Declaration of School Boundaries Pursuant to Paragraph (a) of Subsection (2) of Section 21. THE Hon. Minister for Education has declared that the boundaries for the schools listed hereunder shall be as stated in this notice. Children who live within the areas and boundaries stated shall attend the schools to which such boundaries apply unless directed otherwise or unless an option is provided. Children who live outside the areas and boundaries shall not attend the schools to which such boundaries apply unless written approval for such admission is obtained from the undersigned.

#### 1. Glencoe Primary School:

Children attending Government schools and in Years 1 to 7 inclusive in 1981 and living in the localities of Halls Head, Erskine and the area south thereof to White Hill Road shall attend the Glencoe Primary School, except that children in Years 6 and 7 in 1981 and living in the above specified areas shall have the option of completing their primary education at their present (1980) school or of transferring to the Glencoe Primary School.

2. Goollelal Primary School:

The boundary for the abovementioned school is as follows:—

- From the intersection of Wanneroo Road and the proposed Hepburn Avenue, in a general westerly direction along the alignment of the proposed Hepburn Avenue to the proposed Mitchell Freeway, north along the alignment of the proposed Mitchell Freeway to Robertson Road, east along Robertson Road to Barridale Drive, in a general northerly direction along Barridale Drive and its extension to Whitford Avenue, southeast and northeast along Whitford Avenue to Wanneroo Road, and southeast and south along Wanneroo Road to the proposed Hepburn Avenue.
- The boundary parts of Hepburn Avenue (north side), Mitchell Freeway (east side), Robertson Road (south side), Barridale Drive (east side), Whitford Avenue (south side) and Wanneroo Road (west side) are included within the area for the Goollelal Primary School.

The following have been declared as optional areas:—

(i) From the intersection of the proposed Mitchell Freeway and Robertson Road, east along Robertson Road to Barridale Drive, in a general northerly direction along Barridale Drive and its extension to Whitford Avenue, in a general westerly direc-tion along Whitford Avenue to the proposed Mitchell Freeway, and south along the proposed alignment of the Mitchell Free-way to Robertson Road. (Optional area "A"---northwest Kingsley area.)

The boundary parts of Robertson Road (north side), Barridale Drive (west side), Whitford Avenue (south side) and Mitchell Freeway (east side) are included within this optional area.

(ii) From the intersection of the proposed Mitchell Freeway and Whitford Avenue, in a general easterly direction along Whit-ford Avenue to Duffy Terrace, northwest along Duffy Terrace to Woodvale Drive, from this junction due north to Mullaloo Drive in a general westerly direction along Mullaloo Drive to the proposed Mitchell Freeway, and south along the alignment of the proposed Mitchell Freeway to Whit-ford Avenue. (Optional area "B"—west Woodvale area.)

The boundary parts of Whitford Avenue (north side) and Mitchell Freeway (east side) are included with this optional area while the boundary part of Mullaloo Drive (both sides) and the boundary street of Duffy Terrace (both sides) are not in-cluded within this optional area.

(iii) From the junction of Whitford Avenue and Duffy Terrace, northwest along Duffy Terrace to Woodvale Drive, from this junction due north to Mullaloo Drive, southeast along Mullaloo Drive to Wanneroo Road, southeast along Wanneroo Road to Whitford Avenue and southwest along Whitford Avenue to Duffy Terrace. (Op-tional area "C"—east Woodvale area.)

The boundary parts of Wanneroo Road (west side) and Whitford Avenue (north side) and the boundary street of Duffy Terrace (both sides) are included within this optional area while the boundary part of Mullaloo Drive (both sides) is not included within this optional area.

Children attending Government schools and in Years 1 to 7 inclusive in 1981 and living within the boundary for the Goollelal Primary School, as provided above, shall attend the Goollelal Primary School, except as follows:-

- (i) Children in Year 7 in 1981 shall have the option of completing their primary educa-tion at their present (1980) School or of transferring to the Goollelal Primary School.
- (ii) Children living in optional area "A", the northwest Kingsley area, shall have the option of attending either Bambara Prim-ary School or the Goollelal Primary School but any children from this area who at-tended a primary school in the locality of Greenwood in 1980 may continue to do so in 1981 or may transfer to either the Bamhi 1951 of may transfer to either the Bahi-bara Primary School or the Goollelal Prim-ary School. This concession does not apply to younger siblings of such children nor to children of families moving into this area after the end of the 1980 school year nor to families from this area with chil-dren attending school for the first time in 1981. Such children will be directed to attend either the Bambara Primary School or the Goollelal Primary School.
- (iii) Children living in optional area "B", the west Woodvale area, shall have the op-tion of attending either the Bambara Primary School or the Goollelal Primary School, but any children from this area who attended the East Greenwood Primary School in 1980 may continue to do so in 1981 or may transfer to either the Bambara Primary School or the Goollelal Primary School.

(iv) Children living in optional area "C", the east Woodvale area, shall have the option of attending either the Bambara Primary School, the Goollelal Primary School or the Wanneroo Primary School/Wanneroo Junior Primary School in 1981.

Grovelands Primary School:

The boundary for the abovementioned school is as follows:

- From the junction of Second Road and Railway Avenue, northwest along Second Road and Champion Way to Lake Road, southand Champion way to Lake Road, south-west along Lake Road to the alignment of an unnamed road leading through to Allen Road, northwest along the align-ment of the unnamed road to the Southern River, in a general northerly direction along the Southern River to Allen Road, northeast along Allen Road to Yaves Road, southeast along Allen Road to Ypres Road, southeast along Ypres Road to West-field Road, northeast along Westfield Road to First Road, southeast along First Road to Railway Avenue and in a general souththe junction with Second Road.
- The boundary parts of Champion Way (north-east side only), Lake Road (both sides), (both sides), Westfield Road (southeast side), and Railway Avenue (both sides), and the boundary streets of Second Road (northeast side), Ypres Road (southwest side), and First Road (both sides), are in-cluded within the area for the Grovelands Primary School.

Children attending Government schools and livschool, as provided above, have the option of attending the Grovelands Primary School and com-pleting their primary education at that school, or of attending and completing their primary edu-cation at the Westfield Park Primary School. Chil-dren living in the area for the Westfield Park Primary School are excluded from attending the Grovelands Primary School.

4. Illawarra Primary School: The boundary for the abovementioned school is as follows:

- From the intersection of Hepburn Avenue and Rangeview Road, south along Rangeview Road to Marangaroo Drive, northeast, east and southeast along Marangaroo Drive to Alexander Drive, south along Alexander Drive to Harrow Street, east along Harrow Street to the intersection with the proposed alignment of Hepburn Avenue, and northwest and west along the alignment of Hepburn Avenue to Rangeview Road.
- The boundary parts of Marangaroo Drive (north side), Alexander Drive (east side), Har-row Street (both sides), and Hepburn Avenue (south side) are included within the area for the Illawarra Primary School while the boundary part of Rangeview Road (both sides) is excluded from the area for the Illawarra Primary School.

Children attending Government schools and in Years 1 to 7 inclusive in 1981 and living within the boundary for the Illawarra Primary School, as provided above, shall attend the Illawarra Primary School, except that children in Year 7 in 1981 shall have the option of completing their primary education at their present (1980) school or of transferring to the Illawarra Primary School.

5. Millars Well Primary School:

Children attending Government schools and in Years 1 to 7 inclusive in 1981 and living within the locality of Millars Well shall attend the Millars Well Primary School, except that children in Year 7 in 1981 shall have the option of completing their primary education at their present (1980) school or of transferring to the Millars Well Primary School.

6. Newton Primary School:

The boundary for the abovementioned school is as follows:—

- From where Rockingham Road crosses the railway line just to the north of Railway Crescent, south and southeast along Rockingham Road to Yangebup Road, northeast along Yangebup Road to Stock Road, northeast and north along Stock Road past Howson Way to the railway, and in a general westerly direction along the railway to Rockingham Road.
- The boundary parts of Rockingham Road (east side), Yangebup Road (north side) and Stock Road (west side) are included within the area for the Newton Primary School.

The following has been declared as an optional area between the Newton Primary School and the Spearwood Primary School:---

- From the intersection of Stock Road and Yangebup Road, northeast along Yangebup Road to Miguel Road, north and northwest along Miguel Road and its continuation into Spearwood Avenue, northwest along Spearwood Avenue to Stock Road, and southwest, south and southwest along Stock Road to Yangebup Road.
- The boundary parts of Yangebup Road (both sides), Spearwood Avenue (both sides) and Stock Road (east side), and the boundary street of Miguel Road (both sides) are included in the optional area.

Children attending Government schools and in Years 1 to 7 inclusive in 1981 and living within the boundary for the Newton Primary School, as provided above, shall attend the Newton Primary School, except as follows:—

- (i) Children from this area who will be in Year 7 in 1981 shall have the option of completing their primary education at their present (1980) school or of transferring to the Newton Primary School.
- (ii) Children living in the optional area desigated above may attend either the Newton Primary School or the Spearwood Primary School.

7. North Balga Junior Primary School and North Balga Primary School:

- The boundary for the abovementioned schools is as follows:---
  - From the junction of Treen Street and Wanneroo Road, south along Wanneroo Road to Etchingham Road, in a general easterly direction along Etchingham Road to Princess Road, north, northeast and north along Princess Road to Ullswater Place, east along Ullswater Place to a point south of the eastern extremity of Ambleside Close, north from this point between Ambleside Close on the west and Barlow Way on the east to the northern arm of Coniston Way, east along the southern boundary of Lot 21 to the eastern boundary of Lot 21, north along this same eastern boundary to Beach Road, west and northwest along Beach Road to Muswell Street, southwest and south along Muswell Street to Treen Street and west along Treen Street to Wanneroo Road.
  - The boundary parts of Wanneroo Road (east side), Princess Road (between Balga Avenue and Beach Road) (both sides), Beach Road (south side), Muswell Street (both sides) and Ullswater Place (north side), and the boundary streets of Treen Street (both sides) and Etchingham Road (both sides) are included within the area for the North Balga Junior Primary School and the North Balga Primary School, while the boundary part of Princess Road (between Etchingham Road and Balga Avenue) (both sides) is excluded from the area for the North Balga Junior Primary School.

Children attending Government schools and in Years 1-7 inclusive in 1981 and living within the area for the North Balga Junior Primary School and North Balga Primary school, as provided above, shall attend the North Balga Junior Primary School or the North Balga Primary School as appropriate, except that children in Year 7 in 1981 who currently (1980) attend another primary school may complete their primary education at that school or may transfer to the North Balga Primary School.

8. South Hedland-Koombana Area:

With the opening of the Cassia Primary School in 1981, the re-definition of boundaries of schools in this area has become necessary as follows:—

(a) Cassia Primary School:

The boundary for the above-mentioned school is as follows:----

- From the junction of Forrest Circle and Murdock Drive, in a general northerly direction along Forrest Circle to the northern arm of Mitchie Crescent, northeast along the northern arm of Mitchie Crescent and its extension to Kennedy Street, in a general southesaterly direction along Kennedy Street to Banksia Street, east and southeast along Banksia Street to Murdock Drive, and in a general westerly direction along Murdock Drive to Forrest Circle.
- The boundary parts of Forrest Circle (east side), northern arm of Mitchie Crescent (both sides), Kennedy Street (west side), Banksia Street (both sides), and Murdock Drive (north side) are included within the area for the Cassia Primary School.

Children attending Government schools and in Years 1 to 7 inclusive in 1981 and living within the boundary for the Cassia Primary School, as provided above, shall attend the Cassia Primary School, except that children in Year 7 in 1981 shall have the option of completing their primary education at their present (1980) school or of transferring to the new Cassia Primary School.

(b) South Hedland Primary School:

The boundary for the above-mentioned school is as follows:----

- From the junction of Forrest Circle and Collier Drive, northeast, north and northwest along Forrest Circle to the northern arm of Mitchie Crescent, northeast along the northern arm of Mitchie Crescent and its extension to Kennedy Street, in a general northerly direction along Kennedy Street to the boundary of lots 2426 and 2437 on the eastern side of Kennedy Street, in a general northeasterly direction along the southern boundaries of Lots 2426 and 2427 to and across Stanley Street and continuing in a northeasterly direction along the southeastern boundaries of lots 2267 and 2268, of Mauger Place and of Lots 2311, and 2312 to Traine Crescent, northwest along Traine Crescent to the southern boundary of lot 2334 on the eastern side of Traine Crescent, northeast along the southeast boundaries of lots 2334, 2335 and 2333 to the northern extremity of Catamore Court, continuing northeast along the southeastern boundary of Lot 1, the northeastern extremity of Traine Crescent and the eastern extremity of Edkins Place, and along the southeastern boundaries of lots 2145 and 2144, and then to and across Greene Place to North Circular Road.
- The boundary parts of Forrest Circle (west side from Collier Drive to the northern arm of Mitchie Crescent) and Kennedy Street (west side) are included within the area for the South Hedland Primary School, whereas the boundary part of Mitchie Crescent (both sides) is excluded from the area for the South Hedland Primary School.

The following area is to be an optional area between South Hedland Primary School and Baler Primary School:

From the junction of Forrest Circle and Collier Drive, northeast along Forrest Circle to Murdock Drive, in a general easterly direction along Murdock Drive to Masters Way, in a general southerly direction along Masters Way to Collier Drive, and west and then north along Collier Drive to Forrest Circle. The boundary parts of Forrest Circle (southeast side), Murdock Drive (south side), Collier Drive (north and east sides) and the boundary street of Masters Way (west side) are included in the optional area.

Children attending Government schools and in Years 1 to 7 inclusive in 1981 and living within the boundary for South Hedland Primary School, as provided above, shall attend the South Hedland Primary School, except that children in Year 7 in 1981 and currently (1980) enrolled at Baler Primary School may complete their primary education at Baler Primary School.

(c) Baler Primary School:

The boundary for the above-mentioned school is as follows:—

- From the junction of North Circular Road and Murdock Drive, southwest along Murdock Drive to Banksia Street, northwest along Banksia Street to Kennedy Street, in a general northwesterly and northerly direction along Kennedy Street to the boundary of lots 2426 and 2437 on the eastern side of Kennedy Street, in a general northeasterly direction along the southern boundaries of lots 2426 and 2427. to and across Stanley Street and continuing in a northeasterly direction along the southeastern boundaries of lots 2267 and 2268, of Mauger Place and of lots 2311 and 2312 to Traine Crescent, northwest along Traine Crescent to the southern boundary of lot 2334 on the eastern side of Traine Crescent, northeast along the southeastern boundaries of lots 2334, 2335 and 2333 to the northern extremity of Catamore Court, continuing northeast along the southeastern boundary of lot 1, the northeastern extremity of Traine Crescent and the eastern extremity of Edkins Place, along the southeastern boundaries of lots 2145 and 2144, to and across Greene Place to North Circular Road, and then in an easterly and southeasterly direction along North Circular Road to Murdock Drive.
- The boundary parts of Murdock Drive. The boundary parts of Murdock Drive (north side) and North Circular Road (west side) and Kennedy Street (east side) are included within the area for the Baler Primary School, whereas the boundary parts of Banksia Street (both sides), Kennedy Street (west side) and Traine Crescent (both sides) are excluded from the area for the Baler Primary School.

The following area is to be an optional area between Baler Primary School and South Hedland Primary School:—

From the junction of Forrest Circle and Collier Drive, northeast along Forrest Circle to Murdock Drive, in a general easterly direction along Murdock Drive to Masters Way, in a general southerly direction along Masters Way to Collier Drive, and then west and north along Collier Drive, and then west and north along Collier Drive to Forrest Circle. The boundary parts of Forrest Circle (southeast side), Murdock Drive (south side), Collier Drive (north and east sides), and the boundary street of Masters Way (west side) are included in the optional area.

Children attending Government schools and in Years 1 to 7 inclusive in 1981 and living within the boundary for the Baler Primary School, as provided above, shall attend the Baler Primary School, except that children in Year 7 in 1981 and currently (1980) enrolled at South Hedland Primary School may complete their primary education at South Hedland Primary School.

9. Warriapendi Primary School:

The boundary for the abovementioned school is as follows:---

- From the junction of Balga Avenue with Mirrabooka Avenue, north along Mirrabooka Avenue to Beach Road, west along Beach Road to the east boundary of Lot 21, south along the eastern boundary of Lot 21 to a point east of the extension of the northern arm of Coniston Way, west from this point to Coniston Way, south along the eastern extremity of Coniston Way and continuing south to and between Ambleside Close on on the west and Barlow Way on the east to Uliswater Place, west along Uliswater Place to Princess Road, south along Princess Road to Balga Avenue and east, southeast and east along Balga Avenue to Mirrabooka Avenue.
- The boundary parts of Mirrabooka Avenue (west side), Beach Road (south side), Ullswater Place (south side) and the boundary street of Balga Avenue (north side) are included in the area for the Warriapendi Primary School, while the boundary parts of Coniston Way (both sides) and Princess Road (both sides) are excluded from the area for the Warriapendi Primary School.
- Children attending Government schools and in Years 1-7 inclusive in 1981 and living within the area for the Warriapendi Primary School, as provided above, shall attend the Warriapendi Primary School except that children in Year 7 in 1981 who currently (1980) attend another primary school may complete their primary education at that school or may transfer to the Warriapendi Primary School.
