Town Planning Scheme No. 3.

Waggrakine Development Scheme.

THE Shire of Greenough under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon it in that behalf by the Town Planning and Development Act 1928 (as amended) hereby makes the following Town Planning Scheme.

Scheme Text.

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Citation.

1. This Town Planning Scheme may be cited as Shire of Greenough Town Planning Scheme No. 3—Waggrakine Development Scheme.

Responsible Authority.

2. The authority responsible for enforcing the observance of this Scheme is the Shire of Greenough.

Interpretation.

3. (1) In this Scheme unless the context otherwise requires—

“Act” means the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928;

“clause” means a clause of the Scheme;

“Council” means the Shire of Greenough;

“gross subdivisible area” means the area of land the subject of a subdivision including land to be used for public open space and drainage, but excluding local centres, community facilities sites and school sites;

“P.O.S. Land” means the land coloured green on the Scheme Map;

“road costs” means the costs of construction of a road or pedestrian accessway and includes the cost of the following—

(a) the survey of the boundaries of the road or pedestrian accessway;

(b) all necessary levelling and grading and other earthworks;

(c) the clearing, construction and paving of the carriageway of the road or pedestrian accessway;

(d) all necessary drainage works;

(e) the provision of kerbing;

- (f) the construction and paving of a foot-path on one side of the road except where considered to be unnecessary by the Council;
- (g) the provision and erection of street name signs;
- (h) the improvement of existing roads within the general area of or adjoining a subdivision or other works in relation thereto required by the Council pursuant to Clause 18.

"Scheme" means this Town Planning Scheme;

"Scheme Area" means the area defined in Clause 5;

"Scheme Costs" means the costs described in Clause 41;

"Scheme Surveyor" means the surveyor appointed by the Council to carry out all surveys and prepare maps and plans required for the preparation and implementation of the Scheme;

"Sub-clause" means a sub-clause of the clause in which the term is used.

(2) Unless otherwise provided herein or unless the context otherwise requires words and expressions not defined in sub-clause (1) have the meanings respectively assigned to them by the Act or by Appendix D to the Town Planning Regulations, 1967.

(3) Headings are for reference purposes only and shall not affect the construction of this Scheme Text.

Maps.

4. The following maps are attached to and form part of the Scheme:—

Land Use and Ownership Map.
Area Map.
Scheme Map.

Scheme Area.

5. The Scheme applies to the whole of the land contained within the inner edge of a broken black line on the Land Use and Ownership Map and the Scheme Map.

General Objects.

6. The general objects of the Scheme are:—

- (a) to facilitate and encourage the progressive subdivision and development of the land within the Scheme Area for residential and recreational purposes;
- (b) to co-ordinate and control development in the Scheme Area;
- (c) to plan and make provision for suitable roads and pedestrian access ways and improvement of existing roads within the Scheme Area;
- (d) to make provision for proper drainage of those parts of the Scheme Area which require drainage;
- (e) to make provision for the creation of drainage reserves and easements;
- (f) to make provision for the installation of sewerage facilities within the Scheme Area;
- (g) to make provision for the reticulation of water throughout the Scheme Area;
- (h) to make provision for land to be used for public open space and recreation;
- (i) to plan and make provision for traffic, transportation, disposition of shops, school sites, community buildings, public utility areas and other purposes;
- (j) to make provision for other matters which are necessary or incidental to town planning or housing;
- (k) to improve and secure the amenity, health and convenience of the Scheme Area;
- (l) to make provision for the apportionment of Scheme Costs amongst owners in an equitable manner.

Zoning.

7. (1) The Council has adopted a town planning scheme to be known as Shire of Greenough Town Planning Scheme No. 4—District Scheme which has been submitted to the Minister for Urban Development and Town Planning for approval.

(2) The objects of the District Scheme are, *inter alia*, to zone the District of the Council.

(3) It is intended that the land within the Scheme Area will be classified as within a residential zone.

Method of Carrying Out Objects.

8. As and when owners of land within the Scheme Area subdivide or develop their land the subdivision or development shall be according to a plan which will be capable of forming part of an overall plan of subdivision and development for the Scheme Area.

9. (1) The Scheme Map indicates an acceptable method of subdivision and development of the Scheme Area and shows the location of public open space, drainage basins, school sites, local centres and other purposes.

(2) The Council may from time to time of its own motion or at the request of an owner prepare amendments to the Scheme Map providing for the detailed subdivision of the Scheme Area or any part thereof.

(3) The Council may instead of or in addition to the preparation of amendments to the Scheme Map from time to time of its own motion or at the request of an owner cause to be prepared Subdivisional Guide Maps of the Scheme Area or any part thereof to guide the planning of the subdivision thereof and to co-ordinate the planning of subdivision or development.

(4) When a Subdivisional Guide Map has been prepared the Council shall submit it to the Board for its approval and if the Board grants its approval thereto a person shall not subdivide any land shown thereon otherwise than in accordance with that Map without the consent of the Board and of the Council.

(5) The Council may with the consent of the Board permit departures from the design shown on the Scheme Map or a Subdivisional Guide Map if it considers the proposed subdivisional design or proposed development to be of a similar standard to that shown but no departure from the design shown on the Scheme Map or a Subdivisional Guide Map shall be permitted if in the opinion of the Council it would impede the subdivision or development of adjoining land or the Scheme Area as a whole.

(6) The Council may divide the Scheme Area into stages of development it considers to be convenient for the progressive subdivision of land, the provision of services and the carrying out of works and to the apportionment of Scheme Costs and may from time to time alter the boundaries of any one or more stages.

Subdivision and Development.

10. (1) An owner of land within the Scheme Area who desires to subdivide or develop his land either alone or in conjunction with another owner or owners shall submit a plan of the proposed subdivision or development to the Council and if the proposal involves subdivision he shall submit to the Town Planning Board a plan of subdivision in conformity with the Scheme Map and with the Subdivisional Guide Map (if any) approved by the Board relating to the land with such modifications as are permitted by the Council under Clause 9.

(2) In order to enable the integration of subdivisions of land within the Scheme Area an owner shall also cause to be prepared a precalculation plan of his subdivision in accordance with information supplied by the Scheme Surveyor.

(3) The owner shall submit the precalculation plan of subdivision to the Council for its approval.

(4) The owner shall pay—

- (a) all costs relative to the survey and the precalculation;
- (b) any charges made by the Council for information supplied;

(c) the cost of having the precalculation checked by the Scheme Surveyor.

(5) All plans and diagrams of survey shall be in accordance with approved precalculation plans.

New Roads and Pedestrian Access Ways.

11. Subject to the provisions hereof each owner shall when subdividing his land make the land available for the roads and pedestrian access ways within the land the subject of the subdivision and shall pay all the road costs in respect thereof.

12. (1) Where a road has a pavement width exceeding 7 m an owner is liable for only that part of the road costs as would have been payable if the pavement width had been only 7 m and the road reserve width only 20 m.

(2) The Council shall pay the proportion of the road costs that is in excess of the amount payable by the owner under sub-clause (1).

(3) The proportion of the road costs paid by the Council in accordance with sub-clause (2) forms part of the Scheme Costs.

(4) Roads having a pavement width exceeding 7 m are shown as Scheme Roads on the Scheme Map.

13. All roads shall be constructed in accordance with specifications and of materials approved by the Council and in accordance with the Council's standard requirements for subdivisional road construction.

14. Where the situation of a new road or of a new pedestrian access way is such that in the opinion of the Council it would be fair and equitable that the owners of adjoining land should contribute to the road costs and apportion the value of the land made available for the road or pedestrian access way and the owners are unable to agree upon the proportion of the road costs and value of land made available payable by each of them the amount (if any) payable by each owner shall be determined by arbitration in manner hereinafter provided.

15. (1) Subject to the provisions of this clause and of Clause 12 the Council shall pay one half of the road costs in respect of the section of road that adjoins public open space or other public facilities and the owner's liability in respect of the section of road that adjoins public open space or other public facilities shall be reduced accordingly.

(2) This clause does not apply to the end alignment of a cul-de-sac road if that is the only part of the road which adjoins the public open space or other public facility.

(3) If the location of the public open space or public facility is changed or the site thereof is cancelled the Council's liability under this clause shall be transferred to the new site or cancelled as the case may be.

(4) Where a road to which this clause applies has been constructed by or on behalf of an owner the Council's contribution is one half of the amount the Council considers to be a fair and reasonable cost of the construction of the road and if there is any dispute between the Council and an owner as to what is a fair and reasonable cost it may be referred to arbitration.

(5) Where insufficient moneys to enable it to make the payment have been received by the Council in respect of that portion of the Scheme Costs attributable to roads, a payment to be made by the Council under this clause may be postponed until sufficient moneys have been paid to it.

16. The Council may construct and drain any new roads and pedestrian access ways and acquire the land necessary for that purpose and if the Council does so prior to the subdivision of the lands adjoining the road or pedestrian access way the costs of the construction and drainage of the road or pedestrian access way and all compensation and other costs consequent upon the acquisition of the land shall be paid to the Council by each owner of land in accordance with the foregoing provisions prior to the final approval of the Town Planning Board to the subdivision of his land, but the Council shall not, unless an owner has agreed to pay those costs earlier, demand or seek to enforce payment before the date upon which the owner makes application to the Board for that final approval.

17. Where the Council has resumed land for a new road or pedestrian access way which the owner of the land would have been required to make available under the Scheme when subdividing his land, the owner shall when subdividing his land—

(a) release the Council from any liability to pay compensation therefor; or

(b) repay to the Council the amount of any compensation paid by it to the owner or any of his predecessors in title;

as the case may be, before the final approval of the Town Planning Board of his plan of subdivision.

Construction or Improvement of Existing Roads.

18. The construction, improvement, widening or drainage of or other works relating to each road which has been dedicated prior to the coming into operation of the Scheme but is unmade or in the opinion of the Council requires improvement, widening, drainage or other works in order that the road will be of a suitable standard for a residential area shall be carried out by the owner of the land abutting on the road and, subject to Clause 12, the owner shall pay all road costs in respect thereof or such proportion as the Council determines unless in any particular case the Council decides otherwise.

19. An owner of land which abuts a road referred to in the preceding clause shall when subdividing his land pay to the Council prior to the final approval of the Town Planning Board to the subdivision the proportion of the costs or estimated costs of the construction, improvement, widening, drainage thereof or other works relating thereto (not exceeding one half thereof or the proportion not paid by the owner referred to in Clause 18, whichever is the lesser) determined by the Council, but the Council shall not, unless an owner has agreed to pay those costs earlier, demand or seek to enforce payment before the date upon which the owner makes application to the Board for that final approval.

Closure of Roads.

20. (1) The roads shown on the Scheme Map as roads to be closed shall be closed as the development of the land proceeds and as those roads are respectively no longer required.

(2) When the roads referred to in sub-clause (1) hereof have been closed the land shall be used for the purposes shown on the Scheme Map.

Sewerage, Drainage and Water Supply.

21. (1) The drainage works to be carried out on the land shown as drainage basins on the Scheme Map include earthworks, grassing and fencing.

(2) The drainage works referred to in sub-clause (1) may be carried out by the Council and any costs thereof shall be paid by owners proportionately in accordance with Clause 42.

(3) The Council shall reimburse an owner who carries out the drainage works mentioned in sub-clause (1) the amount paid by him in excess of his proportionate contribution and the amount so paid by the Council forms part of the Scheme Costs.

22. (1) Subject to sub-clause (2) the Council may acquire any land it considers necessary for sewerage, water supply or drainage services and may set aside land for drainage sumps, compensating basins and other works.

(2) Each owner shall on subdividing his land transfer free of cost to the Minister for Works or appropriate Government Department any land required for a sewer pump station site within the land owned by him.

Connection to the Sewer.

23. Subject to the next succeeding clause a person shall not—

(a) subdivide land unless there is a sewer to which all new lots in the proposed subdivision may be connected; or

(b) occupy a building unless it is connected to a sewer.

24. (1) If the Council is of the opinion that the nature of the soil in any part of the Scheme Area is sufficiently absorptive to permit the efficient operations of an apparatus for the bacteriolytic treatment of sewage it may permit the construction of not more than one dwelling house on a lot in its unsubdivided state as shown on the Land Use and Ownership Map and the occupation of the dwelling house before the sewer is available.

(2) Permission to develop given pursuant to this clause does not absolve an owner from his liability to pay for the connection of his land to the sewer when the sewer becomes available.

Levelling and Filling.

25. If land requires levelling filling or other earthworks before it can be subdivided or built upon the cost of those works shall be borne by the owner of the land.

Public Open Space and Drainage Sites.

26. Reservation of P.O.S. Land: It is intended that the land coloured green on the Scheme Map (the P.O.S. Land) will be reserved for public open space and drainage.

27. Acquisition of P.O.S. Land: Subject to the next succeeding clause the Council may as and when it thinks fit acquire the P.O.S. Land or any part or parts thereof either by purchase, exchange or resumption or partly by one method and partly by another or the others.

28. Contributions by owners: Subject to Clause 32 each owner when subdividing his land shall contribute towards public open space and drainage in the following manner—

- (a) the owner shall prior to the final approval by the Board of the subdivision of his land transfer to the Council or vest in the Crown the P.O.S. Land within the area of land the subject of the subdivision;
- (b) if no part of the P.O.S. Land is contained within the land the subject of the subdivision he shall pay to the Council ten and one half per centum (10.5%) of the value of the gross subdivisible area of his land ascertained in accordance with Clause 29;
- (c) if the value of the gross subdivisible area of his land to be transferred to the Council pursuant to paragraph (a) hereof is greater or less than ten and one half per centum (10.5%) of the value of the land the subject of the subdivision the owner shall receive from or pay to the Council the difference in such value as the case may be the values to be ascertained in accordance with Clause 29 or 30.

29. Adjustment where deficiency: If the area of land the subject of an application for subdivision contains no P.O.S. land or contains an area of P.O.S. land which is less than ten and one half per centum (10.5%) of the gross subdivisible area of the land the subject of the subdivision, an assessment of the *in globo* value of the area of the land subject of the subdivision shall be made to ascertain the average value per hectare as at the date of final approval of the subdivision by the Board and the amount payable by the owner to the Council under paragraph (b) or (c) of Clause 28 is the value so ascertained of the area of land by which ten and one half per centum (10.5%) of the gross subdivisible area of the land the subject of the subdivision exceeds the area of land required for P.O.S. Land.

30. Adjustment where Excess: If the land required for P.O.S. Land within the area of a subdivision exceeds ten and one half per centum (10.5%) of the gross subdivisible area of the land the subject of the subdivision a valuation *in globo* shall be made as at the date of the final approval of the plan of subdivision by the Board of the land required for P.O.S. Land on the basis that that land would be used for single residential purposes and the amount payable to the owner under paragraph (c) of Clause 28 is the same proportion of the total value of the P.O.S. Land as the proportion which the area of the owner's land required for P.O.S. Land exceeding ten and one half per centum (10.5%) of the total gross subdivisible area of his land bears to the total area of his land required for P.O.S. Land.

31. Progressive acquisition of P.O.S. Land: It is intended that the development of the Scheme Area will be progressively carried out in such a manner that moneys payable to the Council under paragraphs (b) and (c) of Clause 28 will be available to make payment to owners under paragraph (c) of that clause and if an owner desires to subdivide his land before sufficient funds are available to make the required payment to him the transfer or vesting of the land required for P.O.S. Land and the payment to the owner shall unless the Council and the owner otherwise agree be postponed until the Council has sufficient funds to make the payment to the owner.

32. Council may accept land: A payment to be made by an owner to the Council under paragraph (b) or (c) of Clause 28 may if the Council so agrees be satisfied wholly or in part by the transfer to the Council of subdivided serviced lots within the subdivision.

33. The land to be transferred to the Council or vested in the Crown pursuant to Clause 28 shall be the land shown as public open space or drainage basins on the approved plan of subdivision but shall not include any land which is or intended to be a school site, road or pedestrian access way created by the subdivision.

34. Second P.O.S. Land: If an owner subdividing his land is also the owner of other land within the Scheme Area not the subject of the proposed subdivision referred to in this clause and the other land or part thereof is shown on the Scheme Map as P.O.S. Land the owner may if the Council so agrees transfer to the Council the P.O.S. Land or an agreed part thereof (hereinafter referred to as "the second P.O.S. land") and the value of the second P.O.S. land so transferred shall be credited against the amount payable by the owner to the Council under paragraph (b) or (c) of Clause 28 and for the purposes of this clause—

- (a) the second P.O.S. land shall be valued as at the date upon which the owner offered to transfer it to the Council or as at the date upon which the land adjoining it or adjoining the P.O.S. Land of which it forms part was first subdivided for residential use which ever produces the lower value;
- (b) if the value of the land transferred to the Council under paragraph (a) of Clause 28 and under this present clause is greater than ten and one half per centum (10.5%) of the value of his land being subdivided the owner may elect that instead of receiving a payment under paragraph (c) of Clause 28 the amount of the excess shall be credited against the amount which would be payable by him on the subsequent subdivision of other land owned by him within the Scheme Area;
- (c) upon the subdivision of the land of which the second P.O.S. land forms part the provisions of this clause shall be applied on the basis that the second P.O.S. land does not form part of and never formed part of the land the subject of that subdivision.

35. Sale of Land: The Council may sell or otherwise dispose of any land transferred to it pursuant to Clauses 28, 32 and 34 and not required by it for P.O.S. Land and shall apply the net proceeds of sale received by it as follows—

- (a) first, in making all necessary payments to owners under the provisions of this clause;
- (b) second, in payment to the credit of the public open space trust fund referred to in Clause 36.

36. Public Open Space Trust Fund: (1) In this Scheme the term "public open space trust fund" means a special public open space trust fund established solely for the purposes of the Scheme.

(2) All moneys received by the Council pursuant to Clauses 28 to 35 shall be paid into the public open space trust fund.

(3) The Council shall apply moneys standing to the credit of the public open space trust fund in repaying any loan moneys or finance made available by it and interest thereon expended on the acquisition and development of public open space.

(4) If the moneys standing to the credit of the public open space trust fund are insufficient to repay any loan moneys or finance expended on the acquisition and development of public open space the balance thereof shall, subject to Clause 41 (g), be borne by the Scheme.

(5) If the moneys in the public open space trust fund are greater than the amount necessary to repay the loans and other moneys and interest the balance thereof shall be applied by the Council in further improvements and facilities in the Scheme Area.

School Sites.

37. (1) In this clause "School Sites" means the High School site and the two Primary School sites shown on the Scheme Map.

(2) The Education Department has notified the Council that it will pay the cost of acquisition of the High School site and one of the two Primary School sites.

(3) The Council shall when it thinks it expedient to do so acquire the School sites by purchase, exchange or resumption or partly by one method and partly by another or the others.

(4) Prior to the acquisition of the School sites or any of them the Council may cause them or it to be valued and may cause the valuations to be revised from time to time.

(5) The value of the School sites less the amount of the contribution made by the Education Department (herein referred to as "the net value of the School sites") is payable by the owners of land within the Scheme Area in the proportions specified in sub-clause (6).

(6) An owner's proportion of the net value of the School sites is the proportion which the gross subdivisible area of his land bears to the whole of the gross subdivisible area of land in the Scheme Area.

(7) An owner shall satisfy the proportion of the net value of the School sites prior to the final approval of the Town Planning Board to the subdivision of his land either by the transfer of subdivided serviced lots or a payment in cash or partly by one method and partly by the other as required by the Council, but the Council shall not, unless an owner has agreed to pay those costs earlier, demand or seek to enforce payment before the date upon which the owner makes application to the Board for that final approval.

38. (1) The Council shall assess a fair and just proportion of the costs of roads and services adjoining or serving each School Site.

(2) When the Minister for Education or other Government Department agrees to develop a School Site for the purposes of a High School or a Primary School as the case may be and pays to the Council—

(a) the contribution (if any) referred to in Clause 37 (2); and

(b) the amount assessed pursuant to sub-clause (1) in respect of that School Site;

the Council shall transfer that School Site to the Minister or Department.

(3) If the Minister for Education or Government Department referred to in sub-clause (2) does not agree to pay the amount assessed in accordance with sub-clause (1) the amount payable shall be determined by arbitration.

(4) The Council shall pay the amount received by it pursuant to paragraph (b) of sub-clause (2) to the owners who paid the costs of the roads and services adjoining or serving the School Site proportionately to the amounts paid by them.

(5) If after the expiration of six years the Council is unable to trace an owner entitled to receive a payment under sub-clause (4) it may expend the amount thereof for the benefit of the Scheme Area.

Community Facilities Site.

39. (1) The position of the proposed Community Facilities site is shown on the Scheme Map.

(2) Prior to the acquisition of the Community Facilities site the Council may cause it to be valued and may cause the valuation to be revised from time to time.

(3) The Council shall pay one half of the cost of acquisition of the Community Facilities site and the balance of that cost shall be met from contributions by owners in accordance with the provisions of sub-clauses (4) and (5).

(4) Each owner's contribution towards the cost of acquisition of the Community Facilities site is the proportion of one half of that cost or of the current valuation thereof, as the case may be, which the gross subdivisible area of his land bears to the whole of the gross subdivisible area of land in the Scheme Area.

(5) An owner shall satisfy his contribution prior to the final approval of the Town Planning Board to the subdivision of his land either by the transfer of subdivided serviced lots or a payment in cash or partly by one method and partly by the other as required by the Council, but the Council shall not, unless an owner has agreed to do so earlier, demand or seek to enforce payment or require a transfer before the date upon which the owner makes application to the Board for that final approval.

Local Centre.

40. (1) It is intended that the lands shown as the Local Centre on the Scheme Map will be used for commercial purposes including (but without limiting the generality of the foregoing) shopping centre, offices, service station site, take-away food shop, post office, Totalisator Agency Board branch, and parking areas.

(2) The Local Centre site may also be used for a medical centre, dental centre, infant health centre and other civic or community uses.

(3) The Local Centre site is not zoned for those purposes by the Scheme.

(4) The Council shall negotiate with the owners of the land shown as Local Centre on the Scheme Map in order that the land may be used for the purposes mentioned in this clause.

Scheme Costs.

41. The costs or estimated costs of the following items are the Scheme Costs:—

- (a) the costs of preparation and administration of the Scheme including an amount to reimburse the Council for all overhead and management costs as may be incurred in the preparation and implementation of the Scheme and including all legal costs, planning costs, costs of base mapping and preparation of all maps and plans, payments to planning consultants, engineering consultants, surveyors and other professional consultants, payments to Scheme Managers and valuation costs;
- (b) the costs (if any) to the Council of any drainage works necessary for the proper drainage of the Scheme Area and the acquisition of lands for that purpose;
- (c) the costs (if any) to the Council of the sewerage works necessary for the connection of the land in the Scheme Area to a sewer and of the acquisition of lands for that purpose less any contribution by the Public Works Department;
- (d) the costs (if any) to the Council of the water supply works necessary for the reticulation of water throughout the Scheme Area less any contribution by the Public Works Department;
- (e) subject to Clause 12, the cost of the construction improvement widening and drainage of roads and the acquisition of land for roads or for the widening of roads;
- (f) all compensation payable and all costs and expenses of determining and settling compensation;
- (g) subject to Clause 36 all costs and expenses of and incidental to the acquisition of public open space and the installation of a bore and pump on each site;

- (h) all costs and expenses of and incidental to all drainage works carried out on the land shown as drainage basins on the Scheme Map;
- (i) subject to Clause 36 all interest accruing from time to time on moneys borrowed by the Council for the purposes of the Scheme;
- (j) all other costs and expenses which the Council is required to meet in order to implement and complete the Scheme.

Payment of Scheme Costs.

42. An owner's proportion of Scheme Costs is the proportion which the gross subdivisible area of his land bears to the whole of the gross subdivisible area of land in the Scheme Area.

43. Each owner of land shall prior to the final approval of the Town Planning Board to the subdivision of the land pay to the Council the owner's proportion of the Scheme Costs, but the Council shall not, unless an owner has agreed to do so earlier, demand or seek to enforce payment or require a transfer before the date upon which the owner makes application to the Board for that final approval.

Estimate of Scheme Costs.

44. (1) If any of the items of Scheme Costs have not been paid or ascertained at the time of subdivision of a parcel of land they may be estimated by the Council.

(2) An estimate may be revised from time to time.

(3) The payment of an estimate by an owner discharges the owner's liability in respect of the item of Scheme Costs for which the estimate was made.

(4) If an estimate is greater than the amount paid or incurred by the Council it shall refund the difference to the owner.

(5) If after the expiration of six (6) years the Council is unable to trace an owner entitled to receive a refund under sub-clause (4) it may expend the amount thereof for the benefit of the Scheme Area.

Apportionment of Scheme Costs between stages of development.

45. The Council may from time to time apportion the Scheme Costs or any part thereof between different stages of development in the ratio that the gross subdivisible area of the land in each stage of development bears to the whole of the gross subdivisible area of land in the Scheme Area or in such other manner as the Council considers is fair and equitable.

Works carried out by the Council.

46. If the Council itself carries out any of the Scheme Works it shall prepare details of costings based on current costs in the Greenough region and submit them for verification to an independent engineer nominated by the President for the time being of the Western Australian branch of the Association of Consulting Engineers of Australia and the amount of the costs approved by the independent engineer as being fair and reasonable form part of the Scheme Costs.

Land Owned by the Council.

47. All or any of the land now owned or subsequently acquired by the Council within or near the Scheme Area may be used by the Council for any purpose appropriate to the Scheme (and the Council has all the powers of an owner in respect thereof) and if the purpose is one for which an owner is required to make land available or for which land may be acquired by the Council hereunder the Council shall be compensated for the value of the land so used.

Agreements made prior to the Scheme.

48. If the Council has in anticipation of the coming into operation of the Scheme entered into an agreement with an owner of land within the Scheme Area the provisions of the agreement prevail if there is any conflict or inconsistency between the terms of the agreement and the Scheme.

Development prior to the implementation of the Scheme.

49. The Council may permit an owner or owners to develop land prior to the implementation of the Scheme in respect of the land or prior to the approval of an amendment to the Scheme Map or the preparation of a Subdivisional Guide Map containing a subdivisional plan of the land if the owner or owners enter into an agreement which—

- (a) provides that the owner or owners shall subdivide and develop the land within a specified time in accordance with a subdivisional design approved by the Council and the Board;
- (b) provides that all works shall be carried out under the supervision of the Council's officers and consultants and that the owner or owners shall pay all costs and fees thereof;
- (c) contains a covenant by the owner or owners to pay his or their proportion of the Scheme Costs;
- (d) contains a covenant by the owner or owners to pay all additional costs involved by reason of the subdivision and development prior to the implementation of the Scheme;
- (e) provides that the owner or owners shall mortgage or charge specified land to secure the payment of any moneys payable to the Council;
- (f) contains a release by the owner or owners of the Council from all claims for compensation in respect of the Scheme;
- (g) provides that the owner or owners shall pay all costs of and incidental to the preparation of the agreement;
- (h) contains such other provisions as the Council acting on the advice of its solicitors requires.

Valuations.

50. Where it is necessary to ascertain the value of any land for the purpose of the Scheme the value shall be determined by the Valuer-General or at the option of the Council by a disinterested and competent valuer being a fellow or associate of the Australian Institute of Valuers appointed or approved by the Council.

51. When it becomes necessary to make a valuation by reason of an application for consent to a subdivision the person making the application shall pay the costs of the valuation.

52. (1) In this clause the expression "site improvements" means the reclamation of land by drainage or filling, the construction of a retaining wall or other structure or works appertaining thereto, the excavation, grading or levelling of land, the removal of rock, stones, sand and soil and the clearing of timber, scrub or other vegetation.

(2) For the purposes of the Scheme unless otherwise provided to the contrary the value of land is the capital amount that an unencumbered estate in fee simple in the land might reasonably be expected to realise upon the sale thereof assuming that all improvements thereon (except site improvements) the benefit of which is unexhausted at the time of the valuation had not been made.

53. (1) If an owner objects to the value of his land determined in accordance with the provisions hereof he may give notice in writing of the objection to the Council within twenty-eight days after having been informed of the value or a revised value.

(2) If the valuer does not agree to change the value to a figure acceptable to the owner the value shall be determined by arbitration in accordance with the provisions of Clause 54.

(3) If a valuation made by a valuer is changed as a result of an objection the valuer may reconsider the values placed on other land and make such revaluation as he considers just and equitable and the Council shall forthwith notify other owners affected by any such change in value.

Arbitration.

54. Any dispute or difference which by the terms of this Scheme may be determined by arbitration may be referred to the arbitration of a single arbitrator in manner provided by the Arbitration Act 1895 or any statutory modification thereof for the time being in force and if the parties fail to agree upon a single arbitrator he may be nominated by—

- (a) the President for the time being of the Western Australian Division of the Australian Institute of Valuers if the dispute or difference concerns a question of valuation of land; or
- (b) the President for the time being of the Law Society of Western Australia in any other case. Powers and Authorities of Council.

55. (1) In carrying out the provisions of the Scheme the Council has the following powers and authorities—

- (a) to enter at all reasonable times and inspect any land within the Scheme Area;
- (b) to make arrangements with the owners or occupiers of any land within the Scheme Area;
- (c) to enter into agreements with purchasers or prospective purchasers or prospective occupiers of land within the Scheme Area;
- (d) to enter into agreements with the Crown and any department of the State with reference to the carrying out of any of the objects or works of the Scheme;
- (e) subject to sub-clauses (2), (3) and (4), if an owner of land (in this paragraph and in sub-clauses (2), (3) and (4) called "the owner") does not proceed with the subdivision or development of his land in accordance with the Scheme or by reason of the nature of the land he is unable to subdivide or develop it, to resume or purchase the land or any part or parts thereof and proceed with the subdivision and development of the land in accordance with the provisions of the Scheme and in so doing the Council may enter into agreements with other owners as to the payment or sharing of costs, ownership of lots part of which are outside the land resumed by the Council or any other matters concerning the resumption or purchase of the land or the subdivision or development thereof;
- (f) to dispose of any lots to which it becomes entitled whether under paragraph (e) or otherwise upon any terms and conditions it thinks fit and without limiting the generality of the foregoing to sell the lots singly or in groups and on the condition that buildings of a specified character with specified parking or other facilities shall within a limited period be constructed thereon or that the land and buildings be used for a specified purpose;
- (g) to extend the time within which payments are to be made to the Council and agree to the securing of such payments;
- (h) to transfer any land owned by it or acquired by it pursuant to the Scheme as compensation and to enter into agreements relative to the determination and settling of compensation;
- (i) in any case where in order to subdivide his land in accordance with the Scheme it is necessary for an owner (in this paragraph called "the subdivider") to acquire land from another owner or land formerly comprised in a road that has been closed to acquire the land by purchase exchange or resumption or partly by one method and partly by another or the others and transfer it to the subdivider to enable him to complete the subdivision of his land subject to the subdivider paying to the Council all costs and expenses paid or incurred by it;
- (j) to transfer any land acquired by the Council under Clause 20 (2) to the owner of the adjoining land upon any terms and conditions it thinks fit.

(2) The Council shall not exercise its powers under paragraph (e) of sub-clause (1) unless—

- (a) it has been notified in writing by one or more other owners that they wish to subdivide or develop their land but are unable to do so because of the failure or inability of the owner to subdivide or develop his land;
- (b) it is satisfied that the other owner or owners have made a reasonable attempt to arrange with the owner for the subdivision or development of their respective lands to be co-ordinated or carried out in co-operation or conjunction with one another;
- (c) it is satisfied the failure or inability of the owner to subdivide or develop his land will unduly delay the subdivision and development of the Scheme Area or materially prejudice or impede the operation, implementation or completion of the Scheme;
- (d) no other reasonable and practicable alternative is available; and
- (e) where the Council proposes to resume the land, it first gives not less than three (3) months' written notice of its intention to do so to the owner.

(3) Where the Council exercises its powers under paragraph (e) of sub-clause (1) to resume land it shall not resume more land than is reasonably necessary to permit or enable the subdivision and development of the Scheme Area to proceed or be carried out.

(4) Where the Council exercises its powers under paragraph (e) of sub-clause (1) it has all the powers of an owner in the subdivision, development and disposal of the land resumed or purchased but the following provisions apply:—

- (a) if land has been resumed and if the owner has not been paid compensation by reason of the resumption, the Council before selling the land so subdivided and developed shall offer the new lots wholly within the subdivision and the benefit of any agreement with adjoining owners to the original owner upon his paying to the Council all costs and expenses consequent upon the resumption, subdivision or development of the land and upon his releasing the Council from all claims for compensation in respect of such resumption and development;
- (b) the offer shall be made in writing and if not accepted within twenty-eight days of the service thereof the Council may proceed with the sale of the subdivided lots;
- (c) all moneys received by it from the sale shall be applied first in payment of all costs and expenses consequent upon the subdivision and secondly in payment of all compensation in respect of the resumption of the said land and the balance (if any) of the moneys may be retained by the Council and the Council shall make good any deficit;
- (d) if the offer mentioned in paragraph (a) hereof is not accepted the Council may retain all or any part of the land but if it does so it is responsible to pay the costs of subdivision of the land and compensation for its resumption as are then unpaid.

56. (1) Twenty-eight (28) days' written notice is hereby prescribed as the notice to be given pursuant to section 10 of the Act.

(2) Any expenses incurred by the Council under that section may be recovered from the person in default as a simple contract debt in a court of civil jurisdiction competent to deal with the amount of the claim.

JETTIES ACT AMENDMENT REGULATIONS 1981.

MADE by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

Citation. 1. These regulations may be cited as the Jetties Act Amendment Regulations 1981.

Reg. 67B amended. 2. Regulation 67B of the Jetties Act Regulations 1940*, as amended, is amended in subregulation (3) by deleting paragraph (d) and substituting the following paragraph—

“ (d) To prevent the flow of direct current between ship and pipeline an insulating flange shall be fitted in the shore pipeline, or one easily identifiable, non-conductive hose inserted in the hose string and the insulating flange or non-conductive hose, as the case may be, shall comply in all respects with the Association of Australian Port and Marine Authorities, Rules for the Handling of Dangerous Goods and Oils in Ports, Part 5. ”

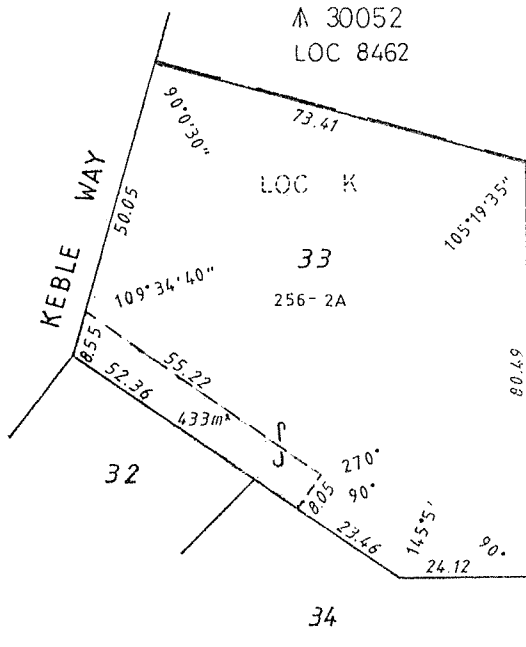

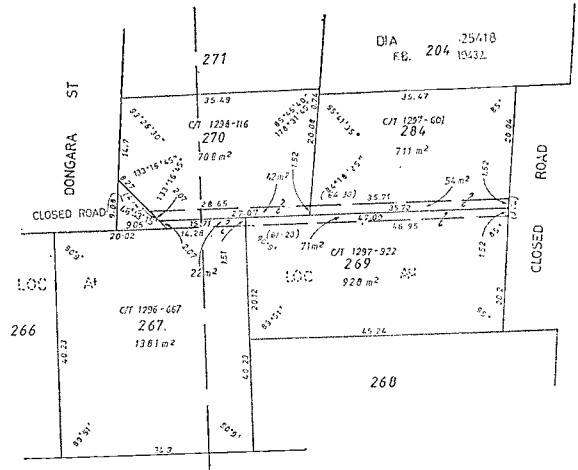
