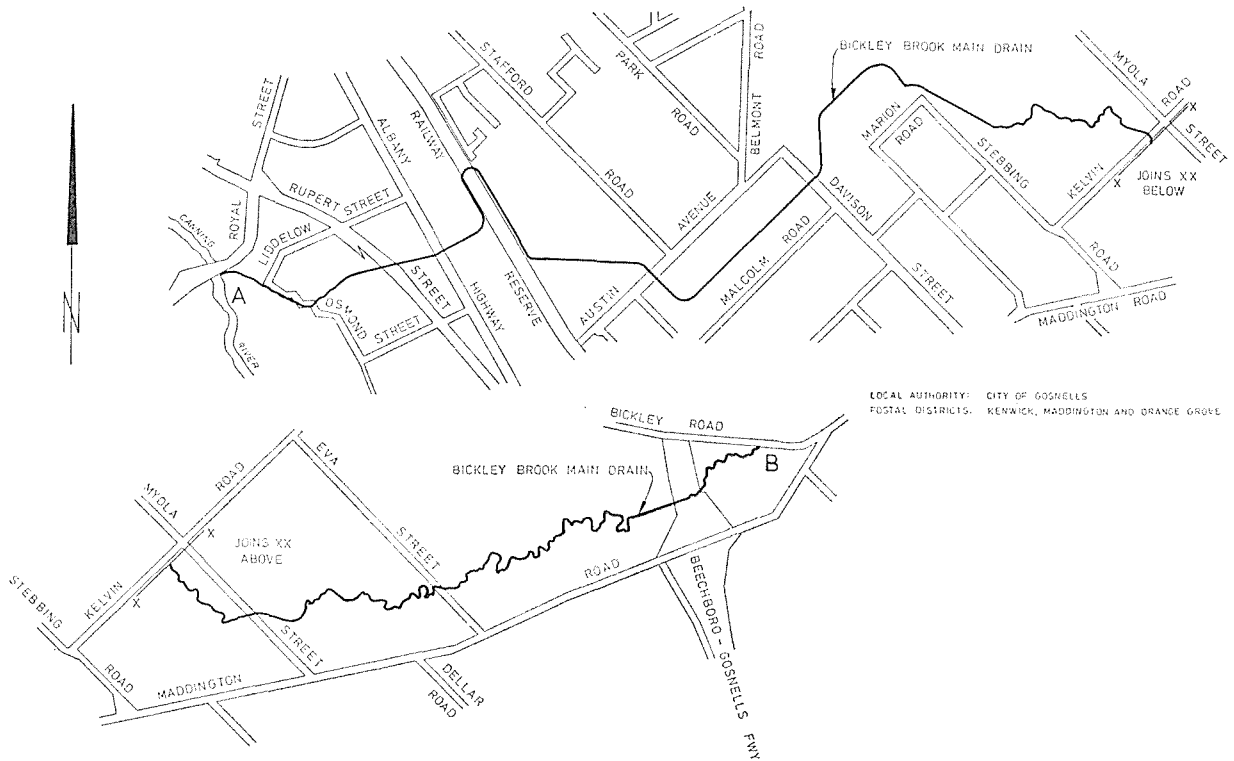

 (a) *Stop*—indicated by a Red light;  
 (b) *Caution*—indicated by a Yellow light; or  
 (c) *Clear*—indicated by a Green light.  
 (2) Affixed to the mast of each three aspect colour light signal is a plate (termed a marker plate) serving to distinguish between a semi-automatic and automatic signal by its position in relation to the signal light.  
 (3) Where two or more three aspect signals are bracketed on the one post, a marker plate is not displayed.  
 (4) Where a semi-automatic signal is provided with a marker plate it must be displayed vertically below the signal light.  
*(Note that a semi-automatic signal is a signal which is controlled from a signal-box or a switch lock, where double line Automatic Signalling is in operation.)*  
 (5) Where an automatic signal is provided with a marker plate it must be displayed diagonally below and to the right of the signal light.  
*(Note that an automatic signal is a signal controlled by the passage of trains.)*  
 (6) Where a semi-automatic signal is operated as an automatic signal, an illuminated letter “A” affixed to the signal mast and visible at short range only, must be displayed. Where the letter “A” is illuminated the provisions of Rule 79 of these rules shall apply.  
*(Figs. 31 to 36 page 484.)*  
*Note: Departure signals are dealt with in Rule 78. ”*
- Rule 65 repealed. 4. Rule 65 in the Schedule to the principal by-law is repealed.
- Rule 76 amended. 5. Rule 76 in the Schedule to the principal by-law is amended by inserting after subrule (4) the following subrule—  
 “ (5) Approach signals are distinguished by a triangular shaped marker plate. ”
- Rule 82 amended. 6. Rule 82 in the Schedule to the principal by-law is amended by deleting subrules (3) to (6) inclusive and substituting the following subrules—  
 “ (3) Points indicators fixed on catch of safety points (*see fig. 62, page 496*) exhibit a red target by day and two small reflectorised red targets by night when the points are in their normal (derailing) position, and a green target by day and two small reflectorised green targets by night when the points are reversed (running position).  
 (4) Points indicators fixed on other than catch points (*see fig. 63, page 496*) exhibit a half red and half green target by day and two small reflectorised targets one red, and one green by night; the green is exhibited in the direction for which the points are set.  
 (5) Points indicators of the type shown in *fig. 64 (page 496)* fixed on catch or safety points exhibit a red target by day and a small reflectorised red target by night when the points are in their normal (derailing) position; and a green band by day, and a small reflectorised green target by night when the points are reversed (running position).  
 (6) The points indicator referred to in subrule (5) of this rule when fixed on other than catch or safety points (*see fig. 65, page 496*) exhibits a green band by day and a small reflectorised green target by night, when the points are in their normal position; and a red target by day and a small reflectorised red target by night when the points are reversed. ”
- Rule 84 inserted. Junction Indicators. 7. The principal by-law is amended by inserting after rule 83 in the Schedule the following rule—  
 “ 84. (1) A Junction Indicator (*as shown in fig. 71, page 499A*) is mounted above the three aspect running signal with which it is associated and exhibits an indication for each diverging route in conjunction with a Proceed aspect on the signal.

\* Published in the *Government Gazette* 14/5/1940 and Schedule substituted in *Government Gazette* 1/10/1962.

(2) A Junction Indicator may be provided with any number of arms up to a maximum of six, fixed at 45° intervals. Diverging lines only are indicated, no indication being provided for the non-diverging line. When a diverging route has been set the signal cannot be placed at Proceed until the Junction Indicator has been illuminated.

(3) Each arm of the Junction Indicator comprises five lunar white lights. A minimum of three lunar white lights must be illuminated before a Proceed aspect can be displayed by the signal.

(4) As its name implies, a Junction Indicator is an indicator only. An illuminated Junction Indicator arm does not authorise a driver to proceed past the signal if the latter is at Stop. The signal itself must be at Proceed to provide such authority. ”.
