WHEREAS it is enacted by subsection (2) of section 15 and subsections (2) and (3) of section 152 of the Petroleum Act, 1967 that notwithstanding the Land Act, 1933 or any other Act the Governor, by proclamation, may declare that any land of the Crown or part thereof reserved for or dedicated to any public purpose under any Act and howsoever classified that:

(a) is not Crown land within the meaning of that expression in Section 5 of the Act; and

(b) is specified in the proclamation, is Crown land for the purposes of the Petroleum Act, 1967 and is land to which that Act applies, so long as the proclamation remains in force: Now, therefore, I the Governor acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in the exercise of the powers under subsection (2) of section 15 of the Petroleum Act, 1967, do hereby declare that the land of the Crown comprising Reserve No. 30490 classified as Class "A" and set apart for the purpose of Conservation of Flora and Fauna pursuant to the provisions of the Land Act, 1933 is Crown land for the purposes of the Petroleum Act, 1967 and is land to which the Petroleum Act, 1967 applies so long as this proclamation remains in force, subject to:—

- (i) Prior to the granting of a production licence within the reserve, the applicant supplying the Minister for Mines with an Environmental Review and Management Programme (ERMP), for study by the Environmental Protection Authority whose recommendations will be considered by the Minister.
- (ii) Survey lines within the reserve being delineated with minimum interference to and disturbance of vegetation and timber, avoiding, where practicable, fragile areas such as steep slopes, wetlands and thickets of timber. Any clearing and construction of tracks to be limited to a superficial blading and filling in of soil irregularities only, so that as far as is practicable the topsoil with its contained seed and rootstocks is left in place. Any shot holes drilled being filled in and left in a safe and level condition.
- (iii) Movement of vehicles within the reserve being restricted to survey lines and existing constructed tracks.
- (iv) All vehicles that have been off made roads must on entering the area be washed down according to the Forest Department's Vehicles Hygiene prescription to prevent the spread of "Phytophthora cinnamomi".
- (v) No open fires being lit except for testing, in a properly constructed burn-pit.
- (vi) In carrying out petroleum exploration within a reserve the permittee, their employees or contractors are exempted from the following provisions of the Wildlife Conservation Act and Regulations 44 (2) and 46 (a) (b) (c) (d) (f) (g) (l) and (o) in so far as they pertain to petroleum exploration on the exploration permit.
- (vii) No dumping of rubbish, spillage of fuels, oils, etc., or discharge of other pollutants within the reserve.
- (viii) On completion or abandonment of any operational area such measures as are reasonably practical being taken to restore the area to its original condition.

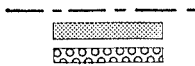

THE Shire of Mandurah under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon it in that behalf of the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928, (as amended) hereby makes the following Town Planning Scheme.

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Scheme Text.

PART I.—PRELIMINARY.

1.1 Citation.

This Town Planning Scheme may be cited as Shire of Mandurah Town Planning Scheme No. 2—East Mandurah Development Scheme (hereinafter referred to as "the Scheme").

1.2 Objects.

The objects of the Scheme are—

1.2.1 To provide for facilitate and co-ordinate the progressive subdivision and development of land within the Scheme Area.

1.2.2 To ensure the provision of roads, water supply, sewerage and drainage services within the Scheme Area.

1.2.3 To make provision for land to be used for public open space, public recreation and other community purposes and to facilitate and provide for the acquisition of such land by the Council.

1.2.4 To plan the situation of and make provisions relating to the acquisition of school sites within the Scheme Area.

1.2.5 To make provisions for lands to be used for Local Centres.

1.2.6 To provide for the sharing of the costs of the Scheme among the owners of land in the Scheme Area.

1.3 Responsible Authority.

The Authority responsible for enforcing the observance of the Scheme is the Shire of Mandurah (hereinafter referred to as "the Council").

1.4 Maps.

The following maps are attached to the Text and form part of the Scheme—

Index Map;

Land Use Map comprising 2 sheets at 1:5 000;

Scheme Map, comprising 1 sheet at 1:10 000,
and 1 sheet at 1:5 000 of the First Major
Development Area;

Scheme Works Map;

Concept Map, comprising 1 sheet at 1:10 000.

1.5 Scheme Area.

The Scheme shall apply to the land contained within the inner edge of a broken black line on the Land Use Map and on the Scheme Map. The said land is hereinafter referred to as "the Scheme Area".

1.6 Interpretation.

In the Scheme unless the context otherwise requires the following terms shall have the meaning set out hereunder—

"Act" means the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended).

"Board" means the Town Planning Board of Western Australia.

"Final approval of the Board" in relation to the subdivision of land means the approval of the Board to a plan or diagram of survey depicting the lots created or to be created by the subdivision of the land after all (if any) conditions imposed by the Board have been carried out.

"Gross subdivisible area" means the area of land the subject of a subdivision excluding land to be used for local centres, school sites and controlled access roads but including lands that are to be used for public open space and drainage as drainage basins or as roads (other than controlled access roads) and all other parts thereof.

"P.O.S. Land" means land shown on the Scheme Map or on a Subdivisional Guide Map as Public Open Space and Drainage or as Drainage Basins.

"Road costs" means the costs of construction of a road or pedestrian accessway and includes costs of the following:—

- (a) the survey of the boundaries of the road or pedestrian accessway;
- (b) all necessary levelling and grading and other earthworks;
- (c) the clearing, construction and paving of the carriageway of the road and pedestrian accessway;
- (d) all necessary drainage works;
- (e) the provision of road kerbing;
- (f) the construction and paving of a footpath on one side of the road except in cases where this is considered unnecessary by the Council;
- (g) the provision and erection of street name signs;
- (h) the upgrading of existing roads within the general area of or adjoining a subdivision.

PART II.—METHOD OF CARRYING OUT OBJECTS.

2.1 Plans and Subdivision.

2.1.1 The Scheme Map provides for the location of public open space, drainage sites, local centres and other purposes shown thereon. It also includes a detailed subdivisional design of the lands which it is proposed will be the First Major Development Area. The first stage of this Major Development Area is shown on the Scheme Map and comprises the lands in which essential services will first be available.

2.1.2 The Council may from time to time prepare amendments to the Scheme Map providing for the detailed subdivisions of such other parts of the Scheme Area as it considers to be Major Development Areas or of parts thereof for the progressive provision of essential services and for the apportionment of and contribution to the Scheme Costs.

2.1.3 The Council may divide the Major Development Scheme Areas into such stages of development as it considers to be convenient for the progressive subdivision of land the provision of services the carrying out of works and to the apportionment of Scheme Costs. The Council may from time to time alter the boundaries of the stages.

2.1.4 The Council may instead of or in addition to the preparation of amendments to the Scheme Map from time to time cause to be prepared Subdivisional Guide Maps of Major Development Areas or of parts thereof in order to guide the planning of the subdivision in the area and to co-ordinate the planning of subdivision or development.

2.1.5 When a Subdivisional Guide Map shall have been prepared for a Major Development Area or a part thereof it shall be submitted to the Board for its approval. If the Board shall grant its approval to a Subdivisional Guide Map no land in that Major Development Area shall without the consent of the Board and of the Council be subdivided otherwise than in accordance with that map.

2.1.6 The Council may with the consent of the Board permit alterations or variations to the Scheme Map or to a Subdivisional Guide Map where in the opinion of the Council circumstances justify such action provided that no such alteration or variation shall be permitted if in the opinion of the Council it would impede the subdivision and development of the Scheme Area as a whole.

2.1.7 A person wishing to subdivide land within the Scheme Area shall make application to the Board for its approval in accordance with the Act. Such subdivision shall be subject to the preceding clause be in accordance with the Scheme Map and in accordance with a Subdivisional Guide Map (if any) for that area approved by the Board.

PART III.—DEVELOPMENT REQUIREMENTS.

3.1 Survey.

An owner who subdivides his land shall carry out a survey of the land in accordance with the plan of subdivision approved by the Board.

3.2 New Roads and Pedestrian Accessways.

3.2.1 Subject to the following clauses each owner of land within the Scheme Area shall when subdividing his land make the land available for the roads and pedestrian accessways shown on his approved plan of subdivision and shall carry out the survey, the construction, paving and drainage of the roads and pedestrian accessways within the land the subject of the subdivision and shall pay all the road costs in respect thereof.

3.2.2 In case of those roads having a pavement width exceeding seven metres (7 m) the owner shall pay only so much of the road costs as would have been payable if the pavement width had been only seven metres (7 m) and the road reserve width only twenty metres (20 m). The additional road costs and the cost of acquisition of land exceeding twenty metres (20 m) shall be paid by the Council and form part of the Scheme Costs. Roads having a width exceeding seven metres (7 m) are referred to as Scheme Roads on the Scheme Map.

3.2.3 The roads shall be constructed in accordance with specifications and of materials approved by the Council and in accordance with its standard requirements for sub-divisional road construction.

3.2.4 Subject to the provisions of this clause and of Clause 3.2.2 the Council shall pay one half of the road costs in respect of the section of a road that adjoins public open space or other public facilities or the flood plain of the Serpentine River or of Peel Inlet and the owner's liability in respect thereof shall be reduced accordingly. This clause does not apply to the end alignment of a cul-de-sac road if that is the only part of the road which adjoins the public open space or other public facility. If the location of the public open space or public facility is changed or the site thereof is cancelled the Council's liability under this clause shall be transferred to the new site or cancelled as the case may be. Where a road to which this clause applies has been constructed by or on behalf of an owner the Council's contribution is one half of the amount the Council considers to be a fair and reasonable cost of the construction of the road and if there is any dispute between the Council and an owner as to what is a fair and reasonable cost it may be referred to arbitration. Where insufficient moneys to enable it to make the payment have been received by the Council in respect of that portion of the Scheme Costs attributable to roads, a payment to be made by the Council under this clause may be postponed until sufficient moneys have been paid to it.

3.2.5 Pinjarra Road and the Main Roads Department's main access highway are not reserved by the Scheme. Those roads are shown on the Scheme Map only because it is understood that the location of those roads will be as shown thereon. The owners of land within the Scheme Area shall not be responsible for any road costs of Pinjarra Road or of the Main Roads Department's main access highway or to make land available free of cost for those roads.

3.2.6 In cases where the situation of a new road or pedestrian accessway within the Scheme Area is such that in the opinion of the Council it would be fair and equitable that the owners of land adjoining the road or pedestrian accessway or being served by it, other than the Council should each contribute to the road costs and apportion the value of land made available for roads and pedestrian accessways and the owners are unable to agree upon the proportion of the costs payable by each of them, the amount (if any) payable by each owner shall be determined by arbitration in manner hereinafter provided and payment shall be made according to the award of the arbitrator.

3.2.7 The Council may survey, construct, pave and drain any new roads and pedestrian accessways within the Scheme Area and acquire the land necessary for that purpose or may upgrade any of the existing roads. If the Council shall do so prior to the subdivision of the lands adjoining such road or pedestrian accessways the road costs and all compensation and other costs consequent upon the acquisition of the land shall be paid to the Council by each respective owner of land in accordance with the foregoing provisions before the final approval of the Board to the subdivision of his land but the Council shall not demand or seek to enforce payment before the date on which the owner makes application to the Board for that final approval, unless the owner has agreed to pay the road costs before that date.

3.2.8 If an owner shall subdivide his land and if he or his predecessors in title shall have claimed or shall have been paid compensation by reason of the resumption by the Council of the land for a new road or pedestrian accessway within the Scheme Area he shall before the final approval by the Board to his plan of subdivision release the Council from the payment of compensation or repay to the Council the compensation paid by it to him or his predecessors in title as the case may be but the Council shall not demand or seek to enforce payment before the date on which the owner makes application to the Board for that final approval, unless the owner has agreed to repay the compensation before that date.

3.3 Closure of Roads.

3.3.1 Those roads and rights of way within the Scheme Area which are shown on the Scheme Map or on a Subdivisional Guide Map as roads to be closed shall be closed as the development of the land proceeds and as such roads and rights of way are no longer required. When the said roads and rights of way shall be closed the land shall be used for the purposes shown on the Scheme Map or the Subdivisional Guide Map and if the land is to be used for residential or other development by the owners the land shall vest in adjoining owners subject to the payment to the Council of the value of such land.

3.4 Water Supply and Sewerage Works.

3.4.1 The Council may acquire any land it considers necessary for water supply and sewerage works. Any land acquired by the Council pursuant to this clause shall be vested in the Crown.

3.4.2 The water supply works and sewerage works shown on the Scheme Works Map shall progressively and at the appropriate time be carried out and the cost thereof less any contribution by the Public Works Department shall form part of the Scheme Costs and be paid by owners in accordance with the subsequent provisions of the Scheme.

3.4.3 Each owner shall carry out all other water supply and sewerage works required to be carried out in relation to his land at his own expense.

3.5 Connections to the Sewer.

3.5.1 If the Council is of the opinion that the nature of the soil in any part of the Scheme Area is sufficiently absorptive to permit the efficient operation of an apparatus for the bacteriolytic treatment of sewage it may permit the construc-

tion of one dwelling house on a lot in its undivided state as shown on the Land Use Map and the occupation of such dwelling before the sewer is available. Permission to develop given pursuant to this clause does not absolve an owner from his liability to pay a share of the costs or estimated costs of the sewerage works or to connect his land to the sewer when it becomes available. Subject to the foregoing provisions of this clause and to Clause 3.5.2 no building shall be occupied unless the building is connected to the sewer.

3.5.2 Nothing contained in Clause 3.5.1 requires that—

subdivision made before or after the coming into operation of the Scheme or the lot upon which such a dwelling house is erected whether that lot was created by a subdivision made before or after the coming into operation of the Scheme; or

(b) a dwelling house erected after the coming into operation of the Scheme on a lot that existed at the coming into operation of the Scheme;

be connected to a sewer.

3.6 Drainage.

3.6.1 The drainage works shown on the Scheme Works Map shall progressively and at the appropriate time be carried out and the costs thereof shall form part of the Scheme Costs and be paid by owners in accordance with the subsequent provisions of the Scheme.

3.6.2 The drainage works to be carried out on the land shown as Drainage Basins on the Scheme Map shall include earth works, subsoil pipelaying, grading, seeding and the installation of wells or bores and associated pumps, piping and equipment. The said works shall be carried out by the Council and the costs thereof shall be paid by owners proportionately to the areas of land to be contributed for public open space and drainage in accordance with clause 4.1.2. An owner who carries out the drainage works mentioned above shall be reimbursed from the Council as part of Scheme Costs the amount paid by him in excess of his proportionate contribution.

3.7 Earthworks.

3.7.1 Each owner of land situated in the Scheme Area shall upon the subdivision of his land at his own cost carry out all necessary levelling, filling and earthworks on his land so that the land will be of a level not less than that determined by the Council for the land or the Major Development Area in which the land is situated. Before determining a level in accordance with this clause the Council shall obtain from the Public Works Department details of the flood level of the Serpentine River or Peel Inlet adjoining the land or the Major Development Area as the case may be and shall allow a reasonable margin over that flood level.

PART IV.—LAND CONTRIBUTIONS.

4.1 Public Open Space and Drainage Sites.

4.1.1 It is intended that the land shown on the Scheme Map as Public Open Space and Drainage and as Drainage Basins shall be set aside for those purposes. The said lands are herein referred to as "P.O.S. Land". Each owner shall prior to the final approval by the Board of his plan of subdivision transfer to the Council or have vested in the Crown the P.O.S. Land within the area of the land the subject of the subdivision.

4.1.2 Subject to the following clauses each owner of land shall prior to the final approval by the Board to the plan of subdivision of his land within the Scheme Area or any part thereof be required to transfer to or there shall be vested in the Crown an area of land equal to 10.5 per cent of the gross subdivisible area of all his land within the particular stage of development.

4.1.3 Land to be vested in the Crown pursuant to the preceding clause shall be the land shown as public open space and drainage or as drainage basins on the approved plan of subdivision but shall not include any land which is or is intended to be a school site, a road or a pedestrian accessway created by the subdivision or a drainage reserve.

4.1.4 If the land required for P.O.S. Land does not exactly equal 10.5 per cent of the gross subdivisible area being subdivided the owner shall vest in the Crown the P.O.S. Land and also transfer to the Council other land (if practicable) to make the total as near as possible to an area equal to the said 10.5 per cent of the gross subdivisible area being subdivided and the Council shall pay to or receive from the owner an adjustment calculated in accordance with the following clauses.

4.1.5 If the lands required for P.O.S. Land within the area of a subdivision exceed 10.5 per cent of the gross subdivisible area of the subdivision a valuation in globo shall be made as at the date of the final approval of the plan of subdivision by the Board of the land required for public open space on the basis that such land would be used for single residential purposes.

4.1.6 The amount payable to the owner shall be the same proportion of the total value (as ascertained by the preceding clause) of the P.O.S. Land as the proportion which the area of the land required for P.O.S. Land exceeding 10.5 per cent of the total gross subdivisible area bears to the total area of his land required for P.O.S. Land.

4.1.7 If the lands required for P.O.S. Land within the area of a subdivision are less than 10.5 per cent of the gross subdivisible area of the subdivision a valuation in globo shall be made of the whole of the land within the particular stage of development or sub area to ascertain the average value per hectare thereof as at the date of the final approval of the plan of subdivision by the Board.

4.1.8 The amount payable by the owner to the Council shall be the value (as ascertained in the preceding clause) of the area of land by which 10.5 per cent of the gross subdivisible area of the owners land being subdivided exceeds the area of his land required for P.O.S. Land.

4.1.9 The Council may require that the amount payable by the owner to the Council be satisfied wholly or in part by the transfer to the Council of subdivided serviced lots within the subdivision and the balance (if any) be paid in cash.

4.1.10 It is intended that the development be so staged that moneys payable to the Council under clause 4.1.8 will be available to make payment to owners under clause 4.1.6. If an owner shall desire to subdivide his land before sufficient funds are available to make payments to him under clause 4.1.6 the transfer or vesting of the land required for P.O.S. Land and the payment under clause 4.1.6 shall unless the Council and the owner otherwise agree be postponed until the Council has sufficient funds to make the payments to the owner.

4.1.11 If an owner subdividing his land is also the owner of other land within the same Major Development Area not the subject of the proposed subdivision and such other land or part thereof is shown on the Scheme Map or on a Subdivisional Guide Map as P.O.S. Land such owner may if the Council so agrees transfer to the Council such P.O.S. Land or an agreed part thereof (hereinafter referred to as the "Second P.O.S. Land") and the value of the Second P.O.S. Land so transferred shall be credited against the amount payable by the owner under clause 4.1.8 provided that—

- (i) the Second P.O.S. Land shall be valued as at the date of its offer to the Council or as at the date upon which land adjoining it or adjoining the P.O.S. Land of which it forms part was first subdivided whichever produces the lower figure;

- (ii) if the value of the land transferred to the Council or vested in the Crown under clause 4.1.1 is greater than 10.5% of the gross subdivisible area of the land being subdivided the owner may elect that instead of receiving payment under clause 4.1.6 the amount of the excess shall be credited against the amount which would be payable by him on the subsequent subdivision of his land within the Scheme Area;

- (iii) upon the subdivision of the land of which the Second P.O.S. Land formed part the provisions of clause 4.1.2 shall be applied on the basis that the Second P.O.S. Land does not nor did it ever form part of the land the subject of the proposed subdivision.

4.1.12 The Council may sell or otherwise dispose of any land transferred to it under the preceding clauses and not required by it for P.O.S. Land provided that all moneys received by the Council in respect of such sales shall after making all necessary payments to owners under the foregoing clauses be expended by the Council in the acquisition or improvement of land for public open space recreation or drainage purposes in the Scheme Area.

4.1.13 The Council may as and when it deems fit acquire the P.O.S. Land or any parts thereof either by purchase or resumption or partly by one method and partly by the other.

4.1.14 If the Council shall have resumed land for P.O.S. Land or for roads it shall be reimbursed all compensation and costs from moneys received from the sale of land under the preceding clauses.

4.1.15 If the Council shall have resumed land for P.O.S. Land or for roads the amount and value of the said 10.5% of the owner's land shall be assessed on the basis that such land had not been resumed.

4.1.16 If an owner of land shall subdivide his land and if he or his predecessors in title shall have claimed or shall have been paid compensation by reason of the resumption by the Council of P.O.S. Land within the Scheme Area the amount of compensation paid shall be taken into account in assessing the payments to or by an owner in accordance with the foregoing clauses and if no compensation has then been paid the owner shall release the Council from the payment of any such compensation.

4.1.17 Subject to clause 7.5, each owner shall prior to the final approval of the Board to the subdivision of his land carry out or pay to the Council the cost of root picking and general cleaning up of an area of public open space equal to 10.5 per cent of the gross subdivisible area of the land the subject of his application for subdivisional approval, but the Council shall not demand or seek to enforce payment of the amount of that cost before the date upon which the owner makes application to the Board for that final approval.

4.2 School Sites.

4.2.1 High Schools: The position of the proposed high school sites are shown on the Scheme Map. The Council shall not be responsible for the acquisition of the high school sites and any arrangements in respect thereof are to be made by the land owner with the appropriate Minister of the Crown or Government Department. It is intended that the high school sites will each be of an area of not less than 10 hectares.

4.2.2 Primary Schools: The Council shall as and when it deems expedient so to do acquire by purchase or resumption the lands shown on the Scheme Map as Primary School Sites. Each primary school site shall have an area of not less than 4 hectares except where the site is adjacent to active public open space which is not less than 3 hectares in area, in which case the area of the primary school site may, if the Minister for Education agrees to and the Town Planning Board approves of the reduction, be reduced to 3.5 hectares.

4.2.3 The Council shall upon the coming into operation of the Scheme value the primary school sites. The values may be revised from time to time.

4.2.4 An owner's proportion of the value of the primary school sites in a Major Development Area shall be that proportion which the gross subdivisible area of his land in that Major Development Area less any part to be used for P.O.S. bears to the whole of the gross subdivisible area of the Major Development Area less the area to be used for P.O.S.

4.2.5 Each owner shall satisfy his liability to pay his proportion of the costs to the Council of the acquisition of a primary school site before the final approval of the Board to the subdivision of his land either by the transfer of subdivided lots with the appropriate cash adjustment (if any) or if the Council so agrees by payment in cash but the Council shall not demand or seek to enforce any transfer or payment before the date on which the owner makes application to the Board for that final approval, unless the owner has agreed to transfer the lots, with or without a cash adjustment, or to make the payment, as the case may be.

4.2.6 The Council shall assess a fair and just proportion of the costs of roads and services serving or adjoining a primary school site and without limiting the generality of the foregoing the Council may include in the proportion of the costs of roads and services so to be assessed by it any one or more of the following items—

- (a) one half of the costs in relation to any water supply reticulation services by which the site is served;
- (b) one half of the costs with respect to any sewer main by which the site is served together with all of the costs of manholes and sewer mains which serve the site but do not serve other land;
- (c) one half of the road costs of a road which adjoins the site;
- (d) the amount by which it is estimated that the costs of stormwater drains are increased by reason of greater volume of stormwater emanating from the site;
- (e) a proportionate amount (calculated on a use basis) of water and sewerage head-works charges levied on an area basis by the Public Works Department.

4.2.7 The Council shall transfer a primary school site to the Minister for Education or other Government department in order that it may be developed for a primary school.

4.2.8 Where the Council has transferred a primary school site to the Minister for Education or a Government Department the Minister or the Department shall pay to the owner (or to each of them if more than one in the proportions to which they are respectively entitled) the amount assessed by the Council pursuant to clause 4.2.6 within three (3) months after demand in writing therefor. An owner or owners may make demand of the Minister or Department from time to time as and when the costs of roads and services are incurred by him and assessed by the Council under clause 4.2.6. If the Minister or Department does not agree to the amount assessed by the Council the amount payable under this clause shall be determined by arbitration. The Minister or Department shall pay to the owner interest on the amount due to the owner calculated at the rate payable in respect of overdraft accommodation applicable to amounts in excess of one hundred thousand dollars (\$100 000) granted by the Commonwealth Trading Bank of Australia ruling as at the date of the demand for payment from the expiration of three months after the date of demand for payment or after the date of the award of the arbitrator as the case requires. If after the expiration of six years from the date of the transfer of a primary school site by the Council the amount assessed pursuant to clause 4.2.6 or any part of that amount has not been claimed by the person entitled thereto the Minister or Department shall pay that amount to the Council and the Council may expend the amount for the benefit of the Scheme Area.

4.3 Local Centres.

It is intended that the lands shown as Local Centres on the Scheme Map be used for commercial development which may without restricting the generality of the term include shopping centres, offices, service station site, a tavern and a liquor store. The site may also include infant health centres and other civic or community uses. The said lands are not zoned for those purposes by the Scheme. The Council shall negotiate with the land owners in order that the lands be used for the purposes aforesaid.

PART V—SCHEME COSTS.

5. The costs or estimated costs of the following items are hereinafter referred to as "Scheme Costs"—

5.1 Administration Costs: The administration costs of the Scheme including an amount to reimburse the Council for such overhead and supervision costs as may be incurred in the preparation and implementation of the Scheme. The term "administration costs" shall include all legal costs, planning costs, payment to planning consultants, engineers and other professional consultants, surveyors and scheme managers and valuation costs.

5.2 Survey Costs: The costs of any surveys and precalculations carried out by the Council in the Scheme Area.

5.3 Drainage: The costs (if any) incurred by or agreed to be paid by the Council of any drainage work necessary for the proper drainage of the Scheme Area and the acquisition of land for that purpose.

5.4 Sewerage: The cost (if any) incurred by or agreed to be paid by the Council of the sewerage works necessary for the connection of the land in the Scheme Area to a sewer and the acquisition of lands for that purpose and the cost of the acquisition of Sewer Pump Station Sites.

5.5 Water Supply: The costs (if any) incurred by or agreed to be paid by the Council of supplying water throughout the Scheme Area.

5.6 Roads: The costs of the acquisition of land for the widening of Lakes Road Reserve and all legal and survey costs involved and the costs of upgrading and widening the carriageway of Lakes Road.

5.7 The costs to the Council of the survey, construction, paving and drainage of new roads and road widening and the acquisition of land for that purpose in cases where those costs cannot be recouped from owners under the foregoing provisions of the Scheme.

5.8 Relocation of services: The costs of the relocation of any essential services within the Scheme Area including the costs of the acquisition of land necessary for that purpose.

5.9 Interest: All interest paid by the Council on moneys borrowed for the purpose of the Scheme.

5.10 Compensation: All compensation payable and all costs and expenses of determining and settling compensation.

5.11 Other costs: All other costs and expenses which the Council shall be required to meet in order to implement and complete the Scheme.

PART VI.

6. Apportionment and Payment of Scheme Costs.

6.1 The Council shall subject to the following clauses apportion the Scheme Costs between each stage of development or each sub-area as the case may be.

6.2 The Council shall from time to time calculate from the Scheme Map or a Subdivisional Guide Map or shall estimate the gross subdivisible area of land in each Major Development Area or in each stage of development. Subject to the provisions of the Scheme an owner's proportion of Scheme Costs is the proportion which the gross subdivisible area of his land less any part to be used for P.O.S. bears to the whole of the gross

subdivisible area of land in the Major Development Area or stage of development in which the land is situated, as the case may be less the area to be used for P.O.S.

6.3 If any of the items of Scheme Costs have not been paid or ascertained at the time of the subdivision of a parcel of land or at the time of the giving of a notice by the Council as aforesaid the Council may estimate the cost of such items of Scheme Costs.

6.4 An estimate of Scheme Costs made by the Council shall be revised from time to time and the revised estimate of Scheme Costs shall be available for inspection at the office of the Council after each revision has been made.

6.5 Any dispute as to the gross subdivisible area of an owner's land may be referred to arbitration.

6.6 If the Public Works Department shall require payment in advance by the Council of the cost of headworks or other works which will be of benefit to the Scheme Area or upon the Council entering into a contract for the carrying out of any works or the Council itself carrying out any such works the Council shall subject to the next succeeding clause apportion the costs of such works in accordance with clause 6.2 among those owners whose land is served by or benefited by such works and shall notify each such owner of the amount payable by him. Each owner shall prior to the final approval of the Town Planning Board to the subdivision of his land pay to the Council the owner's proportion of the Scheme Costs, but the Council shall not demand or seek to enforce payment before the date upon which the owner makes application to the Board for that final approval, unless the owner has agreed to pay his proportion of Scheme Costs before that date.

6.7 If in the opinion of the Council some owners receive a greater benefit from the works mentioned in the preceding clause than do others the Council may if it considers it to be just and equitable so to do vary the apportionment and if the owners do not agree to such variation the amount payable by each owner shall be determined by arbitration in manner hereinafter provided.

6.8 The costs of the acquisition of land for primary school sites shall be paid by the owners in accordance with clauses 4.2.2 to 4.2.5.

6.9 Each owner shall prior to the final approval by the Board to the subdivision of his land pay to the Council his proportion of Scheme Costs not already paid in accordance with the foregoing clauses but the Council shall not demand or seek to enforce payment before the date on which the owner makes application to the Board for that final approval unless the owner has agreed to pay his proportion of Scheme Costs before that date.

PART VII—GENERAL.

7.1 Agreements Prior to Scheme.

7.1.1 If the Council in order to encourage or facilitate the subdivision or development of land within the Scheme Area shall have entered into an agreement with an owner prior to but in anticipation of the gazettal of the Scheme the rights and obligations of the owner under the Agreement shall in the case of conflict be deemed to have been modified by the terms of the Scheme.

7.2 Development Not in Accordance with Stage Development.

7.2.1 The Council may in accordance with the following provisions permit an owner or a group of owners to develop land prior to the implementation of the Scheme in respect of such land or prior to the approval of an amendment to the Scheme Map or the preparation of a Subdivisional Guide Map containing a subdivisional plan of such land. If the Council does so agree the owner or owners shall enter into an agreement with the Council agreeing:

- (a) to subdivide and develop the land within a specified time in accordance with a subdivisional design approved by the Council and by the Board;

- (b) that all works shall be carried out under the supervision of the Council's officers and consultants and to pay all fees incurred by so doing;

- (c) to pay their proportion of the Scheme Costs;

- (d) to pay all additional costs involved by reason of the subdivision and development prior to the preferred stage development;

- (e) to mortgage or charge specified lands to secure payment of any moneys payable to the Council;

- (f) to release the Council from all claims for compensation in respect of the Scheme.

7.2.2 The agreement shall contain such other clauses as the Council acting on the advice of its solicitors shall reasonably require.

7.2.3 Adjustment to public open space contributions shall be made by the transfer of land to the Council and not by the payment in cash.

7.2.4 If the Council shall subsequently recover from other owners part of the additional costs paid by owners pursuant to the foregoing provisions it shall repay to such owners a fair and just proportion of the moneys so recovered and in the event of a dispute it may be referred to arbitration.

7.3 Clearance by Council: The Council shall not inform the Board that the provisions of the Scheme have been complied with in respect of a subdivision until all moneys payable by the owner have been received by the Council.

7.4 Serviced Lots: In any case where serviced lots are to be transferred to the Council in payment or part payment of moneys owing to the Council or in satisfaction or partial satisfaction of a public open space contribution the costs of servicing such lots shall be taken into account in assessing the values thereof.

7.5 Works on Public Open Space: No clearing, drainage works or other works of any kind shall be carried out on lands shown on the Scheme Map as Public Open Space and Drainage or as Drainage Basins without the approval of the Council or otherwise than in accordance with the terms of the Council's approval.

7.6 Native Vegetation: So far as is practicable and consistent with the economic development of land existing trees and shrubs shall be retained. The Council may by notice or by the marking of trees indicate specific trees or groups of trees which are to be retained.

7.7 Fences: The Council shall not be liable to contribute to the cost of any fences on the boundaries of pedestrian accessways of public open space or recreation areas.

7.8 Service of Notices: Any notice to be served or given to an owner pursuant to the Scheme may be sufficiently served if sent to such owner by certified post in an envelope addressed to him at his address appearing in the Rate Book of the Council and a notice so sent shall be deemed to have been served on the day on which it would in the ordinary course of post reach the address to which it was sent.

7.9 Valuations.

7.9.1 Where it is necessary to ascertain the value of any land for the purpose of the Scheme the value shall be determined either by the Valuer-General or at the option of the Council by a disinterested and competent valuer being an Associate or Fellow of the Australian Institute of Valuers (Incorporated) appointed by the Council.

7.9.2 The values shall be the capital amount that an unencumbered estate in fee simple in the land might reasonably be expected to realise upon sale assuming that all improvements thereon (except site improvements) the benefit of which is unexhausted at the time of valuation have not been made. In this clause the term "site improvements" means reclamation of lands by drainage or filling, the construction of a retaining wall or other structures or works appertaining thereto, the excavation, grading and levelling of land, the removal of rock, stone, sand and soil and the clearing of timber, scrub or other vegetation.

7.9.3. If an owner shall object to the value so determined he may give notice of such objection to the Council within twenty-eight days after having been informed of the said value or the revised value. If the valuer does not agree to change the value to a figure acceptable to the owner the value shall be determined by arbitration in accordance with the provision hereinafter contained.

7.9.4. If a valuation made by the valuer shall be changed as the result of an objection the valuer may reconsider the values placed on other lands and make such revaluations as he considers just and equitable. The owners affected by such revaluation shall forthwith be notified of any change in values.

7.10 Arbitration: Any dispute or difference in respect of any matter which by the terms of the Scheme may be determined by arbitration may be referred to the arbitration of a single arbitrator in manner provided by the Arbitration Act 1895 and if the parties fail to agree upon any one single arbitrator he may be nominated by the President of the Law Society of Western Australia for the time being but if the dispute or difference relates to values only he shall be nominated by the President for the time being of the Western Australian Division of the Australian Institute of Valuers (Incorporated).

7.11 Powers and authorities of Council. In carrying out the provisions of the Scheme the Council shall have the following powers and authorities:

7.11.1 To enter and inspect any land within the Scheme Area.

7.11.2 To make agreements with the owners or occupiers of any land within the Scheme Area.

7.11.3 To enter into agreements with purchasers or prospective purchasers or prospective occupiers of land within the Scheme Area.

7.11.4 To enter into agreements with the Crown and any Department of the State with reference to the carrying out of any of the objects or works of the Scheme.

7.11.5 If any owner of land within the Scheme Area does not proceed with the subdivision or development of his land in accordance with the Scheme or by reason of the nature of his land he is unable to subdivide or develop it and his failure to do so in the opinion of the Council will unduly delay the subdivision and development of the Scheme Area or any portion thereof the Council may after having given not less than six months' written notice of its intention to do so to the owner resume or purchase the land of such owner of any part or parts thereof and proceed with the subdivision and development of the said land in accordance with the provisions of the Scheme.

7.11.6 In the event of the Council exercising its powers under clause 7.11.5 it shall have the powers of an owner in the subdivision development and disposal of the said land; if land shall have been resumed and if the owner shall not have been paid compensation by reason of the resumption the Council before selling the land so subdivided or developed shall offer the new lots to the original owner upon his paying to the Council all costs and expenses consequent upon the resumption subdivision or development of the said land and upon his releasing the Council from all claims for compensation in respect of such resumption. The said offer shall be made in writing and if not accepted within one month of the service thereof the Council may proceed with the sale of the subdivided lots. All moneys received by it from such sale shall be applied firstly in payment of all costs and expenses consequent upon such subdivision and secondly in payment of all compensation in respect of the resumption of the said land. The balance if any of such moneys may be retained by the Council and the Council shall make good any deficit.

7.11.7 If the offer mentioned in clause 7.11.6 hereof be not accepted the Council may retain all or any part of the said land but if it does so it

shall be responsible to pay such costs of subdivision of the said land and compensation for its resumption as are then unpaid.

7.11.8 To dispose of any lots to which it becomes entitled whether under clause 7.11.5 hereof or otherwise upon such terms and conditions as it may think fit and without limiting the generality of the foregoing the Council may sell the lots singly or in groups and on the condition that buildings of a specified character with specified parking or other facilities shall within a limited period be constructed thereon or that the land and buildings be used for a specified purpose.

7.11.9 To extend the time within which payments are to be made to the Council and agree to the securing of such payments.

7.11.10 To postpone the implementation of the Scheme or to implement the Scheme in such stages or in respect of such sub-areas as the Council may from time to time determine.

7.11.11 To transfer any land owned by it or acquired by it pursuant to the Scheme as compensation or part compensation and to enter into agreements relative to the determination and settling of compensation.

7.11.12 To acquire land for public open space in the vicinity of the Scheme Area.

7.11.13 To carry out the development of public open space.

7.12 Twenty-eight days written notice is hereby prescribed as the notices to be given pursuant to section 10 of the Act. Any expenses incurred by the Council under the said section may be recovered from the person in default as a simple contract debt in such Court of Civil Jurisdiction as is competent to deal with the amount of the claim.

7.13 The Council may at any time exercise the powers conferred by section 13 of the Act.

7.14 The Council may subject to the provisions of the Statute authorising it so to do exercise any rights and powers vested on it to borrow money for the purpose of the Scheme.

7.15 Claims for Compensation: The time limited for making claims for compensation pursuant to section 11 of the Act is six months after the date when notice of the approval of the Scheme is published in the manner prescribed by the Regulations under the Act.

7.16 Appeals: A person has a right of appeal under Part V of the Act in respect of the exercise of a discretionary power by the Council under the Scheme.
