- (c) decrease the rate of contribution payable under the provisions of section 21 other than section 21 (3), of that Act by each owner in respect of each mine worker employed by him to \$18.87 weekly,

in each case with effect from 18 October 1980.

- (c) That the carrying out of certain development on land within the scope of the Order without approval as stated therein is prohibited.
- (d) Relating to the application for, and grant of approval for, development other than development permitted by the Order.
- (e) Relating to development by a public authority.
- (f) Relating to certain development permitted by this Order.
- (g) Relating to the continuance of the lawful use of land and buildings.
- (h) Relating to appeals against refusal of approval for development or against conditions subject to which approval to carry out development is granted.

2. The Order has effect from and after the publication of this Summary in the *Government Gazette*.
