In The Matter of the Commonwealth Electoral Act 1918 and in The Matter of the election of one member of the House of Representatives for the Electoral Division of Kalgoorlie in the State of Western Australia.

Between John Francis Cotter, Petitioner and Graeme Campbell, Respondent.

To the High Court of Australia sitting as the Court of Disputed Returns.

THE humble petition of John Francis Cotter of 5 Macdonald Street, Coolgardie, in the State of Western Australia sheweth as follows:—

1. Your petitioner is a person who was a candidate at the election of one member of the House of Representatives for the Electoral Division of Kalgoorlie in the State of Western Australia to serve in the Parliament of the Commonwealth which election was held on Saturday 18 October 1980.

2. Your petitioner says that the Respondent, Graeme Campbell (hereinafter called Campbell) of 72 Hare Street, Kalgoorlie in the State of Western

Australia was a candidate in the said election for the said Electoral Division of Kalgoorlie. After distribution of preferences of the other candidate, the final voting figures were:—

Kalgoorlie—

Graeme Campbell	ALP	28 889
Your Petitioner	LP	28 241

Your petitioner craves leave to refer to the full voting figures as if set forth herein. Your Petitioner was the candidate endorsed by the Liberal Party of Australia for the electorate of Kalgoorlie.

3. On the 30th day of October 1980 the Divisional Returning Officer for the Electoral Division of Kalgoorlie Jack Bradley Manders declared that the said Campbell had been elected and certified on the Writ the name of Graeme Campbell and the Writ was returned through the Commonwealth Electoral Officer for the State of Western Australia to the Governor-General on 14 November 1980.

4. Your petitioner further says that Campbell in September and October 1980 and at all material times was a member of the Australian Labor Party and was selected and endorsed by the said Australian Labor Party as its candidate for the said Electoral Division of Kalgoorlie.

5. And your petitioner further says that in September and October 1980 one David Combe was the National Secretary of the Australian Labor Party.

6. And your petitioner further says that in or about September or October 1980 an agreement, arrangement or understanding was made between the said Campbell and the said David Combe and other officers of the Australian Labor Party that the said David Combe, either alone or in association with other persons authorised on his behalf or on behalf of the Australian Labor Party, would prepare and issue advertising material for publication on behalf of, *inter alia*, Campbell in daily and weekly newspapers, television stations and radio stations for circulation and/or dissemination, *inter alia*, on behalf of the said Campbell in the said Electoral Division of Kalgoorlie and generally on behalf of the endorsed candidates standing for election on behalf of the Australian Labor Party.

7. Your petitioner further says that in September or October 1980 the said David Combe for and on behalf of the Australian Labor Party and candidates endorsed on its behalf including the said Campbell prepared for publication and dissemination advertising material which is more fully described in the following paragraphs.

8. Your petitioner further says that on the authorisation of the said David Combe on behalf of the said Australian Labor Party there was caused to be published, *inter alia* on the following dates and in the following newspapers circulating extensively in the said Electoral Division of Kalgoorlie, a full page advertisement which consisted of nine newspaper posters with various headings appearing on them as are more fully described below under which appeared in large type the words "Bad News from Mr. Fraser" which were then followed by further words in small type which are also more fully described below:—

Newspaper; Date.

*The West Australian*; 4 October 1980.

The newspaper posters, from left to right and down the page contained the following words:—

1. "Late Final: Up go tax, smokes, drink, petrol. Out goes Medibank. It's a Horror".
2. "City Extra: New Health Slug".
3. "City Extra: Petrol Price Spirals".
4. "City Extra: Tax Cuts: Families Miss Out".
5. "City Extra: \$9 a week on your bills Slugged!".
6. "Late Final: Tax Levy stays. Health aid goes. Lies, Lies, Lies".
7. "Late Final: Home Loan costs to rise again".
8. "City Extra: 5.2 cents increase Petrol: New Shock".

9. "City Extra: One in five teenagers out of work. Jobless Hits Record".

Under those newspaper posters, which occupied approximately five sixths of the page, appeared the following words in large type:

"BAD NEWS FROM MR. FRASER".

Under the words appearing above appeared the following words:

"Over the last two years, income tax has gone up an incredible 31%. On top of that we pay a crippling petrol tax. So today, the average Australian family is sixteen dollars a week worse off. For five years the Fraser Government has been taking, without giving anything back. And that's really not good enough."

There then appeared a photograph of Mr. William Hayden, the Parliamentary leader of the Australian Labor Party together with a representation of the Australian Flag under which appeared the words:

"RAISE THE STANDARD. VOTE ALP".

In the advertisement in small type appeared the following words:—

"(Advertisement) Authorised by David Combe, John Curtin House, Canberra."

Your petitioner craves leave to refer in full to all such advertisements when produced at the hearing.

9. Your petitioner further says that on the authorisation of the said David Combe on behalf of the said Australian Labor Party, there was caused to be published, *inter alia* on the following dates and in the following newspapers circulating extensively in the said Electoral Division of Kalgoorlie, a full page advertisement which consisted of a large newspaper poster which occupied approximately five sixths of the page and which contained in large type the following words:—

"CITY EXTRA: CHEAPER PETROL RESPONSIBLE TAX CUTS"

Under that newspaper poster appeared the following words in large type:—

"GOOD NEWS FROM MR. HAYDEN".

Under the words appearing above appeared the following words:—

"In a country as rich as Australia, we shouldn't pay more tax every year. Bill Hayden's tax cuts mean an extra \$3 a week in everyone's pay packet. And he'll freeze the price of our Australian oil. Responsible tax cuts, and cheaper petrol will lead to a better economy and to less inflation. And that's something we can all afford."

There then appeared a photograph of Mr. Hayden, the Parliamentary leader of the Australian Labor Party together with a representation of the Australian flag under which appeared the words:—

"Raise the Standard. Vote ALP".

In the advertisement in small type appeared the following words:—

"(Advertisement) Authorised by D. Combe, John Curtin House, Canberra."

Newspaper; Date.

*The West Australian*; 10 October 1980.

Your petitioner craves leave to refer in full to all such advertisements when produced at the hearing.

10. Your petitioner further says that on the authority of the said David Combe for and on behalf of *inter alia* the said Campbell, advertisements relating to similar subject matter were transmitted from and published by the television stations, which are more fully particularised below together with in each case one of the times at which such transmissions occurred, all of which transmissions were received by viewers in the Electoral Division of Kalgoorlie.

The advertisements appeared, *inter alia*, on the following television stations:

Your petitioner craves leave to refer in full to the texts and recordings of the said advertisements when produced at the hearing.

11. Your petitioner further says that the said advertisements and each of them referred to in paragraphs 8, 9 and 10 contained untrue and incorrect statements and were intended to and/or were likely to mislead the electors in the Electoral Division of Kalgoorlie in or in relation to the casting of their votes.

12. Your petitioner further says that in particular and without limiting the generality of paragraph 11 the following statements contained in the

said advertisements were untrue and incorrect and were intended to and/or were likely to mislead the electors:

- (a) In the advertisements referred to in paragraph 8:
  - (i) "Over the last two years, income tax has gone up an incredible 31%"
  - (ii) "So today, the average Australian family is sixteen dollars a week worse off"
  - (iii) "For five years the Fraser Government has been taking, without giving anything back".
- (b) In relation to the advertisements referred to in paragraph 9 of this petition:
  - (i) "Cheaper petrol"
  - (ii) "And he'll freeze the price of our Australian oil".

13. Your petitioner further says that in particular, without limiting the generality of paragraph 11, the said advertisements referred to in paragraphs 8, 9 and 10 contained or constituted untrue and incorrect statements in that:

- (a) they falsely represented that the newspaper posters appearing in those advertisements were authentic and were true copies or photographs of newspaper posters which had appeared during the preceding years when the Right Honourable Mr. Malcolm Fraser was the Prime Minister of the Commonwealth of Australia;
- (b) the copies or photographs of the said newspaper posters referred to were not copies or photographs of any such newspaper posters which had appeared during the period referred to in sub-paragraph (a);
- (c) the said newspaper posters referred to in the advertisements were never published.

14. Your petitioner claims that by reason of the matters hereinbefore mentioned illegal practices were committed in connection with the said election contrary to Section 161 of the Commonwealth Electoral Act. Your petitioner further claims, and the fact is, that the said illegal practices were committed by David Combe and the said Campbell and each of them.

15. Your petitioner further says that the said illegal practices were committed with the knowledge and authority of the said Campbell.

16. Further, or in the alternative, your petitioner says that the result of the election was likely to be affected by the advertisements (being or constituting illegal practices) hereinbefore referred to and each of them within the meaning of section 191 (3) of the Commonwealth Electoral Act.

17. Your petitioner further says that it is just that the said Campbell should be declared not to be duly elected and that his said election should be declared void.

Your petitioner therefore prays:

1. That it may be declared that the said Campbell was not duly elected and that his election be declared void.
2. That it be declared that your Petitioner was duly elected and ought to have been returned.
3. In the alternative, that it may be ordered that a new election be held for the Electoral Division of Kalgoorlie in the State of Western Australia.
4. That the said Campbell be ordered to pay the costs of this petition.
5. That such further or other order may be made as the nature of the case may require.

To the High Court of Australia sitting as the Court of Disputed Returns.

PETITION against the return of Ross Malcolm McLean as the duly elected member to serve in the House of Representatives for the said electoral division at the election held on the 18th day of October, 1980.

The petition of Ruth Cullen of 166 Lake Street, Perth in the State of Western Australia, Waitress, an elector for the election held on the 18th day of October 1980 to elect a member for the House of Representatives for the electoral division of Perth in the State of Western Australia hereby sheweth:—

1. That by a Writ given under the hand of Sir Zelman Cowen, Knight of the Order of Australia, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Grand Cross of the Royal Victorian Order, Knight of the Most Venerable Order of the Hospital of Saint John of Jerusalem, Counsel learned in the Law, Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia and Commander in Chief of the Defence Forces at Canberra and under the Public Seal of the Commonwealth on the 19th day of September, 1980 and directed to John Brown Returning Officer for the electoral division of Perth in the State of Western Australia the said John Brown was commanded to cause an election to be made according to law of one member of the House of Representatives for the electoral division of Perth to serve in the Parliament of the Commonwealth of Australia and the following dates were appointed for the purpose of the said election:—

- (a) For the nomination, Saturday the 27th day of September, 1980.
- (b) For the taking of the poll, Saturday the 18th day of October, 1980.
- (c) For the return of the Writ, on or before Wednesday, the 17th day of December, 1980.

2. That the following persons were duly nominated as candidates for the said election:—

The said Ross Malcolm McLean (hereinafter sometimes called "McLean"), William Timothy Delaney (hereinafter called "Delaney"), Robert Anthony Foster (hereinafter called "Foster") and June Steen-Olsen (hereinafter called "Olsen").

3. That an election pursuant to the said Writ was held on Saturday the 18th day of October, 1980.

4. That upon the scrutiny of the votes cast at the election after counting the unrejected ballot papers the number of first preference votes given for each candidate was:—

Delaney	...	...	...	...	27 599
Foster	...	...	...	...	3 122
McLean	...	...	...	...	29 131
Steen-Olsen	...	...	...	...	551

5. That no candidate having received an absolute majority of first preference votes Steen-Olsen was excluded and each ballot paper counted to her was counted to the candidate next in order of the voters' preference and then Foster was excluded and each ballot counted to him was counted to the candidate next in order of the voters' preference.

That McLean was then found to have an absolute majority of the votes cast.

7. That on the 28th day of October, 1980 the said Returning Officer declared the result of the election as follows:—

and declared McLean duly elected.

8. That the said Returning Officer did by endorsement on the said Writ certify the candidate elected and return the said Writ on the 10th day of November, 1980 through the Commonwealth Electoral Office for the State of Western Australia.

9. Your Petitioner sets out the following facts and relies upon them to invalidate the election.

(a) The following article was published on page 1 of all editions of *The Australian* of Thursday the 9th day of October, 1980 under the title in heavy print:—

**"BANK ACCOUNTS FACE  
LABOR'S TAX INQUIRY"**

and thereunder:—

**"HOWARD CLAIMS 'SNOOPERS'  
WILL CHECK ON PUBLIC"**

In the following words:—

"Liberal Party Planners said last night that the ALP is ready to form a Royal Commission into wealth with powers to investigate tax returns, banks accounts and other indicators of personal income if it wins the election.

"The powers the Liberals believe would be given to the Inquiry are described in documents drawn up in the accord between the ALP and the Trade-Union movement, signed in August. Few details have been openly discussed by Labor leaders in the election campaign.

But they have confirmed that such an inquiry would be a major priority of a Labor Government.

In its document, relationships between the ALP and the Trade Unions, the ALP agree to set up the Inquiry into wealth and give it the power to subpoena anyone it wanted "so that it would not be frustrated in its endeavours by the unco-operative attitudes those with something to hide."

The document adds: "The Commission could hold special inquiries into various sensitive areas such as tax avoidance, capital gains, fringe benefits and professional fees."

The Liberals say this commitment, giving subpoena powers and specifically mentioning tax and fringe benefits, would mean people making available tax returns. Provisions in the Income Tax Act prevent such action at the moment.

"Overtones".

The first coalition attack on the wealth tax front was made by the Treasurer, Mr. Howard, yesterday.

He said the machinery the ALP would set up would probe the personal assets of most people.

The Commission had "sinister overtones" and would have the effect of snooping into people's assets and incomes. He said: "I can only see the Inquiry into wealth as a punitive exercise against capital accumulation both large and small.

"The ramifications are that a very large number of ordinary Australians would be subjected to inquiry. It will put a lot of fear and concern into

the minds of people who will wonder throughout the duration of the inquiry as to what is going to come out of it."

"I believe the real reason is that this is a commitment that the Labor party has to make to placate the more radical elements in their ranks who believe there should be a radical redistribution of wealth in the Australian community."

He said he saw a natural evolution of such an inquiry as such the introduction of a capital gains and a wealth tax and probably some reintroduction of death duties or a combination of them."

"If they have a capital gains tax, will people have to put in their homes? Are they going to have to provide an inventory of their personal assets at the end of each year?"

The idea that capital gains and wealth taxes affected only a small part of the population was "for the birds", he said.

"They would affect the capital transactions of hundreds of thousands of people who would regard themselves as ordinary Australians who have been very thrifty and very careful in accumulating a certain amount of capital.

"It is that sort of group I believe has most to fear from an inquiry."

Meanwhile the Prime Minister, Mr. Fraser, switched his campaign attack to the associated inflationary impact of Labor's policies. A confidential Liberal party survey has revealed this is the most sensitive issue in the electorate.

A national survey conducted last weekend confirmed the ALP's lead in a public opinion poll.

Liberal party sources said although their poll confirmed Labor's popularity, it also reinforced the basic party strategy of fighting the election on the issues of economic responsibility, the effects of inflation and national security.

In Adelaide, Mr. Fraser made television commercials to run at the weekend which focus on the inflation issue.

Mr. Fraser quoted Mr. Hayden as saying: "we propose, without any apology at all, the introduction of a capital gains tax, resource rental tax and restructuring of the tax scale to raise more revenue."

(b) The following article was published on page 1 of all editions of "The West Australian" of Tuesday the 14th day of October 1980:

#### LABOR TAX POLICY A KEY ISSUE

The dispute over Labor policy on capital gains and wealth taxes remained a key election issue yesterday.

The Prime Minister, Mr. Fraser, said "The Labor Party is obviously frightened of this issue and has tied itself in knots over it."

He claimed that Labor Party pledges that a capital gains tax would not be introduced during the first term of a Labor government were ineffective.

The Leader of the Opposition, Mr. Hayden, did not have the authority of caucus, he said. He was bound by the party platform.

He went on: "There has been a dozen times over the last couple of years when Mr. Hayden and Mr. Bowen (Labor's Deputy Leader) and other members of the Labor Party have made it quite clear that they were giving a total commitment to these kind of taxes.

## MAXIMUM PRICES TO AUTHORITY

Maximum price to be paid to the Authority by dairy produce factories for market milk at the rate of 25.06 cents per litre.

Maximum price to be paid to the Authority by dairy produce factories for special products milk at the rate of 22.92 cents per litre.

## MAXIMUM TRANSPORT CHARGES (Market Milk only)

Maximum charge for transport of market milk purchased by the Authority from dairy produce factories outside the metropolitan area to dairy produce factories in the metropolitan area at the rate of 1.30 cents per litre.

## OTHER CHARGES (Market Milk only)

Maximum charge for treatment, excluding pasteurisation and packing, of market milk at dairy produce factories outside the metropolitan area at the rate of 1.51 cents per litre.

Maximum price to be charged at dairy produce factories in the metropolitan area for market milk received for treatment from dairy produce factories outside the metropolitan area at the rate of 29.23 cents per litre.

## ACCEPTANCE AND DISPOSAL OF MILK BY THE AUTHORITY

is found by the Department of Agriculture of Western Australia on a certain day to contain anti-biotic on a second occasion after January 1 1981 or a second occasion in any subsequent quota year, milk supplied by that dairyman for that one day will not be accepted by the Authority as market milk or special products milk.

is found by the Department of Agriculture of Western Australia on a certain day to contain anti-biotic on a third or succeeding occasion after January 1 1981 or on a third or succeeding occasion in any subsequent quota year, milk supplied by that dairyman for the duration of the testing period in which that day occurs will not be accepted by the Authority as market milk or special products milk.

is found by the Department of Agriculture of Western Australia on a certain day to contain added water on the first occasion after January 1 1981 or on the first occasion in any subsequent quota year, milk supplied by that dairyman for that one day will not be accepted by the Authority as market milk or special products milk.

is found by the Department of Agriculture of Western Australia on a certain day to contain added water on a second or succeeding occasion after January 1 1981 or on a second or succeeding occasion in any subsequent quota year, milk supplied by that dairyman for the duration of the testing period in which that day occurs will not be accepted by the Authority as market milk or special products milk.

is found by the Department of Agriculture of Western Australia on a certain day to contain added solids on the first occasion after January 1 1981 or on the first occasion in any subsequent quota year, milk supplied by that dairyman will not be accepted by the Authority as market milk or special products milk for a minimum of two testing periods.

is found by the Department of Agriculture of Western Australia on a certain day to contain added solids on a second or succeeding occasion after January 1 1981 or a second or succeeding occasion in any subsequent quota year, milk supplied by that dairyman will not be accepted by the Authority as market milk or special products milk for a minimum of four testing periods.

is found by the Department of Agriculture of Western Australia on a certain day to have a freezing point determination above MINUS 0.522°C, milk supplied by that dairyman will not be accepted by the Authority as market milk or special products milk in accordance with the aforementioned conditions applying to added water.

is found by the Department of Agriculture of Western Australia on a certain day after January 1 1981, or on any day in a subsequent quota year, to have a bacterial content of over 50 000 bacteria per millilitre not less than 10 days after an initial examination within a calendar month indicating over 100 000 bacteria per millilitre, or after two initial examinations within the quota year indicating over 100 000 bacteria per millilitre, or after two consecutive initial examinations indicating over 50 000 bacteria per millilitre, milk supplied by that dairyman for that one day will not be accepted by the Authority as market milk or special products milk.

Where milk delivered by a dairyman is acceptable as market milk or special products milk and the abovementioned prices for market milk or special products milk apply—

market milk or special products milk delivered by a dairyman to the Authority is accepted by the Authority at the dairyman's registered dairy produce premises.

market milk or special products milk delivered by a dairyman and accepted by the Authority is disposed of by the Authority to the dairy produce factory at the point of acceptance by the Authority.

PROVIDED THAT nothing in the Dairy Industry Act, 1973, requires the Authority to accept all or any milk delivered to it by any person; and milk delivered to and accepted by the Authority may be disposed of by the Authority to milk vendors or other persons.
